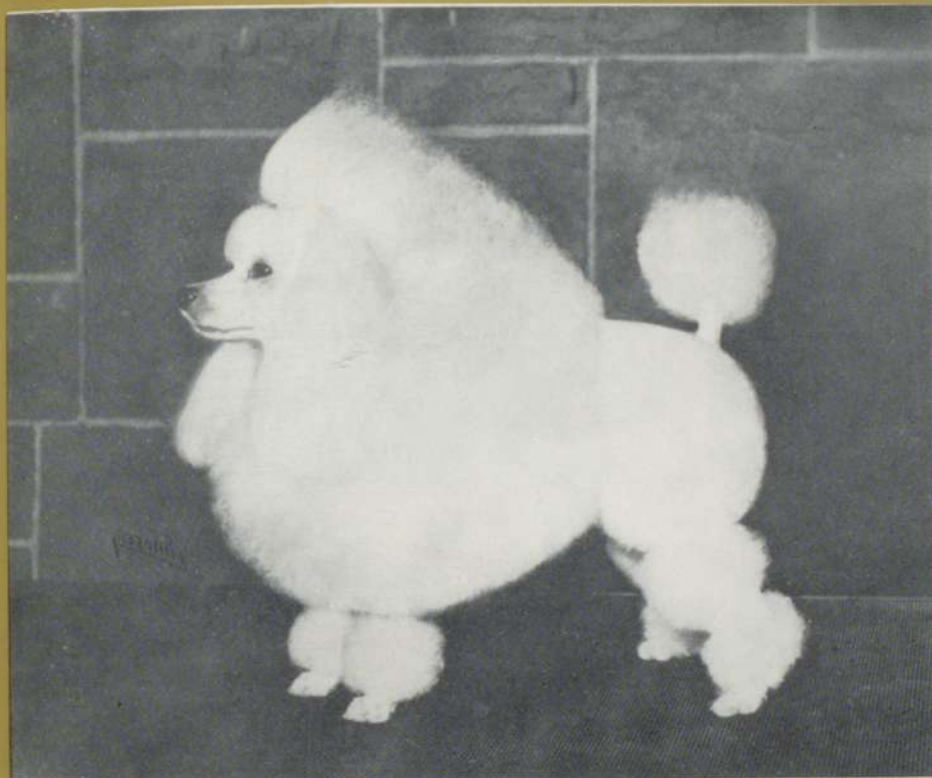

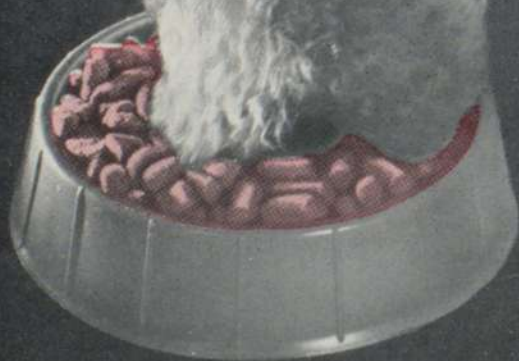

more on the samoyed

... I have been asked by the Committee of the Int. Samoyed Society to answer Mrs. Ellen Weltzin's letter ... in your December issue. I am enclosing a copy of our club pamphlet on the history of the Samoyed ... The Samoyed was primarily bred and used by the Samoyed people as a herding dog, although used in several Arctic expeditions, which proves they are a versatile breed with plenty of heart and stamina. Their build, as all three Standards (Eng. Am. Can.) call for, is not the build of a speedy racing dog like the Siberian but rather more of a blocky (bear) type, yet not heavy or clumsy. A sled dog is any breed or type that will pull in harness.

Any dog should be well balanced with every part in proportion — bone, feet, length of leg, head and body structure and *all standards* call for soundness! The size (in all three countries mentioned) is very similar with perhaps an inch or an inch and a half difference. The general *type* is the same. Type and soundness are very hard to separate. Each is little without the other. As time changes, so do the faults in a breed and it's the main fault of the time, that breeders should watch and try to improve. Everyone interprets the Standard a little differently and few breeders agree on one dog. An "all rounder" will usually take the overall picture.

... For the past 15 years I have been a Samoyed fancier and now as a Director of the newly formed International Samoyed Society I personally do not believe there is a case for the larger Samoyed. We need a larger Samoyed like a larger St. Bernard. If it is a huge white dog these people want then let them go get a Pyrenees Mountain Dog. No offence meant.

The Standard calls for Samoyed dogs to reach 22" and where the United States calls for bigger Sams in their Standard it is most gratifying to learn that many reputable breeders in the United States are seriously considering revising their Standard to 22" where it should be. Usually a large Sam is clumsy. Let us bear in mind the purpose of the Samoyed ... not to race and not to pull a sled, only when necessary — but to herd and guard reindeer and to guard the Samoyed children from wild animals. I am also very pleased to see Canadian Samoyeds taking the breed at US shows over huge hulks, lumbering around the ring. Please let it be known that according to all responsible sources it was the Reindeer that pulled the sleds and not the Samoyeds.

... here is a picture and story ... that shows Sams are still basically "work" dogs. The dog team pictured are all bench champions ... what the picture doesn't show is that during the recent cold spell these dogs

kept our house heated. Neither car nor the oil truck could get up quarter mile hill, so we rolled a gal. drum to a spot where delivery could be made ... we got two gal. drums which, when



weighed 50 lb. each and twice a day the dogs would haul these full drums to the house ... carried groceries, logs, etc. At the time of writing had done this faithfully every day for two weeks which may not seem much but consider: 1) the dogs were trained to harness, let alone to work. 2) They were not gradually conditioned to this sudden hard work. 3) Ch. Tracker is 12 years old and still pulls like a d ...; Ch. Nichi is be seven this spring and has never pulled anything more than the twig that gets caught in his fur; Kicha is a young two year old ... thoroughly soft.

FROM THE EDITOR

It could be Canada, the United States, England, or anywhere. Any place where dogs and pets have been beloved companions whose joyous barks, meows and chirps are no longer heard. The silent mourners stand with bowed heads before a tiny plot with its small cross or headstone. They try to control a sob or a tear — the last thing they can do for their small friend.

Burial of pets in special cemeteries, at which people once looked askance, has become a very much accepted custom. In fact, the animal burial business operated by the Canine Defence League near Bushey, Herfordshire, England, finds it necessary to expand.

Before long the League will open a four-acre, 7,000-grave cemetery with its own up-to-date crematorium, valued at nearly \$15,000. A Garden of Rest will become a beautiful place with acres of landscaped lawns and rose trees. A full-time caretaker is employed, a local undertaker is busy making tiny coffins, (some are silk-lined) and a London stonemason is producing headstones especially for animals.

Superintendent Frank Pettit states that while numerous requests have been received, services are not held.

About a year ago Mr. Pettit accepted the request of an elderly widow to bury Jimmy, her pet tortoise. The cost of the burial is not large, but to some people it represents quite a bit. These are permitted to pay on a weekly instalment basis. Some pet lovers have arranged with local florists to maintain fresh flowers on the grave. Reports Mr. Pettit wryly: "You al-

ways find that the graves are better tended than they are in most human cemeteries."

People from many miles, even so far from the States, make pilgrimages in respect to their small friends buried at Sky Hills Pet Cemetery at Guelph, Ont.

Shortly after Dr. Secord buried one of his own favorite dogs on his farm property, the wife of a veterinarian who had to return to England could not bear the thought of carelessness of her beautiful black Ch. Smokey, who had had to be put to sleep. Dr. Secord offered to bury him near his own dog. From time to time friends would make a similar request. About ten years ago, recognizing a great need for a proper burial place for pets, he decided to expand the burial grounds to the public.

Today Sky Hills is now the final resting place for over 3,000 pets.

. . . May I present a few opinions on the Samoyed breed? I refer in particular to the letter from Mrs. Weltzin and the article under Breed Notes from Mrs. Vera Johnson. Both of these ladies reside in British Columbia where they import quite a few American dogs and attend quite a few American shows. Their interest in size is therefore understandable, but I would like to point out a few inaccuracies in their statements.

Mrs. Johnson says 'we Canadians have a breed standard which varies considerably from that of our friends across the border'. Not so! True, it is much shorter and does not go into detail like the American one but when it is all boiled down there remains only the difference in size. Again I refer to Mrs. Johnson where she says 'this presents many problems for our judges'. Why?

Once more, referring to this article, she says 'we welcome U.S. competition but we cannot expect it if our standards are so different'. Is she actually saying that we should change our Standard just to encourage American entries? Surely this is not the purpose of a Standard.

It was in 1959 that our present Standard was adopted and I do not believe that after this length of time any judge, worthy of the name, does not know that the United States is the ONLY country in the world whose standard is not the same as ours. Now just which country should conform? I repeat, OUR standard is the same as every other country in the world, with the exception of one. The Americans saw fit to alter theirs but the majority of breeders and owners over here did not agree that change necessarily meant improvement. I know that many American breeders, outside of the Western area, were most unhappy with the change in their standard and seemed unable to understand just how it all came about. Our standard was compiled and approved by the CKC only after as many breeders and owners as possible in Canada could be contacted and asked to reply to a questionnaire which asked them — 'which is your desire: The English standard, the American standard or a combination of both?' If the latter, they were asked to make known what they would like to have incorporated. The majority voted to retain the English standard, with a few minor changes. This no doubt was before Mrs. Johnson was interested in Sams.

There has always been controversy over the use of Sams as sled dogs. My personal belief is that for pleasure driving, their use as sled dogs is

remarkable but they are not the dog for racing or draft work. In this the Husky and the Malamute are both superior. In the far north, where they really depend on their dogs for everything, you find few purebreds of any breed but a mixture of many, depending on the terrain in which they are to be used. This makes sense! In country where heavy snowfalls abound they need a longer-legged animal but in bush country where the team must go along narrow trails the smaller dogs are much better. Also, size does not necessarily mean strength or endurance. There is that thing called 'heart' which means more than either. Many a large, heavy-boned dog finishes up riding the sled while his much smaller team-mates are still pulling their hearts out and continue to do so as long as this effort is asked of them.

It would seem to me that instead of crying for a change in our Standard (which, I repeat, is the same the world over with the exception of one country), it would be a much more worthwhile thing for these breeders and exhibitors to band together in an effort to UPHOLD their Standard before the world and to impress on all judges that we do have our own Standard which we would like them to adhere to. I agree that there are many other grievous faults that the judges seem to be overlooking but somehow these faults do not seem to cause the concern that the question of 'size' seems to trigger. A little over or under size is of no concern to anyone; it is the Samoyed who stands head and shoulders above all the others, a truly magnificent animal, but NOT A SAMOYED. This animal is the one that should be severely penalized. For when a dog stands several inches higher than the Standard allows, it means he is much larger overall, heavier-boned, heavier-muscled, and unfit to be a Champion of the breed, no matter how beautiful he may appear as a dog.

My own feeling regarding the original use of our breed is that they were primarily a herding animal. Now a herding animal must, firstly, be fleet and graceful, for how else could he keep up with and control the herds of reindeer which were left in his care? They must also be able to defend their charges in case of attack by other animals. This the original Samoyed could, and would, do and to this day most of our seemingly gentle creatures can defend to the death where anything precious to him is attacked. They were used as a sled animal if the necessity arose and could well serve in this capacity but this was not their primary purpose. Thus, an overly large, heavy-boned and heavily-muscled animal would be completely unfit for his main purpose in life.

Our purpose in having the Canadian Standard approved by the CKC was NOT to make it easier to com-

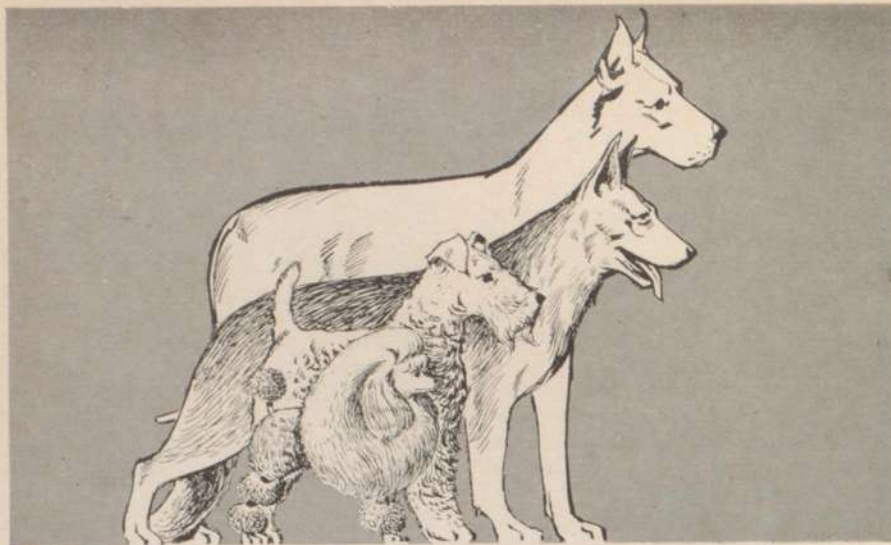

pete in the States or under American Judges or even to encourage competitors from our neighbour country to come up here; this is not a job for a breed club! Our purpose was to try and preserve the breed, as much as possible, in the image of the original imports...

... It is with pleasure I read the letter by Mrs. Ellen Weltzin under the above heading in *Dogs* in the December issue. I have felt very strongly in favour of the larger Samoyed ever since the present standard was adopted. I feel that the present trend in show rings is towards the smaller and finer-boned specimen who is not representative of the Samoyed as a working dog. Indeed, I feel the small, fine-boned Samoyed does not warrant a place in the Working Group.

I write from experience as for quite a number of years now I have worked Samoyeds as sled dogs in the Rocky Mountains in Alberta, also my lead dog and another large Sammy as pack dogs, all under practical field conditions where they have rough going breaking trail and traversing rough and wooded terrain, often in very deep snow. It takes the large Sammy to do this... having worked both large and small Sams, the small ones just can't produce.

My lead dog stands 23 $\frac{3}{4}$ " with beautiful blocky conformation and heavy bone, straight legs and well set hocks — my idea of a practical working Sam. This dog has been shown, yes and taken BB in Working Dog Association Shows; then again I had a judge tell me I should not show him as he was too big!

Our Standard should dwell mainly on conformation, heavy bone, thick heavy coat, well sprung ribs, straight legs, well set hocks, not too straight pasterns with the resulting promise of stamina and capability for his work — a working dog. The Samoyed is of Arctic origin where his people expected him to work for his place in the scheme of life; for them he was their companion, herd dog and means of transportation as well as contributing to their material comforts. As I see it this would indicate an intelligent, sturdy, blocky active dog with a heavy coat to withstand the rigors of his native environment... the small, fine-boned, silky-coated Sammy, however beautiful, is not what he should be — a truly working dog. Let's return to a standard more in keeping with our favorite working dog — the Sammy.

I work my Samoyeds together with St. Bernards — the Sams as lead and point dogs — small, fine-boned Sams would look ridiculous.

... I find it difficult to believe that this lady (Mrs. Weltzin) has a thor-

ough knowledge of the Samoyed breed Standard . . . True, the Samoyed is a working dog . . . he was not originally a sled puller. He was used as a herder, a shepherd type dog for herding Reindeer, fighting wolves and Polar Bear. He should not be of fine bone.

The American Standard is the only one that I know of that has allowed for a bigger, heavier Sam (which is not right in my opinion). It appears that we changed the Standard to fit the breeding.

(re your question — how many have seen a dog sled race? Is it the small dogs that win?) First remember the Samoyed is not a sled dog . . . re size, please check the size of the Siberian Husky. Just because I saw German Shepherds and Irish Setters pulling a sled does not make them sled dogs, and I saw this on TV.

Mrs. W. states: "I think it is time more confidence was put in our judges." I was at a show, the only Samoyed entered — after the judging I asked the judge if my bitch wasn't too big. His reply was no, Samoyeds are a working dog aren't they? I ask you, Mrs. W., isn't the Shetland Sheepdog and the Corgi from the Working Group? England has the original Standard. They brought the breed out of Russia and found what was being bred and formulated a Standard that was reproducing Sams very similar to the original import.

Size, as well as the other items you mention, plus poor temperament, coat, eye color, are all bad for the breed . . .

"Well, at least," said the Old Timer, "they've got a good argument to advance."

He'd invited me over to look at a new dog he'd brought out from England but when I got there I found him in the middle of removing old varnish from crates and sanding them down in preparation for the 1965 show season. So I'd been hooked and when he decided to call it a day I was completely satisfied.

"Who's got a good argument and with whom and what about?" I asked.

"Ever read the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors of the CKC?" he asked.

I told him I did occasionally.

"Well, if you'd read them you'd know what's going on," he said. "But I was talking about the request of the Victoria club to the Board suggesting that the Board take action to have the American Kennel Club recognize Canadian judges in the same way we recognize judges approved in the United States."

"If you hold your breath until that happens you're going to be pretty blue in the face," I suggested.

"I agree, if you're thinking in terms of the old days, when anybody asked to judge in Canada was automatically licensed," said the Old Timer, "but our system of approving judges today in Canada is much tougher than the system in the States."

"Tell me more," I prodded.

"Well, as you know I hold licenses in both countries," the Old Timer said. "So let's compare the system in the States with the system in Canada today. First of all, the initial steps are practically identical. There must be an application to judge and in both countries the would-be judge must establish sufficient background in dogs to indicate that he has the necessary experience. If that is established both countries require a written exam. From this point on the Canadian system, in my opinion, is the tougher."

"In what way?" I asked.

"Well, let's look at the written exam. Under the United States system the applicant writes the exam in his own home or his office or any place he chooses. He is not under supervision. He has access to the book of standards and other reference works. In the Canadian system he

writes his exam under supervision. He has no access to any reference book and must answer the questions from his own knowledge of the breeds."

"Now let's take the next step. In the States, if an applicant passes the written test, he is required to apprentice at three shows. In Canada, however, there is an intermediate step. This is an oral exam. The candidate appears before a board of examiners composed of people who know the breeds he is applying to judge. He is usually questioned closely, not only on the standard but on things that breeders would expect him to know about their breed. And believe me, those sessions can be tough. In the United States system there is no counterpart for the Canadian oral examination."

"Let's assume that the applicant passes these two stages successfully," I said, "what happens next?"

"In the States, when the applicant gets his first assignment his work is watched and if he appears competent he becomes a licensed judge. In Canada, if the applicant passes the oral examination he may or may not be asked to apprentice at one or more shows. In any event he is approved for one show only and again his work is watched by a panel who submit a report to the CKC. In addition he himself must provide the CKC with a written critique of his major winners and it is not until he has passed all these tests that final approval is given and that he goes on the CKC list of persons eligible for approval."

"No, I think our tests are tougher. Perhaps we don't have as strong an argument for reciprocal recognition of judges who were qualified before the present procedure was adopted, except for the fact that the majority of these are old timers in the dog game with years of experience behind them. But our new judges, qualified under this new system, in my opinion have passed tests that warrant recognition in any country in the world."

"If the CKC assembles its arguments, if it outlines fully the tests Canadian judges now have to pass and if it goes to the American Kennel Club with its case well documented it would seem to me there might be a chance. Certainly The Canadian Kennel Club has a strong case to present."

SPANIELS

IN THE FIELD



George Tabner, a well-known breeder and exhibitor of Springer Spaniels in both show and trial, is a firm believer that show Springers must also be able to give good account of themselves in the field. He is President of the English Springer Spaniel Club of Canada and sparked the establishment of Ontario's only Spaniel Specialty Show for all Spaniels.

George Webster is in a rut, but what a wonderful one in which to be. The United States National Amateur All Age Championship Stake, for Spaniels, has been held just twice. George has owned and handled the winning dog each time.

1964 U.S. National Amateur All Age Fld. Tr. Ch. Denalisun Flo Sam — sired by 1962 Nat. F.T. Ch. Kansan ex F-an- w- inc was bred by R. E. French, and whelped October 1962. Satan, as he is called, won the trial held at Burlington, Wis. by the English Springer Spaniel Field Trial Association in November. His other wins in 1964 are as follows: 1st place Amateur All Age Stake at Cincinnati English Springer Spaniel F.T. Club trial; 2nd at the Central Ontario Spaniel Club Open All Age Stake; three 2nd places and one 4th at other U.S. Amateur Stakes.

One more successful year, and the silverware offered for the U.S. Amateur Championship will be retired to the Webster mantelpiece permanently.

1963 U.S. Am. Nat. F.T. Ch. Pam's Aphrodites Of Camden was campaigned, with one exception, in Open All Age Stakes last year. In this much tougher competition, against top professional handlers, "Pusher" still held his own. He finished his U.S. Open title by winning 1st places at Bushy Hill Connecticut and Cincinnati, Ohio trials. He was 1st in the Sudbury and District K. C. and Central Ontario Spaniel Club Open All Age Stakes for his Canadian title. Both these titles were won at two and a half years of age.

George ran Pusher at the U.S. Open All Age National Trial in California in 1964. He was one of the few, of 50 entries, to complete all seven series; but did not place.

George's English Cocker, U.S. F. T. Ch. Windfall Beth, added her share by winning the CINAR trophy for the Cocker winning the most points at Eastern USA. Beth was only entered in the three trials and won first at each.

The other half of the partnership, Ted Haggis, handled U.S. F. T. Ch. Sam Dooley through all series at the same National Amateur Stakes, to be one of 45 starters to finish. Dooley was first at the Central Ontario

Spaniel Club Open Stake, held near Toronto last spring.

Ted's Sulphur Creek Dottie, while still a puppy, had two Puppy and one Limit Stake wins. She placed 1st at two U.S. Amateur All Age Stakes and received one 4th place in three trials entered to complete her Amateur Champion title. It was my pleasure to see her run to third place at the English Springer Spaniel Club of Michigan trial in the Open. She is not yet two years old but has what it takes to go a long way, with more age and experience.

So, while the quality of Canadian field trial dogs is at a new high, the quantity of trials held is on the decrease. Only two clubs in Ontario and one in Nova Scotia held the Spaniel trials in 1964. I have no first hand reports of the Nova Scotian trial. The breedings are familiar though, as we have seen many of similar lines at the local trials.

The American "Working Certificates" requirements have been revised, so that those Springers passing their new "Excellence Tests" have completed requirements similar to those which I proposed to the CKC some four years ago. Surely, soon, some others in Canada will lose their fears, then we may have set up test procedures for Spaniels to prove their natural ability.

Every now and then I get an enquiry asking how to teach a Springer to work in the field for hunting. My own personal opinion is that any Springer which has to be taught to work is not worth the effort. We let a young dog watch an older one hunt, flush and retrieve a couple of times; then give him a try and there is seldom a failure. These dogs will willingly retrieve every time if rewarded with a few words of praise when a good retrieve to hand is made, unlike those "force trained". Let your young dogs follow along on a lead, held by a helper; close enough to see, but far enough behind the guns not to be spooked. They soon get the urge to do what they have seen the other dog doing, because it is fun and it pleases their master.

"DO HUNTERS DESERVE DOGS?"

Not everybody has a dog that should have one. Thousands of men and a few women who shoot birds, do so without the help and assistance of trained gun dogs. As a result, countless thousands, even millions, of birds are shot, wounded or crippled and are not recovered. This is not fantasy but fact. Anyone who has any experience of the sport of bird shooting knows this to be true. Experts such as Frank Kortright know that the real picture is pretty grim. In an excellent pamphlet published by the Canadian National Sportsmen's Show, Mr. Kortright, who, incidentally, is the President of the Show and author of the magnificent book "The Ducks, Geese and Swans of North America" writes as follows:

"Many competent authorities estimate that for every duck brought to bag, there is at least one other that has been wounded and escaped (and which later may die) or has been killed and lost through falling into places inaccessible to the gunner. Even by cutting this estimate in half, the loss from these causes may amount to 15 million ducks annually in North America. 15 millions! This writer is convinced that 15 millions is a minimum figure, but whether the loss amounts to 10, 15 or 20 million ducks, it is ghastly to contemplate.

(The number of upland game birds that are lost in a similar manner also reaches a staggering total).

This tragic waste is the direct responsibility of the wildfowler. It is all the more deplorable because to a great extent it can be avoided. A large proportion of these 15 million ducks can be saved...

Finally take your trained retriever when you go shooting or arrange that some one in your party has one with him. And make sure your dog is well trained and proficient. A poorly trained retriever is only a degree better than no dog at all. The 15 million ducks, plus upland game birds that are lost annually, are largely lost by gunners who do not use retrievers. The gunner who employs a retriever

is doing much to avoid this dreadful waste... The use of trained retrievers in wildfowling and upland game shooting is so vital a conservation measure that it is to be hoped the practice will some day become mandatory in North America, or at least as generally practiced as it is by the more conservation-minded Europeans. Everything that can be done to train more retrievers and to interest more gunners in their use should be vigorously undertaken".

Personally I agree with Mr. Kortright. I know of very few responsible men who disagree. But I do know of one. He is Dr. T. K. Bourns of London, a biologist at Western University, a dog breeder and a contributor to *Dogs in Canada*.

Dr. Bourns, in disagreeing with a suggestion made in this column some months ago that every bird shooter should be required by law to be accompanied by a trained retriever, argued that many hunters simply aren't fit and proper people to have dogs and that if such a law was ever enacted many dogs would suffer as a result.

At the time I didn't agree with Ken Bourns. But after my experience in the last few months, I'm beginning to change my mind.

Consider some of the reports that have come to the attention of the Ontario Humane Society during the recent hunting season.

Four well known and responsible Toronto sportsmen paid their entrance fee to the Provincial Government operated shooting preserve at Presqu'ile Park. The party was one of the restricted number allowed into the Park that day. The routine is simple. Hunters line up outside the entrance to the Park. At the appropriate time (generally 8 a.m.) the office opens and the first hunters in the line are allowed through. Before passing through, their hunting licences are checked and withdrawn. They are held until the hunters return to the office at the end of their hunt. Other details are taken down by the Game Warden, including whether or not they are accompanied by dogs.

On the particular day in question, the Toronto party decided to hunt an area that looked promising for pheasants.

Before they had gone very far, a party of hunters ran in front of them and began to shoot wildly at anything which moved or flew! These men were accompanied by dogs, two Pointers and a Brittany Spaniel. The first party, naturally annoyed by this glaring example of bad behaviour, decided to give them a wide berth and allowed them to get well ahead. Eventually they followed the same general route. There isn't much choice at Presqu'ile Park.

Whilst waiting for the "wild ones" to get clear of them, the first party heard a fair amount of shooting, far too much for the normal amount of

THE SECRETARY'S PAGE

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club was held in the Club's offices, Toronto, on January 9, 1965, with Mrs. Pamela B. Mack in the Chair, and the following members of the Board present: Walter Brown, Mrs. Edna I. Joel, Wm. McDerment, George A. Mehlenbacher, W. J. Monaghan. The meeting commenced at 9:30 a.m. and adjourned at 6:40 p.m.

There follows a summary of business transacted at the meeting.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FIRST NINE MONTHS (1964)

The Board received the financial statements for the nine months ended September 30, 1964, a copy of these statements having been forwarded to each member of the Board, the statements having also been published in the official magazine for the information of members.

Mr. Monaghan pointed out that a comparison of the costs for traveling expenses as shown in the statements for the first six months and the statements for the nine months' period indicated that the cost of the semi-annual meeting of the Board was in excess of \$5,900. He expressed the opinion that this amount was not well spent, stated that he would like to see a decision to forgo the holding of a semi-annual meeting in 1965 with the estimated cost of such meeting to be devoted to furthering some of the objects of the Club, and gave notice that at the annual meeting of the Board he would propose that no semi-annual meeting of the Board be held in 1965.

REGISTRATION, STUD BOOKS AND RELATED MATTERS

KENNEL NAMES

The Board received the reports dated December 3rd and 28th, arising out of meetings of the Kennel Names Committee, these reports dealing for the most part with the Committee's recommendations to the Board on applications for registration of kennel names and any objections which had been received following publication of notice regarding receipt of such applications. The Board approved the Committee's recommendations as set out in these reports.

The Board considered an inquiry received from a Canadian breeder whose registered kennel name was being used by a breeder in the United States in registering dogs of a different breed with The American Kennel Club. After discussion it was agreed that the understanding between The American Kennel Club and The Canadian Kennel Club did not cover the situation, and no action could be taken which would prohibit the use of the kennel name in the United States.

- authorized the recording of transfer of ownership of the Wire Fox Terrier LADY CINDERELLA GENZ (554227) from the name of Horst Detlev Genz, Toronto, Ontario, to Mr. & Mrs. Horst Fischer, Downsview, Ontario; date of transfer, September 3, 1964; (RC-301)

The report of decisions of the Registration Committee was received and it was ordered that the report be included in the minutes.

The Secretary referred to items (11) and (12) in the foregoing report and reported on the reaction of The American Kennel Club to the inquiry dispatched to them, by an order of the Board, regarding the possible registration in the Club's records of Cavalier King Charles Spaniels imported from the United States, litters whelped in Canada sired by American-owned Cavalier King Charles Spaniels, and Cavalier King Charles Spaniels owned by residents of the United States who wished to exhibit their dogs at Canadian championship shows and trials.

It was agreed that the Secretary would forward to each member of the Board a copy of the reply received from The American Kennel Club.

The Board received and considered a report received through the Club's solicitor from the Quebec Provincial Police following their investigation of an alleged case of forgery in connection with an application for registration of litter, and decided that this matter would be placed on the agenda of the annual meeting of the Board, by which time it is anticipated that the Attorney General of Quebec would have decided whether or not to institute proceedings against the person believed to be responsible for the alleged forgery.

DOG SHOWS

SHOW JUDGES

It was agreed that the agenda of the coming annual meeting of the Board would include provision for the Board to review the prepared list of persons eligible for approval to judge at championship shows held under the Club's rules, having regard for the provisions of Chapter 8, Section 4, of the Dog Show Rules, and the fact that a number of those listed at present no longer reside in Canada.

DATES

It was agreed that the agenda of the coming annual meeting of the Board would include provision for the Board to review its present policy of requiring a club wishing to hold a show or trial under the Club's rules to submit a copy of its Constitution, the review being intended to clarify the purpose for requiring such a copy and any action which would be taken on a copy of the club's Constitution when received by the Secretary.

INTERNAL AND ADMINISTRATION

MANAGEMENT SURVEY

It was reported that a Special Committee, appointed by the Board for the purpose, had engaged the firm of Warnock Hersey Management Consultants Ltd., with head office in Toronto, to conduct a survey of the operation and management of the Club, under terms of reference set by the Committee.

It was decided that the report of the management survey would be forwarded under confidential cover to each member of the Board, and the subject would be included on the agenda of the coming annual meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETINGS

Pursuant to the requirements of Article X, Section 2 of the Club's By-laws, the Board decided that a regular meeting of the Board would be held, if necessary, on each of the following dates: February 19th, March 1st, April 16th, May 14th, June 11th, July 16th, August 20th, September 17th, October 1st, November 12th, December 10th.

SALES TAX ON DOG FOOD

The Board decided on the representation which would be made in connection with a reported 11% sales tax on dry dog foods effective January 1, 1965.

SIGNING OFFICERS FOR CHEQUES

It was pointed out that under a policy established by the Board all cheques must be signed by the President, or the Vice-President, or the Second Vice-President and the Secretary. However, a difficulty occurs when none of these officers are present at a Board meeting and cheques cannot be issued in payment of travelling expenses. It was decided that, pending a review of this question at the coming annual meeting of the Board, Mr. Walter Brown would be an additional signing officer.

(Explanatory notes: Commencing in 1951 adjustments were made in the rates on which the Club was charged with certain items. For example, in 1950 and previous years the Club was charged one full operational item for each notice of transfer of ownership which the Live Stock Records Office sent to the Secretary, but in 1951 the charge was decreased to 1/4 item per notice; thus, while there were 3,644 transfer notices in 1951, we were charged with 911 operational items. The charge for such notices was decreased to 1/6 item in 1953. The Club is charged at the rate of 1/2 operational item for each re-issued certificate of registration. The Secretary is provided with a carbon copy of each certificate issued for dogs individually registered in the Club's records. Previous to 1953 the charge was 1/4 item for each such copy; but this charge was decreased to 1/6 item in 1953. Previous to 1955 the Club was charged 1/3 item for recording an agreement re conditional sale of a dog; this was changed to 1/2 item in 1955. Each extended pedigree issued by the Records Office is charged to the Club at 2 items. Commencing with 1958 the Club was charged at the rate of 1/2 item for each Import Certificate issued by the Records Office. The issuance of litter kits commenced in 1959 and the Club was charged at the rate of 1/6 item for each such kit in addition to 1 item for the litter certificate included in the litter kit. The additional charge to the Club for the issuance of a litter kit was reduced from 1/6 item to 1/10 item in 1960. Previous to 1955 the Club was charged at the rate of two items for the posting of a title on the records at Ottawa; this was reduced to 1 item in 1955. In 1960 the charge for Secretary's duplicate copy of registrations was reduced from 1/6 item to 1/10 item; however, the Club ceased to obtain these copies, and also Secretary's transfer copies in March, 1960, hence a considerable reduction in the number of these items charged against the Club in 1960).

Of the total for telephone costs, the cost of regular service (two lines, four extensions, intercom.) totals \$801. The balance (\$405) is for long distance calls, over half of this being for calls to and from members of the Board.

Ref. No. 19 - Meeting (except travelling) expenses.

Of the total shown (\$993) the cost of the luncheon served in conjunction with and rental of the room for the annual general meeting amounted to \$413. The cost of the verbatim report of the annual general meeting was \$305, the balance of the account being for incidental expenses in connection with meetings of the Board, committees, etc.

HEREDITARY DEFECTS

PART IV. Fourth in a series of five articles from the joint memorandum from the British Veterinary Association and the Kennel Club on hereditary defects in dogs. Next month: Prolonged Soft Palate in Short-Nosed Breeds.

PROGRESSIVE RETINAL ATROPHY

The retina is the lining membrane at the back of the eyeball. It is composed of nerve cells and is sensitive to light. It is equivalent to the photographic film in a camera. Atrophy is a wasting of the cells associated with an impaired function so that in progressive retinal atrophy the dog finally becomes completely blind.

Progressive Retinal Atrophy is often referred to by the initials P.R.A. and is sometimes called night blindness. This is a poor name for the condition as it gives no indication of the eventual total blindness. The name "night blindness" arose as it is often in the evening, or at night, that the owner first notices signs of defective sight.

An early sign is an increase in the size of the pupil (the pupil is the dark centre of the eye). The pupil is dilated in dogs with retinal atrophy and the eye may appear larger. In certain lights a red or green glow may be seen in the eyes. As the condition progresses the dog will bump into objects or lose a ball at play. These signs of poor sight are not obvious when the dog is in familiar surroundings but become more noticeable when the animal is away from its home. Sometimes the dog is described as being short-sighted, however, this is not the case and sooner or later the dog becomes blind. A dog may see in bright daylight for some considerable time and moving objects are also seen quite well until the disease is far advanced. Gun trained dogs may have little difficulty in marking but often overrun a bird before finally retrieving by scent. They may also become lost on returning to a handler who is standing still. Cataract develops after the retinal atrophy in a proportion of cases and the centre of the eye becomes cloudy or milky. This is again noticed by some owners, but operation is of no value as the retina behind the cataract is degenerate and useless. Retinal atrophy does not cause inflammation of the eyes and they do not discharge or weep. Retinal atrophy is a non-painful condition but there is absolutely no treatment.

In the Irish Setter the condition could be diagnosed at an early age, often a few months. This is not the case in all breeds today and an animal

may not show signs until adult and may not go completely blind until late middle age. A few owners whose dogs lose their sight late in life may consider this to be normal. However, these cases should be carefully investigated, and the presence of P.R.A. eliminated if possible before progeny from these dogs are bred. If the blindness is due to P.R.A. the progeny will, of course, be carriers or themselves affected.

Progressive Retinal Atrophy is known to be hereditary in man, in other animals, e.g., rats and mice, and in various breeds of dogs. There are at least two types of Progressive Retinal Atrophy in the dog, both of which are hereditary. The condition has been recorded in a number of breeds but commonly affected today are Miniature and Toy Poodles, Cocker Spaniels, Rough Collies, Border Collies, Labrador Retrievers, and English Springer Spaniels. The first breed to be seriously affected was the Irish Setter and prompt action by the Kennel Club and dog breeders eradicated P.R.A. from this breed. Retinal atrophy is known all over the world, particularly in America, Australia and a number of Continental countries.

CANINE CHARACTERISTICS

By MRS. DENNIS GARDINER

This title is self-explanatory, thus, before describing how it may be accomplished the reason why it is so vitally necessary has been ably explained in a paper written by Professor Dr. E. Seiferle, Director of the Veterinary Institute for Anatomy at the University in Zurich, Switzerland, entitled "The Anatomical Basis of the Science of Judging Dogs". In further correspondence he has given us permission to use any of his material we may find helpful. In quotations you will find excerpts from his paper and correspondence.

"The Science of judging domestic animals is not new; it is founded on specific NORMS, and as far as the horse is concerned, has quite a soundly scientific basis."

"Yet up to date we are scarcely able to talk of an actual science of judging (or breeding) dogs, because at present what we lack is a soundly scientific anatomical fundament which should, as far as possible, be supported by experimental proof."

"Many of the constructional principles of the dog are based on unproved assertions and conceptions taken from the horse and are therefore often irrelevant."

"The most accurate possible know-

sive Retinal Atrophy depends on examination of the eye with an ophthalmoscope. The picture at the back of the eye varies with the type of Progressive Retinal Atrophy present. Briefly, the retina may show narrow blood vessels or the presence of pigment spots. Both these changes indicate atrophy of the retina and ultimate blindness.

We know the method by which this condition is inherited in some breeds, i.e., by a simple recessive factor. An hereditary factor for the defect, called a gene, must have been inherited from both parents in any animal which displays the condition. Something can, therefore, be done by the breeder, apart from test-mating, to control the occurrence and spread of P.R.A. by never using any blind animal for breeding, by realising that every animal which has produced a blind puppy must carry a factor for the defect even though itself possessing normal sight, and will, therefore, pass on the possibility of the condition. Litter-mates of blind puppies will also include some carriers. This method does not entirely banish P.R.A., only the procedure known as test-mating can do this, but it can reduce progressively the number of affected animals by reducing the number of carriers. ■

ledge of the constructional characteristics is certainly fundamental to all serious attempts at judging (or breeding) the dog by external appearances."

"It must be understood that external contours and so the general impression a dog makes on the viewer, depends (apart from the skeleton) first and foremost on the muscles with fat and skin included, and it is necessary to feel the parts, even measure them."

"All dogs are built with the same anatomical principles, but specific breed character is found in the different structural and psychological characteristics."

"Experience has taught us that different basic types tend to arise in each breed, some differing widely in proportion so that the whole appearance of a breed can change at different times and in different places according to the type given preference."

"Moreover since the standard is often laid down in very general or even incorrect terms it is surely important to determine the extent of physiological variation within a breed by the most accurate possible weighing and measuring and comparison

of the resultant figures to achieve an objective NORM of desirable appearance."

RECORD OF CANINE CHARACTERISTICS has been compiled to provide a means of collecting the data necessary for a program of **CANINE REHABILITATION**.

To facilitate the use of the following material, the canine construction has been broken down into 10 basic headings, and subheadings. Where pertinent each of the subheadings is numbered to correspond with the numbers on the various illustrations of the dog, which have been drawn to one-half scale from actual measurements. Each section follows this format.

ANATOMY and MEASURING are learned together. As you measure you learn to feel and see, and thus understand the muscular and skeletal structure.

THE NORM gives the overall picture of the dog in ratio to the height at the withers. The definite breed characteristics are those required in a breed to perform the duties for which it was bred, and thus identify

it from all other breeds. This detailed **NORM condensed**, forms a comprehensive **STANDARD** for quick reference. The **RECORD OF CHARACTERISTICS FORM** is used for charting the measurements and characteristics for each individual dog for posterity. It will be necessary to have a central office for filing these forms along with pedigrees; all breeds ideally. This should be a department in the CKC or AKC, under the guidance of a geneticist. A definite fee would be necessary for the initial filing and set fees in accordance with the amount of information required when looking for a stud, breeding stock, or tracing faults etc.

CONCLUSION — Cattle Graders are experienced and paid to do a job, a goal we must eventually reach if we wish unbiased **RECORDS OF CHARACTERISTICS** for filing. But, once we have trained personnel to carry out this task, we also have the nucleus of a new group of judges for the show ring; bearing in mind that it takes a certain personality and ability as well as knowledge to make a top flight show ring judge. ■

The film, which saluted the nation's veterinarians on the occasion of the American Veterinary Medical Association, won top honors in the special film category for excellence in story line, photography and production. The "Chris" is comparable to the "Oscar" award granted in the movie industry.

Narrated by Burgess Meredith, film, stage and television star, *The Gentle Doctor* depicts the history of veterinary medicine since before the time of Christ to the present day.

Small Meals Vs. One Large Meal

More frequent small meals are recommended by many medical men rather than the many-coursed dinner. Gaines Dog Research Center feels the idea applies to dogs as well.

The theory of a team of Czech researchers who tested 450 healthy men found that those who ate fewer but heavier meals stored more fat than those who ate something every few hours, that they had more fatty materials in their blood and could be prone to heart attacks and other disorders believed linked to a faulty diet.

The Center suggests that dog owners who would like to experiment with more frequent but smaller feedings could do so with the new soft-moist dog food now on the market. No refrigeration is required. In patty form, a portion can be broken off at a time and the remainder replaced in its cellophane packet for later use — a boon for dog shows and travel.

Mrs. Lorna Casgrain's tribute to

BLANCHE SAUNDERS

At 11 p.m. on December 8, the dog world lost one of its truly great: Miss Obedience, Blanche Saunders. I had the privilege of living with and learning under this great lady and so I had the opportunity of knowing first hand her genius, her warm personality, her generosity, patience and sense of humour.

Fame did not make her pompous or snobbish. She gave of her great charm equally to all, regardless of importance or lack of it and she was always herself, completely natural. Her deep love of dogs prompted her to make house-pets of all the Poodles at Carillon Kennels.

One thing that stands out in my mind is her absolute conviction that her methods of training and correction which she had devised were good. Always acknowledging that there is no one way to train a dog, she kept quietly on with her writing and her clinics, proving over and over to all who cared to watch or listen, that Blanche Saunders had indeed earned her title of First Lady of Obedience, North America's top trainer. To watch her work with a dog was to watch perfection in rhythm, perfection in timing and decisiveness; graceful, light on her feet and deceptively strong, her voice ranging from firm demands to squeaky praise, she achieved amazing results while the dog's tail continued to wag.

About 15 years ago Miss Saunders suffered a very bad heart attack, which kept her many months in hospital, flat on her back. Not one to lie

idle, this is when she collaborated with Dr. Cross on the *Standard Book of Dog Care*. No wonder she had that first attack. In her Poodle clipping shop in New York, where I stayed with her, she would be up and clipping at 8 a.m.; lunch consisted of a sandwich in one hand while she continued on her feet clipping with the other and often it was well after six when she finished. In addition she managed to write books and articles, make films, help Louise Branch operate Carillon Kennels (then at Pawling, N.Y.), conduct her training classes, organize Obedience exhibitions, travel to judge trials — not to mention looking after business and domestic affairs.

The great wonder is that she could have carried on the way she did all those subsequent years, with a heart condition: she had to take heart pills daily. Anyone watching her in action at a clinic would marvel at a not-so-young woman putting in such a day, even with a good heart. It is my belief that she knew perfectly well the strain and the risk, but that she deliberately lived as she wanted to, preferring to "wear out" rather than "rust out"; and how wise she was! Blanche Saunders would not have wanted to grow too old to be active, nor to be an invalid.

She went the way she would have wished to go. Addressing a meeting of 300 at the Assn. of Obedience Clubs and Judges in New York, she afterwards gave an hour's clinic that was enthusiastically applauded by an

Afghan Breeding for Temperament

The breed standard states that an Afghan should be "aloof, dignified but gay". Just how is this being interpreted by the present day breeders? An Afghan has two completely different sides to his temperament — the one he shows to strangers and the other he displays in his own home. His approach is very cautious, giving rise to the feeling which many people hold, that it is not a friendly breed. This is far from true. Afghans are not complete extroverts like the Poodle, trying to please every minute of the day, but they have "a great sense of humor and remain mischievous throughout their lives.

Afghans should never show any signs of viciousness, especially as puppies and any breeder should, for the benefit of the breed, put down any dogs displaying this tendency. All too often these types are sold to people as pets by breeders interested in quantity rather than quality, with the result that the breed could get the reputation of being untrustworthy and bad-tempered.

To prevent this, a breeder should investigate thoroughly the background and temperament when selecting a stud. Often a stud is chosen for conformation and coat or because it is a top-winner, without actually coming in contact with the dog. Though, how one is supposed to know a male's temperament from a photograph or hearsay is beyond my comprehension. I think a look at the get he is producing for temperament as well as conformation is a "must" for any sincere breeder.

Basset Topline

Having been asked, as a Basset Hound breeder, to write an article on the Basset topline, I went first to the Standard, then through a rather large file of Basset data, and was dismayed by the fact that there were only two or three words here and there on topline. It seemed logical, therefore,

that one would turn to basic anatomy.

The top-line is the spinal column, which is broken down into five parts. The withers are the first nine thoracic vertebrae and slope from the tip toward the tail. The back is level, and consists of the last four thoracic vertebrae. The loin consists of seven powerful lumbar vertebrae, with a slight convex curve. The croup consists of the sacrum and three to four tail bones and slopes slightly to the tail. The tail is the external vertebra.

The foregoing explains the convex and concave curves of the spinal column (or topline) which is held together by powerful muscles.

In a correctly constructed and balanced Basset, the coordinated mental and physical stimuli causes the expansion and contraction of these muscles to absorb the shock of the gait — giving the apparent appearance of a well pulled together topline, sloping slightly from the tip of the withers to the tail (See Basset Standard "nor does he measure more over the quarters than he does at his shoulder?")

Remembering Happy

This story is a tribute to a little Beagle named Happy and to the fine sportsmanship of Canadian beaglers as they welcomed this hardy victor at the risk of their own dogs' glory.

After 14 years of living and giving, Fd. Ch. (Can. & Am.) Sureplace Happy Boy had to be put to sleep last June by his owner, W. P. Land of Bohnnland Beagles, Memphis, Tenn.

Ten years ago this June Mr. Land took some hounds to handler Dale Sutton, who said he'd like to put a field champion to run with Happy, as a matter of interest. Happy and a small hound with a heavy coat soon had a rabbit going. It was plain Happy had his hands full with his companion. When it was discovered that Fd. Ch.

Suttons Rover was 12 years old, Land whistled and hoped old Happy would be in such condition at the same age. And he was. He won the Mississippi Delta BC championship at exactly 12 years.

At that time Beagle fancier, journalist-editor Al Holcomb had Fish Creek Nancy, a hard-going hare hound whom he was running regularly. He asked if he could take Happy along as well to the North Creek and Black River hare trials.

A great controversy was raging. "A hare was no good for brace and a brace hound lacked stamina for hare trials." Land felt that a good hound could win either. Al discussed the matter of opposition with the two trial secretaries. Both replied that "if Land had guts enough to send his brace champion they would welcome him." Happy was out of condition, the trials were two weeks away and he had never seen or smelled a hare in his life. Al reluctantly entered him at North Creek where, it is said, the going is the roughest of any hare trial.



Despite the secretaries' welcome, there were many objections to Happy's entry. However, he had shown well, although rated sixth. Al, a seasoned hare judge expressed the feeling that he should have placed no worse than second or third.

That night a long distance call came from New York. It was Dr. Ray Lawson of Montreal, who said he felt Happy was a great little hound and could certainly win in hare trials. Could he take him to Canada? He was sure Canadian beaglers would welcome him.

Dr. Lawson turned over to "that grand beagler, gentleman and sportsman," Lloyd Courtice, of Courtice, Ont. who reported that while he liked the hound, he did not believe he had foot enough for hare trials.

Happy's first Canadian competition was the Central Ontario. He won easily. Peterborough was Happy's next trial, where he placed second, defeated by another champion. He finished his Canadian title easily at the Club Tai-O trial, getting a first and second on cotton tail. Wrote Mr.

Courtice: I have been running in and judging trials for over 25 years and do not get excited unless I see something like Happy... He is a pleasure to handle, a gentleman in the field and the kennel as well."

Wrote Judge George W. Beniston of Cooksville, Ont.: "Happy had guts and heart to spare... Hounds like him are a pleasure to run after and judge."

In appreciation for all that Canadians have done for old Happy, Mr. Land makes this gesture: "I have one of his great sons here, Fd. Ch. Midwestern Futurity Ch. Bohnland Sinbad. I offer his services free to any Canadian who wishes to use him at any time. The only charge will be \$7.50, to take care of the expenses in handling females here and getting them back home."

Fear Permitted in Bloodhounds

The breed Standard states that in temperament the Bloodhound "is somewhat shy". A check in the dictionary leads to alternative meanings such as "more or less timid, to a certain degree easily frightened, partially wanting in courage, showing some fear" to be substituted. Now while the Standard mentions shyness it does not recommend or condemn its presence, but rather accepts it as a basic emotion in the dog. Therefore should a Bloodhound lacking in timidity be penalised in shows, should breeders take steps to retain this feature in future litters?

Some breed Standards most definitely speak out against shyness, disqualification being enforced if it be in evidence, while in the Doberman Pinscher AKC Standard shyness is actually specified as "refusing to stand for examination, shrinking away from the judge, fearing an approach from the rear, shying at sudden or unusual noises to a marked degree".

This leaves the Bloodhound in a unique position where some timidity, shyness or fear is to be expected, even permitted, while no other breed is quite so fortunate. Indeed, it is a serious defect. — G. Brown

The Working Dog Society Educational Nights

To a question concerning several such diseases, Dr. Sorrell replied: "A puppy afflicted with any of these hereditary diseases should have done one of two things, be put to sleep or spayed (neutered) and sold, but most certainly never used for breeding purposes." Dr. Sorrell is Secretary of Vetoscope '63, Secretary of the Toronto Academy of Veterinary Medicine, member of the American Society of Veterinary Radiologists, Speaker of the 1964-1965 Convention of the Ontario Veterinary Association. Three films were shown January 20, with an open discussion conducted by Dr. W. E. Shute following the film on "dog anatomy."

into the departments from their roof-top kennels after closing time.

Defence Vs. Attack

In the November issue of "Shepherd Shorts" Glen Johnson writes on "Defence Work and the Shepherd". In it he shows the difference between a dog trained for attack work as against one schooled for defence. Through questions and answers he deals further with misconceptions of the general public.

Why shouldn't the German Shepherd be encouraged to develop skill in his inherent quality of defence and guard work, he asks, just as the Retrievers' qualities are encouraged and displayed in field trials.

"We here in Canada seem to want to extinguish all of these superior characteristics that no other breed can match."

The Great Dane Front

The Dane, being a "naked" animal, so to speak, makes it nearly impossible to hide any faults he may have. The Standard states that the shoulders should be strong and sloping.

But to what degree? Here the Standard fails in that it does not call for a definite degree of slope or angulation wherever these two are called for. In discussing this point with persons who are much more knowledgeable, all seem to prefer a 45-degree layback of the shoulder blade. Upon reading McDowell Lyon's book, *The Dog in Action*, I find the 45-degree angle to be most appealing, and it seems most suited to the overall conformation of the Dane's front.

If a dog has a natural 45-degree slope to his shoulder blades and the remaining bones in the front assembly are of the desired length and strength, with good strong pasterns, (neither knuckling over nor with a tendency toward weakness or breaking down) ending in good tight feet with deep pads, high well-arched toes, this part of the front quarters will be correct.

However, the shoulders and legs must be accompanied by a well-filled-in forechest not falling away toward each elbow in a shallow "V". The correct width and depth of forechest will be produced by the proper skeletal structure throughout the front, which includes width and depth of ribcage back of the shoulders. If the dog turns his elbows in or out this usually indicates that he is either too narrow or too wide in front. Both these conditions prevent the correct stance which finds the legs dropping in a straight line to the paws.

The underline of the forechest and brisket should be at least as deep as the elbows. Even a little deeper to insure lots of heart and lung room. The slope of the withers which form the highest part of the backline will be governed by the slope and length of the vertebrae which form this part

of the anatomy. These, accompanied with the proper spring of rib, will give a most desirable front, providing all are in balance.

One thing I would like to see changed in the Standard would be to make a strongly protruding sternum a serious fault, instead of a minor one. A dog with this fault is usually wrong throughout his whole front and presents anything but an elegant outline, as in the case of a sway back, which is a very serious fault.

backs, but still retain the wonderful expression.

A few faults creep in, like pop eyes, boot button black instead of dark hazel, too round an eye, and I fear, straight stifles. These little dogs are working terriers and should be able to do a day's work over rough going.

England has an advantage with so many good champion studs within short distances. I am not an advocate of long plane trips for breeding. So many do not hold. I have seen pictures of New Zealand and Australian Cairns. Because of the difficulty of importing they have very much their own type — longer, lower and larger ears. It behooves the breeder to cull and spay those with definite faults.

more popular. His size is ideal for small home or apartment; he fits into any type of place. Canada has some very fine specimens. I have found them in B.C. and Ontario; they will hold their own with the best in U.S. Have noticed bodies a trifle long and a few shy ones, but on the whole we can be proud of those we have. Keep up the good work is my wish to our breeders; watch for type, then balance, soundness, movement and temperament, thus achieving the perfection which you hope to attain.

YORKSHIRE TERRIER

Ontario has been consistent in producing some very fine Yorkies with dark, steel blue coats. In some cases coats have not measured up to the Standard in shade; however I find our breeders consistent towards improvement. We don't see as much of this fine breed as we should. Have

judged a few and find too much shyness is evident with the odd one, but this can be overcome. We still look for that compact body with good topline and not forgetting the rich tan on head and legs.

TOY POODLE

Every Province has exhibited this breed. We find many sizes in the Toys and some have to be measured out. Care should be taken in this regard to avoid embarrassment. Toys properly coated should be the only ones presented. Have had "blown" coats presented and nervous dogs with tails down; this is not good. We must look for the very active, intelligent dog with great elegance, squarely built. If your dog is not in condition keep him at home until he is ready.

ITALIAN GREYHOUND

This breed is not very popular and scarcely do we see one in a show. We have only registered eight this year, thus many of our judges do not have an opportunity to appraise this breed. I can only recall judging two or three in Canada and must say they represented the breed as they ought. There is a tendency to neglect roach and of course this is important in this breed. After all he is a miniature Greyhound and his appearance must show the proper roach with his other attributes rounding out what is called for in the Standard.

JAPANESE SPANIELS

Very few are found in Canada, the majority are in Ontario. I have only had a few presented to me; they seemed average with good bodies and coats, plus good markings. I would like to see more of this breed to give our judges an opportunity for fair appraisal. If I remember correctly, not too many years ago Judge Wm. Kendrick gave a Japanese Spaniel BIS (in Canada).

TOY MANCHESTER TERRIER

We do not see too many Toys, but we do see his counter-part the "Manchester Terrier". The toy must be under 12 pounds. Great care should be placed on head, including eyes, nose and ears, plus proper color, with even distribution of spots as called for most important. Keep him to his weight, thus avoiding the "rundown" appearance in this breed. Watch shoulders, as here again there is a tendency for a "spread", which is a penalty.

The breeds remaining in the Toy Group are The Affenpinscher, Cavalier King Charles Spaniel, English Toy Spaniel, Brussels Griffon, Mexican Hairless.

No Affenpinschers have been registered in 1963 or 1964. No English Toy Spaniels, no Mexican Hairless; the other breeds only a half a dozen registered, and none exhibited under me.

my summation of the breeds written about, nothing has been mentioned as to body soundness. Please remember this is important in all breeds and a judge should pass judgment on bodies as he makes his routine examination; here one is rewarded for his efforts, as we do find weak, flabby bodies, which should definitely be penalized. □

The Knee Joint of the Chihuahua

We noted a weakness in the knee joint and asked two people for their help or ideas. One was Mrs. D. T. Weir, well-known Ontario breeder of Toy Poodles. She gave my husband and I some pretty plain talk as to its cause, probably in the bloodline that I had started in. Dr. Cormack, my veterinarian, showed us a diastical skeleton of a dog and pointed out the knee joint and structure of the hind leg. We watched many shows, noting this failing in numerous dogs. Often the dog walks or gaits well, then limps, then picks up the hurting limb. In some cases this is operated on and a new knee joint made out of present facilities, but this only helps the individual dog, not the cause.

We traced the weakness to a particular bloodline and made several tests with males or females, then disposed of the offender as a pet, pointing out the deficiency. Subsequently we inbred, this tip given by Mrs. Weir, then we outcrossed and then bred back in again. We acquired a new bloodline and tried to improve front and rear. Dr. Cormack, just a few weeks ago, remarked how sound our dogs had become in the hindquarter and that very few dogs, in a wide area, could compare in soundness of structure. I believe the photograph of our Ch. Shillmaine Pocohontos, which appeared on page 59 of the January issue of *Dogs in Canada*, illustrates the progress we have made in establishing a sound hindquarter. This has not been achieved in two years and it has cost many tears and a great deal of expense. A number of breeders of other breeds have remarked at shows how sound the dogs from our kennels are in this respect. This has been very pleasing, to see that the work has been noted. At the last two Canadian shows in Ontario in 1964 my husband drew my attention to two dogs in the ring. We watched, then saw one cringe down and start limping. Shortly after the other did the same. The judge did not notice one being picked up and taken out of the ring. The animal was definitely in pain. It was apparent on the table from the ringside. This knee joint breakdown is very difficult to overcome. Sometimes one almost feels like giving up. If it occurs in larger dogs, it might be somewhat easier to cope with, but I doubt it.

game generally available in the area. Eventually they found one reason for the activity.

They found one of the Pointers and the Spaniel. Both had been shot and killed. Both dogs were still warm. They were two of the three dogs which they had earlier seen in the company of the irresponsible hunters. They never saw that party again.

This type of incident is a common complaint at this time of year. Every Animal Shelter operated by the Humane Society receives numerous complaints of gun dogs being stolen just before and during the shooting season. Many of these dogs are found weeks or even months later in an entirely different area. They have obviously been in the possession of someone since they would have died of neglect otherwise. Dogs, contrary to some people's ideas, cannot fend for themselves.

Stray gun dogs, more than any other breed, are frequently to be found suffering from gunshot wounds. Not a bullet but shot wounds. But not only bird dogs suffer this abuse. Deer hounds are far too often abandoned by their "owners" either during or after a hunt. Certainly many dogs will run until they are lost but not enough to explain the number which find their way to farms and eventually into the Humane Society Shelters. This is especially true of the deer dogs which hunters "rent" for a few days from some kennel.

What an incredible attitude this situation reveals. The only conclusion one can reach is that there are a number, an unknown number of hunters, or perhaps a better description would be "licensed idiots" who really believe that if you want a trained retriever all you have to do is to steal or borrow a black dog, and it will hunt for you — just as easy as that! Or that if you can "find" a Pointer, a Setter or that comparative rarity the Britany Spaniel, that it will work for anyone who chooses to kick it up the backside and "send it on".

Even worse, the facts show beyond all doubt that many of these hooligans have so little feeling for the dogs they buy, beg, borrow or steal, that when they find that the dogs simply won't work under these peculiar conditions, they simply shoot them down in the very fields where they learn the lesson. Others simply turn the dogs loose and abandon them to their own devices. Some return them to the kennel or place where they may have bought them and demand their money back. "It won't hunt for me"! What a bitter

indictment of the term "sportsmen".
Let's be fair. In my experience in
both British Columbia and Ontario it
is not the average Canadian or Brit-
ish immigrant who is guilty of this
abominable behaviour. The nationality
most often involved is the Italian. For
some reason, the average Italian, who
could probably not afford a gun in
Italy, thinks of the shot gun as a
status symbol. He has little idea of
the basic rules of bird shooting, rules
which the Canadian or British shooter
is taught or has learned the "hard"
way. But this, while partially explain-
ing the incredible behaviour of so
many of these so called "sportsmen",
does not excuse it. Nor does it mean
that there is nothing that can be done
about it. To the contrary, this is all
the more reason why those people who
are aware of the problem and are
concerned about the long range ef-
fects should stop "pussy footing"
about and take the action that the
situation demands.

First, the majority of hunters
should realize that unless they act
to have the irresponsible element in
their midst controlled and taught the
error of their ways, that they them-
selves will eventually suffer. The gen-
eral public is fast losing patience with
irresponsible hunters and is demand-
ing more stringent protection. This
will result in more and more land
being posted and increasing hunter
pressure in parks, reserves and open
land.

The only answer is for hunters,
particularly members of Gun Clubs,
to accept the moral responsibility of
reporting all incidents that come to
their attention to the officers of the
Department of Lands and Forests
and, more important, for the organ-
ized Gun Clubs to bring pressure on
the Department to ensure that these
reports are followed up and action
taken.

Secondly, the Department of Lands
and Forests and in particular, the
Fish and Wild Life enforcement offi-
cers, should "crack down" on all in-
fringements. They could start by
making sure that hunters who use
the public shooting areas, made pos-
sible by the people of Ontario, follow
sensible and humane practices such
as giving other hunters courtesy and
consideration; by shooting in range;
and by using and shooting at legal
targets (and not protected birds, song
birds etc.) and also by using trained
dogs that they own and have trained
themselves or, at least, by being ac-
companied by a competent dog and
handler. I realize that some people
simply don't have the opportunity or
the time or the talent to train a gun
dog. But they can hire the services
of a professional handler to "pick up"
for them. The cost would only be a
small part of the overall cost of shoot-
ing.

But perhaps there is a better solu-
tion; perhaps these lunatics who are
capable of shooting dogs in such a

cold blooded way should be found,
prosecuted and, if convicted, pre-
vented from ever shooting again, by
the simple expedient of having their
shooting privilege withdrawn for life.
That would solve the problem. A few
such "examples" and the rest would
learn the lesson very quickly. Any
man who could shoot a dog in cold
blood simply because it wouldn't hunt
for him is not only an idiot but is a
coward in the bargain. And that sort
generally quit if there is any danger
to themselves.

And one thing is for sure: they are
simply not fit to own, possess or have
anything to do with a dog.

A dog is just too good for them. ■
