CH. HIAWATHA
Owned by Jack Sheridan

I would like to tell you the life-story of a Cocker Spaniel, one that I venture to think may very rightly claim to be one of the "greats" in the history of Canadian Cockerdom.

Ch. Hiawatha was bred in the kennels of Ray Wilcox, at Greensboro, N.C. His breeder's name is one to conjure with, both in Canadian and American Cocker circles. Hiawatha was born on May 1st, 1942, and was purchased as a puppy by Mr. and Mrs. Jack Sheridan, of Halifax, N.S., but he has always been shown as Mrs. Sheridan's dog. He made his debut in the show ring at the Halifax Kennel Club Show in August, 1943, and under Walter H. Reeves, he went through all competition to Best of Breed, beating on his way thereto, his kennel-mate, Ch. Carnidan Trader, a dog that had, hitherto, been considered the top Cocker in this part of the world.

From that day Hiawatha, (whose house name is "Tippy" by the way) has taken everything in his stride; he was shown at all the Shows on the Maritime Circuit that year, and emerged from the five shows unbeaten in his breed and amassing on that Circuit, the astounding total of 23 championship points. In addition to this he was runner-up to the Group Winner at all five shows, the dog which was placed over him each time being that grand Pointer, and veteran campaigner, Int. Ch. Rolew Royalty.

Last year, 1944, he opened the season's activities by going Best of Breed, and winning the Sporting Group under E. V. Turner, and eventually being awarded Best in Show by Mrs. P. A. Margeson at the Annapolis Valley K. C. Show. Later that year, at the first Show of the Maritime Circuit at Halifax, he cleaned up on a field of 46 entries, taking his breed, the Sporting Group and also Reserve Best in Show, under Earle T. Adair, of Pittsburg, Pa. He followed this performance up by winning Best of Breed at New Glasgow,

N.S., Best of Breed and the Sporting Group at Moncton, N.B., with Mrs. W. G. Constable of Boston, Mass., as Judge, finishing up the Circuit at Saint John, N.B., by winning Best of Breed under Louis J. Murr, of New York, thus completing two years of Maritime Circuits unbeaten in his breed.

This year, 1945, he appears to be aspiring to even greater conquests. He started out the season by repeating his last year's exploits at the Annapolis Valley Show in Kentville, N.S., winning again, Best of Breed, the Sporting Group, and Best in Show; this time with Walter H. Reeves judging. He repeated that performance, two weeks later, at the Show of the newly formed South Shore Kennel Club at Bridgewater, N.S.

At the opening this year's Maritime Circuit at Saint John, he was placed Best of Breed by Chas. G. Hopton, and the following day, under Robt. Ross, of Montreal, he was Best of Breed, won the Sporting Group and was Reserve Best in Show.

Then came Moncton, two days after, and for the first time in his short, but brilliant career, "Tippy" was forced to bow his proud head in defeat, for the first time in his own breed. Perhaps he got a little careless or a little bit lazy, or perhaps he thought he would give his Pal and kennel-mate a chance for once. Anyway his companion, Ch. Bobb's Chief Glooscap was placed over him, and again, perhaps it wasn't "Tippy's" fault at all—who knows? However, "Tippy" tightened his belt, and at the next show, two days after, and under no less an authority than Capt. Will Judy, he once more captured the breed; and at New Glasgow, N.S., after a one day rest, he again went to Best of Breed; and at the final show of this year's circuit, at Halifax, under G. V. Glebe, he finished in a blaze of glory

Life Story of an *Outstanding Cocker*

by winning Best of Breed and the Sporting Group.

Glancing over this young dog's amazing record, we find that he has to his credit: Three times Best in Show, and three times reserve to the Best in Show; seven times Best in Sporting Group, and on each occasion where he has not won his Group, he has been placed second, in all 10 times, and, in addition, he has been seventeen times Best of Breed.

However, the Show bench is not the only place where Ch. Hiawatha has made his presence noticed, for he is a very potent force at Stud. Several of his progeny are now distinguishing themselves on the Bench, to mention but one of them—one that has every appearance of becoming that most elusive thing, a "Flyer"—a seven months old female, out of Ch. Sheridan's Black-out, (another Best in Show winner from this kennel.) Making her debut at the Saint John Show, this little lady went from junior puppy to reserve winners' bitch, and won the trophies for the best Puppy, best Novice, and the Best Cocker Puppy bred in the Maritimes, at Halifax; at the only other Show she attended; she went to Winners' Bitch from junior puppy, and has four points to her credit, besides winning the Trophy for Best Puppy in Show.

Taking this record, by and large, it would appear that his proud owners are quite justified in feeling that they have in him, if not the greatest, one of the greatest Cockers of the last decade.

Flash! Hiawatha has just picked off another Best in Show at the Middleton show, held September 15th.

This rule states in part "The authorities of any show may decline to accept entries for just cause - - -". The Board of Directors is of the opinion that no show-giving club has the right to refuse the entries of any exhibitor unless it has first submitted to the office of the Canadian Kennel Club, its reasons for desiring to refuse such entries and these reasons have been endorsed by the Board of Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club with notification to the show-giving club to that effect.

In other words, no show-giving club has the right to refuse the entries of any exhibitor unless it has submitted its reason to the Canadian Kennel Club and has been informed that their reasons were endorsed by the Board of Directors.

This notice is published in Dogs In Canada by order of the Board of Directors and is intended for the attention of all show-giving clubs.

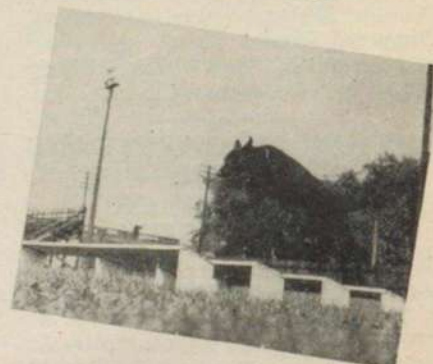

Retriever Trials Gaining New Fans

By W. H. Pym

Ed.—We Easterners are slightly green with envy when we hear of such good times. Your article will no doubt inspire "Retriever" lovers here to become more active.

The Pacific Coast Retriever Association held its fall trials under Canadian Kennel Club, Inc., Rules, at the Wild Duck Inn, some twenty miles from Vancouver, on September 2-3, with major league competition provided by the entries from the kennels of Lt. Paul Bakewell, III, of St. Louis, Mo., Bert Spellmen, of Seattle; Wm. Claude Bekins, of the same city; A. E. Jolivet, of Victoria, and local entries.

This game has developed so rapidly and the dogs have become so proficient, that the work has of necessity been stepped up considerably. As Al. Windsor, staff writer of the *Vancouver Sun* writes, "the standard of even the novice dogs has improved to such an extent that 18 months ago they would have been considered open class dogs".

On this occasion three pheasants were used for the land trial, one being a hidden bird, while on the water test five ducks were used for each dog. In the first water series it was necessary for the dog working from a duck blind to retrieve one duck from the river, and the second bird from a point across water. In the second series two ducks were retrieved from water while the third duck was hidden on land among reeds, etc., and could be located by the dog only by signals from the handler, and the dogs scenting power.

Retrievers can be temperamental or have their off days, so the winner of today can be an also ran tomorrow in precisely the same competition. This attribute adds zest to the game. As an example: In the first championship stake Claude Bekin's "Scorornine", gave a stellar exhibition to be placed first, with Bert Spellmen's "Diver of Trab" and Terry Mansell's "Crevmoy Pride" second and third respectively, with such dogs as Lt. Bakewell's "Little Pierre", and other fine dogs out of the awards.

In the second championship trial the same "Little Pierre" came back to give as fine an exhibition as one could wish to see, with A. E. Jolivet's "Brackens Jill", and Bert Spellmen's "Diver of Trab" close up for second and third respectively. Yet among the unplaced dogs were such stellar performers as "Sky Pilot Judy", the uncrowned

champion of the world, a little dog that always gives of its best, and one that keeps the gallery keyed up every time she performs. On this occasion she just missed on her last bird, and, in this writer's opinion, age may have been the deciding factor as the work was extremely heavy in every heat.

The performance of the Jolivet entry on the second day definitely stamps "Brackens Jill" as being of championship calibre in any competition. The law of imitation appears to function regularly in connection with Retriever Trials. On the second day a fast tide was running, consequently, the last bird in the water had time to drift downstream at a rapid rate. Lt. Bakewell's "Little Pierre" was unable to see his bird in midstream, but by direction from his owner he entered the water some 300 feet from the bird and swam as directed. Finally he raised himself half-way out of the water and caught the scent and recovered his bird. This was an extremely spectacular piece of work, yet shortly after the Jolivet dog, and Grant Mahood's Golden Retriever, "Pat", just about duplicated the same feat. There appears to be no end to the ability of these dogs. Space does not permit my referring to the performances of the fine dogs which failed to place, but they too will have their day.

Puppy and novice stakes were also held. Grant Mahood's Labrador gave a fine performance to be first, with the Patterson Labrador second, the Escott's Golden Retriever third, and promising puppies making up the field. In the novice stakes "Sky Pilot Demond" handled by the veteran E. J. Cameron, gave a finished performance on land and in the water to be first. As an illustration of the rapidity of progress, a local fancier brought a young yellow Labrador to the trials for company's sake. Grant Mahood took one look at him and whipped out the cheque book and bought him on the spot for a figure that would have been considered ample for a dozen lot two years ago. But the shrewd Mr. Mahood did not buy a pig in a sack. On the contrary this dog won second in the Novice class with a strange handler, and gave a water retrieving performance to suit the most exacting. Just tab this dog as championship calibre. Third in the Novice stake was won by Westhaven Susie handled by Miss Thelma Trump, a young lady who was attending her first Retriever Trial.

This retrieving game lends itself admirably to the amateur successfully competing against the professional, and that is as it should be. Sportsmanship comes to the fore in such competition. Billy Oates and Paul McClung acted as official guns and provided their own shells in spite of the scarcity of same. Claude Bekins, a busy executive of Seattle was prevented from attending the trials in person, yet he sent his dog along to compete and won the first championship stake.

Probably an all time record for sportsmanship was set by Lieut. Paul

Bakewell, III. Weeks ago Lieut. Bakewell expressed his wish to attend our trials, but subsequently he was the victim of a plane accident which resulted in two broken ankles. But that did not stop him from coming to Vancouver and giving his usual stellar exhibition of handling retrieving dogs. He must have endured considerable pain as both ankles are still in a cast. At any rate, crutches are not pleasant accessories to an active sportsman. Lieut. Bakewell has most willingly rendered yeoman service to local fanciers and his enthusiasm is responsible for fine Clubs being organized in Seattle, Wash., and Portland, Oregon. The addition of the two new Clubs will provide much desired International competition, consequently future trial rules in Canada and the United States, should harmonize if the best results are to be achieved.

Grant Mahood is another who belongs in the Sportsmen's Hall of Fame. On the day he paid a top price for the untied dog, "Lorrendons Rusty Glint", he presented another fancier with two fine puppies with the hope they would be given every opportunity to develop into competitive specimens of their breed.

Our judges; George Taylor, C. M. Butler, Jack Anderson, and the veterans, C. E. Thomas, and Dan Kneale, who perform their duties gladly come rain or high tide, have our thanks, as does Mrs. Johnny Howard (you Eastern lacrosse fans will remember Johnny of the old Montreal Shamrocks). Wm. Coulson, and Bob McClung, our valuable field assistants, gave us fine service, and we really enjoyed the visit among us of Mr. and Mrs. Roy Gonia, of Tacoma, and Pere Gonia, who handled the Spellmen entry.

There has been some local curiosity in regard to the origin and purposes of the Pacific Coast Retriever Association, so a brief explanation may be in order. The facts are that it was apparent that someone must take the initiative if British Columbia was to be represented on the grand circuit of Retriever Trials. So Bert Blair, Paul McClung, Earl McLaren, Albert Okell, and this writer agreed to underwrite Championship Trials under conditions which would bring out the best efforts of the local breeder's art. At the same time any hope of breaking even financially was not a matter of concern. We advocate major competition for the mature dogs, with puppy and novice stakes, and futurity stakes to insure a continuity of proper breeding methods. The three local newspapers were sufficiently interested to have our trials covered by three staff reporters and a photographer. The reporters were kind enough to say that our last effort was the finest trial ever held here. However, we are merely starting on a progressive program.

The next series of Retriever Trials will be held under the auspices of the B.C. Gun Dog Club. We hope this event will have the support of all Retriever enthusiasts from both sides of the international line on the West Coast,

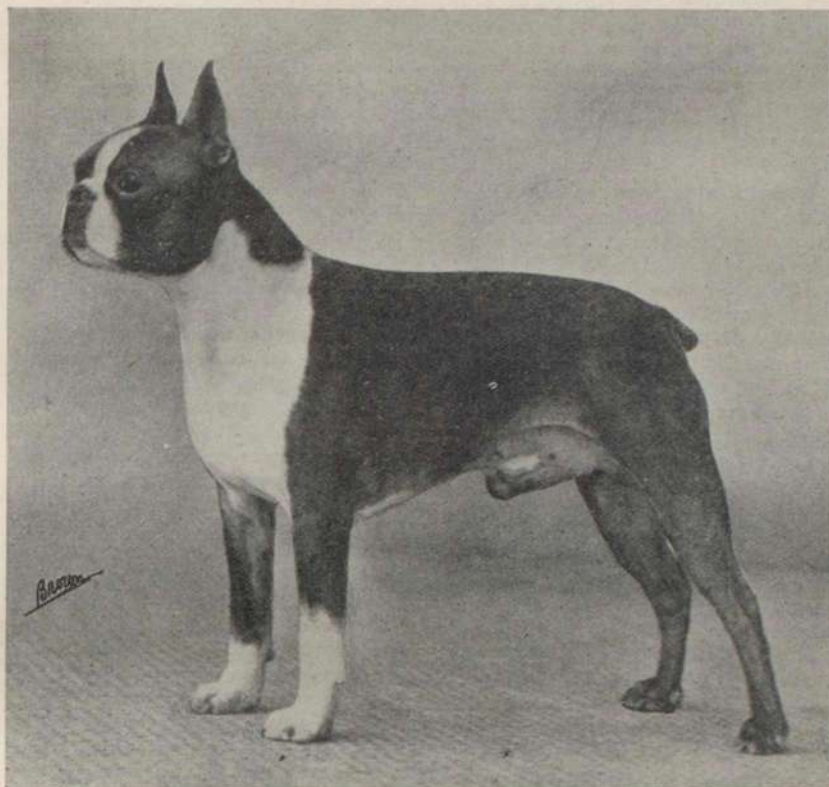

FORT GARRY KENNEL SHOW

By "One Who Was There!"

EDITOR'S NOTE: — "One Who Was There" sounds like a person who has attended dog shows for a long time with a very observant eye. Mr. Harry Baker, apparently enjoyed the show. He has a keen appreciation of style in judging and points out that the "cash customer" likes to know what the judge is doing and why he is doing it.

The Amphitheatre Rink, one of Winnipeg's sporting enclosures, was the location chosen for the executive of the Fort Garry Kennel Club, for their 26th Annual Show. It was a happy choice for this historic building has housed the majority of indoor sporting events for so long that it would seem as though it had always been there. If all the emotional energy could be concentrated, if all the groans, the moans, the expressions of intense joy and honest-to-goodness heart-felt sorrow, if the "Ohs" and the "Ahs" and all the other expletives, polite or otherwise, that have been heard, felt or experienced in the famous "arena" could be compressed, then the "atomic bomb", with all its power, would certainly have its emotional counterpart. The "Amp" has provided the background, for so many glorious victories, and, consequently, very bitter defeats, also of wonderful team-work, and individual prowess. We do remember and can visualize a long line of really important people, in all lines of endeavour, from Jack Dempsey to Nelson Eddy, from Galli Curci to Joe Fahey, and Foster Hewitt, who have performed, sung and announced,—who have thrilled countless thousands in the name of "free enterprise" or "sweet charity". This brings us to where we "came in".

The rink presented a gala appearance, thanks, as always, to the energetic few. The benching was splendidly arranged and spaced; the comfort of the "exhibits" and of their owners, had been thoughtfully attended to, the parade enclosure really looked "swell". The "glads" in their vases, the trophies tastefully arranged on the tables, the space allotted to judge and exhibitor were clear indications of experience and efficiency in such matters. The disgruntled were conspicuous by their absence; the judging assignments were in the capable hands of Maxwell Riddle, who hails from Ohio, U.S.A., and a local product, Cpl. Bill Nixon, of Winnipeg, and the R.C.A.F., our visiting judge "going over" all Sporting, Working, and Non-Sporting (Bostons being the exception); the local judge doing the honours for Toys and the Terrier group, and the Bostons. An innovation, and an extra personal contribution by Mr. Riddle was the screening of a very interesting series of pictures covering "doggy" activities in the field and on the bench, by America's most representative dogs, accompanied by a continuous commentary and description, which was greatly appreciated. Our visitor had the happy knack of placing his dogs in such a way that the cash customers had the opportunity to "see it all," looking them over, bringing them together for closer comparison, in

order to detect quality wherever it could be found.

Mr. Crozier is, I think, to be congratulated on the "set-up" of the exhibit of Labradors—"atmosphere", Hollywood would perhaps call it. They were carefully concealed from behind by reeds and rushes, that left no doubt in the minds of the audience who may have been curious but uninformed, as to the work and purpose of this kind of dog. The entries definitely indicated that the Dachshund is steadily gaining in popularity and quality, as will be shown later.

The local Cocker breeders are supplying plenty of evidence that they intend to tap the "spring" of quality at its present source; either by direct purchase, or by using the "services" of the best that American continent affords. They are to be congratulated, for their ambitious enterprise. It is well that this is so, for it must be borne in mind that the interested "ring-sider" today, becomes the ardent, enterprising devotee of tomorrow. Therefore, I repeat that any innovation that appeals to the eye of the onlooker, as illustrated earlier in this observation, is bound to result in greater enjoyment and profit to spectator and breeder alike. One of the most notable things in our show, was not the lack of variety, but of the very noticeable lack of entries in so many breeds, and its consequent reminder of the amount of opportunity presented.

It is not to be wondered at that Carl M. Tangstad's promising Pointer, looked lonesome; and the Manchester Terrier, sorrowful, the Chesapeake and the Bloodhound looked over at the Great Dane, the Boxer, and the Old English Sheepdog, as if to say, "It's all right, fellows, we'll get 'Best of Breed' anyhow!" Think how disappointed that nice white girl-dog from the coast must have felt, and probably, said, "What no male, 'Samoyede' in Winnipeg!" There was one familiar face that I missed very much, and that was Mr. Hugh Allen, and his Antrim entry. Here is "completion" in the Terrier field—(that can usually be spelled with a capital "C"). And there is something else that seems to me worthy of mention, particularly in the Sporting Group. It was the way the various owners presented their dogs to the judge. There was, under the stimulus of keener competition, a definite and pleasing improvement.

To see Dick Irvin, in the "Amphi" rink, even without his skates, was indeed a pleasure. Of course, he did not travel quite so fast! His miniature Pinschers came in for a lot of attention, and favourable comment. Cpl. Nixon did a memorable job, with his assignment, the Toys, the Terrier Groups and the Bostons. The highlight of all the groups judging was the Cockers. It is no exaggeration to say that the results were received with some surprise, the "foregone conclusion" was eliminated, for the very good reason that Mr. Riddle was no slave to type or size; the element of uncertainty, the doing of the unpredictable was so interesting, that a pronounced hush, a

"quiet expectancy" so unusual in local shows, made this event one to be remembered. One must conclude that he liked best the type, size and general conformation of the dog receiving the "nod" with due regard to the manner of its presentation. It was very gratifying to see Mrs. J. D. Wade go best in Terrier Group, with her imported Scottie Ch. Kinclaven Kismet. The owner of Ornetsie prefix and kennels, has been producing and exhibiting really typical "Scotties" to my personal knowledge, for over a quarter of a century, sparing neither time or expense, to get the desirable type, always a good sport, who keeps coming back for more. A show without "Ma" Wade in attendance, is a long, long way in the distance her many friends and admirers sincerely hope.

It is not so long ago that the Dachshund was quite a rarity. Today, he is shown to be approaching the "favour" spot, by his appeal, as the number of sales and the number of registrations abundantly testify. It will, I am sure, be a source of great pleasure to Mrs. Joy Osterdahl, of Highland Creek, Ontario, to know and hear of Mrs. Mill's success with a Dachsie female, Egyptian Dream of Joyce. It was a splendid wind-up to a very interesting exhibition. Mr. Riddle carefully going over the "chosen ones" from each breed until he was satisfied with his choice for "Reserve" and "Best".

A word, at this point, about the Pettigrew entry, which furnished Reserve Best. He comes from one of the first families of American Cockerdom. His merry swagger as he moves happily along makes one think he is conscious of it. His grandparents on both sides of the family bear that name that has come to mean so much "Stockdale", his grand-daddy being Ch. Sandspring Star of Stockdale" on his father's side. His mother's parents were "Ch. Stockdale Startler and Ch. Peggy of Stockdale. The Pettigrew dog was put through his paces by Mr. George Kynoch, who really excelled in his presentation, and made it decidedly difficult for Mr. Riddle to arrive at a decision. Mrs. Mills' "Dachsie" seemed to sense that the occasion was an important one and behaved accordingly. It was only after a long and careful examination with a very interested crowd, "wondering who" that our visiting judge made Mrs. Mills the happiest woman of the evening by placing her entry in the "coveted spot" and declaring Egyptian Dream of Joyce, Dachshund female, "Best in Show".

As a final observation, the officers, executive and the show committee did a splendid job. Seeing Mr. Sam Jackson, sitting at ease, his voice clearly heard, calling the exhibits to the ring and bidding the next class be prepared by means of the "Mike", seems a far cry from the time when he performed the same function with the "cupped hand" and later the "megaphone". The ladies in the parade ring acquitted themselves with their usual "efficiency".

CHOW CHOWS

Quotation from a letter to Mr. David Fingard from Mr. Freeman Lloyd, Kennel Correspondent to *National Geographic Magazine*:

"In reply to your letter of the 22nd addressed to the *National Geographic Magazine*, regarding the Chow Chow breed of China, I have no extraordinary information to suggest save that of many years' acquaintance with its history and physical appearance.

"For quite 60 years I have been a practical reviewer and public commen-

tator on all breeds at dog shows and have judged at kennel events held on four continents, and since boyhood days have been mixed up with breeders of pedigreed and high class farm livestock, and instructed regarding the values of certain physical perfections or otherwise of animals. Therefore, it was to gather that the straight hocks of a Chow Chow as advised, indeed recommended, by 'drawers up' of points was an absurdity and should be discouraged. The strength of the springing, leaping, or other strong action of the hind quarters is greatly helped by the well-bent and

strong hocks; while the straight hock and stiffl joint proclaims weakness.

"Of course, the even bite is stronger than any other. The late Hugh Dalziel, eminent authority on dogs, about 60 years ago, and I were watching bulldogs being judged at a bulldog club's show at the Royal Aquarium, London. It appeared that the Judge was about to favor an exhibit which was undershot. It was then that Dalziel whispered to the then junior reporter 'Ask them (the readers) if they know of any of the carnivorae with the lower incisors placed ahead of the upper holders.' "

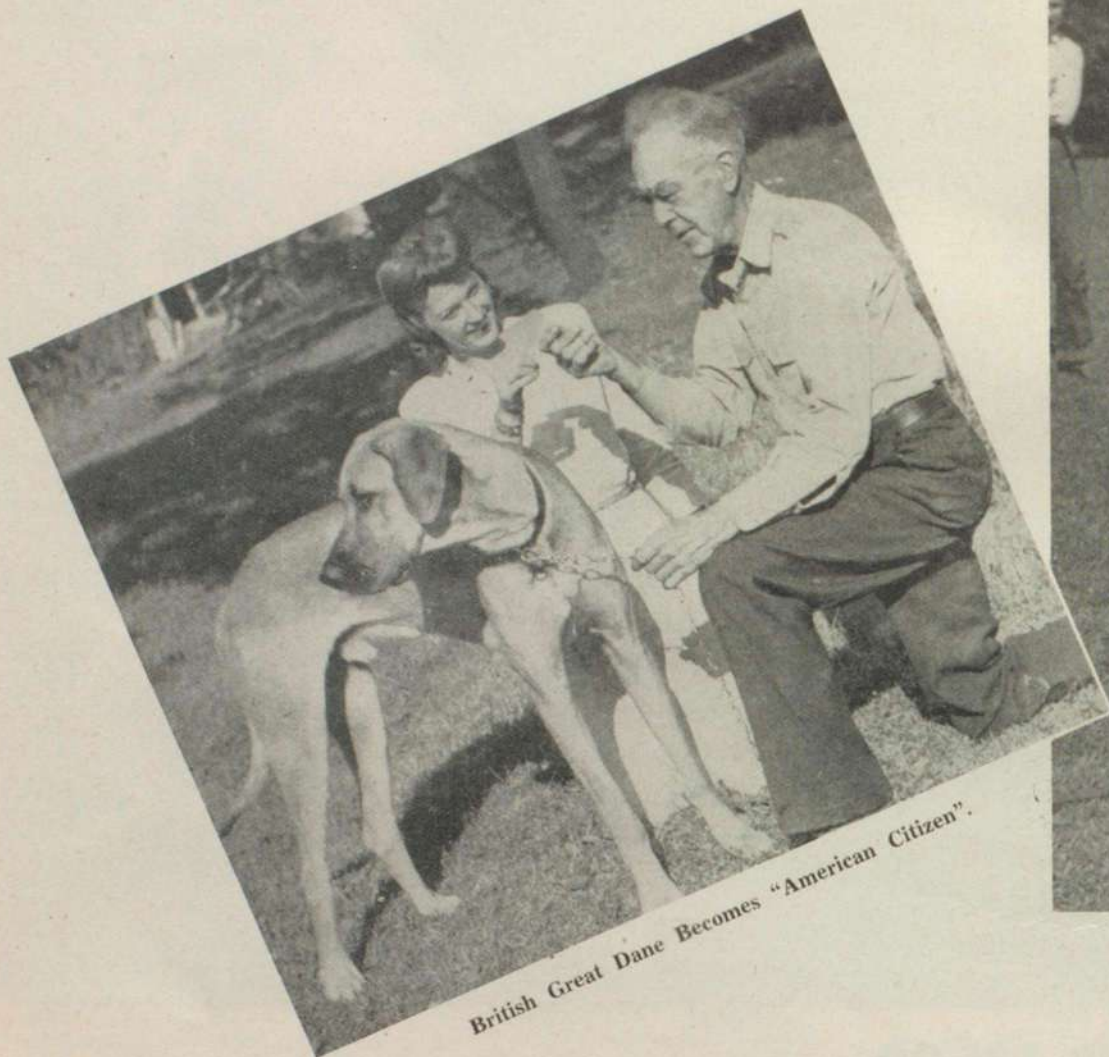

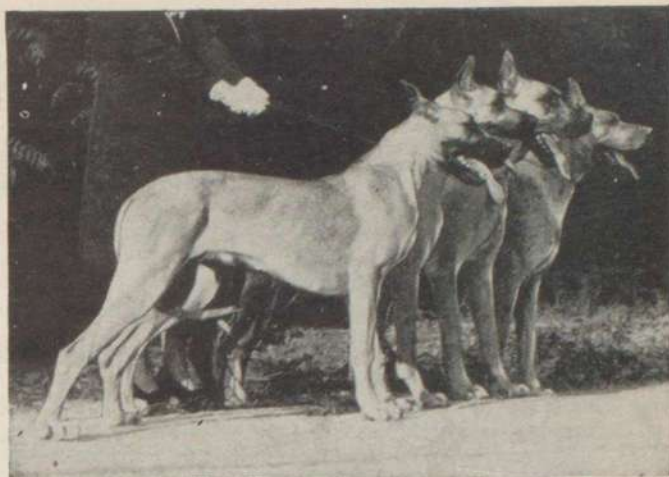

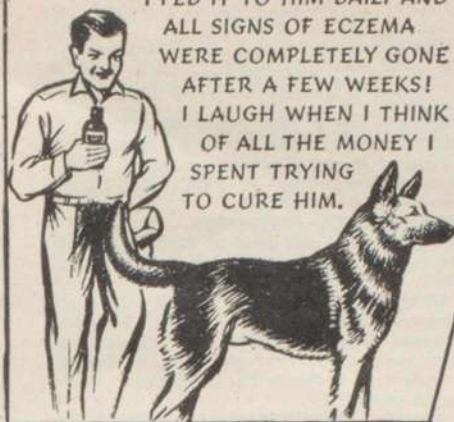
