War Dogs and Their Work

"Up to the breach, you dogs!"
Shakespeare.

A few years ago, as the Nord Express ran from Mulhausen towards Basle, amongst the villages of lower Alsace, a representative of the *Southend Standard* noticed large dogs drawing carts laden with milk, firewood and other burdens. An Alsatian priest saw his look of surprise, and explained that the sight was common to the country miles round. The passing of the peace era has brought the dog into more ubiquitous use; canine possibilities have been tested in many ways, and have calibres bark intermittently, by night or day, a lion's share of the dog's exceedingly useful services, and in no part of the world, one must conclude, have they been put to more severe proof than on the Western front, from Verdun to Nieuport.

The training of dogs of many breeds, sizes and dispositions has been made a subject of special study and practice by Major and Mrs. Richardson, who have at Shoburness a training school for war dogs that must be unique the wide world over. The spot chosen is ideal for the purpose. Close by guns of all calibre bark intermittently, by night or day, across flat marshland and shell-swept range; from the east, when the wind sits in that quarter, comes the raucous voice of the open seaboard. All this means much; for, if complete success is to be attained (and Major Richardson is not an officer of half-measure ideals or practice) it is of primary importance that no noise known to man should produce panic in the mind of the war dog, who must regard the nerve-shattering shout of a fifteen-inch gun as a casual, metallic remark. The dog may be small; it matters little; he must be, anyway, "a little body with a mighty heart," as hundreds have already proved. Nor, within certain limits, does breed count for much. The dog must be individualistic; that is the *sine qua non*. This, being interpreted, means that, be the dog what it may, it must possess intelligence. Major Richardson wants—and gets—very brainy dogs. Whether a dog be a retriever, mastiff, collie, or one of Pistol's "Prick-eared curs of Iceland," it must be able to follow initiative and instruction as a bloodhound

tracks the scent of blood. Given brains, then, the dog becomes as clay in the potter's hand; the trainer is sure of the fruit of his labour.

Major Richardson has devoted some 20 years to the training of dogs for police or military purposes. He was formerly best known in England by his experiments with bloodhounds, but on the Continent has long been known as an authority on war dogs. About a month before the outbreak of war he was in St. Petersburg, engaged in war dog trials; in August, 1914, he was in Brussels, and just got away as the Germans got in. He was well acquainted with war dog training in Germany, and at one time looked after the war dogs of the late Sultan Abdul Hamid. He also understands the French system of training, and for the last 15 years has attended war dog trials in many countries on the Continent. In 1915 he was with sentry dogs on the French front, by invitation of the authorities.

At Shoburness, Major Richardson and his wife are working together, he as commandant and she as assistant instructor of the school. The dogs were at first obtained solely from the homes for lost dogs at Battersea, Birmingham and Liverpool; but since that time hundreds have been got in response to advertisements by the War Office. From all parts of the United Kingdom owners have sent dogs, and the knowledge that the training is entirely done by kindness encourages the supply. There is a small permanent staff of kennel men who look after the food; and of men trained to look after the dogs at the front. Shepherds are engaged where possible; one is a miner, used to whippets.

Major Richardson, during a chat with a representative of the *Southend Standard*, communicated interesting particulars in regard to the training of these dogs of war. A great many dogs have passed through his hands, and the work of training is now occupying 12 hours

daily. More animals are needed, provided always that they be sound and alert specimens of their respective breeds. Long experience with dogs—the Major's Airedales and bloodhounds were world-famous years back—has enabled all the best points of various breeds to be appraised, and their qualifications classified; but it is essential the dog shall be "A1" of its kind—no C3 dogs are wanted. Sheep dog, lurcher, collie terrier (if not small), retriever, and others are in request, or, if destined for training as watchers by day or night, Great Danes, Newfoundlands, St. Bernards, etc., prove excellent material. Most serviceable, probably, as a messenger, is any lithe dog of sinuous methods of progress—a dog that, ferret-like, can nose into one hole and out at another, and, tenacious of purpose, will stick at no obstacle if entrusted to carry a message from point to point. This, as has been proved in hundreds of cases, a dog will do even when his journey takes him across bullet-swept plains or over "No-man's Land" or other areas of desolation and death. For nothing short of death will keep a well-trained war dog from his goal or objective when once he grasps its locality. It was a dog, it appears, that first brought in the glad tidings that Vimy Ridge was captured.

If a cat has nine lives, as is said, a war dog, to judge from records, must often have ninety. Part of their training teaches them to ignore fire and smoke as obstacles to progress, and the lesson must need a lot of learning. But in this and all other departments it is found that perseverance leads to success; without harshness or cruelty of any kind—there is no whip whatever in use—a dog is taught to rush straight through a smoking mass of straw. The canine *sang froid* with which this is done is often remarkable, and its use is obvious. A dog is given a message to carry, perhaps from a trench to official quarters far in the rear. Between the two points lies a blazing village. An untrained dog, however brave by nature, would make a detour, however long, in order to avoid the fire; one of Major Richardson's products, on the contrary, would pick his way with lightning rapidity through the village itself, and would almost inevitably bring his message to the anticipating hand. The despatch is picked from the collar pocket, and the errand is accomplished. In many cases a man,

attempting the like feat, would be shot before he had covered twenty yards.

There are, naturally, stock tests which all dogs brought to graduate at the War Dogs Training School are put through. One, a sort of "B.A." leading to higher degrees of mastership, is that which hardens nerve, quickens the brain, and seasons a dog to the devastating, catastrophic sounds of war. He is set to charge a line of prostrate infantry, broadside on, and the men, as the dog runs towards them, fire blank cartridges at him in the most disconcerting, staggering fashion. Pause, swerve, and turn-tail retreat are early manifestations of the truth that even a dog dislikes being fired at; but the callow recruit is put to his task again and again until he can face the music. Another excellent ordeal is that of the obstacle race, in which dogs, taken a mile from the winning post, are set to race home and to negotiate, en route, such formidable barriers, as hurdles, piled branches, and a barbed-wire fence. These barriers are typical of what doggie will find confronting him out yonder, and when there he will make no pother about passing them, although the sniper may thirst for his blood, or the barbed-wire lacerate his sides. In fact, so agile are these dogs when on active service, so baffling to shoot at, so swift of foot that the percentage of casualties among them is remarkably low. Their success is great, and in many cases a dog has carried a despatch in what has been judged less than a fourth of the time occupied by a human despatch runner or rider. Moreover, as regards their comparative immunity from harm, it will be seen that a dog, dodging into or out of a shell hole, racing across uneven, shell-scored ground, or racing pell-mell down a street, is an object, which, unless he be very close, a sniper can only hit by the merest chance.

A visitor to Shoeburyness saw a dog, when "getting home," make an elaborate detour in front of the kennels. Major Richardson explained that this was a mere piece of canine swagger, as the dog wanted to show his less distinguished *confreres* that he had been on an expedition. The dogs, however, get very keen about time as their training progresses, and although at first apt to

half to three hours. Under the conditions of heavy shell fire it was very good, and my officers were highly pleased, for the map and message were very important, and all our other means of communication at the time had failed." In another letter one reads: "On one occasion, in a front line trench, 'Little Jim' gave the first warning of a gas attack, and was immediately sent with the news to headquarters, reaching there more than three-quarters of an hour earlier than the warning given by wire." In a third it is stated: "The first time I sent my three dogs forward, 'Jim' made a record run. The journey he did used to take a man an hour and ten minutes, but 'Jim' did it in 22 minutes, through barbed-wire entanglements and a large number of batteries."

Needless to add, the need for suitable dogs does not diminish as the war drags on. The War Office will be grateful if the owners of dogs between one and five years old will lend them, and if proved unsuitable the dogs will be returned to their owners carriage paid. They should be sent to the Commandant, War Dog School, Shoeburyness. The breeds required are Airedales, Retrievers, Lurchers, Lurcher Crosses, Collies, Sheep Dogs, Drover Dogs, Deerhounds, Mastiffs and Bull Mastiffs, Danes, St. Bernards, Newfoundland, Labradors, and yard dogs of good size. By sending any of these owners of the most venerable or tender age will be doing their bit to circumvent the Hun.
