## OUR COVER

Our cover this month depicts the sensational Great Dane, Champion Fingard's Count, with the two eminent Judges, Mrs. Marie Meyers Nolan and Mr. George T. Kane, who judged this dog to be Best in Show All Breeds at Brantford, Ontario, and Saint John, New Brunswick, respectively. From Saint John, N.B., Champion Fingard's Count travelled to Winnipeg, Manitoba, where he won the Working Group and Reserve Best in Show All Breeds under Judge Dr. Wilfred Shute.

In addition to winning Best of Breed in one of the largest entries of Great Danes ever to be benched in Canada, this gorgeous 185 pound dog has now added Two Best in Show All Breeds, one Reserve Best in Show All Breeds and Best in Working Group at London, Ontario, to the illustrious show record of the Fingard Great Danes. The London Show was judged by W. C. Baldwin of Ottawa. This marks the fourth occasion in the history of the Canadian Kennel Club that a Canadian bred Great Dane has won Best in Show All Breeds. Champion Fingard's Count won two, and one of the other Best in Show Winners was a daughter of Champion Fingard's Odin, brother to Champion Fingard's Count.

That Fingard's Count comes from a line of illustrious champions is borne out by his sire's pedigree, which includes Champion Duke of Roxdane (Best of Breed at Madison Square Gardens, New York City, in 1940), Champion Steinbachers King, Champion Wiskow Kadow of Brae Tarn, and Champion Peer Gynt's Erl-king.

His dam is Fingard's Champion Wischers Duley. Not only was she a great winner, herself, in the show ring, but she comes from such noted breeding as Champion Muldoon (Best of Breed at Madison Square Gardens, New York City, 1942), Champion Randolph Hexengold, Champion Nero Hexengold, Champion Gunar von Hollergarten of Walnut Hall, Champion Allure of Brae Tarn, one of the greatest of the great producers in Great Dane history, and that outstanding pillar of the breed from Germany, Champion Odin Von Birkenhof, the sire of Champion King Von Loenhart, who holds the world's record for awards in the show ring for the breed.

Fingard's Count was bred and is owned by David Fingard, who is believed to have bred more Great Dane Champions who in turn have produced champions, than any other breeder of Great Danes in Canada. The judge at the Brantford Show where Champion Fingard's Count made his first sensational win was Mrs. Marie Meyer Nolan, who is considered one of the outstanding authorities on the working breed, and particularly Great Danes, of which she has bred many champions.

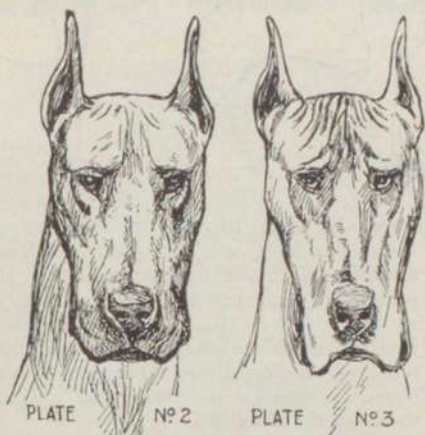

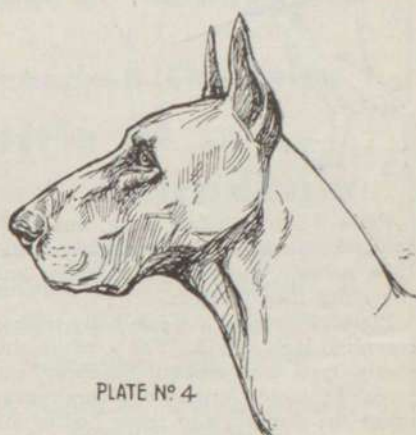

THE appellation "Great Dane" is the great misnomer of dogdom. At no time had Denmark anything to claim in the establishment of this breed, its nearest approach in that country, the Dansk Hond, being a very poor imitation of this magnificent breed, the credit for whose evolution should go to Germany and whose proper name should be that of its native land the "Deutsche Dogge".

The name Great Dane, no doubt, came from Buffon's classification of the large dogs, naming this type of dog the "Grand Danois", and I don't think anyone knows why he should have been so called since he considered the Mollosian and the huge dogs of Ireland his progenitors.

But even in Germany there seemed to be, for a long time, no concerted effort to settle on a definite name, the large dogs of the early days, that were probably some of the ancestors of the breed, were known as Hatzrueden, Saufaenger; and in later years, the Rottweiler was rather indiscriminately mixed with the breed both in name and in active cross breeding.

Again, for a while, the breed was known as the "Ulmer Dogge". But, finally, after the war of 1870, the strong nationalistic feeling finally and definitely fixed the name "Deutsche Dogge".

Great Danes found favor in America quite a long time before they became really popular in America, though the early importations passed here as Cuban and Siberian Bloodhounds. Since their entry, here, the breed has definitely gone forward and established itself in the Fancy. It has always held its own in public esteem, as a companion. As a show dog, it has steadily maintained its position. As early as 1905, there were already sizeable entries at the shows, Westminster having, in that year, 77 Great Danes on its benches. Our largest out-door show, Morris and Essex, benched the fine entry of 120.

America was fortunate in having a rather good lot of dogs among its early

sires such as Melac, Major McKinley, Sandor vom Inn, Dagobert, and others. I remember Major McKinley and Sandor vom Inn very well, and they compared favorably with our later dogs.

The Great Dane is fully entitled to the high rank he holds in the dog world; his noble stature, combining grace and strength with an agility for so large an animal, makes him most impressive. His temperament is splendid, notwithstanding his alertness and desire to guard. His great intelligence makes him most tractable and obedient; and his strong natural desire for human companionship, makes him a safe and reliable dog with women and children.

Of late years, the strong influence of some very prepotent sires has brought to the breed many marked improvements, among them greater style, lovely heads and longer necks, and a great improvement in soundness and movement. These have given this grand breed a stronger position in the show game than ever before, thereby giving promise of a still grander future.

The first paragraph in the standard for the breed demands the distinguishing features that have made its place in the show world, namely, nobility, size, power, and elegance to a degree not seen in other breeds, with a long easy stride and a noble, proud bearing.

The head, of course, is a very important part of this picture. It should be rather long with a strong square muzzle, which should be as long from the stop to its end as the distance from the stop to the occiput, the stop by the way, being quite pronounced.

While the head should be flat and compressed, it should not look weak,

and while the muzzle should be ample, it should never simply cover a weak small underjaw. The head should, in effect, be composed of strong rectangles. The eyes should be medium size, with a keen expression. Plate 1 shows the side view of such a head, while Plate 2 shows the front view.

Plate 3 depicts a very long head, but one that does not suggest power. In this head, we usually find plenty of loose skin, sometimes an abundance of flabby lip, with no strong supporting underjaw. This type of head also has an expression that is not typical, especially in the eyes which sometimes show the very undesirable haw.

Plate 4 shows the type this head sometimes assumes in profile. Instead of the parallel lines of the head and muzzle this shows a decided drop in muzzle and a bulge in the skull both highly objectionable. Heads of this type are also very often overshot, and it is most important that a Great Dane should have a level mouth. Another fault in this head is the dewlap or loose skin at the throat. The Great Dane should have a long, strong, clean neck, and the nearer it approaches a smooth column, the better.

Plate 5 is another faulty head. The muzzle is too short, and has a pronounced upturn to it. Instead of being cut square in front, it slopes back to rather heavy flews. The eyes are too full, and the neck is thick and coarse.

Plate 6 is a front view of the same head, showing the wide skull, instead of a flat one, and the comparatively attenuated muzzle. The ear crop is also too short.

Plate 7 shows the ideal type of body, with a reasonably short back, the correct station, layback of shoulder, sternum not overdone, deep brisket, and the proper tuck up in flank, that helps so much to give it a graceful line.

Plate 8 shows the antithesis of this. A heavy, logy ungraceful body; too long in back, too short and thick in neck; too pronounced in sternum; tail too long, reaching beyond the hocks.

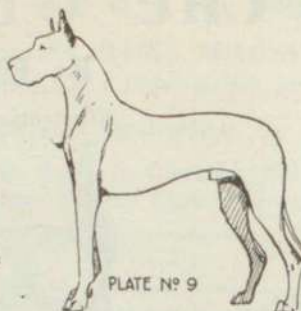

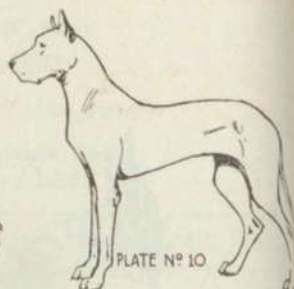

Plate 9 shows a fair body, but made faulty through the incorrect leg structure, namely, the straight shoulder and the stilty hindquarters.

Plate 10 depicts a weak body with a complete lack of rib. For a while this shelly type was making headway, but some of the old German breeders recognized the danger, and these bodies are today seldom met with. The unsoundness in this plate is enhanced by the overdone angulation of the hindquarters.

even the toes turning in and losing their purchase on the ground. The opposite of this is the second figure in which the legs turn outward, especially at the pasterns. This is a condition that usually can be attributed to a more or less rachitic condition in youth. This again influences the feet and splays them at the toes.

Plate 13 shows the normal hindquarter with broad, well-muscled hams; the second thighs long and well developed, with strong, well bent hocks.

eral ways. First of all the second thighs can only do one thing, and that is to assume an upright position to brace themselves and the body, thereby not only elevating the croup until it is higher than the withers, but also putting an undue pressure on the hocks turning them outward, weakening them and losing their entire function of transmitting the thrust from the hocks in the movement of the hindquarters. All hindquarters that are sound, should be

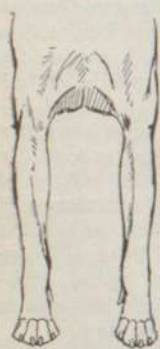

In summing up the body of the Dane, it should be remembered that the body should be moderately long and the ribs rather flat. The body should be deep at the brisket to give plenty of lung room. The sternum should not be too prominent, as is often the case with some of the older types. The loin should arch gently and be very strong, while the croup should be short and slope gradually toward the tail. An essential is the under line of the body, since this upward curve gives the body its graceful appearance.

Plate 11 shows the correct front. The fore legs should be perfectly straight from the elbow to the pastern, the latter having a slight forward bend. The elbow is comparatively low, permitting a distinct right angle in the shoulder blade and the upper arm.

Plate 12 depicts two faulty fronts. The first, due to loose elbows, makes the front legs turn inwardly at the feet,

Plate 14 shows hindquarters that are often met with, and are not as desirable nor as sound as those on Plate 13, due to their overdone length in both the femur, or bone of the thigh, and the tibia and fibula, the bones of the second thigh.

The length tends to overangulation both in the thigh and the hocks, and overangulation always brings with it an unsound posture and movement.

In the German Shepherd, this condition was, for a long time, a much desired feature, due to the erroneous impression that such a structure gave added power to the stride while trotting; whereas, just the reverse was true, owing to the lost motion by the undue length of the bones.

Plate 15 shows the opposite effect, caused by too short a femur, which in turn does not permit enough angulation to give the proper leverage to the bones. The result is disastrous in sev-

perfectly parallel when viewed from the rear.

Plate 16 shows the various positions of the tail. The first is the carriage when the dog is at rest, hanging straight down and not reaching below the hock, thick at the base and tapering to a fine point which, by the way, should never be clipped.

The second figure shows the position of the tail when the dog is in motion. It should never be curled over the back, or even curled toward the back. A ring tail is a very serious fault. The third figure is a bent tail that is sometimes met with, and is also undesirable.

Plate 17 shows the perfect foot, a very important feature in the Dane. It is obvious, of course, that so large an animal should have perfect foundations, and so the feet should be compact, strong, well padded with well arched toes. The second figure shows the wrong foot, namely, the flat toes with no pads, and the spreading bones that have no strong tendons to brace them.

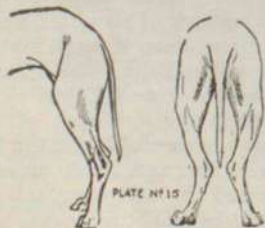

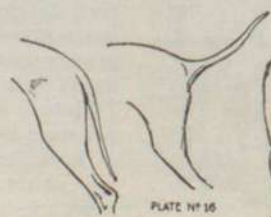

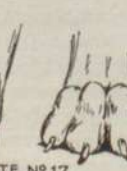

# Know Your Breed...

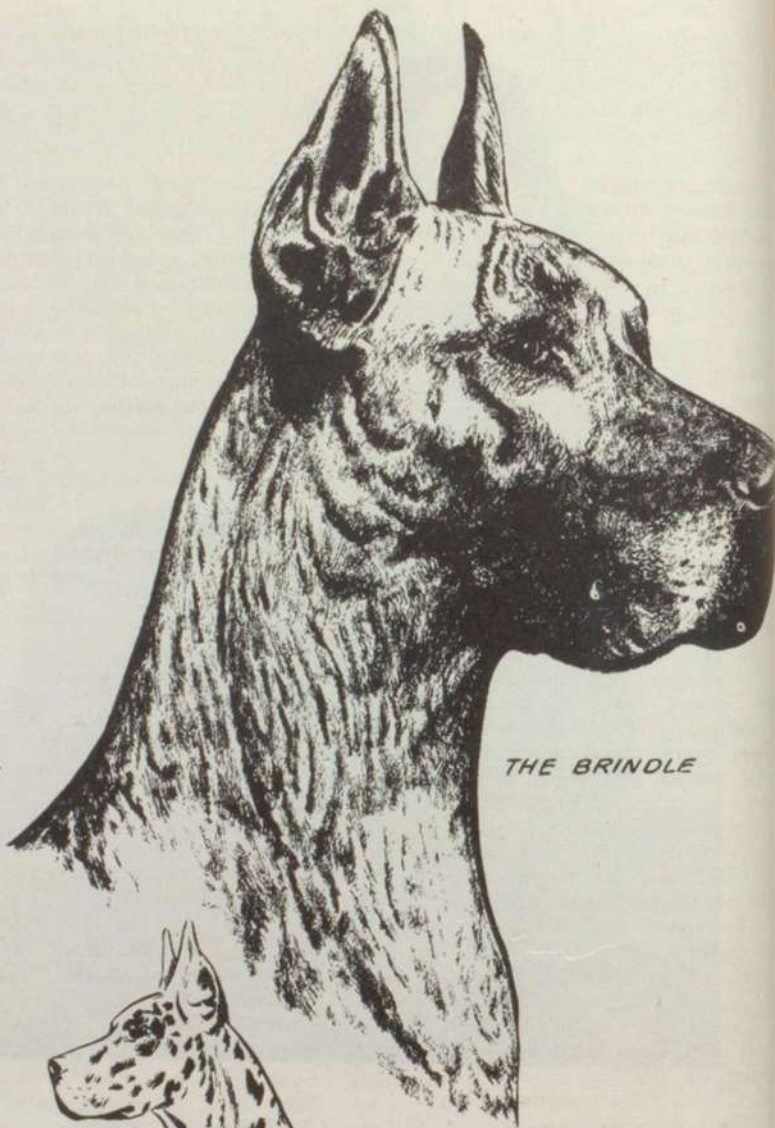
Drawings of Great Danes have been found on Egyptian monuments as far back as the year 3000 B.C. and in Museums effigies of the Great Dane can be seen even to the cropped ears. In early Roman history we read of this breed being used for baiting lions in the arena. Their agility and size, even in those days, was such that they could be used for either fighting or hunting.

While classed as one of the Working Group at the dog shows, the Great Dane is really a Hound. In addition to its Hound-like disposition, it was bred for centuries by the German people as a Boar Hunter, and naturalists claim that the dog which became known as the Irish Wolfhound, was the principal ancestor of the Great Dane. In the evolution of the breed, there is no doubt that the German Mastiff was introduced to create a heavy body, but there the similarity ends.

The Great Dane combines in its distinguished appearance, dignity, strength and elegance with great size and a powerful, well-formed, smoothly muscled body. It is one of the giant breeds, but is unique in that its general conformation must be so well-balanced that it never appears clumsy and is always a unit—the Apollo of dogs. It must be spirited and courageous—never timid. It is friendly and dependable. This physical and mental combination is the characteristic which gives the Great Dane the majesty possessed by no other breed. It is particularly true of this breed that there is an impression of great masculinity in dogs as compared to an impression of femininity in bitches. The male should appear more massive throughout than the bitch, with larger frame and heavier bone. In the ratio between length and height, the Great Dane should appear as square as possible.

There are five distinct colours permissible in the show ring—the fawn is a golden yellow with a deep black mask; the brindle has a base colour ranging from golden yellow to deep golden yellow brindled with strong black cross stripes; the Harlequin Dane has pure white for its base colour with black torn patches irregularly and well distributed over its entire body and it is from the Harlequin Dane that the black Dane is evolved. The latter is a glossy black and very attractive. The Blue Dane breeds true to colour and is of pure steel blue. While the fawns and brindles can be mated together resulting in true coloured progeny, the same cannot be done by mating the Harlequin or the blue with any but their own colour in order to produce the correct shading.

Ideal Height: Dogs, 32" or over at shoulder.  
Females, 30" or over at shoulder.

# The Mechanical Age in Retrievers

(Continued)

EDITOR'S NOTE: In response to the commendations received on The Mechanical Age in Retrievers published in the September issue, Mr. Elliot has sent a continuation of his observations. Mr. Elliot is one of the world's most outstanding trainers of Sporting dogs. He trained dogs for the Canine Corps during World War II, and in the course of his duties he was with every American invasion group that invaded the Islands in the Far East.

MANY of my critics may feel that I have presented a problem far removed from the practical field of endeavor, but I would attribute this to the fact that they were born in the field of mechanical tools and have not had the opportunity of watching the old and tried school at work. In the old school both man and dog were pupils. One was instilled with the old motto, "Teach me, my dog!" Today that motto has been torn from the walls of common sense and thrown to the four winds. One may ask how can both be pupils? That is very easy to answer. The dog can teach his master a great deal more about game finding than the master can teach him. This can only be achieved by watching the dog at work and leaving it alone to solve its problem. Interference from the handler can oft times cause failure. Unless the handler is sure that the bird is there and dead it is better to leave it entirely to the dog. (When in doubt trust your dog.) One can learn many things by watching a good dog at work. Anyone who has put in much time in the field, I am sure, has been amazed when his dog has recovered a downed bird which he considered was in an entirely different location. When such things happen this is when you are a pupil to the dog and they happen on countless occasions. The wise man will go home with all his birds; the fool will leave his cripples to their fate.

The difference between the dogs that are thrown on the waste pile and the field trial dog of today compares favorably with the truck and the limousine. One was built for man's essential needs, the other for his pleasures. Yet, we have the most practical grounds for building a Retriever that combines both qualities. Our field trial dogs are a product from the limousine assembly line. All this has forced the trainer to become a martinet. This may have some merit if used with good judgment, but is it? I am afraid that too often in our anxiety to meet the required demands, sound judgment is forgotten. I know that I have made many such mistakes in my over enthusiasm to keep up with the Jones's. I have no proof of it, but

I am confident that many of my fellow trainers have done likewise.

If it now takes such drastic measures to train field trial dogs, this in itself is sufficient proof that our demands are beyond reason. If it is that we wish the field trial dog to be purely an exhibitionist, then we have got it. But, don't you think that we owe something to the average retriever enthusiast, one who is interested only in the retriever as a shooting companion. He wants a dog that is obedient but one whose natural ability has been given full scope, one that can hunt and find its game without having to depend on its master to guide its every move. To cater to these hunters and demonstrate a dog that would be of the greatest assistance to them in the field, we must make a change in our field trial procedure. We must show them something that demonstrates the dog to advantage, and not so much the handler. One cannot say that these people are not worthy of our attention, for I am sure that they must come very near to making up about seventy-five percent of our total Retriever interest. If my statistics are anywhere near correct, then it leaves a rather small proportion dedicated to field trials. We would with greater emphasis placed on natural ability attract a large portion of this seventy-five percent who have heretofore turned a deaf ear and a blind eye on our field trial efforts. Our original intentions were to bring to the notice of all the benefits to be derived from taking a well-trained Retriever into the field. Field trials were staged for this purpose and we have done a good job, but not good enough, if my statistics are correct. We could sell the Retriever one hundred percent, if we would modify our artificial methods in handling. At the same time, we would be selling a product that would do its job and do it well in any branch of the field. A more genuine and sincere demonstration from the dog and a little less from the handler is all that would be required to prove the Retriever every man's dog.

Some people may fail to see that this would bring about any great increase in the use of Retrievers. I am convinced that it would, for you are certainly not going to sell a man a limousine when he wants a truck, and the number of people who ask for the dog that is steady to wing and shot and is a good game finder certainly overshadows those who want our jet-propelled, man-handled rockets. There is another very important angle to all this and it carries that well-known dollar sign. If nothing else will arouse interest, I am sure that old sign will, and you don't have to be Scotch.

There has to be a greater outlet for the number of Retrievers bred in this country today, and a good outlet, one that will put more dogs into the hands of those who are keenly active in the field. Once you convince more and more of these people that you have a practical product, one that will serve them well no matter where they hunt, they you will have created a market bigger and better than you ever had before. Your prices, of course, will be moderate compared to the prices asked for our present day field trial dogs, but a small profit and a quick turn-over is a pretty solid foundation upon which to build any business. The present day field trial dog really has no commercial value, simply because it neither fits the pocket nor the purpose of the average man.

The public trainer could supply five shooting dogs while he is training one field trial dog—and I mean good shooting dogs—dogs that should be the backbone of our trials. These dogs the average American hunter would love to watch in action, because he would be witnessing something that he knew would serve him well in any river, lake, marsh or field. To make the slight changes in our field trial activities that I favor would not in any way take away the fun of the sport. In fact, it would give more pleasure to a greater number of people. Now I heard you say that! Please don't be so selfish as to repeat that you don't want any more in the game, for there is ample room for everyone just as there is plenty of room for improvement in our dogs and methods. I will be competing no matter what methods you use, but why not give these suggestions a little thought, or better still a little trial. If I am weighed in the balance and found wanting that will be my tough luck, but I don't think I will be. An open mind when it comes to giving a new slant to an old method, works wonders.

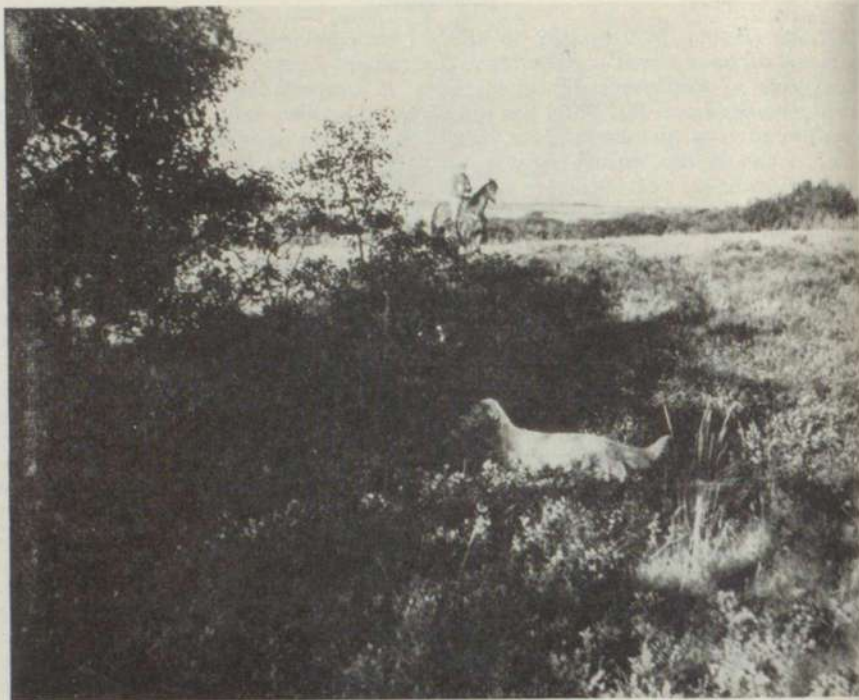
# They Call It Strawberry Valley

**T**HIRTEEN sections of land, over eight thousand acres, were available as usual and scarcely a fence to mar the landscape or retard our progress. This is not dry or worn out prairie, but mostly rich, fertile valley land, stretching almost as far as the eye could see and carpeted for the most part with the original prairie grass, or "prairie wool", as it is usually termed. All over this valley numerous bluffs or poplar trees and willows dot the landscape. Stretches of yellow stubble, from which this year's wheat crop had already been harvested, were also seen. Here the birds would fly morning and evening to fill their crops with grain. Here, too, on the slopes, could still be seen trails made by the buffalo in by-gone days as they walked in single file down to some favorite waterhole or wallow. Such is Strawberry Valley, the natural home of Canada's finest native upland game bird, the prairie chicken.

Having spent a long day in the ring on Saturday, judging the all-breed show at Moose Jaw, and after two almost sleepless nights, I was planning, as my train neared Saskatoon early on Sunday morning, to lock the doors as soon as I reached home and catch up on some much needed rest. However, no sooner had I stepped from the train than a heavy hand was clapped upon my shoulder and I turned to gaze into the face of burly Ralph Orge, accompanied by his henchman, Johnnie Van Impe. "Good morning!" I said, pleasant-like. "Never mind the morning. We've been waiting for you out at the Field Trials since sun-up," was the answer to my greeting. "At the Field Trials?" I exclaimed. "You're not taking me out to any field trials today, besides I promised Jim Forbes I would judge on Monday, not Sunday." "Never mind what you promised. You're going out to the Field Trials." And the way they twisted my arms and marched me off to a waiting auto onlookers must surely have thought that some desperate criminal was being apprehended.

A hurried breakfast at the farm and we three judges together with the Field Marshal rode away in the car, following the cowboys who were riding our horses out to the starting point a couple of miles from the farm. One of the riders lost his hat and immediately swinging his steed around came galloping up the trail toward us, leaning far out of the saddle to retrieve the lost headgear. With ten entries, no time was lost in getting the first brace away for the Open All Age. After the completion of the heats in this series, four dogs were called back for a second run—"Ermac's Gunner of Grail", Lemon Belton English Setter dog, owned and handled by Newton C. MacGregor;

"Elmcroft Mahogany Sue", Irish Setter bitch, owned and handled by Mr. Harry Dean of "Ardee" fame, "Ab's Lightning", liver and white Pointer female, owned and handled by Mr. A. Eubele, and "Nellie's Queen", Lemon Belton English Setter bitch owned and handled by N. C. MacGregor.

The Second Series heats were of forty-five minutes duration and the sun was setting as this final series came to an end.

First place went to "Gunner", the English Setter. We saw this dog competing in the Derby a year ago when he put up a rather indifferent performance. Now he has improved beyond recognition. Possessing an easy way of going, he covered a lot of ground, hunted independently, never lost his head and ran a strong race throughout. One find midway through the heat was typical of his work. The course ran from north to south. A long cast and a bluff far to the South-East was given the once-over. In swinging back to the course he circled a dried out slough-bed. Coming around on the near side he snapped into a lofty point. His handler immediately declared point, dismounted and dropping the lines walked in to make the flush. The horse followed on and actually nudged the dog with his nose from behind, but Gunner stayed put. A single chicken rocketed from the long grass, the dog behaving well at the gun.

"Sue", a smart little Irish Setter, copped second place. Fleet of foot and extremely "birdy", one of her finds on a single chicken on the open prairie was well executed. However, she was a bit lacking in range compared to the first place dog and was not quite sure of herself at times when contacting game.

"Nellie's Queen", English Setter and a well known campaigner at these trials, was placed third. But more about "Queenie" in the event that followed.

The Open Shooting Dog Stake was scheduled for Monday and we were away bright and early, Jack Ayres riding with us on this occasion. The weather throughout had been ideal and we drove leisurely along on this calm sunshiny morning with just a tang of Fall in the air. Ralph had his rifle along, with the scope mounted 270, and asked us to keep our eyes open for coyotes.

We slowed down several times as coveys of prairie chicken flushed from the roadside or walked sedately across the gravel. Jack was taking imaginary shots at some of them with his walking cane through the car window, while Judy, the Labrador beside me in the back seat, whined expectantly. A covey of over twenty Hungarian Partridge flushed so unexpectedly as we rounded a curve, that although Ralph jammed on the brakes, one of them actually crashed against the windshield and fell



to the road. It soon recovered from the shock, however, and quickly flew over to re-join the covey in the stubble.

"There's your coyote, Ralph." Johnnie spotted him standing about one hundred yards from the road. At the screeching of the brakes, he lost no time in putting distance between himself and the car. We were heading east and the wolf was running north. Ralph worked fast in getting the rifle from its case, made a hurried shot and missed just as the coyote vanished over a knoll. Ralph was just in the act of re-entering the car when the animal reappeared running straight east, along the top of a ridge and parallel to the road. Only his top half was showing as Ralph squeezed the trigger and the wolf dropped in his tracks. We estimated the distance to be around two hundred yards.

#### The Shooting Dog Stake

There were ten entries in this stake and the first brace got away early Monday morning. Prairie Chickens were plentiful right from the start and every dog had its opportunity on birds. This stake was handled on foot.

A Brittany Spaniel owned and handled by Mr. F. W. Benson, the President of the Saskatoon Kennel Club, and a pointing Griffon, handled by Mr. A. Eubele, were among the contenders in this event. The Brittany excelled in game finding ability crashing through the under-brush and flushing birds like a Springer Spaniel. This dog needs more work.

The Griffon had two finds and styled up well on point, but proved a bit unsteady to shot.

Four dogs were called back for a Second Series. "Elmcroft Mahogany Sue", owner-handler Harry Dean; "Lightning", Pointer bitch, owner-handler A. Eubele; "Nellie's Queen", English Setter, owner-handler N. C. MacGregor; and the Griffon handled by Eubele.

Third place went to "Sue", the Irish Setter. This dog again proved herself to be a capable contender. Took in all the birdy places and worked to her handler at all times. A bit undecided when she finally had the birds cornered, cost her a higher placing.

"Lightning", who placed first in the Amateur All Age on Saturday and thereby winning her Field Trial Championship, won second in this event. We recall this Pointer winning the Open All Age here a few years back, with an outstanding performance in hot competition. Today she was carrying far too much weight and appeared to tire after the first thirty minutes of the heat had gone. Still, she had chalked up three clear-cut finds. When Lightning styles up her handler never hesitates to call point and nine times out of ten you can bet your bottom dollar that she has birds.

First place went to bench "Champion Nellie's Queen". Queenie went away in this heat as if she really meant business. Had one find in the early stages of her race, then for a while in spite of all her skill, she failed to contact

birds. Later on, considerable interference on the part of her brace-mate spoiled some promising bird work on her part. With fifteen minutes to go, we entered a long draw running from West to East. With shadows made from the setting sun creeping across the valley, the weather had turned very hot and sultry. The wind coming behind us from the North-west had dropped almost to a soft sigh. Queenie showed good judgment, however, by skirting around the south side of the long bluff to make her final bid for fame. Halfway along the draw she styled up well on a nice find and behaved well at the shot. With but five minutes left, point was again called. Munro Murray of the Saskatoon Star-Phoenix quickly dismounted to take a close-up photo of her which will appear with this write-up. Then as MacGregor walked in, three chicken came fluttering out through the poplars. Time was called soon after as Queenie made her final cast through some uncut grain.

We have had the opportunity of seeing Ch. Nellie's Queen in action many times throughout her career. Now eight years old, she can still hunt with the best and is as bird-wise as they come. She placed second no less than seven times in open competition before annexing first in the shooting dog stake here last Fall. By repeating again this year she is now entitled to wear the much sought after crown of Dual Champion.

I have heard it said that when the time comes and the prairie hunter has passed on to the Realms beyond, his spirit returns each Fall to wend its way along the trails he has trod, and to linger around the bluffs he knew so well. So if mine ever comes to visit and to linger around this valley, there should be wonderful memories of the good fellows I have met, who have cantered along the valley and trotted beside me up the draws. There will be memories too, of the many good dogs I have seen topping the ridges and questing for birds down amid the bluffs in Strawberry Valley.

Newton C. MacGregor, the President of the club, expressed his regret for his inability to render more help with the work involved in organizing and staging this year's trials, but promised to take a much more active part in the work from now on.

The assistance rendered at the Trials by Mrs. Beavis was greatly appreciated

by the members. Where ever and when ever, there is a bench show or field trial being staged around these parts, there you will see "Beavis" as she is familiarly called, lending a hand and in her own quiet way doing much to help things run smoothly.

The bulk of the work in organizing and staging this year's event, however, fell to the lot of Mr. and Mrs. J. R. T. Forbes, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer respectively. As youngsters, we were taught never to whip a willing horse. So, folks, why not get behind this good couple and do your share to lighten their task.

Mrs. R. L. Orge, one of the original members and a real booster for the club ever since it was organized, was absent this year for the first time. It would appear that while Ralph is doing his best to keep the wolf population on the prairie under control, Dolly is scaring the daylight out of those big Timber Wolves up in the mountains of British Columbia.

Among the ladies following on horseback we noticed Dr. Jean Morgan, the club's official Veterinarian, and Miss Lois Dean, who is frequently seen handling one of the "Aredde" Setters at the trials.

Not being present for the running of the Puppy, Derby or Amateur Stakes, I am unable to give any particulars regarding the work of the competing dogs, except to relate that I heard on excellent authority by those who had seen her in action, that in "Vagabond Jean of Glentanar", who placed first in the Derby, Mr. and Mrs. Forbes possesses a young dog which, if properly handled and given the opportunity from now on, will make field trial history for the Gordon Setter breed.

The Judges were Mr. Ralph Orge, who needs little introduction to the readers of Dogs in Canada, Mr. Johnnie Van-Impe of Saskatoon, who is rapidly making a name for himself in the field trial game, and the writer, while Mr. Jack Ayres, who knows all the answers when it comes to running a bench show or field trial, acted as Field Marshal.

Note: Jack mentioned that he was not feeling very well, but it was still a great shock to us when we were notified of his death during the following week.

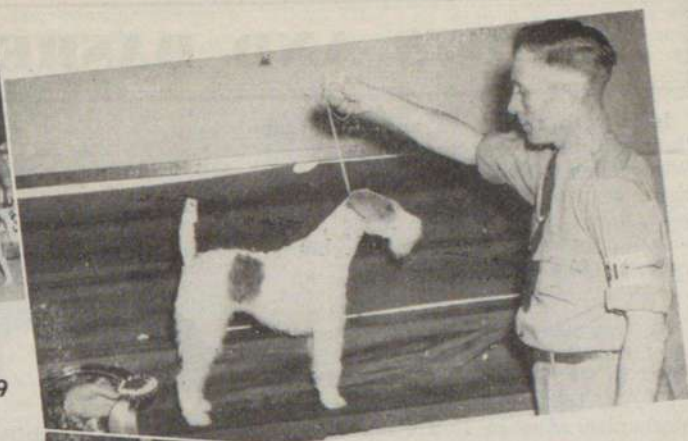

## ... DOTS AND DASHES - - -

It is with regret we announce that there will be no Dog Show at the Royal Winter Fair, this year. Indications are, however, that there will be one next year, when more space is made available for the entry which will, probably, exceed 1000 dogs.

In response to the many letters of commendation on the article by David Elliot in the September issue of DOGS IN CANADA, a further article on The Mechanical Age in Retrievers appears in this issue.

Mr. E. D. Adams, of Calgary, agrees with Mr. Elliot, and goes on to state:

"I do not know, Mr. David Elliott but I certainly concur in everything he says in regard to the way Retrievers are handled in the present day Field Trials. The Retriever today, even if he has all the brains in the world, is not allowed to use them. Going back to the years 1886-1900 in connection with Field Trials of Pointers and Setters, I well remember dogs coming up from Tennessee, and those dogs were handled practically on the same lines as the present day Retrievers are handled in Field Trials; that is to say, mechanically, a great pity!"

It is encouragement such as this which leads us to feel that educational articles which will disseminate information of value to breeders and others can be a leading factor in the promotion of pure-bred dogs in Canada.

We are all familiar with the names of such men as Sir Frederick Banting and Dr. C. H. Best who were awarded the Nobel Prize in 1921 for their research into diabetes which resulted in the insulin which has saved so many lives, and one could enumerate the names of many more scientists who have contributed remarkable discoveries and remedies for the alleviation of suffering to men. Contributions have been made by members of the Canadian Kennel Club to distemper research in other countries, so it is felt that with the eminent scientists in Canada and the facilities of the Ontario Veterinarian College at Guelph, we can contribute to research necessary for this work in our own country.

To effectively carry out the project, it will be necessary to have the research undertaken under the guidance of Dr. L. A. McNabb, Principal of the Ontario Veterinary College at Guelph, who will detail the Department of Virology to have charge of the investigation which will require a period of at least three years at an expense of approximately One Thousand Dollars a year.

In response to a suggestion from Miss V. E. Meyers to the Board of Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club that help be given to further this project, that body while appreciating the necessity for such a move, felt that the Club

could not at this time donate the amount necessary for the work. Following publication of this fact, Mrs. L. M. Hamilton of the Kincaid Kennels, Aurora, offered to donate Five Hundred Dollars as a start towards a fund for a Bursary.

It is an interesting fact and one that is a credit to Canadian Poodle people, that with few exceptions everyone wrote in with news of their Poodles, when it was announced that the October issue of Dogs in Canada was to be a special Poodle issue.

The article, POST WAR POODLES IN CANADA was written from the viewpoint of show bloodlines and all dogs mentioned—both show and obedience—are actually being used for breeding purposes.

The interest and support accorded this issue must be very heartening to all who have the welfare of the breed at heart, and we would like to thank those breeders who rallied 'round to make the issue a success.

## A Pullin' or a Pushin' Cocker?

WHAT is the correct gait in a cocker? This question has been before the "house of cockers" for many years, and through all these years, cockers are still being bred with three different gaits and all their variations. To get the records straight, let's set them down in their order.

First, there is the cocker, which when in movement or gait, appears to be driving from the rear, forward and upward constantly, with a top line appearing to be upward the whole way through his gaiting. He appears to be light on his feet, reaching well out in front at every stride, and his every movement is a smooth flow of body rhythm.

Second, we have a cocker, that, when in movement, gives one the appearance of throwing his rear end up in the air at each step, with the appearance of being sway backed when in motion, and with a hitch decidedly noticeable in his front steps.

Third, we have a cocker that is commonly known as a "paddler," seen more often in females than males, but very often correctly styled, physically, and of good type and construction.

The variations of these three movements in cockers, usually indicate certain improperly constructed parts of his anatomy. However, not in every instance, as dogs, the same as people, can learn to walk improperly, however well and correctly they are constructed.

But, as a whole, there are reasons for incorrect movements in the average cocker seen in the show ring, and it is improper construction.

Let us take the first gait mentioned above. This one would seem to indicate that this particular cocker was correctly put together, in good balance, which enables him to move correctly as a cocker or any other sporting dog, must. To be properly constructed to "gait" in this manner, he must have some outstanding points that are easily visible, such as, a relatively steep shoulder placement, a good strong back, a reasonably short thigh joint, which puts his rear end "down" naturally so his top line is a "natural" and does not require an overdone stifle bend to achieve it. Also, such a constructed specimen, when in motion, has a lower body balance to carry in his movement, therefore, drives with his rear quarters, and uses only his front quarters for the "pivot" action when in movement, giving him the appearance of constantly moving forward and upward at the same time. Coming down with less weight on his front feet than on his rear feet when in motion, he therefore has that smooth flow of movement, action, drive, or what you wish to call it, and is a thing of beauty to watch in motion.

The second gait mentioned above indicates that this specimen may have too much angulation in rear quarters by reason of too long a thigh joint, also improperly angulated thigh joint, too straight down from the top point instead of at approximately a 30° angle backwards. An over angulated stifle is a positive detriment to any sporting breed of dog. It causes much of the weakness noticeable in rear quarters, and is definitely less powerful in the "drive" of the rear quarters of any dog, spoils the sporting look of the top line of the cocker when in motion, and is usually the result of too long a thigh joint and too long a hock joint.

This specimen may also have too long a back, which may not appear to be to the eye, due probably to the extreme layback at the elbows, but again, in this specimen, you will find a definite lack of steepness at the shoulder, rather heavy shoulders without question, which gives excess weight to be placed on the front feet at the "pivot" movement when the



dog is in motion, and gives him a more or less "bouncy" gait. With this specimen, also, there can be many more faults, such as hock weakness, elbow looseness, excess loin span, etc. I should say the greatest number of faulty moving cockers come under this classification.

This third gait mentioned above is seen much more in the females than in the males, especially not in the large boned rugged constructed males, and is in many cases, due to environment, training methods, or manner in which they were raised, the exercise they got, etc. Frequently we see in the show ring, a beautifully styled female, correctly made, and without too many faults, that is a confirmed "paddler," yet without construction fault of any kind, to cause it. But for the most part, when examining the "paddlers", one finds quite often that they lack a top line, or steep enough shoulders which would prevent "paddling" in their cases, and come up to the standard of many years ago, where it called for a "square appearing" dog, an even top line so to speak, exactly as long as they are high. A specimen such as this, properly made in all other parts, with spirit, showmanship and personality that indicates she likes the show ring, will in all probability be a confirmed "paddler" in movement. Don't confuse the "paddler" with the high stepper. There is quite a difference in their construction. High stepping, usually (a good one) results from training with too tight a leash. The writer can recall some 30 years ago when nearly all cockers shown at that time were confirmed paddlers by reason of their construction, and had a definite "bounce" in every step of their movement.

There are quite a few variations of these three "gaits" in cockers, but the majority of them will fit either one of these three. However, so we get the picture clear, don't imagine for a minute that a cocker that has the absolutely smooth flow in motion and fits the first movement above mentioned, MUST be a perfect cocker. While this specimen may, in his movement, appear to be perfectly constructed in every way, he may still have many faults that may condemn him to be just an ordinary cocker otherwise, such as having a very poor head, turned in feet, slabsidedness, comparatively shallow rear quarter muscles, and other faults. Yet, with all these faults he may still, and in all probability could, move across the ring with that perfect picture of flowing rhythm, and in judgment, is put down to another cocker, who is a good deal more sound, physically in the extremities, and comes nearer to the ideal cocker picture, but, who can't just quite give one smooth picture when in motion than the other one can and does.

It is not my intention to go into the matter or question of "what is a good cocker," but as the breed is so well represented in dog circles all over the country, it seems to me there should be a better understanding of the correct and most desirable specimen all around to compete in the Sporting Group. We see cockers and cockers get into the Sporting Group at all the shows. In their classes at the shows they look wonderful, yet, when watching them compete in the Sporting Group, they look so different, pitifully lacking in that "something" that would put them on an equal basis with the other breeds in this group. It is not their size, for every now and then we see a performance of a cocker in the group, with his true sporting dog gait, that seems to lift him up to an equal size with the largest of them, and, having the rest of himself equally put together with the beauty and styling that becomes him, he goes on to win the Sporting Group, and, even Best in Show. But, this happens too few times for so many cockers shown, and the percentages are extremely small, too small for the breed, and, indicates room for a lot of improvement, and a lot of thought.

Jotting down a few random thoughts and observations of the cocker and his movement might not be amiss at this point, so will go back to a point in the cockers that has been argued pro and con for many generations of the breed. It is shoulders. As true cocker movement must be always forward and upward, the steep shoulder, properly constructed on an otherwise good cocker, he can have no other kind of movement but the correct one.

When you have an upright shoulder, you have one that "lays back" considerably at the withers, that is, back down towards the back, with considerable more angulation of the blade, than in the "low shoulder," and in the front view, the chest is longer than usual, and in most cases the lay-back at the elbows is very pronounced, but still does not lay-back as far as the "paddlers" in cockers, where the elbow lay-back is usually tremendous, and definitely interferes with the rib spring, and the resulting "wide chest" is inevitable.

This steep shoulder placement in cockers today, I should say, is a "must" if the cocker is to be put in the sporting group to stay. He really has to be up at the shoulder, and if his construction is proper at that point, he will have that same front characteristic as all other group sporting breeds, narrow, streamlined and built for speed.

Check me on this if you will, but in looking over a sporting group at a large show, you will see that every sporting dog in there, but the cocker, has a narrow front, very streamlined, shoulders, even to the point of looking rather delicate for a sporting dog. Incorrect shoulders on most of our cockers, make them look as though they should be in the "working dog group" for pulling power, instead of pushing power. But when you analyze shoulders without prejudice, look over the field one at a time, and take every animal where speed is essential, that is of foot, for the animal to earn his own living.

Take the lowly cotton tail rabbit. Quick sudden bursts of speed in his life. His front, shoulders and neck are extremely streamlined, has hardly any muscle at all on his front legs, very flat, and very angulated. To kill, dress, and eat a rabbit, all these things are most easily observed. Yet, he is a speed demon as you know. His hind quarters are very well meaty up, that is where all his eating meat is, in his hind quarters.

Now let's look at the modern race horses. Notice one as you see him go by, his shoulders are very flat and sleek, and front legs very delicate in appearance, yet he has speed to burn (unless you had a \$2.00 ticket on one and he came in last). Viewed from the front, a race horse is very narrow comparatively to his rear quarters which are much wider and powerful. His country cousin who has to work hard for his living in another way, in harness in the fields is very wide in front and very strong for "pulling" his way to his daily bread.

In other animals, some of the breeds who kill for their meat and meals, such as the tiger, lion and bear. All of them are very powerful in front quarters, so they can kill with one blow of their front paws, they need not depend on speed for their life. They haven't any either. All sporting dogs, if one were to turn them loose in the wild state, would have to "catch" their meals with their speed, or starve to death. I'll also venture the guess, that no one ever saw a heavy fronted coyote or wolf, or fox.

There are places for wide heavy fronts in animals of all breeds of dogs. If you stop to think of it, after all, a very fast animal, be it rabbit, horse, or dog, when they are running at top speed, they only use their front feet as a pivot for each stride. I do not know how much weight is exerted in the press of the front feet on the ground, to the rear feet on the ground when running, on any given

animal, but I do know it is not the same, front and rear. In tracking rabbits on a well packed snow it will always be noticed that the front feet tracks are barely visible, while the hind feet tracks are deep, indicating driving pressure. A fast running dog in the field on a well packed snow will give you this same picture. And I imagine a race horse would duplicate it, could he find snow packed hard enough to register accurately for his greater weight, once he is in full stride and going at top speed.

An experience years ago in hunting in the field over cockers, a great many of them, one of which was a female, very streamlined and steep at the shoulders making her quite leggy in front with a top line that was rarely seen in those days. At the same time this female was field broken, a male was taken with her. He happened to be a heavy fronted, heavy shouldered, strong looking specimen. After these two were field broken, came the hunting season.

In the years to come, about the third day in the field, the male would leave blood tracks in the snow where his feet were worn through and bleeding. This was caused by his being too heavy in the front and shoulders causing a severe pounding down on his front feet at every running step and jump, his whole weight would pound down on his front feet, resulting in a badly worn pad and bleeding. He was, by reason of his front heavy construction, a "paddler." After about the third day in the field successively, he couldn't get up out of his bed to go hunting, he was so stiff in his shoulder joints from trying to protect his aching feet from the pounding they took. But the female was prim and ready every morning for two weeks straight, to take to the field, not a single day missed from dawn until dark. This happened every year for about 5 years then I let the male be a house dog until he died at 14. Yet the female was still hunting well in the field at 13 years of age, going easily and tirelessly, and to see her in stride in the field was to see a perfect picture of flowing motion and graceful moves. The male looked in comparison, like a jumping, jiving Mexican bear when he was running, and bobbing up and down like a fishing cork on stormy water.

After observing all these experiences in the field working cocker, then seeing a cocker move in the show ring, one knows what will be found when examining them in pose. Some are just on the border line, and acceptable, others are impossible, and a few, just right, but not nearly enough of them for the quantity of the breed in existence today.

According to registrations of pure bred dogs, and on a percentage basis, every time a sporting dog wins Best in Show, other than a cocker, a cocker should win 10 Best in Shows. Cockers with their representation in the Sporting Group, by this same figuring, should win at least 9 sporting groups out of every 10, with one representative and 27 times with three representatives. But why don't they? That is the question, and the answer is simple. They are not being bred good enough in numbers. It is a challenge to all cocker breeders. Let's get our cockers "out of the mud" in front, and put that sporting movement into them. They are classed as Sporting dogs, at least make them look like sporting dogs, and move like one should.

One often hears lately "what is the matter with the cocker breed." Frankly to me there seems nothing the matter with them, that a few really good ones couldn't cure and quick. Let a few cockers appear that are good enough to win repeatedly Sporting Group after Sporting and Best in Show at 4 or 5 straight shows, such as quite often specimens do from the much less popular breeds and I'll venture the guess that the cocker will not only hold his own, but grow up quickly in the public's favor.



## The Forum

FROM the many letters received re the showing of dogs, there is one from Saskatoon which gave rise to this article. The writer of the letter breeds German Shepherd dogs, and in an effort to ascertain what is required of a dog in order to win at the bench shows, he has shown at the various shows on the Prairie Circuit. He is still, however, very confused, for he says, "I find the judging very inconsistent, and it is not giving me the information I am looking for. You may think, by this statement, that I am Kennel blind, so I shall explain that when two of my own dogs are up against one another one judge will put one up and another judge will choose the opposite dog, so I am really confused at the end of the shows. I do want to have a mind picture of perfection of form in my eyes to aim at, but exhibiting at the dog shows does not seem to be the answer."

Another writer complained that after her dog was judged she approached the judge politely with a query as to what was wrong with her dog. The judge, instead of exercising a little patience and recognizing that the question was an attempt to seek knowledge, informed the exhibitor that she was a poor sport.

Against this, we have a report regarding a judge who draws the largest entry of the breed wherever he goes. Some of the exhibitors do not necessarily agree with all of his placings, but they leave the show feeling that this man was honest—that he put the dogs as he saw them, regardless of who exhibited them. The same judge has told at the get-togethers after the show that he goes into the ring with but one thought in mind, and that is to please himself. He has bred many dogs and knows how difficult it is, sometimes, to satisfy everyone, but his honesty of purpose is such that he is one of the most popular of judges on the North American continent today.

The time will never come when every dog can be given a first prize, so a system must be found which will keep the exhibitors supporting the dog shows.

With the Annual Meeting in the near future, now is the opportune time for some method to be thought up regarding the judging situation, for we must find a solution if we are to follow through the object of our Constitution, i.e., "adopting means from time to time to protect and assist persons engaged in propagation, breeding and exhibition of pure-bred dogs."

We have read many editorials and arguments pro and con as to what should and should not be desired in a judge, and at one time a definite attempt was made towards something tangible in the recommendation of a School for Judges in Canada. It even went so far as to make arrangements for halls and teachers, and a well-known veteri-

narian offered his services to teach the anatomy of a dog. This latter is very necessary, in view of the fact that we have some 114 different breeds of dogs being judged today. The fact that a judge may be an expert in his own breed does not necessarily mean that he would also know the faults and good points of every other breed. But the idea was never carried through.

It is a fact that judges, superintendents, ring stewards, secretaries, etc., are part of the hub around which the wheel of the Canadian Kennel Club revolves. Therefore, they should be instructed as to the seriousness of their responsibilities.

When a premium list is sent out, the name of the judge or judges is printed in a prominent place and it is the dog owners' privilege to show or not to show under that judge or judges. The novices quite rightfully depend upon the honesty and integrity of the judge and it is only through experience that they, in time, learn to select a judge as carefully as they would select their dog before going to the show. Unfortunately, many of these novices who are not satisfied quit the game, but others carry on and become an integral part of our organization.

At the National Horse Show held during the Canadian National Exhibition, the writer was impressed by the group of Junior Judges from all parts of Canada who judged the horses, class by class. They marked their findings in their books and then left the ring before the final awards were given, handing in their books before they left so that they could be tabulated later by experienced judges. We have had something after this pattern at Junior judging contests, the most ardent supporters of this in Canada being William Pym, of Vancouver, and Dan Lerch of London, Ontario. The purpose of the contests is to assist in promoting a high standard for youthful judges by teaching them the importance of independent, unbiased judgment, good sportsmanship, the art of close observation and accurate mental photography; also to develop a retentive memory and the proper use of applicable terms in either oral or written expression. After the youngsters have made their awards and given their reasons in writing, two experienced judges go over each class and decide the placings. These are then compared with the children's and the judges explain their reasons for the placings. No contestant is allowed to inspect the dogs at the show, or wear any uniform, high school or club colours. Fifteen minutes is allowed to judge each class.

The International Kennel Club of Chicago has developed this Junior judging into a unique part of their organization and they would have liked to make it International by inviting some of the most outstanding Junior judges of Canada to compete in the Finals at their show each year. Canada did have

an entry, once, and the Finalists, both first and second, were from Canada, but nothing has since been done. A remedy must be found, however, if our dog shows are to rise to greater heights and efficiency. It has been suggested that we have a Commissioner, just as the baseball and hockey organizations have, who would appoint and allot judges to all dog shows.

Deep down in our hearts, the majority of us would like to show under judges who know dogs and are reasonably fair-minded and honest, but when such judges are appointed do we, ourselves, agree with their placings? When the exhibitor realizes that he raises himself in the estimation of all others by taking a loss in the spirit "This is just one show. Tomorrow will bring another at which I may be more successful", then only will the objective be achieved.

It has been suggested that there be a Committee set up to be more or less a central governing body where all complaints and endorsements could be investigated with a degree of privacy. This has been met by prominent dog fanciers, with the statement—"Who is to judge the judges?" "Who is capable of judging the judges?" These statements, however, are not necessary, because if this body of people are supported by all our clubs it would eliminate much of the personal bickering.

It was decided, a year ago, that catalogues be dispensed with in the dog show ring to be used by ring stewards, and so eliminate suspicions of some people that the judge was taking a peek. The ring steward, therefore, has a copy of all entries in the various classes, the same as the judge's book. This has led to confusion, for often the judge's book does not coincide with the catalogue.

In England, a judge may have a catalogue in his hands open at the breed which he is judging, where he can read all the details which are printed therein. We have never heard that the possession of the catalogue influenced the judge in any way in making his decision. It is said that for every law that is made, fifty laws may be found to circumvent the original law. If the presence of a catalogue in the ring will influence a judge, then that judge could not be deemed to possess the amount of knowledge necessary in a judge of dogs.

The system for the licensing of dog show judges in the American Kennel Club was published in the January, 1949, issue of *Dogs in Canada*, and from the smooth manner in which the American shows are being judged today it would seem that this method is bearing fruit.

We would like to hear from those who are familiar with the judging situation as to ways and means by which our present system can be improved.

## Manitoba Gun Dog Club Comes to Life

EARLY last spring, the urge to create more interest and enthusiasm in the training of sporting dogs made itself felt in a group of dog owners in Winnipeg. Several informal discussions took place and eventually Messrs. W. J. Monaghan and R. L. Orge, the President and Vice-President respectively of the Cocker Spaniel Specialty Club of Western Canada, brought the matter before the members of their Club. Upon being assured of the active support of the members, they offered the full support and co-operation of their Club to Mr. Hugh

Crozier, the field trial representative of the Canadian Kennel Club in Manitoba. Mr. Crozier then secured the assistance of Messrs. Frank Marsh, James Duganis, W. O. Sylvester, John Armytage, Homer Good, J. A. Findlay, Alex Gostick and other members of the Gun Dog Club of Manitoba. Informal discussions continued and eventually it was decided to hold a series of demonstrations of retrieving both on land and water.

Through the kind co-operation of Mr. G. W. Malaher, the Director of the Game & Fisheries Branch of the Provincial Department of Mines & Natural Resources, and of the Superintendent of the Canada Cement Company Limited, permission was secured to hold these demonstrations in the vicinity of the pits of the company just west of Fort Whyte.

At first gathering on June 17th, a small but very interested group watched nine dogs being worked. On the following Wednesday, another workout was held. Then in order to give the owners ample opportunity of further training their dogs, some three weeks were spent on intensive work and a great improvement was noted at the next demonstration on July 13th. The demonstration on August 3rd brought out well-trained dogs and over a hundred automobiles were counted in the parking space.

By this time everyone was keen on having a formal field trial.

Mr. Harry Bulloch, the President of the Gun Dog Club, called a meeting

which was well attended and at which it was decided not only to invite the support and co-operation of the members of the Game and Fish Association but to make formal application to the Canadian Kennel Club for approval to hold a field trial on Sunday, September 25th. It was also decided to hold one more retrieving demonstration at the cement works on August 24th.

Extensive preparations and plans were made and suitable publicity arranged for. The evening of August 24th was a real success and the enthusiasm of pre-war days was plainly evident. Hundreds of people turned out to add stimulus and encouragement to those who were working their dogs, and from appearances it is quite evident that the formal field trial will be well worth attending. Moreover, the interest and the demand were so great that the committee considered it would be well worth while to hold another demonstration before the formal field trial, and it was decided to carry out another programme on Sunday afternoon, September 11th. It is hoped that by holding it in the afternoon sufficient time will be available to work all the dogs both on land and in the water.

NOTE: The formal field trials of this Club were held at the east pit, Fort Whyte, where the Club's trophy, donated by the late Col. J. Tulloch, was won outright by Jim Duganis with his dog, Crozier's Duke of Neteley. The trials were highly successful and plans are now being made to make this a yearly event.

## Hull and District (Quebec) News

A MATTER that is being discussed by several prominent Collie breeders is the question of providing more than one Winners Class for the Collies. In view of the great increase in the number of Collies in our present day shows—"Sable"—"Sable & White"—"Tri-Colour"—"White"—"Blue Merle"—it is considered reasonable that more than one Winners Class should be provided for this breed in the C.K.C. Dog Show Rules. It might be suggested that they are still all Collies regardless of colour. That is only too true; but, the fact still remains, so it is with Cocker Spaniels—"Solid Black"—"Parti-Colour"—"Any other solid colour other than Black"—they are all Cocker Spaniels regardless of colour, yet six Winners Classes are provided for them. There does not seem to be

any legitimate reason why one breed should be favoured any more than another in this respect. No doubt Cocker Spaniels were granted this concession when the Cocker was having its heyday in the World of Dogdom at the shows, and perhaps the fact was lost sight of that same day another breed would develop in numbers to such an extent as to warrant similar consideration. That day would appear to have arrived. Collies in several recent shows have ranked second only to Cockers, and by a very small margin at that. The great strides in popularity made by the Collie during the past ten years has surpassed any other breed, and, with the advent of another motion picture in the offing, it seems quite safe to say that the Collie will rank at the top of the list in the very near future at many of the Championship shows.

However, the subject is a very interesting one, especially to the Collie fanciers, and one that would seem to warrant the consideration of our Board of Directors at the next Annual General Meeting. Suffice it to say, nobody would lose anything by the provision of more than one Winners Class for Collies. On the other hand, the show-giving clubs would stand to gain considerably by virtue of the greater increase in the number of entries.

## All-Canadian Fox Hunters' Association

The bugle voice of the hound and the call of the hunter's horn are being heard resounding in the hills and fields in Ontario and Quebec, as owners are preparing their hounds for district field trials and the honour of competing in the All-Canadian trial for the title of "All-Canadian Foxhound Field Trial Winner."

Foxhound field trials are a comparatively new venture in Canada, for it was not until very recent years that any attempt was made to hold organized competition for foxhounds, although field trials for bird dogs and beagles had for many years attracted entrants from south of the border. In 1947, the idea was conceived of establishing an All-Canadian Foxhunters' Association with the purpose in view of conducting a trial at which district winners might compete. The idea was sown in fertile soil so that today we find in ever-increasing number faster and tougher hounds competing in the district and central trials.

Great strides are being made towards establishing the All-Canadian Field Trial as a national event. The steps of progress have led the All-Canadian Foxhunters' Association directorate to approach the Canadian Kennel Club with a view to conducting the trial in conformity with the requirements of that body and declaration of the winner as the "C.K.C. Field Trial Champion." Breeders will doubtless greet with acclaim the successful conclusion of negotiations between these two organizations, which cannot be other than mutually advantageous.

## Great Dane Club of America, Inc.

By Nelli A. Williams

**T**HE primary purpose of a Dog Breed Club is to strive to perfect the dogs of the breed it represents, in accordance with the Standards that have been set up for the breed. All the objectives of the Specialty Club should be either directly or indirectly tied up with that objective.

It is vitally important that the Standards be determined on, logically and scientifically sound physiological facts and possibilities. This means that not only genealogy, but also the probable future usage of the dog be considered before the various component parts are evaluated.

Once these things are determined, the Specialty Club should do everything within its power to influence Breeders to breed and raise their dogs in such a manner that they will exemplify the Standard in the most perfect manner possible. To help accomplish this, it should stimulate interest in the breed. Some of the best media for accomplishing this, are through the holding of periodical instructions and discussions on the Standard, instruction courses in judging and the annual Specialty Shows.

Since its first set of Standards was adopted, the Great Dane Club of America has twice revised them, first in 1935 and again in 1945. The Club has thus shown its realization of changes that have taken place and has made it easier for both Judges and Breeders to more intelligently recognize these changes and to conform to logical regulations.

The Dane Club has always actively advocated that Breeders and others interested in the Great Dane try to quality as Judges. In the years 1939, 1940 and 1941, the Club held numerous instruction classes in Judging and at the present time, its Student Judges are receiving constant and competent aid in developing their knowledge of the Dane and the art of Judging.

With regard to the holding of Specialty Shows, the great Dane Club has always fostered that idea and is now operating on a schedule of at least one Specialty Show a year. The Club has voted to hold two Specialty Shows in 1950. The Club's most recent Specialty Show was held September 11 at Rye, N.Y., in conjunction with the Westchester Kennel Club Show.

Having covered the structure of the Dane, there remains the coat and its color. The coat should be very short and thick. It should lie very smooth, and have plenty of gloss, while the color is divided into the following: fawn, which varies from the lightest yellow to deepest golden tan. It is most desirable to have black shadings on the muzzle, ears, and brows. White is tolerated on the chest or toes, but it is really undesirable. The nose must be black, and the eyes and nails dark. The golden fawn should be preferred, while silver, or blue gray, or biscuit-colored fawn shades should be considered color faults.

Brindles have the same body shades as the fawns, together with the same black shadings on the head, but the body should be striped with pure black distinct stripes, the body color showing clearly between them.

The same rule concerning the nose, eyes, nails, and white markings of the fawns also applies to the brindle color. Faults in this color are silver gray, blue gray, biscuit fawn, or a dirty fawn color.

Blue Danes vary from light gray to deep slate. Again the rule of dark eyes, nails, black nose, and white markings applies to this color also.

Harlequins should have a pure white ground color on which patches of black are distributed all over the dog in a pleasing pattern. The pink, or butterfly, nose is permissible, and so are wall eyes. But dark eyes and nails, and black noses are distinctly preferred.

He pointed out that when the delegates met with officials of the Department of Agriculture on March 3 it was understood that the Club would undertake to educate its members as to the Department's views in respect to adequate identification, and that in the meantime, providing breeders provided a full description of the color and colors of dogs, registrations would continue as before. He further pointed out when this arrangement was made with the Department no date was set at which time identification requirements would be different from the method which had been practised by breeders for many years.

The Secretary then read a letter received from the Canadian National Live Stock Records dated September 15, 1949, to which was attached copy of a letter addressed to Mr. Hitchman on September 13 by Mr. A. P. MacFannel, Chief Registration officer of the Department of Agriculture. These letters indicated that the Department was not prepared to approve of certificates for dogs whose identification would not be sufficient to distinguish one animal from another of the same breed.

The President then read a letter which he addressed to J. G. Taggart, Deputy Minister of Agriculture, on September 19, in which he made reference to the inconvenience and embarrassment which many breeders would experience since no specific notice had been given them indicating that as from a stated date they would be required to practise any form of identification beyond that which they had previously followed. The President's letter to Mr. Taggart further dealt with action that had been taken following the meeting in March and concluded with a suggestion that a further meeting of representatives of the Club with Departmental officials be held.

**RESOLUTION:** It was regularly moved by Director Riedel, seconded by Director Roberts:

**SUBJECT:** The Secretary reported that The Collie and Shetland Sheepdog Club of Canada had applied for permission to hold a sanction show in Toronto "on the evening before the annual Directors' meeting, the first week in February".

**ACTION:** Since no final decision had been reached re the dates for the annual meetings, the application was ordered held over for further consideration at the next meeting of the Board.

**SUBJECT:** The Secretary read a letter from the Victoria City Kennel Club which reported that at a regular monthly meeting of the Club the granting of show privileges (by the Canadian Kennel Club) to service clubs and like organizations had been discussed, and that it was the feeling of the Victoria City Kennel Club that the purposes for which such shows are held by service clubs would be realized and bigger and better shows result if held under the guidance of recognized kennel clubs.

**DISCUSSION:** In discussing the views expressed in the letter read by the Secretary, the Board agreed that until such time as it is established that shows held by other than strictly canine associations are detrimental to shows held by canine associations, and until there is a more equitable arrangement in respect to costs (to the Canadian Kennel Club) for these shows, the only interest of the Club is to see that such shows, regardless of the organizations responsible for their being staged, conform to the rules adopted by the Canadian Kennel Club.

**ACTION:** The Secretary was directed to convey the Board's views to the Victoria City Kennel Club.

**REPORT:** The Secretary reviewed correspondence with the Quebec Provincial Director and the Gatineau County Agricultural Society regarding the distribution of literature (including name of judge) by the Society before the approval of the proposed judge by the Quebec Provincial Director was sought.

**ACTION:** The matter was left in the Secretary's hands for further attention.

**SUBJECT:** The Secretary read a letter from the Eastern Ontario Collie Club extending an invitation to the Officers and Directors of the Canadian Kennel Club to attend its specialty show to be held on October 15.

**ACTION:** The Secretary was directed to convey to the Eastern Ontario Collie Club the appreciation of the individual members of the Board for their kind invitation.

**1431 (1414). REGISTRATION OF CLUB NAMES**

**SUBJECT:** The Secretary reported that applications for registration of the following Club names had been received, that notice in respect to these applications had been published in DOGS IN CANADA, and no objection to either application had been received:

**RESOLUTION:** It was regularly moved by Director Riedel, seconded by Director Roberts:

"THAT, the applications for registration of club names reported on by the Secretary be approved." Motion carried.

**1432 (1401). CONSTITUTION AND AMENDMENT THERETO**

**ADOPTED AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETINGS (1948 and 1949)**

**REPORT:** The Secretary read a letter received from Mr. A. P. MacVannel, Chief Registration Officer of the Department of Agriculture, with which was returned the Club's applications for approval of the Constitution and By-laws adopted at the annual general meeting held in February, 1948, and the amendment to the Constitution adopted at the annual general meeting in 1949. Mr. MacVannel's letter indicated that these did not receive Departmental approval.

**ACTION:** No action was ordered taken at this time.

**1433 (1416). NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP RETRIEVER STAKE**

**REPORT:** The Secretary reported that he had, as directed by the Board, sought the opinions of field trial clubs holding Retriever trials in Canada as to the message received from Mr. Grant Mahood in respect to the application of the National Retriever Club (Canada) Ltd. for permission to hold a National Championship Retriever stake in accordance with Chapter 10, Section 21, of the Field Trial Rules and Regulations.

The Secretary read letters received from the following:

- T. A. Brown, Secretary of the B.C. Gun Dog Club Inc.;
- W. H. Broughall, Secretary of the York Field Trials Club;
- J. E. Kingsley, Field Trial Secretary of the Parksville Fish & Game Association;
- E. L. McLaren, President of the Pacific Coast Retriever Association;
- G. W. Tomlinson, Secretary-Treasurer of the Alberta Field Trials Club;
- J. M. Fleming, Secretary-Treasurer of The Ponoka Sporting Dog Club;
- T. S. Mounsell, Past Secretary of the Pacific Coast Retriever Association.

**DISCUSSION:** In discussing the organization of the Association which sponsors the Annual National Championship Retriever Stake in the United States, the Board noted that the National Retriever Field Trial Club has as members almost all of the Retrievers Clubs in the United States and the member clubs each appoint a representative to attend the annual meeting of the club. At the annual meeting the officers of the club are

elected as well as a Field Trial Committee which has full charge and authority over the conduct of National Open All Age Stake.

**ACTION:** The Secretary was directed to inform Mr. Mahood that the Board looks with favor on the formation of a truly national field trial organization for the purpose of holding a National Championship Retriever Stake, but before taking steps to authorize the holding of the stake this year or in future years it feels that it should be provided with a copy of the Constitution and By-laws of an Association contemplating the holding of such a stake and full particulars about the privileges that would be enjoyed by any Club affiliated or in any way concerned with the operations of a national organization formed specifically for the purpose of holding this Stake.

**1434 (1406). DISTEMPER RESEARCH FUND**

**REPORT:** The Secretary reported that he had discussed with Mrs. L. M. Hamilton and the Editor of DOGS IN CANADA the Board's decision in authorizing the use of a reasonable amount of space in the magazine for the purpose of publicizing the appeal for subscriptions to the research fund. Mrs. Hamilton had indicated that she did not wish to participate in the handling of donations to the fund.

**DISCUSSION:** In discussing this point the Board agreed that the Club could not undertake to handle such donations and it was agreed that it be suggested that a special Committee of those interested in the fund (the Guelph Veterinary College and such other persons keenly interested in this research work) be organized for that purpose and in that way cheques could be made payable direct to the fund which would be handled by this special committee.

**1435. PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR SHOWS**

**REPORT:** The Secretary reported that this matter had been placed on the agenda at the request of Director Jack Thorndike, Jr.

**ACTION:** The matter was ordered held over until the next meeting of the Board so that Mr. Thorndike could present his views on this matter.

**1436. ELECTION MATTERS**

**SUBJECT:** The Secretary reported that while Newfoundland was now a Province in the Dominion, nothing appeared in the Club's Constitution indicating the status of members living in Newfoundland so far as it concerned the annual election of Officers, Directors, Field Trial Representatives and Provincial Committees.

**ACTION:** The matter was ordered held over for further consideration, it being agreed that nothing could now be done on this subject until the Constitution has been appropriately amended.

**1437. FINANCIAL STATEMENT**

**SUBJECT:** The President referred to a suggestion made in his message to the members as dealt with at the annual meetings wherein he suggested that a financial statement for the period ending September 30th should be published for the information of all members.

**ACTION:** The Secretary was directed to prepare such a statement and arrange for its publication in the November issue of DOGS IN CANADA.

**1438. DOG SHOW DURING WINTER FAIR**

**SUBJECT:** Vice-President Brown pointed out that many dog fanciers were desirous of a dog show being held at the same time as the Royal Winter Fair, and since it appeared that no action was being taken by any organization to arrange for such a show he felt that such a show should be staged and that profits from the show should be turned over to The Canadian Kennel Club.

**DISCUSSION:** The Board agreed that while such a show should not be sponsored by the Canadian Kennel Club, it would be prepared to authorize the use of the facilities of the Club's offices and the services of its staff in the event that such a show is organized and held during the Winter Fair.

Vice-President Brown suggested that representatives of the various local clubs and other persons interested be asked to attend a meeting for the purpose of appointing a show committee, and make any other necessary arrangements to ensure the success of the show.

**RESOLUTION:** It was regularly moved by Director Riedel, seconded by Director Davies:

"THAT, in the event a committee is appointed and a dog show is held on or about the time of the Royal Winter Fair, the facilities of the club's offices and the services of its staff be made available to the Committee on the understanding that all profits accruing from this show will be turned over to the Canadian Kennel Club and a statement of revenue and expenditures published in DOGS IN CANADA." Motion carried.

**ACTION:** Mr. Walter Brown was appointed as chairman pro tem of any committee organized until a permanent chairman is elected.

**1440 (1422). IDENTIFICATION**

**DISCUSSION:** The Board discussed the action that should be taken in view of recent developments which indicated that many certificates of registration had been and were about to be turned back without Departmental approval. It was felt that a permanent solution to this problem should be sought and that a delegation should be appointed for the purpose of taking up the matter with the Minister of Agriculture.

**RESOLUTION:** It was regularly moved by Director Riedel, seconded by Director Roberts:

"THAT, in view of the stoppage of registrations without warning to the Club, the Board has instructed that a deputation of not less than three persons including the President and Vice-President wait on the Minister of Agriculture for the purpose of obtaining a permanent solution to the problem." Motion carried.

The Board agreed that this meeting should reconvene at the call of the President to further deal with this matter.

**1441. ADJOURNMENT**

**RESOLUTION:** At 10.25 p.m. it was regularly moved by Director Davies, seconded by Director Roberts:

"THAT, this meeting of the Board of Directors adjourn to reconvene at the call of the President." Motion carried.
