

apartment canvas was made by the dog inspectors, and at the present time over eight thousand dogs are licensed in Vancouver. An average of 200 dogs per month are picked up by the inspectors and are later redeemed by the owners; still an average of another two hundred are sold to new owners, and a great many others unwanted and of no value, are humanely put away. This plan has worked so successfully that plans for a new city pound, with modern heated kennels and outside runs, together with a hospital fully equipped, has been adopted by the City Council, and work on the buildings will be rushed to completion. In spite of the fact that four dog-catching cars are being operated, instead of one, as heretofore, as well as other additions to the staff and overhead, the Vancouver city pound is making money, and the dog fanciers are keeping their dogs at their homes under proper conditions, and the dog-haters are not being antagonized by stray dogs; and if one of our dogs should escape from his home, or be stolen, we have a real dog man looking after our interest. I understand there is a similar system in operation in Victoria, but I have not the particulars.

My correspondent goes on to say: "This City of Victoria is quite a dog town, and I am sure we can look to the Victoria fanciers to give us the best show in this province from now on. Major Nevin is a live fellow and carries a lot of weight. He has made money for the Victoria City Kennel Club with his progressive ideas. They own their own benching, which is made of British Columbia cedar and is, of course, "self-disinfecting." It is a fact that you cannot notice the slightest dog odor, even though the dogs have been on the bench three days. In addition to securing the spacious Armoury for dog shows, with its modern comforts, cafe, rest-rooms, etc., and its unlimited area for judging rings, etc., the Major has a system whereby the Club secures their premium lists and catalogues free of charge, as well as other concessions,

which is a great help to the Club. And it is at Victoria where we find an officer of the Club, in the person of Harry Dodds, who will handle any fancier's dog absolutely free of charge, which is a great boon to the novice. One cannot but be impressed with the co-operative spirit that exists at Victoria; every person connected with the Club are out to do everything possible for the pleasure of exhibitors."

The correct type of head for Irish Terriers apparently is still agitating the breeders and fanciers on the Pacific Coast. This, as I have remarked before, has been brought about by the number of taneous-headed Irish Terriers that have been placed high in the prize-list by judges who apparently have been carried away by the long, lean head, and apparently do not know, or will not pay any attention to, the standard which calls for a flat skull. A taneous head means a long, fine head, short skull, hollow at each side of the skull and abnormal length of foreface. The dog who was first shown with this extremely foreign head was a terrier

called Taneous and he did tremendous harm until breeders woke up to the fact that a descendant of Taneous, if introduced to any strain, would quickly ruin the strain. I must say that to-day, men who value their reputations as judges of Irish Terriers, would hesitate before giving a Taneous-headed Irish Terrier a prize.

I have always tried to make my pages in Kennel and Bench the rendezvous for the whole Canadian Fancy, and it therefore gives me a deal of pleasure to have received many letters from fanciers all over Canada agreeing with my articles the last two months. The article in the July issue, with reference to paying more attention to the quality of our breeding stock, evidently has set breeders thinking that to attain the success we all desire for our Canadian dogs, we must breed on more scientific lines than we have been doing. One reader, in endorsing my remarks, sends me particulars of a recent meeting of the Holstein-Friesian Association in Philadelphia, where Mr. Reed suggested the desirability of the National breed associations giving some study to setting up a system of registry which will permit entering in the herd books unregistered animals that have reached a high degree of purity for a high level of production." Mr. Reed commended the Holstein-Friesian Association for the recently adopted plan of Herd Improvement Registry, which provides for the cancellation of registration certificates of inferior and unprofitable producers. I have marked the last paragraph in italics, as it bears strongly on a communication received from a famous breeder in the West, whose letter reads as follows:

"According to recent announcement, it would appear that we shortly shall have available a reliable preventative for distemper, produced after the manner perfected in England by the scientists of the Field Distemper Committee. While all must welcome this announcement, a situation is created, or will be created, which calls

for serious consideration on the part of dog breeders. At the present time it would probably be no exaggeration to say that the mortality among all dogs whelped is fully 50 to 75 per cent. That is to say, that only 50 to 25 per cent. of puppies whelped reach the age of say, eighteen months to two years, and distemper causes probably 75 per cent. at least of all deaths. If we can eliminate distemper as a cause of death, of course, it will mean that a great many more dogs can, and will be, raised, and for the time-being there should be an increased demand, due to the fact that intending purchasers will no longer have the fear of losing their purchase through distemper. However, if breeders proceed to inoculate, and raise entire litters of puppies, the inevitable result will be to flood the market with dogs most of which cannot be otherwise than very mediocre specimens. It would seem that the most national plan of procedure would be for breeders to inoculate only two or three of the best specimens in each litter, and painlessly destroy the remainder. The result would be a very great improvement in the quality of dogs, while prices should be much higher and more stable than at present. Of course, most breeders are in the game for the love of it, but all the same, they have to make their hobby pay for itself in most cases. It seems to me that this matter should be aired through *Kennel and Bench*, and breeders warned against taking advantage of any immediate increase in demand to the eventual detriment of the whole dog game."

This letter is deserving of the serious consideration of dog breeders throughout the world. Personally, I believe, that in course of time we may have to follow in the footsteps of the Silver Fox breeders, and grade

our puppies. It is a question that will have to be seriously considered by dog breeders, and here in Canada, by the Canadian National Live Stock Records.

Notes from Alberta, in the last issue of *Kennel and Bench*, writes: "That the Sporting Dog judge at Calgary, J. H. Tanton, indulged in a system that was an innovation to the writer. He did not place the dogs on the block in their order of merit, as is usual with most judges, but handed out the ribbons as he thought fit, apparently just where the dogs happened to be. He explained his reason for this, that it kept the handlers and their owners guessing as to where their dogs were placed until the ribbons were actually handed out. Seems sound enough on the face of it, but it is undoubtedly very confusing to the ring-side. We should be pleased to have Judge Walter H. Reeves' ideas on the subject."

As R. S. Tyrrell writes, it may be a good idea to keep the handlers guessing, but what about the spectators! The show-ring should be the school of education for the neophyte, and the system of ranging the winners in their order of merit, certainly helps to show the novice and the spectator the type and conformation wanted, and very often a judge can show by his actions—that past-master, George Raper, was a master at this) just where the first dog was preferred to the second. We old-timers are sometimes too selfish, and forget to make our shows interesting to the novice and the spectator. I have proof of this by the many letters I have received approving of my plan of judging classes to a finish. T.H.C., H.C., and C. may mean nothing to the old show hand, but a card does mean something to the novice. Once we get away from making our shows so professional, we will not hear so much of meagre entries and poor gates. Shows throughout Canada are not supported enough by the one-dog man and the novice.

five heads, the English and Welsh Springers having been placed in the same category—lumped as one breed. As the English and Welsh springers are of distinct types and colors, it seems to me that this grouping of the two varieties of springers, was the making of a hasty pudding that might be anything.

It is believed that the A.K.C. was advised that all springers were mixed in their blood; that there was Clumber Spaniel in the one, and Black or Sussex Spaniel or both of of them in the other. It was further alleged there was an interminable mixture of blood and breed—a combination that could not be disintegrated.

Notwithstanding this ruling it is known that pure strains of English springers and Welsh springers have been maintained down through the centuries. As matters now stand, it would be fatal to cross the red-marked Welsh springers with the liver or black marked English springers, for the reason that red-marked puppies would appear in the ensuing litters, and those puppies would be next to valueless in the United States, as pure-bred English

HERE are six British breeds of land or sporting spaniels, and each of these is, more or less, suited for some particular form of shooting. The six breeds or varieties of breeds—the Cocker Spaniel is a small variety of one or more of the larger breeds—are recognized by the English Kennel Club, while the American Kennel Club permits the entry of only

Springers. It was, I think, a mistake to class two varieties as one, and this upset all of the work and experience of the other sportsmen-breeders of spaniels, who, for generations, had been building up pure strains of English and Welsh springers.

To sportsmen a good dog, like a good horse, cannot be of a bad color; but all men (and women) desire to shoot over a dog that is not only good in the field, but of pleasant appearance, and distinctly representative of the long and distinguished lineage which we recognize as "pedigree."

As before mentioned there are six breeds of Land Spaniels, viz., the English Springer, the Welsh Springer, the Clumber, the Sussex, the Field and the Cocker Spaniel. The springers are probably the oldest of the land spaniels. For centuries they have been widely distributed over Europe. It is only about eight or ten years since Springers commenced to make their appearance in the United

States; but they had been bred and heavily shot over in Canada for some time previous. Large Spaniels of the Springer kind were part of the outfit of one or more of the Canadian pioneers who subsequently were to become celebrated among the greater statesmen of the Dominion.

The Springer Spaniel may be looked upon as a somewhat glorified example of what has been described as "the Village Spaniel"—just the sort of dog that would be at everyone's beck and call when a day's shooting or a little ferretting for rabbits was desired by town or countryman. Show a gun or ferret-bag to the Village Spaniel, and he at once craves to become your slave. For of such is the spirit of the spaniel of any breed or kind.

It is written in the older works that spaniels originally

came from Spain—hence the dog's breed name "Spaniel." One writer states that all dogs become soft or silky in the texture of the hair of the coat after being bred in Spain; and that the prime ancestors of the Spaniel family were foreign hounds that became soft-coated in the Peninsular. Such a contention might be shattered when it is stated there is no trace of the hound's voice in the Spaniel, and that peculiarity must be of considerable weight when we come to consider or speculate regarding the probability of the Spaniel family being an offshoot from the old hounds. Probably the Spaniel is as old in its ancestry as any hunting dog. Moreover, he was well distributed all over Europe, which statement may be proved from the pictures of them to be observed in medieval tapestries and paintings by the old masters of Italy, Holland, France, Germany and England. It appears that the spaniel of the red, or orange-markings has been the friend of the netters, hawkers and shooters of game birds, for hundreds of years. These Spaniels of today have lost little or none of the old type of the very same stamps of dogs used for the same work—that of a dog of all work, so far as the Spaniel has been required by the sportsman.

The Springer Spaniel so far as his name "Springer" is concerned, sometimes reminds one of a certain spinster who wore the same coat from the period of its style first coming into fashion, until the time when the same cut was again called for in feminine attire. I have lived a life that has spanned two periods of the Springer's breed name. Until early in this century the old name of "Springer" had been almost entirely forgotten, for the reason this breed of dog was only kept by conservative country gentlemen who were not prepared to forsake their old breed for the supposed-to-be more aristocratic, Anglicized French Spaniel known in

England as the Clumber Spaniel. These delightful old sportsmen were not prepared to destroy the Springers kept, and shot-over by the squires of the British Isles.

I am in my seventieth year and have not only been specially interested in all breeds of Spaniels, but have held positions that have enabled me to have been a constant observer and seen at one time or another the leading Spaniels of their times. I was one of the first to break away from the long-and-low useless type of Field Spaniels which had their hideous prosperity in the '80s and '90s of the last cycle. So figuratively speaking or writing, I threw away those false gods, and returned to gods of my fathers, the white and liver and the white and red-marked Spaniels.

As I write there is before me a photograph of a team of Springers owned by the late Mr. C. C. Eversfield, one of the earliest and best of field trial breakers and handlers of the old-time Springer Spaniel breed. These dogs came from the kennels of the late Sir Thomas Boughey of

Aqualate, Shropshire, England, and of a strain that had been in the Boughey family for over one hundred years. There is one dog in the group of four sitting on a kennel bench, a dog that has its double in a Springer of the pure Aqualate blood, which I possess at the present day. A more kindly, word-understanding creature I have never known, and I may be excused for the priggishness that suggests that "Roger" surely must be a cut above the common. I like to look upon him as belonging to a sporting, working breed, fostered and kept pure by a famous sporting family for over six score years. But even that fairly long period of time—were as nothing when we consider the Spaniels of Europe—more especially those of Italy and England during the 16th and 17th Centuries.

Spaniel that was to lose its breed name among the few and regain it among the many. The holding of the first field trials for Spaniels, in or about the year 1902, was responsible for bringing the real working Spaniels of England under the instant notice of the public, with the result that only eager, unafraid of cover, bustling, active dogs proved to be the best and most prized.

So there and then were shattered all the hopes and prospects of the "fancier" breeders of the long-bodied and short-legged Field Spaniels of the late Victorian era.

The first spaniel to win at an English Field Trial was a lightly-built, narrow-headed, sharp-nosed Clumber Spaniel called Beechwood Bee, the property of the late Winton Smith, who was responsible for the earlier Springer Spaniels imported into Ontario, Canada. Beechwood was an E.K.C. registered prefix. The Smith dogs, of all the gun dog breeds, bred, bought or sold by him, bore the Beechgrove trademark—for such it really was. Mr. Smith had his kennels, breaking grounds and game preserve in Hertfordshire, close to London. On a buyer going to Beechwood, he was asked to pick out the dog he thought he would like. If the dog was "ready" or broken, the spaniel, setter, pointer, or retriever was immediately taken into the fields or woods and hied on to find game. A bird being sprung or a rabbit driven out by the spaniel, it was shot. Thereupon the spaniel (or retriever) was ordered to retrieve the dead or running creature. The buyer and seller being satisfied as to the value of the dog, there was an end to the transaction.

The buyer had to go to Smith; for Smith would send no dog on approval to anybody. This was a sound business method, and on Mr. Smith's Beechgrove gun dogs being found satisfactory, were sent to all quarters of the globe.

The pedigrees of the older springers in North America often bear the names of Beechgrove dogs. But these clerical particulars do not mean that the spaniels were bred by Smith of Beechgrove. On the other hand, they were acquired in several ways. Smith's supplies for the foreign and home markets, were mostly obtained from the kennels of English country gentlemen, or gamekeepers allowed to keep and break a dog or two, to sell in the usual way at the proper season. So Smith's dogs came from practical gun dog men to another experienced person who had been a keeper. All of these gun dogs were labelled "Beechgrove" sold to the visiting purchasers who had been enabled to see with their own eyes what a pointer, setter, spaniel, or retriever could accomplish as a working, honest dog. Winton Smith was sending springer spaniels abroad late in the last century; indeed, that genial, far-seeing man must have been the pioneer in the export Springer Spaniel business.

It is not at all strange to discover that the first springer spaniel registered as a "springer" spaniel in the 1910 A.K.C. Stud Book, was bred by F. Winton Smith. Her name was Denne Lucy (14264); she was whelped on Jan.

30, 1908. Lucy was by Beechgrove Donaldson and out of Beechgrove Clara. "Beechgrove" and "Cottonham" appear in the three-generations pedigree of Denne Lucy.

The honor for importing the first A.K.C. registered springer, belongs to Mr. Hobart Ames, North Easton, Mass. It would appear that the Ames family still takes delight in its Springers for, as I write, a letter from Wales records that some time ago Mr. Ames, while in Britain, purchased two pure and long-pedigreed Welsh Springer Spaniels. Seemingly these white-and-red-marked spaniels will now lose their A.K.C. official status as "Welsh" springers. They must become a part of the conglomeration of spaniels, undergoing a process of assimilation in a sort of melting pot.


The first pure Welsh springers to be imported, according to the records, were brought over here by Mr. A. A. Busch of St. Louis, Mo., who is still interested in springers and field trials for spaniels. Mr. Busch's earlier white-and-red springers were Butter of Llan, Longmynd Twig, Nancy and Topsy of Llan. The Longmynd strain, as owned by Mrs. Green, in Mid-Wales, was typical of the old Welsh breed with which—as a Welshman—I have been acquainted since boyhood days. The Busch springers

were registered in 1911, during which year only two Black Field Spaniels appeared in the A.K.C. Stud Book. These were Saybrook Morning and Saybrook Midnight owned by the late Mr. R. P. Keasbey of New York City.

Just as the field trials of 1903 and onwards upset the applecart of the breeders of the very long-bodied and short-legged field spaniels in England, so the first field trials held in 1922, near Winnipeg, Can-

ada, acted as a lever to open the eyes of North American shooting men, regarding the great value of the hard and fast working spaniels, silent on their game. It is true that now and then a springer will use his tongue, but, as a rule, the English Springer is mute.

In the Terrier Group, Wilkinson Spence of Vancouver won Best Dog or Bitch with his Smooth Fox Terrier, Brincliffe Beau Brummel, and Wm. Forrest of Calgary, Best Opposite Sex with his Scottish Terrier, Dinah of Tayside (Imp.).

In the Toy Group, George Kynoch made an easy win with his beautiful Pomeranian, Golden Merry Thought (Imp.), a lovely bitch who will make make them all step. Mrs. C. G. Budd of Edmonton won Best Opposite Sex with her red Pekingese Bitch, Ku San of Shantung.

The echoes of our more recent shows in Saskatchewan are still to be heard and will continue to reverberate until drowned out by the reports of shows to come. Saskatoon held another classy affair the last week of July and many new faces both in dogs and exhibitors were seen.

The adjudicating was in the hands of Mr. C. W. Twaites of Medicine Hat, Alberta, and he took all pains to give the best satisfaction he possibly could. He went over the exhibits in a careful and painstaking manner and placed them as he saw them.

The work of Superintendent was in the capable hands of Mr. J. C. Watt (Jock) and he did his work well. He is especially to be commended for trying to enforce the regulations as laid down by the C. K. C. It is a well known fact that many of these regulations are ignored by some of the exhibitors. In this, the older exhibitors whom we expect to be models for the younger generation are generally the worst offenders. Some of them seem to think that these rules are all right for Toronto, but any old slipshod methods will do for the smaller shows. Mr. Watt couldn't see it that way and right here we say he is right, and deserves the commendation and support of everyone who wishes to put our sport on a higher plane.

Mr. J. M. Ayre our enthusiastic Secretary had everything in ship-shape and this contributed largely to the success of this show. This show was held in conjunction with the Saskatoon Industrial Exhibition and the officers of the Kennel Club greatly appreciate the co-operation of the Exhibition Board. Major Gunn acts as the special representative of the Fair Board in connection with the dog show and is splendidly backed up by Mr. Sid. Johns the Secretary and the Manager of the big Exhibition. The Kennel Club can always count on Mr. Johns and find it a great help to receive his hearty support.

We also noticed the President Mr. G. C. Hanselman and our Sask. Director Dr. Cooper lending a hand towards making the show a success and the happy meeting place of fanciers from far and near for which it has an enviable reputation.

The luncheon put on by the Exhibition Board to all exhibitors and members of the Kennel Club was a very pleasant affair and "a good time was

had by all." A report of this show would be very unfair indeed if mention was not made of the ladies who are members of the Kennel Club. When workers are needed these same ladies are right there and ready for the word "Go." Among many other activities, they undertook to provide the wherewithall to cover the expense of the catalogue and they did it in grand style. Good boys, Ladies!!

The best dog in show was Champion Missy of Harwood, a beautiful Labrador Retriever owned by Mr. James Bell of Limerick, Sask., and handled in faultless style by Mr. Harry Selby of Regina. This handsome bitch is no new comer to the show ring, but she was certainly at her best on this day and walked away with a barrellful of silverware including the Hoeschen Cup for best retriever, the Pinder Cup for the best sporting dog, the Birks' Trophy for best dog or bitch owned by a Saskatoon member of the C. K. C. (specially donated to increase the Sask. membership in the C. K. C.), and the Dr. J. T. Cooper Cup for the best in show. Surely Mr. Bell can well feel proud of this wonderful bitch.

The C. K. C. Cup for best Canadian Bred Dog (and the most coveted cup in Canada) was won by Mr. Geo. Kynock's, Mark's Samson handled by his owner. The group winners were Sporting Dog, the above mentioned Labrador; working dog the Collie Elmhill Molly; non-sporting the bulldog Mark's Samson; Toy Geo. Patton's Pomeranian Armois Flashaway, and Terrier Mrs. J. D. Wade's Scottish Terrier Ornetsia Tartan.

We harped somewhat last year on "condition" in the show ring and again this year we noted that condition often changed the awards. Sometimes we wonder if a superior dog should be turned down in favor of a poorer one and the judge's explanation is just "that one is in poor bloom." Anyhow that's the way it goes and we say again "get them in shape."

Another thing we noted and have been wondering if it is orthodox. Some exhibitors plan to have a handler in the ring with their dog and auxiliary or accessory handlers all around the ring. These all strive by various methods that you may have noticed to get a win for this particular dog. Is this good sportsmanship? Think it

over boys and frown on it if it deserves a frown.

The Regina show followed close on the heels of Saskatoon. The Queen city can always be counted on when it comes to a good dog show. The management had employed the well-known Mr. Enno Meyer to do the placing. Mr. Meyer is no novice at the game. In fact, he is an expert that is hard to beat and his honesty has never been questioned. The Regina Board deserve the greatest praise for bringing to Western Canada the best judges obtainable anywhere on the continent. Besides having a good judge, the Regina Show is run in a very systematic manner and is one of Canada's best shows. Mr. Keating, the Secretary and Manager is to be complimented on the success that attends his efforts.

Judge Meyer found his best dog in Geo. Kynock's top-hole Cocker Champion Nahor Lottery. I understand this Cocker won best puppy any variety at Crufts in 1926 and he is still a hard one to fault. He was handled in a matchless way by Mr. Harry Selby of Regina, who also has to his credit the handling of the best in show at Saskatoon. Harry is a real ring general and knows exactly how to bring out the best in his charges and he knows what a dog ought to be as well. We pass the palm to Harry when it comes to judging or handling any breed of dog.

A breed of dog seldom seen in Western Canada is the French Bull-dog. However, this year the redoubtable George Kynock was to the fore with a "rare" specimen. The writer had the honor of leading this dog into the ring at Regina and won a handful of ribbons and some kind advice from Enno Meyer.

The visit of many exhibitors to Regina show was made particularly pleasant by the kind hospitality of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Selby and Mr. and Mrs. A. P. Semple. Their kindness was very much appreciated by all.

Your scribe was highly pleased to meet at Regina an old Regina resident in the person of Mr. Robert Foster, who now resides in California and is President of the California Chow Club. He was greatly interested in the show in general but did not fail to boost for the Chows. He extends an invitation to all interested in his fav-

ourite breed to visit him in California and he promises to show them something good in the Chow line. From what we saw of Mr. Foster in Regina we would like to visit him in California if there was not a blooming Chow in the State.

Mr. Charles E. Haile of Lestock showed a mighty good Chesapeake at Regina and he walked away with the jewelry. Mr. Haile raises a fine type of this useful variety of sporting dog.

We were greatly pleased to see recently a beautiful photo of a handsome Collie. This was the dog Elmhill Alandale sold by Dr. Cooper to Mr. W. G. Hassell of New Westminster, B.C. This dog recently went to best of breed at the big Victoria show and speaks well for the kind of Collies that are being raised in Saskatoon.

When it comes to boosting an entry to a show you can well depend on the "Old Reliable" George Kynock. This year he carried with him about thirty choice dogs. Included in his string was a Chow belonging to Mrs. O. E. Balch, Chicago, and a Samoyede the property of Mrs. M. F. Humphries of the Siberian Kennels, Westerly, Rhode Island. George deserves the greatest praise for the excellent care he takes of his dogs on this long circuit. Early in the morning and late at night you will see him about administering to the comforts of his dogs and getting them in shape "to show to win."

A local fancier of the sagacious Poodle, Mrs. Eagle, informs me that her Mighty Atom was runner up for best toy in show at Moose Jaw. He's a real Poodle and looks as important as a Lion.

Such close line-breeding was only made possible through the using of O. Rosita, which was completely unrelated to her mate O. General in producing O. Johnny Alex.

O. Victor's dam, O. Colleen, boasts of Ch. Prides Hill Tweakem and Ch. Homeless Ector as grand-sires and Ch. Wireboy of Paignton as great grand sire, which brings Wireboy to a total of 8-32 of the whole pedigree.

Mr. Vanier is not a new-comer in the field of dog breeding. Firefly 3rd came from his kennels and she has produced many winners for Mr. Harry T. Smallcombe of Montreal, the two

last out at the Montreal shows being Guinea Gold Cash and Iclas Ramona, both sired by Kold Kash. Both M. M. Vanier and Smallcombe are stickers for substance. They have no use for the whippet fox terriers, they breed for bone and vitality and the judges never fail to note these points and their dogs are always in the money. They use the best studs available and they get a good demand and good prices for their puppies.

Somebody was asking Mr. Vanier: "Don't you think the fees of the Ormsby studs rather high?" He replied: "They produce the goods and I always get a better price for the puppies." He is on the road to Successville all right.

Jean qui pleure, Jean qui rit. Am both at the same time. Sorry that Mr. Capel has sold out all his smooth fox terriers and glad that a game French-Canadian bought them all. And who do you think bought them? J. O. Pelletier, the manager of Central Hotel, Hull.

The Fourth Annual Specialty Show of the Shepherd Dog Club of Canada was held at the beautiful grounds of the Toronto Hunt Club on Saturday, August 3rd, and for the first time in the Club's history the weather man decided to be quite disagreeable, as if to challenge the "Old Boy's" power to have things all his own way the puppy class was judged on the spacious lawn, and during the judging old "Jup" turned the tap open far enough to make slickers look ridiculous, and the argument was ended when the judge, exhibitors and gallery headed for shelter pell mell.

In numbers the entry was below par, in quality it far exceeded all previous years, and it was no sinecure for the judge, Arthur Sickinger of Boston, Mass. 
### JUDGES' REPORT.

Special to Kennel and Bench.

By Arthur Sickinger, Esq.

I must admit that the quality at this show pleased me very much. There was the creme a la creme of shepherddom, namely the German Sieger of this year—German reserve Siegerin, who is also the Holland Siegerin of 1929, and the Austrian Siegerin, 1927. All three top notchers! I understand from my good friend "Jimmie" Strachan, while at the Westminster this Spring, that the dropping off on shepherd entries had been very noticeable in this season.

However, when a judge is confronted with such remarkable quality it more than makes up for the deficiency in numbers or the often padded entries of quantity. I wish to take this opportunity to say "many thanks" to my friends in the States who so generously contributed those "complimentary entries." From former

associations among the "doggy battlefields" in Canada I was quite certain it was WET, but who would like the wetness in the form of rain? Because of the deluge we were forced to leave the spaciousness of an ideal outside ring, for what appeared to be, a discarded exercising ring for horses, in one of the nearby buildings. The ground was very rough indeed, and full of holes, which at times was disadvantageous to the showing of gait. I noticed an improvement in temperament as over the previous year. Shepherd dog breeding is working dog breeding, therefore one may readily see the importance of temperament, (no matter whether the dog is actually working or otherwise). There is danger combined with any shy or over sharp animal! over-sharpness is just another indication of shyness, and we do not want either of these traits in our shepherd breeding. I would be certain that the nerves of your breeding partners are strong and steady, for in my experience I have observed how more often are the undesirable shortcomings of the parents transmitted to the offspring than the favorable, and here too, let us not forget that temperament is fifty per cent. of a working dog.

May I suggest to you also to make your Shepherds your companion dogs, and if this cannot be done with many, then limit your stock to one. He will more than repay you with his pal-ship and devotion. In my long years with our Shepherd dogs, and I have also had plenty experience with other races, I have concluded that they demand more affection than any other breed. There may be exceptions of course, but the desire for affection and human-nearness is an inherently, strong characteristic of the Shepherd. He cannot be thrust into a kennel like so many other breeds, and be expected to thrive there, he must have cleanliness, human companionship, and a very great deal of affection. Therefore, I urge you to take those little fellows out when two or three months old, and bring them into the "noisy world." Place them in homes where they may be raised and educated to become "worthy citizens," instead of keeping them like criminals—prisoners behind the wire bars of a kennel, and above all, give your Shepherd the attention and affection he requires to make him a true and worthy representative of his splendid race.

After this side step I will go back to the show. Yes, temperament seems to have improved; a great step forward for Canadian breeders, then too, I noticed a getting away from

the over-built hindquarters, the long legs, and going closer to the ground. All in all it was a pleasure to be again with my Canadian friends and to pass upon their dogs. My hearty wishes to the club for many more successful shows, and many thanks for the royal hospitality. To Madame Ring Stewardess, my appreciation for the tireless and efficient manner in which she assisted me. (How about it, Billo Bex?)

### Novice Dogs.

1. 32.—Emo v. Bergholtz, Ch. Emir v. Sudenberg-Ch. Alla v. Krone. Very clean type, nice structure, pleasing balance, good substance, very good temperament; has for his age four-

teen months, very good loin, nice croup, strong back, very good angulations fore and rear, generally speaking needs filling out. Very good propelling power, long reaching gait. Needs more fore chest. Plenty time as he is young.

2. 15.—Arko v. Prinzenhof, Xeres des Renardieries-Elsa Hergellust. A more finished dog in general although he must stretch out more for pleasing balance, loses to Emo on general impression and gait. Very ruggedly set up with long dry muscles, slightly bound in fore step.

3. 19.—Albert, Aribert v. Kraeheninsel-Lucky. A very nice one, general impression pleasing, good substance, very good fore fore angulation, good power, springy gait. With more assurance of temperament could have earned a higher place.

There comes into the ring in this class a well known Canadian Campaigner whom I reluctantly leave unplaced because of chorea, and a weak under-shot jaw, which is a very serious fault and one not to be overlooked in a breeding animal.

Ideal in size, quiet, sure temperament, evenly balanced, splendid substance, well knit, dry body of his sire and the best of angulations fore and rear, tremendous depth of chest, deep middle piece with long high withers. Excellent strength of back, and powerfully assembled hindquarters, in moving shows great fore reach, excellent transmission from rear through the back, co-ordinating perfectly with fore quarters and covering the ground with easy free stride. I have heard Utz's head, described as being "plain and heavy"; it impresses me as being beautifully modelled, combining great strength with nobility and proportioned to the body.

# CENTRAL CANADA'S DOG SHOWS

This year the appeal from Ottawa for two dog shows in four days, with different judges for both shows was received enthusiastically by the faithful who follow the shows, and resulted in two fixtures with a point value of possibly two points for each show.

The Ottawa shows make other appeals too, for isn't Ottawa the capital of Canada? It is, and besides, our Ottawa friends have their own way of bringing the fanciers to their shows, year after year.

It has been felt for some time that the enthusiasm of the dog show lagged before the end of the fourth day and so it was arranged for two shows, and the arrangement was quite a success. The interest was maintained in a satisfactory manner and the old saying, that "What is one man's meat is another man's poison" was noticeably something as a truism, as the winners under one judge failed to do as well under the other. We like to see a near appraisal of merit by all our judges, but if they all saw our dogs through the same spectacles the spice of our sport would lose its strength to bring us so often together in competition.

The Dog Show Committee was again under the direction of Ald. W. R. Low, who had his men active and on the job throughout the show. "Jack" Ferguson was the Ring Steward as usual, and we have sung Jack's praises in this respect so often, that to do so again would be tantamount to "painting the lily". "Art" Davis was Superintendent, and he knows how. "Teddy" Gunderson had charge of getting the press supplied with the awards, and we are indebted to him for making the awards possible here.

The quality of the show was quite remarkable and many valuable dogs were benched. How they fared at the hands of the judges will be seen in the awards. Walter H. Reeves, Belleville, Ont., started first for the Ottawa Kennel Club Show, and was followed by Chas. G. Hopton, New York, who took up the burden for the Central Canada Exhibition for the second show.

It was noticeable that Mr. Hopton was not in his usual health and we believe that ere this report appears in print, he will be en route to the Motherland at the advice of his medical advisers. Mr. Hopton hopes to be back in the United States again in early November.


