# British Columbia Gun Dog Retriever Trials

What may be properly called the first orthodox Championship Retriever Trials ever held on this coast were staged adjacent to Vancouver on September 24th-25th, under the auspices of the B.C. Gun Dog Club, and Canadian Kennel Club rules. Mr. Bert Blair was the organizing genius in charge of events and he conducted them in his usual brilliant manner. He was assisted by Hal Straight, Managing Editor of the Vancouver Sun as steward, and President McLaren, Secy. Krogg, Ben Furey, Dan Neal, and members of the Club.

The venue was of the story book variety, the land courses faced the coast range of mountains in the north and west, the mighty Fraser River flowing towards the sea to the south, and the Pitt River on the east. All in a country where fur, feather, and fish abound in their natural state. The Wild Duck Inn was the headquarters with the hosts Routley and Shaw serving everything sporting men could desire on such a day.

The event had a decidedly International flavor with the entries of Lieut. Paul Bakewell 3d. U.S.N., home town St. Louis, Mo.; Mr. Bishopric and party who came all the way from Cincinnati, Ohio; Claude Bekings, Seattle; Dr. McLean, Kelowna; A. E. Jolivet, Victoria, and they gave the local entries fine competition.

The weather was ideal for the spectators but a trifle too hot for good scenting conditions on the first day of the land trials. It was on the first day's land trials that Lieut. Bakewell gave so many of our handlers a postgraduate course in handling retrieving dogs afield when the going is tough. Lieut. Bakewell is an amateur handler in every sense of the word. He is also big enough to lend a helping hand to others not so experienced. It should not be assumed that trick handling counts in Retriever trials, but there is simply no substitute for competency. When Lieut. Bakewell's dog is on the course every mental attribute of man and dog are in complete co-ordination to an extent quite beyond the belief of the uninitiated. Every sound of the whistle, the duration of the note, and the quality of the tone carried its own specific message from handler to dog. As one wag remarked Lieut. Bakewell could hup or turn his dog on a dime at any given point.

Another outstanding performance of finished handling was turned in by the veteran E. J. Cameron when handling the entry of his son, Flight Lieut. Bill Cameron's "Sky Pilot Judy". Mr. Cameron, Sr., being a former harness horse man, understands the necessity for speed in the stretch and evidently trained Judy accordingly.

Keith Coglan, Henry Christinsen, A. E. Jolivet, Tyke Abernethy, Claude Bekins and others turned in good handling performances and it appears By W. H. Pym

to this recorder that good handling is not the difference between amateur and professional, but rather the difference between major and minor league competition.

The Club was very fortunate in their selection of judges. For the first trial Dan Neal and Fred Spencer officiated. For the second event Henry Castillou, K.C. James Washington and O. B. Harrison donned the ermine. We thought each judge turned in an excellent performance with dignity and authority. The well known Billy Oates was the official gun. As he did have a "miss" in two days, he must be quite a fellow with a gun.

We hear so much about the difference between the so-called show dog and hunting dog that this subject is worth review. At these trials the work for the dogs consisted of retrieving three pheasants on land, and three mallard ducks in the water trial. "planted" pheasant was situated about seventy-five yards from the staring point with the remaining two pheasants shot approximately seventy-five yards on each side of the planted bird. The water trial was so situated that it was necessary for the dogs to travel about seventy-five yards through a mud flat and retrieve his ducks from the marsh reeds and out of the fast moving river. On the river the dog was required to swim through decoys in order to reach

At this trial I did not see a single dog that did not have a right to compete at a first class dog show. If a dog is not built right he simply has not the physical endurance to competently perform his duties afield in such a trial. In addition to being built right, a dog must be conditioned for such a task and I believe lack of work was responsible for a few dogs slowing down after retrieving a couple of birds.

The winner of both trials was Lieut. Bakewell's Internationally known dual (now triple) Champion "Shed of Arden" On the first major day Major Austin C. Taylor's "Taylors Topper" was the runner-up. This dog, handled by Henry Christensen, is definitely of major league calibre and will be heard from again. At the second trial "Shed of Arden" again turned in a magnificent performance to catch the judges eye. The runner-up was Lieut. Cameron's "Sky Pilot Judy" who must have just missed by a whisker. Some of the other contestants which impressed the gallery of approximately a thousand spectators were Dr. McLean's "Sky Pilot Penwell"; Bert Blair's "Bracken Sweep"; Claude Bekin's "Scoronine" Tyke Abernethy's "Sky Pilot Tupper" (placed third); A. E. Jolivet's "Brackens Jill" (evidently not at her best on account of maternal duties). The lone Chesapeake, "Cariboo Mick", while not fortunate on pheasants certainly was the answer to the duck hunter's prayer. A strong going dog that gave the impression he could work all day. But probably the sweetheart of the trials was Lieut. Bakewell's Golden Retriever "Stillrover Superspeed". She possesses super speed plus, with brains to spare. In one of the land trials she retrieved her first two birds in 20 seconds and 32 seconds respectively. All she requires is the opportunity and she will win a championship in a hurry in any competition.

In conversation with Lieut. Bakewell after the trials he offered the following suggestions, which coming from one who has enjoyed such outstanding success in the world's best trials, his comments should be accepted without question: (I quote) First, I want to tell you how pleasantly surprised at the quality of most of the dogs and their work. The water tests were different than anything we had seen in the States. Invariably the blind from which the dog works is within ten yards of the water's edge. You had yours fifty yards from the shore so the dogs had to cover fifty yards of marsh and then enter the water. That was excellent and a fine test. However, the duck was so close to the shore it was not necessary to direct the dog once he was in the water for he only had a few yards to swim. I think one of the most important qualities of a finished dog is his ability to swim boldly for a good long distance and take directions in the water. To test this, a combination of your test with a hidden bird about one hundred yards over water will really boost up a top dog and chop the poor one to his own size.

The cover where the blind retrieve on land was held, hid the dogs from view of the handlers and the judges. A dog's hunting ability is determined by his work on marked birds. A blind retrieve is to test a dog's handling ability and to test this it is necessary that the dog and handler be in a position to see one another so the dog can be given directions. And if the judges can't see the dog, how does he know whether or not the dog is running wild or handling properly? We suggest a little lighter cover for the blind retrieves

If at all possible, it is desirable to move to a fresh piece of ground for each dog, as remaining in one place produces a definite hardship on the later dog's run due to the fouling of the ground by the previous falls.

The dogs who failed completely on land were brought back for water work. This seemed to be nothing but a waste of valuable time for obviously they could not be placed. How much better it would be to weed out the failing dogs then use the time saved to run additional series for the better dogs. In that way they would be given

more opportunities to show exactly what they had and what they lacked.

In hunting pheasant it is customary to have your Retriever at heel. He then sits when the game rises. Rather than have them sit in a given spot with the handler behind (which is not as it is done on a day's shoot).

Wouldn't it be better to have the dogs walking at heel until the game is shot than have them sit behind the handler?

Please be assured none of this is said in criticism. It was an excellent trial and my comments are submitted on request and in the interests of a better trial and the development of the game in your section. I know of no location where the natural interest could be better developed and I hope some day to have the pleasure of being with you again. Unquote.

It is a very great pleasure to receive such constructive criticism. This writer has advocated the "walk up trial" for pheasant, and would like to see a universal schedule of work so that international competition could be developed and operated under rules and regulations drafted by an international organization.

The absence of the Rockhaven Kennels Golden Retrievers, owned by Col. S. S. Magoffin was conspicuous. We have missed the entries from this kennel due to the fact that there was no proper competition for them here. However, dogs from this kennel and their

progeny have enjoyed tremendous success at the major trials held in the United States, and it is hoped that now we are finally getting this Retriever trial business on a sound basis, we will see many of the Rockhaven Golden Retrievers in future trials,

# WHY CAN'T WE HAVE MORE JUDGES? By Dollie Wall

Much could be learned and much pleasure and knowledge derived, if all those interested in animals, especially dog breeders could attend a function such as the Chilliwack fair, to see how the boys and girls are taught and trained to handle and judge the cattle, horses, swine and poultry.

At such a judging contest each contestant judges the animal in accordance with his or her interpretation of the breed standard, the examiner in turn after making the awards gives an oral illustration of the work required.

To thoroughly familiarize the pupils with all points of the animals, show-manship classes are held, and the judges of these classes after making their awards again orally describe the requirements of the work.

At this fair one could see youngsters in their early 'teens exhibiting draft horses, light horses, cows and calves in the various judging rings. These children are taught the principals of livestock breeding and exhibiting which is a tremendous contribution to the livestock industry.

Among the many fine trophies offered was the W. H Pym trophy, awarded to the boy or girl for the grand aggregate total and when presenting this trophy the donor said: "You have been the winner of this trophy by feature of having secured the highest aggregate of points in the judging contest just concluded, you have demonstrated that education with application fits one to be a genuine authority on any chosen subject."

Here we are dog exhibitors knowing what is taking place in the other breeds of livestock and make no effort whatsoever to educate our young exhibitors, so that they may in time become competent judges. All this goes to show that the old saying "judges are born not made" is just a silly myth.

The second Annual Field Trial for Setters and Pointers staged by the Field Trial Branch of the Saskatoon Kennel Club on September 3rd and 4th proved to be the most colorful and successful event of its kind ever held in this part of Saskatchewan. The trials were run under the C.K.C. rules and it was interesting to note that the majority of the dogs competing were registered in the C.K.C. Stud Book.

Mrs. Pat Randall, probably the most versatile member of the fair sex connected with the sport in Canada, occupied the Field Marshal's saddle and was complimented by the judges for the efficient manner in which her duties were carried out. Pat was a few jumps ahead of the gallery throughout the trial.

Wherever doggy folks congregate around these parts there you will find this "life-long friend of man's best friend". We noticed her at the Field Trial joining in the fun and really "riding to hounds".

#### Shooting Dog Stake-Twelve Entries

First, "Rap's Saskatoon Duchess", C.K.C. 184496, a flashy, liver and white Pointer bitch, owned by Mrs. R. L. Orge and handled by Ralph Orge. Duchess excelled as a bird-finder, having four finds in the thirty minutes she was down. Steady to flush and shot and under perfect control at all times. Her points were made with snap and style that left little to be desired. In second place, "Mendels Soda", liver and white Pointer, little sister to the first placed dog. "Soda" carried a little too much weight. Had two finds, one on pheasant and another on Hungarian partridge. Handled by F. Van Impe, she was steady to flush and shot. Third to "Topsy", English Setter bitch, owned and handled by E. H. Butterfield. A fast stylish going dog.

#### Amateur All Age Stake-Eight Entries

Another liver and white Pointer, "Rip Rap's Michey", C.K.C. 184495, took top honors in this event, Charles Watt owner-handler. A bird-wise dog if ever there was one, his handling of a covery of Huns on the edge of the stubble was somewhat of a revelation to many in the gallery. "Mickey" had four finds in all and displayed perfect manners when the gun was fired. In second place, "Ab's Lightning", C.K.C. 185219, liver and white bitch, owned and handled by A. W. Uebele. "Lightning" took in all the territory, had one find, a covey of Huns and was steady. "Hansom", English Setter male, owned by Brigadier Trudeau and handled by Sgt. Major Roy, placed third. This dog demonstrated that he possessed a chokebore onse, had several finds on both chickens and partridges, was steady under fire. Lacking in pace to the dogs placed above him.

#### Derby-Eleven Entries

A classy, lightly marked, liver and white Pointer bitch, "Nu-Jene's Lindy", C.K.C. 185332, owned and handled by T. M. Guytar, led the parade in this event. Sent away in the first brace, "Lindy" really reached out, showed excellent pace and was bird hunting all the way. With seconds to go she made her find, snapping into point on a

covery of Huns. The birds were in short grass on the top of the knoll. "Lindy" really styled up on this one. "Rap's Saskatoon Duchess" ran another good race and was a worthy winner of second place, "Ab's Lightning" being placed third.

#### Open All Age

With thirteen entries, the running of this stake saw some of the best run and most hotly contested heats of the trial. Sunday the weather had been really hot with brilliant sunshine all day. On Monday, however, long hanging clouds appeared rather foreboding and just as the first brace of dogs was sent away rain started to fall. For two hours it continued and birds proved difficult to find. Then a break appeared in the clouds, the sun broke through and conditions were ideal for the remainder of the day.

"Ab's Lightning" down in the first heat had created a most favorable impression. Covering the course with speed and purpose, she "nailed" a covey of Huns in a weed patch on the open prairie and had really shown class. So this dog was called back to run a second series, braced with the bye dog, the English Setter "Topsy".

The course for this heat started near the farm house, running directly south on open prairie over a valley stretching for a mile or more to the banks of the Saskatchewan River. Here it turned westward across a gully, dotted with popular and willow bluffs, to the stubble beyond.

A large gallery was on hand as the dogs got away like greyhounds from the slips. As they separated the Setter swung to the west with the Pointer making a wide cast to the east. The pace was really HOT. Butterfield was handling the Setter to perfection and "Topsy" moved with style as she crossed in front, head high and tail batting the breeze. "Lightning" now appeared in front, then reached out to the west with "Topsy" far to the east. Again they crossed in front. The little Pointer was really bird hunting. Every likely spot was given the "once-over" Uebele, mounted on a raw-boned broncho, was carrying a long stick, this he used alternately to urge his steed to greater efforts and to wave it high above his head as a signal for his dog to turn. "Lightning" never once failed to respond. Some of the gallery were now far behind. Uebele appeared to be in trouble, one of his stirrups was seen to be dangling, the tail of his blue shirt was fluttering in the breeze. Still he managed to raise his stick as a turn in the course was reached. Down into the gully now. "Topsy" stylish as ever in action, made a cast to the north racing up to a bluff directly in front. Horses were reined up as a point seemed eminent. For seconds the Setter hesitated, fateful moments they were

too, as "Lightning" came streaking in from nowhere, on past the doubting "Topsy" and "Bingo" she had 'em, the Setter failing to honor. Leading the broncho, Uebele entered the bush ahead of his dog and one after another five prairie chicken fluttered out through the trees, his "whoa Lightning" seemed entirely unnecessary as the Pointer never moved. On across the fully, "Lightning" was dynamite. "Point" called Uebele. The gallery had caught up and all rode in close to see the Pointer again locked up tight by a small clump of willows. Then something unusual occurred. A lone prairie chicken was seen flying straight towards the spot where the dog was pointing, passed within inches of "Lightning's" head and landed within three feet of her nose, from whence it strutted sedately into the underbrush. "Lightning" never batted on eyelid. Butterfield was on foot now endeavoring to inspire confidence into his Setter as several chickens flushed from the stubble ahead. Then Uebele and his broncho walked in again. This time eight chickens arose from the willows while the Pointer again behaved perfectly.. Uebele had barely climbed back into the saddle before "Lightning" had again found game. This time a single chicken and thus a story-book ending to a well contested race. "Ab's Lightning" was placed first.

Second place went to "Saskatoon Lady", C.K.C. 183590, liver and white Pointer, owned by Mrs. R. L. Orge and handled by Ralph Orge. "Lady" ran one of her best races, covered the course well despite the sticky going. With two minutes to go she made a stylish point on a covey of partridge, with "Buster" her brace-mate, backing the find. Both dogs proved to be steady to the shot. "Lady" then had a "stop to flush" on another covey of Huns that flushed wild. "Topsy", the English Setter, won third place for her owner, E. H. Butterfield.

That well-known black bitch, "Sweet Molly O'Windsor", whose name has so often been in the Saskatchewan notes column, will in future appear in this column, she having been purchased from Mr. W. A. Childs (Rockcroft K's) of Saskatoon, by County Clare Kennels (Reg'd.) of Calgary, Alberta, Canada (Cockers ONLY).

These recently-registered kennels are operated by ex-Staff-Sergeant C. O'Brien and his wife. O'Brien, recently discharged from the Canadian Active Army after 56 months service in this war, is also a veteran of France and Belgium in the last

He candidly admits that both he and his wife are novices in the dog-game, but they are willing to learn from anybody, anytime, anywhere. They have set themselves a standard of achievement which might have been based on a recent utterance of the Hon. Townsend Scudder who said: "There is joy and satisfaction in producing a good dog." Their aim (as expressed to me) is "to do anything in our power toward the betterment of the American Cocker Spaniel breed in Canada."

I must say they are moving in the right direction. This week they shipped their first export-puppy to Oak Park, Illinois, and they recently pur-chased in the U.S. a solid black granddaughter of that famous Dual Ch. Miller's Esquire, C.D.X., and are having her bred back to that grandsire before importing her to Canada.

Should this mating result in a litterand here again they are not "counting their chickens before they are hatched"-the progency would, on a five generation pedigree-form, show no less than 33 of the 62 names which appear as being prefixed by Ch. or Dual Ch., there being two of the latter, Miller's Esquire and My Own High Time. Esquire, as is probably known to most students of Cocker pedigrees has an UNBROKEN string of EIGHT successive Champion sires directly back of him. The dam is by Miller's O'Henry, a 13point dog and a son of Esquire.

I am convinced of the sincerity of purpose of these self-styled "Novices", not only by the foregoing moves, but by the fact that they have pledged that (with the exception of one puppy which they would keep for their own future use) every puppy of this litter, if it materializes, will be publicly offered FIRST to registered Canadian Kennels ONLY for a period of 30 days from date of advertising, and not more than one pup will be sold to any one Province. Positively no offers from out-of-Canada breeders will be considered during that 30-day period. This appears to me not only a sincere effort toward the betterment of the breed in Canada, but a wisely-thought-out effort to spread any such benefits across the Dominion.

They already own "Brian Boru of Rockcroft", a ery typey 18-months'-old solid black male sired by Ch. Chimney Sweep's Roamer (He B.I.S. Toronto in 1942). This young dog has very massive bone, a nice, bright, flat coat and loads of feathering, a marvellous gait with the unusual faculty of always coming to rest in the "posed" position so much sought after by dogphotographers. He is bold and fearless, utterly oblivious to gun-fire-noises and has an excellent nose, retrieving to hand

I am certainly going to keep an eye on the success or otherwise of this new venture. Nor would I advise anyone to be too hasty in discounting these beginners, for the day the King and Queen visited Calgary (May, 1939) Staff O'Brien began a hobby of collecting Postal Cancellation Marks. Began it from Zero, with one Royal Visit cover. To-day he is reputed to possess Canada's largest and most completely mounted, classified and indexed collection of over 50,000 specimens from over 15,000 places all over the world. He tells me, and I quote: "I always aim to do Any job just a little bit better than it was done before." Personally, I wish them success.

Many new dogs have found their way to the Pacific Coast in recent months. A new breed for here is the Brittany Spaniel. # For the Good and Welfare of Canadian Dogdom

## To the Members of the Canadian Kennel Club:-

Re: Mrs. Brown's letter to the Board which appeared in the minutes of the August 10th meeting. There are a number of what Mr. Winston Churchill calls "terminalogical inexactitudes", so I trust you will accord me the same courtesy and publish my reply.

- 1. The Palmer affair. I was under the impression Dogs In Canada was the property of the members of the Canadian K.C. and not the Directors and was to be run by the members for the members and not merely to voice opinions held by certain Directors who only permitted to be published what they thought was good for the members to know. In England we like to give both sides of every question and I merely acted in the tradition in which I was trained by giving Miss Stegall's opinion on "Lotteries for Dogs" as well as Mr. Palmers.
- 2. Mrs. Brown is very wrong in her facts when she says I called upon the President "many times previously to being engaged". When I came to Canada I thought Dogs In Canada about the poorest dog publication I have ever seen, and suggested to Mr. Brown I might be of use collecting news, etc. This was no reflection on Mr. Brown, whose hands were full as Secretary of the Club, and I suggested a nominal sum of \$10.00 or \$15.00, intending to be a free lance. I had previously been told that there was no chance of Mr. Brown going into the Service owing to some slight sinus trouble—information which turned out to be incorrect. No one could want a better colleague than Mr. Brown and during the few months we worked together everything was harmonious. To run the club and the magazine are two
- 3. I never offered to become editor at \$15.00 a week, such a suggestion after my long experience would be fantastic, it was as part-time assistant I named this sum and when Mr. Risewick said they would pay me \$25.00 plus 10% commission as editor I knew nothing about the tax reductions and thought \$25.00 meant that sum and not \$19.45. With reference to the commission, I said I would use this to go to American shows, my ambition being to make the paper an international one - and Mr. Risewick replied "that's splendid, you go at your own expense and we get the benefit". Incidentally, I spent much more than I got on my trips to the States and the paper did benefit as was shown by the Christmas number.

Perhaps if Mrs. Brown had to suffer the monetary troubles we English exiles —her compatriots—have had to endure, she would be a little more understanding over the financial question.

- 4. Mrs. Brown wonders how I put in so many long hours when I did not "have secretarial duties to perform". This remark savours of maternal jealousy as the mother of the last Editor and because the magazine made such progress. Frankly, the business side of the paper got me down. I've always been accustomed to having managers to attend to advertisements and all business matters and not being good at figures, the contracts, etc., were a great difficulty and made me put in many more hours work than someone differently trained would have needed. I was glad to know that after I left, the directors recognized the inadequate salary that I received and raised my successor to \$40.00 a week -thereby showing their knowledge of the amount of work required.
- 5. With regard to the libellous letter, it is immaterial to whom it was addressed, the Board ordered me to publish it. When it was handed to me I at once saw it contained a libel by innuendo and pointed this out to Mr. Strachan who was in the office, he rang up the club's lawyer to come across. Mr. Wilkinson did so and immediately said the letter was unsuitable for publication and actionable—I therefore did not publish it, with Mr. Strachan's full approbation.
- 6. With reference to Mrs. Brown's statement Mr. Strachan said he did not approve of my letter re Mr. Palmer in the December issue, I found on several occasions in the last few weeks of his life, my friend, Mr. Strachan's memory was not too good, for he was a very sick man. Not only did he never advise me to publish the letter or say if I did so there would only be one course left for me to do, i.e. resign, but he made considerable alterations to it. Happily, the original letter and his written corrections prove my statement.
- 7. With reference to Captain Waters' statement anent the non-publication of any report of the banquet given in my honor by members of the Canadian K.C., "... I want it understood beyond question I have never even seen ... the article in question", he and others will be interested in the following explanation: After the banquet the Acting Editor asked me if I would write my impressions of it, this I did, and the copy

was typed in the office. When Mr. Risewick rang me up that the Swan Song was not to be published, he suggested I fill up the page instead with the report of my banquet. I preferred to print Mr. W. J. Pym's article, feeling I would rather have the account of the honor accorded me in the first issue after I had left. Before leaving Canada on May 8th, I asked Mrs. McColl if she would send me a number of copies of the June issue as I wished to send them to England to show how the Canadians had honored me. Judge then of my surprise to receive a letter from her dated May 30 (not marked private) as follows, "You are going to be disappointed and I feel very keenly about it. The Publication Committee is Captain Waters and Mrs. Brown. Need I say More? The story of your banquet is out, the reason being that you thanked everyone in the May issue. You will note several complimentary remarks about you in the Provincial Notes. These were not censored, only the leading editorials."

8. I am at a loss to understand when in reference to my letter of resignation as a member of the Canadian K.C. it is stated, "it was agreed that the letter be acknowledged and that Mrs. Robson be advised that no monies are refunded in respect to membership". I made no request for any money to be refunded. I merely asked that my resignation be accepted as I did not feel that it was any honor to belong to a club controlled by certain Ontario Directors who had so little sense of the British idea of fair play as to order me to publish a letter which their own lawyer advised was libellous.

I hope soon to return to England, I want to forget the actions of those certain Directors and only take with me the happy memories of the many friends I have made in Canada and the good sports I have met. I believe there is a great future for Canadian dogdom. Canada is a grand country—full of grand people, and if I can be of any assistance to any of the Canadian doggy folk I hope they will let me know. As Mrs. Brown says, "hoping better spirits may prevail amongst us", after all, we have a great bond in common—our love of dogs.

Mr. Reeves, Miss Mayhew, Mr. Gudgeon and myself heard the first statement." Letter from Miss A. Elsie Mayhew

A letter from Miss A. Elsie Mayhew was read in respect to the amendment regarding the separation of Spaniels (Cocker) and Spaniels (English Cocker) as adopted at the last Annual General Meeting, and which amendment prompted a visit to the office from Messrs. McVannel and McCallum who explained that according to the rule of eligibility it was impossible to carry out the passed amendment.

Comments from Directors Rooney and Ryder were read and after discussion it was agreed that a copy of Miss Mayhew's letter be sent to Messrs. McVannel and McCallum requesting their reaction. Letter from Mr. Robert F. Schelling

The Secretary read a letter from Mr. Robert F. Schelling in respect to the report appearing in the September issue of Dogs in Canada in connection with his appeal from the decision of the Progressive Kennel Club following his appeal from the decision of the Progressive Kennel Club following his protest. Directors Ryder's and Rooney's remarks in respect to this letter were also read. Mr. Schelling stated he was not objecting to the award of the Reserve Winners Bitch at the Progressive Kennel Club Show, but he was objecting to the action of the Judge in making his Reserve Award prior to making his Winners Award. While the Judge awarded the ribbons simultaneously ,apparently from Mr. Schelling's observation the owner of the Reserve Winners Bitch received the Reserve Winners ribbon first. It is to regretted that in the previous minutes in the Judge's remarks, in which he said that he made the awards having full knowledge of the dogs competing, the word "quality" was omitted.

Letter from Mr. A. K. Butler

A letter was read from Mr. A. K. Butler, and which he requested be published in the minutes of the next meeting. Directors Rooney's and Ryder's remarks in respect to this correspondence were also read and after discussion it was agreed that the letter be included in the minutes. This particular letter reads as follows:

"September 14th, 1944.

Secretary, Canadian Kennel Club, Inc., 25 Melinda Street, Toronto. Dear Sirs:

On page 47 of the September Issue of Dogs in Canada there appears in the Minutes of Meeting held by the Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club, Inc., an item headed Policy of "Dogs in Canada." This Policy on reading it over I am greatly in favor of and wish here to go on record as such.

Capt. Waters and Mrs. Brown are to be complimented on moving and seconding such a Policy.

I deeply regret that Item No. 1, has not been carried out by the publication of a letter on page 49 which I feel the space could have been used for some better purpose.

I must ask that this letter be published in the minutes of your next meeting.

#### Letter from Messrs. E. S. McKay and A. K. Butler

A letter was read from Messrs. E. S. McKay and A. K. Butler having reference to their visit to the meeting of the Board of Directors held on August 10th, when they were asked for a definite instance where portions of the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors had ben purposely omitted from publication, and at that time mentioned a

leter which had been received from Mr. Erancis Dagger, President of the Canadian Cocker Spaniel Association, and which letter appears below, together with the reply sent from this office:

"May 9th, 1944.

Miss K. Corley, Acting Secretary-Treasurer, The Canadian Kennel Club, Toronto, Ont. Dear Miss Corley:

I have ben requested by several members of this Association to direct your attention to what appears to be the discriminative method adopted by your office, of passing on enquiries relative to the purchase of puppies and dogs, to various breeders.

It is within the knowledge of the writer that enquiries are passed on to certain breeders, or that the names of such breeders are furnished to prospective purchasers, without regard as to whether such breeders are advertisers or listed in the Breders' Registrar in Dogs In Canada. Other breeders are entirely overlooked.

May I suggest that your Directors enquire into this matter and take whatever action they may consider necessary to ensure that the discrimination complained of shall be discontinued.

Kindly understand that this letter is written in the interest of all breeders and not on personal grounds.

"May 19th, 1944.

Mr. F. Dagger President, Canadian Cocker Spaniel Assoc., Unionville, Ontario. Dear Mr. Dagger:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 9th which was referred to the Board of Directors for attention at its meeting held on Thursday, May 11th.

After discussion it was agreed that the office of the Canadian Kennel Club would discontinue the practice of recommending the names of breeders to enquiriers for puppies and in

place of this service sample copies of the magazine would be mailed to those enquiring, from which the prospective purchasers may secure the names and addresses of breeders and communicate with them.

At this time Vice-President W. H. Reeves suggested that while he was in the office during Miss Corley's absence he was amazed at the number of inquiries for dogs, and suggested that a breeders' register be established in which breeders would be registered under breed headings, and upon inquiry for names of breeders of a certain breed a list would be supplied to the prospective purchaser. The cost of maintainings such a register would be 50c per annum,

and would be a service to members only. To this the Board agreed.




