

Wednesday afternoon with Dr. W. B.S. Thomas doing the honors. This was the doctor's first assignment in Canada and from the impression he made here his services will be in great demand. Dr. Thomas has judged many shows in the U.S.A. and from all reports gave satisfaction. His articles appear in one of the larger magazines across the border and are much sought after. Dr. Thomas who has a large kennel of English and Springer Spaniels in Dover-Foxcroft, Maine, had as his ring steward his kennel manager, Mrs. Coffey who carried out her dut-

NOTES FROM THE EDITOR'S DIARY

S UNDAY morning, August 6th, found the M. S. Ida Bakke, ready to move into the Panama Canal as soon as she had taken up her pilot. We had arrived in Panama Bay some time during the night, and had lain at anchor awaiting the start of the business day at the locks. Everything looked exceptionally rosey for the pleasures of whatever the day was to bring forth in this jungle-tropical locality. Arriving on deck at 6.30 o'clock the picture that awaited our inspection was one of wonder. The greenery of the hills and the level places was of various hues, and running all the way from a dark green to a green that was so light as to be almost transparent. Everywhere the eye wandered there was something de-manding attention. Our experience of jungle country, and of the tropical lands had been derived entirely from books, and from moving pictures, but here it was in all its grandeur, spread in profuse prodigality.

At 9.45 the pilot came on board, immediately afterwards Agent of the Knutsen Line also came aboard, and with him the last mail we would receive this side of the Atlantic, and there were 14 pieces for the writer, and each piece called for the courtesy of attention at once, if the agent was to take care of our mailing when we got to the last lock, so really much of the pleasure of the day was sacrificed because of that. But as we ground out the necessary replies, first one would come to our replies, first one would come to our window, then another, the command always the same "bring your camera" —"bring your camera", we did our best, but did lose a lot of the glamour associated with one of the world's greatest feats in engineering — The Panama Canal.

Being naturally inquisitive we spent as much of our day as was possible interrogating the pilot on the bridge and fortunately he was friendly, well versed and communi-

The line of the Canal goes up the valley of the Chagres River on the Atlantic Slope, passes through the Continental Divide at Gailard Cut and descends to the Pacific Ocean down the valley of the Ric Grande. The disthe valley of the Rio Grande. The distance through the locks, from the deep water of the Pacific to the deep water of the Carribean is 50 miles. It takes 8 hours to steer a ship through the locks.

Entering the Canal from the Bay of Panama (Pacific) at Balboa, where a lovely tropical city of that name seemed to suggest, that since we had lost so much of our scheduled time, that a day could be spent nicely there, but a freight ship, is always a freight ship, and a ship's freight is always exactly where it can be collected profitably, and its passengers list must be always content to be satisfied as far as the time schedule is con-cerned, the quarters are first rate, and the dining room is its own best advertisement. The Captain and his associates make the social life of the ship all that can be desired.

From Balboa we enter the Miraflores Lock, and find ourselves being raised 75 feet, then on to Pedro Miguel, and up still higher, the little electric mules, compact but powerful

make sure that there are no delaying of the ships progress through. Opening into Gatun Bay we pass into the Gatun lock, from there into Colon Bay, and on into the Carribean.

The grandeur of the tropical greens after a sun shower baffles description further than to say they are mag-nificently beautiful, the palms were everywhere, and they held their own attraction. The golf course is full size, and looks like what we visualize paradise to be. As we scan the shores we notice a stir on the muddy-sandy short, and sure enough there is "old man alligator" himself. We pass a large avenue of coco-nut palms, and each one laden with fruit in the ripen-



"The frequent comment that a dog cannot be happy or well in town is just not true. If it were then all the dogs would have been dead long ago. It is once more a question of the owner's consideration for his pet.

FIELD TRIAL RESULTS

Field Trial enthusiasts in Winnipeg were treated to two trials for Spaniels (other than water spaniels) on September 9th and 16th. The former event was sponsored by the pioneer club the Gun Dog Club of Manitoba at Fort Whyte. Nineteen cockers and springers were entered and the crowd were treated to some nice exhibitions were treated to some nice exhibitions of trained gun dog work. The Judges were Messrs A. Blackie and A. B. Adamson who did a nice job. Official guns Messrs J. Baldner and W. J. Sturges and the gallery were treated to a superb exhibition of gunning. Not a bird escaped and the majority killed alcally with light diseated and of some property of the state of the superbola of t cleanly with light skeet loads of seven and a half shot.

Live Pheasants bred locally were used. In the Open All Age Stake and Open Puppy Stake the dogs were allowed two birds each with the purpose of testing each dog thoroughly and doing away with that element of chance in a lucky fall of a bird. The birds were caught the night previous with gloved hands and placed in specially constructed crates and from there, when required at the trial, were transferred without being touched by hand into a cleverly constructed trap from which they could be released by the simple pulling of a cord by an operator well hidden about thirty yards away. The traps are so constructed that when placed on the ground loaded with the pheasant the floor can be removed leaving the bird on the ground and all that is required is the gentle pulling of the entire trap from over the pheasant. It is a cleverly constructed machine. and not a bird flushed of its own volition, but all flew strongly when located by the bustling spaniel. A considerable im-provement in the work of the dogs was noticed over the preceding year and the Club is doing a splendid work in the encouragement of the use of trained dogs in field and marsh. Quite noticeable were the merry little cockers, who were conspicuous by their absence at previous events.

"Fascinating Beau of Ware", owned by Mr. G. A. Carruthers, was top dog of the day winning the Open All Age stake. Second in the All Age was the Springer "David Dick of Avondale", owned and handled by H. S. Scarth. Third place was taken by the writer's Springer, "Hazeldel Myrtle", handled by W. Corson. W. Corson.

On Saturday, Sept. 16th the Sporting Dog Club of Western Canada held their Annual Trial at Charleswood and had an excellent entry of thirty-one springers and cockers. The day was ideal and a large crowd was on hand. The Judge was Mr. Windsor T. White of Cleveland, Ohio. Official Guns Messrs A. E. Brodie and W. Green. Live pheasants were also used and were, I understand, imported for the purpose. This club does not believe the trap method of release according to their announcement over the radio, and used instead the method of catching the birds from their crate by a lad with rubber gloved hands, taking them to the place designated, swung around until dizzied and then released. It was quite fortunate that quite a number of the birds were entirely able to fly but in some instances made a poor job of running; thus several dogs were treated to the almost undeniable opportunity of breaking by having to chase a running pheasant over entirely clear terrain. Not many spaniels that I have seen will drop at the sight of a running bird; rather they will endeavour to retrieve it. How-ever, apart from this trait of the pheasants, which are well known to be as foxy a game bird as is to be found anywhere and a very pleasing day was enjoyed by all. The crowd was handled in a very efficient man-ner, and personally I enjoyed every minute.

GEORGE LYDIATT LEAVES THE RANKS

ANADA lost one of her most loved and respected dog fanciers when George Lydiatt passed away September 14. A pioneer of the glass industry in Canada Mr. Lydiatt was a director of the Dominion Glass Co. with which he had been associated since its inception twenty-seven years ago.

A native of St. Helena, Lancashire, England, he came to Canada in 1872 with his parents. As a youth he went to Ontario's North Bay district where he pioneered a farm, his only aid being a team of oxen.

After learning rudiments of the glass industry with his father at Cobourg, Ont. he joined the Sydenham Glass Co. and became the western representative when that Company merged with the Diamond Glass Co. to become the Dominion Glass Co. He was manager of the Redcliff, Alta. plant from 1913 until he came to Vancouver in 1925.


About 1905 Mr. Lydiatt was showing English Bulldogs in Ontario in fact showing them all over Canada and U.S.A. Two of his best friends at that time that are present day fanciers were Mr. Irving and Mr. Meadows. One of his best known dogs then was "Peggy Stone" an English Bulldog who not only went to the top in Canada but in U.S.A. also.

Mr. Lydiatt had a very lovely home and kennel situated in beautiful grounds part of which was left in its natural state with huge evergreens and flowers growing everywhere. His special jov was to entertain his doggie friends in the "log cabin" that anyone would have been proud to own. It is beautifully furnished and had many pictures and certificates of his dogs and cups galore that completely filled the huge mantle over the fire-Many out of town fanciers were entertained here.

A great many of Mr. Lydiatt's doggie friends were present at the funeral to pay their last respects to one we all loved and respected as a gentleman. To Mrs. Lydiatt and his Mrs. Graeme (his daughter) and Walter Lydiatt who lives in Toronto we extend deepest sympathy.
