Temperament in The German Shepherd Dog

AT the Canadian National Exhibition this year, one of the highlights of the Horse Show will be the Drill Team composed completely of German Shepherd dogs which, with their owners, will demonstrate Obedience training in mass formation. This Drill Team, sponsored by the members of the German Shepherd Dog Breeders' Association of Canada, has appeared in many cities both in Canada and the United States, and its inclusion as a feature of the Canadian National Exhibition is surely the highest honour that could be paid to the breeders and owners of these dogs. We are very fortunate in having a group of Canadians who are so enamoured of their breed that they have used this method to show the public that a pure-bred dog is not only valuable for its good breeding but for its intelligence.

The best testimonial any breed has is the character of its backers, and the German Shepherd dog has been most fortunate in having supporters of the highest characters. In addition to the above Club there is the German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada, now in its 27th year.

Throughout the years, it has often been difficult for these breeders to keep the name of the German Shepherd dog on a high plane. After the First Great War, one could find a "police dog" or a dog which evenly resembled "Strongheart", the great dog of the silent movie days, in the back yards. The boys brought puppies of every size and description back from Germany with them, telling at times the most fantastic tales of intelligence and heroism of these dogs which were used by the Germans for war work. expected, many of these dogs were cross bred, and as a result, the country was flooded with mediocre specimens, for they were prolific breeders and sold for fancy prices to the public.

Untold publicity was given to the fact that the dogs were known in England as Alsatian Wolf dogs, and many were the stories told of the so-called "police dog" being crossed with wolves. As a result, if a child was bitten and the dog remotely resembled a police dog the cry went up to have the breed destroyed.

Some fifteen years ago, when the writer was a reporter for the Toronto Evening Telegram, there was an epidemic of dog biting during an extremely hot summer. One day in particular, a newspaper carried a full page of photographs showing the wolves behind the cages in the Riverdale Zoo, Toronto, and on the same page were pictures of so-called German Shepherd dogs. The public was invited to note the similarity between the dogs and the wolves.

Fortunately, the City Editor of The Telegram was a sensible person and we were able to refute the wild stories that were being published in other newspapers. This was but one of the many storms that the German Shepherd dog breeders had to weather.

Some very beautiful specimens were imported from Germany and the majority of these dogs did not understand our language. They were highly trained in police work, and as was to

be expected, were bewildered by the strange surroundings and the strange language. Occasionally, a dog would bite the judge or shy away from the stranger whom they, naturally, distrusted. To overcome this, the German Shepherd breeders introduced into the standard of the breed the temperament test. It did not matter how many good scoring points in conformation the dog possessed, if he showed the least timidity or aggressiveness he was promptly disqualified. Slowly but surely the shy and nervous Shepherd disappeared from the show rings. Obedience Trials were then coming to the fore, and it was the German Shepherd which proved its intelligence by scoring at most of the Trials.

Gradually, other breeds came in but it is rarely one attends a big Trial without finding a good percentage of the Shepherds amongst those competing.

It is doubtful if any breed of dog was developed as conscientiously in America and Canada. In 1928, or thereabouts, German Shepherd experts were brought from Germany to travel to all the principal cities in Canada and the United States where they examined and rated the dogs and gave valuable information as to the methods needed to improve the breed and the temperament. Today, therefore, one does not see people shy away when they see a German Shepherd dog approaching them on the street. The old bogey of "wolf dog" has completely disappeared.

Know Your Breed ...

Ideal Height:

Dogs, 25 inches;

Females, 23 inches at shoulder.

Weight: Dogs, between 75 and 85 lbs.

Females, between 60 and 70 lbs.

THE German Shepherd Dog has remained one of the truest to its type, even though its ancestry can be traced back to the Early Bronze Age, where 6000 years ago it was used as an aid to man in an endeavour to protect his flocks, property and family.

The popularity of the breed lies not only in its extreme intelligence, but also in its ability to work endlessly without becoming physically exhausted. It can be used for so many different types of work—sheep herding, bringing in cattle from the range, trailing, retrieving on both land and water, as a pack dog or sentry. But, perhaps, its greatest gift to humanity is its ability to help and lead the blind.

The true German Shepherd dogs are most happy when serving man in some capacity or another. During the past two World Wars, they rendered valuable service, not only as messengers in the war zones, but as untiring assistants in searching for people pinned beneath the debris of bombed buildings. They also aided the Red Cross in taking supplies to almost inaccessible points.

It is a beautiful animal; alert, and the look of nobility it bears is apparent at all times. Just as the Greyhound is built for racing, the structure of the German Shepherd has been developed so that the dog can cover the maximum amount of ground, its muscles co-ordinating to give a smooth rhythm to its long, effortless trot.

The first impression of a good German Shepherd Dog is that of a strong, agile, well-muscled animal, alert and full of life. It should both be and appear to be well-balanced, with harmonious development of the forequarter and hindquarter. The dog should appear to the eye, and actually be, longer than tall; deep-bodied, and presenting an outline of smooth curves rather than corners. It should look substantial and not spindly, giving the impression, both at rest and in motion, of muscular fitness and nimbleness without any look of clumsiness or soft living.

The Mechanical Age in Retrievers

YEAR after year as the Retriever Trial season rolls around I cannot help but wonder what new and complicated tests will be given to try out the mechanical ability of our dogs. I use the word "mechanical" because that is exactly what we are developing. Our field trials call for precision in every performance and they do not care from which end of the leash it comes. In fact, so many tests are given today that call for a great deal more from the handler than the dog; it is just like putting the cart before the horse, or keeping a dog and doing the barking yourself. Such tests have forced the trainer to train his dogs to act only under the complete command; they have only to deviate a yard or two from the desired line and the whistle and arms come into play. The dog is not allowed to quarter his ground as is the correct way for a Retriever to work; he is not permitted to show his natural ability in hunting out a fall. The handler knows that if he does allow his dog this privilege no matter how methodically he may be hunting his area, it is against him in the book. Yet, what would give greater pleasure to a Retriever man than to watch a dog bring to the fore that keen, natural ability that puts the hall mark of excellence on all his work? It is indeed to be regretted that this type of work is so seldom seen or called for in our trials. A great deal of what belongs to the dog has been placed in the handler's hands. It might even be more beneficial to have a trainer with a Retriever's instincts and a Retriever with a trainer's mind. I am sure a more artificial performance could not be demonstrated.

So many handlers and owners have become highly delighted with the manner in which Retrievers are handled today. They even brag about how their dogs will go in a straight line for one hundred and fifty yards without turning their heads unless stopped by the whistle. These dogs would give a good account of themselves on a Greyhound track. It is nice to be able to push a dog out that distance when required, but this is seldom called for. It may happen when duck shooting, but even then it is more likely that a boat would be sent for such a bird. In a walk-up it would be a nonsensical thing to do, because of disturbing game that would be far out of range. Ninety-five percent of your work with a Retriever is accomplished within gun range; only when the shoot is over should one handle a dog to distant falls—the less whistling and handling done during a shoot will put more birds in your bag. I am sure there is nothing that will bring down more righteous wrath on a handler's head from his fellow gunners than one who insists on blowing his whistle and wav-

ing his arms to pick up a stray duck while the flight is on. The same applies in the corn field when some handlers will send their dogs out far ahead to pick up a downed bird; yet, they will do this even though they are walking in the same direction as the fall.

Our field trials have given a very good account of themselves and have placed in the hands of countless hunters dogs that they would not have otherwise owned. This, in turn, has contributed much to the conservation of game; there are fewer cripples and dead birds left behind than there used to be when so many hunters went out without dogs. I do believe, however, that we could contribute much more through trials if we confined the work to something more in keeping with hunting conditions. It is still a popular cry in the gallery at our trials, "That dog would be no use to me where I shoot! I would never get a shot if I had to whistle and handle him to his falls." This is very true, and the more we train our dogs to depend on that whistle and direction, the more helpless they are going to become, and it is going to show up most definitely in our breeding. We cannot expect the offspring of mechanical parents to show much natural ability. Those natural instincts will be bred out through lack of development in the parents. To keep our dogs from looking like complete mechanical nit-wits, we will have to go down the river and breed to the old river rat whose natural ability has been given full scope; then, and only then, will we get back to the old type of Retriever who has a head and knows how to use it.

We may love our dogs, but we give them very little credit when we think it is necessary to guide their every move. The old adage of, "when in doubt, trust your dog", seems to have died a silent death with the introduction of scientific training. To be able to give a dog direction out to a fall is a great asset, but I do think that we should make it the exception, instead of the rule. We should encourage and protect that which took our great grandfathers years of breeding to produce, natural ability. We will most surely lose it if we continue to monopolize those hunting instincts that go to make the Retriever one of conservation's greatest friends.

Just to quote a few incidents where the mechanical ability of our scientifically trained dogs show up most clearly, I draw your attention to a very common mistake witnessed at field trials. This has happened to me more than once. A pair of marked birds are shot and the dog has no difficulty in locating his first bird, which he brings smartly to hand. On the second bird, the handler, in case the dog has not marked it too well, lines up his dog

in what he considers to be a direct line to the fall, but he has made a slight miscalculation; however, the dog has been trained that he takes the given line and finishes up too far to the right or left of the fall—that is truly mechanical guidance. In such incidences you will hear such remarks as this: "That handler made a mistake. He didn't give his dog the right line. Can't he mark his birds better than that?" And perhaps several other uncomplimentary remarks. In the first place, why does the handler have to line up his dog with such finality on marked birds? Because our field trial judges are only interested in an accurate race to and from the fall. Therefore, the handler does everything in his power to reduce the possibility of his dog not having pinned his bird correctly. If he goes straight to the fall, picks up his bird and makes a smart return, great applause is given for a wonderful piece of dog work. Yet, there was no dog work attached to the performance.

To really see a Retriever at work is to watch one with a fair conception of the fall put his nose down and work out the area. Too often today we see dogs miss their fall and keep right on going — showing they have no idea of the area in which the bird lies. A great deal of this comes from over-handling and never allowing the dog to develop his natural hunting instincts, he has just come to depend upon his handler to stop him when he is wrong. If the whistle does not blow, he keeps on going. The other types will go out a few yards then turn and look for help. Both types are pathetically out of place as Retrievers. Compare the dog that has had a lot of bird work but has not been trained to handle to the same extent as our field trial dogs, and you will find that if he has not marked the exact position of the fall he will hit the area and hunt it out methodically. There are not wild cruises, there is not the looking for help; he knows he is in the vicinity and if the bird is on the ground, he will get it. If you send him out for a bird he has not seen fall, just give him the direction and watch him work out that ground. He will do it, suiting his pace to his nose and the cover. If he picks up a trail and over-runs it, he will immediately correct himself by falling back to place of origin. In such work, this is where you see the dog perform and not the handler. It is beautiful to watch a Retriever bring all his natural instincts to bear and work out these knotty problems of bird finding. Every true Retriever man gets a great thrill watching this type of Retriever at work, and it is the only type of work that is his true heritage. We cannot bring up the argument that this cannot be followed at field trials,

because the first paragraph in the American Kennel Club book of rules reads: "The purpose of a non-slip Retriever trial is to determine the relative merits of Retrievers in the field." Retriever field trials should, therefore, simulate as nearly as possible the conditions met in an ordinary day's shoot. I know from experience, that if one did handle at a shoot as one does at a field trial it would be the first and last invitation — we would be enemy number one. We cannot blame our dogs if they go out 80 or 100 yards before hunting. After all, our birds at trials are dropped about that distance and even further, so naturally we train for these long distance jobs. To get our dogs to work close on a bird that they had not seen fall would be much more difficult than getting him to do the half mile.

When a dog is fortunate enough to get a runner at field trials, people really do appreciate his fine job of work in running him down, yet, they fail to appreciate or even see the beauty of a dog hunting out his dead bird. They think that he should just go straight to it; to them, this is no problem. However, they fail to realize that the dog is getting an entirely different perspective of the fall than they are, and if he has a fair conception of the fall the natural worker will bring his natural instincts to bear in locating. In so doing, one is given the opportunity of watching a master at work and not just an implement of man's creation.

Our field trial dogs are exhibitionists, which is what the public calls for—the handler has become a showman. To gain all this, we have had to ignore all the finer points of the sport and cater to the extremists. If we fail to accomplish any of the man-made tests, no matter how impractical they may be, our dog is marked down as a poor, or at best, just a fair example of a Retriever.

Our method of training has removed many factors that are so important in the training of dogs. There is no longer time for that congeniality between man and dog that does so much to cement complete understanding. This congeniality permitted each to have mutual privileges and obligations which helped us to arrive at an ideal relationship. The removal of the essentials has severed that relationship and left an abyss that is not in the best interests of the sport or a credit to us. The dog knows nothing intimate about us now other than our moods, which I am sure he must find as changeable and confusing as the weather. It is mass production with a capital P.

We are a unique body, for no matter to what so-called peak of perfection we may reach we will never be satisfied. This has been proved through the last fifteen years that I have been associated with field trials in this country. We started off at a moderate pace. Then it became a canter; now it is a wild gallop to out-wit the dog. As he masters each and every test a new one

is introduced and they become more and more complicated and impractical.

I know that I am responsible for direction in this country, also the whistle. But when I first saw the whistle and direction used, it was at Sheep Dog Trials in England and Scotland, where it was used as we are now using it in Retriever trials. Every move of the Sheep Dog was controlled by the whistle. This had to be, as the dogs had to guide the sheep through several obstacles in their proper order; therefore, it was necessary for the dog to be under complete mechanical guidance. I was much impressed with the manner in which these dogs responded to their handlers, so I tried it out on some young Labradors that I owned at that time. It worked extremely well and I did, through over enthusiasm, over handle. However, that was not for long. I soon learned from much older Retriever men that the mechanical dog was not regarded as the acme of perfection, for the many reasons I have stated earlier in this article. These men had been handling Retrievers for years, and knew that to take away the natural ability from the dog was to reduce its ability as a game finder. However, they did admit that to give this added training was a very useful contribution, provided it was used as the exception and not as the rule.

When I came to this country and practised this method, it was frowned upon. I was told by more than one judge that it was the one thing they had against me in handling Retrievers—but now, after fifteen years, these same judges are among our greatest critics. You could easily go from the near top to a Certificate of Merit, because your dog did not approach his bird from the correct side of a bush or perhaps a blade of grass. I have watched all these changes take place; hence, the reason I feel that I am in a position to use the word extremist.

It has been interesting to note that those who were so much against handling in the early days, did not at any time take the middle track. They followed the herd and made a clean jump from one extreme to the other. At no time did they show any desire to hit the happy medium. If they had, they could be among our more able judges today, because I still feel that the majority of our judges are willing to be shown. This is quite evident if you are a regular attendant of Retriever trials. A new test springs from someone's fertile brain and it will be taken up and practised all over the country. I think this shows a very flexible state of affairs and that our judges are open to suggestion. It would only take a handful of those who get several judging assignments each year and who prefer the more natural Retriever work against the mechanical ability of the other, to bring a more modified version of the sport to the notice of all. I am sure that once it was introduced, all but those with a one-track mind would acknowledge and accept the changes as a step in the right direction, and one that would do much

to bring to the fore the natural ability and instincts that give the Retriever his name.

We have heard this remark made at field trials when a group get together to discuss the work of the various dogs. "So and so has not made a mistake so far, but he'll be caught before the day is out. These judges like handling and they will give a stiff blind for the last series, and so and so does not like to be handled." Here is a case of pinning a good-natural Retriever to the boards and making him look like a fool; whereas, all through the trial he has been making the mechanical dog look like a book student against a practical performer. But it is sad to say that the bookworm will overthrow his opponent in this one test. The natural worker will be thrown out completely on his failure to handle, all his good work through the trial will stand for naught. If he could take his opponents to a duck marsh, he would really make them look like a pantie waist putting in his first day as a lumber jack; he would out-wit them every time as a game finder and the beauty underlying the teamwork between the owner and dog is that the dog knows his work and the owner is perfectly aware of it. We cannot give a Retriever his head one day and expect him to be our mechanical tool the next. Since we are extremists, we cannot deviate from the beaten path with any hope of success; our dogs would either go hog wild or look pathetically to us for help. It would be very much like teaching a child to walk. So long as they have our support they make progress, but when we move this support they collapse, helpless to accomplish by themselves, the job for which they were bred, simply because we have taken over and refused to develop their greatest asset, natural ability.

When we do get a dog that makes an attempt to solve a situation his own way, he is given a few extra hours on the parade ground. Man will not tolerate a mere dog disputing his supernatural ability in game finding—we have fooled the dog to such an extent that it is now easy to see, through his helplessness, that he really thinks we can beat him at his own game. We have all been fooled many times by other people, and we have fooled other people. But how could we ever come to the conclusion that we could fool ourselves into thinking that the mechanical Retriever is a better worker than the natural performer? It may be because we are living in a mechanical age and have been instilled with the urge to have a materialistic control over our dumb friends, or some day the medical world might, while exploring through our intricate make-up, find that we still have animal substance clinging to some small cleft in our cranium. Whatever the answer may be, I hope for our own peace of mind, it will give us a legitimate excuse for ignoring and abusing the natural qualifications which were born and bred into our Retrievers.

Over-Fatness in Dogs

An over-fat dog is unsightly as well as being unhealthy.

Although no animal can live unless its body contains a certain amount of fat or substances derived from fat, it is a disadvantage to be excessively fat. Fat is necessary for the production of energy in the form of heat to keep the body warm, and in the form of work such as muscular exercise. The normal proportion of fat or fatty products in the body of a domesticated dog in a generally good condition is about 12 per cent of its body-weight. It is when the proportion exceeds this amount and the accumulation of fat under the skin becomes abnormally great that the question of over-fatness comes in. Warm-blooded animals are able to store under the skin of their bodies any fat that they obtain in, or manufacture from, their food over and above what is required for their immediate use. This fat, in addition to being a stock in reserve that can be drawn upon in case of need, as in starvation, acts also as an insulating cover to keep the body warm. Thus, when in moderation, this store of fat, commonly called subcutaneous or adipose tissue, serves a two-fold purpose and is exceedingly useful. Fat, compared with other energy-producing substances, takes up a small amount of space, and, consequently, is a very convenient store of energy. It is when it is present in an excessive quantity that over-fatness with the accompanying troubles results.

During the period of growth in mammals, although all parts of the animal gradually increase in size, they do not all increase at the same rate. It is well known how large the head of a puppy is at birth compared with its body, and how the relative proportions alter as the youngster grows, completely changing its appearance. At first the bony frame or skeleton makes the most rapid growth, then the muscles develop and the shape that the body will ultimately assume begins to be more clearly seen. Lastly, when there has been considerable growth of bone and flesh, the body becomes

rounded off with a moderate amount of fat. This is the normal method of growth. Over-fatness is the condition that results when the amount of fat that is laid down is excessive, and it may occur at any age. It is, however, more usual to find it in older dogs than in puppies, as these require their food for growth and play. They rarely have any food to spare for producing excess of fat.

Over-fatness may be brought about in several ways, of which by far the chief is the feeding of too large a proportion of carbohydrate compared with the other constituents of the food, or, what amounts to the same thing, too large a proportion of cereal. It may also be caused by giving too much food altogether, even if the proportions of the constituents are correctly adjusted. More food may thus be consumed than is required to maintain health and also growth, if the dog is still at the growing age. While an animal can store an excess of fat fed as such in its food, fat cannot be completely oxidized in its body unless there is a sufficient amount of carbohydrate. Therefore, since excess of carbohydrate is the chief cause of over-fatness, too much fat in the food should also be avoided. It should be remembered, however, that animal fat is a source of the fat soluble vitamins. Failure of the secretion of certain of the glands is another cause of over-fatness. As to this, there may be an inherited tendency or one acquired by some other influence.

It is easier to prevent a dog from becoming too fat than it is to cure him. This abnormal condition, as we have seen, is brought about by his having too much food of the energy-producing type for his immediate needs. Either less of this kind of food should be consumed or more energy expended. Thus, when the food is properly balanced, the natural way to keep down fat is to eat less food or take more exercise. Exercise may whet the appetite, but it should not be difficult to regulate the quantity of food satisfactorily. To cut out or reduce fat-producing substances in a food that is already balanced merely leads to trouble in other directions. Under all circumstances, the vitamin content of

the food should be maintained. If a dog is found to be carrying too much fat, for a time, until normal, the food should be given moist and bulky, not dry and concentrated. A larger amount of bulky food, even if a fair proportion of it is water, will make the dog feel more satisfied than a smaller quantity of dry concentrated food, though the actual amount of nourishment in each may be the same. Water cannot be converted into fat. The same effect may be accomplished by feeding on food that is less digestible, providing that too large a quantity is not incorporated in the diet so that digestive trouble ensues. It has also been recommended to feed a smaller amount of food, but at more frequent intervals. The composition of the food should be gone into, the balance checked, and, if necessary, the proportion of protein to carbohydrate and fat increased. In addition to the fat-soluble vitamins A and D, an adequate supply of the water-soluble vitamin B is very necessary, as lack of this vitamin tends to over-fatness. Meat is a good source of vitamin B, as well as of protein. When there is too small an amount of protein and too much fat or carbohydrate in the food, the tendency to store fat at the expense of muscle is encouraged.

It is common knowledge that the same kind of food may have divers effects when fed to different dogs. A restless, active dog that takes a lot of exercise will not put on fat in the same way as another that is fond of rest and sleep. Strength of bone and development of muscle are in opposition to storage of fat. The best way, therefore, to prevent over-fatness is to feed the dog with a moderate, but sufficient quantity of a properly balanced food, coupled with a reasonable amount of exercise.

Field Trials in Alberta

Just in case you may think we are loafing, I wish to remind you that we have been anything but idle. First, we ran our Calgary Pointing breeds trials in the usual way that we have run them for the past twenty years, but, shortage of Hungarian Partridge has made a big difference in the last few years. These birds are coming back and we hope to be able to have the dogs find and show the usual class again. May 8th., several of the Calgary enthusiasts of Retrieving breeds took a few dogs and put on a demonstration followed by an amateur trial to show the Drumheller Club, as requested, how it is done. Now they are away and have applied for a championship point trial on Sept. 18th. Some mighty good dogs and some good handling came to light from the city of Drumheller and District. Next, the boys at Ponoka put on an amateur trial to get going. They brought out some very good stuff, and now have already run their first point trial. On May 21st and 22nd, Edmonton in their anxiety to win extra championship points, put on a double header with the result that it worked, and two of the Northern dogs finished their F. T. Championship, namely, Crailing Dan 2nd., and Crailing Dick. The following Sunday, the Ponoka Sporting Dog Club held their licensed point trial, which would have been a credit to any club, and handled very nicely on a well laid out ground. Mel. McCoy, President of the new club, and R. F. Galvin the Secretary, with their field committee, and the Field Marshal, Miller Houston, deserve a lot of credit for this, their first attempt. The Judges were selected, being Glenn Williams of Calgary, W. R. Brownlee of Edmonton, and C. Lewis a local man who seems very promising. I will not mention the awards of the above trials, as I believe they have been sent in and published.

At Calgary, on June 5th, again the Amateur Handlers Sanctioned Retrieving Trials were held and there seemed to be more real enjoyment among the handlers than any retriever trials I have ever seen. Four ladies took

part in it to show off their favorite dog, and three of them were in the money. Over fifty dogs were entered and the Judges for Retrievers were J. M. (Jack) Miller, Ken Morgan, and Floyd Mitchel. Spaniels: Glenn Williams, John Breckenridge, and Norman Godlonton, and they all seemed as interested and conscientious as if a thousand dollars were at stake. The Club's definition of an Amateur at this trial was: A dog that had never been placed in open competition at a Championship Point Trial and handled by anyone who had never placed a dog to win points in a Licensed Championship trial. In some cases these dogs were handled by a member of the family owning the dog, but, in most cases were handled by the owner, who will use him when hunting to save the crippled bird.

The Amateur Championship Trophy was won by R. Niblett of Cambria, Alberta, with his Black Labrador Monty. A direct result of the demonstration at Drumheller on May 8th.

An Open All-Age Spaniel stake was also run and it looks like the Spaniels slipped badly as we did not get enough for a point trial. However, the competition went on and awards went to: 1st, Plain Punch—G. W. Tomlinson. 2nd, Tarzan of Grainger's—A. E. Hay. 3rd, Plain Spotty—Floyd Mitchel.

The windup of the Alberta Spring Trials finished last Sunday, June 26th, with the Calgary Championship point trial for Retrievers. This was held at Chestermere Lake, twelve miles east of Calgary. Over sixty entries faced the judges who were Glenn Williams, Jack Miller, and Doral Pilling. These fellows judged the entire show which lasted from 7 a.m. till 9 p.m. and it looks like we may be forced to make it a two-day trial if this keeps up. The team work we have in our Calgary Club is very gratifying. Even the women are pitching in to help. Would like to mention the names who make up this wonderful team, but space will not permit.

You will notice that eight trials have been held in Alberta during the months of May and June. I personally attended every trial. In fact, I have not missed one anywhere in Alberta for many years. I still wonder sometimes what my real duties are as Field Trial Representative for the C.K.C. I've done a lot of beefing, as some call it, but, this seems to have gotten results. I have striven to keep everything along the lines of an ordinary day's shoot, as suggested in C.K.C. rules. Also, to keep as uniform as possible in the way of entry fees and prize money to give the younger clubs a chance. I do hope that none of our clubs will try to break this down by trying to get too high and mighty. Uniformity of judging should be encouraged, and I would suggest that instead of using three judges, including two green judges, who can and have upset the decision of the expert judge, we should have only one good man and only one green man who knows he must learn. In that way, new judges will come up and be better with the teaching of the expert.

The Fall circuit for Alberta has been arranged and approved, starting with Edmonton on Sept. 11th; Drumheller, Sept. 18th; Ponoka, Sept. 25th; Calgary, Oct. 2nd and Brooks, Oct. 9th.

Calgary will also hold an amateur handlers' Trial before the beginning of the open Fall circuit. I believe some of the other clubs will do likewise. A convention is being arranged for delegates from all Alberta clubs in an effort to standardize everything and discuss the possibility of a National Championship Retriever Trial.

Eggs are Good Food for Dogs

EGGs are exceedingly good food for dogs of all breeds, and of all ages. As a rule they cause no digestive disturbance, and they provide a prime source of nourishment. There is scarcely a dog of any kind that does not take readily to them.

They can be given a wide variety of ways: beaten up raw and mixed with milk, coddled, that is, dipped into boiling water and left immersed until the water cools; boiled three minutes; poached; scrambled with a bit of milk added; or boiled hard. When fed in the last recommended form, they should be simmered very slowly for at least 20 minutes, when they will be found more tender and easily digestible than when boiled more actively for a shorter time. Minced finely with a fork, then, and salted, they prove very attractive and palatable.

As far as the total digestibility of the egg is concerned, cooked egg is much more completely assimilated, hence more nutritious than raw egg. It is claimed that the uncooked white of the egg cannot be thoroughly digested, and that cooking destroys the digestive hindrance. This has been proved again and again by feeding raw eggs and cooked eggs to dogs known to be affected with digestive weaknesses, the raw egg being vomited where the cooked egg will be kept down. In the presence of normal digestive functioning the raw egg will in most cases be retained by the stomach and not vomited, but nevertheless it is not as entirely nutritious as the cooked egg.

Collie Club News

THAT band of go-getters—Eastern Ontario Collie Club—have raised Five Hundred Dollars for prizes at their Specialty Show on October the 15th. Dr. McCain of Pittsburgh—America's most popular judge—has been selected. Quite a few entries from around Toronto will be there. If we had seven or eight Collie Clubs like this Eastern Ontario one spread across Canada, the Collie entries would be doubled at our shows and would make a lot of enthusiastic novices.

Well, I hope the hot weather is over. It is not a very pleasant job on a hot,

sweaty day to comb out a dog. That fine undercoat has a tendency to tickle and to stick. Then, diarrhoea has to be contended with. I used canned milk diluted one of milk to four of water, and it helped. The dogs wouldn't eat their breakfast, so I cut that meal out and fed a heavy meal at dusk.

It is time to start training your pup for the fall shows. A walk of fifteen minutes a day, and every day, on a lead amongst traffic noises and people should be his first lesson. Next, teach him to stand by giving him a tidbit after a good performance. It is better for only one person to train a dog. I have seen some good pups spoiled by their owners making fools of them around the house. When you give a command, make him obey. A good way to make a young dog stop barking is to dash a cup of water into his face. You must catch him in the act, so that he will know for what he is being punished.

Be sure to keep your dogs well combed out behind the ears so as to avoid clumps of matted hair. I carry a steel comb in my pocket always when working around the kennels.

Collie from Connecticut to Perform

A COLLIE, who thwarts the skeptics who claim the breed has been rendered senseless, will perform to the plaudits of our Capital City audience, on October 15th, 1949. Sunderland Gay Cavalier U.D., known to his owner and friends as "Lucky" is a collie who loves a crowd. He was born Dec. 19th, 1944, and was started at a later date into the usual round of shows to gain his championship. From there he was entered on his Obedience training at Worcester, Mass., at the end of the year 1945. By the end of the year 1948 he retired from Obedience training with nine best Obedient Dog Titles and the honour of being termed the highest scoring collie in Obedience in the U.S.A.

"Lucky" retired voluntarily one day when his owner was showing him in Obedience competition. Being weary of rules he exerted his show personality, winning the hearts of the spectators and starting himself on his own show career.

He has appeared in countless exhibitions, including Yankee Stadium in June, 1948, during the 25th anniversary celebrations and at Madison Square Gardens in 1947 and 1949. Canadians will remember seeing him at the Husars Armouries in Montreal last May.

He has appeared before theatre audiences throughout the States and been "interviewed" by radio enthusiasts. National Dog Magazines, local magazines, and newspapers are eternally making him photographically famous. To top this record he has just completed the motion film "Of Light and Darkness".

Lucky's attendance at the Eastern Ontario Collie Club Specialty show is a major Canadian event and even now interest is stirring amongst our Ottawa school children and teen agers. To promote the love of the breed and also

ican collie publication, "Collie Review," wrote a most interesting article regarding the story of Mr. Kusmik and his collie, Sunderland Gay Cavalier, U.D. last month.

It is anticipated that Lucky will take the Capital City favour, when he honours the Canadian fancy by appearing at Ottawa's spacious Coliseum for our first event for the collie breed on October 15th. Collie and Sheltie enthusiasts, come and see him!

A. K. C. Considering Important New Changes

TWO important possible changes are now being considered by the American Kennel Club. One is to abolish the Limit Class, substituting in its place, a regular Bred-By-Exhibitor class. The other has to do with revision and refinements of the Regulations and Standards for Obedience Trials.

At the present time if a Show-giving Club has a Bred-By-Exhibitor class, it is a non-regular class, the winner of which is not admitted to the Winners class, but is admitted to Best of Breed competition. If the Bred-By-Exhibitor class should become a regular class, the winner would, of course, compete in the Winners' class. There have been suggestions that the Bred-By-Exhibitor class be carried a step further and that it be made obligatory that dogs entered in this class must be handled by the owners, or perhaps the owner's family. We would personally like to see the Limit class abolished. In the majority of shows, it draws very few entries and the only purpose it serves, which is not served by other regular classes, is that of a spot, in which foreign dogs can be shown. Since very few foreign dogs do make their debut through the Limit class, most of them coming out in Open, it seems a bit foolish to continue this class.

We hope that no restrictions which would bar handlers, will be put on the proposed Bred-By-Exhibitor class. As we see it, this is a class which any sincere breeder would take great pride in winning, but there are many of our best breeders who do not personally show their dogs. Were restrictions as to handling put on the proposed class, we believe it would tend to give the class a more or less general novice aspect, which certainly is not its purpose.

... DOTS AND DASHES - - -

Show-giving Secretaries are again reminded that the publishing of the Show Reports and the list of Champions which were completed at their Show depends upon the promptness with which the marked catalogues, etc., are sent to the office.

As an example, the Brant Kennel Club Show was held on August 6th. A complete report from that Show-giving Club, including the marked catalogues and judges' books, was received in the Canadian Kennel Club offices on the morning of August 9th. The entire show was checked, a report typed and Champions confirmed within twenty-four hours, reaching the printers in plenty of time for publication in the September issue of DOGS IN CANADA.

If the official report of the Show is late, then the publication in the magazine must, naturally, follow suit. It will be noticed that some of the Show Reports appearing in this issue were of Shows held quite early in the year. Without the judges' books and marked catalogues it was impossible to do the work required in order to publish results.

The Dog Show Rules require that reports of the Shows must reach the office within ten days of the date of the Show, but in many instances it has been a matter of weeks before they do. It is the desire of Mr. Alf. Loveridge, who is in charge of the Show Department, to give the quickest service possible, in order that the breeders and exhibitors may know if their dogs have attained their Championships when making plans for future Shows. This can be done only if the Secretaries of the Show-giving Clubs co-operate by sending in the reports as soon as possible.

There have been many stories of unusual incidents occurring while dogs were in flight on the Trans-Canada Airways as cargo, but the latest just missed the headlines by a few hours.

Kelton Hill Carol, a Border Terrier, imported by Dr. J. A. Campbell, well-known Veterinary, presented her new owner with a litter of four strong, healthy puppies shortly after she disembarked from the T.C.A. plane at Malton. This litter, sired by High Garphar Sensation, will be the first one registered in Canada since 1931. The Border Terrier, one of the oldest of the Terrier breeds (also known as the Jones Terrier) is responsible for the propagation of many of the Terrier breeds from England being bred and shown today.

A famous Pomeranian has now returned to his former owner in Canada from the U.S.A. owing to the illness of Mrs. L. Bethune of Pittsburgh, Penn. This well-known little dog, International Champion Wembley

to the All Toy and Boston Terrier Association Show was the awarding of Best Canadian Bred in Show to "Poplar Personality Pirate", bred and owned by George Busby of Abbotsford, B.C. Presenting trophy was Mr. W. C. Woodward, former Lieutenant-Governor of British Columbia. Judge, Dr. Frank Porter Miller of California.

Tom Tit, bred by George Potts, was awarded Best Canadian Bred in Show All Breeds at the Toronto Kennel Club Show in 1941, and we are glad to welcome it back to Canada.

One country's loss is another country's gain, and it was with regret that Champion Peter Pan of Little Gate left the kennels of Mrs. Joy Osterdahl to go to the United States. Peter Pan had some Best in Show All Breeds, numerous Group wins and was a Canadian Champion when he left here. He has won his American championship including Best in Show All Breeds for his new owner.

Another outstanding Dachshund, holder of "Dog World's Award of Distinction," is Champion Chicopee's Statesman recently sold by Marie and Doug Riedel to the United States. This grand little Canadian-bred dog has several American wins to its credit and, no doubt, will soon be flying the International Championship colours.

The dog industry has become large enough, now, to adopt press agents for kennels and their dogs. That the Editors of the dog magazines will face embarrassing moments cannot be denied. It is difficult to sort the wheat from the chaff and to judge whether the articles sent in are of general interest or for the purpose of publicizing personal friends.

From the bulletin of the Dog Writers' Association we select the following paragraph, which is very timely and expresses clearly the difficult situation with which an Editor is faced.

"The older among us can recall the day when fanciers generally had the idea that the favor of any dog writer could be purchased with a free drink or a free meal, and that for a \$5.00 bill it was possible to get a puff for a dog or a kennel in any column. That impression has pretty generally vanished, and it now is recognized that most writers are doing what they expect judges to do, basing their reports on what a dog does and not on who its owner is.

"Lately concern that the conditions of a generation ago might be returning in a new guise has been expressed by some people in the game. This has grown out of the practice which some breeders and exhibitors have adopted of engaging press agents for their kennels and their dogs. This, of course, is not the same thing as trying to buy the favors of any of the writers with handouts and petty cash, but it definitely is up to the dog writers to make certain that the person who hires a press agent is not under any misconception about what the latter can and cannot do.

"A kennel or an individual dog is just as much entitled to a press agent as a racing stable and a horse, a movie studio and a star, or any other legitimate enterprise. But the press agent should be clearly identified as such, both to the fanciers generally and to his colleagues. He should not, in his own columns, give his clients anything more than he would give them if they were non-clients. There should be none of the hire-me-and-at-least-get-a-break-in-what-I-write idea. Any departure from that position is likely to carry the craft back into the state of disrepute from which it has emerged in recent years."

If a man whose chickens have been killed by dogs knows the name of the dog owner he has no recourse under the Sheep Protection act and must deal directly with the canine's owner.

This was the ruling given to council at its last meeting by municipal solicitor who was asked to advise on a case in which three pullets were killed and the complainant was aware of the name of the owner of the offending dog.—New Westminster, B.C.

We are tickled to death, to learn from the official proclamation of Grantham Township that during the summer months dogs at large in the township have to have adults "on the leash."—St. Catharines Standard, Ont.

This applies only to those persons resident in Canada who have made application for membership and whose application has been approved by the Board of Directors prior to September 15th, 1949.

A list of all members in good standing will be published in the October issue of DOGS IN CANADA.

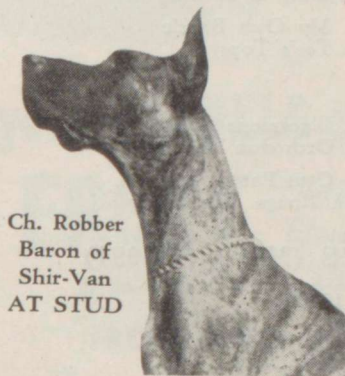

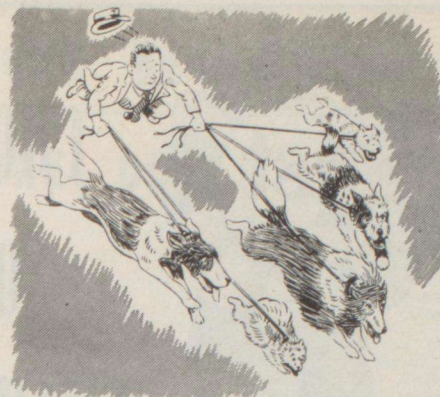

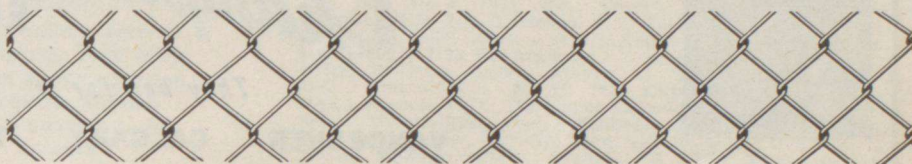

SUBJECT: The Secretary read a letter from the Ottawa Kennel Club, seeking direction in respect to the handling of a protest involving the height of a Beagle which competed at its Championship Show held on May 6th, 1949. The letter indicated that the owner of the dog against which the protest had been registered, had refused to allow the dog to be measured and the Show Superintendent had permitted the dog to compete.

Selling Pure-Bred Dogs

COMPLAINTS reaching the office of the Canadian Kennel Club indicate that not a few breeders of pure-bred dogs fail to observe the requirements of the federal law and the Constitution of The Canadian Kennel Club so far as it concerns their providing purchasers of dogs with certificates of registration issued by the Club. The following information, set up in a series of questions and answers, is provided for the guidance of all breeders.

Question No. 1: What is a pure-bred dog?

Answer: A pure-bred dog is a dog registered in or eligible for registration in the Stud Book of The Canadian Kennel Club. It should, however, be noted that no one has the right to assume that a dog is eligible for registration under Article 33, Section 7, of the Constitution.

Question No. 2: What dogs are eligible for registration in the Stud Book of The Canadian Kennel Club Inc.?

Answer: See Article 33 of the Constitution of the Club.

Question No. 3: Can I sell a pure-bred dog on the understanding that I, the seller, will not be required to provide the purchaser with a certificate of registration?

Answer: Yes, but only if the understanding is made on agreement forms

obtainable by the seller from the Canadian Kennel Club and then only if the agreement is made at the time of sale and a copy of the agreement is forwarded promptly to the Canadian National Live Stock Records.

Question No. 4: If I sell a pure-bred dog and do not have an agreement as indicated by the answer to question No. 3 am I required and obliged to provide the purchaser with a certificate of registration showing the purchaser's ownership?

Answer: Yes. You are not only required to do so by the Canadian Kennel Club but also by the provisions of the Live Stock Pedigree Act, a federal statute which provides that upon conviction for failure to provide a certificate the seller may be fined an amount not exceeding \$500 and costs and not less than \$100 and costs, and in default of payment to imprisonment for any term not exceeding two months. (As a matter of interest to our readers convictions have been registered in Canadian courts where sellers of pure-bred dogs have failed to provide purchasers with certificates of registration).

Question No. 5: If I am under obligation to provide a certification of registration is there any time limit by which I must provide the certificate?

Answer: Yes, the certificate must be provided within three months from the

date of sale. Failure to provide the certificate within three months can result in the taking of disciplinary action but if it established to the satisfaction of the Board of Directors that the seller has and is doing everything possible to provide the certificate reasonable extension of the time limit may be given at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Question No. 6: Can I sell a dog on the understanding that the certificate of registration will be provided but that the purchaser (or whoever may subsequently acquire the dog while the agreement is in effect) will not use the dog for breeding or competitive purposes, and what would such an agreement mean to the Canadian Kennel Club?

Answer: Yes, providing the agreement was made at the time of sale and on forms obtainable from the Canadian Kennel Club. The seller would provide the purchaser with the certificate in the regular way but the breeding records of the Club in the Live Stock Records office would be marked to show that progeny of such dog would not be eligible for registration, and the records in the Toronto office would be marked to show that any wins made by the dog at competitive contests held under the rules of the club are to be cancelled being in violation of the agreement. - (2) **The JAMES D. STRACHAN MEMORIAL MEDAL** to be awarded to the member of The Canadian Kennel Club Inc. whose dog wins the most Best Canadian-bred in Show awards during the calendar year.

The following conditions apply in respect to these medals:

- (1) Open only to dogs owned by members in good standing of The Canadian Kennel Club Inc.;
- (2) A qualifying award will count only if the owner (or owners) is a member in good standing of The Canadian Kennel Club Inc. at the time the qualifying award is received;
- (3) Qualifying awards must be earned at championship shows and specialty championship shows (except specialty championship shows held in conjunction with championship shows) held under the Dog Show Rules of The Canadian Kennel Club Inc.;
- (4) Both medals cannot be won, in the same year, by the same member (individual or partnership). If the member winning THE W. H. PYM MEDAL is also the owner of the dog winning the most Best Canadian-bred in Show awards during the same calendar year, THE JAMES D. STRACHAN MEMORIAL MEDAL will be awarded to the member whose dog won the next highest number of Best Canadian-bred in Show awards in the calendar year;
- (5) The decision of the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club Inc. in respect to any question regarding these medals shall be final and binding.

copy of the agreement must be submitted to the Live Stock Records along with the application for registration and/or application for transfer of ownership of the dog sold on such an understanding.

Question No. 7: You refer to agreement forms made available by the Club: Where and at what cost can these forms be obtained?

Answer: Write the Canadian Kennel Club, Toronto (not the Live Stock Records office at Ottawa) and enclose 25c for each agreement in triplicate that you require. Each agreement is good for one sale. Indicate clearly the type of agreement forms you require. Please do not send cash or cheque.

Question No. 8: If I provide the purchaser of a pure-bred dog with a certificate of registration issued by any organization other than the Canadian Kennel Club am I meeting the requirements of The Canadian Kennel Club and the Live Stock Pedigree Act?

Answer: No, the Live Stock Pedigree Act specifically refers to a "certificate of pedigree registration as issued by such association" and the Act defines

an "association" as an association incorporated under the Live Stock Pedigree Act. (As a matter of interest—a seller of alleged "pure-bred" dogs following investigation was found guilty in a Canadian court of nine charges of furnishing certificates of registration issued by an organization other than the Canadian Kennel Club — he was fined \$100.00 and costs on the first charge and given suspended sentence on the other eight counts. The seller in this instance was denied the privileges of the Canadian Kennel Club).

Question No. 9: Am I obliged to consult the purchaser concerning the name to be given the dog before I send in the application for registration and transfer of ownership?

Answer: No, and the "explanation" that a seller has failed to provide a certificate within the prescribed time limit because "the purchaser has failed to furnish a name" will not be accepted as a reasonable explanation for failure to provide the certificate within the three months limit referred to.

Question No. 10: Can I sell a dog at a stated price plus a further stated

amount for the certificate of registration?

Answer: The Board of Directors views this method of selling a pure-bred dog as prejudicial to the interests of the Club for certificates issued by the Club are not for sale. A dog is sold on the understanding that the certificate of registration is to be provided in which case the stated selling price shall include the certificate; but if the certificate is not to be provided then the procedure outlined in the answer to question No. 3 must be followed.

Question No. 11: Can I provide the purchaser with an application for registration and/or application for transfer of ownership and leave it to him to send the application to the Live Stock Records office?

Answer: Unless there is a written agreement that a certificate of registration is not to be provided, the seller is responsible for furnishing the purchaser with a certificate of registration showing the latter's ownership. The mere act of supplying the purchaser with the required application is not sufficient to meet the requirements of

the Constitution or the Live Stock Pedigree Act.

Question No. 12: Can any other form of agreement or understanding be made in respect to the sale of a dog; for example, can I sell a male dog on the understanding that I could have one stud service to one of my females at a later date?

Answer: Yes, providing a copy of the agreement is submitted to the Canadian National Live Stock records at the time application for registration and/or application for transfer of ownership is made. No special forms are provided for such agreements but it is recommended that the seller arrange for three copies to be made, and the agreement should clearly set out all the terms of the understanding. Such agreements must not be in contravention of the Rules of the Club nor prejudicial to the interests of the Club, its members or their dogs.

Question No. 13: Can agreements made be cancelled?

Answer: Yes, provided that all the parties to the agreement notify the Canadian National Live Stock Records that the agreement has been cancelled.

Question No. 14: "B" acquires a dog from "A" and in turn sells it to "C". Can "A" transfer the dog direct to "C"?

Answer: Most certainly not; how can "A", in applying for transfer of ownership, declare that he disposed of the dog to "C" when in effect he disposed of it to "B"? Such a declaration can easily result in the penalties referred to in the answer to question No. 16. (As a matter of interest it should be pointed out that the Board of Directors has reason to believe that some un-

thinking fanciers are disposing of dogs to persons suspended by or denied the privileges of the Canadian Kennel Club and following resale of the dogs the suspended persons are by-passed in the subsequent transfers of ownership submitted to the Live Stock Records Office. Do not jeopardize your privileges by following such a practice).

Question No. 15: Can a suspended or expelled member of the Canadian Kennel Club, or a non-member of the Club be denied the privileges of the Club, sell a pure-bred dog as such?

Answer: If he does so then he is subject to conviction under Section 18 of the Live Stock Pedigree Act since he no longer is in a position to provide the purchaser with a Canadian Kennel Club certificate of registration.

Question No. 16: What penalty can be assessed against a person who submits an application to the Canadian National Live Stock Records when the said application contains material false statements or representations, or who furnishes the purchaser with a certificate of registration for a dog other than the one sold to that particular purchaser?

Answer: On conviction of either offence a seller is liable to a fine not exceeding \$500.00 and costs and not less than \$100.00 and costs and in default of payment to imprisonment for any term not exceeding three months. The seller can be suspended or expelled by the Club if a member, and if a non-member, can be denied the privileges of the Club.

Question No. 17: You have referred to "disciplinary action" in answer to some of my previous questions; what

does it mean and does that apply also to non-members as well as members of the Club?

Answer: Disciplinary action means the taking of action which may result in the suspension or expulsion of a member of the Club or, as in the case of non-members, the denial of the privileges of the Club.

Question No. 18: What do you mean when you refer to "privileges of the Club?"

Answer: The privileges of the Club are set forth in Chapter 5 of the Club's Constitution, but in short it means that a suspended or expelled member or a non-member denied the privileges of the Club cannot register and/or transfer dogs in the records of the Club, and cannot participate in any way in any competitive contest (show, field trial, obedience trial) held under the Rules of the Club. Any person suspended or expelled by the Club or denied the privileges of the Club is automatically denied the same privileges by the American Kennel Club.

Question No. 19: Do the answers to all of the above questions apply equally to non-members of the Canadian Kennel Club as well as to members of the Club?

Answer: Yes.

Question No. 20: Can a member of the Canadian Kennel Club breed and sell other than pure-bred dogs?

Answer: No, and his membership automatically ceases if he breeds and/or sells other than pure-bred dogs.

Question No. 21: Is an unregistered dog a pure-bred dog?

Answer: Yes, if it is eligible for registration in the Stud Book of The Canadian Kennel Club Inc.

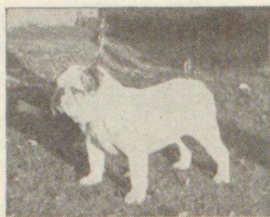

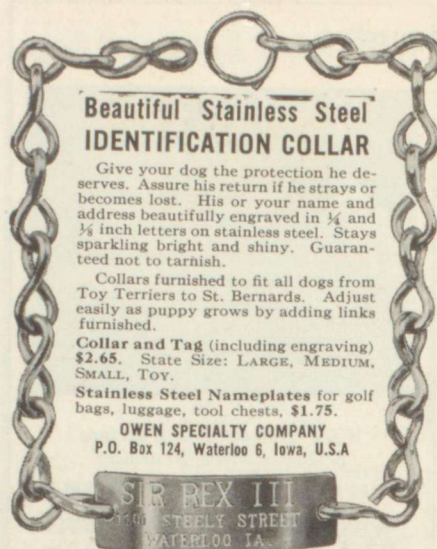

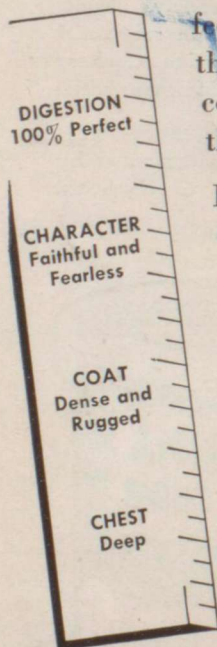
