OUR FRONTISPIECE

Twice this year Dogs in Canada has been privileged to bring to its readers via the front cover illustrations of outstanding specimens of Skye Terriers, on the front cover of our March issue and now on the front cover of this current issue.

The story of Mrs. R. Percy Adams' devotion to the interests of this breed as it dates back to 1904 was related by the Editor in our March issue, therefore, this article on "Our Frontispiece" will be devoted to individual dogs which compose the attractive illustration appearing on this month's cover.

The drop-eared dog on the left hand side is Lord Roland of Talisker, bred by Mrs. Adams and now owned by Mrs. Charles S. Dewey, Jr., of Far Hills, N.J. Lord Roland, in addition to winning a first in the Novice Class at the Morris and Essex this year, was Winners Dog at the Canadian National Exhibition show held last September.

Second from the left is Lady Mina of Talisker, also bred by Mrs. Adams and owned by Mrs. Charles S. Dewey, Jr. Lady Mina was Best of Winners at the Westchester Kennel Club show held at Rye, New York, last September.

In the middle we find Ch. Raggedy Lady of Talisker. This dog, not yet two years old, completed her championship within the period of one month at the age of fifteen months. Throughout this year at six different shows she has four times been placed in the Terrier Group. At the Skye Terrier Specialty Show held in conjunction with this year's Morris and Essex fixture, and where 49 Skyes were shown, Raggedy Lady was Reserve Winners Bitches and Best Bred by exhibitor. Her grandsire, Ch. George of Merrymount, was placed first in Open, Winners Dog and Best of Winners. At the recent Ladies' Kennel Club of Canada show, she was awarded Best of Breed defeating the celebrated English Winner, Schehallion, who was awarded Winners Dog and in doing so defeating the most celebrated Skyes in the United States, who were being exhibited for the first time in Canada.

To the right of Raggedy Lady we find Skyhigh Lady Fay of Talisker.

Imported in 1939 by Mrs. Adams, Fay is a daughter of England's noted sire, Ch. Togo of Merrymount.

Next to the right is Chummies Heir of Merrymount, who was Best of Breed at the Canadian Terrier Club show last June and who, with Schehallion, won the Variety Brace at the recent Ladies' Kennel Club of Canada show. Heir is siring outstanding puppies.

The nine months old puppy at the rear of Heir is Talisker's Last of Tilda, the only living daughter as far as is known of the celebrated Holmesdale Tilda, imported in 1939, and the dam of the Scotch and English Champion, Rip of Merrymount, Ch. Ripper in Germany and litter brother of Int. Ch. Holmesdale Fergus, owned in France.

Schehallion, Talisker's latest importation, came from the famed kennels of Sir Claude and Lady Alexander in England. Sir Claude, by the way, is the recognized world-wide authority on the breed. Shown extensively in England and Scotland where he has been a big winner at Cruft's, Olympia, Crystal Palace, Kennel Club, Brighton and Richmond, Schehallion has twice been Best of Sex. At the Kennel Club and Richmond shows he was placed fourth and third in very strong variety classes by such outstanding judges as Holland Buckley, Croxton Smith, Mr. McCandlish and Mr. Scott. He has always been shown as one of Lady Alexander's Winning brace and team. Schehallion comes to this country with a wonderful record and should do the breed on this continent a great deal of good.

There are other outstanding Skyes in the Talisker Kennels, among them Adorable Lady of Talisker, Ch. Marielou of Merrymount, Ch. George of Merrymount and others, as well as some very promising young stock.

WARTIME PRICES AND TRADE BOARD LICENSING ORDER NO. 63

Through the co-operation of the local Director of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board, the Editor is able to suggest that a person breeding, buying and/or selling dogs does not require a license issued by the Wartime Prices and Trade Board to do so. Likewise a license is not required to purchase food for dogs when the food is to be consumed by the dogs owned by the purchaser. Such a license is, however, required to purchase food intended for resale.

CHAPTER 5

Classes

1. The regular official classes of The Canadian Kennel Club shall be confined to the following breeds recognized by The Canadian Kennel Club as being distinct breeds of pure-bred dogs:

Other breeds recognized by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club shall be added to this list of recognized breeds. The Board of Directors may also transfer any breed from one group to another group whenever in its opinion sufficient evidence is presented to the Board to justify such transfer.

2. The regular official classes of The Canadian Kennel Club shall be as follows:

(a) The JUNIOR PUPPY CLASS shall be for dogs at least six months of age on the first day of the show and under nine months of age on the first day of the show. No puppy may be entered whose date and place of birth, name of breeder, sire or dam is unknown or is not set forth in full on the entry form.

(b) The SENIOR PUPPY CLASS shall be for dogs at least nine months of age on the first day of the show and under twelve months of age on the first day of the show. No puppy may be entered whose date and place of birth, name of breeder, sire or dam is unknown or is not set forth in full on the entry form.

(c) It shall be optional with show-giving clubs whether or not the PUPPY CLASSES be divided. In case of no division the PUPPY CLASS shall be for dogs at least six months of age on the first day of the show and under twelve months of age on the first day of the show. No puppy may be entered whose date and place of birth, name of breeder, sire or dam is unknown or is not set forth in full on the entry form.

Puppies may be brought to the show on the day they are to be judged and may be removed from the show after they have been judged but only after the closing of the show in any evening, and providing the puppy is entered in the Puppy Classes only.

(d) The NOVICE CLASS shall be for dogs never having won a first prize at a show in any regular official class including WINNERS CLASS, wins in PUPPY CLASSES excepted. In determining whether a dog is eligible for this class, no award received on or after the official date of the closing of entries for a show at which the dog is to be shown will be counted. The entry form shall state the name of breeder and place and date of birth of dog.

(e) The CANADIAN-BRED CLASS shall be for all dogs whelped in the Dominion of Canada. The entry form shall state the name of the breeder and the place and date of birth of dog.

(f) The LIMIT CLASS shall be for all dogs except champions never having won six first prizes in said class. In determining whether a dog that has already won six first prizes in the Limit Class is eligible for this class, no award received on or after the official date of the closing of entries for a show at which the dog is to be shown will be counted.

(g) The OPEN CLASS shall be for all dogs but must be divided by sex.

(h) The WINNERS CLASS shall be divided by sex and confined to those dogs undefeated by representatives of their respective sex, color or height. There shall be no entry fee for the WINNERS CLASS and such WINNERS CLASS must be provided for in every breed recognized by The Canadian Kennel Club for which a proper classification has been provided. No dog eligible for competition in the WINNERS CLASS may be withheld except those excused by the officiating Veterinarian.

Only two WINNERS CLASSES may be offered in any one breed with the exception of:

Beagles
Spaniels (Cocker)
Spaniels (English Cocker).

In Beagles four WINNERS CLASSES may be offered, i.e.:

13 inches and under, dogs
13 inches and under, bitches
over 13 inches and not exceeding 16 inches, dogs
over 13 inches and not exceeding 16 inches, bitches.

In Spaniels (Cocker) and Spaniels (English Cocker) four WINNERS CLASSES may be offered, i.e.:

Solid colored dogs
Solid colored bitches
Parti-colored dogs
Parti-colored bitches.

(i) RESERVE WINNERS. After the WINNERS prize has been awarded any second or third prize winning dog otherwise undefeated by a representative of its sex, color or height, which however, has been beaten in its class by the dog awarded WINNERS, shall compete with the other eligible dogs for RESERVE WINNERS. No dog eligible for competition in the RESERVE WINNERS CLASS may be withheld except those excused by the officiating Veterinarian.

(j) The BEST OF WINNERS CLASS shall be confined to the WINNERS DOG and the WINNERS BITCH. No BEST OF WINNERS award shall be made if only one sex is represented by a WINNERS award.

In Beagles, Spaniels (Cocker) and Spaniels (English Cocker), the following Best of WINNERS awards may be made:

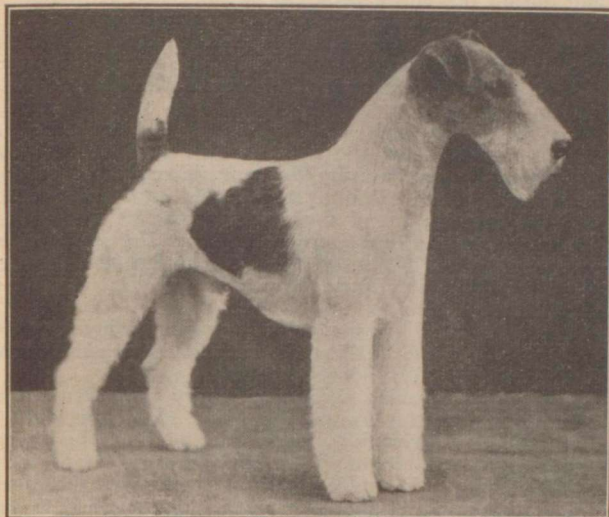
Beagles:
Best of Winners (all sizes).
Spaniels (Cocker) and Spaniels (English Cocker):
Best of Winners (all colors).

(k) SPECIALS ONLY. Dogs may be entered for "Specials Only" and such dogs shall compete with the dog awarded Best of Winners for the Best of Breed awards. Any dog entered "for Specials Only" and received at a show must compete for all special prizes for which it is eligible.

(l) BEST OF BREED. The competition for Best of Breed shall be confined to the dog holding the Best of Winners ribbon or Winners ribbon if only one sex competing, and those entered for SPECIALS ONLY, and shall be judged immediately following the Best of Winners class.

(m) The MISCELLANEOUS CLASS shall be open to all dogs of recognized breeds for which no regular class has been provided in the Premium List. Entries in this class must specify the breed of the exhibit. Failure to comply with this condition shall cancel the award, if any. There shall be no Championship points for this class.

(n) The BRACE CLASS shall be for two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

His get made their first show appearance at the Terrier Specialty Show, June (1941); since that day they kept on winning, accounting for one full-fledged Champion, namely CHAMPION MALABAR'S DRUMMER BOY. While Drummer Boy finished his championship at St. John, N.B., on Sept. 2nd, another Easter Parade son, MALABAR ON PARADE, won Winners Dogs and Best Puppy in Show at the Canadian National Exhibition and Winners the following Saturday at Hamilton. MALABAR'S REBECCA, owned by Ed. E. Thompson, Esq., of Thessalon, Ont., went from 1st Novice up to Res. Winners at the Exhibition, while Mrs. E. Cork's MELODY ON PARADE, still in her puppyhood, accounted for Reserve Winners at the Ladies' Kennel Club Show at Montreal.

Easter Parade's visitors included, among others, two from as far as Victoria, B.C., Thessalon, Ont., Toronto, Ont., Montreal, Que., etc.

Beautiful and sound young stock, both sexes, by Easter Parade out of champion bitches for sale.

(o) The TEAM CLASS shall be for four exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

(p) EXHIBITION ONLY. A dog may be entered for exhibition only, which must be specified on the entry blank. All dogs entered for exhibition shall be entered in the catalogue in special classes called "For Exhibition Only" and may be brought before the judge after the Best of Breed award has been made. These entries shall not count towards the point rating. The show-giving club shall arrange any entry fee it may see fit and not necessarily the same as for dogs in competition. The same particulars must be given as if entered in one of the regular classes, and if not registered in The Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, a listing fee of 25c. must be paid. No dog entered "for exhibition only" and received at a show can compete in any class or for any special prize.

3. Bench show committees may provide such other classes of recognized breeds as they may choose provided they do not conflict with the above mentioned classes. Such classes shall be judged immediately following the Best of Breed award. No dog, however, may be entered in such classes unless entered in one of the regular classes as outlined in sections (a) to (g) of this chapter.

4. GROUP CLASSES. Each all-breed show-giving club shall provide for six groups not divided by sex, such groups to be arranged in the same order, and to comprise the same breeds as appear in Section 1 of Chapter 5. Only dogs designated Best of Breed by the judge, as already set forth, shall be eligible to compete for the Group in which they belong, according to this grouping. All entries for such group specials shall be made after the judging of the regular classes. All dogs designated Best of Breed, except any excused by the official Veterinarian or assistant, must compete in the Group Class for which they are eligible. Failure to do so will automatically cancel all awards and prizes won at that show.

5. BEST IN SHOW. The six dogs winning in the above six groups, except any excused by the official Veterinarian or assistant, must compete in a final group for the title of "The Best in Show" for which no entry fee shall be charged. Failure to do so will automatically cancel all awards and prizes won at that show. Not more than one judge shall officiate in the judging of this Group.

6. BEST CANADIAN-BRED IN SHOW. The competition for any prizes offered for Best Canadian-bred in Show shall be confined to those Canadian-bred dogs which have not been directly or indirectly defeated by another Canadian-bred dog either in breed or group competition. The term "Canadian-bred" shall apply to all dogs born in the Dominion of Canada and champions shall be eligible to compete for any specials offered for such an award.

CHAPTER 6**Ribbons, Money and Special Prizes**

1. All clubs or associations holding dog shows under the rules of The Canadian Kennel Club, except sanctioned shows, shall use the following colors for their prize ribbons or rosettes, in the classes approved by The Canadian Kennel Club and group classes:

First Prize—Red.
Second Prize—Blue.
Third Prize—White.
Winners—Royal Purple.
Reserve Winners—Mauve.
Best of Winners—Purple and Gold.
Special Prize—Green.
Best of Breed—Tricolor (Red, White and Blue).

2. Each ribbon or rosette, except those used at sanctioned shows, shall be at least 2 inches wide, and approximately 8 inches long; and bear on its face a facsimile of the crest of The Canadian Kennel Club, the name of the prize, the name of the show-giving club, and the year of the show.

3. All regular and special prizes must be in accordance with their description in the Premium List.

4. Special prizes at a show must be offered to be won outright at that show and to be awarded automatically, with the exception of existing specials which have still to be won outright (the foregoing applies to specials in existence prior to December 31st, 1941).

5. All special prizes which may be offered shall be accurately described. If money prizes are offered a fixed amount for each prize shall be stated.



6. The person handling the exhibit in the ring shall be recognized as the agent of the owner in the latter's absence.

CHAPTER 7

Selection and Approval of Judges

1. Before a club or association has been granted permission by The Canadian Kennel Club to hold a show it must send to The Canadian Kennel Club before the premium list is due to be issued for the approval of The Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club, a list of the names and addresses of the Judges which it has selected to judge its show, giving in each instance the particular breed or breeds of dogs and group classes, if any, which it is desired that each one shall pass upon. If said Board of Directors shall so approve, the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club will inform the show-giving club that the list of judges has been approved.

The show-giving club must not advertise or publish the name or names of any judges which it has selected until approved by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club.

2. The Show Secretary, bench show committees or superintendents shall, in every instance, notify appointed judges of the breeds and group classes upon which they are to pass, and such notifications shall be given before the publication of the premium lists.

3. The Show Secretary, bench show committees or superintendents shall not add to or subtract from the number of breeds which a selected judge has agreed to pass upon without first notifying said judge of and obtaining his consent in writing to the contemplated change in his assigned breeds, and the judge when so notified may refuse to judge any breeds added to his original assignment.

4. The Canadian Kennel Club will not approve as judge for any given show the superintendent, show secretary, or show veterinarians, or club officials of said show acting in any one of these three capacities, and such person cannot officiate or judge at such show under any circumstances.

5. A bench show committee which shall be informed at any time prior to a week before the opening day of its show that an advertised judge will not fulfill his or her engagement to judge shall substitute a judge in his or her place, which substitute judge must be approved by The Canadian Kennel Club, and shall give notice of the name of the substitute judge to all those who have entered dogs in the Classes allotted to be judged by the advertised judge. All those who have entered dogs to be shown under the advertised judges shall be permitted to withdraw their entries at any time prior to the opening day of the show and the entry fees paid for entering such dogs shall be refunded.

6. Should an appointed judge be unable to fulfill his engagement, the Show Committee shall have the right to fill the vacancy. In the event of an appointed judge not officiating, it shall be optional with the exhibitor, before the commencement of the judging of the breed to withdraw his dog or dogs from competition and from the show, in which event his entry fee shall be returned.

7. In case an advertised judge shall have judged part of the classes of a breed and then finds it impossible to finish, a substitute judge shall be selected by the bench show committee, and in that event the awards made by the regular judge shall stand, and his or her substitute shall judge only the remaining classes and specials. No dogs entered under the regularly selected judge shall be withheld from competition.

8. A substitute judge shall finish the judging of the breed or group class he or she is adjudicating upon if he or she has begun to judge before the advertised judge arrives at the show.

CHAPTER 8

Officials

1. When a club or association sends to The Canadian Kennel Club its list of Judges to be approved, it must enclose with that list the names and addresses of its proposed Superintendent or Secretary of Show, and Veterinarians.

2. Any person or persons acting in any official capacity, paid or unpaid, including that of judge, secretary, superintendent, steward, clerk of a show, or as an officer or member of a Bench Show Committee of any club holding a show in the Dominion of Canada under any rules other than those of The Canadian Kennel Club (Incorporated) may be disqualified and debarred from all privileges of the same.

CHAPTER 9

Veterinarian and Veterinary Inspection

1. Every dog show shall have one or more qualified

veterinarians, one of whom shall be in attendance before and during the entire progress of the show or within easy call. The veterinarian, or one of his assistants, must examine every dog before it can be admitted to the show. The veterinarian must indicate on the identification card of each dog after examining it, a certification of such examination, and no dog shall be considered officially admitted to a show until this certification is so attached. Any exhibitor must show the identification card of his dog to the steward upon entering the ring, if requested to do so, by any competing exhibitor and if said card shall not contain the certification of the veterinarian the steward shall see to it that said dog is removed from the show if, upon an examination by the show veterinarian the dog shall prove ineligible for entry, otherwise the dog may be permitted to compete.

When appealed to by a judge, or when giving an opinion on a protest to the bench show committee, he shall immediately render his decision in writing.

2. The veterinarian shall sign every identification card after examining the dog or dogs covered by the identification card. Veterinarians also shall be furnished with a handy receptacle, containing a proper disinfectant for use after handling a dog suffering from a communicable disease.

Veterinarians first should examine dogs shipped to shows as soon as possible after the dogs' arrival, so that such dogs may be taken from their crates with as little delay as possible.

A veterinarian who desires a dog's mouth to be opened shall request the owner, or person in charge, to open it, in order that the veterinarian shall not bring his hands in contact with possibly infected secretions.

3. Any individual who takes any dog into a dog show without official veterinarian inspection as above described, or who takes a dog into a show that has been rejected by the official veterinarian, OR EXPOSED TO ANY DOG SUFFERING FROM OR SUSPECTED OF SUFFERING FROM ANY CONTAGIOUS DISEASE, shall be subject to the withdrawal of the privileges of The Canadian Kennel Club, Inc.

CHAPTER 10

Premium Lists and Entry Forms

1. A club or association which has been granted permission to hold a dog show and has obtained the necessary approval of its breed classification, money prizes, special prizes, judges list, superintendent, show secretary and veterinarians, and has notified each judge as previously provided for, must next cause premium lists and entry forms to be printed and sent to prospective exhibitors.

2. Premium lists may either be in long or condensed form, and in order to insure uniformity it is recommended that any club or association giving its first show shall apply to the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club for samples or for advice in making up its premium list.

3. Two copies of the premium list when printed must be sent to the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club at the time of distribution.

4. A dog show will not be recognized as a Canadian Kennel Club Show unless the official endorsement of the premium list, signed by the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club, be published at the head of the classification. No change in the classification shall be allowed after such official endorsement.

5. All judges' names, officiating at any championship show under Canadian Kennel Club Rules, together with a list of breeds said judges are approved to judge, must appear in the premium list.

6. The premium list shall contain a list of the officers of the show-giving club, of all officials of the show and of all judges who are to officiate. The exact location of the show must be specified and the date or dates on which it is to be held.

7. Except at specialty club shows the general classification of recognized breeds divided into groups and in the same order as set forth in Chapter 5, Section 1, in their proper groups and alphabetical position shall be published in the premium list, except when a condensed form of premium list is used, in which breeds in which classes may be given which vary according to heights, weights, colors, etc., may be omitted from the general classification and listed in the official alphabetical order, immediately following the general classification.

8. Such extracts from the rules as shall be designated by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club shall be furnished with every premium list.

9. Bench Show Committees may make such regulations or additional rules to govern their shows as shall be considered necessary, provided such regulations or additional

rules do not conflict with any rule of The Canadian Kennel Club. Such regulations or additional rules shall be printed in the premium list and violations thereof shall be considered the same as violations of the rules and regulations of The Canadian Kennel Club.

10. No specials may be accepted or offered by any show-giving club unless they have been published in the premium list of the show, nor may any be withdrawn or the conditions thereof changed after they have been published in the premium list.

11. The Canadian Kennel Club shall not be called upon to impose any penalty upon any individual, club or association which is alleged not to have paid a special prize published in the premium list of a show-giving club as being offered by him or it unless the original offer of the special to the show-giving club was made in written form and signed by the donor.

12. Every premium list shall specify the date on which the entries for a show shall close.

CHAPTER 11

Entries and Entry Fees

1. Every dog entered in a show given under the rules of The Canadian Kennel Club must be registered or "listed" with The Canadian Kennel Club before being exhibited. The listing fee for each dog shall be 25c. and all listing fees shall be collected by the show-giving club or association. A dog eligible for registration in The Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book may only be listed for three shows, after which the dog (if eligible) must be registered in The Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book with the exception of dogs registered with the Kennel Club (England) or The American Kennel Club which may be listed indefinitely upon payment of listing fees. Dogs ineligible for registration may be exhibited indefinitely by the payment of listing fees.

2. Entries shall not be received less than two days prior to the first day of the show, and a club accepting any entry after that date shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$10.00 for each entry so accepted.

3. Every entry must be printed in the catalogue. Exhibitors must abide by their own errors, errors on the part of the management or printer's errors excepted.

4. Every dog entered in a show shall be the property of the person making its entry, and the right to exhibit a dog cannot be transferred. If any entry be made in the name of an agent and the name of the owner be not given, the win of the dog shall be cancelled. If a dog be entered in the name of an association, the name of the association and its Secretary shall appear on the entry form at the time of the making of such entry. The entry must clearly state the name, sex, color or size (if entered in classes divided by color or size) of the dog, The Canadian Kennel Club registration number (unless listed), the date of birth, name of sire and dam, and the name of the breeder. Should any of these particulars be unknown to the exhibitor, it shall be so stated on the entry form. No dog shall be entered in the Puppy, Novice or Canadian-bred Class, un-

less all the particulars respectively required for competition in these classes, as set out in Chapter 5 of these Rules and Regulations are known and stated on the entry form.

5. No entry shall be received from any person who is not in good standing with The Canadian Kennel Club, The American Kennel Club or The Kennel Club (England) on the day of the closing of the entries. Before accepting entries, a list of persons not in good standing must be obtained by the show superintendent or show secretary from The Canadian Kennel Club.

6. No entry shall be made under a kennel name unless that name has been registered with The Canadian Kennel Club. All entries made under a kennel name must be signed with the kennel name followed by the word "registered". An "exhibitor" or "entrant" is the individual, or if a partnership, all the members of the partnership exhibiting or entering in a dog show.

7. If the name of a dog which has been listed with The Canadian Kennel Club and which shall have won a prize at any show, subsequently shall be changed, the former name as well as the new name shall be given on the entry form for any subsequent shows and shall be published in the catalogues of such subsequent shows until such time as said dog shall have been awarded a prize in one of the regular official classes of The Canadian Kennel Club under its new name, whereupon its former name may be dropped.

8. The ownership of a registered dog entered in a show must be recorded in the registration files of The Canadian Kennel Club.

A registered dog which has been acquired by some person other than the owner as recorded with The Canadian Kennel Club may be entered in the name of its new owner at any show but application for transfer of ownership must be sent to The Canadian Kennel Club within thirty days after the last day of the show or the winnings of said dog will be cancelled.

If there shall be unavoidable delay in obtaining the registration certificate for transfer, notice of such delay and the reason therefor must be sent by mail to the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club within thirty days after the show, in which case a reasonable extension of time for sending in the certificate for transfer may be granted. In the case of such an entry by a partnership every member of the partnership shall be in good standing with The Canadian Kennel Club before the entry will be accepted; and in case of any infraction of these rules, all the partners shall be held equally responsible.

9. If clerical errors or omissions be made in entering a dog at a show such as the incorrect name of the dog, the registration number of the dog, the name of the breeder or of the sire or dam of the dog, or of its date of birth, the exhibitor shall be advised of his or her mistake and if he or she shall again offend after being so advised, a fine of one (\$1.00) dollar shall be imposed for each such offence and the person making such incorrect entry shall be suspended from the privileges of The Canadian Kennel

Club if the fine shall not be paid within sixty (60) days of the date when said fine was imposed.

10. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors.

11. A dog, wrongly entered in a class, may not be transferred to another class, and no alteration may be made on its entry form.

12. No dog which

1. Has distemper or other communicable disease shall be entered at any show.
2. Has had distemper or other communicable disease shall be entered at any show unless it has been fully recovered for thirty days.
3. Is known to have been in contact with distemper or other communicable disease shall be entered in any show until thirty days after such contact and provided said dog has itself been free from any symptom of said disease during said thirty days.
4. Has been kennelled on premises on which there existed distemper or other communicable disease shall be entered in any show until thirty days after such exposure and provided said dog has itself been free from any symptom of said disease during said thirty days.
5. Has been inoculated with distemper virus shall be entered at any show unless it has been fully recovered from any reaction to said inoculation for at least thirty days.
6. Has been inoculated with distemper virus and has shown no reaction thereto shall be entered in any show until thirty days after said inoculation.
7. Is known to have been in contact with an animal which has been inoculated within thirty days after such contact, and provided said dog has itself been free from any symptom of distemper during said thirty days.

13. No dog not regularly entered in a show shall be allowed within the show precincts unless engaged as a special attraction with the approval of The Canadian Kennel Club. No dog under six months of age will be allowed within the precincts of the show building without the approval of The Canadian Kennel Club.

14. In a classification where there is a division of weights, a dog may be entered in two different weight classes, but the second entry in such case must be noted on the entry blank as "Alternate Entry", for which no entry fee shall be charged. The owner or person making such entry must notify the Superintendent or Secretary of the show, as hereinafter provided, in which class said owner or person elects to show the dog, and the dog must be shown in that class and must conform to the weight called for in that class. This rule shall also supply where there is a division of height.

15. No entry shall be made at any show under a judge of any dog which said judge or any member of his immediate household has been known to have owned, sold, held under lease or boarded within ninety days prior to the date of the show.

16. No dog eligible for special prizes can be withdrawn from competition unless it has been stated on the entry blank, "Will not compete for special prizes."

17. Any show-giving club which accepts an entry fee other than that published in its premium list, or in any way discriminates between exhibitors or entrants shall be disciplined.

18. The authorities of any show may decline to accept entries for just cause and may refuse to receive or may remove any dog from the show building on account of disease or vice, and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the organization holding the show or any official connected therewith, but said authorities must file their reasons for doing so with The Canadian Kennel Club.

CHAPTER 12

Disqualifications

1. A castrated dog or spayed bitch shall be disqualified and forfeit any prize that may be awarded to it.

2. Total blindness, total deafness, or lameness, shall absolutely disqualify. If the veterinary surgeon is satisfied that the deafness or lameness be temporary, the dog shall be allowed to compete.

3. A dog shall be disqualified from winning a prize, or from receiving one, if awarded, at any show (except as hereinafter provided) if it be proved to the Committee of the show or the Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club, as the case may be:—

(a) Any dye, colouring, darkening, bleaching, or other matter has been in any way used for the purpose of altering or improving the colour or marking of a dog.

(b) Any preparation, chemical or otherwise, has been used for the purpose of altering or improving the texture of the coat.

(c) Any excessive powder, oil, greasy or sticky substance has been used and remains in the coat whilst being judged.

(d) Any part of a dog's coat has been cut, clipped, singed or rasped down by any substance, or that the new or fast coat has been removed by any means except in the following breeds: Airedale, Bedlington, Bull, Fox (Wire and Smooth), Kerry Blue, Lakeland, Scottish, Sealyham, Welsh and Yorkshire Terriers, Collies, Pomeranians, Poodles, Retrievers. The old or shedding coat and loose hair may be removed in all breeds.

(e) If any cutting, except in Boxers, Bull Terriers, Bostons, Great Danes, Schnauzers, Dobermans, piercing, breaking by force, or any kind of operation or act which destroys tissues of the ears or alters their natural formation or carriage, or shortens the tail, or alters the natural formation, or colour of the dog, or any part thereof has been practiced, or any other thing has been done calculated in the opinion of the Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club to deceive, except in cases of necessary operation certified to the satisfaction of the Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club. Dew claws may be removed in any breed, except where otherwise required by the breed standard, and shortening the tails of dogs of the following breeds will not render them liable to disqualification:—Airedale, Fox (Wire and Smooth), Irish, Kerry Blue, Lakeland, Sealyham, Welsh and Yorkshire Terriers, Welsh Corgis, Spaniels (except Irish Water), Doberman Pinschers, Schnauzers, Old English Sheepdogs, Poodles, Toy Spaniels, Schipperkes, Griffons (Brussels), and such other breeds as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

(f) The lining membranes of the mouth, or tongue have been cut or mutilated in any way.

CHAPTER 13

Ring Stewards

1. Ring Stewards shall be selected by the show-giving club, but no person not in good standing with The Canadian Kennel Club, Inc., shall be so selected. It shall be the sole duty of the ring steward to assist the judge only as instructed by the judge, other than to see that no person or persons except the show superintendent, judge, other ring stewards and those actually engaged in exhibiting a dog before the judge are permitted within the ring during the judging period. No person shall be permitted to act as ring steward for any judge under whom he or she, or any member of their immediate family may be exhibiting, nor to act as agent or handler under the same judge at such show.

CHAPTER 14

The Catalogue

1. Every bench show committee shall provide a printed catalogue which shall contain all particulars required of exhibitors entering dogs as hereinafter provided. It also shall contain the exact location of the show, the date or dates upon which it is held, a list of all officers and the bench show committee, names and complete addresses of all judges, superintendent or secretary of the show, veterinarians, and all exhibitors.

2. Every catalogue must state on its cover: "This show is held under Canadian Kennel Club rules."

3. It is recommended that the catalogue be in book form 6 x 9 inches in size. It shall contain the names and particulars of every dog entered in the show, arranged as follows: Catalogue number, the name of owner, the name of the dog, The Canadian Kennel Club registration number, the name of sire and dam, the date of birth, and the breeder. If not registered, a dog shall be listed and so marked. It also shall contain in each breed when given the regular official classes of The Canadian Kennel Club in their order with their respective entries, after which additional classes with their respective entries may be placed.

4. Except at specialty club shows, the general classification of recognized breeds divided into six groups and in the same order as set forth in Chapter 5, shall be published in the catalogue in their proper groups and alphabetical position.

5. The foregoing provisions of Chapter 14 shall not apply to a Field Trial Bench Show. None the less a club which shall hold a Field Trial Bench Show shall cause to be prepared for the use of and to be filed with The

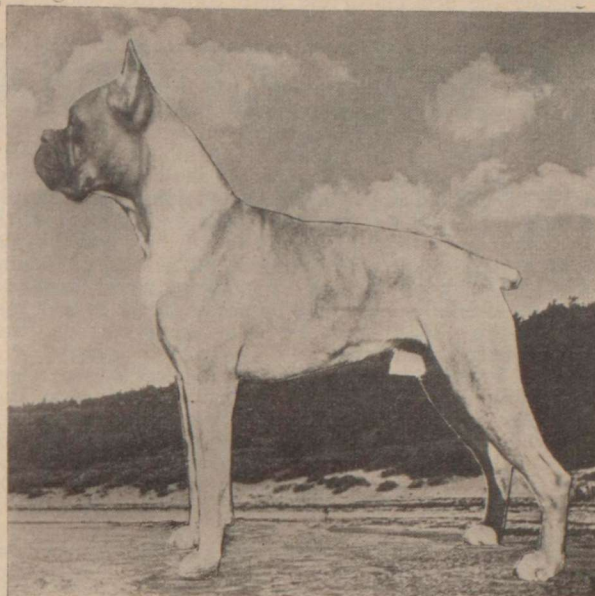

Canadian Kennel Club, a report of the entries and awards made at such shows which report shall be set forth in regulation form and shall contain in detail the information required by the terms of Sections 1 and 3 of this Chapter.

CHAPTER 15

The Dogs and Their Exhibitors

1. All dogs, entered and received at shows shall be kept on the benches or in the cages between the official opening and closing hours of the show, except while their class or classes are being judged, or during the periods designated for exercise.

The exercising periods and the hours for the opening and the closing of a show shall appear in every premium list and catalogue. Any person or persons failing to observe this rule after due warning by the superintendent of the show-giving club shall be subject to disciplinary action by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club.

2. Nothing shall be displayed on the bench or on the cage at a show except the kennel name and address, prizes and ribbons won by the dog at that show, a sign containing the dog's name and a sign not larger than 12 x 15 inches offering dogs or puppies for sale. No other sign shall be placed at the back of the bench or cage.

3. Any club or association giving a dog show must provide arm bands and shall see that every person exhibiting a dog wears, when in the ring, an arm band containing thereon the catalogue number of the dog being exhibited; but no badges, coats with kennel names thereon or ribbon prizes shall be worn or displayed, nor other visible means of identification used, by an individual when exhibiting a dog in the ring.

4. It is recommended that any club or association giving a dog show should provide in every ring a board upon which the awards may be written after each class is judged.

5. Any dog entered for competition and passed by the official Veterinary Surgeon and benched at any show held under Canadian Kennel Club rules, must compete in every class in which said dog is entered, unless said dog is excused on account of sickness or other cause by the official Veterinary Surgeon or Show Superintendent. If an exhibitor refuses to take his dog into the judging ring when ordered to do so, he shall be deprived of the privileges of The Canadian Kennel Club.

6. No dog shall be allowed to compete for a special prize for which any dog which has previously beaten it at the show may be eligible to compete.

7. In any class where there is a limit of weight or height the person in charge of a dog entered in such class may claim of the Superintendent or Secretary, the right, at any time after the opening of the show and before the judging of its class, to have the dog weighed or measured, and the result shall be recorded and held good at the time of judging at the show.

8. Any competing exhibitor or handler shall have the right, during the judging of the class, to demand the weighing, measuring or determination of color or marking

of any dog whose record has not been registered officially. The decision of the Show Superintendent shall be final in the determination of weight and height. The decision of the judge shall be final in the determination of color or markings. The bench show committee must provide scales and standard for this purpose.

9. If a dog shall have been entered in any regular class for which it is ineligible, or in the name of an owner not in accordance with the recorded registration on file with The Canadian Kennel Club unless application for transfer or ownership has been made within thirty days of the last day of the show, all prizes won by said dog in that class, including specials relating to the class, shall be cancelled by The Canadian Kennel Club, when the awards of the show are checked by The Canadian Kennel Club from its records. If cancellation occurs, all prizes shall be void if there is no dog of record to move up. In computing the championship points for a breed, said dog shall be counted as being at the show.

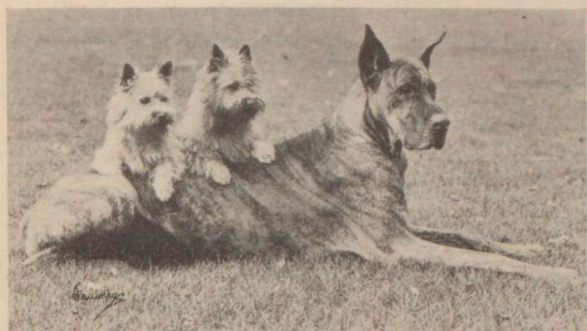
10. If the catalogue and/or the judge's book of any show shall be in error or mistake set forth any information contrary to the information which appears on the entry form of the dog for that show, the Bench Show Committee and/or the Superintendent of the show, upon request of the owner or handler of said dog prior to the judging, shall correct the entry in the judge's book and in the marked catalogue to be sent to The Canadian Kennel Club, and said dog properly may compete in all classes and for all prizes for which the entry form discloses it was properly entered.

11. If the win of a dog shall be cancelled, the dog next in order of merit shall be moved up, and the win of the dog moved up shall be counted the same as if it had been the original award. For this purpose, the judge shall place one dog reserve, after the regular prizes are awarded, if a dog of sufficient merit be available. Any such re-adjustment required shall be made by the Show Secretary after being advised by The Canadian Kennel Club.

12. If the win of a dog shall be cancelled by The Canadian Kennel Club the exhibitor or entrant of the dog shall return all money or special prizes which have been received for its win to the secretary of the show-giving club within twenty-one (21) days of the receipt of notice from The Canadian Kennel Club of said cancellation. The show-giving club shall in each instance of failure to comply with this rule, notify The Canadian Kennel Club of such failure and The Canadian Kennel Club upon receipt of such notice forthwith shall suspend the exhibitor so in default from all privileges of The Canadian Kennel Club and notify the exhibitor so in default that it has done so, and said suspension shall continue until The Canadian Kennel Club is notified that restitution has been made.

13. (a) In event of the cancellation of a win or disqualification of a dog by a show committee, notice of such shall be forwarded within seven days after the close of the show to the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club. The executive must at their first meeting thereafter either cancel

4. A judge shall be supplied with a book called the judge's book in which he shall mark all awards and all absent dogs. The original judges' books at shows shall be in the custody of the judge, secretary, steward or superintendent. None other shall be allowed access to them. At the conclusion of the judging, the book must be signed by the judge and any changes which may have been made therein initialed by him.

5. A judge's decision, as marked in the judge's book, cannot be changed by him after the closing of the show, but a clerical error appearing in the judge's book may be corrected by The Canadian Kennel Club after consultation with the judge.

6. The judge of each recognized breed shall designate as "Best of Breed" the best specimen, either male or female, entered in the regular official breed class or for specials, but no dog shall be designated "Best of Breed" at a show at which said dog has had the winners ribbon withheld for lack of merit.

7. Only one judge shall officiate in each Group Class and one judge select the Best in Show.

8. If a judge disqualifies a dog at any show, he shall make a note in the judge's book giving his reasons for such disqualification. In computing the championship points for a breed, said dog shall be counted as being in the show.

9. A judge shall disqualify a dog which, in his opinion, has been improperly tampered with and he shall enter his reasons for such disqualifications in the judging book.

10. No person shall approach a judge to favour his or her entries; if in writing he shall be expelled, forthwith.

11. Any person acting as a judge at a show held under these rules shall not exhibit for competition, nor act as an agent or handler at such show, and the penalty for violation shall be suspension and cancellation of all wins made by him or her at such show.

12. No judge shall judge any dogs he has owned, handled or boarded within 90 days prior to the date of the show.

13. No judge shall be allowed to smoke when handling dogs in the ring.

CHAPTER 18

The End of the Show

2. The following fines will be made:—

(a) For not making due returns of marked catalogue to The Canadian Kennel Club—FIVE DOLLARS.

(b) For non-payment of prize money or prizes offered by the show-giving club in its premium list within sixty days after the closing date of the show—ONE DOLLAR PER DAY.

(c) Donors of special prizes that do not deliver the special upon receipt of due notice from the show-giving club shall be subject to disciplinary action.

3. Refund of date fee.

CHAPTER 19

Miscellaneous

1. Bench show committees and superintendents of dog shows shall be held responsible for the enforcement of all rules and regulations relating to shows and must provide themselves with a complete copy of The Canadian Kennel Club rules and regulations for reference.

CHAPTER 20

Amendments

The Dog Show Rules and Regulations governing Clubs may be amended at any annual meeting of the Club by the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members present. Notice of all proposed amendments must be in writing, signed by at least one member in good standing and filed with the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club by November 1st of the current year, and shall be included in the notice calling such meeting otherwise the meeting shall have no power to act thereon.

Amendments to these Dog Show Rules and Regulations shall be effective immediately except in cases where they may be effected by any amendments to the Constitution in which case they shall be effective immediately upon the amendments to the Constitution being approved by the Minister of Agriculture.
