MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CANADIAN KENNEL CLUB, MAY 16th, 1940

THE regular monthly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club, Inc., was held in the Board room of the Club's offices, 25 Melinda St., Toronto, Ont., on Thursday afternoon, May 16th, 1940, at 2.00 o'clock. The President, "Reg." P. Sparkes presided. Directors present included: Walter H. Reeves, Dr. H. E. Batt, Mrs. E. Brown, Wm. McDerment, W. J. Risewick and F. W. Walkerdine.

It was regularly moved by Mrs. Brown, seconded by Mr. Walkerdine and carried:

"That the Minutes of the meeting of the Board of Directors held April 18th, as read, be adopted."

The Secretary reported that following the last meeting of the Board, arrangements had been made with the Election Commission for the distribution of the referendum ballots which had since been mailed, and further that a specimen ballot had been forwarded to the Deputy Minister of Agriculture as instructed. The Deputy Minister's letters of May 7th and May 10th were read. The Secretary was instructed to forward a copy of Dr. Barton's letter dated May 10th to all Directors not present and that in the meantime the letter be laid on the table. The President stated that a good many members appeared to be under the impression that the marking of the ballot was compulsory and that the result of the ballot would be binding on the Board of Directors. These impressions he had sought to dispel wherever and whenever possible; the members were not obliged to return their ballot if they did not wish to do so and further the ballot was only intended to be for the information of the Board of Directors. The question had been referred to the members throughout the country merely to secure a consensus of opinion. The President reported on his meeting a committee appointed by those attending an informal meeting held in Toronto on May 6th.

The Secretary reported that he had received several letters from Mr. W. H. Pym regarding the approval of judges for shows held outside the Province of Ontario and after a general discussion, it was regularly moved by Mrs. Brown, seconded by Mr. Risewick and carried:

"That the selection of judges for shows to be held outside the Province of Ontario be referred to the Provincial Director for the attention of their Provincial Committees for consideration and report before being submitted to the Board of Directors for attention, and that in future judges will be approved only at the regular meetings of the Board of Directors."

DOG SHOW TECHNIQUE

By REG. SPARKES, Toronto
(President Canadian Kennel Club, Inc.)

I HAVE often desired to have a few words with "Dogs In Canada" readers about the matter of dog shows generally, and particularly of the manifest obligations of the show-giving club managements to The Canadian Kennel Club on the one hand and to the dog exhibiting public on the other hand. I frankly concede that this subject is a broad one and that it can only be considered from the viewpoint of experience and with much sympathy.

When a show-giving club decides to hold its show, one of its chief considerations might well be the matter of a generous time allowance, plenty of time to do justice to the fixture from start to finish in every respect, having in mind that the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club only meets once in each month and that such Board meetings is held, usually, on the third Thursday of each month.

The two important services that must receive the attention of the Board of Directors are: First, application for show date (or dates); second, application for the approval of the judge (or judges). There should be no requests made for telegraphic, telephonic, or air mail attention in respect to any one (or either) of these services. It is quite true that our Secretary-Treasurer has been constitutionally vested with the power of Manager and it is just possible that some of our club managements seek to take undue advantages of the Secretary's powers, but it should also be remembered that the Secretary only acts under the control and with the approval of the Board of Directors, and the Directors and myself are fully cognizant of the fact that the Secretary understands and appreciates the limits of his powers, and that he has no desire to exceed his authority under any circumstances although it is thoroughly understood that he is always anxious to co-operate with the show-giving club officials to his limit at all times. As a matter of fact, if the show-giving clubs would only show that measure of co-operation with the Secretary, that he is always so willing to show to them, there would be very little need for this article to be written, therefore, I must insist on all clubs allowing a safe margin of time to have dates approved of and their judges approved of by the Board of Directors at their regular monthly meetings. The approval of the premium list will have the attention of the Secretary-Treasurer as heretofore.

Other considerations that should never be overlooked, if a successful and profitable dog show is expected to consummate the efforts of the clubs

workers: A suitable date must be secured, this, and a competent judge (or judges) will go a long way towards creating the appeal that will attract the entry, and if you are really interested in the success of the fixture, your premium list will show the extent of your efforts. Then prizes to be won should be offered in such a way that they could be allocated almost automatically. As for instance any prize offered for the best in male Puppy Class or in female Puppy Class could be immediately determined by looking at the blackboard or reference to the judges book. This policy might easily govern all the prizes to be offered and all prizes donated that cannot be allocated on this plan, could be declined to great advantage. These remarks about prizes refer to the regular breed classes only and do not refer to the Group prizes or the prize for Best in Show or Best Canadian-bred.

It will be wise not to overlook the powerful appeal of cash prizes and this attraction may safely be adopted by any club; the amount of the cash prizes offered to be controlled by the number of entries and of course by the amount of the entry fee.

Then of course there is the matter of the gate to be considered and here the club should endeavour to attract the patronage of the general public, and if this patronage is available, and it usually is, then consideration must be given to the comfort of the public. It is very, very important that Mr. and Mrs. John Public be catered to and that they should be given no cause for offense. Keep the rings bright and attractive and the aisles always clean.

There is nothing about a dog show from start to finish that should not be pleasing to everybody concerned. Secure the dates in the regular manner. Have your judges approved of officially by the Board of Directors, and there can be no substitute for this very important service. Have your premium list approved of. Let your judges and prize list be your strongest entry attractions. Give your exhibitors the smile and the handshake that will assure them of your welcome. Co-operate with them within the limits of your club rules and the rules of The Canadian Kennel Club and you may look for and anticipate receiving the exhibitor's co-operation in return.

When the deplorable condition of dogdom in Europe on account of war restrictions is considered, fanciers on the American continent have every good reason to appreciate the fact that the sport of breeding and exhibiting has suffered no restrictions to speak of on this side of the Atlantic.

OUR FRONTISPIECE

For this issue we are pleased to feature Mrs. Richard S. Quigley's sensational winning Pekingese, English Champion "Remenham Derrie of Orchard Hill". We use the word "sensational" advisedly, feeling that the word could be substituted by the word "phenomenal" and still we would be correct in our choice of words. "Remenham Derrie" was born on January 15th, 1938, sired by "Diamond of Ashcroft" and out of "Remenham Marigold", and was bred by Mrs. M. Vlasto, Hants, England.

The brilliant wins which marked this dogs triumphal march to championship status in England included the following important engagements in the summer of 1939: June 6th, The Pekingese Club (London), Judge J. B. Royce; June 7th, Birks, Bucks and Oxon Canine Association (Windsor), Judge Commander Warren; July 4th, Richmond Dog Show Society (Richmond), Judge Mrs. H. Coade; July 13th, South Wales Kennel Association, Cardiff, Judge Mrs. H. J. Weaver. The most distinguishing mark of "Remenham Derrie of Orchard Hills" career was the winning of the 1939 English Pekingese Clubs Gold Medal which is awarded annually for the Best Dog of the Year.

At Westminster Kennel Club show the English Peke star was spoken of in the Press Room as having "arrived in the United States and that he would be well worth watching", and sure enough he won for Best Peke in rather hectic competition. He went on to the Group a hot favourite to win but he had to be content with the second station on that day. The judge was Mrs. Harry L. Sears, but since then our feature dog has made his presence strongly felt at every show that he has attended, as for instance best Toy at Boston, Detroit, Chicago, Richmond and Alexandria, Best Dog in Show at Norfolk, Va.; in Canada Best Toy and Group at Toronto Kennel Club show, Best Toy and Group at London, Best in Show all breeds at Chatham; a further analysis shows Best Toy 10 times and Best in Show 3 times. He is already well on his way to Tri-International Championship honours so we must excuse his proud owner for her pride of ownership in such a wonderful specimen of the Pekingese breed.

THE MORRIS AND ESSEX SHOW

FOR the first time in fourteen years, Madison's sunshine feature weather did not materialize for the 1940 Morris and Essex Dog Show. In the early morning, the green polo field was beautiful despite the slow heavy mist, reminding one of an English countryside in April, but by the close of the day it was almost waterlogged. Mrs. Geraldine M. Dodge was perhaps the most cheerful person on the entire grounds, and to all who proffered their sympathy for the unpleasant weather condition, her reply, accompanied by a smile that was at all times radiant, was "It could be much worse, couldn't it". Judging in the open and beneath canvas was well under way by the starting hour and the parking accommodations were packed long before noon.

The breeds to be judged by lady adjudicators and the long haired breeds particularly were judged under canvas at the extension ends of the "big tops" where such breeds were benched and really there was only the minimum of discomfort discernable as far as this scribe could notice. The huge grandstand, which had been specially built to accommodate 5,000 persons where the Group and Best in Show features were being staged was rather desolate looking in its wet jacket. We have often visualized the possible exhibitor and general public possibilities of such an arrangement and trust that it will be available for future years under more propitious weather conditions. Imagine a grandstand extending the full width of the Polo field, with 12 rows of seats rising "circus style" to an unobstructed view and you will be able to visualize the service we are trying to describe. It is simply a gift from the gods and should be so recognized.

The judging went on as usual and in as many rings as formerly, only it was something of a hardship to navigate from ring to ring with a cautious step if one was to retain the perpendicular position. Tempers appeared to be well under control, smiles took on a grimace but scowls were taboo on the day.

As the main grounds became available a small army of expert gardeners converted the soggy field into a miniature bower of flowers. The usual floral centerpiece, that everyone is familiar with, had as an extension the letters M.E. on each end, and for the necessary Club colours Marigolds and purple Petunias furnished the "purple and gold" effect in extravagant abundance, a delightful setting that only required the weatherman's endorsement to have become a real gem of thoughtful effort. In any case the sponsor of the idea is deserving of much praise for its elegance and certain possibilities under more favourable conditions.

It was in the very heart of this picture that the Groups yielded their choicest specimens and in the final line-up for Best in Show were included the Afghan Hound, "Ch. Rudiki of Pride's Hill" owned by the Blakeen Kennels which made it a double on the day; this Kennel having also scored with the French Poodle in the Non-sporting group. The Sporting group was headed once again by an English Setter, Mrs. A. B. Duke's

"Champion Maro of Maridor" in exquisite bloom and shown to perfection. The Working group provided one of the few surprises of the day when Walter H. Reeves of Belleville, Ont., paid a great compliment to the Waseeka Kennels by placing the consistent winner, "Ch. Barnacle Bill of Waseeka", in top place. The Kerry Blue Terriers brought the largest entry on the day (95) and were generously rewarded when "Tanjax Flying Scotsman" owned by Harry Isaacs won the Terrier Group. It was one of the most popular group wins of the day according to the vote of the ringside as recorded by their cheering. The Toy Group was headed by a recent campaigner in Canada, the Pekingese, "Ch. Remenham Derrie of Orchard Hill" owned by Mrs. R. S. Quigley.

Whilst it will be noticed from the foregoing that no Canadian dog reached the finals, nevertheless, it will be found that they were well represented in the award columns. The outstanding win of the day was that of the English Cocker Spaniel, "Danny of Sherrygroom" owned by Mrs. C. Gordon MacKinnon of Montreal. Out of an entry of forty eight, "Danny" won Best of Variety, a richly deserved win. In the Hound Group, W. C. Baldwin of Ottawa came through with the American Foxhound, "Baldwin's Carmen" to win Best of Breed and we do not hesitate to offer congratulations to both exhibitors.

Two incidents marred the day, Ed. McQuown, well known all round judge, was injured in an automobile accident at Harrisburg whilst enroute to the show. Mrs. McQuown was forced to return to her home at Springfield, Ohio. Although obviously in pain, Mr. McQuown judged the Shetland Sheepdogs and then left to have further attention from a doctor. Fortunately Mr. McQuown had his son along and although he was too badly shaken up, he was a great help to his father.

C. E. Harbison, the popular Secretary of the Dog Writers Association suffered facial injuries in another automobile accident but you can't keep good men down, and Ed. McQuown and friend "Harbie" both belong in that category.

Noticeable in the Kerry Blue section was the large Canadian entry. The winning dog "Tanjax Flying Scotsman", arrived from England, shortly before Westminster. It took forty-two days to make the trip. Against this, the newly imported bitch, "Downsview Delilah" brought over by Cliff Tushingham, and now the property of Miss E. Moodie, arrived in Canada a month ago and the trip took but nine days. "Delilah" competed at the Kerry Blue Terrier Specialty Show in England winning the "War Baby" trophy for best puppy in show. In passing it should be said that the only existing litter of puppies by "Int. Ch. Blue Steele of Chevin" is at the kennels of Cliff Tushingham. The dam, "Ch. Longview Sunshine" has made a nice job of raising this very desirable litter.

At the Boston Terrier ring, there was added interest for the Canadians when "Int. Ch. Paddy's Dixie Romance" won for best of opposite sex. This one was bred by Paddy Boughs

of Toronto; she is now owned by J. Dwyer. This brief resumé of the show naturally will fail to do the winners justice, but there follows hereunder a partial list of the ribbons as annexed by the Canadian exhibitors. DOGDOM IN ENGLAND

LET us give a passing thought to our dog loving confrères in the Motherland at this dark period that they are passing through at the present time, having in mind that their breeding activities had a £300,000., export value alone (\$1,500,000.) and that the present and immediate future of this industry is in a condition of jeopardy owing to war conditions. It was the writer's privilege to attend the last championship show held at Harrogate on Saturday, September 2nd, 1939, the day before war was declared and at that time it was feared that dogdom in England had encountered a recurrence of the dark days experienced by breeders during the 1914-1918 period, but with the spirit of the true British sportsman the blow was taken flush on the chin, and so far there had been no serious complaints heard, this was reflected by the Chairman of the English Kennel Club (A. Croxton Smith) when he said at the Annual General Meeting held in London on March 29th, quote:

"After the last war most of them said confidently that such a thing could never happen again, but at the same time, the Club realizing the hand-to-mouth existence that they had led in the old days, decided most firmly that it would seek to build up reserves that would serve them in any contingency that might possibly arise. He hoped the meeting approved of that policy. They had been able to do so without excessive taxation upon the

public for which they legislated. They always had in mind that they were legislating for the general public of exhibitors, and it was prudent to perform those services at the lowest possible charges. He thought that if it had not been for the unexpected outbreak of hostilities they would have been able this year to show a favourable balance sheet."

Replying to Captain Vernon, who had asked if the Committee could do a little more to encourage shows at the present time, the Chairman replied:

"We have not turned down any applications to hold shows, but he thought it would be agreed that it would be impossible to run a championship or big open show owing to the difficulties of transport and the impossibility of obtaining benching. These drawbacks would make competition too restricted. What might happen in the future no one could say. Frankly, they were living from day to day, but at the present they realized that men and women who were working hard were as much entitled to have a little recreation as racing people, those who attended Greyhound racing meetings or enjoyed themselves in other ways. He thought they would all agree that national interests must come before everything else."

From the balance sheet we noticed that a deficit of £1,757.18.0 (\$8,785.00) had been transferred to the Kennel Club Establishment Account.

At the meeting of the Emergency Committee held on March 29th, "it was decided that there should be no championship shows and no substitute for the Kennel Club Championship certificate."

We reiterate that our British brethren have taken theirs on the chin and at this distance we are filled with admiration for that brand of gameness which steers them over the bumps of disappointment and we do trust that the dogged spirit of optimism that is so characteristic of the boys of the bulldog breed will be sufficient to determine judicious and selective breeding policies now, so that when the smoke of battles clear away, the breeding world may feel at liberty to look to England again for the better class of canine specimens for the purposes of breeding and exhibiting.

Quilley, had quite a busy time of it, and certainly he exerted both himself and the class when the lady handlers were in the ring. It was most amusing to see each lady attempting, with more or less success to set up a Bulldog. To come back to the Regina show, the Spaniel (Cocker) of Mrs. Pat Randall, "Glendewar Flag Salute", was placed reserve Best in Show. This is also a home-bred one and Mrs. Randall must have been very thrilled with the win.

It may be worthy of note that the recently organized Ladies Auxiliary of the Regina Kennel Club donated eighteen of the special prizes offered at the show, exclusive of donations from individual members. They also undertook to supply refreshments at very moderate prices, and this feature was much appreciated by the visitors. The profit from this was turned over to the show committee, and the effort held the balance on the right side of the ledger. It is surprising how much can be accomplished when the will to do it is there. This bitch is sired by "Culbahn Cuagh" ex "Culbahn Chief", and is already being prepared for the summer shows. Thanks to Dr. French and Mrs. Randall for the foregoing news. It is very encouraging to the Saskatchewan correspondent. J. R. Turner, of the Croyden Kennels, Regina, reports the recent purchase of a pure white Bulldog puppy, "Devil's Lake War Time", from the Blue Cross Kennels of Devils Lake, North Dakota. This puppy is sired by "Whisky Boozer" ex "Lilah May Wrinkles", and is a double cross of both "Ch. Moravian Meddlesome" and "Markus Sampson". One of the duties

of the puppy at the present time is to keep the twins in good humour and we are told that he is quite an adept at his task. I. W. Hilts of Kennedy has added Cocker to his kennels, and recently purchased "Croydon's Go-Getter" from J. R. Turner and is now negotiating for a black bitch from the same kennels. He has also acquired a female from S. Saidman of Winnipeg.

Notes From Alberta

THE Alberta Kennel Club held their regular meeting on May 9th in the Herald board rooms with a large membership attendance. Every member was handed a list of prospective exhibitors for the forthcoming show, with instructions to go out and do their best to gather in a good entry.

The City Council and the Exhibition board are assisting the club in every way possible much to the delight of the club members. A visit at the kennels of Lt.-Col. Ritchie, M.C., gave me a chance to have a good look at the Scottie, Ch. Viceroy, also the imported female, Gleniffer Bright Spark, both had wintered well and will soon be ready for the summer shows.

Mrs. Goff is now in the Eastern States and will bring home a brace of Cocker to add to their already noted string.

Eric Harvey is importing a brace of German Short Hair Pointers. He already has Labradors, Setters and English Pointers.

Tommy Cook, of Calgary, drove your scribe out to see some springers perform. I saw ten good working dogs before darkness overtook us. Tommy has a way with retrievers, and they certainly understand and obey his commands.

In order to clear up a misunderstanding let me say here that Goods and Live Stock exported to U.S.A. should be paid for in U.S.A. currency. This is a ruling of the Foreign Exchange Control Board.

Now it might be in order to mention another matter of vital interest to dog fanciers, that is that we would make a mistake to sever our relations with the National Live Stock Records of Ottawa. The National Live Stock Pedigree Act is in full force and effect. It governs not only the members of the Canadian Kennel Club Inc., but every individual breeder of stock eligible for registration. It makes no distinction between Medes or Persians, therefore whether we are affiliated with the Records or not, does not in any particular alter our position; we must abide by the Law, and if the Law says we must identify our animals, we must do so until that Law has been rescinded. Why all the fuss? I am firmly convinced that we should work in conjunction with the Records, and keep Identification compulsory.

Do you know that Alberta Sportsmen have expended over four thousand dollars on the purchase of Chukar Partridge. The first liberation of these birds (Alectoris Graecia Chukar) took place on Dan Pattons farm south and west of Calgary. During 1938 and 1939 over seven hundred birds were released at over thirty selected places. Compilation of reports from nineteen of these points show fifty-five coveys with a total of 441 chicks.

Chukar males weigh around twenty-seven ounces. Females average around nineteen ounces, they may be found from sea level to an altitude of 14,000 feet in elevation.

The Luck of the Irish

SURE it's just the luck of the Irish to be welcoming back to active dogdom our lady Director of The Canadian Kennel Club, Mrs. E. Brown, who is rapidly returning to her normal good-looking self after her recent major operation.

Time and again it would seem to be quite obvious that the breeders and the judges of our Irish Terriers are equally and perhaps definitely responsible for the Irish Terrier not becoming one of our most popular breeds. There are just as many good "Micks" as there are good ones of any other breed, and breed for breed the "Micks" are the equals of all comers for character, quality and style. As a matter of fact the Irish Terrier as a breed are wholesome and courageous to a degree. As companions for adults or for children they are in a class by themselves, but how seldom do we find our judges with the necessary "intestinal fortitude" to put a "Mick" to the top in the Terrier Group, much less to put him to Best in Show. We hesitate to believe that it is lack of breed knowledge on the part of our judges that is retarding the dog show popularity and the progress of Irish Terriers.

For some unknown reason some of our Irish Terrier breeders and some of our Terrier and all-breed judges refer to the "Mick" as the "mystery breed", for example, we often hear the remarks that "a good big one should beat a good small one any time and every time", or "how can a short backed "Irishman" beat one of the racey type". Such remarks can only be tolerated on the part of persons lacking knowledge of the breed.

The Irish Terrier is indeed an open book as a breed, and there is no mystery about him at all. If we only had the weight as a guide we might feel inclined to allow our imagination too much play, but when weight and height are both set for our guidance by those authorized to speak for the breed, all guessing is at once eliminated. The standard states clearly that the most desirable weight for males in show condition is 27 lbs. and for the female 25 lbs. The height has been definitely stated and it should be 18 inches at the shoulder. There have been "Micks" shown from pure-bred parents with a background showing the prescribed number of generations and complying with all standard requirements in every particular and still such dogs do not get a "look in" from some of the officiating judicial talent. What is the answer, or where is the mystery?

It is clearly understood that there is much more for breeders to strive for than weight and height in their breeding and show stock, nevertheless, weight and height are sound essentials and must be complied with as foundations upon which to build up sound judgment. It is quite true that the Irish Terrier has made wonderful progress in recent years. It is equally true that this very day he has more loyal supporters than ever before, and further, it is quite true that in Canada we have many fine specimens around, including Champions, and at least,

one Tri International Champion. We have good breeding—exhibiting stock of such equal quality that they keep on meeting each other regularly and winning and losing to each other alternately. We have quality stock. We know we have plenty of splendid breed representatives but what we also know but cannot understand is this, why should the "Little Red Devils" be considered as entry fillers for the shows, and why can't we find the odd good one taking the Terrier Group once in a while.

In conclusion I take the liberty to quote Lt.-Col. E. H. Richardson's fine tribute to the services rendered by the Irish Terrier in the first Great War, and it should be remembered that the gallant Lt.-Col. was the Commandant of the British War-Dog School at that time, just as he is at the present time, quote:

"I can say with decided emphasis that the Irish Terriers of the service more than did their part. Many a soldier is alive today through the effort of one of these very Terriers. Isolated with his unit in some advanced position, entirely cut off from the main body by a wall of shells and thus prevented communicating his position or circumstances by telephone or runner so that help might follow, this messenger dog was often the only means his Officers had of carrying the despatch, which eventually would bring relief. My opinion of this breed is indeed a high one. They are highly sensitive, spirited dogs of fine mettle, and those of us who respect and admire the finer qualities of mind will find them amply reflected in these Terriers. They are extraordinarily intelligent, faithful and honest, and a man who has one of them as a companion will never lack a true friend."

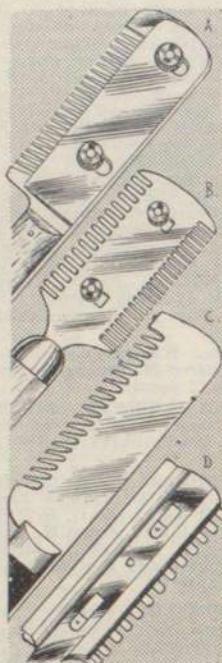

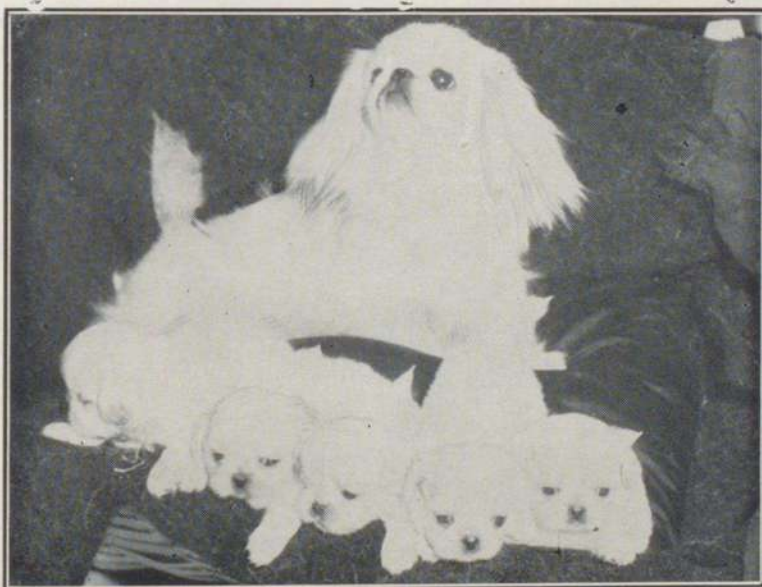
