

FROM THE EDITOR

From time to time the question arises as to the value of a specialized magazine as an advertising medium as opposed to a mass medium, such as a daily newspaper. In this age of specialization, methods of reaching potential customers have become streamlined, so that specialized publications, of which *Dogs in Canada* is one, are a primary requirement in marketing services, products — and dogs.

While raising and selling of purebreds is not a business with most of *Dogs'* readers, many aspects are so similar to those of a business, that a practical, down-to-earth system of advertising should be used. A simple method of bookkeeping is also essential — one should at least know the cost of raising a litter, including stud fees, inoculations, medications as well as food and supplements — in addition to the sale price.

How and where should you advertise? First, decide who you want to reach — then how to reach these potential customers — without paying for waste circulation. If you have show stock to sell or stud services to offer, your market is apparent. You are seeking someone who would appreciate a good dog and would like to add show or breeding stock to his present kennel. Who are these people? They are readers of *Dogs in Canada*, willing to pay a proper price for what they want. They are your concentrated market — there is absolutely no waste. On the other hand, if you have stock you are willing to sell at low prices to the general public, classified newspaper advertising would serve your needs.

It is unrealistic, however, to run a single advertisement and expect immediate and direct profit. It doesn't happen that way in business nor will it in selling dogs. A small advertisement, used repetitiously or changed from time to time, but in continuity, stands a far better chance of paying dividends than a single insertion.

Successful breeders have a workable system of allowing so much per puppy per litter for advertising; \$5.00 per pup is found to be the lowest workable amount. Budget for the 12 months ahead, considering special issues, Christmas, or other months when it would be beneficial to increase your promotion.

Dogs in Canada has a campaign under way, to increase the readership and potential customers, directed to groups of people who have shown a real interest in purebred dogs.

Operators of successful kennels acknowledge that a kennel cannot be profitably run without advertising. Your publishers will be pleased to assist you in planning a budget or drafting copy.

While no publication would claim to do the entire job, *Dogs in Canada*, as Canada's sole all-breed national publication, should be your base of promotion for your kennels.

The German Shepherd pictured on this month's cover is Can. and Am. Ch. Sussex Leigh's Wendy of Donami, known to her family as "Wendy". Owned by Mr. and Mrs. John C. Logan, 300 Bright St., Sarnia, Ont., she is a genuine "working dog"; her occupations include herding, serving as a watch-dog, companion and baby sitter, while not attending shows. In her owner's opinion she is lovable, is full of personality, vim and vigor, and holds a high opinion of her own attributes.

Mr. and Mrs. Ed Summerfield bred Wendy for the Logans from their Ch. Frigga of Sussex Leigh and a top-producing sire, Can. Grand Victor, Ch. Ero VD Auwellenburg. "Without Ed's help," Mr. and Mrs. Logan maintain, "we undoubtedly would never have had such a successful start in showing, breeding and training the German Shepherd Dog." Her full brother Ch. Wiseman was another top dog in the ring until a bad virus ended his show career.

Handled by her owners in Canada and by F. A. "Chum" Porter in the U.S.A., Wendy attained ten points in the States before she was two years of age, and her Canadian championship at two years and a few weeks. She finished her American title in August, 1961 at Chagrin Valley, Ohio in an entry of 62, going Best of Opposite Sex under Working Group specialist Robert Wills. At this time she was believed to be the only living Canadian-bred German Shepherd holding both titles. She earned four Group placings, eight Best of Breed, ten BOS — always shown in large shows with big entries in the breed. She was retired from the American show ring after going Best of Breed under Robert Wills at Columbus, Ohio. Now she is permanently retired from the show ring at five years to resume maternal duties. She will be bred to Ch. Ulk Wikingerblut Sch III in the Fall. These puppies will be closely linebred on Axel V.D. Deininghauserheide. Pedigrees will be sent on request and two reservations are open.

In the meantime, Wendy is using her natural, inherited instinct for herding work and has had favorable comments on her abilities from local experts. She is being trained for Obedience and will enter that ring soon.

My other English Import, Can. Ch. Vulcan Champagne Amamas, is a daughter of Eng. Ch. Vulcan Champagne Spear and granddaughter of Eng. Ch. Vulcan Champagne Spinach (both dogs mentioned in Miss Lane's article), and is also a great granddaughter of Int. Ch. Nunsoe His Grace.

OLD TIMER TOUCHES TENDER SPOT

. . . The Old Timer (June issue) touches upon a sore spot on the collective bodies of dog shows in Canada. Judging by reactions and comments from fellow exhibitors the conditions touched upon are of extreme concern to a great many people.

Inasmuch as the article does mention a situation which is assuming ever more menacing proportions it is decidedly to be welcomed. Unfortunately the Old Timer's "supposing", regarding the possibility of malpractices on the part of exhibitors and handlers who double as judges, suggests a certain lack of familiarity with today's dog shows. A doctor who were to say "suppose there is such a thing as the measles" could not astonish one more severely. There is no questioning the fact that some breeder-exhibitors, as well as handlers, make excellent judges. But it is safe to assume that to expect an excellent job of judging from breeder-exhibitors and/or handlers who have never managed to rise above mediocrity, is utter folly. We are afflicted at this very moment with judges who, as breeders in their very own breeds, are hopelessly at sea; judges who, as exhibitors, are ridiculously ineffective, and finally judges who, as handlers, are at-

tempting to gain championships for dogs of such incredible lack of quality that one wonders how these handler-judges could possibly recognize quality if they were to be hit in their faces with it.

It goes without saying that the CKC should carefully balance the advantages of this wide open situation against the tremendous disadvantages. The regulations presently in existence are quite inadequate to curb malpractices. Unlike the Old Timer we do not believe in a 90% honesty rate, nor do we believe that legislation pertaining to this matter is impossible. Considerably less than 10% of Canada's citizens rob banks each year, but there must be legislation regarding those who do.

Let no one be deceived by the standard excuse that if action were to be taken "there would be no dog shows left for lack of judges". A poor show is not better than no show at all. A bad judge is not better than no judge at all, nor incidentally is a poor champion better than no champion at all. If neither the CKC or the show-giving clubs possess the resources to ensure an adequate supply of judges who are beyond reproach, let them decrease the numbers of shows. Amputations have been known to save lives.

P.S. During the past two years I have regretfully declined an appreciable number of invitations to judge at Canadian shows, mentioning as my reason the disagreeable impression the very exercising of the dual functions of handler and judge might cause in the eyes of exhibitors. My decision was not one of conscience but of consideration for the feelings of fellow exhibitors and handlers.

. . . The Old Timer article starts off with the statement: "Just supposing, conjectured the Old Timer, a judge puts up a competitive dog one week and handles him the next? No law against it."

Quote: Dog Show Rules, page 28, section 16: A dog shall not be handled, regardless of whether there is any remuneration in the show ring, by any person who has judged that dog, or any other dog owned by the same person (or kennelled on that person's premises) within one year preceding the show."

Unfortunately in Canada there is not a license available for either handler or judge. Nor is a license required. Until this law is changed in Canada we will always have a small group of people who call themselves dog judges impersonating professional handlers and vice versa.

I would like to see the Old Timer do an article about the way Poodles are being judged today. I think the judges are afraid to feel under the Poodle coats to see if there is a dog under all that hair or not. I am sure that the people who breed Poodles would welcome a judge that would really give their dogs a good going over. If the Poodle has a proper coat it only takes a moment to put it in order again.

DIFFERENCE IN SAMOYED STANDARD

. . . May I write in connection with the portion dealing with Samoyeds in the article written by Mr. Stan Whitmore on the Working Breed in the May issue of *Dogs in Canada*?

His remarks "This breed has improved a lot over the past few years, more within standard size, adhering more to the American specifications", are what I would call a left-handed compliment.

The Canadian Samoyed Club presented a Canadian Standard to The Canadian Kennel Club in 1959 which was approved by them, and which we in Canada have been stressing since that time. While the American Standard is much more lengthy than ours, when it is all boiled down to the important details there remains really only one difference of any importance, and that is the one of size. I would like to add here also that the United States is the only country in the whole world that has approved the increase in size for the Samoyed. A vote taken by as many breeders and owners in Canada as could possibly be contacted proved that their preference was for the size given in the original Standard.

It is the opinion of the writer that the Samoyeds in Canada today (at least in the Eastern part where I have the opportunity of seeing them) are as good as, if not superior to, any being shown in the United States today, and it would be a great help to our breeders if all judges, when judging in Canada, would keep in mind that there is this one difference in the two Standards.

THE OLD TIMER

While the judge is in the ring to judge dogs, maintains the Old Timer, the handler should be just as presentable as the dog.

The Old Timer was chuckling as I sat down beside him at the ringside.

"Ever see the south end of an elephant going north?" he asked.

I'd just been turned down in the ring and wasn't feeling too happy about it so my answer was rather sharp.

"I came here to see dogs, not a menagerie," I told him. "I'm not interested in elephants."

"But take a look at that one," the Old Timer insisted. "It illustrates a point I've been trying to make for a long time."

I looked up. Facing me was a pair of slacks—but what a pair. They were broad in the beam and well filled. The seat ended midway towards the knees. There was a smear of chalk across the posterior and about two inches of bare back showed between where the slacks ended and a rather dirty white sweater began.

Just then the owner of the slacks, having got her dog set up the way she wanted, straightened herself. She was a big woman, who could have been good looking. But it was obvious that all the grooming time available to her had been spent on grooming her dog. Her hair was unkempt. Lipstick, applied earlier in the day, had become a piebald patch. The face was smeared with a combination of white chalk and perspiration.

The dog, however, was immaculate, and I made a point of mentioning it.

"Of course," said the Old Timer. "It's in wonderful condition, but the exhibitor isn't being much help to it the way she is dressed."

"It's the dog that's being judged," I argued "not the exhibitor."

"True," said the Old Timer, "but you get in the judging ring and see if you can divorce yourself entirely from the whole picture of dog and exhibitor. Mind you, I'm not picking on that particular exhibitor. She just happens to be handy. You'll find men going into the ring just as sloppily dressed. In fact

I think you'll find more of them. On the other side of the picture you'll find women dressed in high style, trying to move a German Shepherd, for instance, on a pair of spike heels."

"I still say the judge is in there to judge dogs, not to pass on the way the exhibitors are dressed," I argued.

"Again, I agree," said the Old Timer. "But I'm thinking of the overall picture. To me the handler should complement the dog. Now I'm not advocating that a dog show should also be a fashion show. But I do say that when the exhibitor takes a dog into the ring he, or she, should be just as presentable as the dog."

"Now slacks, for instance. It's my own opinion that slacks adorn only about one mature female form out of a hundred. God gave women curves and if they've got 'em, slacks don't help them . . . at least not those who have them in an over-generous proportion. And why men with pot tummies go into the ring in shirt sleeves, with a couple of rolls of that fat hanging over their belt buckle, is something I'll never know."

"Okay," I asked. "Let's have your idea of what the well dressed exhibitor should wear."

The Old Timer scratched his head for a moment.

"First of all," he said, "I'd emphasize cleanliness. No reason at all why, after a dog is ready for the ring, the exhibitor shouldn't take a minute to head for the washroom and get rid of the powder and dust. No reason either, that he shouldn't run a comb through his hair or, if a woman, apply a little fresh make-up."

For a man I'm in favor of a jacket in the ring. For a woman a tailored dress or suit. Sensible shoes, in my book, are a must and for women—or most of them—I'd say high heels should definitely be out, particularly if they are

THE HUMANE SOCIETY

BY TOM HUGHES

Third in a series by the General Manager of the Ontario Humane, in which the writer discusses the pros and cons of kennel inspection.



The average dog fancier sometimes fails to appreciate the great amount of work done by a Humane Society with other animals. This is only natural, since the dog fancier is primarily concerned with dogs and the particular breed of dog he happens to be interested in. The facts, however, are that there are many more domestic pets of other species than there are dogs in Canada today. For example, the uncounted thousands of cats. These represent an increasing proportion of the demands made on the average Humane Society or SPCA for help and assistance. This help may only extend to providing humane destruction facilities for unwanted kittens but whatever help and assistance is given, it is essential and without it, thousands of cats would suffer unnecessarily.

There are thousands of budgerigars and small rodents such as hamsters kept in captivity. These in turn sooner or later create a demand on the services of the Humane Society.

A considerable number of horses are kept both for work and for pleasure. It is hard to know how many horses there are in Canada at the present time, but I would be surprised if the number is much less than 250,000.

The only reason I draw these facts to your attention is to show that the Humane Society is not primarily or solely concerned with dogs. We are interested in all animals, their problems, the problems of their owners and finally in the prevention of cruelty to those animals.

This brings me to my main point; prevention is a thousand times better than cure! The best way I know to achieve prevention is to regularly inspect premises where animals are housed and kept. This is done frequently in the case of slaughter houses, pet stores, riding stables, stock yards, public pounds and similar establishments.

A very obvious "absentee" in the last paragraph are kennels where dogs are boarded and, to a lesser degree, bred. Such kennels are not at the present time inspected by an impartial authority throughout the country.

Many kennels claim that they are subject to "Veterinary Inspection." With the best will in the world this may mean very little. It can mean, the most careful and rigorous checks of the establishment by an eminently well-qualified person in the shape of a veterinarian with years of small animal experience, who is prepared to inspect a kennel and pull no punches in expressing his opinions to the owner of the kennel. This highly desirable form of inspection is, in fact, the most that the words "Veterinary Inspection" can mean. But even in these cases and presuming that the veterinarian who makes the inspection condemns a part or whole of what he sees, the kennel owner or proprietor is not under the least obligation to pay attention to the opinion of the veterinarian. I appreciate that the average kennel proprietor, in fact the vast majority of kennel proprietors, would meet the suggestions of the veterinarian, and in fact would not have invited his inspection unless he intended to go along with that advice. But the fact remains that this "inspection" has only limited value. It can mean absolutely nothing!

It is true that the lower than average kennel, or to be more frank the "sub standard" kennel, is sub standard because the owner or operator either does not have the necessary funds or the knowledge, or is indifferent. Any inspection of an establishment such as these can mean nothing unless the inspection can be followed up by some authority who has the necessary power to deal with the situation.

It is in this problem that I believe that SPCA's and Humane Societies can play an active part in conjunction with The Canadian Kennel Club. Not the "local" Humane Society, because this group does not have the legal authority or status to take action against any kennel but the SPCA's such as the British Columbia SPCA and the Ontario SPCA who are incorporated by public Acts of the Provincial Legislature. What I propose is that a scheme that I was instrumental in introducing in British Columbia be extended to the Dominion of Canada and particularly to the Province of Ontario.

Under this scheme of kennel inspection, kennels are inspected once a year by a well-qualified representative of this Society. If the Inspector recommends that the standards of the kennel are adequate, a certificate of approval is sent to the kennel proprietor, together with a sign which can be hung outside the premises. The virtue of this scheme is that the general public who do not have the opportunity to examine the kennels themselves, or for that matter, may not have the specialized knowledge to recognize a good kennel, can leave their animals with confidence at an establishment showing an approved sign of this Society. The certificate is renewable each year and the inspection has to be repeated yearly or whenever the type of operation or the proprietor changes.

This system has been in force in British Columbia for a number of years

German Shepherd

Past



GEORGE GERIGS owned and showed his first Shepherd in 1927, handled for Mr. and Mrs. H. S. Weller of Briardale Kennels whose stock was the foundation for his own White Hart kennels at Pickering, Ont., registered in 1953. An active exhibitor, he now holds a license for judging Shepherds. He is a member of the German Shepherd Dog Breeders Assoc., Inc. (also a past President), and editor of the club's monthly bulletin.

First I would like to express my appreciation for the opportunity to reminisce and in doing so provide those who perhaps do not have the same information at their fingertips, with some of the recorded facts regarding great Shepherds of the past.

I think any novice, having decided on the breeding of German Shepherd Dogs, and having gathered all the books currently printed in order to acquaint himself with great dogs of the years 1937 - 1953, would have come to the following conclusions.

In order to qualify as 'great' a dog must, in himself, approach very closely the standard set by the recognised authorities in structure and temperament. But just as important as this, he must be capable of producing specimens as good as, and better than, himself. His effect upon the breed must be noticeable, even through his grandchildren. He must be dominant enough to correct faults in the specimens and bloodlines that he is used with. Lastly, the greats and near greats passed on their faults to a lesser degree than their virtues. In other words, they improved the breed as a whole.

Secondly, he would come to the conclusion that although many good dogs have come and gone from the scene during the past quarter of a century, it does not take months of reading to single out the greats, especially if one checks authentic records and is prepared to accept the opinions of the experts. The records will show him that the dogs during the mentioned period who had the greatest potential for breed improvement on this continent were, Pfeffer v Bern, Odin v Busecker Schloss, Nox of Ruthland, Falko of Benlore, during the earlier part of these years. These four dogs had to have great influence because they were in themselves, 'greats', and came down through such greats as Erich v Grafenworth, Klodo v Boxberg, whose names can be found somewhere on most of our Pedigrees today.

He would also now realize that for some ten or 15 years after they were first used on this continent, the influence on the breed by Pfeffer and Odin has,

to date no modern comparison; even in 1952 Pfeffer was rated by experts as one of the top, if not 'the' top contributor to breed improvement for the past 30 years. He would also find, were he to compile a list of these greats, this list would, in the main, correspond with the following, after the founders of the breed, and up to the Pfeffer era, such dogs as: Erich v Grafenworth Sieger 1920, Klodo v Boxberg Sieger 1925, Utz v Haus Schutting Sieger 1929, Hussan v Haus Schutting, Cito v Bergerslust, Alf v Webbelmanslust, Curt v Herzog Hedan, Odin v Stolzenfels Sieger 1933, Cuno v Georgentoor Sieger 1934, Brando v Heidelbeerberg, Gerri v Hooptal, Gelmo v Hooptal, Bodo v Brahmenau, Dewett v d Starrenburg J.S. 1934, Jalk Pagensrub Sieger 1935, Clodulf v Pelztierhof, Alex v Eber-snacken, Ferdl v d Secretanerie, Dachs v Bern.

Starting with the Pfeffer era, the following imports and American breeds had a great influence on the breed: Pfeffer v Bern Sieger 1936, Odin v Busecker Schloss, Trutz a d Schwanenstadt, Baldr v Befreunungsplatz, Siegbert Heidegrund, Ingo Piastendamm, Quell Durmeisheim, Quido Durmeisheim, Siggo Cornilushof, Lex Preussenblutt, Rolf v Osnabruckerland.

The following are American bred 'greats': Ch. Nox of Ruthland Gr. Vic. 1941 and 1944, Ch. Marlo v Hoheluft, Ch. Derry of Longworth, Ch. Garry of Benlore, Ch. San Miguel's Baron of Afbor, Ch. Merrilees Vetter of Dornwald, Ch. San Miguel's Imp of Rocky Reach, Ch. Storm of Seamair, Ch. Nocturne of Grettamarc, Ch. Conde Del Llano Estacado, Ch. Nox of Dornwald, Ch. Cosalta's Ace of Wyliewood, Ch. Jeffry of Browvale.

This brings us to the greats whose affect upon the breed were being felt during a period which is too close to the present to be really of the past.

It is interesting to note that in the current issue of the German Shepherd Dog Review, there is a Great Grandson of the one and only Pfeffer v Bern, advertised at stud.

As to the amount of influence felt by the breed, I feel that perhaps when reviewing the records, we would have no other choice than to place Pfeffer V. Bern at the top of the list. We would find that this dog was almost individually responsible for the change in type of Shepherd bred, after his arrival on this continent. And even today more than just a few long-time breeders will class newcomers as either 'Pfeffer or Odin type'. Odin and Pfeffer were half brothers, and, though perhaps in a lesser degree, Odin V Busecker Schloss played no small part in giving to this continent the type of Shepherd desired by the foremost breeders during the time of these gone but not to be forgotten great Shepherd Dogs. ■

Today's German Shepherd Dog is indeed a "rare" breed. Although now more handsome and elegant, more streamlined and closer to the ideal of perfection for the breed, the German Shepherd has lost none of the qualities necessary for a true working dog. This is a breed which, in the process of constant beautification by dedicated breeders, has actually improved rather than degenerated, and whose rigid standard is being maintained. He is unique too, in the sense that he is being put into use more than ever before, and in numbers far surpassing any other breed of dog, for various types of work requiring intelligence, dependability, stamina, courage, soundness, trainability and faithfulness. Armed forces all over the world have now turned to the German Shepherd Dog almost exclusively as guards, scouts and messengers; they have proven themselves beyond a doubt as the finest rescue dogs and the Alpine Rescue Patrols use only the German Shepherd for this work; police in almost every country utilize this dog on their forces not only for rugged duty but as trackers, and in addition to countless law-breakers being apprehended due to the ability of the German Shepherd for this type of work, a great many lost children have this dog to thank for saving their lives. Properly trained, this breed is unsurpassed as a dependable herding dog, and his fame as a reliable guide dog for the blind is world-wide. In addition to all of these attributes he is a devoted companion who would more often than not give his life in defence of his family. This is a dog which is closer to being human than any other animal I know, and he thrives on human companionship, particularly when it is coupled with careful training, intelligent care and consideration.

The German Shepherd Dog is today one of the most popular breeds in the world. Fortunately there seem to be a predominant number of truly sincere breeders who are more interested in improving and developing good sound specimens than there are those who are interested only in capitalizing on popularity for the sake of the almighty

dollar without giving any thought to soundness, selection, type or bloodlines as was the tragic case after the First World War. Thanks to the large number of German Shepherd Dog Specialty Clubs being organized throughout every corner of the United States and Canada, students of the breed are constantly increasing in numbers, and even the general public is becoming better educated as to the requirements of a good German Shepherd Dog and thus less likely to be taken in by the proprietors of puppy factories and careless backyard breeders. I doubt that we shall ever breed the perfect specimen, but it is a constant challenge to try to reach for that goal, and more German Shepherds than ever before are now coming closer to that standard. Where once, not too long ago, it was not very difficult to make a champion, today it is an entirely different story with much greater and tougher competition and many more Shepherds of excellent quality appearing in the ring.

The German Shepherd has the highest point rating both in Canada and in the United States; more and larger specialty shows are held for this breed than for any other, and it is becoming commonplace to see a specialty judge assigned to do German Shepherd dogs at all-breed shows. At this point I cannot help but digress from the main subject for a moment, since the last few sentences deal with something about which I feel very strongly. To my mind, our present system of point rating is pathetically antiquated, and it is high time that we gave consideration to a system of grading. As previously mentioned, we find these days a large number of really top-notch specimens in many shows, particularly at specialty shows and booster shows where the judge is generally well versed in the breed, and yet points can be given only to the Winners Dog and Winners Bitch despite the fact that others could well and deservedly be classed as excellent. In contrast, we still find in many all breed shows a small entry of average or mediocre specimens which are given points on a similar basis of competition, but which quite often do not deserve nearly as much credit toward a championship title as some of those others previously mentioned which may not even have placed in the ribbons. Surely, under those circumstances, we have reached a turning point where we should progress and devise a fairer and better method of awarding championship titles which would give proper recognition to those dogs truly deserving of this distinction. In obedience, German Shepherd Dogs lead the pack as degree winners, and it is not at all uncommon these days to find a champion with a U.D. degree as well.

A great step forward today is the

We are often times asked just what our goals are in regard to the work being done by the American Breed Survey Society. I believe the most important task that lies before us is the compiling of a history of the German Shepherd Dog on this continent, starting with the inception of the ABSS in 1958, listing data in regard to the various strains, making recommendations, issuing warnings in regard to breeding of individual dogs.

Naturally the system employed by the American Breed Survey Society for German Shepherd Dogs (known as ABSS) is not a new one. On the contrary, it has been used in Germany under the name of die Ankorung since about 1920 with astounding results, giving us consistently the most outstanding sires and dams of the breed. The answer obviously is the zeal with which European breeders adhere to the recommendations of the Survey Board. As we progress under the Breed Survey system we too will learn the wisdom of some degree of obedience to rules, as we must do in every other sport, in order to reach any marked degree of success. A boxer does not reach heights in the ring, a golfer does not perfect his golfing technique, a runner does not perfect his style without studying the rules which have been compiled over the years by the trial and error of others in the sport. Likewise, the breeder of Shepherds needs to take a look at the results of blood combinations, of the combining of certain physical and mental characteristics and the results of these combinations.

To depend on clever advertising for knowledge is a sure path to disaster. The advertiser is interested in two things namely: 1-to sell his product. 2-to satisfy human ego. Rarely does one find among his fellow breeders a thoroughly honest desire to help breeders other than himself. This may be considered a blunt statement regarding an unfortunate but totally human characteristic.


A breed improvement system without political affiliations or selfish interest seems to be the better answer. The ABSS claims to have this highly enviable distinction.

Just a few of the aims of the ABSS are as follows: 1-The improvement of temperament of the German Shepherd. 2-Well developed jaw formation. 3-Avoidment of faulty rear action. 4-Avoidment of weak shoulder angulation. 5-Improve pigmentation. The function of the (ABSS) is to offer guidance to those who would not only breed top caliber show and obedience stock, but most important of all have a desire to produce worthy breeding material with breeding background of comparatively clean ancestry. We do not have false illusions in regard to the time element and personal effort involved in such a long reaching breeding program. The Germans started the Survey movement in 1922 and are still making necessary changes in the program from time to time. Their success speaks for itself.

The improvement of temperament should be first and foremost, in the improvement of all breeds of dogs, in order that he may be a better companion and servant to man. His nerves should be sound, his attitude toward people should be favorable, not necessarily everyone's friend but rather, indifferent toward strangers. The gunfire test has now been added to insure against dogs of unsound nerves. This of course does not mean that dogs showing slight reaction are turned down by the Breed Survey. It does mean that such faults are noted and that dogs having these slight faults are used with warning. Our goal and aim is toward the improvement of nerves and temperament in the German Shepherd Dog.

The ABSS recommends that faulty jaw formation should be avoided or bred away from in order that male dogs may give the appearance of full masculinity and bitches that of strength. More important perhaps is the fact that the well developed jaw provides the better tooth bed, one more likely to hold the teeth intact even when exercised on hard objects with continuous regularity. In the survey field we find that the shallow jaw, because of the shallow tooth bed fails in many cases to hold the premolars, even sometimes the molar when the animal is allowed to chew on hard objects, such as bones or hard toys. Lack of No. 3 upper premolar or No. 4 lower premolar is also a serious fault as the loss or lack of these teeth allows the remaining teeth to "drift" and become loose, eventually dropping out. Such tooth faults are usually inherited and must, if we are to progress, be warned against. Another aim and goal is to improve pigmentation within the breed.

Faulty rear action is still quite pre-

Photo-series for a dog's head

At first sight it looked to me like a child's play: a German Shepherd Dog was to be photographed in color with the head at a particular angle and the tongue hanging out. A few trial shots were made in a training school and a number of types submitted for the criticism of the experts. By now I was aware of the fine distinctions that are drawn in expert circles. The various types and breeds soon became familiar to me and it remained only to find a typical specimen with the required characteristics. However, it did not end there; there were many other conditions to be fulfilled: the muzzle had to appear moist, ears correctly pointed and eyes alert, with gaze appropriately directed. At the same time the dog had to be allowed a certain freedom of movement so that it should not appear cramped. The

background was to be quiet, but not monotonous and unnatural, the coat very sleek and glossy and in bold relief. Even the deep black parts of the coat and the shadowed areas, must show glossy detail to ensure perfection in the final reproduction. To obviate excessive panting and slavering of the extended tongue it was necessary to keep the dog right up to the last moment in a cool, shady place. A few trials enabled me to decide upon the most favorable lighting and the correct exposure using a flash fill light. The lighting set-up, that is to say the main lighting and fill light with additional small lighting units, was so arranged as to give the necessary camera mobility to enable a considerable number of shots to be obtained without tiring photographer or model.

Another failure: the dog is standing in such a position that the head appears to sink into the body and this leads to ugly intersections.

In the course of photographing this series we discovered that bitches have an unsuitable mentality and are much more nervous than dogs, and are therefore not used for portraiture.

It is difficult to get a dog to maintain a particular position without showing evidence of constraint. I had to attract its attention to the desired direction by getting an assistant to make scarcely perceptible noises, such as rustling paper, or scraping shoes at a considerable distance. After many abortive attempts—mostly the result of spontaneous movement on the part of the dog—critical examination left only a small selection of satisfactory pictures. Every movement of the dog was followed with the camera and shot after shot was taken at the few favorable moments. Thanks to the rapid interchangeability of adap-

Show Talk

The first Saturday in June was the date for the 25th dog show of the *Progressive Kennel Club*, held for the second year in the Don Mills Arena. The building lends itself perfectly to this type of activity. This old club has dispensed with benching, leaving only the Ottawa, Burlington and Kitchener Shows to hold bench shows in Ontario. Martha and Clarence Stevens, Show Secretary and Superintendent for many years, conducted their respective duties with their usual efficiency. Martha claims this is her last year at the job. Judges Sam Back, Neil Malcolm and Glen Stephens gave Dr. W. E. Shute his six dogs from which to choose BIS. His choice was the West Highland White Terrier, Ch. Dina Ken's Little Pip, also BCB. Another Westie took the Doctor's eye for BCBP, Roseneath Dainty Diamond, owned by Mrs. Thelma Adams.

The *Burlington & District K.C.* again had Miss Blanche Saunders to conduct one of her very famous Obedience Clinics the day prior to their double trial. The Clinic, although better attended than last year, still left much in the way of attendance to be desired. The majority who did attend were from distant points. The Trial the following day had five rings and five judges all active at the same time. Miles Flannigan, George Taylor, Walter Konradt and Miss Saunders passed on the official classes in the two trials and Marguerite Charter judged the unofficial classes. American dogs once more showed the way to the Canadian dogs and took home most of the trophies. One exception to this was the highest score in the unofficial classes, for

a youngster. Douglas Wade took home this trophy for his score in the Graduate Novice.

The middle of June again welcomed good weather for *The Canadian Save the Children Fund Dog Shows*. Climax to an almost perfect two days was a short visit by Her Majesty the Queen Mother. BIS honors were divided between the Pekingese, Ch. (Can. Am.) St. Aubrey Mario of Elsdon, owned by Nigel Aubrey-Jones and R. Wm. Taylor, and the Kerry Blue Terrier, Ch. (Can. Am.) Tregoods Vickys Gallant, owned by Mr. and Mrs. H. Betts. Judges for these honors were Mr. Peter Smith and Mr. Louis Murr. BCBP each show came from the Terrier Group when Louis Murr chose the Cairn Terrier, Cairndania McBrigand's Holbrig, owned by Mrs. Betty Hyslop and Peter Smith chose the Miniature Schnauzer, Tannenbaum's By Golly, owned by Joan Morden.

The *Kingston & District K.C.* followed with their two shows. One must give credit to a hard-working committee who must find it difficult to conduct their shows. This club has very few members actively engaged in showing dogs and therefore are perhaps not too familiar with the many details that must be given attention. Judge Alfred LePine found his BIS in a repeat for the Pekingese. Mr. Edwin Pickhardt chose the Cairn Terrier, Ch. (Can. Am.) Rossmars Clanruff O'Cairndania. The owners just reversed positions for Mr. LePine's choice for BCBP was Betty Hyslop's Cairn Terrier Cairndania McBrigand's Holbrig and Mr. Pickhardt's was a

Stateside notes

A number of meetings of leading veterinarians will be held during the coming months in the United States, which will be of special interest to dog breeders both in the States and Canada: Animal Care Panel meeting, slated for Chicago, October 2 to 5 where, it is announced, scientific papers will be given on germ-free animals, dog diseases and facilities, etc.; a conference highlighting rabies is planned during the five day session at Atlanta, Ga., August 6 to 10. Here the status and growth of this dread disease in the States will be reviewed.

The Westminster Kennel Club has announced its judging panel for the 1963 show, to be held February 11, 12. Forty-nine judges will pass on 2,500 dogs. Among these will be the following who will give Mr. Virgil Johnson his choice for BIS; Sporting Group, Fred M. Hunt; Hound, Herman G. Cox; Working, Mrs. Wm. H. Long, Jr.; Terrier, Thos. H. Carruthers 3rd; Toy, Melbourne T. L. Downing; Non-Sporting, Anna K. Nicholas. We notice there are no Canadians in the long list, for the first time in quite a few years.

At the famous Dog Fanciers Luncheon in New York, Anton Rost, Mrs. Hayes Blake Hoyt and Laurence A. Horswell (the three speakers) were asked their opinion on unbenched and benched shows. With the ideas somewhat divided, all agreed that if expenses are not prohibitive benched shows have advantages generally outweighing their disadvantages. Among those mentioned were attractiveness to the paid spectators, which bring newcomers into the fancy, educating the general public and breed publicity from having the dogs in view. Judges' critiques also came up for some discussion and all three speakers were opposed to this and the grading of shows.

It might be well for Canadian exhibitors to take note of the new schedule of points that came into effect May 15. Most interesting is that it now takes five males or female Boxers for one point. This is the highest of all the breeds in the areas although it does drop down to four in the south and two in some western States. In these latter States German Shepherds take the lead as they do in Hawaii, where it takes three Shepherds to get one point.

Show-giving clubs who are interested in obtaining the Dog Show Judges' Directory from the American Kennel Club should bear in mind that the one sent out at the beginning of the year contained several errors and the A.K.C. suggests that clubs write for a revised copy, marking the outside of the envelope "judges' directory".

SHOW AND TRIAL RESULTS

The awards at shows and trials reported in this issue are in accordance with official returns received by the Canadian Kennel Club. As such the reports are subject to any necessary corrections, and to such cancellations as may be required by the applicable rules and regulations. 13 FT 28. RETRIEVER FIELD TRIALS

SUBJECT: The Secretary:

- (1) read a letter from Mr. Williams (dated March 17th), who expressed the view that:
 - (a) the Board, at its annual meeting in February, should not have proceeded to amend Chapter 4 Section 1 of the Field Trial Rules and Regulations, in connection with Retriever trials "without some reference to the Field Trial people";
 - (b) the concluding paragraph of the regulations approved by the Board at its annual meeting in February in connection with approval of judges for licensed Retriever trials conflicted with the preceding regulations governing the approval of judges for Retriever trials;
- (2) read a letter from Mr. Wells (dated March 22nd), enclosing a copy of a petition which he reported was being circulated, the petition claiming inconsistencies in connection with the sections relating to "student judges" and submitting that the concluding paragraph of the special regulations approved by the Board in connection with approval of judges for licensed Retriever trials "is contrary to the intent of the amendment to the By-laws" approved by the Minister "in that it gives an individual more authority than the Board of Directors";
- (3) read a letter from Mr. T. K. Coughlan (dated March 21st), British Columbia Field Trial Representative for Retrievers, requesting clarification of the sections relating to student judges;
- (4) read a memorandum from the Office Manager seeking clarification of certain sections of the new regulations.

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed it was pointed out that:

- (1) in the November (1961) issue of "Dogs in Canada" there had appeared a message from the Chairman of the Field Trial Council reporting on representations which had been submitted by a number of clubs conducting licensed Retriever trials, in connection with the approval of judges for Retriever trials, and the Chairman of the Field Trial Council had then sought the comments and suggestions of persons and clubs interested in Retriever trials, not only on the proposals which had been submitted, but any other suggestions with regard to possible revision of Chapter 4 Section 1 of the Field Trial Rules and Regulations;
- (2) copies of recommendations of the Chairman of the Field Trial Council with regard to the revision of Chapter 4 Section 1 of the Field Trial Rules had been distributed at the commencement of the annual meeting of the Board on February 3rd, and these recommendations were not dealt with by the Board until the Board's session of February 7th.

13 FT 29. BEAGLE FIELD TRIALS

SUBJECT: The Secretary read:

- (1) a letter (dated March 23rd) from Mr. Gratton, who reported that he had been asked by the Beagle Field Trial Representative for Nova Scotia & Newfoundland whether the Canadian Kennel Club would provide funds to meet travelling expenses should it be decided that a delegation from his electoral zone would attend a meeting of representatives of zone committees, proposed by the Ontario Field Trial Representative for Beagles (Packs) for the purpose of discussing matters of interest to Beagle clubs conducting licensed Beagle trials for packs;
- (2) a letter (dated March 27th) from Mr. Ralph Frayne, President of the Ontario Association of Beagle Clubs, in connection with minutes of previous Board meetings reporting the appointment of an Advisory Committee for Beagles (Packs), the granting of priority dates to Beagle clubs, and the appointment, at the annual meeting of the Board in February, of the Ontario Field Trial Representative for Beagles (Packs).

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed:

- (1) Mrs. Mack reported that Mr. Stuart, Quebec Field Trial Representative for Beagles, felt that some of the matters which had been proposed be discussed in connection with Beagle trials for packs were of concern to clubs conducting licensed Beagle trials by braces, and that therefore the appointment of an Advisory Committee should not be restricted to clubs conducting trials by braces;
- (2) it was agreed that the Board should proceed to authorize the appointment of an Advisory Council on Beagle trials (Brace), the Chairman of the Council to later arrange for liaison between the two Advisory Committees;
- (3) it was agreed that the Board had not at any time taken the position that it would no longer grant priority rights to clubs conducting licensed Beagle field trials;
- (4) it was agreed that, while recommendations of clubs conducting licensed Beagle field trials were sought in connection with the appointment of Beagle field trial representatives, the ultimate decision of the Board in making such appointments is not based entirely on the recommendations of Beagle clubs;
- (5) the By-laws (Article XIII, Section 10) provide for the formation of zone committees, but the Kennel Club has not been asked, nor is it considered advisable, to provide funds for travelling expenses in connection with meetings of zone committees, nor in connection with meetings of representatives of zone committees.

- (3) when distributing the agenda of this meeting to the Board he had requested that members of the Board bring to the meeting full details of all such cases known to them in order that a properly documented brief could be prepared.

 - (b) stated that the Committee's present interpretation of a Standing Resolution setting forth those names which may not be registered as kennel names indicates there is a very practical difficulty in making necessary decisions;
 - (c) submitted his redraft of a Standing Resolution setting forth those categories of names which may not be registered as kennel names.
- (2) a report, dated June 7, 1962, distributed to members of the Board by the Kennel Names Committee, in which the Committee recommended that the present Standing Resolution with regard to names which may not be registered as kennel names be revised to read as follows:

"THAT, the headnote in listing applications for registration of kennel names shall read as follows:

'NOTE: the following names MAY NOT be accepted as registered kennel names:

- (1) any name which has been registered as a kennel name with The Canadian Kennel Club;
- (2) any name which has been registered as a kennel name with any other kennel club with which The Canadian Kennel Club has working arrangements with regard to mutual protection of kennel names;
- (3) any name which is phonetically identical to a name registered as a kennel name with The Canadian Kennel Club;
- (4) the word "Royal" either as the whole or as a part of a name;
- (5) any name which is the name of a post office or place located within 100 miles of the applicant's residence and kennels;
- (6) the name of any place in Canada having a population of 1,000 or more;
- (7) a qualitative or descriptive adjective (unless it is one which is not normally used in naming dogs);
- (8) a colour, by itself, or in combination with other letters or word (unless it is a colour which is not normally used in naming dogs);
- (9) a name of a specific breed or breeds or group, or any name which is indicative of a specific breed or breeds or group;
- (10) any name which in the opinion of The Canadian Kennel Club is misleading as to origin or relationship."

DISCUSSION: After discussion it was agreed that the Board should proceed to discuss section by section the Committee's redraft of the Standing Resolution, at the same time considering Mr. Monaghan's recommended redraft of the same Standing Resolution.

DISCUSSION: During a discussion of proposed section (8) Dr. Williams pointed out that, although the present Standing Resolution refers to "colours", the Committee had interpreted this to mean that the Board felt that a kennel name should not be permitted if it included one or more colours, particularly where any of these colours are commonly used in the naming of dogs.

It was agreed that #(8) should be amended by adding "or words" after "word".

Motion carried.

DISCUSSION: Mr. Monaghan pointed out that, although the present Standing Resolution precludes the registration, as a kennel name, of nouns in common everyday use, the revision proposed by the Committee did not include this exclusion and he felt that the same exclusion should be included in a redraft of the Standing Resolution.

Dr. Williams stated that the Committee felt that it was difficult for the Committee to recognize all nouns in common everyday use and in order to avoid any suggestion that the Committee is discriminating it had felt it advisable to delete this exclusion.

DISCUSSION: Mr. Monaghan pointed out that the present Standing Resolution includes the following exclusion: "surnames (except in the case of an applicant who has, prior to January 1, 1958, registered more than ten dogs with his surname as a prefix, and it is otherwise not unacceptable)", and suggested that the same exclusion be included in the revision of the present Standing Resolution.

Dr. Williams stated that the Committee felt that if we are to continue our present policy (as expressed in a Standing Resolution still in effect) limiting the use of a name as a kennel name in the naming of three dogs, then a person wishing to use his surname as a prefix beyond that three-time limit should have the opportunity of registering his surname as a kennel name, hence the Committee did not include this exclusion in its redraft of the Standing Resolution.

During a discussion on this question both Dr. Williams and Mr. Monaghan quoted from sections of the Trade Marks Act and Regulations made thereunder, copies of which the Committee had obtained for reference purposes at this meeting.

SUBJECT: The following section included in the report (dated June 7th) of the Kennel Names Committee with regard to a proposed new application for registration of kennel name:

"Enclosed is a sample of the small card presently used as an application for registration of kennel name form. For some time we have been requesting that an application for registration of a kennel name show three choices. The Committee has given consideration to the revision of the application and it suggests that a new application for registration of kennel name take the form of a two-page folder, each page 8-1/2" x 11". The first page would set forth the name selected by the applicant and, in block letters, his name and postal address. The second page would include the conditions applying to the application and its approval and would require the signature of the applicant. The third page would include whatever restrictions the Board may decide on at its coming semi-annual meeting, together with such other information as the Board may decide should be included in the application. The fourth page would set forth the entire Article XXV of our By-laws dealing with kennel names."

A draft of pages 1. and 2. as prepared by the Committee is enclosed for the Board's examination prior to consideration of this question at the semi-annual meeting."

SUBJECT: The following section included in the report (dated June 7th) of the Kennel Names Committee with regard to the procedures followed in processing applications for registration of kennel names:

"Members of the Board are aware of the extent to which the present Kennel Names Committee and preceding Kennel Names Committees have sought to implement what it understood to be the Board's intentions when it adopted the present Standing Resolution quoted at the commencement of this report. It has reviewed practices followed by the Committee in the past, and at the coming semi-annual meeting of the Board will recommend that the following policies be approved by the Board in connection with the processing of applications for registration of kennel names:

- (1) In checking applications submitted, the staff at the head office will be restricted solely to establishing whether a name selected is covered by any of the restrictions set forth in the present Standing Resolution quoted at the commencement of this report (if that resolution should remain unchanged) or any new Standing Resolution which the Board, at its coming semi-annual meeting, may adopt in its place.
- (2) The Kennel Names Committee will be consulted only where the staff is in doubt as to the application of any restriction in connection with any particular application which has been received, and any objections which may be received following publication of applications in 'Dogs in Canada'.
- (3) In the case of a check on The American Kennel Club list, our check is to be restricted solely to ascertaining whether the name applied for is identical to a name registered with The American Kennel Club. If a name applied for is identical to a name on the A. K. C. list it will be rejected automatically, but all other names selected (whether phonetically identical or not) will be submitted to The American Kennel Club and their reaction will determine whether further consideration can be given any name selected. We will sustain automatically any objection received from The American Kennel Club, anticipating that they will do the same on any objection we see fit to submit to them.
- (4) Any name which does not come within any of the categories prohibited by Standing Resolution and which is not objected to by The American Kennel Club or any other kennel club with whom we have working arrangements on kennel names, will be published in 'Dogs in Canada' in the usual way, and if there is no objection within the stipulated period following publication, the name will be approved. Objections received following publication will be referred to the Kennel Names Committee for consideration."

DISCUSSION: Dr. Williams stated that the Committee's recommendations are based on a feeling of the Committee that the procedures now recommended by the Committee will ensure greater uniformity in accepting or rejecting applications than has been possible heretofore.

MOTION #260-62

Moved by Mr. Anderson, seconded by Mr. Blyth:

"THAT, the Kennel Names Committee be authorized to operate under the recommended procedure in processing applications for registration of kennel names."

SUBJECT: The following section included in the report (dated June 7th) of the Kennel Names Committee with regard to working arrangements with The American Kennel Club regarding kennel names:

"As the Board is aware, whenever we establish that a Canadian breeder is making use of a well-known American kennel name when naming, for registration purposes, dogs born in Canada, a 'stop card' is forwarded to the Live Stock Records office for inclusion in their files on registered kennel names with a view to prohibiting the further unauthorized use of such well-known kennel name. On the Committee's instruction the Secretary communicated with The American Kennel Club regarding letters received from Canadian breeders having the kennel names SHANGRI-LA, WUNDERBAR, and OHMI, who pointed out that their kennel names were being used by other persons registering dogs with The American Kennel Club. The Secretary pointed out the practice followed by The Canadian Kennel Club when it is established that residents of Canada are using well-known American kennel names, and sought to obtain a reciprocal arrangement in this connection, or to establish means by which Canadian breeders could themselves protect their kennel names by registering their kennel names with The American Kennel Club. The reply received indicated that The American Kennel Club was not prepared to reciprocate along the lines indicated, and residents of Canada are not eligible to register kennel names with The American Kennel Club. The Committee can only recommend that this matter be laid on the table until the Secretary again visits The American Kennel Club office, at which time he can seek further consideration of this question by officials of The American Kennel Club."

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed the Secretary reported that:

- (1) the existing arrangement between the two Clubs requires only that each Club reject an application for registration of kennel name which is identical to a kennel name registered with the other Club;
- (2) both Clubs had voluntarily extended this arrangement to the point where each Club is rejecting applications for names similar to kennel names already registered with the other Club;
- (3) during discussions with officials of The American Kennel Club they had outlined why they could not consider further extensions of the existing arrangements.

SUBJECT: Dr. Williams, as Chairman of the Kennel Names Committee:

- (1) pointed out that some years ago the Board had adopted the following resolution as a Standing Resolution:

"THAT, a person may not use a kennel name more than three times without registering same."

- (2) gave notice that at the next regular meeting of the Board the following motion would be made:

"THAT, the Standing Resolution reading as follows:

THAT, a person may not use a kennel name more than three times without registering same."

be and is hereby rescinded."

the national Board, in the meantime, to be polled on whether or not the Standing Resolution in question should be rescinded, the Board at its next regular meeting to be governed according to the vote of the national Board when the motion, of which notice has been given, is introduced.

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed:

- (1) Dr. Williams stated that if this Standing Resolution is fully implemented it would mean that a breeder whose first litter consisted of five puppies would be required to register a kennel name if the registered names of all five puppies were to include a kennel name selected by the breeder;
- (2) Mrs. Gove suggested that a kennel name should not be granted until the applicant has demonstrated that he is a practical and sincere breeder;
- (3) Mr. Gratton stated that the registration of a kennel name should be a privilege, not an obligation;
- (4) Mr. Blyth stated that there should be no restriction on who may apply for the registration of a kennel name.

REPORT: Dr. Williams reported that:

- (1) pursuant to resolution #207-62, the Committee had taken up with the Director of Canadian National Live Stock Records the possibility of installing a visible filing system on kennel names to expedite the checking of applications for individual registration and to ensure greater accuracy with regard to rejecting names which may not be used by applicants;

(2) the Director of Canadian National Live Stock Records had advised that they would investigate the Committee's proposal.

DISCUSSION: The President reported that the Director of the Records Office had reported, at the last meeting of the Live Stock Records Committee, on the proposal submitted by the Committee.

REPORT: Dr. Williams reported that:

- (1) the Committee had previously rejected the application of Mrs. Wm. Bourne, Ottawa, for the registration of DEB-BIL'S as a kennel name on the grounds of its similarity to the kennel name DEBHILL registered with The American Kennel Club;

(2) Mrs. Bourne had forwarded, for the Committee's consideration, a photostat of a letter which she had received from Mrs. W. T. Kellogg, Westport, Conn. who had registered DEBHILL, as a kennel name, with The American Kennel Club;

- (3) reported that it was the recommendation of the Committee that Mrs. Bourne's application for registration of DEB-BIL'S, as a kennel name, be approved if Mrs. Kellogg, in answering an enquiry from the Secretary, confirms that she has no objection, provided that Mrs. Bourne does not use DEB-BIL'S in the naming of Collies for registration purposes, and provided that Mrs. Bourne will make a written commitment along that line.

MOTION #261-62

- (1) the Secretary, as authorized by section (8) of the Committee's report to the Board at its meeting held on March 31st, had arranged for the reporting, in the official magazine, of the applications for registration, as kennel names, of SHEP'S VALLEY and NETLEY CREEK, and had placed before the Committee letters which had been received following publication of these names;
- (2) the Committee had considered the letters which had been received; the Committee recommended approval of these applications.

CONDENSED REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE

NOTE: The following is a condensation of the report submitted by Mr. J. C. Anderson referred to in item "#5 F 3. Canadian National Live Stock Records" in the minutes of the session of June 25, 1962.

By resolution #331 of last year, I was appointed Chairman of a Special Committee to review and consider our cost of operating in conjunction with the Canadian National Live Stock Records as compared with establishing our own recording office. As I was also previously appointed Chairman of a Special Committee, together with the Executive Manager, to investigate the incidence of the unit costs at the Records Office and prepare a brief for our Representative to present to the Records Committee, it is considered this report will combine the two closely related subjects.

Mr. Brown and I have had considerable correspondence and several meetings on this subject and based on the Executive Manager's data attached hereunder and our findings, the Committee recommendations are as follows:

- (1) For economic and other reasons it would not be in the best interests to consider setting up our own records office at this time, away from the Canadian National Live Stock Records.

(2) The Canadian National Live Stock Records was established a good many years ago and since that time the volume of business has in-

creased many fold but procedure and accounting methods have largely remained unchanged.

(3) An approach should be made to the other live stock associations in the Records Office with a view to possible unification of procedure and modification and modernization of equipment that would reduce costs and expedite service.

(4) Our representative on the Records Committee should be at liberty to make such use of this report as may be in the best interests of the Club.

(5) A request to the Chief Registration Officer for an audit of the financial obligations of each association would not provide information we are not now aware of, therefore the approach to the problem should be made together with the other associations in the Records Office and the Records Committee.

(6) Consideration should be given to meetings between Executive Managers and Secretaries of the associations with a view to co-ordinating mutual problems and discussion of Records Office problems.

The following represents a condensation of the material which accompanied Mr. Anderson's report.

- (1) The net operational item rate for the Records Office was 40.9¢ in 1950. The net operational item rate was 70.34¢ in 1960. This would seem to suggest that from 1950 to 1960 the rate had increased by 75%, but the analyses which accompanied this report suggest that the actual increase was in the area of 56.35%.
- (2) In 1938 the net operational item rate at the Records Office was 21.567¢. This had increased to 70.304¢ by 1960. This seems to suggest that Records Office costs had increased far out of proportion to the cost of living index (which was 63.7 in 1958 and 128.4 in 1960), however four main factors have influenced this substantial increase:

- (a) the gross operational costs of the Records Office in 1938 were approximately \$62,000 so the Departmental grant of \$20,000 had a more significant effect on reducing costs payable by the affiliated associations than was the case with the Departmental grant of \$25,000 in 1961 when the gross operating costs of the Records Office (excluding postage costs) amounted to \$272,800;
- (b) in 1951 and again in 1953 there were certain operational item rate adjustments which did not affect the gross operational costs of the Records Office but had the effect of increasing the operational item rate;
- (c) while the Records Office enjoyed franking privileges for many years it is now required to pay postage on outgoing mail and this naturally increased operating costs;
- (d) the increased cost to do the same volume of business in 1961 as compared with costs in 1938.

(3) Taking the Canadian Kennel Club's volume of business with the Records Office in 1938 and adjusting it by the changes made in the operational rates in 1951 and 1953, and having regard for the increased net cost of living index from 1938 to 1961, we can conclude that the 1938 gross operational rate, as thus adjusted, was in the area of 71.93¢ compared with 73.24¢ in 1961.

(4) The operational item rate set for some items, such as transfers of ownership and memberships, do not bear any relation to actual costs. This unfortunately gives rise to the feeling on the part of some of our members that on such items the Club is overcharged. Even if these items were adjusted (and any such adjustment would necessitate readjustment of other item rates) we are not satisfied that this would have any significant effect on our gross costs at the Records Office.

(5) When one considers the financial advantages of our affiliation with the Canadian National Live Stock Records, we feel that it would be extremely difficult for The Canadian Kennel Club to conduct its own registration office at costs comparable to that which we are now paying (in total) the Live Stock Records office.

REPORT TO C.K.C. MEMBERS

SUBJECT: The Club's Head Office

At the annual meeting of the Board of Directors held in February the undersigned were appointed co-Chairmen of the Property Committee, with power to add to the Committee, the terms of reference of the Committee to be as follows:

- (1) making a survey of our needs in the way of office accommodation;
- (2) considering whether the Club should build or buy an office building, or should continue to rent;
- (3) considering any other ideas and suggestions.

As the Club's 5-year lease on its present office accommodation expires on March 31, 1963, and as the annual meeting of the Board of Directors in 1963 is not scheduled to commence until March 13, 1963, the Committee felt that it was imperative that its final submission be placed before the Board at its semi-annual meeting, which commenced on June 25th.

The Committee's report to the Board will be included in full in the minutes of the semi-annual meeting to be published in the official magazine, but in the meantime the Committee has been authorized by the Board to take this page in "Dogs in Canada" to place a report before the membership.

At its annual meeting in February the report of the previous Property Committee was considered by the Board, and during the discussion of that report, two suggestions were made, the first being that the Board consider the purchase of an old, large home suitable for conversion to an office building, it being pointed out that this had been done by other organizations and companies, and secondly, that in selecting the location of an office building consideration should be given to its accessibility from a transportation point of view, to staff and others who would be visiting the office for business purposes.

In analyzing our present location the Committee reached the unanimous conclusion that it is quite inadequate in terms of area available, and reached the conclusion that an absolute minimum that is now required would be 2,500 sq. ft., but it felt that the Board would be most unwise, if it continued to rent office space, to limit itself to that area, having regard for the anticipated continuing increase in the volume of business which the staff is required to handle. For a variety of reasons the Committee reached the unanimous conclusion that the office must be reasonably centrally located in Toronto.

Some idea of the Club's increase in volume of business over the past ten years can be gained from the following statistics:

On having reached the conclusion that a change of location is imperative the Committee concentrated its efforts on finding a building which the Club could purchase and, to the extent necessary, renovate or convert for our purposes. Our wants were made known to a number of major real estate firms in the City. Acting on the suggestions which they put to us from time to time, a number of buildings were inspected. The Committee also looked into a number of buildings which had been advertised in the Toronto newspapers. Unfortunately, none of these were considered to be satisfactory either from the point of view of the condition of the building or the financial costs that would be involved to purchase and renovate or convert and maintain, or having regard for general conditions in the areas in which these buildings were located. We also reached the conclusion that property values within the area that we considered the Club's offices should be located are inflated at this time and, for the following reasons we reached the conclusion that, for a period of years at least, the Club should continue to rent office space:

- (1) While some members may consider the Club's present financial reserve to be unnecessary, we are of the opinion that that reserve, in the form of fluid assets, should be maintained.
- (2) Any reduction of the Club's investment would naturally reduce the revenue which the Club presently receives from its investments.
- (3) If the Club substitutes any part of its present investment in bonds for investment in a building, there is no assurance that the building would maintain its purchase cost or that, in times of economic stress, the Club would be able to sell the building or to obtain a mortgage at favourable rates.
- (4) The initial cost to purchase a building does not represent the only cost. Even if the Club owned the building outright and had no carrying charges in the form of a mortgage it would still have other costs, such as municipal taxes, heating, janitor service, possible installation of air conditioning, insurance, general building maintenance, and whatever additional costs there may be by way of converting the building for our own use.

Had this Committee been able to come to the Board with any building or buildings which the Board might seriously wish to consider it would have done so, but we ultimately reached the decision that our efforts should be finally concentrated on finding a suitable area that could be leased. Here again we availed ourselves of information from real estate agents and checked a number of advertisements in Toronto newspapers.

In checking out some rental offers we found that the price per square foot quoted or advertised did not always include such items as janitor service, air conditioning and heating. We also found that some very attractive prices were quoted or advertised, but often these were on a sub-rental basis for a short period, after which the rental rates would be increased quite considerably.

In a report to the Board dated June 11th, which was placed before the semi-annual meeting of the Board, this Committee suggested that the Board examine office space available at 1173 Bay Street, Toronto (a building very close to the junction of Bloor and Bay Streets) in which space was available at \$2.75 per sq. ft. per year. After the Committee's

report was discussed at the semi-annual meeting the Committee was authorized to negotiate with a representative of the owners of the building, and in due course, the Committee submitted a report to the Board setting forth the terms which the owners offered for our consideration. The following are the terms of their offer:

- (1) We could commence occupation of the premises on either August 1st or September 1st, 1962.
- (2) There would be no rental charge for the first month, and our rental for the remaining period of our existing lease (which runs to March 31, 1963) would be at 50% of the rental of whatever space we took.
- (3) Heating and air conditioning would be guaranteed, and the rental would be \$2.75 per sq. ft. per year.
- (4) The Club and the owners of the building would share equally the cost of whatever partitioning the Club requires.
- (5) Elevator and janitor services would be provided at no cost to the Club.
- (6) The lease would not include, as does our present lease, an escalator clause which would enable the landlord to increase rental if municipal taxes on the buildings are increased.

After the Committee had presented its report on the terms which were offered by the owners, there was a discussion which established that there was a division of opinion amongst the members of the Board as to whether the Club should continue to rent office space or the Committee should continue its efforts to locate a suitable building which could be purchased. A resolution was adopted (with the Vice President in the Chair) authorizing the Committee and the signing officers to finalize details of rental of space at 1173 Bay Street.

The following members of the Board voted in favour of the resolution: Mr. MacCallum, Mrs. Gove, Mr. Gratton, Mrs. Joel, Mr. Little, Mrs. Mack, Mr. McDerment, Mr. Miller, Mr. Monaghan.

The following members of the Board voted against the resolution: Mr. Williams, Mr. Blyth, Mr. Dawson, Mr. Wells, Dr. Williams.

In recommending that the Board enter into a lease (to commence on September 1, 1962 and expire on March 31, 1968) the Committee had thoroughly analyzed the costs involved and our previous costs for rental of space, having regard for the Club's income. The Club moved to its present location on April 1, 1948. Its costs for rent, telephone, and light in 1949, the first full year during which the Club occupied its present location, represented 6.5% of the Club's income (exclusive of revenue from "Dogs in Canada" which the Club then published). The rental costs on the new location at 1173 Bay Street would be \$7,700 a year, and if to that we add our light and telephone costs for 1961, our rent, light and telephone costs would be 5.18%, calculated on an income of \$170,000 per year. This compares with 8.1% in 1952, 5.3% in 1956, 4.4% in 1957, 4.4% in 1958, 4.0% in 1959, 3.8% in 1960, and 3.5% in 1961, although in comparing these percentages for the past few years it should be realized that while our income has continued to increase, we have not rented space in keeping with this growth, nor until this year have we hired the additional office help that this growth warranted and for which additional space is required.

An analysis of rental costs at our present location (\$4,800 per year) in relation to actual usable office space represents a cost to the Club of \$2.75 per sq. ft. per year (this rate was actually \$3.20 per sq. ft. per year during the greater part of our present lease before the building owners took over the responsibility of meeting janitor service costs).

In presenting this report the Committee would like to stress that the following represents its considered opinions as to the desirability of the move which it has recommended to the Board:

- (1) It is not anticipated that it will involve any reduction in the Club's financial reserve, from which the Club this year will receive revenue in excess of \$3,500 in the form of interest on its investments in bonds and debentures.
- (2) It will add to the prestige of the Club, having regard for the type of building in which these new offices are located.
- (3) It will provide adequate space for the present staff and for an expansion in staff.
- (4) It will enable the setting up of a much improved meeting room for meetings of the Board of Directors and committees, and eliminate the expense of holding national Board meetings in Toronto at hotels, which has been found desirable occasionally in the past.
- (5) It will enable the setting up of an acceptable reception area, which could be used for purposes not possible with the present inadequate reception area.
- (6) It will provide better storage facilities than are presently available.
- (7) The construction of the building is such that possible loss of irreplaceable books and records through fire is considerably reduced.
- (8) The new offices are reasonably centrally located and are readily accessible, through publicly-owned transportation, to all who would have occasion to deal with the Club at its office and to all members of the staff.
- (9) Parking facilities are available near the building.
- (10) The fact that the new offices are air conditioned represents a tremendous asset over the present location where the office is not air conditioned.
- (11) The presence of elevator service is a definite advantage, particularly to those who found our present walkup arrangement a strain.
- (12) The new offices are located in the same building as "Dogs in Canada" which would permit of closer consultation between the members of the staffs of the two organizations and would be a decided advantage to those who may have business with both organizations.

As can readily be understood, the Committee has not recommended additional expense to The Canadian Kennel Club and its members, other than to comply with the increased need of office space to carry on with the evolutionary growth of our organization.

for your information

Did you know that it is unlawful and punishable by fines of \$50 minimum and \$500 maximum, according to the National Livestock Pedigree Act (a federal law) for:

Anyone to sell, or otherwise dispose of any purebred animal without registering the animal in the name of the new owner and that it is contrary to the same act to sell or otherwise dispose of any animal as a certain breed (such as a German Shepherd) unless the animal is registered.

According to the latest dog show rules of The Canadian Kennel Club:

Every show-giving club must mail out in advance to every exhibitor, an identification card, absentee card and a program showing the time scheduled for the judging of the various breeds.

The time must be printed in the catalogue when judging of the first breed in each group will commence.

A judge may not judge a dog for six months after he has handled it nor handle it for one year after he

has judged it. In both instances it also applies to any dog owned or kennelled on the premises of the owner.

The following must appear on the entry form: Name of handler if the dog is not to be shown by the owner or any member of his immediate family.

It shall be the duty of the veterinarian to exclude any dog that does not have two normal testicles normally located in the scrotum.

That the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club passed a resolution in 1958 which prohibits any dog from competing for Canadian Bred or Canadian Bred Puppy if it has not been signified on the entry form, at the time of mailing, that the dog is Canadian bred.

That the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club may, at any time, revise the qualifications for an Obedience judge.

That, according to the CKC by-laws, no person who received a salary, bonus or honorarium may vote in or stand for office in any election.

Advanced tracking test

Having in mind the more advanced tracking tests currently under consideration by The Canadian Kennel Club, the Vancouver Island Gun Dog and Tracking Club conducted an interesting experiment on June 10.

In addition to the standard quarter mile tracks for three dogs, more advanced tracks of a half mile in length and four hours old were prepared for five competitors.

The results of these unofficial tests were as follows:-

In the quarter-mile tests, one was successful, a Weimaraner owned and handled by Mrs. Ann MacHemer.

In the half-mile tests, two were successful, a German Shepherd owned and handled by Mr. Ivan Beggs and a Yellow Labrador owned and handled by Mrs. Mary Bates.

There is nothing unusual to report about the quarter-mile tracks; they took place on farm lands. Ground cover was grass and weed of varying density and the weather was mild, slightly overcast and not too dry. But when it came to the plotting of half-mile tracks, the main difficulty was to find a large enough area. Finally, two tracks were laid in very large fields in the same farmlands as the shorter tracks, and three were laid in a clearing cut through wild lands for electric power transmission lines. It was in the latter area that two dogs turned in an outstanding performance.

The terrain was rugged, undulating and, in spots, hilly. A mild breeze blew, but two of the three tracks were little affected by it.

The ground cover varied from sparse scrub to grass, mud and bog. The tracks crossed rough gravel roads, and at times followed overgrown roads, but mainly

they went wherever the tracklayer could find adequate footing.

We met with some surprises and learned some lessons too.

Our main surprise was that the six-inch squares of leather dropped by the tracklayer did not attract the attention of either of the two dogs which had so painstakingly followed their half-mile tracks. The tracklayer said he had slept with his leathers for a week but, even so, none of the five dogs showed any sign of recognition when the article was shown them.

Our main lesson was that in the case of one track, laid in a rough horse-shoe pattern, the two legs of the track were too close together. Even 100 yards between them is not enough for safety. We made other mistakes too, such as dropping the article on an undulation which, with the light breeze, foiled the dog but we felt that it was a highly successful experiment.

We had intended to have a cross-track two hours old crossing the four-hour tracks, but the idea was abandoned as being too difficult to organize and put into effect.

All tracks were gone over by the "judges" the day before the test and we are still wondering how such tracks could be satisfactorily mapped. The writer's own conclusion is that maps and plots for such a test would have to be abandoned in favour of a certificate signed by the judges to the effect that the dog in question had successfully passed its test as prescribed.

The organizers, workers and supervisors of this test were Mr. and Mrs. A. Best of Crofton, Vancouver Island, to whom all the credit is due. Mrs. Best is director of the club's tracking section and her husband is the hard-working tracklayer. The writer and Mrs. Best acted as the unofficial judges.

The event was keenly watched by about 25 spectators. ■

Vetescopic '62

7. The Veterinarian in Space Medicine.

8. The Diseases of Fur-Bearing Animals.
9. The Health of Animal Division of the Canadian Department of Agriculture will show how they protect animal health and in turn human health.
10. Veterinary Medicine as a career will feature all the many facets in which veterinarians are engaged.
11. A modern pharmacy emphasising the drugs used in Veterinary Medicine will be combined with a display of instruments.
12. Fur bearing animals and several other fields will be displayed.

Over 8,000 square feet of show space in the Hydro Building at the CNE will be devoted to Veterinary Medicine. Visitors are cordially invited to meet and talk with veterinarians. Exhibitors and dog enthusiasts in general are urged to visit this huge display and take in the CNE Dog Shows at the same time. ■





recognition being given to German Shepherds which have contributed to the improvement of the breed. In 1956 the German Shepherd Dog Club of America instituted a Register of Merit system, retroactive to 1941, which honors top producing sires and dams. To be awarded this distinction a dog must have at least 100 points won by 10 offspring and must have sired five champions. A bitch must have at least 40 points won by four offspring and must have produced two champions. Only major shows may count and points are always cumulative. Another highly progressive project introduced by the German Shepherd Dog Club of America within the last few years is the holding of annual Futurity Shows, hosted by regional clubs in six sections of the United States. To enter, a breeder must first nominate an entire litter by a given date, and then subsequently enter individuals from that litter within a specified period of time. There are four classes for each sex, Junior, Teenage, Intermediate and Senior. This year a Maturity Section was added with one class for each sex, and to be eligible for entry the Shepherd must have been entered in a Futurity the year previous. In June of this year I had the great honor and privilege of judging the Mid-West Futurity and Maturity, hosted by the German Shepherd Dog Club of Detroit and held in Pontiac, Michigan. It was a real challenge and a great thrill to see so many promising youngsters chosen by their breeders and owners to compete in this important event, and the overall quality was truly amazing and proved the worth of planned and selective breeding programs. In the entry totaling 183 (with some absentees) there were few below average and many well above that plane. Of interest is the fact that almost 400 litters in the United States were nominated this year for these "Breeders' shows" which proves that today there is an ever-increasing interest being shown toward breed improvement and progressive activity for

German Shepherds. We now have in America a Breed Survey Society for German Shepherd Dogs which is proving a worthwhile endeavour. All German Shepherds which are surveyed and qualify in Class 1 or Class 2 are entered into permanent records which include vital breeding qualifications and statistics. Several surveys have already been carried out in Canada by this Society and many of our Canadian bred Shepherds are now included in the two volumes of Breed Survey Reports presently in print.

In a way it is unfortunate that so much publicity is being given today in the matter of hip displasia in the German Shepherd Dog, since this may give the general public the highly false impression that this breed is the only one afflicted. In truth, this malformity has been found in practically every breed of dog (in fact it is found in every mammal including man) and it is to the credit of the German Shepherd breeders who are in a very small minority group of those who do not ignore the fault and "bury their heads in the sand", that they are facing and recognizing the issue and trying to do something to eradicate it.

Today we have a large influx of imports from Germany, many of which are proving their worth toward correcting faults and improving the breed, as shown not only by their own winning records but also by those of their progeny. However, we must recognize the fact that just because a dog has been imported does not necessarily mean it is a top specimen or capable of producing quality. This also applies to many champions who may be outstanding but seem incapable of producing as good as themselves. To the novice breeder it is only natural that he should want to breed to the winning dogs, but this can be disastrous and the results highly discouraging if done indiscriminately without consideration being given to compatibility of bloodlines, type, and correcting of faults. Of value, where the German import is concerned, is the *Zeitung des Verein fur Deutsche Schäferhunde*, S.V., a magazine printed in Germany, which reveals foreign judges' reports, pedigree warnings and breeding advice on innumerable Shepherds. A basic knowledge of genetics is almost essential to the sincere breeder, and it is imperative that he be able to recognize the faults in his own stock in order to properly select mates for corrective purposes, stabilizing of type and improvement. Oddly enough we find a specific variety of faults in different sections of the country. But the one fault which has been prevalent in all regions for the past few years has been poor front assemblies — steep shoulders with blades too wide apart and insufficient lay-back, and short, straight upper arms. It is most gratifying to note that so far this year I have found, during various judging assignments, a definite improvement in this respect, which proves that breeders are recognizing this fault and breeding to correct it. However, I am somewhat alarmed to

find an increase in the number of dogs with missing teeth. Hind quarters are generally much better than they used to be, but backs still require improvement, and feet in some parts of the country could be better. Today it is not often that we find many Shepherds lacking in pigment, sex characteristics are usually definite, and extremely light eyes are a rarity.

Generally speaking, the German Shepherd of today is a better balanced and well proportioned dog, and unlike a few years ago good temperament and soundness is the rule rather than the exception.

and is operating successfully. I appreciate that the same scheme applied to Canada would involve costs which might be extortionate, but I feel that the costs might be equated if the scheme was jointly sponsored by the SPCA and The Canadian Kennel Club. Safeguards to the scheme would be necessary. When the decision of the Inspector was challenged by the kennel owner, arrangements would be made for a three-man committee, consisting of a veterinarian, a representative of The Canadian Kennel Club and a representative of this Society, to carry out a special inspection of the premises. The decision of the Appeal Committee would obviously have to be final.

I have recently asked The Canadian Kennel Club to consider such a scheme and I hope it will be possible for the CKC to meet with me to discuss this matter in more detail.

Certainly, any practical scheme for inspecting kennels and indicating to the general public the standards to be found within those kennels, deserves careful consideration by The Canadian Kennel Club and merits, I believe, the support of all responsible breeders and kennel owners.

After all, the scheme will help the good kennels and encourage the indifferent ones to become better. ■

valent and while the ABSS perhaps does not come in contact with the seriously handicapped animal it does appear sufficiently frequent to call serious attention to rear end weakness and to issue warnings in regard to the use of such animals. We aim and our goal is to improve rear end soundness within the breed.

Quite often we find, while working in the survey field, animals having better rear end angulation than shoulder angulation. The tendency of this lack of balance is toward a hackney motion, or a lowering of the front assembly (running into the ground). The animal usually tires easily. There are cases where a dog lacks proper coordination but because of a compensating looseness of shoulder ligaments it allows the animal to reach out and coordinate with the great reach of the well angulated rear quarters. This has a tiring effect upon the animal and usually, after much gaiting, results in a gradual slowing down and a falling into the forehand. Our aim and goal is toward a more correct shoulder assembly for the German Shepherd of tomorrow.

Space does not permit my going into every phase of the Breed Survey field. Suffice it to state that our aims and goals are clearly defined, our sails are set and the seas ahead look favorable. We need to enlarge our crew in order to accomplish our "aims and goals". We must have the fullest cooperation of every Shepherd fancier, every group of fanciers, every Shepherd Dog club. We need your support without any colorful display from the ABSS in return. We have one duty to perform and are doing it to the very best of our ability. We do not compete in the field of the monthly publication, bulletins or other modes of regular communication. Our duty is to render a factual survey to breeders of breed improvement animals brought before us, to compile the records of these animals so that information may be acquired that can come in no other way, to print an annual report of these animals so that the breeders on this continent may have this valuable information always to be available.

Those who have in the past been our most severe critics are now beginning to view the ABSS in another light—that of a friend and helper. Our aim and goal then is to gradually widen this cycle of friends and work as a unified, idealistic body of breeders who are willing to seek truth and enlightenment. The torch has been lighted, now we need more torchbearers.

Surveys throughout the country have been well patronized this last year and we have every reason to believe that the next published volume will be even more informative and superior than our last.


