







the maltese dog

. . . I have just been sent an article appearing in Dogs in Canada entitled "The Maltese Dog". It is always nice to see an article about Maltese when the information is correct but this contains more misstatements in a short space as have ever met my eye.

I was amazed to see the picture from the book, "The Maltese Dog", as I believe the copyright is still in effect and does not allow reproduction. The quotation from Popular Dogs is from an issue in which the word "delete" was omitted by typographical error. If you check the Popular Dogs issue of March, 1960 you will find the correct statement which reads "deleting (a) under 3 lbs. ideal (b) smaller the better (c) low to the

ground and also deep in loins". This alone makes most of the writer's arguments invalid.

As secretary and director of publicity of the American Maltese Association, the only existing Maltese club in the United States, as well as being a member of the standard revision committee, I would like to point out the author's obvious ignorance of both the U.S. standard and the fact that "under 3 lbs. ideal" is being deleted from a revised standard now awaiting approval. The weight, if approved, will be up to 7 lbs., 4-6 lbs. preferred, with overall quality to be favored over size.

The American Maltese Association numbers many Canadians among its membership but the author is not one of them. Were she, she would know the feeling of U.S. breeders, exhibitors and fanciers as you can note from the enclosed official club publications. Since it was one of our Canadian members who has objected so strongly to your March issue's article, I would like to point out a few points:

1. The present U.S. standard, accepted in 1906, was based wholly on the English standard of that date.

The U.S. standard is only now being revised while the English did their revising about 3 years ago.

 Innumerable articles have appeared in England's Dog World in the past few years stressing the fact that English breeders were concentrating on reducing size.

It appears the author would prefer to write a Canadian standard to fit her own dogs rather than to use either the English or U.S. standard. She refutes both standards in listing her salient points. If I more on page 6

FROM THE EDITOR

ANY form of change is likely to encounter a three-sided reception: favor, disfavor and much comment but no expression to the parties most concerned. This is notably true concerning Club Roundup. As readers will recall, this department was evolved from the former Club Notes. Following announcement of this necessary step, and prior to its implementation, letters arrived from clubs in three provinces stating their feelings. Since the introduction of Club Roundup the only province from which verbal and written protests come is Ontario. The amazing thing is that clubs writing in are protesting about reports on their own clubs! Complaints are that "things are left out that shouldn't." Honestly, whose fault is this? Individual club notes are not to exceed 300 words. When 500 to 1,000 words are submitted the Provincial Editor is saddled with the unnecessary, difficult chore of trimming to size.

The editors can only work with material sent them by authorized members of the club executive.

Club Roundup is designed to enable readers across Canada to know what other clubs are doing. You, as a club member, know what your own club is doing because you attend the meetings — or should.

Let's look at the problem. Club representation: Equal space is provided for every club in every province. Each club secretary, as mentioned above, must confine her notes to 300 words. This is plenty of space for a report and is fair to all.

Content: Your Provincial editor should not be put in the position of having to cut out anything to conform with the necessary space and rules governing permissible content.

Deadlines: Your editor has a deadline to meet. Yet there are always some who try to push the date beyond the deadline and are annoyed if the tardy material does not appear in the next issue. It is understandable that conscientous secretaries endeavour to get their reports in the earliest issue following a club meeting. But this should not cause the Provincial editor to be late with his or her material. American publishers have a strict deadline that is not nearly as generous. Some specify that material must be on hand three months in advance—rather than the three weeks allowed by Dogs.

Club Roundup privileges are most abused in the Ontario Region. To serve as a guide, we again set forth items which cannot be considered as club news:

(a) Canadian wins in Canada. Wins by Canadian dogs at American shows are allowed.

(b) Names of judges at coming shows which are not using advertising space in this publication.

(c) Show dates, if no advertising. This

is strictly editorial space.

In neither standard is there any reference to the great angulation she wishes to present as typical to explain the "so much spring and bounce" she prefers, Neither are typical of a good moving Maltese. With correct shoulder placement and angulation Maltese will move with a smooth flowing motion. The U.S. Maltese standard, when approved, will lay great stress on gait, calling for a smooth flowing motion, legs swinging freely from the shoulders, with the hind legs moving in a straight forward movement. Crossing over, toeing in or out and cow hocks will be definite faults.

The American Maltese Association has welcomed Canadians as members but has never attempted to force its standard on them or on The Canadian Kennel Club. It has been the first to admit the antiquated 1906 standard needs revision and is well into the long and arduous task of making it acceptable to breeders, fanciers

and the American Kennel Club.

As an officer and breeder, I do object strenuously to the mis-statement purported by the author as being typical of the breed and of the statements that U.S. breeders are concentrating on breeding an under 3-lb. animal exclusively, when their main concern is a sound specimen, many of which are winning in the show ring, not only in the United States but in Canada as well.

.... In your March edition there is an article on Maltese by Mrs. Laura M. Paton which I would like brought to the attention of anyone interested in Maltese. In her standards of Maltese I think she is away out of order. It is a well known fact that, when showing or breeding dog of any breed, we as exhibitors must abide by the standards laid down by The Canadian Kennel Club or there would be no point in having these organizations appoint judges to make future Champions.

I would also like to point out that in my estimation anyone showing a Maltese over 7 lbs. and having lemon streaks on a coat other than white is asking for his or her dog to be put down. To verify this one has only to look at Champions such as Gina of Villa Malta, Aennchen's Shiker Dancer, Senor Blanco, Aennchen's Smart Dancer and many others too numerous to mention . . . all under 7 lbs! So, where does Mrs. Laura M. Paton get her 9 and 10 lb. dogs?

As a breeder of Maltese, not too well known yet, I would like to say this — I would not, under any condition, show or exhibit a Maltese over 7 lbs. and with any lemon or brown streaks in their coats.

OBEDIENCE



Ed. O'Brien, Canfield, Ont., is well-known as Canada's leading professional trainer of dogs in Obedience work. He is a licensed Judge, one of Canada's first. He began his career in the West, training dogs for herding and other farm work. Since moving to Ontario he has specialized in training dogs for police and guard work and for disabled people. Mr. O'Brien also breeds German Shepherds and Dobermans.

The Bytown Obedience Club of Ottawa recently let on the "Beginners Novice Course". The club gives one of these brochures to each new trainee at the start of the novice obedience course, to assist him in his homework and keep him informed re the next lesson. These booklets are for sale to training clubs, and I am sure would prove interesting and helpful to both instructors and pupils in training classes. The information given regarding training is to a large extent of a general nature, and I am sure that to the beginner the book will be a wonderful guide.

I was particularly interested in the list of things that the Bytown Club feels the young dog should already know before starting the training classes. Housebreaking is number one on the list. We here at Edlyn Kennels most heartily agree! For, on the whole we find that more than half of the dogs coming to us for training are certainly not housebroken, yet most of them are family dogs. Often we see examples of this lack of training in our Obedience Trials, Yet housebreaking, leash-breaking, teaching the dog his name and so on, though quite easily learned by a puppy, make a good foundation for the serious training to come later.

While I do not advocate serious training for a dog still in its infancy, some control should be exercised at an early age for the benefit of both handler and dog. This week brought to our attention the two extremes in age training. Number one, a dog of 18 months, has practically never been handled, knows nothing of the world outside of his own small run, does not even know his own name and has never worn a collar. This dog is so bewildered that he does not know whether to run from a human or to attack. The dog does not lack intelligence, he simply has had no experience in living. The owner has asked to have the dog trained to the C.D.X. standard in two months! In the second case, we had an enquiry about the possibility of training a five months' old puppy for tracking. Surely, the life of a trainer has to be lived to be believed. So, don't get discouraged, Readers, most of you have only one dog to train. I suggest you get this booklet from the Bytown Club and you are on your way. Incidentally, this is not a paid advertisement!

I am going to bring up again the controversial subject of a Judges' Conference. I seem to have really started something when, in a previous article, I recommended holding such a conference. Most of the judges with whom I have discussed this matter strongly favor such a conference being held. Others, to my surprise, evidently feel nothing could be accomplished, while one or two, for some reason, are really opposed to it.

Not only do I still stand by my previous contention that this conference is really needed but, since observing the scoring of the dogs in a few trials in the recent past, I am more convinced than ever that a Judges' Conference should be held without delay. Let me hasten to add that I am not questioning the integrity of any of the judges, the fault lies, rather, in the interpretation of the rules. There is no denying the fact that there is too great a variance in the marks deducted for mistakes made by both dog and handler. No book of rules could possibly cover every situation, so the judge must at all times be prepared to stand on his own two feet and decide instantly whether to cut or not, as well as the number of points he will award.

Every judge I have questioned feels, for instance, that a dog walking on a recall should be penalized, but I have yet to meet one judge who felt sure of the points that should be deducted. As a result, there have been deductions all the way up from zero to as much as three points.

The faulty execution of this exercise, as well as many others, needs to be discussed and the number of points to be deducted settled, at a conference of judges. By doing this, the scoring by the judges would be more consistent than

it is at the present time.

While we are on the subject of judging, I feel we should consider some changes in regard to qualifying new judges. As most of my readers know, the applicant for license to judge must appear before an examining committee and take both a written and an oral examination. Then, if successful, he must apprentice under three different official judges. My quarrel is with the manner in which the official judge is asked to make his report.

An apprentice judge may sit at the more on page 53

Gun Dog Club, a pioneer in the Retriever sport and formation of the National Club, celebrates its 25th anniversary this year, which makes their being hosts especially fitting.

All clubs should be considering the * nomination of judges for this event.

Seven licensed trials were held in 1962. A new club, The Winnipeg Field Trial Club, put on double-header Open Stakes in July. The Delta Marsh Retriever Club was revived and had a successful trial in September.

The Manitoba Gun Dog Association continues to develop its new club-house and grounds. They have been most fortunate in receiving periodic financial assistance toward this end, and over the course of two years have been able to erect a most up to date furnished and electrified building on donated property with ideal terrain and water.

The Manitoba owned dog to make the most Open points in '62 was George Duganis' Lab. F.T. Ch. Black Squeek of Netley Creek with 15 points. Fred Ward's Lab, F.T. Ch. Stonegate's Pluto made 17 points, which included five for a first place in an Amateur Open. Top dog in Open Stakes run inside the province was a Lab. female, F.T. Ch. Jokers Lady of Rockwall, owned by J. F. and Archie B. Gray, with 12 points.

HUMANELY "SPEAKING"



A frank discussion on field trials from the standpoint of the Ontario Humane.

FIELD TRIALS

The whole subject of field trials and in particular the use of live birds during the trials, has been "in the news" lately.

At the Ontario Humane Society's Convention, held recently in London, discussion centred around a motion that recommended the repeal of Section 387 I (f) of the Criminal Code. This section forbids the shooting of live birds. It does not specifically prohibit the practice of allowing dogs to retrieve live birds. In other words, there are two separate and distinct practices that are under discussion.

The motion was withdrawn, mainly because it was felt that the whole subject needed careful consideration before anyone could vote intelligently on the motion.

However, the most important reason for tabling the matter was to give the Ontario Humane Society an opportunity to meet with representatives of the Field Trial clubs in Ontario to discuss the whole subject in detail. To enable this to be done the Convention appointed a committee of three. They are Mr. W. Plumer of St. Catharines, Dr. T. K. Bourns, of London, (incidentally a contributor to Dogs in Canada) and myself.

Representatives of the Field Trial Clubs of Ontario also met in Toronto recently. At that meeting a similar committee was also set up to meet with the Ontario Humane Society. This committee consists of Mr. William Hayden of Hamilton; Mr. William Copeland of Grimsby; Mr. H. V. P. Lewis of Toronto and Mr. Mark Seguin of Stratford. In effect, the Ontario Humane Society and the Ontario Field Trial Clubs have formed a "joint committee". It will discuss the way in which field trials are run and the safeguards that could be introduced to avoid any accidental damage or injury to the birds. One very important subject to be discussed is the inspection of field trials by official Inspectors of the Ontario Humane Society. In this context some Field Trial Clubs have asked voluntarily for inspec-

I must stress that the clubs referred

to have all been Retriever clubs. N contact has, as yet, been establishe with Spaniel or Pointing groups.

Incidentally, I refer constantly to "Or tario Humane" and "Ontario Field Tri Clubs" but the problem is commo to Canada. No doubt other Province will watch the developments in Ontari with great interest. In fact, I would sug gest that the contact and liaison the has been established by the "joint con mittee" idea in Ontario should be emi lated throughout Canada.

However, it is essential for there t be any hope of success, for both group to trust each other and to realize tha while they may disagree on some point that everyone concerned is acting i

good faith.

ARE FIELD TRIALS NECESSARY?

Obviously, I cannot speak for the entir humane movement. The many thousand of members and the various Societies and branches etc. that the Human Movement consists of, all have their own point of view on this matter o any other. However, I have a persona viewpoint and this might be a good time to "philosophize",!

First of all, I don't think all shooter or hunters are cruel, or sadistic. However I am quite convinced that cruel sadistic, and highly irresponsible people hunt and shoot. They do a lot of other things too. Some of them even join hu mane societies! . . . People are people whatever their interests. I am convinced that the true "sportsman" (who seems to be decreasing) is always humane ir that he never intentionally causes unnecessary suffering to an animal or bird Indeed, he will go to any length to avoid say, for example, leaving an in jured animal or bird, to suffer. Unfortunately in this day and age, the number of irresponsible shooters seems to be on the increase!

It is important to rememer that conservation of wild life is not just a phrase used to scare the shooting public into accepting low bag limits or, in some cases, total protection of certain species It has very real meaning, and it is supported by facts that are not only real, but very depressing. The fact of the matter is that if birds (and animals) are NOT conserved, then they will eventually, sooner rather than later, become extinct. When we talk about "conservation" then we are really talking about the survival of birds and animals Let me quote an eminent Canadian whose books and articles have brought him world wide recognition as an authority on the subject of wild fowl, Mr F. H. Kortright. Referring to the fan-tastic annual loss of birds he says "overshooting must take a major share of the blame (together with the loss of suitable breeding and wintering habitat). For every duck brought to the bag there is at least one other that has been wounded and escaped, later to die, or has been killed and not recovered." The writer Mr. Kortright, estimates that "at least 15 million ducks a year are lost it this way; the number of upland bird that are lost in a similar way also reache a staggering total".

Mr. Kortright goes on to say "The use of trained Retrievers in wildfowling and upland game shooting is so vital a conservation measure that it is to be hoped the practice will become mandatory in North America. Everything that can be done to train more Retrievers and to interest more gunners in their use should be vigourously undertaken."

Personally I agree with Mr. Kortright! The vital role that field trials play cannot be underestimated. Without them dogs would not be bred for brains and work, but for "beauty". It would be of little consolation to future generations to remember the once abundant and beautiful wildfowl of the 20th century while contemplating an equally beautiful but useless Retriever, Spaniel, or Pointer.

I realize that shooting men would still breed their own dogs, but this was not good enough in the past when hunting pressures were much less than they are now. Without Field Trials it would be utterly inadequate today, and in the future, as the number of people shooting grows constantly. The volunteers who run Field Trials do so at great expense of both time and money. They make nothing out of trials. They deserve the gratitude of all those who have conservation of wild life at heart. Without Retriever trials the wildfowl of the North American continent would suffer even more than now!

I feel strongly that it should be com-

pulsory by law for anyone carrying a gun and ammunition for the purpose of shooting birds to be accompanied by a trained Retriever. And what better way of determining whether the "dog" is, in fact, 'trained" and not just the pooch from next door, borrowed for the "occasion" than a certificate from a Field Trial Club, licensed to conduct Trials by The Can-adian Kennel Club! The certificate could simply state that the dog had passed a simple series of tests, sufficient to ensure that it was competent to perform basic duties. It would mean that the shooter or dog owner would have to spend time training his dog, but this is desirable anyway! This "chore" could discourage only the irresponsible shooter.

If members of the Humane Society should look for the real reasons for training dogs, so is it equally important for Field Trial Club members and shooters in general to realize that the members of the humane movement are sensible, responsible people who are not necessarily opposed to shooting as such but to

the activities of the irresponsible "lunatic fringe". The sort of people who shoot at anything that moves, often out of range; the "marsh cowboys", the idiots who care nothing for conservation or for bag limits and who would probably shoot a dog if they ever had one; the people who shoot horses, dogs and even cattle presumably out of frustration or worse; these are the people who are responsible for much of the needless slaughter of wildlife. The sooner such people are deprived of their opportunity to behave in this way, the better for all concerned.

The general public, including responsible shooters and members of the humane societies, join together to condemn those responsible for this criminal irresponsibility. It is to be hoped then that both groups can join together in the interests of conversation on the issue of Field Trials!

If shooting was illegal in Canada then everything to do with the sport would be redundant and unnecessary, including Field Trials, dogs, guns, etc. But as long as shooting is a perfectly legal activity encouraged by all Governments and by a substantial section of the general public, then just so long will Field Trials be an essential part of the fight to conserve wildfowl.

King George V, a keen shooting man if there ever was one, said "The wildlife of today is not ours to do with as we please. We hold it in trust for future generations".

(Bumpy) Lewis and genial Show Superintendent Hudson Kalloch, deserve nothing but praise - for acquiring the beautiful, spacious new venue, for the glittering trophy tables, handsome displays, generous rings and smooth handling of this

KEN-L PRODUCTS AWARD WINNERS

The big social event of the year in Canadian dogdom was a joyous event, unhampered by sleet and snow.

For many of the 200 or more guests at the annual Ken-L-Ration pre-Sportsmen's Show reception and dinner, it was like old home week. The event, held at the Seaway Hotel, had all the joyous aspects of a victory celebration rather than the eve of four days of heavy competition.

The coinciding meeting of The Canadian Kennel Club Board of Directors as well as the presence of the winners of the Ken-L-Ration Awards (who were flown in by Ken-L-Ration for the occasion) permitted representation from across Canada, making it a national affair.

Guest speaker was Dr. James Archibald, head of the Small Animal Division of the Ontario Veterinary College — who has a distinguished academic career as well.

Among the guests were the four Ken-L Products Award winners, a rare assemblage of Westerners, American exhibitors and handlers from a distance, Canadian exhibitors from distant locales, judges, Ontario breeders, directors of The Canadian Kennel Club, members of the Toronto Academy of Veterinarians, writers, pet food buyers (commercial), members of the Ken-L-Products Food Plan and others important in Canadian dogdom.

The Ken-L Products awards were made to the top-winning dog in each of four geographical areas: British Columbia, the Prairie Provinces, Ontario and Quebec, and the Maritimes. The coveted awards are made according to The Canadian Kennel Club show results. To earn the award, the dog must have made the wins in his own area. It should be noted that while some top competitors may have aggregated more wins, the entire winning was not done in the dog's own geographical region. The wins were exceptional this time in that Albert Kaye was the first previous winner to carry off another Ken-L Products ice bucket. And for the first time, two dogs of the same breed — Pekingese — were tops in their regions.

In the century of Veterinary medicine in Canada, said Dr. Archibald, tremendous advances have been made. Today the great animal scourges have virtually been eliminated while others are now under control. Limited funds, tedious hours and lack of trained workers has delayed much of the work to be done.

'Dog breeders have a most excellent organization in the CKC, but could not some advancement be made by establishing a code of standards in hygiene, preventive medicine, nutrition, housing and parasite control?" he asked.

Report on Ontario Humane Convention

The first real insight into the work of the Humane Society came as a shock to observer Phyllis Smith. Here is a dedicated group, working desperately without sufficient funds or interest from those most concerned.

Early in April I was assigned to cover, as a representative of Dogs in Canada, the annual convention of the Ontario Humane Society, in London, I greeted this assignment with mixed emotions. It meant that I would miss a dog show and I had little interest in spending three days in this manner. During my 20 years in the 'dog-game' I was aware that such societies existed, but that was all. I wasn't interested in them, how they operated or what their program involved. Like many other breeders of purebred dogs I, perhaps unconsciously, resented their selling 'orphans' which in many cases were full of one disease or another.

However, one does not question the why's of an assignment, one just goes. What a rude awakening I had! Here was an organization, I discovered, that was trying desperately to carry out many of the ideas and convictions shared by my fellow dog breeders, with little or no help from the very persons most involved.

During my years in this hobby I have frequently stated I was trying to, as a lover of dogs, do my part in the promotion and improvement of dogs in general. At this convention I realized that I, and many like me, have been interested only in my own small circle and my own kennel. Perhaps, in the long view my own breed could be included. But certainly not dogs in general, and animals as a whole.

Delegates from Ottawa and Sault Ste. Marie, as well as nearby points, attended. Each represented some local Society that had many problems, the answers to which they hoped to discover from other associations which had experienced and resolved similar problems. I found that 'Dog Control' which most of the local Humane Societies are operating, is most distasteful to them and certainly is not one of their prime purposes. But the payment they receive from their municipality to perform this service is essential to the maintainance of their operation. Delegates informed the meeting that without this revenue they could not operate. Too, it was felt that they

were best qualified to carry out this work, in the most humane way possible.

Although some shelters in small areas do certain investigation before allowing an animal out for adoption, most shelters have neither the personnel nor the finances to employ sufficient help required to do more of this type of work. On the whole no formula has, as yet, been devised which will give some assurance that animals can and will be well cared for. Does it make any difference where one lives or the income one has? Cruelty can be practised in the best homes in the best neighborhood and by the "best" people.

As for the problem of disease, well

run shelters confine stray animals, or animals that are brought in for adoption, until they have been given a complete veterinary examination. If any are found to have even the slightest symptom of disease they are isolated from other animals until the veterinarian gives them a clean bill of health. Here again, I was surprised that every shelter does not get the assistance needed from veterinarians. Some do have a permanent doctor, others rely on one, who is interested in the community problem, to come in once a day. Once again insufficient funds preclude other than a cursory examination.

Several reports, by officers and committee chairmen, were interesting as well enlightening. To report on these, in greater detail, they will be held over until next month.

The recommendations of the Award Committee, under Mrs. Noel Eaton, were accepted and the awards presented at the dinner which was covered by television and radio. Presentations were made by President, Mr. Peter Armour: a silver medal and citation for bravery to Miss Susan Jacobs, Streetsville, a 16 year old, who showed outstanding bravery in rescuing her pony from a burning barn. (This award was presented by Mr. Arthur Godfrey at the Royal Winter Fair); a silver medal and citation for bravery to Mr. Robert Taylor, Burling-

ton, who risked his life and was injured while rescuing a dog and over 50 head of cattle and pigs from a burning barn owned by his neighbour. (Mr. Carter was not present for the presentation); a bronze medal and citation to Mrs. Larry Cond, Whitby, who, while visiting friends, was able to lead three horses from a burning stable to safety. A further medal and citation was presented to nine year old Charles Shore who rescued nine puppies from a burning kennel. To do this young Charles had to break an entrance into the kennel to get to the puppies and it is no doubt he effected the rescue at a personal risk to himself. A bronze medal and citation was also given to three faithful workers of the Society who have each served, in one capacity or another, for more than 25 years. These went to Miss Jane Boyle, Niagara Falls; Mrs. Marjorie McKay, St. Catharines; and Mr. Herb Merry, Oakville.

Certificates of Merit were presented to several members for outstanding actions on behalf of the Society during the past year. To 13 year old Graham Rolph, Mono Mills, Ont. for rescuing a dog from an ice-covered pond (and fell through the ice during the rescue); to James Ryan, a canine control officer of Markham who rescued a puppy from a culvert, under particularly unpleasant circumstances; to the Toronto Humane Society for their work in rescuing a number of animals from a recent train wreck and to Mr. Charles Plant, Niagara Falls, who has retired as Director and Manager of the Niagara Frontier Society Shelter.

The annual elections resulted in the following being elected to the Board for 1963: President, Gordon C. Trent; Vice-Presidents, Russel T. Payton and G. D. Jefferson; Treasurer, J. K. prescription for the dog game

Have you ever noticed that we have a tendency, when confronted by an illness, to devote our attention to the symptoms rather than to the disease? With our own bodies, we fuss about our aches and sneezes, dosing ourselves with pain killers, anti-histamines and sleeping tablets, but doing little to combat the condition that produced the offending pains and sniffles. If our malady doesn't go away, we consult a physician who diagnoses the condition and prescribes treatment to get to the root of the trouble.

I wonder if we may not find a rather close parallel in the dog game. Perhaps we should ask, first, "Is the fancy completely healthy, or does it suffer from nagging pains or that rundown feeling?" The presence or absence of symptoms should provide the answer.

Let's listen to a discussion among "doggy people", extracting a few sentences from their conversation.

"But Sideny, old man, what can you expect when the judges don't know the breed standard?"

"Well, I'll tell you that Harriett and I will never show at Bazooka Falls again; all the breeders there have small dogs and Toar just didn't have a chance.

"What I'd like to know is, why doesn't CKC make up its mind?"

"My dear, I wish you could see that dog; Best of Breed at the last three shows all because he has a pretty face. He couldn't do a day's work why he couldn't track an elephant in fresh snow! They should be disqualified if they can't do the work they are designed for, that's what I say."

"Hey Sam, listen to Mable sounding off again about Charlie's dog. That animal of hers may be a heller on game, but he looks like a cross between a Basset and a Borzoi. No wonder she never sees a blue ribbon."

These statements or variations of them which we have all heard many times, are, I submit, symptoms. There are others, of course, but these will serve to illustrate the point. In brief, they involve criticism of judging and of CKC, disparagement of the other fellow's dogs, and the splitting of breeds into show vs. working types.

To return to my original thesis, do we not find ourselves, being aware of these things and of others like them, attempting to cure the ill by treating the symptom rather than the disease? Do we not find, too, that most of the effort expended on these symptoms takes the form of sheer complaining? It is true that many valuable concrete proposals are made in an effort to do something constructive, and that a number of these have been implemented by our Kennel Club. Still, I maintain, we are not coming to grips with the

basic problem, the disease in my ana-

The next few lines will contain some pretty blunt statements which may arouse indignation in the mind of the reader. However, I think that a little serious thought will lead to the conclusion that what I am about to say is true. It is my belief that the root of the problem mentioned above is to be found in our own ignorance; ignorance of our role as fanciers of a certain breed, ignorance of our role as members of CKC, and most important of all, ignorance of what characteristics make

a good dog - and why.

To expand on the first of these, it is apparent that very few fanciers take active roles in shaping the destiny of their particular breeds. One detects a totally unwarranted detachment on the part of breeders with respect to specialty club activities. Perhaps this is most apparent in attitudes to breed standards, where the average Sidlehound breeder, disagreeing with the statement that the left legs should be twice as long as the right ones, either ignores the official list of breed attributes and breeds according to his own personal standard, or reluctantly attempts to breed towards the official standard because judges or CKC want Sidles to be that way. The important thing is that each characteristic in a standard should have an optimal size, condition, or what-have-you, and that there should be a good reason for each of the ideal values set forth. Coming back to our friend, it may be that the standard is correct, in which case he should find out why, after which he will breed for characteristics not reluctantly, but knowledgeably and enthusiastically. On the other hand, our breeder may be correct in his idea of perfection, in which case he should campaign, through his specialty club, to have the official standard changed. After all, CKC doesn't make breed standards, but rather puts into official recognition the ideal as set forth by the specialty club. Finally, it may be that neither our breeder nor the specialty club really knows why a Sidlehound should have its left leg twice as long as the right ones - it simply says so in the book! Here ignorance reigns in full majesty.

The second realm occupied by lack of knowledge concerns our role as members of The Canadian Kennel Club our Kennel Club. The impersonal word "they" is almost invariably used when referring to CKC. Those of us who have had dealings with similar organizations in other countries have, or should have, a great appreciation for our Kennel Club. If we have suggestions or complaints, we should remember that we are The Canadian Kennel Club. We should speak our piece, not to Joe next door, but to our representative on

the governing body of our Kennel Club. I might add that we would do well to heed the advice of our telephone companies when picking up Dogs in Canada by reading the yellow pages. Here is where we will find rules in the making. Here is where we are given the opportunity to voice opinion before final steps are taken after which we may only say, "What they should have done was

Finally, and most important, it is naked truth to say that we are ignorant about our dogs. I shall go so far as to say that not more than 20 people in all of Canada really know dogs. Before you spend too much time wondering who the other 19 are, I should tell you that you aren't on the list and neither am I.

As with most things, there is a full range of ignorance to be found among us. Also, one can detect two kinds of this commodity; sheer lack of knowledge on the one hand, and false information on the other. Doubtless, the latter is the more dangerous, for the misinformed frequently speak with great authority. unthinkingly spreading untrue "facts". So colossal is our ignorance, that it is difficult to choose examples to illustrate the point, however, consideration of basic skeletal anatomy related to function will do. Most of us develop the capacity to recognize a good gait from a poor one. But do we know in specific terms why one dog moves more effortlessly or with greater drive or with better reach, than another? Let me put it this way: suppose that we are looking at a dog which moves imperfectly, and that we are suddenly empowered with a great magic which will enable us to alter the dog's skeleton. Would we know which bones to lengthen or shorten, and by how much, or which angles to increase or decrease, and by how much, in order to correct the gait? I'm afraid that the honest answer for most of us is "no". Indeed, many of us don't even know what the bones are, much less how they work in concert to produce an effect upon the dog's move-

To take this a step further, let me illustrate that entire organizations show lack of knowledge. To avoid offending others, I shall quote from the newlyrevised standard of my own breed, The Alaskan Malamute. "Stifles moderately bent, hock joints broad and strong, moderately bent and well let down. Now, there is not a shadow of doubt that there exists an optimal length of femur (thigh), tibia-fibula (shank), and metatarsal (foot) bones, and optimal angles between them, in order to produce the tireless, powerful gait required of the Malamute. Yet, the collective knowledge of our entire breed club has not proven sufficient to describe these in concrete, measurable terms. In other words, we do not yet know what is ideal. As a result, we concoct a phrase like "moderately bent" which may mean ten things to ten people, some of them judges. Incidentally, if you think that we are a bunch of dummies, take a peek at your own breed standard and see if we aren't in good company.

20/Dogs in Canada

The foregoing is intended to represent a diagnosis of some of the ills of the dog game. If I'm going to play physician however, I mustn't stop here, but must prescribe remedies, and here they are: large doses of Sulphastudyal and Learnamycin, to be taken at frequent intervals. I suggest that we must become serious students of dogs in general, of dogs of our own breed, and of our own personal dogs. In this regard, Dr. Shute's series on The Anatomy Of The Dog, which recently appeared in Dogs In Canada, and Lloyd Brackett's series on The Dog In Motion, currently appearing in Dog World, will be of immense help. Of great importance, I believe, is the program so enthusiastically led by Mrs. Dennis Gardiner of Kerrykroft Kennels, Orono, Ont., (see Dogs In Canada, January, 1962) in which dogs are measured in every conceivable way, are X-rayed, and are photographed by slow motion moving picture cameras. Not only are the "record of characteristics" of each dog valuable in assessing the animal and in instructing the people involved, but precious information about the inheritance of various characteristics may be extracted from such records when they cover several generations. One might add that study and measurement of psychological traits, while frequently neglected, are as deserving and rewarding as measurement of physical attributes. Studies in Dog Behaviour by C. J. Pfaffenberger, available in booklet form from Purebred Dogs (American Kennel Gazette), is an excellent source of information on this subject

A program such as Mrs. Gardiner's cannot be carried out by lone individuals. Therefore, I suggest that each of us should seize the initiative and instigate activity in our specialty clubs, in local all-breed clubs, and in CKC itself, to promote such programs across the country.

Finally, we should recognize that we "doggy people" have not made any serious attempt to harness research facilities to our problems. Much could be learned by a few trained men and women such as senior graduate students at O.V.C., O.A.C., or at Zoology Departments in our universities. Such projects would cost in the neighborhood of \$3500 per year for a three year program (the average period of residence of a Ph.D. candidate). The prodding, however, must come from us; it will not come from the universities. To get such a plan into operation it will be necessary for enough of us to raise our voices so that such sources of funds as our CKC and the feed companies which we patronize will provide financial sup-

We don't need to feel ashamed of the fact that we lack knowledge about important things. Indeed, the realization that one does not know is the prelude to finding out. It is important, then, that we focus attention upon the limitations of our knowledge and come to realize that the major ills suffered by our "game" lie at our own doorstep. Each of us has an obligation to take

part in the "cure."

DON'T SACRIFICE BALANCE

by BILL JOBSON

Some of the extravagant, out-of-proportion heads found on the Miniatures and Toy Poodles of the present day have caused me to compare the three recognised sizes, especially regarding head dimensions.

Before I started on the experiment I sized up several Standard top winners and took as my basis the ideal which has done most of the winning. This dog is exaggerated in no way. He is, in fact, perfectly balanced and if he looked any bigger in any department he would appear exaggerated, particularly in head.

His dimensions are: height to shoulder 26", length of back from shoulder to tail root 22", length of neck from shoulder to peak of head at back 12", length of skull and muzzle from peak at back of skull to tip of nose 9", length of foreface only 4½", width of head across skull between eyes 5".

The following table is based upon this Standard-sized model and the fractions given in relation to the smaller varieties are to the nearest 1/26th".

One has to remember that all three sized Poodles should portray the same balanced picture regardless of what actual height it is. The minute Toy should convey the same proportions as the largest Standard and should in no way be exaggerated or dwarfed.

Therefore, if we take a nine-inch Toy in proportion to a Standard we should get dimensions very like this: height 9", length of back 7½", length of neck 4½", total length of head and skull approx. 3½" and length of foreface approx 1 5/16ths, with a skull width of 1½".

From the foregoing one will quickly see that the ultra long-headed Toy is totally wrong and out of proportion as is the short-legged long-backed Toy.

Before going all out for these long fine heads I ask you to stop and think if they are required or if the judges who look for them are quite right in what they try to find. There has been far too much high-lighting of length of head for many years and if one is not careful we shall find ourselves with only a head, no body and nothing in that head. Then the breed is lost.

I fully realize just as you do that it is no use trying to find any ideals on certain dimensions. I have not given them for that reason. I have simply given them to illustrate the fact that balance and proportion must come before exaggeration. I cannot imagine anything more grotesque than to see a Standard with a 15" head! This sounds perhaps silly, but when one finds a 9" Toy with 5" head then a Standard in proportion would have that fantastic feature.

Please look at your Poodles, size them up and ask yourself whether they are balanced. And is the head the only thing you see? Please let us keep everything in proportion.

Only law can help

The following information has been received from The Humane Society of the United States:

"More than 175 million vertebrate animals are used every year in American research laboratories.

"These animals undergo every extreme of agony that flesh and nerves can endure — and some that are wholly beyond endurance. They are burned alive, scalded without anaesthesia, crushed in steel presses, starved to death . . . many go totally mad from years of cruel confinement without humane care.

"Much of this suffering is unnecessary and inexcusable, even by the criteria of medical research. The cruelty does not advance science: it retards medical progress; it wastes millions of dollars that in other use could save human lives and prevent suffering . . .

"It is utterly impossible for 9,000 laboratories, employing 200,000 persons and using more than 175 million animals a year, to agree on and to enforce humane standards for use and care of animals." (Many laboratories operate behind locked doors; visitors are unwelcome). Much of the work is uselessly duplicated.

The Randall bill, H.R. 4856 has been introduced in the United States Congress, which would establish rigorous standards of humane use and care of animals. It requires all government agencies getting grants to abide by the established standards. It orders the Department of Justice to enforce the law.

Similar ruthless and needless treatment of animals goes on in Canadian laboratories. It is hoped that readers will, if given the opportunity, support any legislation or activity toward humane treat-

(2) pointed out that members of the Board had been provided with copies of letters received from a number of judges objecting to this change in the 'certificate' they are required to sign after having completed a judging engagement at a championship show held under C, K, C. Rules;

(3) reported that in the opinion of the Club's solicitor there is no power in the Board to require that Winners must be worthy of the title of "champion" in the opinion of the judge;

(4) recommended that the Board take immediate action on this question. DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed it was suggested that rather than alter the statement to its original form, it would be preferable to delete the statement in its entirety.

SUBJECT: The President suggested that the Board give immediate consideration to a number of letters which had been received from a number of persons who had heretofore been considered as eligible for approval to judge all breeds at championship shows held under the Club's rules, such letters having been received in response to letters written by the Secretary by way of implementing resolutions (#71-62, #72-62 and #375-62) adopted by the Board in 1962.

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed:

(1) Mr. Anderson suggested that the Board consider the advisability of arranging for appropriate amendments to Chapters #7 and #8 of the Dog Show Rules in order that the selection of judges for championship shows would be left entirely to the discretion of clubs conducting such shows, except in the case of persons from whom the Board has seen fit to withdraw judging privileges after investigation;

(2) Mrs. Joel pointed out that in a report (dated May 29, 1962 - File #11 D 25) which she had presented, as Chairman of the Committee, to the semi-annual meeting of the Board in June (1962) the Committee had expressed the following views: "This Committee is of the opinion that the present Dog Show Rules (Chapter 7, Section 1) setting forth certain requirements before a person may be eligible

to judge a breed or breeds, and the present policies limiting the frequency of judging engagements by a judge within the same zone, are not at all helpful to show-giving clubs. Since the primary responsibility for holding a show rests with the show-giving club, and since they must, of necessity, engage persons who will attract entries, this Committee feels that the right of the show-giving clubs to select judges should not be restricted by The Canadian Kennel Club except, of course, by way of eliminating persons suspended or expelled, or ineligible to judge the same breed or breeds in the country in which they reside. "

(1) when approving judges for a particular show, inform the show-giving club of other judging engagements of their selected judges if such engagements are close as to time or area;

(b) give such clubs the opportunity of altering their selection of judges in such circumstances.

INTERNAL AND ADMINISTRATION

9 A 7. AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS

REPORT: The Secretary:

(1) reported that Ministerial approval had been granted amendments to the Club's By-laws, such amendments (\$10, \$11, \$12, \$13, \$14, \$15, \$16, \$16, \$17) having been approved by majority affirmative vote on the last referendum ballot:

(2) read a letter (dated January 30th) from the Chief Registration Officer of the Department of Agriculture raising questions with regard to the following amendments (approved by majority affirmative vote on the last referendum ballot):

\$\frac{\psi}{5} = -\text{an amendment to Article XXV - Kennel Names;}

\$\frac{\psi}{8} = -\text{an amendment to Article XXVIII - Rules of Eligibility;}

\$\frac{\psi}{18} = \text{an amendment to Article XXVIII - Rules of Eligibility;}

\$\frac{\psi}{18} = \text{an amendment to Article XXVIII - Elections;}

(3) reported that arrangements had been made for Dr. F. J. Leslie, the Chief Registration Officer, to meet with the Board at 2:00 p. m. for the purpose of discussing with the Board the three amendments referred to in (2) above;

(4) reported on a letter from Miss Susan Radley setting forth her views on some problems which breeders may face if amendment \$\psi\$ should receive Ministerial approval.

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed, the Board:

(1) noted that in connection with proposed amendment No. \$\psi\$ (which provided that a dog found to have hip displasia, cryptorchidism or monorchidism would be ineligible for registration, or its registration cancelled if already effected the Chief Registration Officer, in his letter of January 30th, had merely suggested that the section number of this addition to Article XXVIII be numbered 5 rather than numbered 4, as set forth on the referendum ballot:

(2) agreed that this amendment should be thoroughly discussed by the Board before its meeting with Dr. Leslie;

agreed after discussion, that since an amendment to the By-laws is effective immediately upon Ministerial approval, it would be neces-

sary to immediately revise all applications for registration and make necessary alterations in registration procedures in order to properly implement the amendment, and to do so would present con siderable difficulties both for breeders and the Live Stock Records

office: agreed that the amendment, if it became effective, might present legal problems to breeders who had sold dogs as pure-bred and provided certificates for such dogs, as provided by the Live Stock

provided certificates for such dogs, as provided by the Live Stock Pedigree Act; agreed that while the principle of the amendment may be sound, another more practical approach to the conditions set forth in the amendment was indicated and that, in the meantime, the Board should request of the Minister of Agriculture that he withhold approval of the amendment.

MOTION #9-63

"THAT, we ask the Chief Registration Officer to convey to

SUBJECT: The Secretary pointed out that, according to Section 15 of Article XXXVIII of the By-laws, should the Minister notify the Club that he is not prepared to approve of any of the amendments to the By-laws as approved by majority affirmative vote, the Board has the power to appoint a committee to interview responsible officials of the Minister's Department for the purpose of agreeing on any necessary changes (which must not be contrary to the spirit of the amendments) approved on the referendum ballot in order that such amendments may receive Ministerial

MOTION \$10-63
Moved by Mr. Brown, seconded by Mr. Dawson:
"THAT, we go into Committee of the whole to discuss these
questions with Dr. Leslie."
Motion carried unanimously.

SUBJECT: The President informed Dr. Leslie of the text of resolution \$9-63 and Dr. Leslie was informed of the Board's reasons for adopting said resolution.

After discussion, Dr. Leslie stated that, having regard for the Board's reasons for advancing such a request, it is highly probable that departmental officials will give favourable consideration to the request when submitting their recommendation to the Minister.

DISCUSSION: A discussion followed with regard to the points raised by Dr. Leslie in his letter of January 30th with regard to three amendments to the By-laws (approved on the last referendum ballot) and for which Ministerial approval had been sought.

It was pointed out that Dr. Leslie had drawn attention to the fact that if amendment No. 18 on the last referendum ballot (providing for a two-year term of office for the Board) was to be approved by the Minister, then it would be necessary for a correction in the present Section 17 (reading as follows: "The Officers and other Directors elected in each annual election shall take office on January 1st of the year for which they were elected.") of Article XII. After discussion it was agreed that the Secretary would re-submit an application for Ministerial approval of a mendment No. 18 in order that this Section would be consistent with the new Article XII providing for a blennial election of the Board.

The Board noted that in his letter of January 30th the Chief Registration Officer had advised that he could not recommend Ministerial approval of amendment No. 5 (an entire new Article dealing with kennel names) as the new Article included provision (in Section 4) for the Board to delegate any or all of its powers and authority to a Kennel Names Committee, the Chief Registration Officer having pointed out that Article IX, Section 1 of the By-laws provides that the affairs of the Club shall be managed by the Board, and Section 2 of Article XIII provides authority for the appointment of special committees whose actions shall be subject to approval of the Board.

After discussion it was agreed that in these circumstances the Board had no alternative but to re-submit an application for approval of proposed amendment No. 5 with Section 4 deleted.

He stated that other incorporated live stock associations had not seen fit to impose so many restrictions on the allocation of herd or farm names and suggested that the Board review the policies which it had seen fit to adopt over a period of years.

REGISTRATION, STUD BOOKS AND RELATED MATTERS

7 R 20. ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION

SUBJECT: The Secretary pointed out that, pursuant to the Club's By-laws, the Club had adopted, with the approval of the Chief Registration Officer, regulations governing artificial insemination and inquired whether the approval of the Chief Registration Officer may be expected if the Board sought his approval of an amendment to the regulations which would permit any practising veterinarian in Canada, upon the completion of the required applications and approval thereof, to practise artificial insemination for pure-bred dogs. Dr. Leslie expressed the view that favourable consideration of such a request may be expected if the Board decided that a change in the present regulations is advisable.

-Dr. Leslie left the meeting after being thanked by the President for his co-operation in arranging to meet with the Board to discuss matters of mutual concern.

INTERNAL AND ADMINISTRATION

9 A 103. APPOINTMENTS FOR 1963

SUBJECT: The Secretary pointed out that:

(1) the Club is entitled to five representatives on the Canadian National Live Stock Record Board;

(2) at the Annual General Meeting in 1960 the members, by resolution, had elected Mr. J. W. MacCallum to a five-year term on that Board, Mr. R. L. Blyth to a four-year term, Mr. Wm. McDerment to a three-year term, and had decided that the President and Secretary should be elected by virtue of their respective offices;

(3) it is customary for the Board, at its annual meeting, to decide whether it would place before the Annual General Meeting its recommendations with regard to the filling of any Yacancies in the Club's five-member representation on the Record Board.

DISCUSSION: The President stated that it would not be possible for him to attend the Record Board meeting on March 26th, and suggested that for the current year another member be elected to take the place of the President as one of the Club's five representatives.

REPORT: The Secretary read the following report (dated March 11, 1963) submitted by Mr. Thomas Joel, one of the Club's two representatives to the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair:

"As one of the Club's two representatives to the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair, I am submitting this report direct to the Board of Directors previous to the report which I shall make, with Mr. McDerment, at the Annual General Meeting to be held on Thursday of this week.

"As the Board is aware, various representatives of this Club to the Winter Fair have unsuccessfully sought during recent years to convince the Royal Winter Fair that one or more dog shows, and possibly obedience trials, should be staged in connection with their annual Fair. During recent years we have been led to believe that there was not sufficient space for our purpose but if and when additional space became available, then consideration would be given to a dog show. That space has now been provided, but my discussions with the General Manager of the Royal Winter Fair this morning lead me to believe there is no prospect of a dog show being staged at the Winter Fair.

"I am reasonably satisfied that unless two conditions are met we are most unlikely to receive any encouragement and the prospects of a dog show at the Winter Fair are remote. These conditions are as follows:

(1) some activity in connection with dogs must be going on throughout every day that the Royal Winter Fair runs;

that the financial arrangements must be such as to convince the officials of the Royal Winter Fair that the financial returns for such activity will be well worth while from their point of view.

"I think the time has passed when we should simply seek to inform them that space should be made available for dog shows and obedience trials. I feel that the only real possibility of anything worth while now being accomplished is for The Canadian Kennel Club itself to thoroughly explore what can be done for dogs at the Winter Fair and be prepared to place before the executive of the Royal Winter Fair a detailed plan which will meet at least the two minimum conditions which I have outlined above.

"My discussions with Mr. McKee this morning led me to believe that our association with the Winter Fair is nothing but a courtesy arrangement that has no real benefits for either organization."

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed:

(1) Mr. Blyth expressed the view that Mr. Joel had outlined a course of positive action and felt the Board should decide what should now be done to place specific proposals before the management of the Royal Winter Fair;

Winter Fair; the President suggested that the Club's representatives to the Royal Winter Fair be augmented by persons having a thorough knowledge of obedience and field trials; Mr. Brown suggested that every effort be made to have shows and trials at this year's Royal Winter Fair, this by way of celebrating the Club's Diamond Anniversary;

Mr. Anderson suggested that consideration be given to possible plans which would bring together, at the Royal Winter Fair, the top dogs across the country for a grand championship.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

5 F 30. SHOW AND TRIAL ACCOUNTS AND CHARGES

SUBJECT: A memorandum which the Secretary had addressed to the Board on February 14th, in which the Secretary proposed:

(1) that the Club discontinue the present of requiring a separate date fee for each and every championship show and licensed trial held under the Club's rules and substitute a system which would require a club wishing to hold such shows and trials to make a standing deposit of \$25.00, which deposit would be refunded should a club voluntarily cease to hold shows and/or trials under the Club's rules or be debarred from doing so;

(2) that the recording fee in its present form be discontinued for obedience trials and field trials and that we set a fixed service charge for each of these events;

(3) that a club wishing to hold a championship show for other than all breeds be required to pay, within ten days after its show, a fixed service charge (in place of the present recording fee) determined by the number of breeds eligible for entry at its show;

(4) that, in the case of all-breed championship shows, the recording fee be discontinued and a fixed charge be payable, within ten days after the show, based on the number of dogs in competition at that club's all-breed championship show (or shows) held in the previous year;

(5) that the Club discontinue the present charge for judges' books supplied show and trial-giving clubs;
(6) that the listing fee continue to be payable as at present;
(7) that, having regard for proposal (1), a schedule of fixed penalties be set for violations of the Dog Show Rules or where a club fails to carry on with the show or trial for which a date has been allocated or for failure to make its returns on time.

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed:
(1) the Secretary stated that these proposals were presented with a view to eliminating much of the accounting work now required by the Club and show and trial secretaries;
(2) it was suggested that before the Board considers whether it should take any action with regard to the first of the Secretary's proposals, the reaction of show and trial-giving clubs should be sought.

6 IM 3. DOGS CROSSING CANADIAN-AMERICAN BORDER

REPORT: The Secretary:

(1) reported that in 1962 the Board of Directors had authorized a committee composed of Mr. W. J. Monaghan and the Secretary, to meet with Mr. E. J. Cannon, a Customs Consultant at Buffalo, N. Y., for the purpose of deciding on an approach to the American Government with regard to the possibility of obtaining abolition of all duties, tariffs, bonds, etc. in connection with dogs crossing the Canadian-American border for any purpose whatsoever;

(2) reported that the meeting with Mr. Cannon had taken place at the Club's offices on November 2nd and that thereafter Mr. Cannon had submitted the digest of a proposed submission to the American Government, the submission having to do solely with obtaining new regulations which would facilitate the entry into the United States of Canadian-owned females to be mated to American-owned stud dogs; read a memorandum (dated March 12, 1963) from Mr. Monaghan, who reviewed three important aspects of the shipment of Canadian-owned females to the United States for breeding purposes, and who recommended that Mr. W. J. Callaghan, a Tariff Consultant, be retained to make necessary representations to the United States Government with a view to obtaining an appropriate executive order which would facilitate the entry of Canadian-owned females taken or sent to the United States to be mated to American-owned stud dogs.

DISCUSSION: After discussion the Board agreed that the committee should be asked to consider appropriate recommendations to the Board with regard to developing further the original intention of seeking the complete abolition of all tariffs, duties, bonds, etc. on dogs crossing the Canadian-American border for any purpose whatsoever.

 (2) reported that his attention had been drawn to the fact that in the Club's first published Book of Breed Standards in the standard for Collies, under the heading of "Disqualification", there appears the following: "Body in grown males, a cryptorchid is disqualified": reported that his attention had been drawn to the fact that in the Club's first Book of Breed Standards there appears in the standard of the Shetland Sheepdog the following, under the heading of "Disqualifications": "cryptorchidism in adults over 12 months of age"; pointed out that although the Club's Dog Show Rules had for some years provided for the disqualification of monorchids and cryptorchids regardless of age, and although the quoted sections of the standard for the Collie and Shetland Sheepdog had been in effect since at least 1956, no judge or exhibitor in the breeds concerned had communicated with The Canadian Kennel Club seeking a clarification of the evident confliction between what appears in Chapter 17, Section 1 of the Dog Show Rules and the quoted sections of the standards for these two breeds;

 (5) recommended that the Board decide whether or not Chapter 17, Section 1 of the Dog Show Rules takes precedence over breed standards or vice versa;

 (6) suggested that, if the Board does take the position that the Dog Show Rule takes precedence over the breed standards, arrangements be made for the inclusion in the first Book of Breed Standards.

DISCUSSION: During a further discussion with regard to present restrictions on kennel names it was pointed out that Section 1 of the present article XXV (Kennel Names) in the By-laws provides that a breeder who registered his kennel name since May 5, 1951, may only use his registered kennel name as a prefix when naming dogs born his property. It was suggested that only if such a policy is universally followed would it be meaningful to the extent intended when this policy was adopted by the Club in 1951. Mr. MacKillop and Mr. Anderson gave notice that if Ministerial approval is granted amendment No. 5 (a new Article XXV on kennel names approved on the last referendum ballot — see resolution #12-63) then they would move and second a motion the purpose of which would be to allow a breeder having a registered kennel name to exercise his choice as to whether he would use such name as a prefix or suffix.

While discussing this question reference was made to a standing resolution with regard to the use of a registered kennel name in the naming of dogs imported to Canada.

ACTION: The Secretary was instructed to inform Col. Drury that the matter had been considered by the Board but the Board did not believe it should take any action.

DOG SHOWS

11 D 1. JUDGES

The Secretary reported on a matter arising under this heading and the Board took appropriate action.

SUBJECT: The Secretary reported that a question had been raised as to sust how the Club may acquaint show-giving clubs with the fact that a number of persons are available, on a one-show basis, to judge certain breeds, these persons having established eligibility to judge a certain breed or breeds at one show after having complied with the requirements of Section 2 of Chapter 7 of the Dog Show Rules.

ACTION: After discussion it was agreed that:

(1) such persons should not be included on the list of approved judges distributed to show- and trial-giving clubs;

(2) this matter would again be considered by the Board at its semi-annual meeting when, at that meeting, the Board considers proposed amendments to Chapters 7 and 8 of the Dog Show Rules.

REPORT: The Secretary reported that:

(1) several persons, after meeting the requirements of Section 2 of Chapter 7 of the Dog Show Rules, had established eligibility to judge a number of breeds at one championship show, and amongst these were a number who had indicated their desire to proceed to establish eligibility to judge additional breeds or a group;

(2) in these cases the Chairman of the committee responsible for processing applications for approval to judge had been guided by the text of a standing resolution (#366-61) and these persons had been informed that their request to establish eligibility to judge additional breeds or group would be dealt with after a final decision had been made on the breeds or group for which they had established eligibility to judge at one show.

made on the breeds or group for which they had established eligibility to judge at one show.

DISCUSSION: During a discussion which followed:

(1) it was pointed out that in most cases few of these persons would have an opportunity of judging a few breeds or a single group at a champlonship show, and their opportunities of obtaining judging engagements would continue to be limited until they could establish eligibility to judge additional breeds or groups;

(2) in these circumstances it would be advisable to permit these people to establish eligibility to judge additional breeds or groups if only to extend the list of persons eligible for approval to judge at championship shows and permit show-giving clubs a wider selection of judges;

(3) it was agreed that standing resolution \$366-61 should be rescinded.

MOTION #97-63

Moved by Mr. Anderson, seconded by Mrs. Anderson:

"THAT, the following resolution (#366-61) be deleted from the Book of Standing Resolutions:

"THAT, for the guidance of the Committee it be recommended that no applicant for approval to judge an additional breed or breeds or an additional group be permitted to take the written and oral examinations until an assessment of the critique of the previous approval has been received."

Motion carried unanimously.

Aloha!

My first visit to Hawaii last summer was a series of surprises and delights beginning with my arrival at the Honolulu airport where I was told I was the first Canadian to judge a Hawaiian obedience trial; where I was smothered in plumeria, carnation, and dog biscuit leis; where I was photographed with American Champion Barwyn's Anharryd, CD., the latter fashionably attired for the occasion in a corgi-size plumeria lei; and where I was amazed to learn I had judged "Annie" (as she is known when not meeting obedience judges at airports) and owner Dorothy Westerlund the only time they competed in Canada at Victoria, B.C.

All livestock admitted to the Islands is isolated and the 120 day quarantine station was one of the many not typical tourist attractions on my agenda. From seemingly endless rows of outdoor shady runs, the dog "prisoners" greet you as nature equipped them to do so or with their mouths clamped shut over balls and with a distant stare as they watched for their own Special One's daily visit. It was my impression that day that the popular dogs entering Hawaii were Poodles.

A few days later I was privileged to judge the 24th AKC sponsored Obedience Trial of the Obedience Training Club of Hawaii. It is now a pleasant blur of bright mummus worn by many spectators under shade trees in Thomas Square . . . of three Utility, seven Open and 28 Novice entries of tantalizing monkeypod trophies . of smart handlers keeping their dogs quiet and cool before competing of my stewards who applied me often with sunburn lotion much like basting a chicken for frying . . . of five lux-white Poodles seated side by side in the "Long Sit" giving me "snow blindness" after five hours in the sun . of my dilemma when a Miniature Poodle seated on a swarm of red ants broke this exercise of the approving spectator laughter when Dot Fantasia's comical Cocker completed the "Long Down" in the sun in the shade of a tree . of awarding the top score of 199 points to a Dalmatian in Novice B expertly handled by John Kaaloa and 198 points for the highest scoring Poodle trophy to his own Miniature Poodle. The gala banquet following the trial was the occasion of much merriment and the opportunity to present club achievement awards and certificates to apprentice training instructors.

By reason of geographic isolation, Alaskan and Hawaiian obedience fans share a sneaking fear that their standard of performance may be lower than those living on the mainland and able to commute to many areas offering excellent competition to keep them "on their toes' This basic idea keeps both Alaska and Hawaii obedience club members striving forward with far more enthusiasm than is noted in our local clubs. Consequently, their request from me was for constructive criticism rather than congratulations. Opportunities for this were given at the post-trial banquet, later in the week at a dog training session, and at every occasion - with individuals and small groups at breakfast, luncheon, dinner and coffee parties, and even while sightseeing. At the club's monthly meeting, I launched forth on my favourite obedience subject, the "smoothness and gentleness of handling". In this talk I condemned training without the use of timely praising which results in many depressed, sullen, fearful dogs and equally unamusing handlers judged in trials everywhere.

During this week in Honolulu I enjoyed meeting Mrs. Kaiser and visiting her "Kaiser Pink" white Standard Poodle Kennels. It is the plan of her octagonally-designed kennel to enable each Poodle from its individual pen to view the central grooming area. Their close contact with Mrs. Kaiser, kennel attendants and visitors, avoids the development of the unsociable type of personality so often noticed with kennelled dogs lacking human association. Each Alekai dog had a characteristic Poodley interest in people. Their superb temperament and condition was a credit to Mrs. Kaiser's personal interest in this breed.

The OTC of Hawaii presented me with a hibicus carved monkeypod lamp as a reminder of my visit with them. With or without it, it would be difficult to forget any of these sincere and generous people. It is difficult to select only a few of the many interesting people in the dog game on the Islands. There is the Club's Treasurer and most willing worker in the club, Harry Wong and his wife, whose combined charm soon changed me from feeling like a malihini (newcomer) to a kamaaina (old timer). Eloise and Roger Monsarratt breed, train, show in obedience and work towards the AKC's bench acceptance of Australian Kelpies. This is one evidence that the spirit of adventure that brought Roger's ancestor five generations ago to Hawaii by schooner is still active in his descendant. Tricky judging problems were gnawed over with Arthur and his brother Dr. Edward Zane, Capt. Everett Gladding, President of the OTC, and Robert Sato, all judges residing in Hawaii. It was an education to watch Mrs. Ruth Budrea, an inexperienced trial secretary, whose administrative ability had everyone working and enjoying his responsibility. Unforgettable were the seven photogenic children (keiki) in mummus, aloha shirts, or diapers belonging to and frequently being rounded up by the Director of Training, Dr. Howard Furumoto, DVM., and his wife.

A visit to the Island of Hawaii meant great fun with Betty and Arthur Evers, owners of the High Scoring Dal and their handler John Kaaola and his wife Florence. John trained his first dog entirely by reading Blanche Saunder's textbook "Training You to Train Your Dog" without even having seen a dog trained and with no other help whatsoever. Discovered by Dr. Zane and persuaded to enter a trial in Honolulu in 1958, John coped the highest score in trial, a feat which he repeatedly does or else close to it. In my estimation, John Kaaola just has the touch and is the finest trainer I have ever met and the only one with whom I would unhesitatingly trust my own Poodles. As so many of the best trophies at each trial flew off to Hilo, Hawaii, with him, Florence and John were somewhat embarrassed and wondered if the OTC membership were not resentful of this wholesale vanishing of their trophies out of Honolulu. Their answer came to them in an unexpected and sad way. John sustained severe multiple injuries from a recent car accident. Florence wrote "everyone in Honolulu really came through with help to sell our 18 shepherd puppies"

I am not surprised. The Americans I met in Hawaii were just those kind of people.

ingham and let him know whether or not this matter is of further interest. He will then be able to know whether or not the plan should be developed. Maritime readers are requested to bring this matter to the attention of poodle owners, who may not be CKC members and hence are unlikely to read of this matter. Failure to respond will be construed as lack of interest in the formation of such a club.

Evangeline K.C. March meeting was held at the home of the Vice-President Mrs. Peel, South Berwick and with a very large attendance. New members continue to join. Plans for the June 28 and 29 shows are uppermost and are progressing satisfactorily. The new Dog Show rules Amendments #20, #21 and #22 are of great concern to so small a club and one can but wonder whether Kennel Clubs throughout the country are doing their duty, as the implication of these rules should have been discussed before the members voted - perhaps they were. Breed Familiarisation continued with Group 5 under the guidance of Mrs. P. A. Margeson.

Twin City Obedience Club completed the second course March 29, with 22 dogs participating and started the third course April 4. Obedience Trials are slated for June 30, in conjunction with the Maritime Toy Dog Club Specialty. Twin City's President, R. A. Bonoyer, has been appointed by C.K.C. Obedience Representative for N.S./Nfld.; his address is 89, Main St., Dartmouth.

LOOKING BACK

Tantramar K.C. was originally organized under the name of Amherst K.C., but in November 1955 was reorganized and renamed Tantramar because of the membership comprising breeders from so large an area as Amherst, Sackville, Springhill, Westchester, etc. In May, 1956 the new club held its first All-Breed championship show and in May, 1958 it enlarged the show to a twoday with a reception on the intervening Sunday; this pattern of a two-day show and reception continued through 1959 and 1960 when the show days were moved to Saturday and Sunday in 1961 and 1962 with Moncton holding a show on the following day, Monday making a three-day circuit. This year, 1963, the club is again branching out and holding three one-day shows May 18, 19 and 20.

October, 1957 the first meeting of the Junior K.C. was held and it is believed that this was the first Junior K.C. to be formed in the East. Many of these Juniors have since shown their dogs to their championships and some are now handling dogs for friends.

The first CKC Retriever Trials to be held in Nova Scotia were held by Tantramar K.C. in September, 1958.

The first Obedience classes to be held in Nova Scotia were likewise held by Tantramar K.C. in April, 1958 but the Golden & Labrador Retrievers

The club continues to flourish and this year, under the chairmanship of F. L. Mayne, Westchester, with monthly meetings at the home of the members.

Evangeline Kennel Club dates its be-

ginning from April 18, 1956 when a group of Valley dog lovers gathered at South Berwick to discuss the forma-tion of a kennel club in the Annapolis Valley. As a result of this meeting the Evangeline K.C. was formed with a membership of 15 and with Mrs. A. Z. Whitman, of the "Windy Lea" Kennels, Auburn as President. Already at this first meeting it was decided to hold a championship show in September, and what the members lacked in know-how about dog shows they made up for in enthusiasm, and under the guidance of Robert Laskey of Saint John, N.B. and with the help of friends in other clubs and led by the Whitmans, who were the principal driving force in the formation of this club, the first All-Breed championship show was staged at R.C.A.F. Greenwood on September 5, 1956 with Mrs. Alva McColl, Toronto judging. Shows from then became an annual event until 1960 when the club branched out into two one-day shows held on consecutive dates during the summer. In 1960 the club suffered a great loss in the death of Mrs. Whitman in a car accident while en route to attend a kennel club meeting in Halifax. In 1958 James Meagher, of the "Nova" kennels, Berwick, had become President and ably guided the club until 1962 when he was forced to resign because of a pending transfer by R.C.A.F. and E. St. John Green, Canning was elected. The memership, although small, is extremely active and enthusiastic, all taking part in the club work, not a few driving round trips of 130 miles to attend the monthly meetings, so that although the club is small it has great ambitions.

hose in one hand and your tire chain in the other as you amusingly describe how long it took your dog to regain consciousness after being suspended in midair; how many screams it took to get his attention by the effective use of the rubber hose; how many stitches it required to close the gash made by the dumbbell beating; and especially the improvement in your "left handed closeto-the-collar grip" as you hold the hose threateningly behind your right ear. Sounds tricky and fascinating. The author claims "nearly all have been helped mentally" -to devote their lives to their gods no doubt. And when your dog no longer satisfies your super ego there are two alternate sources of disposal—the gas chamber and the oven.

After this basic training, you may want to enter the CKC Obedience Trials, under my judging perhaps. Be sure to check your leash, dumbbell and rubber hose on the table after entering the ring. On the other hand, why bother, my fiend. I have news for you-I can tell you now-you have failed according to the rules. If you inflict pain, be sure you can take it by failing with less than 170 points. Don't kid yourself or believe the author; your dog's eyes and manner towards you are a dead give-away.

If Canada is about to embark on a tough system of dog training, then it is up to Canadian Obedience judges to toughen up their scoring. I'm warning you, I'll be the most unpopular judge in

Canada, but the happiest one.

Do yourself a favor. Send me your book as we have a dandy garbage in-cinerator and I'll forward you a copy of Blanche Saunder's "Training You to Train Your Dog".

Perhaps one of the most significant pieces of news coming north of the border is that the AKC has approved a new standard for the Siberian Husky. The size disqualification is now by height (dogs over 23½ inches and bitches over 22 inches) instead of the weight in the old standard.

★ ★ ★ ★ ★
Springerites on both sides of the border can attend an interesting and profitable weekend on August 9-11. These are the dates of the English Springer Spaniel Field Trial Association Specialty Show and Obedience Trial. Along with these events will be a trip through the world famous Cornell Research Laboratory, where the Forum will be held. The Specialty Show (judged by Derek Rayne, Calif.) and the Obedience Trial (judged by Springer breeder George Pugh) will be held on Saturday, August 10 on the campus of Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y. The Sweepstakes (judge, Mrs. John L. Camp) will take place Friday, August 9 and the Forum-Breakfast, along with the tour, on Sunday.

**** Changes in two classes, Novice and Bred by Exhibitor, come into effect June 1. A dog will now be eligible for the Novice Class if it has not won three first prizes in Novice, a first in Bred-by-Exhibitor, American Bred, or Open Classes, nor one or more points toward its championship - all other conditions being the same as before. The change in the conditions of the Bred-by-Exhibitor Class will permit the entry of a dog that is owned wholly or in part by the person, or by the spouse of the person who was the breeder or one of the breeders of record. When the new rule becomes effective, it will then no longer be required that the owner of a dog be that identical person who was the breeder. Note should be taken that under the new conditions only registered dogs are eligible for entry in the class. Dogs must be handled in the class, as heretofore, by an owner or a member of the immediate family of the owner.

★ ★ ★ ★ ★
The American Bouvier des Flandres Club was launched at a meeting held in New York recently with 21 members attending. Fifty-four applicants were accepted and the club would welcome new members from Canada. The Secretary is Mrs. Joan L. Doane, 2303 Foster Place, Wilmington 6, Dela. FOR YOUR INFORMATION

Exhibitors should be warned that the new ruling for the Bred by Exhibitor class is now in effect regardless of the definition on the reverse side of entry forms. Effective January 1, 1963 the definition for this class is as follows: The Bred by Exhibitors Class shall be for dogs owned AND HANDLED by the

Other amendments to the Dog Show Rules now in effect are: Any person officiating as Superintendent of a show shall not enter a dog nor handle a dog at the show which he is superintending, and the same rule shall apply to any member of his immediate family residing under the same roof.

Any person officiating as Secretary of a show shall not enter a dog nor handle a dog at the show of which he is Secretary, and the same rule shall apply to any member of his immediate family residing under the same roof.

Any person officiating as a ring steward at a show shall not enter a dog nor handle a dog at the show at which he is ring stewarding, and this same rule shall apply to any member of his immediate family residing under the same roof.

Obedience exhibitors should note that the first four amendments listed above, apply to Dog Show Rules ONLY. The only change in the Obedience Regulations and Standards deals with participation. This new section is Section 14 of Chapter one.

A ruling has come from The Canadian Kennel Club office that an Obedience Trial held in conjunction with a Dog Show, even when held by the same club, is a separate event. Therefore, it would be Permissible for a man to steward in the obedience trial and his wife enter and handle dogs in the show, and vice

Although no ruling is printed in the Dog Show Rules, there is a CKC standing resolution, of some years standing, which permits a dog, of any breed, which has been awarded Best Opposite Sex to receive additional points, if it has come up from the classes to defeat dogs, of its same sex, entered in Specials Only. Providing, of course, that the addition of these Specials brings the total dogs defeated into the next category. For example: a male Boxer has gone BB. The Winners Female has defeated four females for one point and has been awarded BOS over two Special females. She would thus receive two points. If on the other hand there was only one Special female, no additional points would be given, as it takes six Boxers for two

points. (This point example applies only to Ontario and Quebec, but the example would still apply in all parts of Canada with the difference of the number of points awarded).

Dogs in Canada does not mail copies of the magazine to members of The Canadian Kennel Club. This mailing list is kept and maintained in the CKC office. As all wrappers for members' copies are addressed in that office, change of address etc. should be directed to The Canadian Kennel Club, 1173 Bay St., Toronto, Ont.

For many years Canadian breeders consulted and relied on the Complete Dog Book which carries the official American breed standards. Those who have received a copy of the new CKC book of Standards will notice many standards now differ, either in part or in their entirety. A few breeds so affected are: Pointer, Labrador Retriever, Irish Setter, American Cocker Spaniel, English Springer Spaniel, Vizsla, Miniature Dachshund, Boxer, Collie (Rough), Samoyed, Airedale Terrier, Miniature Schnauzer, Papillon, Pomeranian, Boston Terrier, Poodle, and Schipperke.

Now that the show and trial season is well under way, Show and Trial Secretaries would be well advised to see that their returns are in to the CKC office in the prescribed time. Otherwise the CKC will, no matter how reluctant they are to do so, be forced to withhold the date fee. The rules state: The Secretary or Show Secretary of the club holding a show held under these rules shall, within ten days after the last day of the show, send the following to The Canadian Ken-

(a) a catalogue marked with the winnings made in all classes, groups, etc. and also all absentees; (b) an unmarked catalogue; (c) all entry forms; (d) all judges' books; (e) the list of suspended persons as provided by The Canadian Kennel Club; (f) any other information or reports as may be required by The Canadian Kennel Club.

Section 2 of the same chapter: The Canadian Kennel Club may require a showgiving club to provide a report of any matter or matters connected with its show. This must be made within two weeks of the date on which the club receives request for such report.

Section 3: The show-giving club is responsible for the collection of all recording and listing fees, and all such fees shall be remitted to The Canadian Kennel Club within ten days after the closing of the show.

Of All Things Department

The natural sound of a wild dog is a howl — not a bark. Barking is an acquired form of canine civilization.

It has long been said that the ratio of human life to a dog's is seven years to one. But consider this: a canine is capable of reproduction at 12 months (if not earlier) and a seven-year-old human is not. In development a year-old dog corresponds with that of a 16-year-old person; a two-year old dog to a young man or woman of 24 years and a three-year-old dog to a human being of 30 years. A dog four years of age compares to a human of 35. From the age of four years, every subsequent year of a canine's life is equal to five years of a human life.

Dog shows are not as old a function as one might believe. The first ever held in England was in 1859 at Newcastle-on-Tyne. The first dog show held in North America took place in Chicago June 4, 1874. The total entry of 21 was entirely composed of bird dogs. About a fortnight later plans were made to hold a show at Oswego, N.Y. This was promptly cancelled, as the total entry of three dogs provided little competition.
