The Editor's Line

The Mastiff Club of America is attempting to revive an interest among real breeders in the mastiff. This breed, owing to its rarity, is mentioned in this issue.

The Mastiff has long been known in Britain and has been referred to as a large-headed dog, with blunt muzzle. The animal has massive limbs and is broad and muscular. At the time of Chaucer, they were known as Alans or Alaunts:

"About his car there wente white Alaun's

Twenty and more, as great as any steer,

To hunt the lion or wilde boar And followed him, with muzzle fastly bound."

-Chaucer, The Knights Tale.

We see Sir Robert Sibbald terming the mastiff "the molussus" and Dryden, who translated Virgil's Georgies about 1666, say:

"Nor last forget thy faithful dogs; but feed

With fattening whey the mastiff's generous breed."

In the original the word is molussus, translated by Dryden into mastiff.

In "The Gentlemen's Recreation," in four parts, viz: Hunting, Hawking, Fowling, and Fishing, published London, 1686, is some mention of the mastiffs. It states, that the English Mastiff is an Indigena or native of England, and that "The King of Poland has a great race of English Mastiffs, which in that country retain their ferocity, and are brought up to play upon greater beasts." It mentions that the wolf will carry off a porker with ease, unless stopped by Mastiffs or horseman; and "When the wolf is hunted with Hounds he flieth not far before them, and unless he be coursed with Greyhound or Mastiffs, he keepeth the covert ways," and again, on Bearhunting; it recommends Mastiffs to be mingled with the Hounds for more speedy execution, stating: "for they will pinch the bear and provoke her until at last they bring her to bay," etc.

In further reference to the mastiffs owned by the King of Poland, Col. H. Smith mentions two mastiffs, standing 30 inches at shoulder, according to his own measuring, that had belonged to the Elector of Saxony and King of Poland."

Marion purchased a four-place Fair-child plane in April and has just completed a 2½-months' solo trip visiting top kennels from Canada to Omaha, Detroit, through Illinois, Kansas City, Tulsa, Houston, Galveston, San Antonio, and even across the Rocky Mountains to Santa Fe, New Mexico, to see Amelia White and Alex Scott of the Kandahar Afghan Kennels.

Rudika, who had never flown before, proved a perfect mascot and loves to fly. Mrs. Florsheim told us the dog seems to know from the air pressure when she is 50 feet off the ground, sits up and begs for the windows to be opened so she can proudly stick her head out. Marion Florsheim was in the U.S. 319th Army Air Forces as a pilot, flying ships for the Ferry Command. Once the American shows open again she plans to fly her Afghans, and top dogs of several other favorite breeds cross-country for exhibit. Her plan is to campaign Int Ch Rudika on the Pacific Coast.

Rudika, a beautiful black-masked daughter of a famous sire, Int Ch Rudi-

ki of Prides Hill, was recently sold to Mr. Charles Costabile of Texas, but The Florsheim's "Five Mile Kennels" now again have a half interest in her, and consider her America's top show bitch. Rudika has sired one litter, from which came four top offspring, three of which have won many groups, two have won Best in Shows. The fourth dog unfortunately is not in a show home, though Mrs. Florsheim considers him the best of the lot. The three best known from the litter are: Ch Asri Havid of Five Mile (owned by Mrs. Eve Gudgeon of Hamilton); Ch. Yenghiz Khan of Five Mile (owned by Mr. and Mrs. Wilfred Kennedy of Detroit); and Ch Zumurrud of Five Mile (owned by Mrs. John Bamburger of Salt Lake City). Ch Zumurrud has just whelped a beautiful litter of six, sired by Int Ch Rana of Chaman. Three pups are black masked reds, the other three creams. The Florsheims were so enthusiastic about them they have purchased the entire litter. which was whelped in the kennels of Mr. and Mrs. John Hickey, professional handlers, Kansas City, Missouri.

The Florsheim's have orders for 8 top show specimens from English show kennels, and are breeding 4 line-bred Rudiki litters from which they expect to choose stock, retaining it until 6 months old before taking it to England where it must go through quarantine.

International Champion Rudika of Blakeen has some remarkable wins to her credit. She has 21 Best of Breed awards, 21 Placed Group, 19 Best Hound, 3 Best of American Bred in Show and 1 Best in Show.

Mrs. Florsheim's "Five Mile Kennels" situated at Route One, Darien, Conn., are famous for their Afghans.

Lassie, the Collie film star, had to swim in the chilly waters of Lake Louise, in the Canadian Rockies, during the filming of his new picture, "Son of Lassie". After each plunge, Lassie received a thorough drying from his owner and trainer, Rudd Weatherwax.

Lassie, the California-born collie screen star, became the toast of Canada during a seven weeks' visit there. No Canadian-born star could have been taken to heart with more enthusiasm.

On location filming for his second starring picture, "SON OF LASSIE", the handsome brown and white animal was followed everywhere by throngs of admirers. With candid cameras working overtime, they stuck close to him on the windswept seacoast of Vancouver Island, climbing over back-breaking trails to summits in the Canadian Rockies, and rowed out onto lakes high in the Rockies to get a glimpse of the dog star.

By actual count on one average day, Lassie posed for seventy-eight snapshots. His owner and trainer, Rudd Weatherwax, estimated that he was photographed more than 3,000 times during the trip by admiring fans.

He also bowed gracefully and extended his paw for friendly handshakes on countless occasions with such visiting dignitaries as the Lieutenant-Governor and Attorney-General of British Columbia, an Air Vice-Marshal of the Royal Canadian Air Force, and a Major General of the Canadian Army.

Lassie, making his third distant location journey since signing his Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer contract, took to travelling like he took to his fans. His previous trips—to Lake Chelan, Washington, for "Lassie Come Home", and Jackson Hole, Wyoming, where filming of "Son of Lassie" began—had proved him a stout trouper.

On Vancouver Island, he chased over rugged seacoast rocks with his fellow actors, Peter Lawford, Robert Lewis and Leon Ames. Then he moved over to the nearby Patricia Bay station of the Royal Canadian Air Force where, on the air field there, he played scenes with Lawford and Curtis.

It was in the Canadian Rockies, however, in the area around the famous resorts of Banff and Lake Louise that Lassie and the entire film troupe had their most exciting adventures. Most spectacular were two climbs to the Upper Victoria Glacier, overlooking Lake Louise, and the Athabasca Glacier in the Columbian ice fields, both over 2,000 feet above sea level. The first found a group of twenty-six essential members of the cast and crew, led by a veteran Swiss guide, packing in with their equipment on fifty horses, the first time a pack train ever had gone into this two-mile patch of ice. Color cameras had to be carefully padded to protect their delicate mechanism from freezing in the cold, or from possible accidents where footing was precarious.

Hollywood's Glamour Collie



Visiting Canada's most beautiful scenic spots, Director S. Sylvan Simon also took his company to such famous locales as Moraine Lake, Lake Minnewanka, the Bow Falls and Bow River, Herbert Lake and the Valley of the Ten Peaks. These latter ice-capped summits all are more than 10,000 feet high.

There were no tricks or stunts associated with the making of "Lassie Come Home" or the new Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer photoplay. Sam Marx, producer of both pictures, would be the first to throw a large share of credit for the emergence of Lassie as a Hollywood hero and his fine, natural performances in his two pictures on the shoulders of young Rudd Weatherwax, the modest trainer whose business it is to make his four-footed charges feel at home in front of a movie camera.

Of course the degree of success in any such endeavor is partly dependent on the intelligence of the animal. A dog like a human being, may be highly "showy" and photogenic and not take direction worth a darn. Lassie, however, not only showed amazing responsiveness, after Weatherwax's initial period of months of patient work with him, but seemed to have more fun working on a movie set than any body else around.

Lassie's story has all the Cinderella element. A scrawny and not too prepossessing young pup, he was turned over to Weatherwax, operator of a West Coast kennel, in payment of a ten dollar debt. Weatherwax, who trains dogs, horses and other animals because he enjoys it-aside from the fact that the work provides him with a good livelihood-liked his new charge from the start but hadn't the faintest notion that he was playing godfather to a coming dog star. Lassie (who was at that time called Pal) learned all the elementary practice things in jig time, lying down, rolling over, playing dead, opening a door, disarming a man with a gun. No dog that Weatherwax had ever owned showed a stauncher sense of loyalty and obedience. Lassie, after a few months of working under Weatherwax, would no sooner have thought of disobeying his trainer's command than of flying.

A good example of this was supplied in a sequence of "Lassie Come Home", when the dog, at the trainer's command, was told to stand facing a herd of Scottish longhorns. A big bull, venom in his eye, began to advance toward the collie. Lassie whimpered and looked up

pleadingly, but didn't budge an inch. When the bull had come to within a dangerously close number of yards, Weatherwax gave the signal for Lassie to vamoose, and he sped away like a bullet.

The dog trainer works in the closest co-operation with the S.P.C.A. on all his movie chores, and won't tolerate the use of whips, sticks or even harsh language. When Sam Marx and Fred Wilcox, the director, decided after looking at literally hundreds of canine prospects, that Weatherwax's collie was the one they wanted to gamble on, the trainer stayed with them day and night. He worked with Lassie much as might a dramatic coach who sees a favored protege facing his big chance for fame and fortune. So well had he trained Lassie to swim against a roaring current, with a camera grinding overhead, that not a single retake was needed in the difficult river sequence that played an important part in "Lassie Come Home". Lassie, a normally gentle dog, also learned how to counterfeit bristling rage in a fight, how to simulate pain and injury and how to express tenderness, fear, disappointment, excitement and other emotions in a way that brought enthusiastic praise from those seeing him on the screen.

Weatherwax's theory, which has been pretty well demonstrated in practice, is that a collie has perhaps the surest and strongest homing instinct of any dog, and this—plus his naturally high intelligence and physical appearance—makes him a good choice for an action-character screen story. Hollywood folk have expressed great surprise at the trainer's ability to maintain an unruffled temper,


against conditions that would drive lots of writers, actors or directors slightly daffy. If Weatherwax ever reaches the point of complete discouragement with an animal (which seldom happens) he will merely put the particular pupil away by himself for a few days, and then try again. He says that a dog which has absolute trust in his master, and in that master's fairness, will accomplish almost anything; but that one slip-up on the trainer's part, one show of anger or rancor, may ruin weeks of patient handling.

"Son of Lassie" will bring back to the screen two actors who were seen in the first dog picture, Donald Crisp and Nigel Bruce, along with Peter Lawford and June Lockhart. Another Lassie production is to come to moviegoers later in the year—a story of a dog's readjustment to civilian life after doing his time as an Army sentinel. This picture will be released under the title "Hold High the Torch".

Dogdom's bluebloods—the aristocrats of the collie world—will appear along with Lassie, the collie dog star, in Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's "Son of Lassie", the technicolor squel to "Lassie Come Home". As the picture's opening scene, one to delight the heart of every dog-lover, fifty of Southern California's most valuable show champions were selected to make their debut before the cameras.

With several of the collies valued as high as \$10,000 each, total value of the fifty was approximated at \$100,000. Included were champions from shows all over the country, from North Hollywood to Madison Square Garden, New York. Outstanding among these were such dogs as Champion Irela of Glamis, a twenty-time winner of best Collie in show, owned by Cherry Osborn; Champion Lauriden of Redberry, Bench Show winner owned by Nancy Haston; Champion Black Douglas of Alstead, tri-color champion owned by Ted Kattell, rated best of breed at Morris and Essex, America's largest dog show; and Donell's Rollo of Glamis, many-time winner, owned by Mr. and Mrs. Don

Ten of the fifty collies were owned by Rudd Weatherwax, owner and trainer of Lassie, and his brother, Frank.

THE LATE FRANCIS DAGGER

By A. Elsie Mayhew

Dog lovers in general and Cocker Spaniel breeders in particular sustained a great loss when Francis Dagger of Unionville passed to his reward recently. Mr. Dagger had been associated with his daughter, Miss E. Mildred Dagger of "Warwick Kennels" at Unionville for the last six years.

At the time of his death he was President of the Canadian Cocker Spaniel Association, Inc., and with his daughter and the writer was one of the seventeen Charter Members of that Association when it was granted its Charter in 1928. This, I believe, was one of the first breed clubs to apply for incorporation. At the present time it is not active, its members having agreed to be so until the conclusion of the war. Its membership stretches from coast to coast. In passing, I would like to mention that the above club owes its formation to Mr. W. A. Price, of Windsor Arms Hotel, Toronto, the the writer's mind the dean of Cocker people in Canada. He is at the present time Vice-President of the Association. He never would accept the Presidency because of personal pressing business elsewhere.

The writer has personally known the late Mr. Dagger for twenty odd years and will feel his loss quite keenly. He had what I admire so much, real brains, a wonderful memory and a great sense of humor and, above all else, he loved the country and nature and his first love the Sea. Miss Dagger told me that when he went to the Rest Home where he died he took two sea pictures with him. In business, Mr. Dagger was a telephone man. One of their most respected pioneers. I have before me a copy of the Canadian Telephone Journal which has many wonderful things to say of him. I quot: "Francis Dagger, one of the outstanding figures of Independent Telephone History, graces our Front Page. Known, respected and admired by Executives in the Industry in all parts of Canada, he enjoys the friendship and goodwill of all those with whom he comes in contact." Isn't that a wonderful thing to have said about you? Thank goodness, it was written in his lifetime.

To me the most interesting thing about him was that he was a salt water sailor. Three times around Cape Horn, once around the world, six times across the Equator and once around the Cape of Good Hope, and all in a sailing ship of seven hundred tons. No wonder he was good company with all those experiences in his head, and how he loved a joke and how well he could tell one.

To his surviving daughters, Miss Mildred and Mrs. Bain of Ottawa, and his son Gordon, goes out sincerest sympathy. He lived his life so that his passing will be long felt with regret.

Standard

EDITOR'S NOTE: A large number of en-quiries have come in for authentic infor-mation regarding Collies. We have, therefore, asked the Secretary of the Collie Club of America to let us have the latest edition of the standard. In enclosing this information to our office, Mr. B. J. H. Ribert, Secretary of the Collie Club of America, drew attention of the Cottle Ciuo of America, arew attention to the fact that no point rating is included. He stated that a discussion on this matter came up some years ago but no definite action was taken.

1. HEAD-Skull flat, moderately wide between the ears and gradually tapering to the eyes. There should be but a very slight prominence of the evebrows. and a very slight depression at the top. The proper width of skull necessarily depends upon the combined length of skull and muzzle, for what would be a thick or too broad a skull on one dog is not necessarily so in another of the same actual girth, but better supported by length of muzzle. It must also be considered in conjunction with the size of the dog and should incline to lightness, accompanied by cleanness of outline of cheeks and jaws. A heavyheaded dog lacks the bright, alert and full-of-sense look so much to be desired. On the other hand, the attenuated head is most frequently seen with small Terrier eyes, which show no character. Muzzle should be of fair length and tapering to the nose, which should be black; it must not show weakness or appear snipey. The teeth of good size and even. English standard says, "Mouth the least bit overshot," but this is by no means desirable, and if at all exaggerated should be treated as malformation.

2. EYES-There being no "brow" in which to set the eyes, they are necessarily placed obliquely, the upper portion of the muzzle being dropped or chiseled to give them the necessary forward lookout. They should be of medium-size, never showing too light in comparison with the color of coat, nor with a yellow ring. Expression full of intelligence, with a bright and "What is it?" look when on the alert or listening to orders; this is of course largely contributed to by the throwing up of the ears which accompanies the "qui vive"

3. EARS-The ears can hardly be too small if carried properly; if too small they are apt to be drawn quite erect or prick-eared; and if large they either cannot be properly lifted off the head or, if lifted, they show out of proportion. When in repose the ears are folded lengthwise and thrown back into the frill; on the alert they are thrown up and drawn close together on the top of the skull. They should be carried about three-quarters erect. A prick-earned dog should be penalized. So much attention of late having given to securing very high carriage of ears it has resulted in reaching the other extremes

in some cases, and that is now necessary to guard against.

4. NECK-Should be muscular and of sufficient length to give the dog a fine upstanding appearance, and show off the frill, which should be very full.

5. BODY - Rather long, ribs well rounded, chest deep, but of fair breadth behind the shoulders, which should have good shape. Loin slightly arched, showing power.

6. LEGS-Foreleg straight and muscular, with a fair amount of bone, the forearm moderately fleshly; pasterns showing flexibility without weakness; the hind legs less fleshy, very sinewy, and hocks and stifles well bent. Feet oval in shape, soles well padded and the toes well arched and close together. low when the dog is quiet, the end hav-

7. TAIL - Moderately long, carried ing an upward twist or "swirt"; gaily carried when excited, but not carried over the back.

8. COAT-This is a very important point. The coat, except on the head and legs, should be abundant, the outer coat harsh to the touch, the inner coat soft and furry and very close; so close that it is difficult on parting the hair to see the skin. The mane and frill should be very abundant. The mask or face smooth, the forelegs slightly feathered, the hind legs below the hocks smooth. Hair on tail very profuse, and on the hips long and bushy.

9. COLOR - Immaterial, although a

richly colored or nicely marked dog has undoubtedly a considerable amount of weight with judges-the black and tan with write frill and collar, or the still more showy sable with perfect white markings, will generally win, other things being equal.

10. SIZE-Dogs, about 24 inches at the shoulder; bitches about 22 inches. Weight, dogs, about 60 pounds; bitches, about 50 pounds.

11. EXPRESSION-This is one of the most important points in considering the relative value of Collies. "Expression," like the term "character," is difficult to define in words. It is not a fixed point as in color, weight or height, and is something the uninitiated can only properly understand by optical illustration. It is the combined product of the shape of the skull, muzzle, the set, size, shape and color of the eyes, and the position and carriage of the ears.

12. GENERAL CHARACTER-A lithe, active dog, with no useless timber about him, his deep chest showing strength, his sloping shoulders and wellbent hocks indicating speed and his face high intelligence. As a whole he should present an elegant and pleasing outline, quite distinct from any other breed, and show great strength and

FAULTS-Domed skull, high peaked occipital bone, heavy pendulous ears, or the other extreme, prick ears; short tail, or tail curled over back.

of Directors and the Canadian Kennel Club staff in connection with carrying out all of the wishes of the membership. It is heart warming to hear such a thoughtful expression of appreciation of the vast amount of work entailed.

At the present time two Bull Mastiffs are already housed at the Mellish's "Heatherbelle Emperor" and Heatherbelle Empress, both dogs require two points each to complete their championship, and according to records as far as can be found they will be the first Mastiff champions in Canada.



In deepest sorrow we report the sudden passing of our friend and member, Irene Gaynor, on June 29th. Our Visiting Committee Chairman, Eric Jackes, had called on her and her sister, Gladys, only that afternoon and Irene seemed in good health and good spirits. She died unexpectedly late that night. Her passing is a distinct loss to our Club. All who knew Irene Gaynor loved her. The Club will miss her and we offer our deep and sincere sympathies to her sister Gladys in this hour of bereavement.

Congratulations are in order to Geo. Jerman and Ted and Mary Weller for some wins gathered at the Progressive Show, July 7th, Dufferin Park. Briardale's Beda of Rosemere, owned by Ted and Mary Weller finished her championship by gathering Winners Bitch Ribbon, and Rickey of Oakmere, a 7 months old Puppy won himself laurels by starting in the Junior Puppy Class and going right through to Best of Breed, and also winning the Working Group.

For many years our love of the canine world has centered in Shepherds, and the year's events have not caused that love to diminish or to become even slightly dimmed. We have lived to see our breed condemned by the more timid ones over a period of years. But all through that time our Club has managed to keep our Shepherds in the foreground in Canada among the other breeds. The Shepherd entry in the All-Breed Shows has been well up in the higher brackets and we have been content to see the Shepherd win the Working Group occasionally which may have been as good as average in all breeds. Now the Shepherd has come into his own and has been elevated in a show to that position which in our estimation is his proper place. That place is Best Dog in Show. It was our good fortune recently to watch a Shepherd owned by one of our members claim the top title which all breed fanciers hope for and which only one person in any show can win.

On June 9th a goodly number of Shepherd owners went to the London Show, each one in the hope that his dog might win one of the two spots that would give him some points toward a Championship title. Among these contestants was one who apparently had little hope of attaining that end, for the entry was placed in the Limit Bitch Class. The only entry in that class as a matter of fact. Well, the judging of the Shepherds gets under way with Mr. E. D. McQuown, of Dayton, Ohio, passing on our breed. The male dogs are gone over with Beau of Tammalar, owned by Tammalar Kennels taking the Winners Dog Ribbon and Gunner of Briardale, owned by Briardale Kennels, being placed Reserve.

The bitches are then brought in and the Limit Class is won by Black Magic of Rosemere, owned by Mr. and Mrs. W. O. Flink. She just had to win this class because as we have stated before, Black Magic of Rosemere was alone in the class. But when the class winners were brought in it was Black Magic who took the ribbon with Elf von Saliba, owned by Mr. and Mrs. R. T. Coleman, as Reserve.

Then into Best of Winners and Best of Breed with Black Magic of Rosemere sweeping all before her. This would have been enough for any Shepherd in one show but fate had more in store for her.

By the time the Working Group was judged, Edna Flink who had been showing Black Magic was so weak from excitement that she turned the dog over to Alf Loveridge who showed her in a masterful manner, as usual and presented the Group Ribbon and trophy to Edna. At this time many of the Shepherd exhibitors went home in the belief that this was about all anyone had a right to expect from one dog show. Those who remained were treated to an unforgettable event.

Alf Loveridge again took over when the breeds went in for Best in Show. By that time the handler and the dog were more used to each other and Alf gave us a splendid exhibition of handling by bringing out the best qualities in the dog. The rest is history. A Shepherd had gone Best in Show. Walter had remained in Toronto to look after the home front. When his dog won the Best of Breed Ribbon, Edna called him on the phone to apprise him of their win and he refused to believe it. It took the combined efforts of several friends to convince him. When Edna called him a second time to tell him of the most important win, it was too much. Walter spent a sleepless night. It's o.k. Walter, we can't blame you. We think we would have gone out and looked up a "Speak" under the circumstances. In our time we have seen history made in our Club and by members of our Club. We have seen the Von Stephanitz Trophy brought to Canada by one of our members. We have seen a 7-month-old puppy go Best of Breed. We have had some of our Shepherds win the Working Group, one of which went to Reserve Best in Show, and now we have a Shepherd winning the title of Best Dog in Show.

OBEDIENCE TRAINING

The President of the Canadian Dog Training Club, Mr. E. S. McKay, and the Secretary, Mr. W. O. Flink, have shown a great deal of energy and foresight in bringing obedience training to public attention. As this training is quite spectacular it always proves a drawing card. A great deal of education be given to the public in this way as to the correct handling of many breeds of dogs about which they know very little. It should also serve to make the dog, if anything, more popular by showing what marvellous work can be done by an intelligent dog in the hands of an intelligent person.

Show Secretaries should pay attention to the great progress being made by the various obedience clubs. The Canadian Dog Training Officers have asked me to stress to all Show Secretaries the necessity for getting in touch with the Dog Training Club before attempting to organize an obedience test in conjunction with a dog show. There are a number of features of an obedience test which are not very well known to the Show Secretaries, and for which provision must be made under the obedience rules. For instance, it is only required to bench dogs who are being shown in obedience work for one hour. Also, it should be noted that the ring which is used for obedience trials must either be a special one which has not been travelled over by other dogs or the Show Superintendent must undertake to have a ring thoroughly disinfected before an obedience trial is staged. The reason for this precaution should be entirely obvious, but has sometimes been overlooked in making show arrangements.

Show Secretaries should immediately contact Officers of any Dog Training Club with which they are co-operating in putting on shows and, before issuing premium lists or making any other definite arrangements, they should understand thoroughly just what is necessary in regard to the obedience trial, and also what degree of co-operation they may expect from the Training Dog Clubs in the matter.

Regular Schooling classes are being held by The Canadian Dog Training Club, and membership is invited. The secretary, W. O. Flink, is to be addressed at 132 Heward Avenue, Toronto.

THE SALUKI

By AUDREY M. HOLLIS Lieut, R.C.A.M.C.

THE SALUKI is claimed to be as old as the earliest known civilization and his story must be pieced together from fragments from many sources all down the ages.

Perhaps the earliest glimpses of the

Saluki are seen in Egyptian records, and there survives a carved marble head study from the pre-dynastic period 6,000-5,00 B.C. Salukis are again seen in a tablet of the great Pharaoh Antef betwen 3000-2000 B.C., and are mentioned in a papyrus about 1,000 years later. The most valuable record is in a fresco at Western Thebes (about 7,400 B.C.), showing the governor receiving tribute which includes Salukis from the desert tribes. Mention is made of Salukis in the writings of Xenophor's expedition in Arabia, and by Alburquerque, 1596, at the time of his conquests at Ormuz in the Persian Gulf.

These greyhounds of the East became the fashion among the Crusaders, who brought them back as proof of their pilgrimage. Traders from Aleppo and caravans trading between Venice and Arabia introduced the breed to Europe, where they are seen in the works of such famous artists as Paul Veronese, and Benvenuto Cellini.

The habitat of the Saluki comprises all the region stretching from the Caspian Sea to the Sahara, including Egypt, Arabia, Palestine, Syria, Mesopotamia, and Persia. Considering how the Mahommedans despise ordinary dogs,

which they regard as unclean, it may seem strange that they should honour, and even revere the Saluki. The hounds are not only prized for their sporting abilities but in the wastes of the desert the owners may have to rely upon the Salukis to provide meat.

Throughout the ages the great tribes have carefully guarded the precious strains, which have been handed down to them. Famous dogs are known all through the desert; pedigrees are learned by heart, "sung or chanted," and handed down by oral transmission from generation to generation.

A Saluki is spoken of as "El Hor, the Noble One," or "Barake, Specially Blessed," and is granted every privilege, even admission to the Shiek's tent. In and is never sold but presented as a mark of esteem. In the encampments the East, a Saluki is considered sacred the valuable Salukis are carefully protected. Great care is taken of the pups, and often they are nursed by the women of the tribe.

The game for which Salukis are used are hare, fox and other desert animals. The Saluki, having tremendous speed (37-40 miles per hour) is used by the Arabs in bringing down gazelle, one of the fastest antelopes. These dogs have very keen eyes and hunt mostly by sight, their sense of smell being less highly developed.

The sport for which the Saluki is famous is falconry, and the team work between the dog and the bird is remarkable. Once the game is sighted the dog and hunter pursue it by following the flight of the hawk. It is the Saluki's duty to come up and hold the gazelle until the hunter arrives to kill in the orthodox Moslem way.

The life of the Saluki, like that of his master, is not an easy one. He hunts over the rough rocky country and the blistering sands, and endures the scorching sun by day and the frosty desert night.

Salukis are first mentioned in England in 1835 and again in 1840 when a bitch owned by Sir Hamilton Smith, a dog in St. Regent's Park zoo, and one owned by the Duke of Devonshire were spoken of as Persian Greyhounds. Evidently there was no real interest in Salukis until the Hon. Florence Amherst imported the first Arabian Salukis in 1895, from the Kennels of Prince Abdulla in Transjordania, and a great deal of credit is due to the Hon. Florence Amherst for popularizing the breed in Europe.

Interest was just being aroused in the public and the press when the Great War intervened and stopped all activities. At the close of the war Salukis again became conspicuous, and specimens were brought back by officers and men returning from the East. Mrs. Mervyn Herbert brought back several fine specimens from Egypt, and Mr. Vereker Cowley imported Malik-el-Zobair and Zobeida-el-Zobair. These

with Ch. Sarona Kelb and Sarona Sarona, imported from Mesopotamia by Brigadier-General Lance in 1920, figure prominently in the pedigrees of our present day Salukis. In England Salukis are fast becoming one of the most popular breeds.

The Saluki was well established in the Old Country before he came into his own on this side of the ocean. Not until 1927 was the breed officially recognized by the A.K.C., and at Westminster Show the same year two Salukis were shown in the Miscellaneous class. The following year there were ten entries and the breed was judged by Mr. G. V. Glebe.

In July, 1927, the Saluki Club of America was formed with only seven or eight fanciers among its members. Since then interest has been steadily growing and dogs have been imported from England and the East. After a favourable start the depression caused a temporary set-back but in 1934 Mr. and Mrs. S. Y. L'Hommedieu, Jr., and others endeavoured to revive interest and to date some 350 Salukis have been registered in the A.K.C. In the New York area most entries have been due to Mrs. Paterno's El Retiro Kennels and

in New England to dogs from the Diamond Hill Kennels of E. K. Aldrich, Jr.

In Canada the Saluki is a rare breed and so far only ten dogs have been registered in the C.K.C. Mrs. C. A. Mc-Gee's Sheik El Ra was the first dog to cross the border and soon after, in 1937, Dr. G. Bagnani imported from England, Mazuri Adonis and from Mrs. Greenwood's Kennels, Nablous Mish-Mish. No other dogs came into the country until November, 1944, when I imported Diamond Hill Hadji from Mr. E. K. Aldrich, Providence, R.I.

Although we have not quantity we have quality, for in these dogs is found the best blood in England, America and the East, combining such strains as Amherstia, Grevel, Ruritania, Rushford, Sarona and Zobiar.

The future of the Saluki in Canada looks bright. In colour he can meet the demands of the most fastidious; in disposition he shows great attachment to his master, is gentle with children, affectionate without being demonstrative, a good watch dog but not aggressive; in appearance he is graceful, dignified and refined, possessing subtle strength and power. In fact, he has everything to commend himself to you.

A Rare Dog The Barkless Basenii

Mr. Alexander Phemister, President of the Basenji Club of America, has been kind enough to send this up-todate standard, which we trust will be preserved by all those who are interested in this breed, as at the present time, it seems impossible to get copies of the Complete Dog Book, which contains the up-to-date standard.

BASENJI STANDARD

Adopted by the Basenji Club of America and approved by the Board of Directors of the American Kennel Club at their meeting, November 9, 1943.

HEIGHT-Approximately 17 inches dog, 16 inches bitches.

HEAD-Of medium width, not tapering towards the eyes, well chiselled, with lofty carriage. The skull should be flat. The foreface should taper from eye to muzzle, and should be shorter than the skull, teeth should be level. Wrinkles should appear upon the forehead when the ears appear upon the forehead when the ears are pricked, giving a puzzled expression. These are a special characteristic of the Basenji, but exaggerated wrinkle is to be avoided, as the excessive loose skin tends to give a Bloodhoundy appearance and spoils the clean lines of the breed.

NOSE-Black greatly desired, but a pinkish tinge should not penalize as otherwise first class specimen.

EARS—Should be pointed and erect, set well forward and of fine texture.

EYES-Should be dark hazel. shaped, small deep set and far seeing.

NECK-Of sufficient length, well crested. and slightly full at the base of the throat. It should be well set into flat laid-back shoulders

CHEST-Deep and of medium width.

BODY—The body should be short and level. The ribs well sprung with plenty of heart room and deep brisket, short coupled and ending in a definite waist

FEET-Small, narrow, with arched toes. LEGS-Straight with clean bone and well defined sinews. Pasterns straight rather than otherwise, but not of the Fox-terrier type.

HINDQUARTERS — Strong and muscular, with hocks well let down, and turned neither in nor out, with long second thighs.

TAIL-Set on top and tightly curled over to one side.

COLOUR-Chestnut with white points and tall tip, also black and white, and black, tan and white, red and white, fawn and white.

COAT-Short and silky, skin very pliant. MOVEMENT—Both hindlegs and forelegs should be carried straight forward with swinging stride, greatly resembling that of a racehorse trotting full out, this swift, tireless running gait being a special characteristic

GENERAL CHARCATERISTICS—Basenjis do not bark. The appearance should be one of springy poise and alertness, greatly resembling an antelope.

HISTORY OF THE GREAT PYRENEES BREED IN CANADA

The Great Pyrenees breed in Canada is seldom seen and little known, although when the French first wintered in Newfoundland at Rougnoust and on the shores of Placetentia Bay, as far back at 1662, it is known that they brought the great white dogs of their native mountains, the Pyrenean Mountain Dogs, as protection against wolves and other animals. It was while fulfilling this role of guard-dog and pet that Pyrenean dogs became mated with the sporting pets brought over by the English settlers, the Curly-Coated Retrievers, and from this mating resulted a breed which has long made dog history and is popular to-day (though in a modified type) among large dogsthe Newfoundland. Why the Pyrenean dog did not continue as an adopted dog by the English and so leave descendents to-day in eastern Canada remains a mystery.

Nothing further was heard of the breed until about twelve years ago when hearsay carries the news that a French woman brought back with her from France to guard her home in New Carlisle on the Gaspé Peninsula, five great white dogs from the Pyrennees.

The first Great Pyrenees registered in Canada with the National Live Stock Records Office in 1935 was "Basquaerie Marie Blanque," born at Needham, Mass., in 1933. This dog was taken as a companion to Fort McPherson, Northwest Territories, a post among the Indians, within thirty miles of the Arctic Circle. Here Marie is thriving and happy, living out in the cold northern winter and making herself useful by pulling ice and wood on a sled.

NATIONAL DOG WEEK DATES SET—RIPLEY 1945 GENERAL CHAIRMAN

The eighteenth annual National Dog Week, and the first to be held under its new incorporated set-up, will be observed this year under the general chairmanship of Robert L. ("Believe It or Not") Ripley the week of September 16th-22nd, it is announced.

Direction of the movement will emanate from the newly-opened secretary's office at 424 Madison Avenue, New York 17, New York.

Officers for 1945 of National Dog Week, a not-for-profit corporation organized under the laws of Illinois, include: W. E. Armstrong, one of the best known figures in the American dog fancy, President; Captain Will Judy, authoritative writer and speaker on dogs, Vice-President; and Harry Miller, executive secretary of the National Dog Week for the past two years, Secretary-Treasurer.

This year's observance will follow largely the pattern of last year's successful event, which was planned as a tribute to the dog in honor of his outstanding performance on the war front and the home front. The slogan featured in the 1944 National Dog Week literature, "In War, In Peace, 'Man's Best Friend'," will again be used in 1945. Fund-raising activities and the organization of committees for community observances this fall will get under way immediately.
