## Cover Story

The exquisite Toy and Miniature Poodles shown on this month's cover are obviously the pride and joy of someone who knows Poodles. Phyllis Walker, who with her brother Peter Walker has recently opened the new salon, Le Chien Elegant in Toronto, is the owner.

Miss Walker began her career in England with the well-known Hawkridge Kennels in London. This enterprise was in a section frequented by dog-loving titled people and in the course of her years there she beautified and sold pets, including a Pug to the Duke of Windsor. She has also trimmed a Sealyham of the Queen of the Netherlands during her stay in London as Princess Juliana. Prince Bertold of Sweden brought his big black Standard Poodle who was trained to guard his royal master. It was necessary for the Prince to order the dog to "stay" (which it did, like a statue) and remain at his side throughout the trimming.

Miss Walker, with Michael Karageorgis, started Toronto's first Poodle specialty salon. This partnership has now been dissolved. In her new enterprise she is catering to all breeds.

Now showing under the prefix Ma Griffe (my seal) she has taken three dogs to their titles during 1960: Ch. Jay's Ma Griffe, imported silver Toy (popularly known as Peanuts and a great favorite as a receptionist at the salon), Ch. Karas Caramel, brown Miniature female and Ch. Karas Punjab, brother to Caramel who gained his title at just under 20 months. The latter two were sired by Ch. Firebrave Juba. Merrymorn Taree, who completes his show career this year, is a silver male Miniature. A younger silver female will be making her puppy debut this Spring. The piece de resistance of Miss Walker's program is Karas Buccaneer, (sired by Can., Am. and Bermuda Ch. Poodhall Gus and Ch. Firebrave Honourine — and a relative of Juba) who will also make his debut this year.

While Miss Walker breeds almost entirely from her own stock, little "Peanuts" was imported expressly for improvement of the Ma Griffe stock and is expecting puppies before long.

### WATCH THE GRAVY GROW

The first dog food ever to make its own gravy has been introduced to Canadian dog owners by General Foods, Limited. Called *Gravy Train*, the new product is basically a "dry" meal type dog food but becomes a "wet" food with the addition of water.

To prepare, warm water is added to the chunks of *Gravy Train* and the mixture is stirred to produce brown gravy. The result is a dish that looks and tastes like beef stew.

Many users find *Gravy Train* pellets serve as a treat or reward, simply given individually to the dog to chew.

## FROM THE EDITOR

Canadian dogdom suffered still another blow when Mr. John Daniell-Jenkins lost his life in an automobile crash December 4, near Altona, Ont. Well-known for his devotion to dogs (Mr. and Mrs. Daniell-Jenkins have been highly respected for years for their Kennels of the Rouge Bullmastiffs, Papillons and West Highland White Terriers), he was equally regarded for his work with many service organizations.

His unique personality prevented him from letting anyone know of his great heart. Many people in the dog world have found the Daniell-Jenkins the first on the scene, not only bringing help and comfort at the time, but for many months following. It could be said that he was dedicated to the relief of suffering. Among the organizations in which he served: The Canadian Cancer Society, the Red Cross, the local Lions Club (which made him a charter member). He also helped found the Canadian Foundation for Poliomyelitis. He was a member of the Pickering Rod and Gun Club, a director of The Canadian Kennel Club for a number of years, was first president of the Honourable Company of Bullmastiff Fanciers in Canada, a member of the American West Highland Club, of the Papillon Club of America and the American Bullmastiff Association as well as many Canadian show-giving clubs. Mr. Daniell-Jenkins was a grandson of the late Lord Glantawe of Swansea, Wales. Following studies at New College, Oxford and Inner Temple, (law) London, he served with the Sixth Battalion, Welsh Regiment in Wales and with the RCASC in Canada, with the rank of captain, in World War II. He also served as an officer instructing in the Sea Cadet Corps. A world traveller, he found the quiet of the Rouge Hills area to his liking. For a time he was on the city desk of the Toronto *Telegram*.

Deepest sympathy is extended to his wife, Dorothea, his daughter Mary (Mrs. Keith Balsdon) and grandson.

The recognition of New Year serves as a time for reflection — a time to consider that here before us lies a clean slate. A truly fresh page that has upon its face no trace of anything that has passed before . . . One shadow which can mar the new year is a residue of unfounded rumors.

It has come to our attention that a misunderstanding apparently exists in the minds of some regarding our reporting and attending the Bermuda shows . . . Your editors were invited to Bermuda in 1958, 1959 and 1960 by the Bermuda Trade Development Board as its guests. Rumor would suggest something to the contrary. An American publisher attended this year on the same basis, as well as a representative from a large-circulation American magazine not totally connected with dogs, and a well-known photographer of dogs. This is an accepted method of recognizing, by companies, governments and others, the part members of the press play in their operations.

The space the young Bermuda shows receive in this publication has been questioned by a few. This club is young, eager, willing to make great personal sacrifice to get their shows on a sound basis. They provide unlimited picture material. They have gained international respect for their high standards and great efforts and deserve support. They are an extension of the Canadian dog interest, providing an increasing market for Canada's purebreds. They look to Canadians for leadership and advice and have boundless admiration for what Canadian dog breeders have accomplished.

Rumor also infers your publishers ignore shows in Canada . . . We give coverage of all Canadian activities — not conformation shows alone — in proportion to material received. One of the largest shows in Canada did not have a photographer in attendance. Nor has a word come from the greatest retriever event in Canada. Here and in the United States, this is a responsibility of the show-giving clubs. It would be impossible for *any* dog magazine to furnish photographic services at *every* show. This has been stressed editorially by your publishers on numerous occasions. Automatic coverage of wins, of course, appears in the Official Show and Trial results. Unlike the policy of other dog publications, *Dogs in Canada* publishes Best in Show photographs free of charge. Other wins are reproduced at a very low rate.

Our wish for the New Year is that we may be able to advance your interests and provide an even better Canadian dog magazine and that all of us may enjoy health, happiness and success.

Many thanks for the many heart-warming greetings from individuals and clubs from coast to coast in Canada and from other countries. Some of the cards were outstandingly clever and original in depicting the senders' own dogs or breeds. The messages will spur us on to greater endeavors for 1961 . . . Coming: starting with February a new column, "You Were Asking" — questions on care and health answered by veterinarians.

Another import from England — is a Welsh Corgi, (my informant didn't say whether Cardigan or Pembroke) Helarian Tell Tale, aged three months, arrived on board HMCS Haida with *Lieut. Molliet* of Bedford.

Talking of shows, Shearwater KC are to start things off for 1961 with the first Maritime Championship show. It looks as if even more shows are in the planning stage for the Atlantic provinces than 1960. There have been two recent Sanction shows, both well attended, top honors at each went to Buchanan Crest Prince, a German Shorthair Pointer owned by *C. B. Robinson* of Kentville.

*Bill and Marion Mitchell* are well pleased with a litter of Standard Schnauzers from their two imports from England; this must be the first Canadian-bred litter for a good many years.

## Book Review

*This is the Chihuahua*, by Maxwell Riddle, Sterling Publishing Co. Inc.

\$4.50

Well-known to Canadian dogdom, Max Riddle is considered the world's leading authority on the Chihuahua. This well-known journalist and judge spares no effort in his research. Tracing the history of dogs in the Western World, he studied Spanish in order to read the accounts of Columbus and the Spanish Conquistadores in their own language. The results of the research are manifest in this book.

Profusely illustrated, this work is respected as the most up-to-date book ever published on the Chihuahua.

*The Chihuahua*, by Russell E. Kauffman, General Publishers, Toronto \$4.80.

This smallest of the canines has as its background one of the most glamourous, mysterious stories of all canine history. Named after a northern Mexican province where it is never found . . . direct descendant of a dog five times its present size . . . only breed of dog native to America which was here in pre-Columbus days . . . an avid hunter, though its prey of the moment might be a month. Its story is told here, with valuable chapters on type breeding, judging, showing, contained in 29 chapters with 129 illustrations.

*The Biggest Dog in the World*, by Ted Key, Clarke Irwin Co., \$2.95.

The Jackson family thrived on the maxim, "stand firm and think big." Violet, a gentle kindhearted dog who adored people and cars, went right along with the family philosophy. She thought big until she was 30 feet tall (although secretly she still considered herself a lap dog). Delightfully illustrated by the author who is the famous cartoonist featuring the enterprising maid, "Hazel".

*Cairn Terriers*, by Hector E. Whitehead. British Book Service (Canada) Ltd. 95c.

This handy little book not only relates the Standard, but gives good advice on how to buy a Cairn, how to raise the puppy, and when the time comes, how to show. The final chapter deals with breeding for show material.

*What Dog for Me?* by Robert V. Masters, Sterling Publishing Co., Inc. \$3.00.

This book is primarily for the would-be dog owner, although anyone else would find the material on more than 120 recognized breeds both interesting and useful. Profusely illustrated (many photographs in color) each picture shows the characteristics of the breed — size, color, long or short hair.

*Training the Hunting Retriever*, by Thomas R. Cofield, D. VanNostrand Co. (Canada) Ltd., \$5.75

The latest and most talked-about book on training retrievers, this valuable work deals with the Labrador, Chesapeake and Golden: every single step from buying a puppy to turning out a finished retriever for land and water. Mr. Cofield recognizes that every dog is an individual personality and must so be treated.



## WINTER OBEDIENCE TRIAL

*Obedience trials can be held the year round and when combined with innovations are fun for dogs and people, as this club proved.*

The Burlington and District Kennel Club's Ninth Obedience Trial was held Sunday, December 4. This date, a month earlier than usual, was chosen because the committee felt that the weather in December would probably be better than later in the winter. And they were so right. We did have a clear, sunny day. Entries totalled 58 dogs and came from the states of Pennsylvania, New York and Michigan as well as from all parts of Ontario.

Winners in the various classes were as follows:

*Utility* won by an American Cocker owned and handled by Mrs. Harry Cole of Ancaster. *Open 'A'* won by a Miniature Poodle with a score of 191½, owned and handled by Mrs. Elizabeth Frazier of Buffalo. *Open 'B'* won by a Shetland Sheepdog with a score of 196, owned and handled by Mr. Norman E. Wurtz of Buffalo. *Novice 'A'* won by a Welsh Corgi with a score of 198, owned and handled by Mrs. R. N. Harvie of Barrie. *Novice 'B'*, a Weimaraner owned by Dr. W. C. and Mrs. Margaret H. Meminger of Erie, Pennsylvania, handled by Mrs. Meminger, scored with 199 tied with a German Shepherd owned by Mr. V. Alksniss, handled by Mr. Helmut Weller. The run-off was won by Mrs. Meminger and her Weimaraner which was also high score for the trial.

This is a repeat performance for Mrs. Meminger. Handling the same dog, she took high combined score at our double trial held last June. A fine record for a good dog!

Trophy for the highest scoring dog entered from the Burlington and District Kennel Club was taken by Mrs. W. H. Richards, our new Membership Convenor. Her German Shepherd, "Rex", scored 194 in the Graduate Novice class. Rex was recently in a collision with a truck and we are pleased to see him recovered sufficiently for trial work.

Trophy for the highest scoring student was won with a score of 179½ by a Golden Retriever owned by Mr. Jim

Taylor and handled by his wife, Olive. This marks a number of firsts for the Taylors. The first dog they have trained in Obedience graduated handsomely after her first series of training classes, to go on a week later to pick up her first CD leg in her first trial. Very commendable work.

The Graduate Open class was won by a Standard Poodle owned by Mrs. Jean Zvonkin of Hamilton, handled by her husband, Mr. Abe Zvonkin.

The 'hodge-podge' class was won by a Boston Terrier owned and handled by Mr. J. Giacomelli of Stoney Creek. Our 'hodge-podge' class was an innovation. It consisted of scrambled exercises, that is exercises chosen from the three classes of Novice, Open and Utility. As the handler entered the ring an envelope was chosen from among a number of similar envelopes each containing a list of exercises which the dog was to perform. For example, the Boston's list comprised the heel free Open, Novice recall, Utility seek back, Open retrieve over high jump, Novice long sit and the Utility group examination. It was easy to see (particularly on recall) that dogs, like people, are quick to forget the basics. For proof of 'people-forgetting' ask any engineer to put away his slide rule and calculate the square root of a five-figure number the way his Grade X son does. Chances are he's forgotten how unless he has been helping with the homework. Anyway the 'hodge-podge' was great fun for everybody and a happy finale to another good trial.

# SKYES IN CANADA

by Mrs. R. Percy Adams

Talisker Skyes Reg'd., Ste Agathe des Monts, Que.

Owning one breed for over half a century is a long time — breeding and exhibiting one breed for that length of time must be quite unique. My first Skye came to me as a gift from Oban, Scotland when I was a little girl way back in 1904. Oban Jock was a loved pet. Several years later a friend who came to visit from Scotland said, "I will send you a really fine brace of Skyes of whom you can be truly proud". The Talisker Kennels (named for a small village on the Isle of Skye) were started when Talisker Prince and Talisker Belle landed in Montreal. Our first litter, I think of seven, arrived in the winter of 1909. In 1910 the late Mr. Ormiston Roy took Belle and Prince to the Westminster Show in New York (entered in the name of my father, S. B. Townsend) where Belle defeated Prince and won Best of Breed. This brace had a number of litters and they and their puppies were shown extensively at Montreal Shows (our first show was in 1909 when Oban Jock won the blue ribbon at the Carnival Dog Show at the old Victoria Rink). Many were sold to homes in Ontario and Nova Scotia. I was so delighted to win the Norman K. Swire Memorial Trophy this past Autumn with Ch. Talisker's Fairy Wonder. Mr. Swire bought a Skye from me about 1919 for Miss Clark, daughter of the late lieutenant-governor of Ontario . . . The late Bob Ross and his wife were my idols as dog experts in the early days. I used to watch them grooming and training their Scotties and Irish Setters for the ring and would try to do the same things with my Skyes, not letting them know I was trying to copy them.

None in my family was interested in my dogs and how I ever managed to bring three, four or five dogs by express from Ste. Agathe all by myself, care for and exhibit them, I will never know. I learned everything the hard way, certainly. I can remember when I was very young trying to revive a dying newborn puppy by wrapping it in cotton batting and putting it in the oven of the kitchen woodstove — needless to say, it did not recover.

During all these years I reared many litters, but it was not until 1930 that I began breeding and importing in a large way and sending Skyes all over America and Europe. Talisker Skyes will be found in Ontario, British Columbia, Newfoundland, Labrador and in practically every State in the USA — also in Norway, Italy, Switzerland, France, Austria, Belgium.

A few Skyes were known in the United States in the late 1800's, but I believe coat difficulties were their undoing. At this time a number were imported to New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. About the same period the Countess of Aberdeen, a great Skye lover, brought two to Government House in Ottawa during the term of office of her husband as Governor General of Canada. She had large Skye kennels, her stock mostly of the drop-ear variety in the Old Country. A little later Mr. George Caverhill in Montreal had a few fine examples of the breed.

It was not until the late 1930's that Skyes began to be seen in the USA in numbers. The Skye Club of America was formed in 1938 (of which I am a charter member). I then began to exhibit in the States with great success . . .

In all these years enthusiasm at Talisker has never dimmed. We are proud to have imported a number of England's finest Skyes in brood bitches and stud dogs. Ch. Merrymount Sunflower was said to be the finest Skye female in existence when she came to Talisker from England in 1953. Then came Eng. and Can. Ch. Alison of the Mynd, said to be the finest Skye bitch of all time. In all, 28 or 30 noted Skyes have come to Talisker from England and Europe over the years.

Scientific feeding and common-sense care keep all our little inmates in fine health — we pamper no one and love each one daily. Our kennels are in an old renovated 100-year-old barn. The interior is varnished knotty pine with varnished birch plywood divisions and varnished hardwood floors. Each pen approximately eight feet long with a

removable shelf edged with a band of iron at the end for a bed (the youngsters love to chew aluminum). We have 35 large outside runs and three covered runs for freezing rainy weather. During winter storms we use a gravel snow blower which blows the snow over the four-foot high solid partitions between the runs. After cleaning runs each day the refuse is put into deep covered pits and covered with lime. After two years this is removed to the garden compost heap as splendidly conditioned fertilizer.

This is our system: The Skyes are put out in all weather except freezing rain and in all temperatures down to 35 degrees below zero as long as there is no bitter wind. The dogs are put out at 8 a.m. when the kennel is scrubbed with hot soap and javel water. I prepare 60 individual plates of food, consisting of Purina, meat, Rex wheat germ oil, wheat germ meal, medicinal iodine drops, lard, cod liver oil, dried egg yolk powder, dried skim milk, brewers yeast, alfalfa meal. Twice a week, boiled pork liver. The puppies get Parrishes chemical food added to two meals of egg yolk, canned milk, Pablum and an extra can of meat later in the day. All the dogs get a large biscuit at night and once a week I buy 100 bones. The dogs are brought in at 11 a.m. for their meal and rest until about 1:30 p.m. when they are again outside until about 5 p.m., according to the weather. During these hours the 60 or more dishes are washed and some dogs taken by twos and threes for free runs over the lawns and fields when many of them swim in the lake. Skyes love to swim).

In addition there is the matter of caring for several litters of puppies:



feeding them four or five times a day after they are four or five weeks old, keeping the whelping boxes clean and sweet and pampering the little mothers just a little bit. Skyes generally have five, seven or nine puppies. They whelp easily. My puppies are generally whelped in my own house in the sunporch and kept here for five or six weeks. During this time I sleep on a chesterfield in my living room to make sure the puppies are kept warm and nursing well and that the mother can be put outside several times during the night. I use a large infra-red light bulb attached to the ceiling of the whelping box, about four feet above the puppies. This maintains a lovely warm heat.

I believe I am fortunate in having the only complete show and breeding records of all Skyes since they were first bred. Skye breeding is a life-long study and I wonder why some young interested Canadian would not want to benefit by my long experience and start to carry on from where I soon will have to stop. When I do, it will be sad to have all my work and study of the breed just melt away . . . I will always be more than willing to give any help possible and always welcome visitors to my kennels to see and learn about these magnificent animals.

I must give due thanks to the late Sir Claud and Lady Alexander of Ballochmyle and the late Miss Rosabelle Watson of Faygate, London for most of my knowledge (other than experience) of the Skye Terrier.

## NUTRITIONAL BALANCE URGED

"Interest in the nutrition of the dog has seen tremendous increase," said Dr. W. A. Krehl during the tenth anniversary of the Gaines symposium held recently at Kankakee, Ill. Dr. Krehl is associate professor of Medicine, Marquette University.

Speaking on "A Decade of Progress in Nutrition," he stated: . . . "No longer are we satisfied to find and identify a vitamin which will correct a deficiency; we now want to know how this chemical works in the chain of metabolic reactions."

He scored raising the protein content of the diet of the dog as being as pointless as the horsepower race for automobiles, adding that protein needs to be geared to the amino acids they provide and those needed by the dog. When protein is used more and more as a source of calories, he said, there is biologic and economic waste. Balance in nutrition is the goal.

Dr. Krehl also emphasized the need for the use of nutrition in control of disease and said it is high time for a real push in that direction.

## How To Buy a Schnauzer Puppy

The long-awaited book, *The Complete Miniature Schnauzer*, is well worth the waiting period and the price (\$11.50). Anne F. Paramoure, internationally renowned Schnauzer specialist, has gone into research which well accounts for the time required to assemble her findings. Virtually anything anyone could ask is entailed in this book. (Although one statement must be set right: "The United States is the only country in which the Miniature Schnauzer is classified in the Terrier Group." The Canadian Kennel Club places the breed in the Terrier Group as well).

This is a book which every Miniature Schnauzer owner should own — and every prospective owner. For the latter here is her guidance toward purchasing a puppy of this handsome, spirited breed:

Puppies at a younger age may be purchased at a lower price than a slightly older one — since at six or eight weeks the adorable youngster may be just average at six months or a year. It's a gambler's hope of picking up a "flyer" at a moderate price. On the other hand, in purchasing an older puppy, there is the opportunity of seeing how he has developed — with regard to whether or not the second teeth will prove him to be undershot, too long in body or other faults which may crop up later. A puppy may develop rapidly toward a championship specimen, only to "blow" when it is a young adult.

Choosing a puppy from six to 12 weeks is not easy, Mrs. Paramoure maintains, even for experienced fanciers, if it is show material you are looking for, since healthy puppies resemble each other very closely at birth, with real differences becoming apparent only as they develop.

**Coat:** at birth, the Miniature Schnauzer coat is short and smooth; at six or eight weeks the top coat (much darker than it will be later), begins to grow out. But look underneath the top coat — what you see there will very nearly resemble the shade of the adult coat.

**Bone:** good bone should be apparent at a few weeks of age. The legs should be bigger around in proportion to their size than that of an adult. Observe the front legs from the front: they should be straight. From the side, hind legs should make an angle at the hocks, "but a six-weeks-old puppy still tends to brace his hind legs under him a little to support the weight of the body, which is heavy in proportion".

**Ears:** correct ear carriage for an uncropped Miniature is a drop ear, like that of a Fox Terrier. Ears bend over close to the head until cropped (usually at eight to ten weeks old).

**Whiskers:** By six or eight weeks, the infant's whiskers should appear sufficiently to indicate whether or not he will have a good growth. Watch out for unusually well-developed whiskers and fluffy body coat — they are signs that the coat will



likely be soft. Preferable is a rather smooth, flat body coat which at this early age indicates a likely hard coat at maturity. Look out for too hard a coat and no signs of whiskers sprouting: the grown dog may be short on beard. "Big soft whiskers and a soft body coat are much more common faults at the present time than lack of whiskers and furnishings."

**Eyes:** look for dark brown eyes which are not too large or too round.

**Teeth:** Watch out for an undershot mouth (where lower teeth extend beyond the upper layer). At six weeks of age you should be able to assess this. Make sure front teeth do not exactly meet (they wear down too fast) but upper teeth should pass outside the lower in what is termed a "scissors bite."

What should you expect at the varying puppy ages?

In general, the younger the puppy the bigger his head and the shorter his legs in proportion to his body. After eight or nine weeks of age the legs grow longer, the body loses its puppy roundness and compactness. By three months the puppy, already cropped, begins to look like an adult but on a smaller scale. From then on he grows bigger and usually lankier up to about four or five months. Then he begins to fill out again and by six months is often practically grown, though he may gain as much as an inch or more in additional height. Small puppies usually mature more quickly than larger ones and stop growing sooner . . . The larger ones still have a puppy look and need to tighten and harden . . . However, a more slowly maturing puppy may prove better in the long run and retain his quality to a greater age.

**Temperament:** On this all-important quality, Mrs. Paramoure advises: ". . . Be reasonable. Do not grab a strange puppy by the legs or the scuff of the neck and sweep him up into the air. Do not shout at him, stamp at him, or thump him down suddenly. Speak quietly, move slowly, give him a chance to sniff your hand. Pick him up gently, but firmly enough so he is not afraid of falling. Remember that he is just a baby and needs time to grow accustomed to strange sights, sounds and smells and to find out what they are all about." # THE BEDLINGTON — at random

al, it takes practice and a good eye to achieve a fluid look rather than one done in separate parts and then assembled on the dog. Materials used for trimming a Bedlington are: scissors (for head, body, legs and feet); clippers (for ears, chin, neck, belly and tail) and, of course, a steel comb. For dogs that are being shown we find singeing their coats no less than a week before a show helps to give them a nice neat appearance.

Bedlingtons are quite adaptable too — playing endlessly and tirelessly in the snow with children all through the winter, then coming in to thaw out by the fireplace. When summer is here, to romp on the beach is great sport as long as they have a shady place to which to retire. It is said that Bedlingtons today no longer care to go near water as they did in the past. This may be true to some degree but we have one little girl who adores the ocean and on occasion has gone swimming with a field trained pointer in our nearby reservoir.

We were visited by a breeder from Holland last summer, who also raises racing Whippets (a Bedlington forebear) and he told of starting a Bedlington and a whippet and of the Bedlington's ability to overtake the whippet on more than one occasion. We also know of Bedlingtons who will and can tackle anything from rats to full size raccoons and keep with it until the kill.

Many are the facets to a Bedlington's character and it is hard to picture the lamb-like creature at a dog show, looking so docile and elegant, possessing the same instincts as those just described, but they do and that is what makes them so fascinating.

One has only to live a short time with Bedlingtons to find they are a dog of multi-character. For us it is just under ten years, and a more loving, stubborn, intelligent, whimsical companion would be hard to come by. Ours is a house-kennel (our home, their kennel) of five Bedlingtons and a huge Maltese cat named "Grogan" who is mother to all.

The fact that Bedlingtons do not shed at all is much in their favor as members of a household. One thing I must mention though is that, like the Poodle, an unkept Bedlington loses all its elegance when allowed to go for any length of time without proper attention, this simply being a good combing once or twice a week and trimming at least every three months. Of course when showing your Bedlington the above grooming program is, of necessity, intensified.

The trimming of a Bedlington is really not hard, but like everything else that must look as though it is perfectly natur-

## Points To Remember in Buying a Cairn

According to Cairn specialist Hector F. Whitehead, it is conformation, not color that is important in purchasing a Cairn Terrier puppy.

Color for show purposes is no problem. Your Cairn can be of any color, except white. As to the fine points, the ears, muzzle and tail tip are more desirable in a darker shade.

When you're buying a puppy, watch for a plump one, plump like a baby, up to three months. If the Cairns you see are skinny, it's a warning of trouble. Do look for a dark eye. If you are buying a puppy for show, buy him early, but if for a pet only, up to three months is recommended. While the puppy should be plump, look out for the "pot-bellied" pup — this could be a sign of wrong feeding, over-feeding or worms.

While there are many fine Cairn

specialists in the world, few can match the record of Mrs. Betty Hyslop, Cairndania Kennels, Brockville, Ont. Mrs. Hyslop and Mr. A. S. Richardson, (Arthnell Kennels, Ottawa) have been responsible for the early start of Cairns in Canada. The former has made 50 Canadian and American champions, 54 Canadian champions and 53 American champions in Cairns alone. She obtained her first Cairn in 1929 and her first litter came in 1931.

Canadian dogs have climbed high in the estimation of American and English breeders as a result of the efforts of several of our fine Canadian experts. Mrs. Hyslop is one who deserves such credit. Her 14 Best of Breed wins in succession at Westminster is a record that has probably never been equalled — she has had a total of 17 Best of Breed wins at this show.

## How To Choose Your Scottie

The Scottish Terrier is like no other dog, yet when many unknowing people spot a terrier of any breed, they exclaim, "What a nice Scottie!" Such is the popularity of this reserved lovable breed.

Even his eyes are different, and used differently. A Scottie always seems concentrated on something. He has a purposeful look, even if it's to move three feet either way. The widely-placed deep-set eyes look either straight ahead or down, casting over the ground where his work (when working) lies.

His legs are short, powerful. They are particularly heavy-boned for a dog of this size (height averages about 9½ inches). So important are the fore-quarters of the Scottie, the Standard devotes its longest paragraph to this portion. The neck, too, is unusually muscular, nicely proportioned and of a moderate length, set into a long, sloping shoulder. The brisket is unusually pronounced. The breadth of chest another of the typical characteristics. The elbows, viewed from the front, must not project outwards, nor yet be tucked under the body. In action they work fore and aft close to the ribs.

When you look at the side, the elbow joint is well behind the front line of the chest, allowing the forearm to descend vertically to the pastern and foot. Because of this construction, it is said that "in a good Scot there is almost as much of the dog in front of the forelegs as there is behind them." Although this is an exaggeration, it does help in forming the correct picture in the mind.

When you choose a Scottie, feel the forelegs. Even in an infant they will feel big-boned. They should feel rounded to the touch — never thin or flat. Actually the round feeling will not be due to the bone structure alone, but to the sinews and muscles on the leg. The forefeet, too, should be big for the size of the puppy, the pads thick and toes firm and well-arched. Watch out for thin flat feet or spread toes. And finally, the forefeet should continue the effect of a straight front by being turned neither inwards nor outwards.

Examine the ribs when you go over a puppy. They should be big for the size of the dog.

Feel their roundness as they leave the spine and flatten to the deep chest. To provide for plenty of heart and lung space they should be carried well back. Sometimes in attaining the shortness of back good ribs have been sacrificed. However, "it is more important for the dog to have good deep ribs carried well back, with a strong muscular loin, than that he should measure an inch or so less from his withers to his tail." The ideal, nevertheless is frequently attained — ribs excellent in depth and length, with a strong muscular loin, yet a short-backed, agile dog. Be on guard for too short a back, as with such a low build atop short legs, the free long-striding gait of the breed could be spoiled.

# Australian Terriers At Home And Abroad

"Aussies", as they are affectionately referred to in Australia, have with the inception of the Australian Terrier Club of Victoria, some 15 or more years ago and with the help of a few enthusiastic owners and breeders, made fantastic headway in the Terrier Group and the dog world in general. The Australian Terrier Club of Victoria, Australia with the assistance of leading judges and the Kennel Control Council were, after the first year following the formation of this club, able to arrive at a Standard which would conform to the requirements of a pure breed; and on October 23, 1947, the following standard was adopted by The Kennel Control Council of Victoria, to which most successful breeders have rigidly conformed:

**General Appearance:** The Australian Terrier is a rather low-set dog, being active and full of courage. The body rather long in proportion to height, with good straight hair, the harsher the better. The ideal weight for dogs is 12 to 14 pounds. Females slightly less. Neck inclined to be long, but with a decided frill of hair. It is to be remembered that the Australian Terrier is a working dog and should therefore show intelligence and have a hard-bitten appearance.

**Head:** Head long with flat skull, full between the eyes, with slight stop. Soft, silky topknot slightly lighter than head color; long powerful jaw, teeth level, nose black, eyes small, keen and dark color.

**Ears:** Small, pointed, well carried and erect. Not too closely set and free from long hairs.

**Legs:** Forelegs should be perfectly straight, well set under the body with light feather to the knee, clean feet. Hind legs, good, strong thighs, slightly bent at stifle, and hock. Hock well let down.

**Feet:** Feet small, well-padded and with no tendency to spread.

**Tail:** Tail docked, set on high and

well carried, but not over the back or curled.

**Coat:** Body coat should be weather-resistant, about two inches long, harsh and straight, with short undercoat.

**Color:** (a) Body — blue or blue-black or grey-black with tan on face and legs. Tan, the richer the better. (b) Sandy to clear red. Smuttiness or dark shadings undesirable.

**Faults:** Undershot or overshot. Eyes too prominent or too light in color. Ears dropped forward, too large or rounded at point. Coat curly, wooly or silky (puppies excepted). White patches on chest or feet. Nose flesh-colored. Crooked forelegs.

This standard was adopted in full by the Australian Terrier Club of Queensland, Australia, by The Canadian Kennel Club and in the main part by The American Kennel Club. (CKC asks for "average weight about 10 or 11 pounds, weight from 8 to 14 pounds, height, average about 10", 8 to 12". — Ed.)

Australian Terriers, contrary to the numerous writings of people who hope to know the breed from hearsay, have been recognized as a pure breed for almost 100 years! Touching lightly on their background, one should remark that only pure English terriers were numerous in Australia as far back as the 1870's when "The Aussies" first originated. In the '70's the Australian Terriers, as yet unnamed, were classified in the "Any Other Variety", a few years later as "Hard-Haired Terriers" with the colors of blue and tan or sandy.

The breeds used to found the "Aussie", the old-fashioned Scotch Terrier who does not bear much similarity to his descendants today known as the Scottish Terrier, the Black and Tan Terrier with his fine bone, pricked fine ears and black and tan markings. The Skye Terrier and particularly the Dandie Dimmont Terrier. It is from the Dandie Dimmont that they have inherited their soft, silky top-

knot and breeders have developed the beautiful ruff, which makes the Australian Terrier so different from other terriers. With the improvement in length and texture of topknot, ruff and coat and the added height on leg to offset the crooked fronts inherited from their low-to-ground ancestors, they have still managed to keep all the lovable, intelligent, loyal characteristics in one small compass. "Never have there been so many fine qualities in one such small body". Quite definitely since about 1900 there has been no cross-breeding in Australia, but unfortunately this cannot be said for the breed overseas, where many exports have long since lost any resemblance either in character or conformation to our beloved little "Aussie".

With the exception of the undesirable color of chocolate with tan markings in the American Kennel Club Standard, no alteration has been made since the first foundation stock. This color which should be rigidly opposed by all true breeders was openly discussed in a recent issue of the *English Dog World* and the breeder stated that as three generations had now been bred, they could be registered as a purebred color. How naive can one get? The anomaly, I have been told, exists in England, whereby a dog may be inspected by three judges and if passed as a reasonable specimen of a breed, it may then be registered with the English Kennel Club. This could not auger well for any breed.

I had the very great honor of helping establish the Australian Terrier in Canada with the export from Australia of Int. Ch. Seven Oaks Rose Marie to Mr. and Mrs. D. Anderson of King, Ont. Rose Marie was the first dog of any breed to be exported from Australia to become an international champion. And in the United States it is again an Australian Terrier who had the great honor. Australian Ch. Seven Oaks Whisper, international champion.

## TRIMMING THE WIRE FOX TERRIER

The Wire's coat should be trimmed to fit the dog — the nearer the fit to the natural body line, the better. There are many fine points in presenting any breed, but for the average person showing, perhaps the best study is to watch the best dogs in the ring, and keep a file of pictures of them from dog magazines. Your dog might not have the necessary hair where required but it will certainly serve as a basic guide.

Practice is the key. You might ask an expert to help you the first few times. It is in the fine points that most errors will be made. Here are some pointers by Mrs. T. H. Caruthers, III, writing for the Wire Fox Terrier Club of the Central States:

"Most novices leave too much hair on the hips, thighs and on the inside of the hocks, giving the impression of big hips and knock knees in a person. Too much hair on the front and sides of the elbows gives the impression of a wrestler, or a man upon whose head a bowl was placed and shaved around. When you leave all the hair in front of the hips on your dog, it is comparable."

"Take a sponge and soak him completely down. See how much better he really looks than you had supposed. Your Fox Terrier is not a freak but rather as fine a piece of canine anatomy as exists. Give him in his attire an even break."

# FIRST NATIONAL FOR SPANIELS

The First National Championship Stake for Spaniels under CKC rules and regulations was held near London, Ont., Saturday and Sunday November 26 and 27. The event was sponsored by the Spaniel Field Trial Association (of Ontario) with the Western Ontario Spaniel Club as Host Club.

To be eligible, dogs must have placed first to fourth in an Open All Age Stake at a licensed trial during the past two years. This limited to 16 the number of dogs who were invited to enter, sent by registered mail from the CKC office. Of these nine dogs were entered, one of which was absent from the trials.

The balmy weather (exceptional for November) and light breeze made ideal running conditions. The spacious site at Woodeden Children's Camp and perfect cover gave the dogs plenty of space to work. The pheasants, too, found the cover to their liking. They flushed fast and flew like wild birds, especially the pure Chinese cocks used for the final two series on Sunday.

Judges Howard A. Mesnard of Walled Lake, Michigan, and Orest Andrews of Sudbury had ample opportunity to give each contestant as fair and as complete a test as ever held. There were three land series and a water series held the first day. All dogs except one completed the four events, quality being

high. Marshall Maurice Martin from Sudbury kept the proceedings on the move with no annoying lags.

The new point system of scoring was used. Each dog being marked completely for every appearance in the field. Score sheets were passed to referee Stew Walton as soon as the judges were satisfied with a dog in every series. To save time, the referee double checked that all possible phases were marked, and totalled the scores for the judges. These scores were then posted on a board at the completion of each series. This way, handlers and spectators alike were able to see how the dogs scored. There was no need for second-guessing on the results.

After a hot lunch served at the Cobblestone Inn, Saturday afternoon began with the Water series. A good crowd, including CKC President Walter Brown and Vice-President J. MacCallum, gathered on the banks of the Thames River to watch. For this series, live pigeons were thrown low over the water, shot and retrieved. Each dog had two tests of his performance. Most of the large gallery also followed in the next and last, land series of the day. In this, one handler was disqualified and barred from the remainder of the trial for rough handling of his dog.

The good food never tasted better

than on Saturday evening, when some 40 handlers, friends and officials gathered for cocktails and the Field Trial banquet. Here too, the friendly atmosphere which was found in the field prevailed. A highlight of the evening saw Dr. William Coop of Brampton, Ont. present the greatly admired and enlarged Dr. Coop Challenge Trophy for pigeon conservation to Stan Welsh. He has no doubt added much interest to future Gun Dog Stakes. Speakers of the evening included Ted Haggis, chairman of the trial, the judges and President Walter Brown.

Sunday morning began cool and cloudy, but soon warmed up again. Unfortunately, two fine Canadian dogs broke at the start of the series, the first time down, and were eliminated. The remaining five completed that series, but the judges narrowed them down to three for the final series. These were run singly under both judges to complete the placing. Gunners Arnold Robb, Charles Smith and Merv. McGuffin once again rode the birds well out to provide good long retrieves.

Winner with 536½ points out of a possible 600 was AFT Ch. Apache Magic Clipper, English Springer, owned and handled by Julian T. Collins of Ravenna, Ohio. Runner up was Am. FT Ch. and 1960 Cocker National Champion Belol's Petey's Boy, owned by Dr. J. W. Menge of Detroit, Mich. Handler of this American Cocker was Clarence Wingate of Toledo, Ohio. The third place dog was FT Ch. Carla of Avandale, English Springer, owned and handled by E. H. Harding of Ohio. Winner of the J. J. Haas trophy for the Best Canadian-owned dog was Dunoon Diana, handled by her owner Dr. Coop.

Awards were presented at a smorgasborg luncheon, served at the Darleen Motel. Field Trial Secretary George Tabner assisted Chairman Ted Haggis in the presentation of the large bronze shields and rosettes to the dogs which placed and the National Championship Button to the winner.

Member Clubs of the Spaniel Field Trial Association (of Ontario) welcome any clubs or individuals in other areas that are interested, to join in making the Association more widely represented in Canada.

He is now buried in the pet cemetery of the K-W and North Waterloo Humane Society. His headstone bears the inscription: "Blackout. 1940-1960. Man's Best Friend. A-N AF WW 2." The letters indicate the three services. Owned by Mrs. William (Mom) Smith, he became mascot to 450 servicemen and women during the war years when his owner held open house. Blackout would bark at 9:30 p.m. signallying it was time to return to camp, except on Saturday nights when he knew they could stay later.



# FIRST NOVA SCOTIA BREED SURVEY

by J. D. BOYD

The first German Shepherd Survey held by Nova Scotia fanciers November 19 (and the third held in Canada) proved the largest yet held in this country, despite drizzling weather. Dogs came from distant points, including New Brunswick.

This first Breed Survey was sponsored by the Blackcrest Kennels, Reg'd. CKC Director Harvey M. Gratton of Truro, N.S. (who gave full support) met Mr. Grant E. Mann at the Halifax Airport and drove him to the estate of Mr. and Mrs. M. Walker in Jollimore Village, where the survey was held.

Mr. Mann is chairman and senior surveyor of The American Breed Survey Society for German Shepherd Dogs Inc., and is internationally known for his Liebestraum Kennels. He has been associated with Shepherds for over 35 years as a serious student, breeder and judge. Three females of his breeding, Leda, Jola and Twanee have been awarded the world prize, the Von Stephanitz Trophy, signifying the Grand Victoria.

Due to a misunderstanding in reservations Mr. Mann's plane did not arrive until 1:30, therefore we were late in getting started. Everyone co-operated and with only a short coffee break the survey carried on through the supper hour and well into the evening. Assisting Mr. Mann and myself was Mr. Gratton, owner of the Trollhattan Kennels and Training School, well-known

breeder and judge. Mr. Gratton has been associated with Shepherds for a number of years and therefore well qualified to assist with this survey.

There was a large enthusiastic crowd and everyone followed Mr. Mann's comments with keen interest, as he proceeded methodically to assess the dogs. He was very patient and cooperative in answering all questions put to him by our many newcomers to the breed. These novices are going all out to acquire top breeding and show stock and already this area abounds with many

dogs sired by the "world greats," and pedigrees read like a social register. This survey (it is hoped) will not only point out the faults so prevalent in our breed today but will serve as a guide in the selection of suitable specimens for future breedings.

After an interesting and very instructive day Mr. and Mrs. Walker extended their hospitality to everyone by inviting us into their spacious home. Mrs. Walker and family, assisted by Mrs. Richards, served a bounteous buffet dinner. The congenial atmosphere and the friendly warmth of our associations all attested to the success of the survey.

The following day Mr. Mann gave a talk on "The American Breed Survey Society for German Shepherd Dogs Inc." which was recorded on video tape to be broadcast on "Gazette", CBC, Halifax on December 5. Accompanying Mr. Mann with their dogs were Mrs. Mary Avent and Mr. Charles Reynolds of Dartmouth and Halifax. Mr. Lloyd McInnes, well known MC conducted the interview.

Mr. Mann stated that he was very pleased with the quality and numbers of our dogs as compared with many larger centres. Mr. Gratton stated that he feels the survey was a successful step in the right direction, that it is his contention that any steps for breed improvement must be voluntary and sponsored by breed clubs. It is my hope that this will spark the interest required for a breed club in this area.

## The Staffordshire Bull Terrier

We were quite surprised to read in an article by Mr. and Mrs. Uplinger of Erie Pa., (incidentally we correspond with them) "It should be stated that on this continent the correct name is Staffordshire Terrier (not Staffordshire Bull Terrier as in England) and is a breed completely distinct from the Bull Terrier". The standard for the Staffordshire Terrier appears in the Complete Dog Book (A.K.C.) whereas the standard for the Staffordshire Bull Terrier does not. The Staffordshire Bull Terrier has however been recognized by the C.K.C. and the standard was published recently in *Dogs in Canada*.

We would agree with most of the rest of the article, apart from one point. The Staffordshire Bull Terrier is the result of crosses between the Old Bulldog and an Old English White Terrier, not the Bulldog and a Game Terrier as stated for the Staffordshire Terrier. The rest of the article as to colourings and characteristics would be applicable to both breeds. We would emphasize that the Bull Terrier, Staffordshire Terrier and Staffordshire Bull Terrier are separate

breeds. The dogs which we breed and own are the Staffordshire Bull Terriers bred for so many years in England, and these dogs have the deep through broad skull, very pronounced cheek muscles, distinct stop, short foreface, and ears which according to the Standard are rose or half rose, and not large, full drop or prick to be penalised and definitely not cropped. The Staffordshire Terrier can have its ears cropped and pricked. The weight of our dogs are: male 28-38 lbs. and female 24-34 lbs., heights are male 14"-16" and female 14"-15". The Staffordshire Terrier's weight is — male 40-50 lbs., female 35-45 lbs.; the heights are male 18"-19" and female 17"-18" (all heights being taken at the shoulder). Thus you will see that the Staffordshire Terrier is a larger dog than the Staffordshire Bull Terrier, who must be of great strength for his size and appear to be "stocky".

We would really like to see some Bull Terriers, Staffordshire Terriers, and Staffordshire Bull Terriers in the same ring in this country, then perhaps it would clear up some of the misunderstanding.

We ourselves, do not like to be told that our dogs, which we are trying to put before the public as a great dog to own; are only poor specimens of another breed, and this will continue to happen whilst erroneous statements are made about our breed.



## Vancouver Juniors Have Huge Club

The Vancouver Junior Kennel Club was formed eight years ago by Mrs. Elsie Murray. This club has been growing ever since and now has approximately 60 members. The aim of the club is to educate young people about dogs, especially purebred. To foster this aim, regular training is given in show, handling, rules, grooming, general care and conformation of individual breeds, and in Obedience work. Members do not have to own a dog to join and in fact, many join to learn before they buy a dog; this obviously being a desirable situation.


The results of having such a club are very obvious to dog people in Vancouver since a high standard is maintained in all areas through written examinations and practical competitions. These are not obligatory for all members but the majority take part. The results are shown in the number of champions and obedience title holders achieved by juniors. Many breeders have been so impressed that they have given show prospects to juniors along with their much appreciated information. Professional handlers use their help in grooming and handling at all the shows and many juniors have placed and won in groups handling dogs of other people so well as their own. In Obedience the juniors with registered dogs place regularly even in competition in the States. Also, Junior Showmanship classes in Washington are dominated by whatever juniors can go to them. Often a group of three will come out first, second and third from a class of 40. Older juniors also do a proficient job of ring stewarding at many of the sanction and point shows.

Some of the juniors are starting to breed their own animals. With the extra knowledge and training they have received these members are going to be the top breeders and judges in the future. As long as this type of club can prosper, older dog people need not fear what will happen to their efforts to improve dogs. This work will be carried on with ever great success.

# THAT PUPPY YOU REARED BY HAND

*Mrs. Alida Monro, founder of the famed Firebrave line of Miniature Poodles is well-known to the Poodle fanciers in this country and deeply regarded by breeders everywhere.*

That puppy that you reared by hand because it wasn't doing well. I don't mean the one that tried to take the nipple and was pushed off by his stronger brothers. I mean the one or ones that the bitch kept pushing out into the cold, for which you felt sorry and were induced by your feelings to attempt to bring up by hand. In many cases these puppies have been reared successfully. Breeders for generations have questioned the wisdom of this. Recently I had an experience with two young sparrows that brought this question very forcibly to mind. One afternoon I went into my barn and found an extremely young sparrow lying on the bench beside my car, crying feebly. It had fallen from the swallow's nest which the sparrows had taken over in the owner's absence — and, what a furore was created when the swallows returned and found usurpers in their nest! A battle royal ensued and the swallows were forced to abandon their own property. I put the little sparrow into a box lined with hay because I could not face killing him and I hoped he might die comfortably in these quarters. However, when I returned the following morning I found him still alive and cheeping pitifully. I took him into the house and put him on the mantelshelf over the Aga cooker where it was nice and warm. I fed him bread and milk which he took ravenously, and later a number of flies which I was lucky enough to swat. He seemed contented. I realized he was only a few days old because he still had the knobby lump on his beak with which he had broken open his shell. He was very sparsely feathered which confirmed my opinion. The same evening going into the barn I found a second sparrow lying on the bench. He was bigger than the one I had found earlier and better feathered. He, too, was squawking, but lustily. I took him into the house and put him in the box beside his brother and fed him in a similar manner. I may say my whole attitude to flies was completely changed with the advent of my two protogees. I was

very annoyed to find so few flies that I could swat and spent my time going looking about for any kind of insect that I could capture and crush and offer to my young birds. These two, after a day or two, set up a resounding cheep and opened immense yellow rimmed beaks as soon as they heard my voice. My dogs were very intrigued by the two strangers and stood round all the time I fed them, hopefully waiting for any odd morsels that fell to them. The second day I sought advice from an expert who agreed that rearing wild birds was very difficult but suggested I should feed them meal prepared for budgerigars, canaries and other young birds, in addition to all the insects I could get. This I did. They seemed to thrive and after a few days when I went to feed them they perched on my fingers. On the tenth day the first one who, to my dismay, had not grown at all during those days nor had he feathered as he should, although he appeared sprightly, and ate well, I noticed he was beginning to fail and that his cheep was rather weaker. Next morning I found him dead. His brother who had been much bigger from the start had feathered very well and seemed to be thriving and I felt very hopeful of rearing him but, one morning as he was perched on my finger I suddenly noticed that one of his wings was put on at the wrong angle and it was obvious that he would never be able to fly. Now I was in a quandary. If he continued to survive I could not possibly let him loose in my own place because of the dogs, but much more important because of my cat. I had intended to take him to the Common and let him go as soon as he was able to fly and look after himself. In the interim between infancy and flight I intended keeping him in a large parrot cage. However, the sight of his deformed wing made me feel it would be wrong of me to let him survive. I could not make up my mind and went on feeding him. Then Nature solved the problem. One morning I found him dead. There is my case. Does it not seem certain that the mother bird knew these two young-

sters were unfitted to survive, and that their fall was not an accident? The smaller one lacked in his make-up what is needed for natural growth, the larger had a deformity and would be unable to survive in normal conditions. He was doomed to death as was his brother. How did the mother know? Can it not be that she had a natural means of knowing the deficiencies of her offspring, that a normal youngster gives off certain magnetic waves that she receives, and those that are not normal use a wave length that she cannot receive and so are pushed out as any waste product would be? Let us translate this to the canine world. Bitches, I am sure, have the same certain knowledge and so-called bad mothers may be exercising it and not neglecting their duties as we think. I have not had any personal experience of hand rearing puppies that have been pushed out. The only occasion on which I tried hand feeding I was not successful. There is one case of which I heard recently and it seems to bear out my thesis. A maiden bitch whelped four puppies quite successfully, but she refused to take any care of them and contented herself with lying nearby and cocking a thoughtful eye at them as they cried. Her owners decided to take a hand and fed the pups a full three weeks. After that they were able to be weaned they all survived and developed quite well and all went to different homes. As they reached six months things went wrong, one developed deafness, another blindness. A third became wild and hysterical and almost unmanageable. The fourth is the best, and he appears to be not quite 100% healthy. There is my case. Some would say the bitch was a bad mother. Was she?


