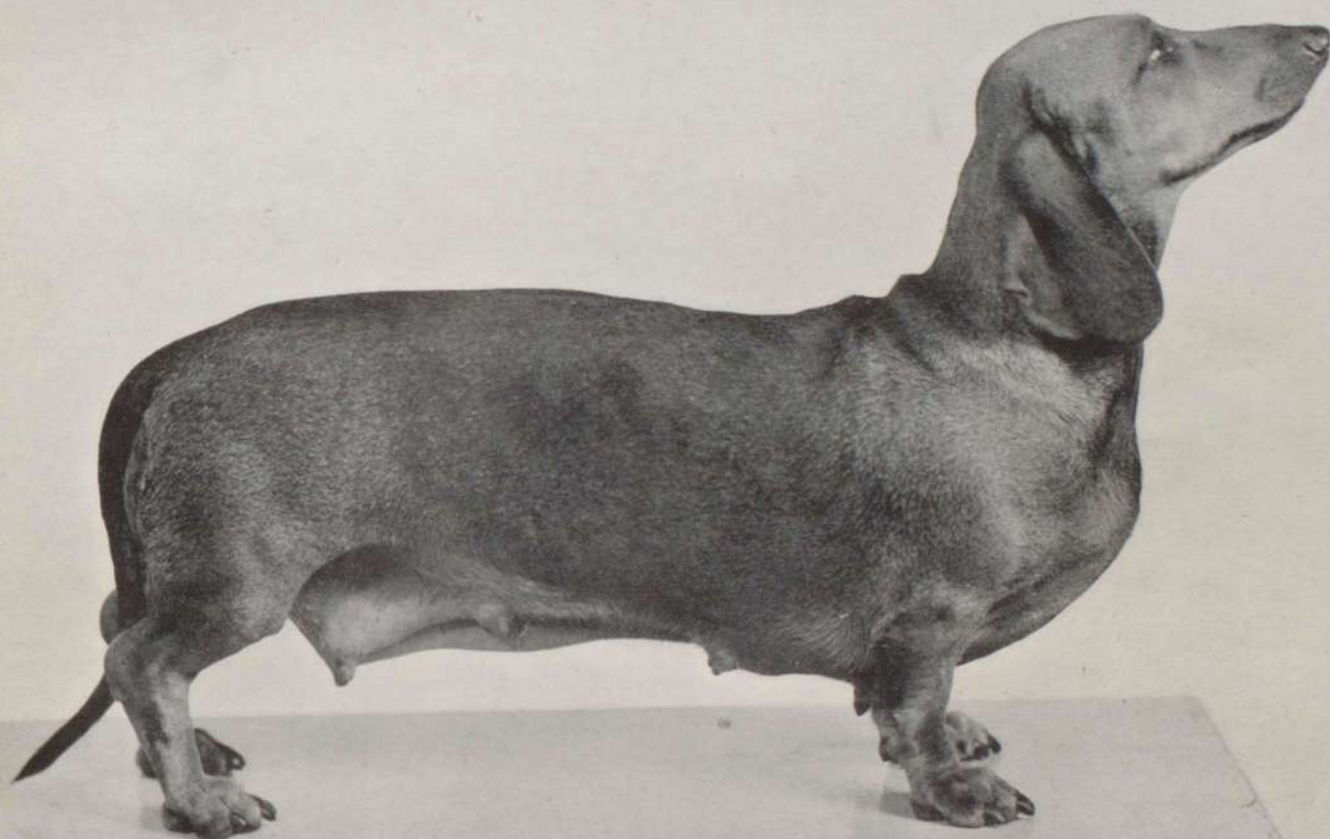

OUR FRONTISPIECE

THE comely little lady appearing on the front cover this month is Ch. Cairo of Joyce, a Smooth Dachshund bred and owned by Mrs. Joy Osterdahl of Brockville, Ontario. Cairo has just returned from the Maritime show circuit where she was Best of Breed at each of the four shows at which she was entered, and at the Bedford Kennel Club show won The Canadian Kennel Club award for the best Canadian-bred dog or bitch in show owned by a member of The Canadian Kennel Club. Cairo has gone Best of Breed the last ten times running. She commenced her march to the ranks of Champions by earning four points at the Ladies Kennel Club of Canada show in 1940 and followed this up by Best of Breed wins at the Toronto Kennel Club, Canadian National Exhibition and Hamilton Kennel Club fall shows in 1941, all of these wins providing more than the required number of championship points necessary to earn her title.

Her sire is Champion Tucson Von Mayndale, who is by Ch. Achat von Werderhavelstrand (imp.) out of Ch. Gold-dust. Her dam, Ch. Metta of Mayndale, was bred by Charles F. Schaefer of Gowanstown, Ontario, and was purchased by Mrs. Osterdahl when still a puppy. Metta is by a son of Int. Ch. Arno von Luitpoldshelm (imp.) out of May Queen of Mayndale, who is by Axel von Isarstrande ex Ch. Brunhilde. Metta herself did considerable winning for she was Best in the Hound Group at the Ladies Kennel Club of Canada show 1939, Best of Breed at the Canadian National Exhibition show 1940 and was Best of Breed and second in the Hound Group at the recent Guelph show.

Cairo's last litter of pups, now about fifteen months old, show great promise, one having one Winner and two Reserves to her credit at the age of one year and the other was Reserve at the last Hamilton show at eleven months of age.

Cairo has been well loved by those who have known her due to her delightful disposition and her love of going "dog show".

A native of Nova Scotia, born at Annapolis Royal, Mrs. Osterdahl spent nine years at an English boarding school at Edgely, Windsor, N.S., although her home at that time was Halifax. Later Mrs. Osterdahl spent a couple of years travelling through England, Holland and Germany, returning to Halifax for a period of two years. After her father's death she moved to Montreal with her kennels at Dorval. After three years Mrs. Osterdahl moved to Brockville, Ontario, there to work with Dr. and Mrs. Flanders.

The only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. M. Bradford, Mrs. Osterdahl married Mr. Osterdahl in Montreal about eight years ago. He joined the Royal Canadian Engineers and went overseas at the beginning of the second world war. Her hobbies are dog breeding, horses, goats, swimming, tennis, ground hockey, basketball and gardening, although she has little time to indulge in sports as apart from her kennels she has fourteen goats, seven horses and ponies, three Siamese cats (belonging to Mrs. Flanders), and dog boarders to look after as well as assisting Dr. Flanders, a Veterinary Surgeon, with his "patients".

Mrs. Osterdahl's chief aim in breeding is to produce good, healthy, useful Dachshunds with the wonderful dispositions that are rightfully theirs, and Cairo's popularity would seem to indicate success in her efforts.

Editorial

DOUBTLESS most breeders have from time to time paused to reflect on the general condition of their favorite breed from a qualitative point of view, and it may be that they have asked themselves two questions. First: how has it been possible for breeders over a period of years to improve their breed despite obstacles, natural and otherwise? Second: how can the breeders of today and tomorrow hope to accelerate improvements or prevent deterioration, as the case may be? In the final analysis it will no doubt be agreed that for the most part all improvements—and, by the same token, the opposite—have been due to human interference. The word is used advisedly, for it has been and is a well-meant interference since it could serve no useful purpose to be otherwise.

The purpose of this editorial is not to go into the first of the two questions set forth above, but rather to make a suggestion in regard to the latter. The sum total of a breeder's knowledge is based on experience, experiment and observation. He may have a fairly good picture in his mind of many of the "name" dogs in his breed through canine publications. He may be familiar with the main good or bad points of certain strains, and of course his observations are limited entirely to his own dogs, and dogs which he has observed and possibly closely examined at the shows. Geography being what it is on this continent, most breeders have little opportunity of observing first hand what is going on in other parts of the country or continent. As a result, a breeder can hardly be expected to have a fairly accurate picture of most of the dogs appearing in the pedigrees of his stock unless they are the results of his own breeding operations over a period of years or have been bred near at hand.

It would therefore seem that what is required is some method whereby a breeder is able to obtain a reliable and accurate detailed description in the way of the good points and faults of the stud dogs available for breeding purposes, and the same particulars for the dogs appearing in the pedigrees of dogs which he proposes to use for breeding purposes.

If any fanciers have any suggestions to make in this regard, your editor will be pleased to receive them for discussion in our reader columns.

THE CORRECT TREATMENT TO MAINTAIN A BITCH IN PERFECT HEALTH

HAVING found the corner-stone upon which your kennel will be built up—viz. the perfect bitch—we now go on to the treatment of her. Do not over-feed and under-exercise. Either is bad, but together they are fatal to her career as a super-brood bitch.

Let her food be plain; and, remember, whether you like it or not, that the dog is a natural scavenger, and is none the better, but the contrary, for being fed on "delicate cakes on a silver dish". Nor does the dog need a plenteous supply of patent medicines. "Quacking" and rich feeding are as harmful to a dog as to a child. Give her plenty of whole-meal bread and red meat, raw or lightly cooked, a large hard bone once a week of the marrow-bone type, and free access to water. She needs a good bed, dry and non-draughty, where she can lie at full length and which must be kept scrupulously clean; brush her well daily, keep her free from worms, let her have lots of exercise, and that is all. The reason very poor people's dogs, often arrant mongrels, have mostly such good health, is not because mongrels are constitutionally stronger than highly-bred dogs, but because they live hard and aren't "fussed". A little iodised powder sprinkled on food is valuable, as it gives the necessary mineral salts with iron, phosphates and calcium which are apt to be insufficiently present in the ordinary diet. Cod liver oil and Parrish's syrup (mixed), when the weather is not too hot, are also most beneficial as a tonic conditioner.

Now I must touch on a really difficult problem. Should the brood bitch be shown? My better judgment makes me unhesitatingly answer, "No." Shows are not really good for dogs. They get over-excited, the buildings are overheated, the dogs' routine is disturbed, many of them hate the ring and the attendant handling by strangers. Sitting chained on a bench all day is no pleasure to them; they moan or sulk at their unwanted captivity what time "the call of the wild" sounds in their ears in vain.

To a bitch it isn't a case of "Il faut souffrir pour etre belle," but "Parce que je suis belle il faut souffrir." Moreover, there is ever present the risk of infection. However, if a bitch is strong and healthy, shows in moderation do her no real harm. But there is another more serious point. The K.C. rules lay it down that to become a champion a dog must obtain three challenge certificates under three different judges. This is a much harder ruling than it sounds. The owner naturally looks for judges to whom his particular canine type appeals. The number of judges at championship shows is limited, and one may have to wait a long time for what one considers a "suitable" judge. Especially is this the case after one or two C.C.'s have been obtained. The temptation to go on for the third is almost irresistible, and it may mean long delay before one gets a championship show accessible or at a suitable date, or with a judge who

has neither previously "put the dog down" nor awarded him a C.C. In the case of a bitch it is far harder. I know how often one enters her and then she disappoints one by coming into season, so that she cannot be shown. Most people breed from a bitch on her second heat for her own sake and that of her figure make-up, but if she is a good show bitch one is apt to postpone her second litter again and again for the sake of the vanishing carrots of certificates. The consequence is that we pass over the three best years of breeding and then mate her at four or five years old, or later, when she is perhaps show-tired and nervy, and so miss altogether the best litters she is capable of producing. The waste of high-class bitches thus brought about is tremendous.

Most of our litters are from very young or rather elderly bitches—a very bad thing for the breed. It takes the best part of a year from the onset of heat and the mating to the re-establishment of show condition. And a dog's life is so short and its best years so few. It is hard to see how to cure this drawback to the showing of bitches. The only thing to do is to compromise. Show your bitch up to the time of her first mating that the "cognoscenti" may see her and appraise her worth. Then after her first whelping be prepared to retire her from the ring and concentrate on her progeny. You will gain in the long run in the quality and soundness of your young stock, and your fellow-breeders will (or should) bless you for your magnanimity in putting the breed interests always in the forefront.

Finally, we come to the choice of a sire. I am not going to write you a treatise on Mendelian principles, line-breeding, in-breeding, or any other much-discussed biological theories. There are plenty of books on these topics if you want to consult them. But, going on the assumption from which I started, that I am writing to advise novice breeders how to start building up a sound, healthy, typical and distinctive strain, I will set down some practical suggestions.

First, carefully consider your bitch's pedigree and the constitutional characteristics she may have inherited or be likely to pass on to her offspring. Make up your mind which of the famous dogs in her pedigree she herself most resembles and whose type you desire to perpetuate.

By this time you will begin to have some knowledge of type, strains, outstanding dogs of the past and their individual representatives today. So look for a dog who has at least one ancestor in common with your bitch. If this ancestor appears two or three times in the extended pedigree, so much the better. You have then a strong "common factor" with which to work out your type. Having found a likely dog of the

same type as your bitch, and of the required ancestry, study his individual characteristics. For example, be sure that he has the head and expression you wish to "fix" in your strain. As I have already said, head and expression are most important in the dog.

Next, quite honestly consider the defects of your bitch. Is she strong enough in bone, not too long in back, has she good round feet with short toes, small close-set ears (in Retrievers), good hindquarters and well-set stern? In this inspection be very severe and honest with yourself and then make sure that the dog is extra good in the respects where she may tend to fail. Remember that defects, by some odd law of Nature, are much more readily perpetuated than virtues. Finally, try to see puppies he has sired and note their characteristics, making sure that they are of good quality and not coarse. Having satisfied yourself with the choice of a sire, make arrangements with his owner well beforehand and await events. When the litter arrives, if it is good, make up your mind to keep the best bitch for breeding and the best for show and stud. If you sell all but one, keep the bitch, as she will be the first real step in building your strain.

For care of the bitch before and after whelping and also for weaning of puppies there are plenty of reliable guides. But I will mention one or two things. For ten days before the whelping date keep your bitch on slops and raw meat—no hard tack whatever. Give her a good dose of castor oil and paraffin (two parts to one) two or three days before she is due. Let her be thoroughly used to her whelping kennel—she ought to be in at least a fortnight beforehand in order that she may make her nest. Let her have her usual fibre or straw bedding till labour begins, then have ready several clean sacks loosely filled with cut-up disinfected straw and stitched up. Use these as mattresses for the dam and whelp, changing them daily. When she goes off her food and shows by restlessness, that labour is approaching, clear away the bedding and tack down firmly but not too tightly a clean empty sack; it gives her foothold for straining and the puppies are more comfortable on it. Sponge her teats and belly with warm water containing one of the well-known disinfectants, mop her dry, and let her get on with the job.

Judge your litter at three days and again at three weeks; mark those you wish to keep, if it is a good litter, and don't change your mind. Abide by your judgment.

Lastly, the next time you mate her (you should miss her next heat), if the mating has been highly satisfactory, stick to the same dog; otherwise select by the same method. Above all, never use a mere "outcross"; it will only ruin your type. With two bitches you have made a really good start in building a distinctive strain. Proceed on the same lines and do not be tempted to deviate from your type.

AT THE SHOWS

Guelph

The first show of the reorganized Guelph Kennel Club and sponsored by the Junior Board of Trade of the City of Guelph was held in the Arena at Guelph, on Saturday, September 5th, with about 175 dogs entered for competition. The show was very well attended throughout the course of the day.

Two Springer Spaniel puppies donated by William Rimmer, of Guelph, vice-president of the club, and a Pointer puppy donated by a resident of Guelph were raffled off at the close of the day. As a consequence of these activities the club was able to turn over to the Guelph Daily Mercury British Distress Fund the sum of \$657.00.

The judges included G. M. Parham, of Ferndale, Mich., who judged all breeds in Group One except Cocker and Springers, all breeds in Group 2 and the best in these two Groups. Wm. J. Westcott, Jr., of Lansing, Mich., was judge of Cocker and Springers. The well known Glenn Staines, of Detroit, Mich., judged the breeds forming the Working Group as well as the group itself. The awards to all other breeds, Groups and Best in Show were made by Captain H. Dudley-Waters, of Highland Creek, Ontario. For his Best in Show, Captain Waters selected the Springer Spaniel, Am. Ch. Frejax Whirlaway, owned by Fred Jackson, of Detroit. Best Canadian-bred in show went to the Old English Sheepdog, Blue Tangles of Clearbrook, bred and owned by the Clearbrook Kennels of Caledon, Ontario.

Judge Mr. Parham placed the above mentioned Springer best in the Sporting Group with best in the Hound Group going to the Afghan Hound, Am. Ch. Kurran El Myia, bred and owned by Mrs. E. R. Matchett, of West Hill, Ontario.

The above mentioned Old English Sheep Dog was selected by Mr. Staines as best in the Working Group.

In the Terrier Group Judge Captain Waters selected the Skye Terrier, Schehallion imported and owned by Mrs. R. P. Adams, of Montreal. Best in Toy Group was the Pomeranian, Wembly Orange Prince, bred and owned by George Potts, of Toronto, and best in Non-Sporting Group went to Walter Brown's English Bulldog, Kempston Moravian Ajax.

THE AMERICAN WATER SPANIEL

Quite recently The Canadian Kennel Club added to its list of recognized breeds the American Water Spaniel and the first representatives of this breed to be registered in Canada were a male and female imported by Arthur C. Orton, of Ruthven, Ontario.

While his virtues as a gun dog have long been recognized by thousands of sportsmen in the United States, recognition by the American Kennel Club was not sought until 1940.

The breed is definitely American in origin and he, therefore, ranks along with the Chesapeake Bay, the American Foxhound and the Boston Terrier as a native of the United States.

It is said by those who have employed him for hunting purposes that for all round usefulness he has no equal. They are dependable watch dogs and are especially fond of children.

His general appearance is of a dog medium in size, having the typical spaniel characteristics, a curly coat, amiable disposition and a demeanor that indicates intelligence, strength and endurance. In height he runs from 15 to 18 inches at the shoulder and from 25 to 45 pounds in weight.

The Irish Setter

In an article of mine not long ago I made some brief comments on the status of the Irish setter in Canada, I mentioned particularly that the breed on the whole was in need of improvement. That statement still obtains but does by no means imply that our setters are not good.

We have some very excellent dogs in Canada, much better perhaps than we get credit for. There are poor specimens in every breed and absolute perfection in none. Every dog regardless of how outstanding he is, or is thought to be, has his faults. The appraisal of a dog is, after all, a matter of opinion and consensus of opinion is what counts.

In a recent issue of an American publication some very frank comments on the Irish setter were made by a well-known authority and breeder, we quote from an interview; "I think the future of the breed is good but the type is going back — too many roachbacks, snipey nosed, high set ears, high tails, straight stifles and bad feet, poor coats and colour". No doubt this authority does not mean to combine all these defects in one dog and while collectively they sound alarming, individually they are well within the realm of correction.

Just what he means by "type" is not definitely clear to me, I presume he means his ideal according to his judgment. To me "type" is a very elastic word as regards Irish setters for there are so many strains that the type varies considerably and what would be one fancier's ideal might not meet with the approval of many another. This diversity of type, nevertheless, fits well into the requirements of the standard.

Every physical perfection is allied to a defect into which it threatens to pass if allowed to drift that way. If the "type" is going back it is the fault of the breeders for breeders alone control matings. Then too, there are far too many breeding for fashionable pedigrees rather than individual perfection.

A dog with a "fashionable pedigree" which has proven his individual excellence in significant style and exhibits the qualities desired and whose progenitors when studied do not disclose any undesirable characteristics is worthy of consideration. This does not imply, however, that the hoped for type of offspring will be produced even if the bitch is carefully selected.

Neither is it sufficient to think that because a dog has several champions in his pedigree that he is going to be a successful producer. The sincere fancier desiring to breed intelligently will select a sire for compensative reasons as well as taking into consideration, pedigree, individuality and his potency to produce progeny of high calibre.

While the foregoing may constitute a few of the obvious rules in breeding, it does not explain why the Irish Setter in the United States should retrogress at this stage of the game, for Americans well know the principles of breeding and with so many good dogs available

it is difficult to understand the decline. It may be possible that too many are breeding for sales only and such a venture as a rule does not merit the expenditure necessary for the production of high class stock. But whatever the case may be, it is heartening to learn that our American fancier still thinks "the future of the breed is good".

In Canada the selection of a sire is limited but even so I do not believe that our setters are deteriorating or that the "type is going back". On the contrary, I think Canadian bred dogs are on the upward trend and, although production is comparatively small they are appreciably improved.

Credit must be given to Mr. R. Ray McLaughlin in his endeavor to improve the breed by importing into this country such good dogs as, Ch. Sagan of Shaunavon, Ch. Patron of Ide, Galea Shiel, Wistful Sadie and his most recent American importation, Benedict O'Coobler. The stud dogs housed in Mr. McLaughlin's kennels are contributing a worthwhile service.

Mr. Fred Ratcliffe, of St. Catharines, a former fancier bred many good dogs in his day. I believe he is the only Canadian breeder who has produced an international champion. This dog was Moira, whelped Feb. 3rd, 1931. She was sired by Tipperary Shamrock Bang and her dam was Capitola. Capitola was bred by Mrs. G. Cook of England and was imported to Canada by Mr. Ratcliffe. A mating of Moira and Ch. Flornell Squire of Milson produced some good ones among which was Ch. Bonny Red Squire a stud dog of a few years ago.

I believe Mr. Ratcliffe may be coming back into the fancy as last spring at the Hamilton show he exhibited a rather good looking youngster. It is to be hoped so interested an admirer does return to the ranks.

Another genuine lover of the breed is Mrs. W. G. Camp whose breeding career although short, was crowned with considerable success. From her Ch. Lillibet came an outstanding litter, three of which made their championship. One of these, Ch. Roamer Jerry of Falingbrook, owned by Mr. Gordon Harkness turned out to be rather prodigious in the field. This litter was sired by the well known Champion Forest Lucky Strike of "Stone" fame.

Incidentally, Lucky Strike was the last champion to be bred by the late Chas. Stone. Lucky came to rather an untimely and tragic end when he was poisoned while accompanying Mrs. Stone on a visit in British Columbia. Mr. Stone was a breeder of long duration and was internationally known. He was Secretary of the Canadian Kennel Club from Sept. 1888 until Sept. 1890. In 1928 he was made Honorary President which office he held until his death.

But the Stone name is destined to live on as Mrs. Stone now possesses a fine "Wildair" product which she intends to show next spring when he will be two years old.

A somewhat new fancier and breeder is Mr. E. S. McKay, he is an enthusiastic booster of the breed and loves the sport of showing. No doubt, the real thrill will come to him when he has one of his own breeding prove successful. He is also interested in Afgans and at present has a lovely young prospect.

Another name worthy of mention is that of Mr. Kenneth Alton, of Freeman, Ont. This sporting gentleman is deeply interested in the breed especially when they are trained hunters. Success had just begun to come his way, when for some unknown reason he dropped out of the breeding picture. Perhaps he may make a comeback later on.

Among devotees of the Irish setter we might include the names of Mr. and Mrs. A. H. Clarke. Their newly crowned champion, Patrick Milson of Hawarden, recalls to mind another name once prominent in the production of good dogs. I refer to Mr. M. H. Meek who owned the good bitch Patricia Rosabelle a daughter of Ch. Higgins Red Coat. From matings of this bitch with Champion Kinvarra Bryn and later Ch. Milson O'Boy this country is the richer in good Irish blood. Mr. and Mrs. Clarke's "Pat" is from the latter mating.

In conclusion I would like to pay tribute to other breeders throughout Canada who are endeavouring to improve the breed, among these are: J. Forbes, Vancouver, B.C., Ardee Kennels, Waldhiem, Sask., J. Burkinshaw, Saskatoon, Mr. and Mrs. Eamens, Winnipeg, Man., Mrs. A. Fisher, Stoney Mountain, Man., Stanley A. Beatty, Halifax, N.S., Amedee Trudeau, Longueuil, Que., Mrs. Herd, St. Lambert, Que., and numerous others.

The advent of another year should see a new lot of fanciers and a greatly improved lot of Irish setters.

Adoption of Minutes

It was moved by Mrs. Brown, seconded by Mr. Reeves, and carried:

"That the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Directors held on Thursday, August 13th, be adopted".

Letter from Live Stock Records Office re Breed Names

A letter from the Live Stock Records Office was read in respect to the breed names as they appeared on the certificates of registration. After discussion the Board decided that in order to have uniformity in the use of breed names the said breed names would appear on certificates of registration exactly as set forth in Article 34 of the Constitution, this practice to be initiated on January 1st, 1943.

Letter from Live Stock Records Office re Kennel Names

A letter from the Live Stock Records office was read in respect to the employment of kennel names on the certificates of registration to show the breeder and/or owner of a registered dog. After discussion the Secretary was directed to inform the Live Stock Records office of the following decisions:

1. A kennel name may not be used to indicate the breeder or owner of a dog unless the said kennel name is registered with The Canadian Kennel Club.
2. Where kennel names are used to indicate the breeder or owner of a dog, the proprietor or proprietors operating under that name and in whose name the kennel name is registered, shall be shown in brackets alongside of the kennel name on the certificate.
3. The questionnaire which accompanied their letter be employed as and when the Live Stock Records office deem it necessary to request the information indicated by the questionnaire.

Appointment of Recording Office

The Board discussed at length the appointment of a recording office as set forth in the Constitution, Article 13.

"That by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 13 of the Constitution of The Canadian Kennel Club and in view of the Solicitor's approval of the resolution drafted by the Record Committee of the Canadian National Live Stock Records we continue our relations with the Canadian National Livestock Records under the following agreement:
