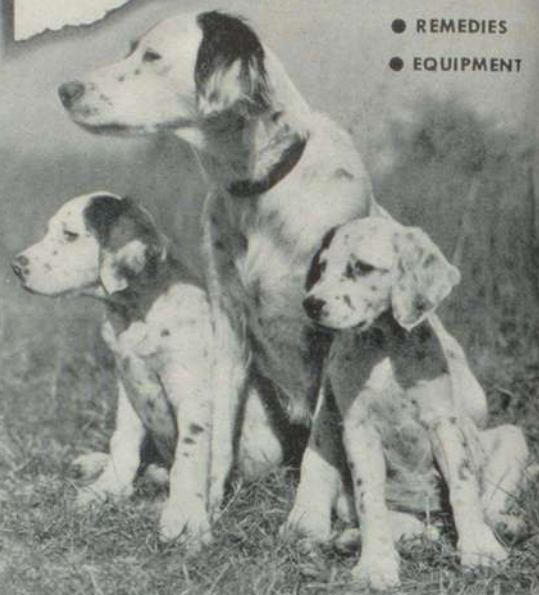

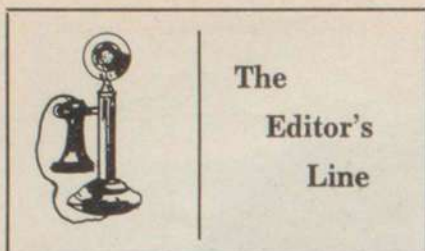

CHICAGO WORLD CHAMPION SPEED RACES

January 2nd, 1946

Mr. Charles N. Gough of McMasterville, Quebec, is hoping to bring back the honours to Canada with his "German Shepherd Flyers". Mr. Gough's "Flyers" have a sire and dam named Dan and Connie, who have been on the payroll of the Beloeil Explosive Works for the past five years. Dan can clear a six-foot barbed wire fence and can catch a saboteur or suspect by grabbing him by the foot, ankle or leg, and hold him for arrest. He has to his credit saving of a boy's life on the Richelieu River. Dan and Connie have to date travelled more than 20,000 miles in dog sled and cart.

The most important and the largest cemetery for dogs is that situated upon Ile Wrecher in the middle of the Seine, near the City of Paris, France. It contains more than 3,000 animals.

Before one of the tombs there is a monument 12 feet in height and one can see graven on the stone the features of "Barry", a St. Bernard, one of the noblest dogs the world has ever known. Barry belonged to the monastery of Mount St. Bernard. In his four-year career he saved more than 40 persons from death.

Here are some of the very distinguished persons who have plots: Edmond Rostand, the great French poet, Leon Daudet, Rejane, the actress, Coquelin, writer, Sasha Guitry, the great modern actor, Sully Prud'homme, Prince Lotbinoff and the Grand Duke Nicholas of Russia, as well as many other celebrated people throughout the world.—Extract from J. A. Robitaille's column in "La Patrie."

CHOW BREEDERS DISAGREE WITH MR. LLOYD'S THEORY

Several Chow Chow fanciers have pointed out that they disagree with the views expressed by Mr. Freeman Lloyd in a letter to Mr. David Fingard, an extract from which appeared in the October number.

Mr. Lloyd attacks the Chow standard in that he disapproves of any tendency toward a straight hock. Chow breeders have pointed out that the standard drawn up by the American Chow Chow Club, which is the recognized standard for United States and Canada, calls for "hindlegs straight hocked, muscular and heavy boned".

Photographs of the desirable type as per the said standard all show this straight hock, and pottery statues preserved from the Han Dynasty (China, 150 B.C.), show this same formation.

The dog is a sled dog; elephants and many other heavy draught animals have this stocky straight hock. The Chow has been used as a draught animal and was bred constantly with a straight hock.

Chow breeders feel that while Mr. Freeman Lloyd's observations may be quite correct when referring to an animal in which swiftness and fleetness of foot is desirable, he would be hard put to furnish evidence that Chows with angulation existed, and that this was a characteristic of the breed either before or after the Chow standard was drawn up.

NIAGARA FRONTIER KENNEL CLUB FIRST SHOW A TREMENDOUS SUCCESS

With the first show safely tucked away—and a show of which the Niagara Frontier Kennel Club members may justly be proud—enthusiasm and optimism are so high that plans for another, early next year, are already being discussed. Most of the sixty odd members of this new organization are the veriest novices at show-giving, but under the guidance of show chairman, Bob Schelling, and show superintendent, Fred Stickel, the event, attended by over thirteen hundred spectators, set several new Canadian records. Held in the Arena at Port Colborne, Saturday, September 29th, it was the second largest show in Canada this year.

From the banner opposite the entrance which welcomed visitors, past the office, lunch bar and down across the floor of the building, every part of the layout had been carefully planned to ensure the comfort of exhibitors and their entries.

At the south end, directly below a tier of spectator seats, two twenty-by-forty foot rings had been set up. The trophy table, attractively decorated and laden with an array of sterling, plate, china and crystal such as has seldom, if ever, been seen, was centered between and in back of them.

The Cocker ring was toward the north end of the Arena, opposite the Cocker benching and close to one of the spaces provided for handlers. This arrangement allowed the always large group of Cocker enthusiasts to collect without a semblance of crowding and drew the praise of everyone.

Nine foot aisles all around the rows of benching afforded ample space for owners to group chairs beside their dogs and visitors to walk around at will with no congestion resulting.

The services of Boy Scouts was an innovation which contributed much to the smoothness of operations. These were stationed at the Exhibitors' entrance and as runners for the stewards and one, with especially sturdy legs, acted as messenger between the Secretary and Superintendent.

Much credit for the large entry is due the outstanding panel of judges secured by the Niagara Frontier Kennel Club. Chris Cassleman, Chicago, filling his first assignment in Canada since the last Toronto Exhibition Show, passed on all breeds other than Terriers, Cocker Spaniels and German Shepherds. His quiet and careful deliberation over each contestant inspired a feeling of confidence in novice canine and human alike and proved a source of satisfaction to the old timer who so often feels that judging has become a matter of boring routine to the man who gives with the blue and red.

Clyde Heck, Allentown, Pa., who came to the show with the finest reputation as an outstanding authority on Cocker

Spaniels filled a difficult role in a masterly fashion.

Miss Lena Short, London, Ontario, performed her duties in her usual good style, judging all Terrier breeds.

Mrs. W. Hendry, Scarboro Bluffs, chosen by the German Shepherd Club, handled her first assignment in a capable and forthright manner.

Largest breed entry, except for Cockers, was from the Boston Terrier fanciers—a gesture of commendation honoring Bob Schelling. Great Danes and Shetland Sheepdogs gave the little gentleman with the white vest a worthwhile race—no entry of Danes in recent years has equalled that at this show and it is believed fourteen Shelties was an all time Canadian record.

A surprise of the day were twelve Chihuahuas peeking from their glass show-cases at the "oh-ing" and "aw-ing" crowd which continually collected to admire them.

Of interest to exhibitors and spectators alike were the American Water Spaniels which, through the good offices of the Niagara Frontier Kennel Club, had been officially recognized and were being shown in Canada for the first time. Mr. John N. Sherlock, Kenmore, N.Y., President of the American Water Spaniel Club and owner of the Best of Breed, American Champion Brighton's Betty, assured everyone that his enthusiastic group planned to attend all shows within motoring distance of the border now that "the ice had been broken".

In the judges seat, before a bewildering variety of breeds ranging from an infinitesimal Pom to a thirty-four-inch black Great Dane, Alf Loveridge was hard put to choose among twenty-odd contestants for cups offered first, second and third winner in the Children's Handling Class. Top honors went to Isabel Lowndes, Dundas, who showed a Cocker Spaniel to such good advantage as to suggest long hours of hard practice and a natural talent for the job.

Reg Sparkes, passing on the Groups, held the large evening audience—some of whom had not left their seats for hours beforehand—in a happy and enthusiastic mood.

A gorgeous black Cocker Spaniel, Sanborn's Playboy bred and owned by G. R. Sanborn, Guelph, which had come up from the ranks over several champions entered for specials, took the Sporting Group.

Mrs. E. R. Matchett's International Champion Kurram El Myia topped Group 2 and drew a round of applause from the spectators, many of whom had never before seen an Afghan, when he stood quietly, all pride of accomplishment in his bearing, for a moment just after the award was made.

The tri-color Collie, Harswing Hit Parade, bred and owned by Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Schwinger, Ebenezer, N.Y., placed first in the Working Group over strong competition and George Davies' Kerry Blue, Kindon Vuliana, looking, as

one ringsider put it, "like a carefully cut out silhouette," did likewise in the Terriers.

The Miniature Pinscher, International Champion Trail Blazer of Geddesburg, owned by William A. Harris, stepped out before the Toys with all the showmanship of a prima donna.

A Boston American Champion Yankee Bombardier, owned by Miss Emily Shire, Bronx, N.Y., was first in the Non-Sporting.

Came "the" moment of the long day. Mid absolute quiet, the Group Winners were put through their paces. Judge Sparkes went thoughtfully to the trophy table—denuded now except for Club President Bill Pietz's silver serving tray, a truly enormous basket of rose and mauve Glads and the rosette, all of which were destined to honor his choice. The racing heartbeats of those handling the six finalists could almost be heard and certainly their echo was felt through the tense expectancy of the crowd. Quickly Mr. Sparkes returned to the line-up and handed the bit of purple and gold to Bill Schwinger and his Collie, Harswing Hit Parade, became the target for a battery of cameras as he received the applause and cheers, the trophies, the "once in a lifetime" honor of Best in Show.

There may never be a perfect show, at least until the perfect person, or persons, are found to hold it and no one can please all the people, all the time, but members of the Niagara Frontier, their officers and friends, their show Chairman, Secretary and Superintendent, all felt they had done a job of which they might be justly proud.

Another year small changes will be made—better flooring will be provided, the lunch bar will be kept open until the Show's end and better weather will certainly be on order. However, aside from minor details, even if those who say it shouldn't, the praise so generously given by all who attended was justly deserved.

"THAT WE HAVE TO SEE!"

Editor Note—Mr. C. A. Ellis, of Windsor, has sent us the following letter which is alleged to have been written by one of his friends overseas to a mutual friend here. No doubt you will agree upon reading it that the wolves of Saul Ste. Marie had better look to their laurels in the way of accomplishment. Baron Munchausen might come to attention also upon reading the following episode regarding a quail hunt.

Dear George:

I tried to talk Kerr into taking me duck hunting and wound up on one of the damndest quail hunts on record. There is an ex-General attached to the station here who is now a Lt. (jg), named Benthussen. His home was close to mine and he used to spend, and does spend, a lot of his time hunting even here. It seems that when Benthussen came back from his last cruise he brought a young monkey. Shortly thereafter he acquired a Setter pup which he began to train on quail, as there are plenty of birds over here. The monkey used to go along, became friends with the pup, and eventually became interested in quail hunting himself. Benthussen claimed that the monkey was as good as most dogs on quail and "By God, he could prove it".

So this is all over the bar at the Officers' Club on a Saturday night. Kerr and I took him up on his statement because we knew him, and a quail hunt was arranged for the following morning, to consist of Benthussen, Kerr, myself and the monkey; Kerr to furnish me with a gun and the necessary clothing.

After the usual amount of backing and filling that would be normal expectancy on a Sunday morning, complicated by the fact that the monkey insisted on riding in the front seat, we got started. The quail country is quite rugged with 8-12 inches of grass and many low bushes. We fanned out three abreast and the monkey (after a few runs up and down a nearby tree to get limbered up) preceded us by 50-60 yards, running back and forth, jumping the low bushes, very much like a springer in high grass.

Pretty soon the monkey goes down on a point—three feet on the ground and tail straight out. Kerr was the nearest, so he went in and flushed a covey about 10 feet ahead of the monkey. He got two birds, the monkey ran around in circles making monkey noises (denoting extreme happiness, I suppose), and after Kerr and I had paid off our bets with Benthussen, we started on again.

About a mile further on, the monkey pointed again, about 67-70 yards ahead of us. As it was my side, I started in, but Benthussen stopped me, saying, "Look at the monkey closely." I did—three feet on the ground with the tail straight out as before, but the fourth foot, I guess you would call it the left front paw, is waving about in the air and clearly indicating "stop". I did. The monkey then started racing about an area 40-50 feet in diameter. This went on for two to three minutes and then all was quiet.

SASKATCHEWAN FIELD TRIAL HISTORY

Editor—This article rounds out the picture given by Mr. Orge in our September Number. The co-operative spirit evidenced can easily bring Saskatchewan to the forefront in America as a Field Trial Centre.

While perusing the September issue of *Dogs In Canada* I came across an article called "Field Trials", by R. L. Orge of Saskatoon.

This article was very interesting and educational to all lovers of the field trial sport, and I am of the opinion that the idea of educating the sporting public to sponsor more trials in this part of the Prairies is a move in the right direction. Saskatoon is to be highly complimented on their venture in field trialing and I wish them every success in their future trials.

One part of Mr. Orge's article that forcibly came to my attention was paragraph six, page nine, and I quote Mr. Orge as writing:

"Previous to 1943 there had been several 'catch as catch can' type of field trials held in Saskatchewan. Progressive thinking dog-lovers felt the need of placing field trialing on a firmer foundation. To satisfy their desire for improvement in this grand sport, an organization was formed and became known as the Field Trial Branch of the Saskatoon Kennel Club."

The last sentence of this quotation I believe is perfectly true, but the first and second sentences are far from the facts and to prove this I want the readers to bear with me while I describe the original inauguration of the trials known as the Saskatchewan Field Trial Association Incorporated, headquarters Moose Jaw, Sask.

1934

This club, organized in 1934, has had a spectacular career in the major field trial circuit. Moose Jaw sportsmen, convinced that they had the facilities for a fine field trials course, with the right kind of open country and plenty of birds, let nothing stand in their way in the organization of this new star in the field trials firmament. The 1934 trials, held under the guidance of that very fine sportsman and able field trials judge, the late Frank Walsh of Winnipeg, with Dr. Wilson of Edmonton and C. T.

Carney of Des Moines, Iowa, as associated judges, was an interesting and very successful commencement of what proved to be later an outstanding success. The championship in this year drew outstanding dogs into the competition. Enthusiasts will remember the contest between Black Hawk Kid, Jake's Jack Mohawk, and Buddy D, owned and handled by Carl Duffield; Doctor Blue Willing, Evergreen Jersey Mack and Air Pilot's Sam, all owned by L. D. Johnson and handled by that redoubtable sage of handlers, Ed. Farrior; Shanghai Express, owned by Gerald Livingstone and handled also by Farrior; Spunky Creek Joanne, the Dresden China Pointer owned by Nina Billingslea; Proctor's Star, owned by C. S. Proctor, handled by Mac Pritchette; Wild Crabtree's Tailwind, who was discovered fifty miles away from the course (on point?), three weeks after the trial; Joyce's Ghost from Calgary with Charlie Crist as mentor, and last, but not least, the winner, Fort's Dixie Proctor, handled by Pete Pritchette, and owned by Kent Shortel. Evergreen Jersey Mack took the All-Age, and Poncianna, owned by Dawson Coleman of Philadelphia, with the dean Jake Bishop in control, took the Derby. The success of this trial only spurred the promoters to further action for 1935.

1935

A strenuous effort was then made to secure more dogs and more handlers to locate in Saskatchewan. New training grounds were located, new aspirants found, with the finest of dogs, to locate where verdure was green, mornings and evenings cool and birds in profusion. In the Championship that fine old veteran, Doctor Blue Willing, ran away with the purse of \$510.00 in a sterling exhibition of staunchness and supreme bird finding ability. Fort's Dixie Proctor got the All-Age and Ten Broeck's Bonnet, owned by W. V. Bowles of Texas, took the Derby honor. Frank Walsh, J. M. Miller and Dr. Wilson again presided as the judiciary.

1936

The year 1936 saw the Saskatchewan club hold the largest field trials held on the American continent in that year, a brilliant achievement for a three-year-old organization in the major field trials circuit. The policy of extending every assistance to trainers in locating in Saskatchewan, fair and generous treatment to all contestants; a good field trials course, with the best opportunity to display the prowess of the dogs and with the finest judges obtainable, had borne fruit in the entry list for the 1936 event. Club officials were astounded at having fourteen Setters and forty-one Pointers in the All-Age stake, four Setters and thirty Pointers as starters in the Derby, and four Setters and twenty-three Pointers in the Championship event. The late Al. Hochwalt, maestro of reporters in the world of dogs, who had told us in 1934, in his official report,

that a new star had appeared in the field trials firmament, was to see his dream come true. Over this vast assemblage of the finest sporting dogs produced in the world, Dr. T. Benton King of Brownsville, Tennessee, the grand old "young" man of the judging fraternity, was to preside, assisted by that fine sportsman, John Miller of Calgary, who had served so well in the 1935 trials. Sharp-tailed grouse and Hungarian partridges were there in abundance. Drought had not struck the course and the cover was excellent. Crops were cut and food for the birds was plentiful. The open, rolling prairie, with scrub in the draws, stubble fields and clumps of poplar, seemed alive with birds at the time, so that judges, contestants and gallery had everything that could be desired to observe this classic event.

Highland Bimpkins got the All-Age and a golden pot. Garwood won the Derby. Then came the Championship, with an array of thirty-one of the best that was good indeed to look upon. I quote here from friend Al's own story:

"The Championship was the revelation of the programme; the bright spot in a sombre mosaic. Birds were found by those two dogs that kept the handlers, the judges and the gallery moving. In reality it was a higher class championship on the prairies than we have seen in several seasons. Back of the winners were dogs which ran races of a calibre fully on a par with any that have won on these prairie events, but here was a plethora of good work."

Here Air Pilot's Sam was to start the wins that carried him on his splendid career through the southern circuit until he reached his climax in the National Championship, so ably described by Nash Buckingham in *Outdoor Life*. The dog's gestures were spectacular, his running superb and his finding ability without fault of any kind. Close behind him came the runner-up, W. V. Bowles' snappy little Setter, Ten Broeck Bonnet.

1937

The 1937 trials, conducted under difficult conditions, excessive drought, failing water supplies, and shortage of feed for horses, did not interfere with the huge success of the events. If 1936 was good, 1937 was astounding in the turnout of contestants and spectators. Henry P. Davis, genial secretary of the American Wild Life Institute, an outstanding judge of fine dogs, presided over the judiciary. John M. Miller, chief clerk of Calgary, assisted him nobly in deciding a stupendous entry of the finest string of dogs America could produce. The wide open Amateur started on Sunday, August 29th, with seventeen entries. Ernie Shaffer, with Spunky Creek Coin, wrested the Grant Hall Hotel Cup from Carl Duffield, Jr. Monday, August 30th, saw forty-eight starters in the Open Derby and Howard Kirk with Wayside Lulu, Earl Crangle with Anthony's Betty Joyeuse, Jet Crawford with Wayside Annie, took first, second and third money respectively. The Open All-Age was the next event, with sixty-eight starters. Air Pilot's Sam, with Ed. Farrior handling, added another pot of \$832.50 to his handler. Durch Epperson took second and third with the Shaffer

Pointers, Spunky Creek Coin and Spunky Creek Boy. Concluding this hard week's work, thirty-two of the best went out in the Saskatchewan Open Championship. Dewey English, with Highland Bimpkins, owned by Dr. L. O. Crumpler of Danville, Va., was tops at \$1,080.00, but Earl Humphreys, with Bess Willing, gave him a real contest, split the big pot as runner-up, with much credit to her versatile, hard working handler.

On the final Sunday, concluding seven days of continuous running in the Professional events, the Western Canada Amateur events were concluded. Harry Felt of Findlater took the Derby with the Hutchinson Cup. W. G. Ross took the Amateur All-Age with the Dr. Low Cup and the Melon Dew Cup for the Shooting Dog Stake. Moran Rutherford took the Closed Shooting Dog Stake and the Plaxton Cup. C. L. Theofan took the Cocker and Springer trial and the Joyner Cup. In all, there were eight days continuous competition and 188 entries in all, to defeat the club's own 1936 record and to provide the world's latest final of 1937. We conclude the history of 1937 with Al. Hochwalt again:

"When in 1934 this new club was announced to run a trial near Moose Jaw, Sask., the world of bird dog people was not greatly startled. It was just another club to take its place among the many. But from the very beginning this new organization began to make itself felt. It was conducted just a bit different from the mine run kind. It proved to be a new note in the scheme of things. The astounding progress that was made in those few short years has been the talk of the country. The Saskatchewan Club went from a small beginning to lead the clubs in the Canadian prairie country. This year the fourth trial of its career has broken records which may not again be equalled in Canada or elsewhere."

1938

The birthday judiciary of 1938 commended itself to sportsmen all over the continent. Nash Buckingham of Memphis, Tennessee, internationally known author, trapshot, hunter and judge of good dogs, with W. T. Windsor of Akron, Ohio, listed among the ten outstanding judges of the North American continent, decided the very happy birthday event.

Al Hochwalt, who had been with us since the inauguration of the trials in 1934, has passed away to his well-earned rest. George Rogers, who succeeded him in a difficult post, well described the event as follows:

"The rapid growth and envelopment of this organization has been chronicled. It is a field trial saga. The all-age stake carried an entry of 67, the Derby had 40 starters and the Open Championship 33 starters and the Open Amateur had 18 starters. Despite the fact that the gross entry did not equal the amazing record of 1937, there was so small a difference that the 1938 programme will go down in the records as another great achievement of this youthful organization and will serve as a goal for other clubs of even more mature experience."

Ben Temple, owned by C. A. Rugg, handled by the redoubtable Dewey English, won the All-Age, followed by Mississippi Broomhill Jake, owned by Col. C. B. Goss, handled by George Payton; Highland Bimpkins, owned by Dr. L. O. Crumpler, and also handled by Dewey English, was third. Stakes were \$793.00, \$478.80, \$317.20. In the Derby, Dutch Epperson, with Island Park Boy,

from the string of E. J. Shaffer, was first; Sedgefield's Nigger, handled by Clyde Morton and owned by A. G. C. Sage, was second. Third place was divided by classy Floreta of the Lebanon Kennels of J. Dawson Coleman, handled by Jake Bishop, great old dean of the trainers, and Olive Hill Topsy, handled by George Crangle, another veteran, and owned by E. S. Donovan. Shakes in the Derby were: 1st, \$511.50; 2nd, \$306.90; 3rd, \$102.30.

Four heats under the blazing September sun, at the close of a really great week of scintillating exhibitions on the greatest wide open course in Canada, saw Uncas Flying Devil, again handled by Dewey English and owned by Howard Eyester of York, Pennsylvania, cinch his leading position with the longest cast ever seen on the source—a mile and a half—where he was found in beautiful point, waiting patiently but steadily for Dewey to flush. This brilliant performance by Devil was not to bring him an outright win. Howard Kirk of Hickory Valley, Tennessee, was in there with that sterling little bitch, Amazon's Village Girl, from Village Boy out of Spunky Creek Amazon, owned by H. E. McGonigal. Patiently but with alacrity and perfect style, she marked her ground, braced with Highland Bimpkins, a formidable brace mate indeed, to a very praiseworthy finish. Nash Buckingham and Bill Windsor, ablest pair of judges seen on this course, saw her as a capable runner-up to split the golden pot with Dewey English; \$1,150.00 going to the winner and \$350.00 to the runner-up.

So ended the saga of 1938 with its massive entry of the truly great in the royalty of upland sporting dogs.

1939

The 1939 trials opened August 25th with the Empire facing the greatest trial of its history. The shadow of this conflict in July and August perhaps had its effect on the entries, which were somewhat smaller than in former years. The quality of the entires, however, was excellent. Fifty All-Age, twenty-five Derbies and twenty-four Championship starters provided a truly excellent field. Spunky Creek Coin, owned by E. J. Shaffer, took the Championship with a performance replete with the highest type of showmanship in both handler, V. E. Humphries, and the dog. Amazon Village Girl, with Howard Kirk handling, was a credit as "runner-up" to that excellent sportsman owner, H. E. McGonigal of Kokomo, Indiana.

In the Derby, Dewey English, a consistent winner of these trials, took A. D. Noe's Tennessee Dare Devil into top money. In the All-Age, Village Ben, owned by one of our most enthusiastic supporters, Dr. H. E. Longsdorf, and guided by the rising young star, Howard Kirk, was victorious over the field of fifty of the cream of American Pointers and Setters. Carl Duffield, Jr., captured outright the Grant Hall Hotel Trophy for the third successive time with Norias Daisy.

1940

Still under the clouds of World War II, the club decided that for 1940 the order of the day would be "business as usual". Headquarters were back at Stanley's, and there would be more birds than ever available for the 1940 Canadian classic.

So we wrote early in 1940, as the handlers gathered for another successful season on the Saskatchewan prairie. The veteran, Dr. T. Benton King, kindly consented to judge the trial for the second time. He was with us last in 1936. T. Dean Coridan of Fortville, Indiana, rising star in the top group of the American judging fraternity, joined the genial veteran in the heavy task of picking the winners from a splendid representation of the best bird dogs in the world. August 26th saw Carl Duffield, Jr., take the Amateur All-Age cup with that lively, spritely little Setter, "Playgirl". In the year before the same Carl Duffield, Jr., had annexed the Grant Hall Cup, emblematical of the Saskatchewan Open Amateur Championship, by winning it three times in succession.

In the Open Derby, thirty-one Pointers and six Setters were entered. Marvin Yaunt, a newcomer in this trial, took first place with "Tarheel's Sassy Jane", owned by Stanley Bayley, "Mohawk Ginger Pal", owned by W. F. Black and handled by R. D. Bevan, was second, and "Dean", owned by Dr. Harry Ridley, handled by C. B. Black, was third.

In the Open All-Age Stake, thirty-six pointers and sixteen Setters were down, an unusually large proportion of Setters for this trial. Jack Harper, with "Texas Ranger", owned by D. B. McDaniel, was first; Dewey English, with "Lawless Boy", owned by Dr. H. E. Longsdorf, was second, and Earl Humphreys guided and rode "Young's Billie", owned by H. J. Yoakum, to a splendid third.

That classy third, however, did not satisfy the hard-riding Texas cowboy, who once decided that the best way to make a quick fortune was to ride Texas mules attached to parachutes, down from aeroplanes as the most thrilling exhibitions in his repertoire. In the championship stake, with a resplendent entry of class, he placed "Young's Billie" on top with an out-and-out win in a stellar performance throughout.

1941

The war was still on. We carried on under difficulties but had a very successful trial. This was our last trial for the duration. Gas rationing came in and we were forced to abandon our trials until the war ended.

We closed for the duration with a substantial bank balance and \$350.00 in Victory Bonds. We contemplate starting again in 1946.

Now after reading the records as stated, I am sincere when I state that I do not believe Mr. Orge in his article meant to belittle our organization, but I do say he took in a little too much territory when he said that previous to

1943 there had been several "catch-as-catch-can" type of field trials held in Saskatchewan.

Nevertheless, I feel Mr. Orge has the right idea in doing all in his power to encourage and promote field trials under the Canadian Kennel Club supervision and I for one will be backing his idea for more local amateur trials under the Canadian Kennel Club in Saskatchewan. Let us all get behind Mr. Orge and start something in our own districts along the lines he has set out.

TRIMMING THE

WEST HIGHLAND TERRIER

Ed. Note: We have had innumerable requests for instructions on trimming Westies, and Mrs. H. W. Mellish has kindly given us a brief outline of the method of procedure. Mrs. Mellish is writing a book on the stripping and trimming of all breeds.

A Westie is one of the hardest dogs to trim, as nearly all the trimmings must not be seen. It requires a considerable amount of patience and practice. I will deal with each point in standard order (English):

(1) Coat. A Westie should have a 2-inch coat; hard outer coat without curl, and a fur undercoat.

(2) Skull-tip all ragged ends at an angle and leave about an inch long.

(3) Eyes. Clean hair from inside corner which gets in eye, and allow skull hair to shade eyes, heavy eyebrows but not enough to spoil expression.

(4) Muzzle. Leave all hair.

(5) Ears. Clean tips inside and out and trim edges and point with scissors, graduating hair on lower part of ear to blend into skull hair.

(6) Halo-trim hair circling face to form a halo, from hair on ears until it



blends into chest. This is most important for expression and balance of head. Length of hair to blend with remainder of coat.

(7) Neck and shoulders. This has to be thinned to produce a muscular neck on sloping shoulders. But no hair must appear cut or shortened, and must still have a heavy covering of hair.

(8) Chest is left unless there are ragged ends, which should be tipped.

(9) Body. Level back but thin hair on sides of ribs so as to present the flattish side appearance so required in a Westie for their work. Leave upper half of rib well covered.

(10) Legs and feet. Trim and shape (round) front feet and ragged ends on furnishings. Quarters—trim and round

(11) Tail. Trim tail all round, gradu-
ating from full length at base to short
hard hair at tip, trim off all feathering.



Trim all hair under base tail close and
gradually lengthen to blend with re-
mainder of hair, thin hair but do not
cut with scissors showing a free easy
movement.

"At the Ottawa Exhibition my Ch. Priorwood Pagan had won Best Peke and Best Toy, Priorwood Pansy had completed her championship and Wing,

DIETARY LAWS

By David Fingard

Ed. Note: The author of this article has made enquiries and investigation as to whether inter-breeding is deleterious; and the foremost authorities claim that it definitely is not, provided both animals are sound.

With few exceptions, man and dog are very similar physiologically. Diseases in man and dog, with few exceptions, are likewise similar.

Dog, like man, is omnivorous. Therefore, the same scientific dietetic rules are applicable to man and dog in relation to nutritional requirements—vitamins and calories.

The following evidence which has been acquired through research work will prove these contentions conclusively.

The evidence has been obtained from the world's leading nutritionists' recent publications.

The history of dog's scientific feeding and care of puppy and adult dog is taken from a book published by Wesley Mills, M.A., M.D., D.V.S., etc., Professor of Physiology in the Faculty of Human Medicine, and in the Faculty of Comparative Medicine and Veterinary Science of McGill University, Montreal; Lecturer of Cynology in the latter Faculty; author of *Animal Physiology, Comparative Physiology, etc.* (The writer feeds all puppies from four weeks of age four times daily, one quart of milk, in addition to which cow's milk, whole, is left for them to lap day and night. Puppies from six to twelve months are fed three times daily, and from there on, irrespective of age, twice daily.)

"Dogs, like other animals, require more food and a larger proportion of fatty food in winter than in summer; and to feed a dog but once a day during the severe weather of winter seems little short of cruelty in the larger proportion of cases." (Professor Mills.)

In the scientific world it is the writer's opinion that the work of Professor Mills is a splendid contribution to both medical and veterinarian sciences.

The experience of the writer is based on many years of scientific feeding and breeding, from which it is believed a world record has been established in Great Dane litters, and the rearing of champion Great Danes which have won against the best competition on the North American continent.

The information herein contained should be of paramount importance to man and dog alike.

This article is not to be construed as a thorough and complete scientific formula on the feeding, health, and care of dogs. I am merely endeavouring to give breeders and owners of pets the salient points and basic fundamentals, for in some six to seven years, we have

not had one case of distemper, or lost one pup or adult dog through illness.

With none of our friends and helpers among the lower animals would we part so reluctantly as with the dog. No speechless associate of man has ever so entwined itself around the very roots of our domestic life as the dog; none has won so much admiration, confidence and affection, none has appealed to so large a number of mankind of every condition, age and sex. It will therefore be conceded that so noble, so intelligent, and so faithful an animal as the dog is entitled to the most complete understanding and the best usage of which we are capable.

The individual that can see nothing to admire in the dog is surely defective either by nature or by education—in fact, a sort of human monstrosity.

The professional treatment of the dog in disease naturally falls to the veterinarian; but inasmuch as this animal is very different in his nature from the horse and other herbivora (vegetarians) which engage the chief attention of the veterinary profession, it follows that if the dog is to be treated on a rational basis, he must be made a subject of special study by the veterinarian. A knowledge of equine medicine goes but a little way to qualify a man to treat the dog, and the sooner this is recognized by the profession of comparative (veterinary) medicine, the better it will be for both the profession and our canine friends.

The dog must be understood in health before his ailments can be well appreciated and treated, and the more intelligent body of breeders and owners of dogs thoroughly realize this.

The subject has been carefully studied

by Charles Darwin, and no better treatment has been given it than may be found in his work, *"Animals and Plants Under Domestication"*. Briefly, the origin of the dog has been referred to the following sources: All the various breeds of dogs are believed by some to have descended from some single wild species of animal, while others hold that the evidence of descent from several is stronger. Some think the dog has been derived from several species, extinct and recent, more or less mingled. Some would refer the dog to the wolf, the jackal, or some unknown extinct species.

No view of the origin of the dog can be considered as proved; nevertheless, some are much more probable than others. Very few would now hold to a theory—at one time more acceptable—that all the principal varieties of dogs were derived from a distinct wild ancestral species.

In favor of the view that the dogs of the present and the past historical period were derived from several, or, at all events, more than one wild species, may be mentioned the following:

1. The great difference, especially in form, of the different breeds of dogs.
2. At the most anciently known historical period several breeds existed resembling wild breeds then living.

Breeds of dogs allied to greyhounds are figured on Egyptian monuments between 3400 B.C. and 2100 B.C., though there is evidence that besides these breeds there were, thousands of years before our time, pariah dogs, turnspits, etc., which bear no small resemblance to the breeds of the present day; but there is not evidence to prove that these sub-varieties are identical with those of the present time. But long before the historical period in Europe there is evi-

dence that man possessed the dog. The resemblance of dogs, in different parts of the world, to wild species of animals, is suggestive of a multiple origin, i.e., an origin from several wild stocks. Considering man's sociable nature, the tendency of many wild species resembling our dogs to hunt in packs — which animals are more readily tamed — the attempt to tame the young of such species can be readily understood, and its success would be followed by fresh attempts as soon as it was perceived how useful they might be in the chase, which was the chief occupation of primitive and uncivilized man.

"There is equally good evidence to believe that some breeds of dogs are to be referred to the jackal. Upon the whole, it would seem probable that 'the domestic dogs of the world are descended from two well-known defined species of wolf (viz., *Canis lupus* and *Canis latrans*) and from two or three other doubtful species (namely, the European, Indian, and North African wolves); from at least two South American canine species; from several races or species of jackal; and perhaps from one or more extinct species.' (Darwin.)

The Rearing of Puppies

A large proportion of the worries and discouragements, as well as the pleasure and successes, of the breeders of dogs have their source in puppies.

Certainly all the arrangements should be made with a full realization of possible dangers and their prevention, rather than of dosing with medicines. The breeder who does not act on this principle will not be a success; and the practitioner of canine medicines, like his colleague in human medicine, is discharging his highest functions when he advises so as to prevent evils which, in a good proportion of cases, he can but imperfectly remedy.

Weaning Puppies

So long as the puppies and the bitch are prospering fully, they should not be separated. It but rarely happens, however, that a pure-bred bitch can suckle puppies longer than four or five weeks without immediate or future detriment to herself especially, and not seldom must the dam be helped in her duties after the third week. This should be done very gradually, for the change from mother's milk to any other food implies a grave strain on these delicate stomachs.

The only suitable first food of the puppy is, of course, that most like what he has had—viz., milk—and, practically, this must be cow's milk. Experience shows that this can not at first be given undiluted, NOT because it is richer than bitch's milk, for the following table shows that the latter far exceeds most other kinds of milk in nutritive qualities—but because the stomach, etc., can not at once adapt itself to the new food.

especially since errors in feeding are responsible for a large proportion of the ills to which dogs are liable.

So that the whole subject may be grasped in a rational manner, we remind the reader of certain well-established physiological principles.

All foodstuffs for animals are divisible into:

1. Organic
 - (1) Nitrogenous
 - (a) albumens
 - (b) albuminous (as gelatin)
 - (2) non-nitrogenous
 - (a) carbohydrates (sugars, starches)
 - (b) fats
- (2) Non-nitrogenous
2. Inorganic
 - (1) Water
 - (2) Salts

Every animal to remain in health must have all of the above in its diet, as has been abundantly proved by experiments — i.e., the food must be **CHEMICALLY** adequate.

It is well-known that nearly all animals, and certainly all dogs, will accept milk with avidity. Milk is a perfect food because it meets all the above requirements. It is what Nature has provided for all young mammals.

A question much debated is the frequency of feeding. Should an adult dog be fed only once, twice, or oftener, during the day? To all such questions no categorical answer can be given. It has been said that the dog's stomach is large and his digestion slow.

The dog's stomach is rather large as compared with man's, but the rapidity of his digestion depends greatly on a variety of circumstances.

The argument from the wild carnivora is not worth much, since their mode of life is very different from that of the dog at the present time. More reliable instruction may be got from a study of ourselves.

So far as the feeding of packs of hounds and large kennels is concerned, convenience, rather than any exact study of the question, has probably determined that the dogs shall be fed but once in twenty-four hours.

In some of the gravest troubles to which the dog is subject, food and the surroundings of the patient are of infinitely more importance than medicine.

When a dog is rapidly losing flesh and strength, if he will not eat he should have small quantities of suitable food forced down his throat every hour or so.

The almost entire absence of teeth, as in the Turkish dog, is to be regarded in the light of defective development, as also the lack of hair in the Mexican hairless variety.

THE GRIFFON

By L. M. Wood

The Griffon Bruxellois (including Griffon Belge and Petit Brabancon), as its name implies, is essentially a Belgian breed.

The original Griffon resembled a small terrier, half Barbet, half Griffon, any color, with a silky tuft on the head and pointed muzzle.

About 1880 people began the selection of the breed by crossing in the pug. This shortened the muzzle, producing the undershot jaw, and broadened the skull. The body was made cleaner in outline. This crossing gave birth to the short-haired variety, called Petit Brabancon, which was not admitted at first. All short-haired pups were eliminated at birth. However, when the practical advantage of the short-haired dog was recognized, the Petit Brabancon was allowed, giving roughs and smooths in the same classes.

Few breeds possess such an original facial expression. The Griffon Bruxellois are the astonishment and admiration of all who see them, more monkey than dog you might say, with their charm, gentleness and that human expression in their faces which makes them unique in the canine world.

The most typical specimens have broad black rings round their eyes and long eye-lashes. When they have small semi-erect black ears, obligatory black masks in an entirely red ensemble, the result is worth a lot but, as most ears are cropped this side of the Atlantic, they have not been bred for the desired small British ear. Tails are cut at the second joint.

Weights have run from three pounds to twelve pounds, all sizes turning up in a litter. It is not wise to breed from a female under seven pounds as the litters are large for such a small breed, running four to seven pups.

With the roughs the coat requires stripping twice a year. This should be done only with the fingers.

As house pets they are ideal, their intelligence is almost human, they are a hardy toy if not pampered and make good guards.

They prefer the company of their own kind and several males will live to-

DONATION OF STATION WAGON AND WHEEL CHAIR BY ASSOCIATED CANINE CLUBS OF EDMONTON

An impressive ceremony took place on Wednesday afternoon at the Colonel Mewburn Pavilion University Hospital, Edmonton, Alberta, when Mary D. Gardner, on behalf of the Associated Canine Club of Edmonton, presented Harold L. Weir, chairman of the War Services Council and associate editor of the "Edmonton Bulletin", with a station wagon and a wheel chair, the latter a folding type suitable for carrying in the wagon. The wagon and chair will be used by convalescent veterans.

The different clubs banded together for the occasion—The Edmonton Kennel Club; The English Cocker Spaniel Club of Alberta, and the English Bull Dog Club of Western Canada. They were represented at the ceremony by Mrs. J. S. Grant on behalf of the English Cocker Spaniel Club, Mrs. Glover representing the English Bull Dog Club, Mr. A. E. Figg, President of the Edmonton Kennel Club, Mrs. R. E. Austin, a member of the Canine Club committee, and Mrs. Alice Marr, a member of the same committee.

Edmonton citizens supported the Canine Club's drive for funds to the extent of more than \$2,991. Mrs. Gardner stated that the money not yet expended had been set aside for entertainment of the veterans. A dog show and raffle held this spring, and a tag day under the sponsorship of Mrs. Allen Ayerst, were the methods used to raise the necessary funds.

In 1941, Mrs. Norma Austin, Mrs. Alice Marr, Mrs. Gladys Morton and Mrs. Mary D. Gardner, all of Edmonton, formed a club known as the Lord Mayors Stork Club, with a view to furnishing layettes and clothing for British babies and children, who were in dire need of these things due to the blitz on England. They held their first show the following Easter and raised \$472 for the above purpose. The next spring they also put on an All-breed show and raised the sum of \$900 and donated this amount to the Milk For Britain Fund. The next spring the entire proceeds of their show was donated to Madam Chiang Kai Shek for the Chinese War Relief amounting to \$1,100. In the fall of the same year the Edmonton Kennel Club donated to the Edmonton Navy mothers \$250. Now the above combination represents just what the Edmonton people did, and are doing. Great credit is due them individually and collectively for they certainly have done nobly and long may they be spared to continue their efforts. It is just such gestures that advertise Canadians as being second to none when DUTY CALLS.

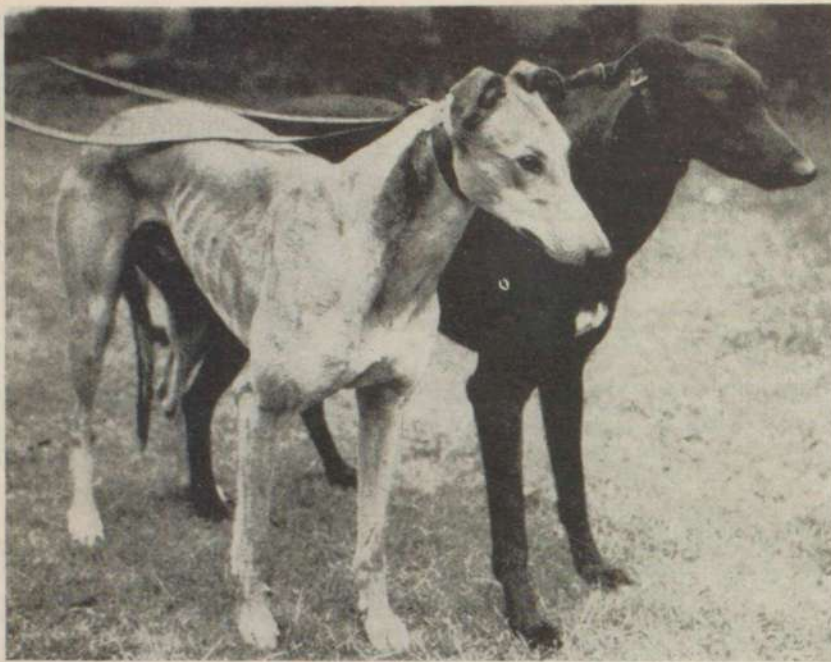
