If I had not made out these papers correctly, surely I would have been informed by this time.

Another breeder has a litter of Boxers four months old. She also has heard nothing regarding her litter registration for several weeks, and no word concerning registrations which were submitted a month ago.

I fail to see why these things take so long... but will try to understand any sensible explanation given. When you have pups sold and clients anxiously awaiting their papers, it gets to the point where the buyers look at you with doubtful eyes when you try to re-assure them and explain the circumstances.

COCKER FANCIER DIES

... It is with a feeling of sadness and regret that we report the death of Lorne Broley of Brookwood Kennel fame on Tuesday, July 1st. He had been ill and in an oxygen tent for two weeks suffering from an attack of virus pneumonia.

Lorne Broley was one of the founders of the Cocker Spaniel Club of Central Ontario, Inc. and as a member did much to improve the Cocker Spaniel in Canada through his importation of many good dogs of which Int. Ch. Brookwood Candidate was perhaps the best known.

At various times his interest seemed to stray from the black variety to the AS-COBS and to a minor degree the Particolors but he remained true to the blacks and died while trying to establish a strong Bangaway strain in Canada.

While business interests forced him to reduce his once extensive kennel and fore-go club meetings, he still managed to make a number of dog shows either as exhibitor or spectator and was a friend to all along the Cocker benches.

The duty (paid by the importer) is 7½ to 10% of the declared value of the dog shipped into Canada from the U.S.A. The amount is refundable when application is made to the Customs Office in the importer's city, on an import certificate available from The Canadian Kennel Club. For full information suggest writing to The Customs Department, Parliament Bldgs., Ottawa, Ont.—Ed.

REDS, NOT ASCOBS

... Last evening I made a more careful reading of the article in the August issue of *Dogs in Canada* entitled "Proposed Survey For Cockers". I am quoted in that article as saying that the better marked black and tans follow the conformation of the Ascobs. Having the minutes of that meeting as taken down by Mrs. Marian Brown, I referred back to them and what I said at the meeting and the way it was recorded is this: "The better marked black and tans follow the conformation of the Reds". This is a very important distinction, to ignore it would be a serious error on my part.

The most important tools the serious breeder must have are Observation and Curiosity; without them he could not select future breeding stock or the best stud to use at breeding time. To amplify these remarks let us compare black-factored cream buffs or buffs with red-bred Cockers. The black-factored buffs would possess short backs, lovely heads, flat bone and elegant furnishings, whereas the reds would have coarser heads, higher quarters, bulgy muscles on rounded bone structure and not as nicely furnished with coat. The black-factored buffs also carry the linkage between short backs, proper front leg length and shoulder construction, so important in the modern styled Cocker Spaniel.

When we consider that the foregoing also applies to the Parti-color Variety of Cocker, I hope that you will agree with me that it is very important to serious breeders that I be quoted correctly.

THE OLD TIMER

Some people seem to have all the bad luck, observed the Old Timer, and small wonder — they put out the welcome mat for it.

"You know," said the Old Timer, "I think it's his own fault."

That's a habit the Old Timer has. He'll sit, thoughtful, for a minute or two, and then suddenly become vocal. Those who don't know the Old Timer may be thrown off base by these sudden, out of the blue, utterances, but I've sat too often and too long with him in his kennels not to be used to his habits. So I did the obvious.

"What is whose own fault?" I asked.

"Well, I've been thinking of Joe Blfskz," said the Old Timer.

Now, of course, there's no real Joe Blfskz, but this character, over the years had earned the name—you know, after the character in the comic strips who was continually dogged by misfortune. Anything the canine Joe Blfskz touched, crumbled. If he paid a whopping big stud fee, to breed to a popular and producing stud, chances were his female would miss entirely or at the most present him with one or two puppies. The latter was usually the case, for if there was no progeny he'd get a second mating. One or two pups would deprive him of that second chance.

And if a female was bred accidentally, by one of his own dogs, or as not infrequently happened, by a neighborhood nondescript, there'd be a full litter.

If he was going to a dog show and his was one of the first breeds to be judged he'd have a puncture or a breakdown and arrive too late to take his dog into the ring. Or, if he got there on time, he was very likely to be off with a crony some place and miss his call into the ring.

His lamentations were loud and long. These were the things that had earned him his nickname. Only yesterday he'd been around to the Old Timer bemoaning his luck. He'd bought a good female. He'd bred her to a good sire. And for once in his life he'd had a promising litter of seven puppies. Then, about three days after their birth the puppies began to slip down hill. When he'd been around to see the Old Timer only two were left alive.

"Yes, I've been doing a lot of thinking about Joe," said the Old Timer "and I think it's time I had a talk with him."

"Like what?" I asked. "What happens to him is the way the ball bounces."

The Old Timer looked at me. Then he took out his pipe and filled it carefully. He tilted back the old arm chair until his head was leaning against the wall of the tack room and pulled his old fedora down over his eyes.

"It's the way the ball bounces, all right," he said, "but did you ever stop to think that maybe Joe makes it bounce that way. Ever take a look at his car when he gets to a dog show?"

I admitted I hadn't.

"Take a look at the tires sometime," he said. "You'll find them either so soft, they're almost riding on the rims or so hard you can hear the car rattling a hundred yards away. And have you ever seen it washed, or the windows clean? You know I think his car, as much as anything, provides the answer to Joe's tough luck."

I asked him what he meant.

"It's indicative of Joe," he said. "He

lives in 'mananaland' — you know never do today what you can do tomorrow. Ever been in his kennels?"

Again my answer was in the negative.

"I have," he said "and they're good kennels—or were when Joe started out. But the breaks in the wire of the runs is something Joe will repair tomorrow. There's the answer to his mongrel litters. There isn't a stall without old stale food in it—bad nutrition could be the answer to his females failing to produce. And his whelping arrangements are something out of this world and should be."

"His whelping arrangements?" I asked.

"Let's say his lack of arrangements. I was there once while one of his females was whelping. You never saw anything like it. No whelping box and the floor of the stall she was whelping in was covered with a dirty old piece of carpet that had probably, without cleaning or washing, seen the birth of dozens of litters. Joe did nothing."

"But isn't it sometimes better to leave the female to herself?" I asked.

"Sometimes," the Old Timer said, "but rarely. The occasional female may resent assistance but most of them welcome it."

"Okay, what should Joe do?" I asked.

"Millions of dollars have been spent on canine research," the Old Timer said, "and we've learned something from it, or should have. The raising of healthy puppies should be just as exact a science as the raising of healthy children. First of all, the female should be prepared for motherhood."

"And how would you do that?" I asked.

"Well, every good breeder has a record of his female's seasons," he said. "He should know reasonably well in advance, when he plans to mate her. And the preparation should begin well before the mating date. First of all, make sure she's not too fat nor too thin. Make sure she's getting in her diet all the vitamin and mineral supplements she needs. If she's not in good condition the eggs won't be there for the male to fertilize at the time of the mating. And finally, have a stool analysis made. Make sure she's worm free."

"And after the mating, what?" I asked.


"The same care. The same careful feeding. Calcium supplements to help make bone on the puppies—and one other thing, a booster shot against distemper and hepatitis."

Most of the things about which the Old Timer had spoken were old hat. But the booster shot, after pregnancy had occurred was something new to me.

"A booster shot?" I asked, "how come?"

"You know, don't you, that if the female herself is immune she'll pass on that immunity to her puppies for a few weeks after their birth?" the Old Timer asked.

MEMO FROM THE EDITOR

It's about time court officials and other citizens learned that while to some people a pet is a pet, to others a dog, cat or bird is a beloved friend. Court orders should be obeyed, when they are being handed down but consideration might also be given the circumstances.

From time to time we hear of children broken-hearted because their dog is condemned for some misdemeanour. That in itself is sad. But when the sole companion of an elderly person is to be destroyed, it is a cruel thing. Children can learn to love another dog, and they make new friends readily. An older person cannot.

A case in point is that of Mrs. Maude Robertson of Centre Island, Toronto. The 80-year-old widow was taken forcibly from the courtroom in hysterics on being told that her 10-year-old Wire-haired Terrier must be destroyed. The dog was on probation after biting an 18-months-old baby last year. At that time Mrs. Robertson was told that "every dog is entitled to one bite, but only one bite." A few weeks ago a three-year-old child was taken to hospital for treatment of six punctures caused by the dog's teeth. Mr. Robertson, who has had two novels published in England, was in the city when Sport got out of the house. Apparently he was chasing another dog, when some children tried to touch him.

Neighbours were shocked when they were told Sport must be put down. Children living next door protested he was always very good, "except when they teased him." Mrs. Robertson, who lost her husband just a year ago, maintained the dog never bites unless teased.

In the meantime, learning of her plight, friends and even strangers telephoned, offering to hide him for her. Now Sport is missing, but not lost. He'll remain away on a visit until Mrs. Robertson can sell her house and move elsewhere. "If I have to go to jail for disobeying the magistrate's order, then I'll go," stated the lonely woman. "But they won't get Sport."

Living in the country has both advantages and disadvantages, as readers with an "R.R." address will agree. But after reading this bit of beautiful writing from Guy Murchie's *Song of the Sky*, (Houghton Mifflin) the disadvantages may all seem on the side of city living.

"If you listen closely, each kind of tree is a musical instrument; the apple a cello, the old oak a bass viol, the cyprus a harp, the willow a flute, the young pine a muted violin. Put your ear close to the whispering branch and you may catch what it is saying: the brittle twitter of dry oak leaves in winter, the faint breathing of the juniper, the whirring of hickory twigs, the thrumming of slender birch clumps, the mild murmuring of the sugar maple, and behind them all the thunder of whole bare trees in a headlong tide of air."

I said that I did.

"And you know, don't you, that more is known about vaccines than ever and that the so-called permanence is problematical?"

I agreed that I knew this too.

"Well doesn't it make sense to make sure the female has the immunity. I've had autopsies done on a litter of puppies that died three days after birth to a so-called immune female and all died of hepatitis. She just had no immunity to pass on and when I brought home the bug from a show—as I apparently did—the puppies died like flies. Now with a booster shot I make sure the female can protect her puppies until the time comes to start their own immunization treatment. And finally the birth itself."

I asked for details.

"No reason that a whelping area can not be as sanitary almost as a human maternity ward," the Old Timer said. "Prepare for the whelping. Scrub the whelping box and whelping cage with a good strong disinfectant. Have your disinfectants handy when the whelping starts. Pad the whelping box with many layers of good clean newspaper and then sit back and wait."

"And when the whelping starts?" I asked.

"Be there to help. Many dog people will argue that it's good practice to let the female cut the cord. I don't agree. The mother's teeth can set up a naval infection. Similarly a dirty old carpet or a dirty whelping box can also cause infection. That's why I say pad the box with a layer of newspapers. When one puppy is born the top couple of papers can be lifted up—with the placenta—and disposed of. Everything can then be clean for the next. Thoroughly disinfected scissors, to cut the cord, and a touch of antiseptic on the severed cord is a common sense precaution.

"No, no doubt about it. I'm surer than ever that most of Joe Blfskz' tough luck is nothing more than a severe case of laziness and the non-use of elbow grease."

FASHION NOTE

A new wonder yarn for sweaters was introduced at a press reception recently, which seemed to us "made" for doggy and outdoor people. The yarn, called Bon-ora, is a combination of high-bulk orlon and textured nylon developed by Grand'Mere Knitting. Washable? If you accidentally put your Bon-ora sweater in a washing machine full of hot water, it will emerge fresh and unharmed. We examined one which had been washed 300 times, taking the equivalent of 15 years of wear. It was unfaded with no sign of "pile". The sweaters are snag and moth-proof, will dry without wrinkles and don't cling. Altogether, ideal for people with little time to worry about their wardrobes.

TRAINED RETRIEVERS

Every year . . . millions of fine birds are needlessly left to rot in thick cover and moving water . . . yet with more trained retrievers in action, fewer birds need be shot to reach the legal limit.

SPORTING Dogs known as Retrievers include several separate breeds. Those most frequently seen competing in field trials are: Labrador Retrievers (black, sometimes yellow, or occasionally chocolate in colour); Golden Retrievers, which have longer, silkier coats; and the rugged Chesapeake Bay Retrievers. By far the most numerous are black Labrador Retrievers. Next in popularity are the beautiful Golden Retrievers. Chesapeake Bay Retrievers, one of the few truly North American breeds, are fewer in number.

Regardless of individual breed preference as owners, retriever men universally admire a good retriever working with skill and enthusiasm. There are splendid representatives of each breed.

Retrievers share several characteristics. In size the males weigh around 70 pounds, with some much larger or occasionally smaller. They have dense oily undercoats which shed water and enable them to withstand severe cold. They are natural water dogs. Physically they move with speed and grace, but are solidly and powerfully built, with stamina to work all day under tough conditions. Their scenting ability is highly developed, as is their interest in game. Their eyesight is remarkably good. Retriever puppies, as soon as they can walk, will chase a thrown object and return it to the hand of a human. These breeds are very interested in working for people. From generations of breeding for "soft mouth" they will not kill or injure the game they retrieve, but carry it with great tenderness.

The character of the Labrador Retriever, with which the

writer is most familiar, applies in many respects to all retrievers. Generally speaking, Chesapeakes by temperament are usually considered to be somewhat more and Golden a little less aggressive than Labradors. The Labrador is a gentleman — dignified, wise, quiet, and sweet tempered. An adult will not fawn on strangers, but under all normal circumstances is polite and well disposed towards humans, and particularly gentle and loving with children. Labradors are among the most popular of all breeds, both in Great Britain and North America, and undoubtedly their nobility of nature, as much as their remarkable record as field trial winners, accounts for their steady increase during a period now well over 100 years.

Because of the well established and growing interest in retriever training and in field trial clubs, there are many breeders of working retrievers. These dogs are continually called upon to demonstrate their ability in trials and while hunting, and ensure that the qualities of temperament and working excellence of the retriever breeds are maintained. That retrievers often are both handsome and good workers is evidenced by the number of Champions or Dual Champions competing in trials.

Retrievers should not be shy or nervous, wilfully stubborn, flighty, yappy, or vicious, and these characteristics are untypical.

They should have unflagging eagerness to retrieve, as a



AFGHAN

This aristocrat has remained unchanged since Moses received the Ten Commandments at Mount Sinai, its original home. This breed not only hunts animals as large as deer and ferocious as leopards, but guards herds and flocks. The Afghan is constructed ideally for his home territory. His feet are shaped for travel over rough wasteland, his hip bones set high and wide, and he can stand heat and cold. He is actually a hardy dog. A fine companion, and excellent in obedience.

BASENJI

Comparatively new to North America, but gaining interest wherever shown, the dapper Basenji is one of the older dog families. The sole breed known as "barkless", he is not noiseless. He chortles when pleased, and will occasionally growl. Famed as a hunting dog in Central Africa (silent of foot and mimics the prey) he both points and retrieves. Other unique characteristics: a deeply wrinkled forehead, curling tail carried over back, a playful companion, fastidious as a cat, no doggy odour. Ideal for city living.

Characteristics: a keen nose, determination, willingness to work in rough and open cover in any weather. Hardy, easily kept in condition. Quick to learn, needing less training than most breeds, this cocky little sportsman has dignity, likes attention, responds readily to kindness.

One of the most famous of all breeds, the Bloodhound is the only four-footed animal whose testimony is acceptable in court. Bloodhound authority Dr. Leon F. Whitney considers the breed of three types (1) show type, (2) man trailers of medium build who work on a leash, (3) penitentiary type, racier, faster, can be taught to attack, good tree dogs. Innumerable lost persons have been recovered by Bloodhounds, and many lives saved. An extremely affectionate dog, not quarrelsome with people or other dogs. Somewhat shy, thinskinne'd physically and in sensitivity.

Serving man in the field from our ancestors' early days, the Coonhound is famed as a night hunter. His three greatest assets are: a superior nose, exceptional keenness on trail and determination to force the quarry to tree. Fanciers of the Black and Tan have scrupulously kept detailed records and improved their breed to become the first Coonhound variety recognized. This hardy animal is able to stand heat or cold, also works well on deer, bear, mountain lions and bobcats, and are valuable in controlling the "cat" menace in stock country.

DACHSHUND (Smooth)

The debonair Dachsie is making up for lost time (war) and is daily gaining in popularity. Low-slung and perfectly assembled for his specialty of badger hunting, he uses heart and brains as well as muscle. He is the national dog of Germany, but has found even greater acceptance in many other countries. There are even field trials (on rabbit) and they have been known to work, in a group, on deer. Pretty much a one-man dog, the Little Dachsie is nevertheless friendly, lively and an ideal house pet—extremely neat, no shedding, no doggy odours, a fine traveller.

DACHSHUND (Long-haired)

For many people, a dog must have certain qualities in appearance, size and temperament. The Dachshund, standard type, for example, exactly fits the requirements of many would-be purchasers, except for one — they prefer long hair. Made to order, then, is the Long-haired Dachshund, with its silky long coat in a variety of rich colours, usually red (tan), red-yellow, or yellow or two-colours, deep black, chocolate, white or gray, with rust-brown markings. A beautiful creature, wise, understanding, loving, a dog taking its place as a member of the family, with no muss or fuss. The coat itself is something like that of an Irish Setter, giving an elegant appearance to the dog.

The trick in outcrossing the smooth standard Dachshund with terrier types was in excluding other breed characteristics while obtaining the desired wire coat. The rough coat also serves as protection in combat with the badger, who fights to the end. The wire has all the excellent qualities of the smooth, wrapped in special packaging. He takes care of himself, and devotes his life to the family.

The qualities are identical — no bathing (barring accidents), no plucking or trimming necessary, no hairs left on clothing or furniture. As for personality, the little Dachsie is full of fun, a loyal companion, and quick to announce a stranger. Ideal for small home and apartment living, and small car driving.

The Royal Dog of Scotland, which resembles a shaggy Greyhound, has a keen scent for tracking, tremendous strength, and can outrun a deer, coyote, wolf or rabbit. The Deerhound trains well, and is a vastly loyal and dependable dog, craving human companionship.

He also developed skill as a gun dog and retriever. A lesser known talent is that of working well with livestock on farms. The Elkhound is hardy and sound, yet small enough to fit into the household, where he is the pride of many city families. He is typical of the Northern dog, including the tail curled over the back.

The Russian trainer refused in view of the act. Sir Dudley then bought the eight outright, then bred them for eight years without outcrossing. Sportsmen preferred a smaller dog, so he made a cross with the Bloodhound, the only known cross perpetrated. Qualities: love of work, sagacity, trains easily, grand companion.

One singular advantage over other animals: a build of elbow which enables them to turn abruptly at full speed. The Saluki is a serious watch dog, with a disposition combining dignity and gentleness. 

BEAGLES BETTER THAN EVER

in an interview with Emerson Robertson

MORE good Beagles are in action today than for many years, says Emerson Robertson, considered by many to be the dean of Beagle men in Canada. A breeder, trainer and hunter for more than 40 years, Mr. Robertson of Vermont Park Beagles, Streetsville, Ont., nevertheless sees a few shortcomings which warrant attention.

Light eyes, for example, are now more pronounced in Canada and the United States. "Not a serious fault, just objectionable". The hackney gait is becoming more prominent. A trotting horse reaches, and gains speed. A hackney motion is up and down, which is waste motion, as far as speed is concerned, in both horse and Beagle.

Any hound colour is good in a Beagle, but too many are showing too little white, he feels. The Wheatley pack, brought from England to Long Island, and the Belvior (pronounced Beaver) are the strains most frequently found in today's Canadian Beagles. The markings are black and tan, with white running gear and white blaze. Prior to their advent, it was fashionable to show a lot of white. The current trend toward only a fraction of white is a disadvantage in that a pack can barely be seen as it blends with distant scenery.

On Beagles in General

"It is my opinion that a dog qualifying for a bench championship should pass a test in the field to demonstrate his ability to work. My best show dog at present is also my best working dog. In judging I would never disqualify a hound showing evidence of work. To me they are honourable scars.

"Forty years ago there were individual hounds which could win in bench and field today as they did then. But today's average is high. In a competition of 60 entries at the recent Central Ontario Beagle Club trials only about three could be considered poor. Another outstanding improvement is the length and depth of muzzle. You see fewer snipey hounds now."

The hounds, in Mr. Robertson's opinion, seem to be improving themselves. There are many noticeable qualities, in feet and shoulder particularly, which enable the dogs to work better.

Size

In Canada the 13" Beagle is most popular by far. But in the North where the dogs steadily encounter rough conditions, and hunting fox in Southern Ontario, for example, the 15" size has advantages. Breeders could find a good

market in the northern areas for the larger dogs, he feels.

"Today's female 13" hounds seem to be better than the males," observed this specialist. "And yet I've seen years when the males were better. It seems to me show people are making too much of a fetish of short backs. I've hunted hounds for 25 years with very short backs. The trouble is they bob too much. They can't reach out. I don't want to see an over-long back, because that would cause a sway. Personally, I like speed. I like to see the hounds move as though they were going some place.

"But even that can have some disadvantages. One of my fastest hounds I sold because the rest of the pack would cut corners to keep up. Too fast hounds are inclined to over run the game. A slower hound makes the turn without losing the checks; he has the ability to carry the line, follow the scent steadily, and produce the hare systematically.

Beagles vs. Foxhounds

At one time farmers and hunters favoured Foxhounds, registered and unregistered. There were enormous numbers in Canada. Food was cheap and there was virtually no cost in raising them. Now the meat by-products have become a costly food. Since a foxhound eats four times as much as a Beagle and takes up more space, interest turned toward the smaller hound, and they were used on almost every sort of game.

"In deer-hunting, the Beagles far surpass the Foxhound. One major reason is feet. Many of the best bred Foxhounds have thin skin and pads. After a long day's run they come home with injured feet and are useless the next day. A Beagle doesn't run as fast, but next day he's ready to run again. Good pads can be bred. The earliest Beagles had beautifully made feet with deep pads.

"I haven't had a Beagle with sore feet in 20 years," said Mr. Robertson, even after running hard every day for two weeks.

Scent

Scent is that evasive quality which years of research have failed to pin down. "British Field Sports", a book written in 1817 by an authority of that day discusses scent as an unaccountable quality.

"Scent cannot be measured—but then, not enough real scientific investigation has been given the subject. Scenting qualities are sharper at times, less

at others. How do you explain a dog chasing one rabbit, continuing on that first rabbit, even though another crosses the trail? That is, if the rabbit is fresh. Perhaps it's some kind of protection. But if a rabbit is tired, the hounds jump a fresh one, they'll go after it. It's a known fact that rabbits give off less scent as they become more fatigued. That's the reason very few are actually killed by the dogs."

Field Trials

In this expert's opinion, proper judging can only be done if the dogs are given more time to run. You can force almost any other breed to run, but Beagles have an inborn desire to run. Either they will or they won't.

"I have advocated that the number of hounds entered at a single time be limited. Take half an hour for each brace. If the judge sees the dogs in action for only a matter of minutes, how can he give a fair assessment?"

Hounds need no special training for hunting or field trials, he believes. But they should be worked at least three times a week. How early? One of the most extraordinary Beagles known was owned by Ed Johns of Gravenhurst. Muskoka Flossie won a hare trial at 4½ months. That was more than 20 years ago. Her name appears on pedigrees of a good many of the best Beagles in Canada and the States. Other Beagles develop more slowly, but surely.

In feeding, many owners mistake "condition" for starving. A Beagle is working hard in the field. He should be well fed, but not over-fed. Beagles are like humans. One day they are "hot", another day they are "off". You can just hope and try.

As for breeding, Mr. Robertson urges a strict policy of breeding only the best to the best, and eliminating all others. Experience has shown that breeding in and in produces the best Beagles.

"But you must breed only the best of the family to the best of the family," he warns.

The Malamute, Mala-Nor's Kobuk Kimo, a son of Can. Ch. Lorn-Hall's Nordic X Kobuk's Manassas Silver, has been purchased from Margaret Harvey, West Hill, Ont., and will travel with Mr. and Mrs. Georgi Acutis to Turin, Italy, sailing via S.S. *Christopher*. Mr. Acutis intends to show him in Italy, and hopes to return to this country next year to try for Canadian and American titles. Kimo will be the first Alaskan Malamute in Italy, and as far as can be ascertained, states Mrs. Harvey, the second in Europe—the other being Sena-Lak's Llano, now living in Madrid, Spain.

9 A 13. PROPERTY COMMITTEE

The Secretary read the following report received from Mr. J. H. Daniell-Jenkins, Chairman of the Property Committee:

"The Chairman of the Property Committee and his members wish to acknowledge with gratitude the expression of confidence made by the Board at its annual meeting in re-appointing the Committee as a whole.

"Since the satisfactory renewal of the lease on the present premises, it has not been necessary to call the Committee together, but you can rest assured that your Committee is ready and willing to perform any services that may be required of it and that members are still watching for an opportunity to recommend permanent premises should such become available."

It was regularly moved by Mr. Laskey, seconded by Mr. Monaghan:

(#418-58) "THAT, the report of the Chairman of the Property Committee be received with thanks."

9 A 5. WEIGHTS AND MEASURERS

Mr. Monaghan stated that the Board is being faced with an increasing number of complaints regarding the alleged improper measurement of dogs at shows, suggested that a standard procedure be set up in order that dogs may be measured and official certificates of measurement issued, and with a view to securing a firm recommendation suggested that a committee be appointed at this meeting, and the entire matter be then referred to such committee.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Monaghan, seconded by Mr. Anderson:

(#419-58) "THAT, the Board may appoint Official Measurers for the purpose of measuring the height of dogs in those breeds (Beagles, Poodles, Brittany Spaniels, Shetland Sheepdogs, Miniature Schnauzers, Golden Retrievers, Briards, Great Danes, Standard Schnauzers) where there is a mandatory maximum (or minimum) height requirement in the respective Standards, and

thereafter submitting attested reports to the Secretary. They shall hold office during pleasure.

"The metal measuring gauge shall be of a type approved by the Board after approval by an Inspector of the Weights and Measures of the Department of Trade and Commerce, Canada.

It shall be the duty of an Official Measurer to measure, with a metal measuring gauge, any dog presented other than at a show or trial for the purpose of being measured, providing the said dog is:

- 18 months of age or over;
- tattooed in accordance with the By-laws of the Club.

The measuring gauge shall be loosely placed across the shoulder blades at the highest point. The dog must be standing in a natural position with his feet well under him on a level non-slippery surface. Height is determined by a line perpendicular to the ground from the highest point of the shoulder blades, the dog standing naturally with its forelegs and the lower hind legs parallel to the line of measurement.

An Official Measurer shall forward to the Secretary a statement signed by himself and two witnesses and sworn to before a Justice of the Peace, a Notary or a Commissioner for Oaths, stating the time, place and result of the measuring.

The Secretary, on receipt of the statement and a service charge of \$3.00, shall issue an Official Measurement Certificate which shall, when presented to the proper officials, entitle the said dog to be shown or run without further measuring in the height or breed division indicated on the Certificate.

No Official Measurer shall submit a statement to be submitted to the Secretary for a dog which he measures at a show or trial.

This system of issuing official measurement certificates shall be effective on and from January 1, 1959.

Persons who have been recommended to or by a member of the Board or are Inspectors of Weights and Measures of the Department of Trade and Commerce, Canada, may be appointed Official Measurers."

Mr. Monaghan suggested, for the Committee's consideration, the following "Official Measurement Certificate":

This is to certify that the (sex) (breed) (reg. no.) (reg. name) (date of whelp) (tattoos and where) has been officially measured by an Official Measurer of the Club on (date of measuring) and is certified to be:

The following points were considered in the discussion which followed:

- in only a small number of breeds does the official standard prescribe a minimum or maximum height;
- a dog should not be officially measured under the proposed plan until it is eighteen months of age;
- the proposed plan would not apply to any measuring conducted at shows;
- to avoid complaints regarding the acceptability of scales and measuring standards employed at shows and trials, the approval of an Inspector of Weights and Measures should be obtained for any equipment approved by the Club;
- the acceptability of other suitable identification in order for a certificate to be issued for a dog which has not been tattoo-marked for registration purposes;
- whether mandatory minimum or maximum heights should be eliminated entirely ("a good dog, a credit to its breed, may be ruled out for being slightly over the maximum height allowed, while poor specimens, which are within the standard, are allowed to win").

Motion #419-58 was put to a vote.

9 A 16. STANDING RESOLUTIONS

A discussion took place on the adequacy of the present allowances to members of the Board while travelling to and from the annual meetings and semi-annual meeting of the Board and while attending such meetings.

After thorough discussion it was regularly moved by Mr. Laskey, seconded by Mr. MacKendrick: (#421-58) "THAT, the daily allowance for each day attending the annual meetings or semi-annual meeting be \$26.00 a day starting January 1st, 1959."
FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.
(AMENDED STANDING RESOLUTION) Motion carried.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Laskey, seconded by Mr. Irving: (#422-58) "THAT, the daily allowance per full day while travelling be increased to \$16.00 per day effective January 1st, 1959."

9 A 28. "OPEN SESSION" OF BOARD

The Secretary sought an instruction with regard to the preparation of minutes for the "open session" held on the evening of June 10th, to which members were invited to attend.

It was agreed that:
(a) these minutes would indicate that such an "open session" was held, in accordance with notices published in the May and June issues of the official organ inviting members to attend.
(b) these minutes should reflect the Board's disappointment that so few members (about 25, exclusive of the Board) attended the open session.

11 D 28. REPLIES TO "LETTERS TO EDITOR" IN OFFICIAL MAGAZINE

(a) drew attention to a letter published in "Dogs in Canada" suggesting that information appear in the magazine regarding the fact that monorchids cannot be shown at championship shows held under the rules of the Club;
(b) drew attention to the reply published with the letter in question;
(c) suggested that the publishers be advised to consult the Board before it publishes answers to letters which have to do with the By-laws, rules or policies of the Club.
Mr. Monaghan undertook to take the matter up with the publishers.

11 D 20. INDIGNITIES TO JUDGES

It was then regularly moved by Mr. Irving, seconded by Mr. Williams: (#426-58) "THAT, show-giving clubs be requested to include in their catalogues a notice that this Board has ruled that indignities to judge "in the ring" means in or near the precincts of the show and during the duration of the show."
FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.
Motion carried.

The Secretary was instructed to arrange for an appropriate notice to appear in the proposed standard premium list.

11 D 5. MEASURING EQUIPMENT

Mr. Irving:
(a) referred to resolutions (#417 and #418) previously adopted by the Board; and
(b) suggested that until such time as official approval is obtained on a measuring device approved by the Board and such approved measuring standards can be made available, without delay, to show-giving clubs, show-giving clubs should have the right and responsibility of selecting their own effective measuring devices.
After discussion it was regularly moved by Mr. Irving, seconded by Mr. Monaghan: (#427-58) "THAT, it is the responsibility of each show-giving club to select its own effective measuring device, until such time as The Canadian Kennel Club has designated a particular measuring device as government approved and is in a position to supply such approved measuring devices to show-giving clubs."

The Secretary:
(a) pointed out that at the annual meeting of the Board, Mr. Irving had reported that some show-giving clubs were experiencing difficulty in arranging for entry forms for their shows and had suggested that the Secretary endeavour to remedy this problem;
(b) reported that he had discussed the matter with Mr. Ken Ellis of the Quaker Oats Co. who had advised that the Quaker Oats Co. would be very pleased to assist show-giving clubs by providing entry forms and such other items such as armbands, bench numbers, etc.
(c) reported that he had discussed with Mr. Ellis the matter of arranging for a standard entry form for use at all licensed field trials, and would be presenting a report on this at a later meeting of the Board.

11 D 23. STANDARD PREMIUM LIST

The Secretary reported that with a memorandum dated May 29th he had forwarded to all members of the Board the draft of a standard premium list for championship shows, this in accordance with a recommendation made by Mr. Irving that such a premium list be drawn and forwarded to all show-giving clubs for their guidance.

Mr. Irving suggested that members of the Board should have an opportunity to thoroughly study the draft prepared by the Secretary.
Mrs. Gove stressed the need for eliminating as much as possible from premium lists and catalogues in order to lessen printing costs for show-giving clubs.

It was regularly moved by Mrs. Smith, seconded by Mr. Blyth: (#431-58) "THAT, the Secretary's recommended premium list be approved subject to such changes as the Secretary may make after hearing from members of the Board."

(c) he had withheld further action on these applications pending the instruction of the Board and in view of the action taken on the application of the Central Canada Exhibition Association to hold a championship show on August 30th.

In the discussion which followed the Secretary:

- (a) pointed out that August 31st falls on the Sunday between the second and third shows to be held by the Canadian National Exhibition;
- (b) pointed out that the Canadian National Exhibition has priority rights on its show dates;
- (c) reported that the Ottawa Kennel Club has priority rights on the first Friday and Saturday in May, and in the event a show-giving Club in Ontario sought permission to hold a championship show on the Thursday immediately before or the Sunday immediately after the Ottawa Kennel Club May dates he would not, except if otherwise ordered by the Board, approve such an application in fairness to the Ottawa Kennel Club.

It was regularly moved by Mrs. Smith, seconded by Mr. Williams:

(#432-58) "THAT, the applications be left in the hands of the Secretary."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

Motion carried.

11 D 26. C.K.C. CERTIFICATES FOR SHOWS

Mrs. Smith, speaking on behalf of Mrs. Mack, reported that Mrs. Mack had contended that the engraving appearing on certificates offered by the Club is not as legible as it ought to be.

The Secretary placed before the Board a sample of the engraving now appearing on C.K.C. certificates.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Williams, seconded by Mrs. Smith:

(#433-58) "THAT, there be no change in regard to engraving of certificates."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

Motion carried.

The Secretary:

- (a) reported the case of a member whose dog had earned Best Canadian-bred in Show at a championship show held a few days before the member had applied for membership although his request for an application for membership form had been received a few days before the show at which the award was received by his dog;
- (b) enquired whether, in these circumstances, the engraved certificate offered by the Club should be awarded.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Williams, seconded by Mr. Laskey:

(#434-58) "THAT, we award the certificate to this member."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

Motion carried.

The Secretary reported that where a listed dog is concerned there is no way to establishing whether it is eligible to win any of the certificates offered by the Club at championship shows or licensed obedience trials.

After discussion it was regularly moved by Mr. Dawson, seconded by Mrs. Gove:

(#435-58) "THAT, the offering of Canadian Kennel Club certificates be amended to require registration in Canadian Kennel Club records prior to winning of the awards for which these certificates are offered."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

11 D 1. EXAMINING COMMITTEES

The Secretary read a letter from the All Terrier Club of Canada requesting that the Board, at an early meeting, receive a delegation from that Club for the purpose of discussing the procedure followed in examining those wishing to be approved as judges.

It was agreed that the delegation should be invited to meet with the Board at the first meeting at which Mr. MacKendrick, Chairman of the Ontario Examining Committee, would be present, Mr. MacKendrick being overseas until the end of August.

11 D 30. SHOW JUDGES FAILING TO KEEP ENGAGEMENTS

Mr. MacCallum raised the point of judges who accept assignments and either fail to keep their engagements, or fail to notify clubs, in sufficient time, on their inability to keep their engagements.

Mr. Monaghan referred to the position of a club which engages a judge to officiate and the judge, after the commencement of judging, advises the show-giving club that he has to catch a plane or train at a time which will not enable him to complete his assignment.

These questions were ordered referred to the next meeting of the Board for consideration.

11 D 31. APPLICATIONS FOR APPROVAL TO JUDGE (SHOWS)

Mr. Irving referred to the present application for approval to judge (shows) and suggested that well-known people should not be required to furnish references with their applications. He suggested that the Board consider amending the application.

FIELD TRIALS

13 FT 7. LISTS OF JUDGES FOR FIELD TRIALS

The Secretary suggested that:

- (a) steps be taken for the preparation of a list of judges recognized by the Club, for Beagle field trials;
- (b) consideration be given to the adoption of an apprenticeship plan for those who seek to be approved as judges for Beagle field trials.

After discussion it was regularly moved by Mr. Monaghan, seconded by Mr. MacKendrick:

(#437-58) "THAT, the matter of preparation of a list of qualified judges for Beagle field trials be left in the hands of the Chairman of the Field Trial Council and Secretary for report to the Board."

Mr. Monaghan referred to the resolution (#410-58) adopted by the Board, and suggested that the letter be addressed to the Hon. Alvin Hamilton, Minister of National Resources, Ottawa, with copies to the Minister of Justice and Mr. Gerhard W. Kennedy, Ottawa.

13 FT 23. RESERVE PLACEMENT IN OFFICIAL STAKES

- Mr. Irving:
- (a) pointed out that provision appears in the Field Trial Rules for four placements in each official stake, however no provision is made for a "Reserve" placement in the event there is a cancellation of an award in a stake;
- (b) suggested that provision be made for the selection of a reserve dog in each stake, and this placement should be reported in the official trial report published in the official magazine.

After discussion it was regularly moved by Mr. Irving, seconded by Mr. Blyth:

- (b) stated that he felt that the satisfactory results obtained were largely through the efforts of Mr. Anderson and Mr. Irving;
- (c) enquired whether any further action was desired.
- Mr. Anderson and Mr. Irving suggested that no further action be taken at this time.

- (b) read a letter, dated May 7th, received from the Deputy Minister of Agriculture.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Irving, seconded by Mrs. Gove:

(#441-58) "THAT, Mr. Anderson's Committee be authorized to take this matter up with the Minister of Agriculture."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

14 G 3. PROMOTION

The Secretary:

- (a) pointed out that at the annual meeting of the Board Mr. MacKendrick had given notice that at this meeting of the Board he would present specific proposals with regard to "Education" with particular regard to public relations, junior education, genetics, and film library;
- (b) reported that all members of the Board had been provided with a detailed proposals submitted by Mr. MacKendrick, the proposals explaining the objective (the development of a greater interest in and appreciation of pure-bred dogs in Canada) of the detailed programme presented which dealt with Publicity and public relations, a "National Dog Week", an Annual Dinner and presentation, education beginning with public school students by way of essay contests and distribution of illustrated brochure, increasing membership through the co-operation of clubs, a slogan contest, information booth at shows, interviews on radio and T.V., the setting up of a film library, the publication of an official C.K.C. book, and the issuance of reminders (match folders and calendars).

Mr. MacKendrick:

- (a) stated that the brief placed before the Board had been prepared with the assistance of the Misses Dunn and Peir of "Dogs in Canada";
- (b) suggested that a committee be appointed to negotiate with the Editors of "Dogs in Canada" for the purpose of promoting the detailed plans outlined in the brief;
- (c) suggested that the Board consider the publication of its own book of breed standards such as "The Complete Dog Book" which includes the standards recognized by The American Kennel Club.

It was regularly moved by Mr. MacKendrick, seconded by Mr. Monaghan:

- (#442-58) "THAT, a committee be formed to negotiate with the Editors of "Dogs in Canada" to promote the brief as tabled."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

AGAINST THE MOTION: Mr. Williams.

Motion carried.

It was regularly moved by Mr. MacKendrick, seconded by Mr. Monaghan:

- (#444-58) "THAT, the Editors of "Dogs in Canada" be retained for a period not exceeding 2 1/2 years, for a fee \$1000 per annum."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

It was regularly moved by Mrs. Smith, seconded by Mr. Anderson:

- (#445-58) "THAT, Mr. MacKendrick be thanked for his excellent report."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

ABSTAINED FROM VOTING: Mr. MacKendrick.

Motion carried.

14 G 4. CONTROL OF CLUBS

The Secretary reported that on April 1st there had been forwarded to all members of the Board a copy of the detailed proposal submitted by Mrs. Smith with regard to the affiliation of local and breed clubs with The Canadian Kennel Club, and the reasons why control of clubs should be considered by the Board.

In support of her proposal Mrs. Smith stated that:

- (a) each year a number of new clubs are formed yet until such clubs apply to The Canadian Kennel Club for permission to hold shows or trials under the rules of the Club, the Secretary does not know that such clubs have been formed nor where their respective secretaries can be reached;
- (b) there are two clubs in Ontario operating under the same name;
- (c) adoption of her proposal may assist in the granting of show dates when the present priority schedule expires;
- (d) the proposal would ensure that each club hold an annual meeting and submit financial reports to their respective memberships;
- Points considered in the discussion which follows:
- (a) the proposal would enable the Club to be informed on clubs operating in Canada;
- (b) the registration of the clubs with the Canadian Kennel Club may place the Club in the position of being responsible for indebtedness and actions of registered clubs;
- (c) size of membership of a club is no criterion of its contribution to the field of pure-bred dogs;

- (d) clubs can be controlled through the granting of show or trial dates;
- (e) the use of "Canadian" or of "Canada" by clubs which are not truly national in membership or operation;
- (f) the problem of "controlling" clubs which do not seek any privileges from The Canadian Kennel Club;
- (g) whether clubs, in order to qualify for the privilege of holding shows or trials under the rules of The Canadian Kennel Club, must show financial responsibility;
- (h) whether to limit the proposal to Ontario unless or until other provinces desire to participate.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Irving, seconded by Mr. MacCallum:

- (#446-58) "THAT, the proposal, in principle, be approved for the Province of Ontario, the details to be worked out by the Board members in Ontario; Mrs. Smith be appointed Chairman of the Committee with power to add as she sees fit, to consider our discussion to-day and bring in a revised proposal for the consideration of the Board members in Ontario."
- FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

Motion carried.

14 G 8. MUTT SHOWS

Mr. Laskey drew attention to the activity of some members of the Club in respect of their promoting "mutt" shows as annual events, and expressed the view that such activity is not consistent with membership in the Club.

After discussion no action was taken.

14 G 8. DOGS FOR CIVIL DEFENCE

The Secretary read the following interim report from Mr. J. H. Daniell-Jenkins, the Club's liaison officer with the Department of Health and Welfare, with regard to dogs for civil defence:

"Since the retirement of Gen. F. F. Worthington as Federal Civil Defence Co-ordinator, the Government in Ottawa has not filled the vacuum thus created and it has been difficult to make any progress.

"It was announced over the radio this morning that a re-organization may be taking place in the near future. I would suggest that the C.K.C. use its influence on its own members to contact Civil Defence authorities at the local level with a view to getting even an initial program under way before mentioned re-organization occurs. I would respectfully suggest to Mrs. N. T. Smith, Chairman, Obedience Council, and Miss V. E. Meyers, Chairman of the Ontario Obedience Representatives, that they, after consultation with the writer, make an approach to Lt. Col. S. Wotton, Ontario County Co-ordinator, whose Headquarters are at present in Oshawa.

"There is an active Obedience group in Oshawa, some of whose members might be interested in participating, as a beginning. It is my considered opinion that unless negotiations are resumed promptly by the C.K.C., the Government will be forced to negotiate with some other interested groups."

It was regularly moved by Mr. Williams, seconded by Mr. Irving:

- (#447-58) "THAT, we accede to the request of Mr. Daniell-Jenkins and write Col. Wotton and assure him of our continued efforts in connection with the use of dogs for civil defence, and Mr. Daniell-Jenkins be requested to continue as our liaison officer during the Board's pleasure, and thank Mr. Daniell-Jenkins for his report."
- FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Williams, Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, Mr. Monaghan, and Mrs. Smith.

Motion carried.

MINUTES

3 M 10. RECORDING BY TAPES

It was regularly moved by Mr. MacKendrick, seconded by Mr. Williams:

- (#448-58) "THAT, the requirements of recording discussions through tape recording at Board meetings be dispensed with in future."

Mr. MacKendrick stated that he was satisfied that tape recording was no longer necessary, pointed to the time and labour involved when the Secretary is asked, by individual members of the Board, to provide verbatim transcriptions, and the benefits derived from their use were not consistent with the work involved for the Secretary and staff.

In response to a question the Secretary stated that the use of tapes is much to be preferred if he is ordered by the Board to provide a verbatim transcription of the discussion on any matter, and is much more reliable than the previous practice of requiring a member of the staff to attempt to record the discussion at meetings of the Board.

The motion (#448-58) was put to a vote.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Irving, seconded by Mr. Laskey:

- (#449-58) "THAT, except when ordered at a meeting of the Board, no transcripts shall be taken off the tapes, and the Standing Resolutions in this connection be amended accordingly."

FOR THE MOTION: Mr. Anderson, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Irving, Mr. Laskey, Mr. MacCallum, Mr. MacKendrick, and Mrs. Smith.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE JUNE 9th SESSION OF THE SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING OF THE BOARD

URGENT MATTERS

II D 12. CORRESPONDENCE WITH THE GATEWAY CITY OBEDIENCE TRAINING CLUB

The President reported that in accordance with the Board's instruction, Mrs. Eileen Hearn, President of the Gateway City Obedience Training Club had been invited to meet with the Board, and in accordance with Mrs. Hearn's wishes the meeting had been set for 2.30 P.M.

The Secretary read a letter from Mr. Hugh Crozier objecting to the Board's decision cancelling the awards earned by his Beagle CROZIER'S PRINCE at the Coronation Kennel Club--Gateway City Obedience Training Club's championship shows held in September, 1957.

The Secretary reported that in accordance with the Board's instruction the exchange of correspondence between himself and the Gateway City Obedience Training Club and the Director for Manitoba, with regard to the Gateway's applications for permission to hold championship shows and licensed obedience trials in May, 1958, had been reviewed by the Club's solicitor who is of the opinion that:

- no club in Canada is required to apply to The Canadian Kennel Club to hold a show or trial;
- any club in Canada applying to The Canadian Kennel Club to hold a show or trial under the Rules of The Canadian Kennel Club does so voluntarily;
- The Canadian Kennel Club retains the right to either approve or decline to approve any application to hold a show or trial under its Rules;
- in the event the Club does not approve an application it is under no obligation to make any explanation for its decision.

After discussion it was agreed that:

- Mrs. Hearn would be asked to outline the views of the Gateway City Obedience Training Club;
- in Mrs. Hearn's presence Mrs. Gove and the Secretary would make their statements;
- questions may be asked by Mrs. Hearn, Mrs. Gove, members of the Board and the Secretary.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Brown, seconded by Mr. Dawson:

- (#305-58) "THAT, this matter be laid on the table until 2.30 P.M."
Motion unanimously carried.

DOG SHOWS

II D 12. CORRESPONDENCE WITH THE GATEWAY CITY OBEDIENCE TRAINING CLUB

Mrs. E. C. Hearn, President of the Gateway City Obedience Training Club, entered the meeting, was introduced to all members of the Board, and was invited by the President to outline the views of the Gateway City Obedience Training Club on the subject which had prompted the Board to invite her to attend this meeting of the Board.

Mrs. Hearn:

- thanked the Board for extending an invitation to meet with the Board at this meeting;
- stated that the Gateway City Obedience Training Club was very pleased that such an invitation had been extended to its President;
- was generally critical of the manner this matter was handled both by The Canadian Kennel Club and by the Manitoba Director;
- stated that the Gateway Club desired an explanation as to why six weeks had elapsed before it had been informed that its applications to hold championship shows on May 23rd and 24th had not been approved;
- stated that the Gateway Club desired an explanation as to why its applications had not been approved.

In response to a question Mrs. Hearn stated that the Gateway Club had about 175 members of whom about 18 are members of The Canadian Kennel Club. Mrs. Gove stated that of the 18 members about 10 are ordinary members of The Canadian Kennel Club, the remainder being associate members, and with the exception of Mrs. Hearn, none of the officers of the Gateway Club have had any previous experience in the staging of championship shows.

In the discussion and question period which followed, the following statements were made:

1. APPLICATIONS OF THE GATEWAY CITY OBEDIENCE TRAINING CLUB TO HOLD CHAMPIONSHIP SHOWS AND LICENSED OBEDIENCE TRIALS ON MAY 23RD AND 24TH:

- Mrs. Hearn stated that these applications were completed on January 27th and were mailed to Mrs. Gove on January 29th;
- Mrs. Gove stated that the applications were delayed in reaching her because her proper address was not shown on the envelope in which the applications were mailed to her.

2. TELEPHONE CONVERSATION BETWEEN MRS. GOVE AND MRS. HEARN ON FEBRUARY 7TH (Quoted from Mrs. Hearn's letter to the Secretary of February 18th: "On February 7th the president of the club telephoned Mrs. Gove to ask if any action had been taken.")

A discussion then took place between Mrs. Hearn and Mrs. Gove with regard to this aspect of the matter.

- Mrs. Hearn stated that the Gateway City Club did not anticipate that their applications would not be approved;
- Mrs. Gove stated that her recommendation of approval of the

applications submitted in connection with the championship shows jointly staged by the Gateway Club and the Coronation Kennel Club in September (1957) was conditional that the officials responsible for the running of these shows would be drawn from the Coronation Kennel Club (which Club had previously staged championship shows), the Gateway Club to be responsible for the obedience trials staged in conjunction with these shows, and she was surprised, when she had received premium list a few days before the shows, that this condition attached to her recommendation of approval had not been faithfully observed.

3. MRS. HEARN'S LETTER TO THE SECRETARY OF FEBRUARY 12TH (received by the Secretary on February 13th):

- The Secretary stated that this letter, which had sought a decision on the Gateway Club's applications, was the first indication he had received that the Gateway Club had applied for permission to hold championship shows and obedience trials on May 23rd and 24th;
- Mrs. Gove stated that she had withheld forwarding the applications to the Secretary in the customary way having decided, after long and careful consideration, to consult the Board at its annual meeting which commenced on February 14th;
- The Secretary stated that he had withheld action on Mrs. Hearn's letter of February 12th in view of the imminent arrival of Mrs. Gove who, upon arrival, had consulted him with regard to the applications with the result that the applications were referred to the Board.

4. APPLICATIONS REFERRED TO THE BOARD AT ITS ANNUAL MEETING:

- The Secretary pointed out that when the Board, on February 19th, had dealt with "Dog Show Matters", Mrs. Gove had outlined her reasons for believing that the Gateway Club, being an obedience club, should "either combine their shows with other shows or put on some sanction shows for experience";
- Mrs. Gove pointed out that the Board, in resolution #191-58, had unanimously concurred with her recommendation.

(SECRETARY'S NOTE: The following is an extract from the minutes of the annual meeting of the Board held in February, 1958:

"Mrs. Gove:

- reported that the Gateway City Obedience Training Club was formed in 1956 as an obedience club;
- reported that due to the necessity of the Fort Garry Kennel Club changing its 1957 show dates, the Gateway City Obedience Training Club combined with the Coronation Kennel Club in staging championship shows and obedience trials in September, her approval of the applications for these events being based on an understanding that the Coronation Kennel Club would be in charge of the championship shows;
- reported that when the shows were held they were 90% controlled by the obedience Club and a number of "little difficulties" arose;
- reported that the obedience club had applied for permission to stage championship shows and obedience trials in May, however she did not feel they are sufficiently experienced to handle championship shows on their own;
- stated that she felt that the obedience club should either combine their shows with other shows or put on some sanction shows for experience.

It was regularly moved by Mr. MacKendrick, seconded by Mr. Irving:

"THAT, we concur with the provincial Director's recommendation." (#191-58)
Motion unanimously carried."

5. MRS. HEARN'S LETTER TO THE SECRETARY DATED FEBRUARY 18TH:

- The Secretary stated that this letter was received on February 19th, but he had not seen it until after the annual meeting of the Board had adjourned, and Mrs. Gove had left for Winnipeg. The Secretary then read portions of this letter and the action he took with regard to it.

6. MRS. HEARN'S LETTER TO MRS. GOVE OF MARCH 1ST: Mrs. Gove commented on an aspect of this letter.

During the discussion:

- It was pointed out to Mrs. Hearn that it is customary for the recommendation of the local provincial Director, in the case of applications for show and trial dates originating outside Ontario, to be followed by the Secretary when approving, or not approving, applications for permission to hold shows or trials under the rules of The Canadian Kennel Club;
- Mrs. Hearn was asked whether any of the officials of the Gateway City Obedience Training Club could gain experience by assisting at any of the coming shows in Winnipeg, and Mrs. Hearn replied to the effect that such arrangements may be made with the Coronation Kennel Club whose shows are scheduled to be held in September.

Vice-President Mr. Brown, said:

"The reason why I took a stand on this question was that I believed in hearing both sides of any question. I believe you can never get satisfactory settlement unless you do. And if you take one side and not the other, then you are not being fair to all parties concerned. Now I don't think this is so very serious - I do think there have been a couple of errors, I don't think they are very serious, and I don't think they were done with any malicious intent. What I am interested in is this lady and this lady both going back with a view to trying to cement their two sides to better relations so that all parties concerned will be functioning in the best interests of all dog lovers. That's the reason why I wanted it thrashed out here - why I wanted to try and cement the forces with a view of working together. Now what's been done cannot be undone. It is too late now to put a show on the dates requested. I think myself that if we can only get these two ladies to agree to go back and work together as they possibly can with the various organizations and their various ideas; try and build up for the future. What happened is water under the bridge; let us go on from there. I don't know whether it can be done. I hope it can be done."

Mrs. Hearn thanked the Board for the hearing given her representations on behalf of the Gateway Club, and was thanked by the President for her appearance before the Board.

Mrs. Hearn left the meeting.

HOW'S YOUR HUNTING KNOWLEDGE

**A gun, no matter how deadly, is useless
if you don't know how to use it, says
sportsman-writer Ross Ballard**

Now's the time to review the ABC's of hunting, before the season really gets under way. When I was fourteen my father gave me a sweet little single shot .22 rifle. When he gave me the gun he said: "There's more to hunting than pulling the trigger." Then he took me out rabbit shooting. I slipped and stumbled over acres of ploughed fields, caught my pants on bushes that seemed to jump out at me, struggled over fence after fence, each one seeming to be higher than the next. And finally when a rabbit jumped up right under my feet, I was too surprised and tired to do anything but stare open-mouthed as it bounded away, tail waving tauntingly at me.

I learned a lesson from that first hunt that I have never forgotten. I learned that a gun, no matter how deadly, is useless if you don't know how to use it. What really decides the difference between "going shooting" and bringing back game is your knowledge of hunting. This knowledge covers everything from the clothes you wear to the way you train your dog. It's knowledge that is gained from experience. But from one season to the next even the experienced hunter forgets. Before you go out on that first hunt this year, let's bone up on our hunting knowledge. Let's just see if we really are as good a hunter as we think.

How's Your Marksmanship?

Sure you've been hunting for years and getting your fair share of game. But how many shots have you missed because your reactions were a little slow, or perhaps you convinced yourself and your hunting companions that it was a difficult shot. You can't blame anyone but yourself for poor shooting. However, there's no reason why you can't make every shot count, and the secret is practice.

First, you've got to know your gun. And you have to learn about it anew every year. After all, from the close of the season to the next opening is a long time and you can get pretty rusty.

Get to know the feel of your gun again. Get used to the balance, so you can snug it up to your shoulder quick and easy. Fire a few shots so you get used to the recoil, so you won't flinch when you shoot at game. And remem-

ber to "squeeze off" the trigger, not jerk it. By "squeezing" the trigger your sights will stay centred, steady on the target.

Now the gun feels pretty good. You're used to the feel of it again. The next step is shooting practice. To get the feel of a shotgun you should be shooting trap or skeet. For a rifle you should be constantly taking target practice.

So you go out and fire a few rounds and you begin to think you haven't lost the old eye. Well, how's your swing? Are you picking the target up from behind, squeezing the trigger as the barrel passes the target, and following through the swing with the trigger squeeze? Practice your swing a few times, it will come back to you.

Now, how's your eye at estimating ranges? You can miss a lot of game if you cut loose while it's still in the next county. It's well worth your while to spend a little time with your gun before the season opens. It can even pay off in more game and less cripples.

Do You Know Your Game?

This may seem a little stupid to the experienced hunter. But just think for a moment, how many hunters were killed last year because some nimrod blasted away at what he thought was a deer. If you think about it for a while, you'll be extra careful in choosing your hunting companions this year.

There's no reason why every hunter shouldn't know his game. The libraries are filled with books containing colour illustrations of deer, ducks, geese, upland game birds and just about any game you'll ever find to shoot. The Carling Conservation Club is doing an excellent job of educating hunters and would-be hunters through their colourful and informative conservation advertising. Every hunter should have reprints of the Carling's Deer Hunting Guide and Upland Game Bird Guide in his camp as a constant reminder of what deer and upland game birds look like.

Knowing your game goes beyond looking at pictures. If you really want to learn the habits of game, get out in the off season and try stalking them. Learn how to read signs and tracks. It will give you much needed experience that will pay off in better hunting.

Check Your Clothing and Equipment!

The correct clothing is just as important to a successful hunt as your gun. If you're at all uncomfortable a hunt can be pretty dismal.

The clothing and footwear you select should be designed to do three things: 1. It should be light to wear and not hamper movements. 2. It should protect you from heat and cold and from bushes, dirt and dampness. 3. It should protect you from being mistaken for game and shot!

Because weather, terrain and tastes differ from place to place, it is impossible to select all-round clothing. However, here are some tips you should remember:

- Yellow and scarlet, either ordinary or in fluorescent colours are the most easily identified.
- Be sure your garments are light and loose fitting so you can move about easily. Heavy, stiff clothes can tire you out quickly when walking.
- Your hat should shade you and protect you from rain, wind and snow.

- Rubber soled boots are tops for walking and comfort.
- Your socks should be fairly heavy and absorbent.
- A comfortable set of long johns are a necessity.
- It's a good idea to take one extra of everything you think you'll need, then you'll be sure of being comfortable.

Every hunter has odds and ends of equipment that he takes along just in case he will need them. Sometimes they seem to get in the way, but often they are useful. Let's check and see if you've got these handy hunter's aids:

- Waterproof matches or matches in a waterproof case.
- Some light, strong rope.
- Sharp knife.
- Compass.
- Chocolate bars, gum, candy, cigarettes, etc.
- Pencil and paper.
- First aid kit.

Know the Ten Commandments of Safety

This should be automatic for every hunter, but I'll bet a box of shells that not one hunter in ten remembers them all. Here they are, as a reminder to everyone who takes a gun out for game:

The 10 Commandments of Safety

1. Treat every gun with the respect due a loaded gun. This is the first rule of gun safety.
2. Guns carried into camp or home, or when otherwise not in use, must always be unloaded, and taken down or have actions open; guns always should be carried in cases to the shooting area.
3. Always be sure barrel and action are clear of obstructions, and that you have only ammunition of the proper size for the gun you are carrying. Remove oil and grease from the chamber before firing.
4. Always carry your gun so that you control the direction of the muzzle, even if you stumble; keep the safety on until you are ready to shoot.

THE POODLE THAT POINTS

A water dog that points — that, in brief, sums up one of the rarest hunting dogs in North America, the Pudelpointer. Not yet registered in this continent, the unique hunter was developed in Europe in the 19th century by bringing together the English Pointer and the dog once famous as a water dog, the Poodle. This breeding in part, at least, retains the quality for which the Poodle is now rarely credited — an obsession, as well as a talent for retrieving from water. The combination results in an all-purpose hunting dog—affording nose, a passion for water, eagerness to hunt, pointing instincts, plus intelligence and willingness to co-operate.

As was the case in Europe, it may be some time before the breed "catches on" here. Hunting, throughout the world, has its own customs and traditions; anything new must prove itself thoroughly. The breeders, in an effort to establish their new breed, used only the best possible stock and let the dogs prove themselves. Today's Pudelpointer is earning a good name as a hard worker on land and water, for feather and fur, in bush and in the field — no wonder dog, but a wonderful companion. No glamour dog either, but nevertheless appealing in a rough brown coat.

Bodo Winterhelt, Toronto and district, brought the first to Canada.

5. Be sure of your target before you pull the trigger; know the identifying features of the game you intend to hunt.
6. Never point a gun at anything you do not want to shoot: avoid all horseplay while handling a gun.
7. Unattended guns should be unloaded; guns and ammunition should be stored separately beyond reach of children and careless adults.
8. Never climb a tree or fence or jump a ditch with a loaded gun; never pull a gun toward you by the muzzle.
9. Never shoot a bullet at a flat, hard surface or the surface of water; when at target practice, be sure your backstop is adequate.
10. Avoid alcoholic drinks before or during shooting.

I suggest that you should hang these 10 commandments of safety up in your camp as a constant reminder that hunting is a dangerous sport if your gun is not treated with respect.

If you would like a set of the commandments for hanging in your camp, get in touch with The Carling Conservation Club. They will be glad to supply you with all the reprints you want.

What Do You Know About Hunting Dogs?

This is a loaded question — especially for the readers of this magazine. And I for one don't want to start a controversy.

Every one of us has a favourite breed of hunting dog. And you probably have good reasons for liking it. To me, who has never owned a hunting dog, they are a wonderful addition to any hunt. Besides their obvious advantage of tracking game, they are wonderful companions.

I have hunted many times with a dog, and the sight of one on a scent is sheer poetry. Their sound is as exciting as the crack of a rifle or the boom of a shotgun across crisp morning air.

If you have no definite opinions on the type of hunting dog you prefer, I suggest you consult The Carling Conservation Club. In co-operation with Bumpy Lewis, one of Canada's leading dog trainers, Carling's have created an excellent guide to hunting dogs. This guide gives you all the basic information you need to choose the best hunting dog for your needs. However, once you have decided on the breed of dog you want, I recommend that you consult a kennel operator who will help you choose and train your dog.

There you have it — a brief reminder and a few thoughts that every hunter should know. It is not possible to cover the whole field of hunting in one article, especially when you consider its many aspects. However, I hope that the experienced hunters will have been reminded of some of the things they had forgotten and the novices will have learned something that they will never forget.



basic essential of their trade. They must be able to mark and remember several falls, and marking ability is of primary importance both in field trials and while hunting. They must have courage to go through dense cover and to swim with heart in rough icy water. Extraordinary scenting ability is indispensable in their work. To be teachable and useful hunting companions they require high intelligence, coupled with great willingness to please. Since all good retrievers meet these standards, and are devoted friends as well, it is understandable that retriever owners have a very special feeling for their dogs.

Retriever training enthusiasts come from every profession and occupation, but share several interests and objectives which make them a congenial and united fraternity. They like dogs, out-door activity in the surroundings of forest, field and stream, and occasional hunting trips in the fall season. They are good sportsmen, both in the competitive sense, and in their responsible attitude towards game laws and conservation of our natural resources.

Conservation authorities recognize the place of trained retrievers by hunters as a means of protecting the game-bird population. It is a fact, that for every legal limit bag of upland game-birds or waterfowl taken home by a hunter, several more birds are shot but left behind. Annually in North America the total of these *wasted* birds amounts to the startling figure of *millions*. They are not picked up because they are lost, fall in thick cover, moving water, or inaccessible places. With a trained retriever, fewer birds would be shot

because almost all those brought down would be found and retrieved. Retrievers can be used in many ways, and are unusually versatile, but the work at which they are specialists, and superbly equipped by instinct and training to do, is to find and retrieve shot or crippled birds.

Across Canada there are some 35 retriever training clubs. The number one objective of these clubs is conservation, through training and encouraging the use by hunters of trained retrievers. Training trials, at which the dogs are judged, and ribbons or small prizes awarded, are held as often as once each month. These trials are open to all owners of purebred retrievers. Once or twice annually each club holds C.K.C. Licensed Trials. Trials provide the opportunity for friendly competition, raise the standard of performance, and allow owners to evaluate their dogs' progress on a comparative basis.

Roughly defined, the stakes most commonly run are Junior, for dogs under 2 years; Qualifying, for dogs that are not quite ready for the Open; and Open All-Age for the most advanced performers. Sometimes the same dog may be entered in more than one of these. Points towards a Field Trial Championship are awarded only in the Open Stakes, with 5 points for first, 3 points for second, 1 point for third, and 1/2 point for fourth. To complete the title a dog must earn a First and a total of 10 points. Certificates of Merit may be awarded in all stakes to dogs that have not placed but complete the tests commendably.

The National Retriever Championship Stake is held each year in a different area of Canada by the National Retriever Club of Canada. Dogs qualified to compete in this Stake are the previous year's winner and all dogs that have placed during the current year in Licensed Open Stakes. There is only one winner, and this dog is entitled to be



designated as "National Retriever Champion of 19—", usually abbreviated to Nat'l Ch. 19—.

Briefly, what retrievers are expected to do is to come when called, walk at heel, and sit and stay wherever required. They must be steady to shot either when sitting at heel or walking up; that is, they must not break and run in to retrieve until commanded to do so. They must retrieve equally well on land and from water. They must honour, or sit quietly at heel while another dog retrieves. They must not pick up decoys, or switch birds; that is, leave one bird or the area of a fall to go to another. They would be disqualified from competition for "hard-mouth".

The tests given at retriever field trials simulate as closely as possible actual hunting conditions. There is no confliction in training methods or requirements between hunting as opposed to trials. The best means of learning how to train a retriever is to join a retriever training club.

In the Junior Stakes dogs are not expected to do blind retrieves, and are only tested on birds which they have had the opportunity to see fall. Usually they are tested with one or two falls in each test. Eagerness, courage, and marking ability are most important.

In the Qualifying, dogs may be expected to remember 3 birds, and they may be required to handle to a blind retrieve; that is, a bird planted without their having seen it placed.

In the Open Stakes the dogs' behavior and general performance is more critically judged. They may be required to mark and remember as many as 4 birds they see fall during one test. Their obedience in taking directions to blind retrieves at great distances is astonishing. When sent on a line in any direction they are expected to continue on this line until stopped and cast in a new course. One whistle means to stop, sit, and look back at the handler. A short series of whistle blasts means to come in. A hand signal, which may be accompanied by the command "get over" sends the dog right or left, or with "get back" sends him farther out. Sometimes in training or trials the falls are considerably beyond gun-range. The

reason for this is that retrievers may be
 sent to find birds shot by a friend, or
 wounded birds which come down at a
 distance. Tests may combine land and
 water, or may include both blind and
 marked retrievers.

Each stake is judged by 2 or some-
 times 3 people, who are thoroughly ex-
 periented in handling and training of
 retrievers and in the requirements of
 retriever work. Each dog in a Stake
 tries the same tests; those which fail
 are eliminated, while the successful ones
 go on for further testing.

For those who love these wonderful
 dogs, a retriever trial is very thrilling.
 You can hear a pin drop while a dog
 is working at a difficult test, and the
 applause is warm and spontaneous after
 a brilliant performance. Spectators are
 welcomed at retriever trials and the gal-

DOG HERO OF 1958

Dutchess, a German Shepherd who plunged into a lake and swam 300 yards to rescue her 10-year-old mistress, was named winner of the fifth annual Ken-L-Ration gold medal as America's most heroic dog of 1958.

The presentation was made at the annual award dinner in Chicago, August 13. Dutchess also received a \$1,000 bond in her owner's name, a gold plaque, a gold-plated leash and collar, a custom-made dog blanket, and a year's supply of dog food.

Dutchess averted a tragedy last September when Donald J. Phillippi took three of his children for a ride in a hydroplane he had constructed. The boat turned on end, throwing the passengers into the water. Dutch spotted the accident from shore and swam out to where the father was struggling with the children, only one of whom could swim. The father shouted to young Linda to grasp the dog's collar, which she did. Dutch then towed her to shore, while a neighbour sped across the lake in his boat in time to rescue the others.

Second prize went to a dog which attacked an armed robber, suffered a beating, but saved his mistress. Third prize was awarded Rusty, a German Shepherd, who stayed with his three-year-old, totally deaf companion when she was lost in the woods, and guided searchers to her. Spot, a Fox Terrier,

was named fourth winner. He routed three armed gunmen who threatened to shoot an attendant at his owner's gas station. Fifth was a dog of unknown ancestry named merely DJ, who located an unconscious man who had wandered from an automobile accident in a daze and fell into a swamp. Police presumed he had been picked up by a passing motorist and had abandoned the search for him.

I find they are people who take a pride in the ability of their animals and who want other people to do well and they help us to do well by offering us good suggestions and by telling us our good and bad points while in the ring.

I started training under Mrs. Pfennich on February 24, 1958. I felt good going to the classes to learn and to see the difference training will do for a dog. In April, I received notice from the Ottawa Kennel Club about their Obedience Trial coming up on May 3, 1958. I was thrilled and wanted to participate and learn from participating more about obedience. I am very glad now that I did, for in his first trial and with only ten weeks training my Labrador received his first leg of obedience in Novice "A". Being thrilled about it all, we decided to enter him in the Montreal Obedience trial held at Senneville, Quebec, on May 24 and 25, where he received two more legs, which meant we had earned his "CD". The following month, June 18 and 19, there were two more trials in Ottawa put on by Rockcliffe. This time I thought I would enter my Labrador in Open "A". The first day of the trial, I was disqualified when my dog missed coming back over the jump on the retrieve, but, everyone was so kind and told me how good he had done otherwise, that I was there next day trying hard again. I was nervous, in fact, I have been nervous in every trial so far, but, I was always made to feel at ease by the judges, who seemed so understanding. On June 19, and my second try, the Labrador made me ever so proud by going through his class and winning his first leg of "CDX". The following Saturday, June 21, we went to Kingston where we won a second leg of his "CDX".

We still have one leg to go for our "CDX" and then with the help and training from Mrs. Pfennich, we hope to be able to try for our "UD".

I have found it a great thrill working with all the obedience people and I hope to continue seeing and participating with you all for many years to come."

It is so nice of you to take the time to write to us and it's a pleasure to reproduce your letter here, for we think it will give a lift to newcomers in the obedience ring. We agree with you that most people at obedience trials (including the judges) try to help the other fellow. That's what helps to make obedience the great sport it is. We must never lose this spirit so that we can continue to enjoy ourselves and have fun at trials. Our congratulations to you on your fine showing in so short a time. ED.

News Bits

Four obedience trained dogs from Montreal and district took to the air on August 9 last. What we really mean is that the four dogs and their owners, along with your editor, appeared on a live television show on Channel CBFT. A brief explanation of obedience training was given and then the dogs and owners were put through certain of the exercises by yours truly. Mrs. R. W. Tyner and her Standard Poodle, "Amanda of Merrychance", demonstrated the Signal Exercise and the Group Examination of the Utility work. "Woodland's Jolly Girl" owned and handled by Mrs. Mae Birch, demonstrated the Retrieve and the Drop on Recall. Heeling on leash, showing corrections, was performed by Mrs. Ruth Mingie and her Shetland Sheepdog, "Summit's Gold Dust." Miss Catherine Harrison and her American Cocker, "Dolly Vardon's Spotty" demonstrated the Heeling Free and the Recall. All dogs did extremely well considering the heat from the spot lights and the two cameras in action, to say nothing of the people connected with the show standing on the sidelines. Once again it was proved that good obedience trained dogs can and will perform under any kind of conditions. Demonstrations such as these, especially on television, are a terrific boost for obedience.

We are looking forward to meeting many of our friends in Toronto on September 14 where we have been invited to judge the obedience trial of the German Shepherd Dog Club of Canada.



Primrose Patch Gold Duchess and three of her five puppies: Kopje's Little John, Kopje's Lawrence and Kopje's Lucinda, all sired by Can. and Am. Ch. Primrose Patch Laurel. "Duchess", a daughter of the famous English Ch. Primrose Patch Daffodil, was acquired by Kopje Kennels in February 1956 and soon made herself felt in the Ontario Show Rings. Campaigned sparingly, she has a Group win to her credit and a number of Group placements including that at the Canadian National Sportsman's Show. Charming herself into the hearts of all she meets, "Duchess" has become a lovable companion, gay in spirit and tough in constitution.

Commencing in 1956, Mr. and Mrs. D. F. W. King, R.R. #2, Pickering, Ont., the owners of Kopje Kennels, have been building up their foundation stock, combining the best of the famous English bloodlines of Primrose Patch, Von Walder and Robsvart. All this foundation stock has at least five generations of pure Miniature breeding behind it. Carefully chosen for type and temperament, their progeny, shortly to be introduced to the Show Rings, are showing the progress of selective breeding.

The Miniature Dachshund was developed in Germany during the late 1800's to fulfill specialized hunting requirements. These tiny hunters were used to trap and retrieve burrowing game for which purpose the larger Dachshunds were not physically suited. Mr. and Mrs. King have found that breeders have carefully preserved the requirements of the hunting dog. Keen of eye, ear and nose, they have won hunting trials against larger dogs and successfully completed their obedience qualifications.

Conveniently small, but mighty in spirit and affection, the Miniature Long-haired Dachshund is equally at home in town or country. It is clean, free of body odour and its small size, about nine pounds, makes it a delightful companion in any situation.

Mr. and Mrs. King have also found the Miniature Long-haired Dachshund to be extremely tough in constitution adjusting to extremes of temperature without difficulty. 20TH ALL-BREED AT HALIFAX

When the Kerry Blue Terrier walked out of the ring, he not only had taken top place over 146 entries at the Halifax Kennel Club 20th All-Breed show, but had chalked up his 29th Best in Show Award. He was Can. and Am. Ch. Tailteann's No Regrets (sire, Ch. Rinty of Wulfreda, dam: Ch. Foxhills Witch) owned by Mrs. M. Eileen McEachren, Todmorden, Ont., and handled by Ted Ward. The previous day (July 1) he took BIS in the Dartmouth competition. At Halifax he was also awarded Best Canadian Bred in Show.

More than 40 different breeds were represented at Halifax, where Best Canadian Bred Puppy in Show went to a Beagle owned by Harold Smith of Fairview. Two Irish Setters, owned by Mrs. T. G. Threlkeld of Sorel, Que. and handled by Roy Dauphinee, won the Best Brace.

Handling results: Junior Children, Elena Roberts of Halifax; Senior Children, Nancy LeMoine of Amherst; Ladies, Mrs. T. G. Threlkeld; Men, H. K. Robertson of Timberlea. Nancy LeMoine took the Dick Zwicker Memorial Prize in the competition between Junior and Senior Children.

Judge was Mrs. P. A. Margeson of Kentville. It is noteworthy that no less than five of the rare Australian Terriers competed. A number of American breeders made a point of attending this show.

FAKE SCENT FAILED

An attempt to foil hounds which almost led to a court case ended up with chuckles, at least on one side. Prior to the traditional stag hunt run by the Devon and Somerset Staghounds Club in the 100-square mile public park of Exmoor, England, the League Against Cruel Sports made an announcement. They had dreamed up a chemical scent irresistible to dogs, and had enlisted people hitch-hiking and on vacation to spread the scent.

Col. L. M. Murphy, Master of the Devon and Somerset pack, warned he would not be responsible if stock grazing in the "contaminated" area was injured through also becoming irresistible to the hounds.

Since the chemicals were said to contain sex hormones, all female dogs were used in the hunt, "to avoid confusion." While league members hoped the hounds would be running in circles, the pack instead went on with the hunt, and were not the least bit addled. "They loved the stuff," said Col. Murphy.

A man found guilty of getting a three-months-old puppy drunk was put on three years' probation under which he is forbidden to own or feed dogs. The German Shepherd puppy had returned to its home with a neighbour, who said when she confronted Gerry De Young, 46, and a friend, the pair admitted feeding the dog wine.




