MORE DOG CONTROL NEEDED

MORE DOG CONTROL NEEDED
...! enjoy reading the letters in Dogs very much. In the July issue Ian Byers suggested readers write in their views on dog control. I have been trying to have something done about stray dogs in this district ... no results. Laws need to be made and enforced by each municipality. When coyotes and timber wolves do a lot of damage, action is taken and bounties put on them. Why not on dogs. From my own experience living on a stock and poultry farm for 50 years, give me coyotes any time to stray dogs. Where coyotes and wolves kill to stay alive, dogs kill for joy. I have suggested to the municipality here to make it compulsory for all dogs in the town or country to be licensed and tattooed, with the number put against the owner's name. Then, if and when a dog is found killing and is shot the owner cannot deny ownership, which they always do. Have a heavy enough fine for all unlicensed dogs, double the license on unspayed females and cross-breds or mongrels. If a man pays a good price for a purebred dog nad will take care of it rather than lose dog and money. In towns where there is a dog pound or shelter, make it illegal to let a female out to anyone but its rightful owner. Have all others destroyed. I know of two farmers here

who went to the nearest dog pound and each got a female of the hound group. These females were left to run loose at all times, raise litters sired by anything. In one case it was a coyote. The pups were given away — result, a pack of roaming, killer mongrels. One attacked a child — seven stitches in its face and marked for life.

Then we have the advertising in papers. This should be cleaned up. Unless an animal is purebred and registered it has no business being advertised as a breed . . one case I know of, a female (part Collie, part mongrel) was running in season with three coyote hounds and one Whippet. Pups were advertised as Collie pups, \$6.00 each. All sold, all turned into good chicken killers. Another ad referred to purebred Pomeranian and Chihuahuas \$25.00. The sire is of one breed, the dam the other. Because the dam and sire are purebred and sold without papers the woman told me she could get the papers at \$5.00 extra and register the pups. I asked her as what! So it goes. Something must be done, but what?

My opīnion on dog auctions is that they are as barbaric as the slave auctions of olden days. As an owner of a registered kennel, I say if we have to come down to this to sell dogs, let's stop breeding them.

FROM THE EDITOR

WHEN children were selected to air their views on a recent Candid Camera show, one little dark-haired boy of about seven or eight proved to be a real champion of dogs. Naturally, he had no idea that he was on television.

His face intent and sincerity glowing in his eyes, he spoke right from

"I believe," he began earnestly, "that dogs should be allowed to vote.

"Why shouldn't dogs be allowed to vote for the President? They could help guard the President and they could help keep the country safe in case of attack.

"Especially German Shepherds. The German Shepherds would watch the White House and guard the President. If anybody got near the President they would scratch their eyes out.

"Why couldn't the German Shepherds and other dogs live at the White House? And there'd be a lot of dogs. I know all the dogs can't live in the White House so they should live in the Capitol. And the White House should have dog food for them."

This boy is obviously madly in love with dogs. In his eyes there is little they could not heroically accomplish. For their contribution to the safety of one's country, he considerately expects that proper canine food would be provided.

We did not catch the name of this grand little boy. But we do hope there are more like him and that they will grow up having the same awareness, the same concern and the wonderfully clearcut ability to express their ideals.

THE RECENT POSTAL STRIKE, which at the time of writing is still being negotiated in Montreal, showed very dramatically the extent to which we are dependent upon one another. This, in one field of communication alone. The feeling at first was almost one of personal injury. The fact that someone in public service would deliberately not fulfill his duties and would cause to be set aside our mail.

Without dwelling on the subject, all of us felt, some more seriously than others, the handicap of not being able to send and receive correspondence.

Some of Dogs' readers will recall a book by Wylie in which all the men suddenly disappeared and women by desperate circumstances had to learn to control (and did) public utilities such as electricity, water and sanitation. The recent experience does cause one to take public services less for

granted.

The irony of it all was that despite mail problems, *Dogs in Canada* was off the press and ready to mail on July 28. Pleased that readers would have their copies earlier, your publishers were disappointed to learn that delivery delays held them up in some cases for nearly a fortnight!

HARRY DEAN, who writes on Setters for the "In the Field" department, remarks on the difficulty of assembling material when the clubs neglect to send him notes about their activities. "Or if they do send them it is merely a repetition of the placements made by the various dogs, information that is already covered in another section of Dogs in Canada. In my opinion the column should contain interesting sidelights of the doings of the various clubs."

Mr. Dean is so right. Some of the field trial people who feel there is insufficient space given to their branch of dogdom are the very folk who could help make this the lively department it should be. It's difficult to believe that nothing ever happens beyond dogs earning placements! December is the next issue carrying the Setter banner. 

"They're not the biggest shows in Canada," said the Old Timer "but the competition is good, the company's pleasant and I enjoyed them."

He was just back after attending a series of shows in the Maritimes and we were sitting, with a cool one in hand, discussing the results. He'd done very well — finished a young dog that needed a few points and had consistent group placings with his specials dog. A Best in Show, however, had eluded him. I knew he had hoped for this before he left, for his champion had a pretty impressive record in the central Canada shows. I decided to kid him about it.

"So you couldn't get your Best in Show," I said "and the average entry only about 150 dogs. Maybe that dog of yours isn't as good as you think he is. Getting a little kennel blind?"

The Old Timer snorted. I knew he was annoyed because if there is one thing he is not it is kennel blind. Indeed he is more critical of his own dogs than of those belonging to other people. I'd been on hand when he'd sold dogs that were not up to his standard. They'd be good typey dogs, but the buyers didn't go away with the idea they'd bought a future champion. They knew the dog's faults as the Old Timer saw them. So, the Old Timer gave me the look he thought I deserved.

"Quantity," he said "doesn't necessarily make a dog show. What point is there to watching a procession of 400 mediocre dogs into the judging ring. I look for quality. And they do have quality on this Maritime circuit. They get a surprising number of American champions entered in the classes. And the Canadians who travel six, seven or eight hundred miles to a dog show don't take along bums. Add to that, the fact that the Maritime people are good breeders - and believe me, even though the shows are small, the wins are not cheap wins, particularly if your dog manages to place in the group.

I knew I'd gone far enough, so I dropped the subject of dogs.

"But they tell me the shows are long — that you get there early and stay late," I suggested.

"True," said the Old Timer "but somehow the shows don't seem long. And I think that's because of the people."

"The people?" I questioned.

"The people," he repeated. "These are dedicated, hard-working dog folks. They don't perhaps have the local dog populations to guarantee show success so they try to make their shows the best possible to attract good outsiders. And they succeed.

"First of all, you're made to feel a welcome guest when you arrive at the show premises. You're not just another exhibitor who has added a dog or so to the entry. They're interested in you and they're interested in your dog. If they haven't the answers to something you want to know they'll find someone who has. In short they're hospitable."

The Old Timer paused and reached for his pipe. He filled it carefully and got it drawing freely.

"You know," he said "I think I have the answer. I don't think those people down east look at a dog show as an opportunity to pick up a point or so towards a championship. Certainly they like to win. But I get the impression they are sincerely interested in seeing how their dogs stack up. I get the impression they are interested in learning.

"They want to talk dogs with you. They want to learn about sires in other parts of the country. And being Maritimers they are interested in politics. And at dog shows it's Kennel Club politics. So though the hours may be long by Central Ontario standards the time passes quickly because the conversation is good and the atmosphere leisurely and friendly."

"So I gather you enjoyed the trip," I commented.

The Old Timer grinned. "I've told you what I think of the dog shows and there's one additional factor — the sea food. It's wonderful. Clam chowder — like nothing out of the cans. Atlantic salmon that's never been introduced to a freezer. And lobster — at the canneries — fresh cooked, three for a dollar. Your taste buds react. I'm going back."

He leaned back. I could almost smell that clam chowder with him. If he goes back I'll plan to be along.

Painless Quill Remover

If your dog should tangle with a porcupine here's a quick and painless method of relieving him of his misery. Pour a few teaspoons of acid vinegar on the quills at periods of every five minutes for about 20 minutes. Wait for 15 minutes, then pour any kind of oil all over the quills, and watch the results. THE COMMAND "COME"!

Too often at training trials Puppy Stakes are interrupted while inexperienced handlers (and some who know better) try to make runaway pups return, or fetch to hand birds they have marked well but stopped to play with on the way in. If a trainer gives his pup an early grounding in coming when called, he has a powerful tool with which to control the pup's return when retrieving.

Maintaining desire to retrieve is so vital that with many young pups the risk should not be taken of associating the slight pressure required to enforce the command come with the joys of retrieving. For this reason early lessons in coming are more safely taught completely apart from retrieving; later on this accomplishment combines with and makes retrieving sessions progress more smoothly.

Puppies of seven weeks come when called to play or eat, and less willingly when obliged to return to their runway after a romp. By three months any Retriever pup can be responding cheerfully to the command come.

The first lessons can be held in the house, garage or any small enclosed area where the puppy cannot escape. Praise and pet him when he obeys, go after him when he doesn't and gently but firmly drag him in by the scruff while repeating the command. Praise him when he arrives. Gradually increase the distance, moving to a fenced yard and eventually to an open field. The three commands, sit, stay and come, go naturally together and can very usefully be taught together as a series. This does not mean, however, that a puppy that will sit and stay for a brief period until called should be expected to be steady at a trial when a bird is thrown for him. As a basis for the steadiness that will be required as he moves into junior competition, it is good practice to begin holding a pup on a slip leash until his bird or dummy hits the ground, rather than letting him break while it is in the air.

Patience and self-control are important in training dogs of any age, and anger or abuse or too much nagging and repression can ruin the very best puppy. It should go without saying that a pup ought never to be

called in and then punished for something else after he has obeyed. Lessons should be short and fun, but once he has learned this command he must not be permitted to ignore it. A few minutes a day will soon teach a pup to come happily and immediately when called. He will thoroughly enjoy the attention of these early lessons, and will be a much better performer when he attends his first trials.

ONTARIO WATERFOWL RESEARCH FOUNDATION

A private non-profit organization formed in 1961 is developing the Niska Waterfowl Research Station on 100 acres 30 miles north of Hamilton.

Hoping to attract \$10,000 in visitor fees each year, to underwrite maintenance, the foundation has opened a section called Kortright Waterfowl Park, in honour of noted conservationist, Frank H. Kortright, president and organizer of the Canadian National Sportsmen's Show, Gate receipts of the show are helping to support the research station.

One of the objectives of the foundation is public education. There are examples of most of the world's geese and most varieties of North American ducks. For those interested in creating a pond or wildfowl habitat there are examples of dams, outlet diversions and water control structures, and advice will be supplied on request.

A. T. Cringen of the Ontario Agricultural College in Guelph is executive director of the foundation. Mr. W. H. Carrick, managing director of the station, is a noted wildlife photographer who filmed Walt Disney's Polar Bears and has done several films for Ducks Unlimited.

Two Retriever men who are trustees are H. V. P. Lewis and Secretary of the National Retriever Club, R. K. Moore, who is chairman of the station management committee.

Niska Waterfowl Research Station and Kortright Park, which are immediately south west of Guelph on the east side of the Speed River, may be reached from Ontario Veterinary College by going west on College Ave., south on Downie Rd., and west at Hanlon's Shell Station on Puslinch Concession Rd. No. 6.

NORTH BAY SPORTMEN'S SHOW

The North Bay and District Retriever Club put on an effective demonstration of Retriever work, helping to acquaint the public with the useful role that trained Retrievers play when used by hunters in cutting down wasteful wildfowl losses.

RETRIEVER CLUB RECOGNIZED BY FLORIDA'S GOVERNOR

Once each year the governor recognizes individuals and organizations that have contributed most to the conservation of wildlife and natural resources of the state.

This year the club honours go to the North Florida Amateur Retriever Club for its effort as an organization in encouraging the use of Retrievers in the hunting field as a direct effort to reduce the crippling loss of waterfowl and upland game birds.

Canadians are said to be the most travelled persons in the world, although they rarely travel inside Canada. Which is probably just as well if they take their pets with them. I suppose everyone who owns one or two pets wrestles with the problem, each and every summer, of whether or not to take their pets on the annual holiday. Sometimes the type of holiday resolves the problem for them. After all it's entirely academic to worry about taking two large horses on a small boat trip. And just in case you might think that no one ever takes horses on their holidays you would be wrong. Quite a few really keen horsemen and women plan their holidays around their horses and take them along in a horse trailer. What more could anyone want than a tent in the back of the wagon, a horse trailer behind and a boat on the top of the car. A sort of built-in mobile holiday

Cats are not the best of animals to travel with. Almost without exception they resent and reject the concept of travel for travel's sake. Travel for a definite reason, such as returning to the bosom of their family, yes. This a cat will do, under its own steam, like no other animal. The cat that will doggedly (??) cover 20 or 30 miles a day just to get back to a family that either forgot him or deliberately dumped him absolutely rejects driving from A to B just for a change of scenery or air. And I think most cats show it by either lapsing into a semi coma or else by getting themselves lost at the most inconvenient time and place. I receive letters from travellers who report that their pet disappeared "just as we stopped for some gas" or "we let the kids go to the washroom and when we had been driving for 20 minutes we realized that Kitty wasn't with us any more." For such people I have only sympathy. But little else, I can't help them. Nobody can. It's an impossible task to try to find a cat in the thousands of miles often covered by these travellers during their trip. And their pet may be anywhere en route. So cats should be left behind in the safety of "Cat kennels."

Perhaps the best travellers of all are dogs. There is nothing more blase than the dog which has been well and truly indoctrinated. We are all familiar with the dog that can't wait to get into the car, preferably the front seat, and would much prefer to be in the car than anywhere else. These dogs are a joy to travel with. They can relax into that special state of suspended animation that only dogs can achieve, and blissfully let the hours and the miles slip by. Generally these dogs are also the perfect house guest and can be safely taken into motel rooms without the slightest

Unfortunately not all dogs are so well trained or well behaved. As a result numerous motel owners and almost all hotel managements view canine guests with well concealed delight and only agree to permit them in the room with marked reluctance. Many (and the number is increasing rapidly) refuse flatly to allow this privilege to their guests. Because it is a privilege, not a sacred right. After all, the motel or hotel is designed to accommodate human guests, not dogs. We may love our dogs; we may be willing to accept or overlook the odd mistake or peculiarity as evidence of our dog's "character" but our fellow guests equally well may not. I think most people who keep their dogs in close relationships become thoroughly accustomed to the doggy odor that emanates from even the best kept pooch. We simply can't smell the odor anymore. But the next occupant of the motel room or the next door neighbor may not only notice the smell but find it very objectionable.

As a result all is not roses for the traveller in Canada who is accompanied by one or more dogs. He will not find many motels who will accommodate him. And the situation is growing worse every year.

I happen to travel a great deal in my job. Probably 60,000 miles a year, many of them by auto. Unless there is some special reason for leaving her at home I always travel with my favourite bitch. She has earned her special place in my affections many times over in the field and in the home but she has earned "mention in despatches" many times by protecting my

car and its contents from damage or theft. On a number of occasions she has discouraged would-be "breakersin." She lies quietly in the front well of the car and few realize she is there until the fury that she becomes hits the car window like Eddie Shack hitting the ice. She has never damaged or even left the slightest sign of her presence in a motel room but, because of the general bad reputation of dogs with motel keepers, I'm prevented from having her with me in more and more places. Except those places where I am known and the dog is trusted. Or I am trusted, which is much the same thing.

For the sake of those numerous people who, like me, travel a lot with their dogs, I have thought up the idea of a "Mobile Character Reference Card" for dogs. The card simply identifies me as a dog owner who has stayed at such and such a motel on such a day and "certifies that the room was left in excellent condition and that the dog was not a nuisance in any way to other guests or to the Manage-ment of the Motel." (I don't normally stay in Hotels - at least not with my dog). Before I check out in the morning I ask the front desk to send someone to my room to make sure all is well. I then ask the Manager to sign my little "Canine Credit Card." Some, the majority, do so with either real or forced pleasure; others decline for various reasons. But the idea is valid and, I think, a good one. I even have a photo of the dog on the card just to impress and to make sure I don't pull a ringer. If I have any feeling that the Manager of a motel I am checking into is at all undecided I immediately pull out my trump card.

Of course you can just check into a motel without mentioning that you have a dog at all. But this is chicken. And in any case it's pretty embarrassing when the waiter brings some ice to your room and gets a nice warning growl as he tries to enter your room.

If you want to take your dog with you on holiday it's up to you to train him to the car, to thoroughly accustom him to living with "peoples" and to make absolutely sure that you and your dog leave a good feeling behind as you travel and not a nasty smell.

Patches is Honored For Fantastic Rescue

Patches, a Collie Malamute mixture, has been named America's Dog Hero of the Year for 1965 and has received the annual Ken-L-Ration gold medal.

Owned by Marvin Scott of Spanaway, Wash. Patches and his family were honored at a banquet in the State ballroom of the Palmer House in Chicago, August 3. Among the awards presented to him were a goldplated leash and collar, a gold plaque, a custom-made dog blanket, a \$1,000 U.S. bond and a year's supply of dog food.

Last December 17, when the temperature dropped to zero, Mr. Scott told his wife he was going to check for possible ice damage to a patrol boat moored at a small pier below their lake home. Patches "tagged along."

Attempting to push on the stern line with a piece of timber, Scott realized too late that the pier boards

were glassy with ice. As his body skidded off and struck a floating dock, all the tendons and muscles in both legs were torn and he rolled into the icy 15' deep water and went under.

Patches leaped into the icy waters, grabbed him by the hair and pulled the dazed and shivering man to the surface, then towed him nearly 20 feet to where he could grasp the edge of the floating dock. Dimly aware that the dog must be nearly drowning with chill and exhaustion, he managed to push him onto the dock.

But the man, unable to climb onto the dock with his terrible injuries, frigid water about him and water he had swallowed, virtually blacked out. His grip loosened and he slid under the black water again. Patches leaped after him and hauled him by the hair to the dock again. After Scott had recovered sufficiently to push Patches onto the dock, he somehow hung on and screamed for help. The lateness of the hour and the wind defeated his efforts.

Once more Patches proved the difference between life and death. Bracing his feet firmly, the dog grasped the nearly helpless man's overcoat and tugged with all his might. Encouraged by this unexpected assistance, Scott struggled with every ounce of remaining strength and eventually was able to ease his body up onto the dock.

Now the pair struggled toward the house, Scott crawling painfully and Patches straining with teeth on collar. The two laboriously made their way up a rock-studded, 300-foot slope to a point near the back door. Scott was then able to throw a stone against the door and alert his wife.

After 25 days in hospital, with pneumonia a constant threat to a body undergoing massive leg operations, Scott has survived and has been able to return to work, using two canes. And Patches, of course, keeps a wary eye on him.

A Plea For Poodles

by MRS. ANITA CHAPMAN

Well-known as a true Poodle devotee and breeder, as well as owner of the Chapman Pet Shop, Toronto, Mrs. Chapman writes from the heart of unintentional but cruel neglect.

As a devoted Poodle breeder and a fancier of the breed, I am concerned about the image of the Poodle as it is being diminished by the innocent ignorance of the greater part of the pet-owning public. These dogs may be of show calibre, they may be pet stock, but they have been sold to customers as Poodles, with the Poodle heritage of beauty and fun-loving spirit.

I lay this criticism squarely at the door of uninformed and inexperienced breeders and sellers of mediocre pet stock who have no thought or concern of what happens beyond the banking of the cheque or cash. They have not completed their sale.

They have not taken the time to explain to a customer that the possession of a Poodle is not limited to giving it daily food and a place to sleep. Some are actually afraid, I believe, that they will limit their sales if they frankly and honestly state, that unless they are experienced enough or are willing to purchase equipment and learn how to use it, the Poodle must be taken to a salon or veterinarian for clipping and grooming. I don't

care where it is taken, but this must be done, at least once a month.

People who have not the honesty and concern to properly inform their customers of what is absolutely a requisite have, in my opinion, no right to be in the business, and I shall bluntly call it a business, as these people are spending neither time, money or study to improve the breed as a whole, or their own stock.

Puppies and adults come to this salon, and to others across the country, I know, so badly matted it is almost impossible for the animals to properly eliminate. I'd say this comes directly under the heading of ignorance and cruelty. I feel strongly enough about this to consider it also as a combination of ignorance and penury. If owners simply do not, or cannot spend the necessary money to have their Poodles or other longhaired dogs properly cared for, they would do better to have a dog which requires a minimum of grooming.

We have Poodles and sometimes other breeds brought in with huge mats on the head which have become entangled with the facial hair or mus-

tache. When these are cut away running sores around the eyes come to light.

It is occasionally necessary to strip these poor creatures down to the skin, taking time and energy out of all proportion to the amount charged, even with an additional charge for the abnormal time required. And just try to explain to the owners, who bring in a wreck and expect to pick up a real beauty, why they are walking out with a shorn lamb!

Breeders of show stock and high quality pet puppies are more than anxious that the dogs they sell are properly looked after and are pleased to give helpful information on the proper care and feeding. This article, then, must be mainly directed to the type of breeder mentioned earlier.

I am not going to attempt in this short space the detailed instructions for clipping Poodles. There are excellent charts for this purpose.* However, here are a few simple steps you can outline to your customer as a preven-

tive measure against one of the most common reasons for Poodles looking like sheared sheep when they arrive home from the clipping salon.

A hypothetical situation: You have just sold a darling little ball of fluff to some nice people who were very excited and pleased that they have found exactly the little puppy they have been looking for. You are also pleased, because you have made a sale and you think the puppy has gone to a good home where it will get the attention it deserves. But wait: as you stand there and watch the car drive away, do you feel satisfied in your own mind you have given the new owners all the help and information they need? Or are you worrying that you haven't fulfilled your obligation?

The first stop by the customer upon leaving your kennels should be to the veterinarian for innoculations, if not already given. This is most important, as they are very susceptible at this tender age. New owners, as a rule, can't seem to resist taking their new puppy visiting, or asking people in to inspect the newest member of the family. Visitors sometimes

bring their own little dog along to make friends, exposing the new pup to all common puppy ailments.

Potential customers should know and expect that looking after a Poodle is a little different from other breeds, and the seller is doing them no service in not giving them this honest information. The trouble is some of them are afraid of making it sound like an expensive and complicated operation, thus losing a possible sale.

The cost of proper grooming amortized over a year's time, amounts to less than half a package of cigarettes a day and this is a monthly visit to the finest pet shops and Poodle salons in the larger cities.

Many would-be Poodle owners become discouraged by tales told of dogs having to be stripped of their coats, expensive ear treatments, ear operations, when most of this could have been prevented by a little information on the part of the breeder

or seller at the time of the sale.

Some people have the misconception that Poodles should not be clipped for the first six to eight months. If

Judging Differences Canada – U.S.A.

by MRS. G. T. FERGUSON

I HAVE been asked in this, the Poodle Issue of Dogs in Canada, to comment on the differences that I have noticed between the dog shows and Poodles shown in the United States and Canada. Since, as yet, I have not had the pleasure and privilege of visiting and exhibiting at the western shows, the following comments are limited to what I have seen in the central and eastern part of the United States and Canada.

Dog shows in the United States are managed by dog show organizations hired by the various Kennel clubs rather than by the Canadian system of individual clubs sponsoring shows run by the club members. In defence of the American dog shows, it is a pleasure to know that when Poodles are to be judged at two o'clock - two o'clock it is! There are cases when their judging schedule falls behind but until this year in Canada, Poodles could have been scheduled for two o'clock and it might have been as late as five o'clock by the time you finally reached the ring. This makes for a long, tiring, nerve-racking wait for both the exhibitor and dog.

To obtain a Poodle's American championship (15 points) two majors are required of either three, four or five points. Since we only require ten points and no majors here, I strongly feel that with time and determination any Poodle can become a Canadian champion. I fully realize that The Canadian Kennel Club is still working on our system but I hope that the day comes when we, too, have to obtain majors. Granted, our shows have a very small entry compared to the American shows but some of our champions just don't deserve that honor and could never obtain their American championship. In all fairness, though, even if the entries are far more numerous in the States than here in Canada, the ratio of good dogs to poor specimens is about the same. There are still only a few genuine candidates for Winners and

In the States it is very rare for the judge who assesses the Breed to also do the Group. If you are fortunate enough to take the Breed, for the price of your entry, you then obtain two different opinions of your dog.

Here in Canada, it is infrequent if both the Breed and the Group are not done by the same judge. Hence, for the price of your entry, you are only obtaining one opinion.

On the whole, since the amateur or owner-exhibitor is fast disappearing in the States, Poodles are mainly shown by handlers licensed by the American Kennel Club. Granted, their dogs are prepared better than many of ours but I still enjoy watching the owner-exhibitor win at our shows.

Personally, I feel that the judges, especially in the United States, are placing far too much emphasis on length of coat and head — especially length of foreface and not enough on soundness and feet. Many class dogs and specials in the States are carrying so much coat they certainly do not give the overall appearance of a well-balanced dog. They are literally "dripping" in coat. One cannot help but wonder when one sees the coat almost reaching the ground just what is being hidden.

As a breeder, I agree that nothing is more important and pleasing than a good head, but with this emphasis on length of foreface, the jaws and skulls are narrowing. Insufficient jaw is causing bite problems! Let us hope that we don't get their skulls so narrow that there just isn't room for brains.

Unfortunately, the judges are looking for length of coat and foreface here, too, but so far they haven't forgotten that a harsh texture is more important than a long "cotton candy" coat and that a Poodle's head must be in proportion to its body.

Poor feet: a major problem with Poodles in both countries. Whatever has happened to the well-bunched foot—without artificial help. Splayed feet and too-thin pads are covered by dropping the bottom puff and helped by the long grass of some outdoor shows and the absence of a table and the judge even checking feet. I still agree with the old horse breeder who said, "no feet—no horse."

Size-wise, all Poodles are getting larger. It becomes increasingly difficult to win with an 8½" Toy, 13½" Miniature and 20" Standard. Fortunately, judges are still placing small sound specimens here but they, too, are beginning to follow the trend to larger Poodles. Never have I seen so many "up to size" Toys and Miniatures as are winning in the States. Some of the Standards look like small ponies. Personally, I feel that to "special" a good small specimen in the States is a complete waste of time.

One cannot kelp but feel concerned for the future of the Poodle today, when champions are being shown with heads sitting squarely on their shoulders, entirely lacking in neck; fronts that move like a pair of knitting needles and rears that can hardly get the dog solidly around the turn!

KEYNOTES TOWARD PERFECTING THE POODLE

by MRS. D. T. WEIR

The knowledge of measured structure via breeding records is the key to your success or failure in this demanding but rewarding program, maintains this well-known breeder-exhibitor.

THE most important requisite in breeding Toys is to appraise exactly where the improvement should be made. There is always room for improvement. I never will be satisfied. I have an ideal picture and I could draw an ideal Poodle. But in breeding it is extremely hard to get a half inch on a bone—where you want it.

Keep in mind a picture of proportion. Ten inches at the shoulder gives a lot of leeway. If you are dealing with an 8" Poodle everything must be

in proportion and balance.

Here is a yardstick in appraising your bone lengths and proportion: The difference between an 81/2" Poodle with plenty of good body and head and the length of body in proportion, bone substance of the right type and (a) a 9" so-called high on the leg, shortbacked Poodle (which is only shortbacked because of the overly longlegged or high-stationed Poodle) which is not good because the body lacks substance and depth, or (b) the Poodle with an overly coarse head which on a 9 or 91/2" dog would be in proportion, providing the bone substance was good enough.

How do you know that by bringing in a good head you're not going to invite some undesirable characteristic like a poor rear end? You know your stock fairly well and where the parents are strong and dominant, so you don't

have to worry on that score.

BE SPECIFIC

When you say "improvement in head," you cannot generalize. You must break up the head into its component parts and decide which of the parts need improvement, which, taken with the structure you already know your female to have and to have inherited as a dominant force. You must improve the component parts.

You just can't buy an entire head. You must know your bone structure to know what makes a good or a poor

head.

Toy Poodles of say, 15 years ago, in my opinion, could stand a great deal of improvement in the eyes. What was wrong? It was the bulge. What appeared to be a large eye was not necessarily so. The appearance of bulging came from below the eye where the bone structure fell away. It was not filled out below the eye,

and actually created a bulge just under the eye. In other words, a flat facial contour makes it appear large. In my opinion a puppy with this feature would be discarded because it would not have a true Poodle head.

INBREEDING SETS THE STAMP

In my experience, before you attempt to set characteristics, the only way to determine what any female or male carries is to inbreed the specimen, preferably to its sire or dam or to a very close relative.

The first litter (inbred), raised to maturity, properly studied and appraised in relation to the sire or dam of the litter, will give you a great deal of necessary knowledge, with which to continue breeding.

It's an axiom: you must wait until the litter is fully grown (at least two years old) before true assessment or

appraisal can be made.

Admittedly, this is a costly procedure. You can't sell the puppies. Or if you do sell, it must be on the agreement that breeding privileges are retained by the breeder. You must keep the litter entire or your program is out of control.

This stringency is not as difficult in Toy Poodles as it might be in larger breeds. The litters are small (an average of two) and the appetites are not large.

If you honestly want to improve dogs there is no short cut. You have

to do it slowly.

As an example, Ch. Mar-Con Tata of Tyldesley was the second in my program. I had looked several years before finding what I wanted. I first saw a relative of hers handled by Horace Hollands and learned that puppies were available. But before making a purchase I examined nearly 20 relatives. "This," I decided, "is the female in which I'll invest." This silver Toy, who eventually became a Best in Show winner, was a real problem in the show ring for the first year. I couldn't keep her tail up. (She kept it up like a little flag at home.) Finally a helpful handler-friend said, "I'll get her tail up for you." What she did, I'll never know, but after the "helpfulness" Tata wouldn't even get her little rear end up off the floor, let alone her tail. Actually all that was required was maturity. After her second litter, Tata's tail never went down.

And so Tata became the foundation of my Toys, And this is the lengthy procedure which has paid off. You have your first litter, which is inbred. You must now assess each individual in the litter. What are their qualities? What are their faults? In the assessment you keep in mind they are inbred to their own family — and so you will have a picture of them carrying through the qualities from the grand-parents.

You also look for the faults that must be eliminated — after the puppies are mature, or two years old. You have a knowledge now of the good qualities which are possessed by the mother, and bred to the sire, which the sire has. And their faults.

The good qualities you can be reasonably certain will continue if the future stud or dam carries them. The faults you can hope to partially take care of if the sire or dam does not carry them. How? In the next generation. The choice of the stud for the next generation is all-important.

You now have the mature second (inbred) litter, in which there is a female you are going to mate. She carries a great proportion of the good qualities of her mother and the sire of the puppies which is also the

grandfather.

She carries both visible faults and hidden faults. You can plainly see the visible imperfections and you do have knowledge of the hidden failings. And here is the big question. The safest choice in the long run is to select an uncle or brother carrying all of her qualities and none of the visible faults, and you hope, none of her invisible imperfections which you are aware she carries.

Now you come to the third (inbred) litter, where you can begin to see some progress. Here again you must wait for maturity to get the true proportions. Your assessment here will reveal the qualities in which the family is dominant - that is, small and wellfilled out eyes, good length of head (particularly proportioned upper and lower jaws with a good bite), wellplaced ears of proper length, cleanness and length of neck, well-angulated shoulders, good depth of brisket, short loin, properly angulated pelvic bone, a short croup with an upstanding tail. You will expect to find the forequarters in proper proportion in the length of the bones and the hindquarters well-angulated, with no tendency towards hip dysplasia or slipped patella (stifle).

This may be of varying size, but

still in proportion.

Faults: You will also find faults. They could be in a thin, sparse coat, the spotting gene or the coat could be of poor color. There could be any number of individual bones which may be either too long or too short.

Temperament: In my experience the same environment over the

My FIRST POODLE . . . and how it grew

"Bibelot" Poodles began the way so many other successful kennel stories do — the lovable pet that wins a blue ribbon at his first dog show, soon followed by a second dog, the first

litter, the new puppy -

My first dog show thrill was training my white Standard Poodle "Joey" to his CD. Then came Ch. Barlanark Lisette V.D., Am. C.D.X., my first champion and big obedience winner. Liz was the "apple of my eye" and gave me many years of pleasure, only to come to a tragic end in the prime of her life. Her exquisite beauty, loyalty and devotion will never be

forgotten.

By now I had graduated from the University of Toronto and decided to open the Poodle Studio. Time to have another dog. This was the international group winner, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Bel Tor Joshua Am. Can. CD who has made many friends over the years and produced six champions. Joshua was joined next by Ch. Peth-melys Tison of Bibelot CD. Tison's unusual deep apricot coloring caught everyone's attention as I started travelling to more distant dog shows in the USA and then once to Bermuda. To my knowledge Tison is the only dog to hold the six titles of Am. Can. Bda. championship and Am. Can. Bda.

It was at the Poodle Club of America in 1961 that Ch. Lady Joan of Lowmont CD came into my life. How do I describe her? Absolutely exquisite. She was the only Poodle in class, beautifully put down and handled by Howard Tyler. She was giving everything. Her grace and floating movement were a pleasure to behold. I stopped and watched, absolutely spellbound. Naturally she won. All I could see in my mind was another Lisette and oh how I wanted that dog. For several days I talked of and dreamed about her. Finally I wrote Miss McCreery, remarking how impressed I was with Lady Joan, and that if she would ever consider parting with her, I would welcome a chance to buy her. Back came a polite little note saying Lady Joan had just been promised to a Mr. Smith. Imagine my disappointment: Then three days later came a phone call from Miss McCreery. If I would be willing to pay the airfare from New York to Toronto, give Lady Joan anything faster. To think that Lady Joan was now mine! So off to the dog shows again. Lady Joan promptly won her championships, soon followed Brown and Ch. Bibelot's Naughty Marietta — both finished as pups with group placings and Best Puppy in Show awards. The third pup regretfully was spayed.

Lady Joan's next litter by Ch. Wycliffe Virgil produced six black pups - four champions, three of which finished as pups, and the fifth is well on her way to a championship. These are Am. Ch. Bibelot's Merry Anne, Am. Can. Ch. Bibelot's High Fashion, Ch. Bibelot's Jumping Jac-

Continental trim in that huge open a good home and breed her to Joshua, then Lady Joan would be mine. I don't think I have ever agreed to by her obedience titles. I did not take her on in Specials, for she came into season and was bred to Joshua. Three pups resulted from this mating - two of which were to go back to Lowmont, but Miss McCreery felt she could no longer cope with lively young pups, so gave them back to me. In short order these two became champions. Ch. Bibelot's Honourable Mr. ques CDX, and Ch. Bibelot's Magnificent Maxime and Bibelot's French Flair. The sixth, Bibelot's Mischief Maker, has produced champions.

Again Lady Joan was bred and produced five more black pups. Ch. (Can. & Am.) Bibelot's The Judge of Hi Crown, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Bibelot's Tall Dark and Handsome, Ch. Bibelot's Susie Q of Hi Crown, Ch. Bibelot's In Style of Hi Crown, and a fifth with points, Bibelot's In Vogue of Hi Crown.

To date I have never kept a pup of my own breeding to show and train, but Tall Dark and Handsome, known to his countless admirers as The Tramp, was just too good to let go. I just had to figure out a way to keep him. Poor Tramp has lived an unusual dog's life, I must say, for his home has been everything from a boarding kennel, my car, the studio or a handler's kennel, but not in our apartment! He is a ball of fire, and somehow is just too active for apart-

ment life as yet.

Ch. Bibelot's Tall Dark and Handsome is now in England, where I hope he will carry on in the fine tradition of his breeding. Combining the finest Canadian and American bloodlines - both as winners and producers, he should prove a valuable asset to English Standard Poodles. Tramp won his Can. Ch. at seven months and one day of age, his Am. Ch. at ten months, a Specialty BIS and Am. Group win in puppy trim all "firsts" in Poodle history. All his winning between seven and 15 months of age earned him a standing of third top Canadian owned Standard Poodle and seventh Non-Sporting. To date he has three BIS and 13 group firsts. Quite an impressive record to take to

Feeding of Newborn Puppies

HAND-REARING of newborn puppies is nothing new. Dog breeders have been doing it for centuries, using feeding equipment designed for human infants and a great variety of makeshift devices, from doll-bottles to eyedroppers. For many reasons, these makeshifts have been only moderately successful. Nipples designed for human babies are too large for small pups and are too firm for larger ones, requiring stronger sucking than a newborn pup can do. Doll-bottles are usually too small and too poorly made to be satisfactory. Feeding with an eye-dropper results in milk entering the pups' lungs, and should always be discouraged. Fortunately there is a good way to hand-feed newborn pups a simple, easy, quick, clean, scientific way - and that is by the use of a tube passed directly into the pups' stomachs.

► Stomach-tube feeding of newborn animals is a comparatively new technique, patterned after methods used for premature human babies. Dr. Leon Whitney's Complete Book of Home Pet Care, published in 1950, contains a photograph of a pup being fed with a urinary catheter. We have been using the tube-feeding method since 1954, and have lost only two pups out of more than a hundred raised! In addition to orphaned pups, we have administered supplemental feeding to hundreds of nursing pups, and undoubtedly have saved many that would have died. These included pups that were weak at birth, pups in very large litters, and pups with cleft palates that were unable to

The principle of feeding a pup with a stomach-tube is very simple. A soft, flexible tube of suitable diameter is placed over the back of the pup's tongue and merely pushed down its throat until it enters the stomach. Then a measured amount of formula is injected through the tube, after which the tube is withdrawn. After a little practice, one person can do this alone very easily and quickly. The pup is placed on its stomach on a table, its mouth is opened with one hand, and the other hand passes the tube directly over its tongue and down its throat. It takes less than a minute to feed each pup.

Only two precautions must be observed in using the stomach tube. First, force must never be used. The tube should slip down the pup's throat quite easily; if it doesn't, it is not the right size tube or it is not being

used correctly. Second, the tube must never enter the windpipe, for to accidentally inject milk into a pup's lungs would, undoubtedly, be to kill it. It is easy to tell if the tube is in the esophagus (right) or the windpipe (wrong). If the tube is accidentally passed into the windpipe, which very seldom happens, only two or three inches of the tube will pass before it meets resistance. If it is in the esophagus, six or more inches of the tube can be passed into the pup with ease, as the soft tube coils up in the stomach. If there is any doubt, the tube should be withdrawn and passed again before feeding. I repeat, force should never be used.

Equipment for stomach-tube feeding is inexpensive and easy to obtain. We use Pharmaseal Laboratory's K-31 Expendable plastic premature-infant feeding tubes, and 10 or 20-cc plastic disposable syringes with the needles taken off. Both are available through a surgical supply house, drugstore, or a veterinarian. Size 8-French tubes are suitable for all pups except very tiny toys; size 5-French are for those. One tube and syringe often lasts long enough to raise an entire litter. These tubes are fifteen inches long and have a black mark eight inches from the tip. As a simple safety precaution, the tubes should be passed down the puppy's throat nearly to this mark. It is impossible to pass eight inches of tubing into a pup's lungs, so this precaution insures that the tube is in the stomach.

It has not been found necessary to clean the tube between feeding each pup in a litter. After the feeding, the tube and syringe are taken apart, washed thoroughly in hot soapy water, rinsed well, and allowed to dry.

Pups should be fed four times a day and no more. Although they would nurse more often, they would take only a very small amount each time. Overfeeding causes diarrhea and dehydration, and kills far more pups than does underfeeding. Dudley Baker, in the August 1963 issue of DOG WORLD Magazine, published an excellent article on milk formulas for puppies. By far the most satisfactory for use are the commercially prepared, powdered, bitches' milk. These products are easy to use, correct in their content, and always fresh, as they are mixed before each feeding. Incidentally, milk fed through a stomach-tube need not be warmed,

but may be fed right from the refrigerator.

In an emergency, or if commercially prepared bitches' milk is not available, pups may be fed one of the following mixtures: eight ounces of homogenized milk plus two egg yolks, or five parts evaporated milk mixed with one part water. Either mixture is less convenient and far more expensive to use than the commercial product. These formulas must be kept refrigerated, and mixed well before use.

Each of the above-described formulas, as well as the commercial products, contain about one calorie per cubic centimeter (abbreviated "cc", the numbered units on the syringe). A puppy needs about 60 calories per pound of body weight a day for the first week of life, 70 calories per pound daily for the second week, and 80 to 90 calories per pound thereafter. This volume is to be divided by four, for four daily feedings. It is simple to gauge the volume to feed by the condition of the pup. A quiet, rapidly growing puppy with a normal stool is adequately fed. A pup with diarrhea may be overfed, and one that cries intermittently for no apparent reason may be hungry. The mathematical formula can be used to estimate the requirements at first, but one soon learns how much a pup can hold. The abdomen of a young puppy enlarges somewhat after feeding, but never should appear bloated, nor fed so much as to cause milk to overflow through their noses.

▶ The first stool of a newborn pup is firm, dark and scanty, representing the contents of the intestinal tract before birth. Subsequent bowel movements should be soft, yellowish, and formed. A pup that is fed four times a day will have four to six bowel movements a day. Stimulation of urination, and defecation after each feeding, is accomplished by gentle rubbing of the anal region with a piece of cotton.

Diarrhea in pups is a serious complication, as it causes rapid dehydration. It often indicates over-feeding, chilling, or a bacterial infection. It is particularly serious when accompanied by continuous crying. Treatment of diarrhea should be started at the first sign. The milk formula is diluted 50% with water, and antibiotics are added. As the condition subsides, the amount of water in the formula is gradually reduced to normal.

Constipation in puppies, indicated by reduced frequency of stools, can mean dehydration, underfeeding, or an unsuitable formula. Correction of the cause and addition of a teaspoonful of sugar to eight ounces of formula will help the problem.

A newborn puppy attempts to regulate its environmental temperature by crawling close to its mother and litter-mates when cold, and crawling away when too warm. A satisfactory

heat source for orphan pups is an ordinary electric heating pad, turned on low and protected with a water-proof covering. The pad must fill only a portion of the box, so that the pup can crawl onto it if cold and off it if too warm. Light-bulbs and heat-lamps are likely to cause overheating, as the pup is unable to escape from the heat.

Of course, it is absolutely necessary to keep the pups clean at all times. Folded newspaper makes a satisfactory and easily-changed bedding. Dirty puppies may be washed in warm water and dried with a towel. Each pup should be kept in its own individual box or compartment.

Puppies can be started on solid food at three weeks of age, and should be weaned at four weeks. "Instant" baby-cereal, the high-protein variety, may be mixed with milk formula for their first food. Pups are able to swallow solids before they will eat from a bowl so the weaning process of hand-raised pups can be hastened by spoon-feeding cereal for a few days.

► A word about death losses of newborn pups. Much has been written on the myth of "acid milk" and the cold, crying pup that probably has a bacterial infection. We recognize still another situation, the "limp puppy syndrome." These pups are found lying on their sides, quiet and warm. When picked up, their heads loll. Their movements are feeble, they do not squirm, and they may look very flat. If they are not treated, or are discovered too late, they get cold, may cry a little, and then die. This condition is most common in puppies between 48 hours and seven days old. It almost never occurs in all the puppies of any litter, but a bitch with pups such as these may lose a pup or two in each of her litters. The

cause is thought to be starvation. The pup is prevented from nursing by more vigorous litter-mates, by constant licking by the bitch, or by getting lost behind the bitch or in the bedding. After just an hour or two, the pup's meager resources are depleted, its blood sugar level falls far below normal, and it becomes too weak to nurse if it does have the chance. The remedy for this situation is simple and dramatic. The affected pup is given a stomachful of milk formula through the tube. Improvement is evident, often in fifteen minutes. The entire litter in such cases should be watched closely for relapses, and fed with the tube at the first sign of trouble. Such pups need not be taken away from the dam, but close observation and quick action may be needed to save all of

How One Chesapeake Breeder Made the Grade at Crufts

One of the great English breeders of Golden Retrievers got his start upon seeing his first Golden in 1917. H. L. Jenner's Abbots' kennel had its inception then, when a friend gave him a fine specimen. Mr. Jenner's greatest day, according to the Golden Retriever Handbook by Elma Stonex, was Cruft's Jubilee Show held in 1936. Snow fell in London when he arrived on the eve of Cruft's. His two entries, Ch. Davie of Yelme and Ch. Abbots Daisy, spent the night in the room with him. He awakened to find Daisy swallowing the last mouthful of the only socks he had thought to bring. He walked what seemed miles on chilled feet until he could purchase another pair.

By the time he arrived at the show a new emergency greeted him. Beau-tifully clean and brushed when he started out, his two entries soon were tinged with black from London's sooty slush. He settled down to cleaning them, and then his luck turned. Both Davie and Daisy captured CC's and took five Firsts.

George V of England Cherished His Labradors

King George V, grandfather of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth, was an active dog fancier, breeding and exhibiting black Labradors under the prefix of Wolferton, a name he inherited from that great dog lover, Queen Alexandra, his own grand-mother. One of his noted dogs, Wolferton Ben, won six Challenge Certificates. At that time the dogs of Royal kennels did not compete in field trials.

Three of his favorite Labradors not only lived in separate quarters but had their own keeper. These were the dogs chosen to accompany him to Balmoral.

The Labradors were not merely "kept" dogs. They were real workers, as were all of his Majesty's dogs.

Where a Cocker Puppy's Tail Should be Cut.

Some books on specific breeds present the novice with all kind of information except one where a puppy's tail (of any specific breed) should be cut. However, Dr. Leon Whitney, who, by 1956 had raised 2,000 Cocker Spaniels in addition to other breeds, is very specific in his book, This is the Cocker Spaniel.

He states that every Cocker pup's tail has parallel sides for about threeeights of its length, before starting to taper. This, he maintains, is the place to cut.

The Bloodhound

The Bloodhound has been up and down in its long history. A sagacious breed understanding a great deal above the language of command, its secrets have been so skillfully portrayed as to rank first among all others that hunt by scent. It is the natural instinct of purebred Bloodhound to trail from the time they can walk and man has been their quarry for centuries. Upon location they show no further interest. Knowledge of the breed is usually either erroneous or vague.

Contrary to popular belief, they do not always trail nearest the line. When scenting is good it is not un-

common to see them trailing 50 yards on the leeward side only bordering the scent zone. They evince superiority in hunting a colder or lighter scent by taking more pains, reasoning and determination on the line they are laid upon. Each smell is unmixable.

The schooling begins early. Each hound hunts for himself, is taught to be self-reliant and to remember the scent. He relies on his nose and does not see his quarry until he gets his body scent or bumps into him. His ability to recast, when over-running the line, is the keenness or yardstick of his nose. Strength and length of foreface denote scenting power. On bad scenting days when the hound is checky he needs assurance, but if the scent is good, "talk to him". When events or circumstances create a need he sometimes requires more room than other hounds. He knows an actual search from a practice run.

In addition to their tracking skill they are equally proficient in bringing game to the rifle and as guard dogs. They are affectionate and especially fond of children. A breed that is usually quiet at night only sending up a sonorous bay on occasion. Old bi-ographers claim "his voice alone entitles him to the greatest considera-

Many black and tan Bloodhounds show the tan very light in color. An example of jet black with mahogany is Landrover Royal Liza, currently being exhibited. A full-brother and a half-sister also carried this coloring. During one period, in the Old World, names carrying the word black or dark were jet black with a little mahogany. A red Bloodhound requires additional weight to show the same condition as the black and tan color. Liver color is rarely seen.

A man-hunt creates a sense of excitement, memorable experiences, a sort of four star attraction. As head of the hound family he still remains supreme. Unerringly he pursues.

A Real Home Operation Where the Dogs are Pets

Mrs. Nancy F. Onthank, well-known breeder and judge of Dachshunds, believes in keeping her kennels small, so that dogs have a home life. In

this article, reproduced courtesy The American Dachshund Magazine, she tells of the growth of her successful kennels:

"My first Dachshund was given to me, not a very good one but lots of personality. My husband felt sorry for a lonely dog, so he got my first female from Ann Stewart, one of the most famous breeders. Later, with a male from Ann Stewart, I started breeding one litter a year.

By the time I was somewhat relieved of small-child care, I needed new stock. From Fred Pearson, I got two lovely females, the start of Rose Farm stock: Ch. Debutante of Fre Delsa and Ch. Red Velvet of Fre Delsa. Both go back to the famous Ch. Gunther v Marienlust.

After I had proved a pattern in breeding, I became licensed to judge. My first big assignment was for DALI, where I had an entry of 173 Smooths. Later I judged twice at Westminster, and I have judged at many other U.S. shows, in Bermuda and Great Britain.

Ch. Red Velvet of Fre Delsa, bred to Ch. Hardway Welcome Stranger, gave me Ch. Venture of Hardway, sire of 28 champions. "Vick" was the best Smooth in the U.S. for two years. This pride and joy sired my Ch. Herthwood's Mark of Rose Farm, who has had many wins, including DALI, where he retired the famous Leutnant trophy. He is a Bermuda and Canadian champion also, is producing as well as his sire, and is also a real pet.

None of my dogs is a real kennel animal; I have kept my kennels small, a real home operation where the dogs are treated like pets and many are frequently in the house. Any day, my kitchen is likely to have six to ten dogs underfoot.

I have had experience with Dachshunds of other varieties. Some years

MEETING OF THE **BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

The semi-annual meeting of the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club was held at Toronto commencing on Monday, June 10, 1965.

There follows a summary of decisions of general interest reached at the meeting.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

ACCOUNTS WITH SHOW- AND TRIAL-GIVING CLUBS

The Secretary was authorized to draft proposed amendments, for the consideration of the Board at its next annual meeting, on his proposal that date fees be discontinued, and that instead of clubs paying recording and listing fees as at present, there be substituted a new arrangement whereby the show- or trial-giving club submits but one cheque upon being billed by

BANK ACCOUNTS

To expedite the payment of refunds to show-giving clubs, salaries, and any expenditure not exceeding \$75.00, the Board authorized the setting up of a bank account, in which the amount on deposit is not to exceed \$5,000 at any time, and upon which cheques may be drawn requiring only the signature of the Club's Secretary-Treasurer. Deposits in this new account are to be only in the form of cheques drawn on any of the Club's other bank accounts, such cheques to be signed by the President (or Vice-President or Second Vice-President) and the Secretary-Treasurer.

INTERNATIONAL MATTERS

THE AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB

During the meeting the Board met with Mr. Alfred Dick, Executive Vice-President of The American Kennel Club, and the following subjects were discussed:

the possibility of a reciprocal understanding with regard to recognition of show judges approved by either Club;
recognition by The American Kennel Club of titles granted by the C. K. C. to the extent of showing such titles on A. K. C. certificates of registration and of permitting such titles to be shown in catalogues for shows and trials held under A. K. C. rules; arrangements which would permit of Canadian-owned field trial dogs being entered as listed dogs at trials held under A. K. C. rules; (see

the requirements of The American Kennel Club for recognition of a breed which it had not heretofore recognized (with particular reference to breeds recognized by the C. K. C. which have not yet been recognized by the A. K. C.) (4)

Following its meeting with Mr. Dick the Board decided on the form of written representations to The American Kennel Club on subjects (1) and (2).

REGISTRATION, STUD BOOKS AND RELATED MATTERS

REGISTRATION OF AMERICAN FOXHOUNDS

For some years the Club's special regulations with regard to the registration in the Club's records of Canadian-born American Foxhounds registered with the International Foxhunters' Stud Book (Chase Publishing Co.) provided for the registration of such dogs as were born in Canada prior to December 31, 1959. The Board removed the stipulation that such dogs must have been born in Canada prior to December 31, 1959, although the other requirements set out in the regulations will continue to apply.

BREED STANDARDS

The Board considered the report of the Breed Standards Committee on a proposed new standard for the Vizsia as submitted by the Vizsia Club of Canada. It was noted that the Chairman of the Committee had communicated the Committee's views to the Vizsia Club, and the Secretary was authorized, upon receipt of a recommendation from the Committee, to publish a proposed new standard for the Vizsia with an invitation to those interested in the breed to submit their comments.

Because of evident interest in the Silky Terrier the Board took steps to provide for the recognition of the breed, to be known as the "Silky Toy Terrier", and for the recognition of the A.K. C. standard of the breed. When recognized, the breed is to be placed in Group #5.

On the recommendation of the Breed Standards Committee the Board directed the Secretary, when corresponding with clubs and others considering revision of a breed standard, to outline the following suggestions:
(1) consideration to be given to eliminating existing disqualifications;
(2) no new disqualifications (except by agreement of the Board in specific cases) to be allowed;

faults should be held to a minimum and be stated at the end of the

avoidance of vague terms such as "rather" and "fairly".

On the recommendation of the Breed Standards Committee the Board decided that when a standard is revised or a new standard proposed, there should not be a scale of points included.

As the Club has published its own "Book of Breed Standards" and in order to remove the necessity of the Board considering new standards (and changes in standards) adopted by The American Kennel Club, the Board decided to include, in a special referendum ballot to be conducted concurrent with the next regular referendum ballot, a proposed amendment to Section 4 of Article XXVI of the Club's By-laws, the proposed new Section 4 to read as follows:

"4. The standards of breeds recognized by the Club shall be those standards published in the current edition of the Club's Book of Breed Standards, and any changes therein which have received the approval of the Board. The Board shall have the power to adopt new breed standards, and to amend any standards adopted by the Club previous to the enactment of this By-law."

BREED IMPROVEMENT - SELECTIVE REGISTRY

Mr. W. J. Monaghan, Chairman of the Selective Registry Committee, reported that he is endeavouring to obtain information with regard to selective registry ideas from parties in the United States, and that information would be distributed to members of the Committee when obtained.

Consideration of a proposal that agreement forms now being made available by the Club be printed in French was postponed until it is clear whether the forms are being used to any extent.

In view of the provisions of Article XXXI (Registration of Transfers of Ownership) of the Club's By-laws, as amended in 1964, the Board decided to discontinue making available agreement forms for use where dogs are sold on the understanding that they are not pure-bred.

The Board approved an agreement form, drafted by the Club's solicitor, intended for use when those who have entered into an agreement that a dog has been sold on the understanding that it will not be used for breeding purposes wish to cancel said agreement. (NOTE: Such an agreement is provided for in Article XXXI, Section 2 of the Club's By-laws.)

ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION

While the Club has regulations governing artificial insemination, these regulations do not at present provide for the use of imported semen. The Secretary was instructed to draft appropriate regulations covering the importation of fresh and frozen dog semen, the draft to be included on the agenda of the next annual meeting of the Board, such draft to be submitted to the Chief Registration Officer of the Department of Agriculture for checking purposes prior to presentation to the Board.

KENNEL NAMES

The Secretary was instructed to publish a notice in "Dogs in Canada" pointing out that registration of a kennel name with The Canadian Kennel Club must not be construed or represented as registration of a kennel, a breeding and/or boarding establishment, a dog dealership, a pet shop, or a training and/or grooming establishment.

For some time it has been the policy of the Club, when processing an application for registration of kennel name, to check any of the names selected against the list of kennel names registered with The Kennel Club (England) and to reject any name which appears on that list or is considered to be quite similar to any name on such list. The Board decided that this practice would be discontinued but if, upon publication in "Dogs in Canada" of a name applied for, an objection is received on the grounds of prior registration of a kennel name with The Kennel Club, consideration would be given to such objection.

REGISTRATION COMMITTEE

A member of the Board was authorized to lay an information in order that prosecution proceedings may be instituted against a member believed to have forged a signature on an application for registration of litter

In the case of a litter of Nova Scotia Duck Tolling Retrievers whelped in the United States (sire and dam Canadian-born and C, K, C, registered) the owner was referred to the A, K, C,

The Secretary was instructed to discuss, with the Chief Registration Officer of the Department of Agriculture, the question of identification and registration of dogs included in bulk shipments to Canada.

The Board considered a request for the recognition of the Podenco Ibeneco Pelo Liso (also referred to as the "Ibiza Hound"), and decided to take no action when, according to information obtained from the Spanish Kennel Club, full three-generation pedigrees could not be furnished for two specimens of this breed imported to Canada.

The Board declined to authorize the registration of a Poodle imported from Japan with a certificate issued by the Japan Kennel Club.

NOTICE

SUBJECT: Entry of Canadian owned dogs that are CKC registered in Field Trials held under American Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

The current American Kennel Club rules under which various types of field trials are held require that to be entered in a member trial or licensed trial a dog must either be AKC registered or part of a previously registered litter. However, provision is made in the rules governing the various types of trials, except Beagle trials, for the entry of a CKC registered dog by its Canadian owner in three trials before the dog is AKC registered provided that the CKC number and "Canada" are shown on the entry form. Further entries, however, would have to be on the basis of AKC registration.

Beagle field trial rules require that a hound be AKC registered or part of a previously registered litter without providing for the "three times" prior to AKC registration as is the case in all other types of AKC field trials. Thus a Canadian owned CKC registered Beagle must be AKC registered before it is entered in an AKC Beagle trial.

The American Kennel Club is prepared to give prompt registration service on applications that are made to it by Canadian owners of CKC registered dogs provided a note is attached to the applications stating that this special service is desired for the purpose of entering the dog in AKC trials.

(certificate of registration to not be issued - registration authorized to enable registration of litter whelped by this female in 1961); (RC-318) instructed the Secretary to inform Mrs. Jean Marks, Secretary-Treasurer of the Essex County Kennel Club, that it will consider the problem set forth in her letter of April 2nd if the person who is anxious to be helped will write the C. K. C. personally, giving full particulars of the problem; (RC-319)
authorized the recording of transfer of ownership of the Poodle (14)

C. from a poundkeeper; (RC-332)

authorized the registration of the Airedale Terrier EHO ARGO imported from Finland by Veikko Lilja, Toronto, Ont. on June 25, 1963; (RC-333)

COMPLAINTS, CHARGES AND PROTESTS

POLICIES

The Board decided, as a matter of policy, that before any complaint is referred to an advisory committee for investigation and report, the complainant will be required to make a cash deposit of \$15.00, such deposit to be refunded to the complainant after the advisory committee has submitted its report and it is clear that the complainant attended before the advisory committee to prosecute his complaint.

A special committee (Mr. Wells, Chairman) was appointed to review the Club's By-laws and rules with a view to recommending to the Board any necessary amendments to eliminate any existing conflictions.

Mr. Monaghan was appointed Chairman of a special committee to prepare material for the guidance of show- and trial-giving clubs in the handling of protests.

SPECIFIC CASES

In the course of dealing with a number of files on complaints, charges and protests, the Board:
(1) referred nine files to advisory committees for investigation and

cancelled an award to a dog not placed in competition at a show for
all awards for which it was entitled;
reprimanded a show-giving club for failing to fully implement the
provisions of Chapter 23 in its handling of a protest and directed it

gave a breeder fifteen days in which to properly identify three dogs
which he had sold;
gave another breeder fifteen days in which to elect a formal investigation of a complaint that he had failed to properly identify two dogs
which he had sold;
after considering the report of an advisory committee which had conducted an investigation, dismissed a protest alleging that a show
secretary had accepted an entry after closing of entries;
referred two complaints to the Complaints Committee for consideration and report;
declined to reinstate a person who had been previously denied the
privilege of participating in shows and trials held under the Chub's
rules, although the person in question had since paid entry fees to
the show-giving club whose complaint had resulted in the penalty
imposed a \$10.00 penalty on each of two show-giving clubs which
failed to mail judging schedules, before their respective shows, to
exhibitors;
imposed a \$10.00 penalty on a field trial club for issuing a premium (8)

exhibitors; imposed a \$10.00 penalty on a field trial club for issuing a premium list without prior approval of its selected judges.

INTERNAL AND ADMINISTRATION

BOARD MEETINGS

The Board decided that, if deemed necessary by the President, the next regular meeting of the Board would be held on September 17th.

REPORT OF MANAGEMENT CONSULTANTS

The Board received and considered a report (340 pages in length including charts and graphs) received from Warnock Hersey Management Consultants Ltd., who had been appointed to conduct a survey of the management and operations of the Club.

The Board authorized the Management Consultants to prepare a synopsis of their findings (at a cost not to exceed \$400.00), the synopsis to be published in "Dogs in Canada" with an invitation to members to submit their comments to the Secretary so as to be received not later than December 15, 1965. While every member of the Board had been provided with a copy of the report received from the Management Consultants it was decided that each member of the Board would also be provided with a copy of the synopsis, and that each member of the Board may discuss all aspects of the Management Consultant's report with as many members of the Club as possible in any manner he or she sees fit, and that each would submit a report at the next annual meeting of the Board.

Mr. Wells was appointed Chairman of a special committee "to study all the cumbersome methods of the operation of our present rules and regulations and amendments thereto".

In addition to the \$2,000 already paid on account, the Board authorized the payment to the Management Consultants of \$2,645.96.

STAFF

On the basis of a salary schedule suggested by the Management Consultants, the salary of N. F. Brown (Secretary-Treasurer and Executive Manager) was increased from \$175,00 per week to \$184.80 per week, retroactive to Jamary 1, 1965. The setting of salaries for the remaining members of the staff was left in the hands of the Executive Manager.

It was agreed that the Secretary may extend the present two-week vacation period to three weeks after a member of the staff has been employed by the Club for a period of five years.

The practice of including a breakdown of salaries in the annual statements was ordered discontinued.

In view of the recommendation for the organization of the office as reported by the Management Consultants, the Secretary-Treasurer was instructed "to employ a capable office administrator having the ability and integrity that the position demands, at a salary not to exceed \$7,000 per annum, with the prospective of relieving Mr. Brown of his present overload of detail work and at the same time reorganizing our whole office structure in order to achieve greater efficiency with no additional staff but rather adjustment of present complement where found necessary!

PROMOTION, PUBLICITY AND PUBLIC RELATIONS

Mr. Ashcroft, Chairman of the Promotion, Publicity and Public Relations Committee, drew the Board's attention to a press clipping reporting that the Canadian Hereford Association "is cracking down on persons selling live stock they falsely claim is 'pure-bred'", and in conjunction with that Association's programme the Canada Department of Agriculture "is making 'warning' signs available for all community auction markets".

The Chairman of the Committee was authorized to approach the Department of Agriculture regarding the signs it is supplying the Hereford Association.

RULES OF ORDER

The Club's By-laws provide that "Rules of Order, as found in 'How to Conduct Public Meetings in Canada', by H. G. MacGill shall govern meetings of the Club and Board." The Secretary reported to the Board that while he had endeavoured to obtain copies of this book for each member of the Board, he had been advised by the publishers that the book is "out of prize". "out of print".

It being felt that Rules of Order governing meetings of the Club and Board should be in a form which members of the Board and members of the Club can readily obtain, the Secretary was instructed to poll the national Board on whether the following proposed amendment should be included in the special referendum ballot to be conducted concurrent with the next regular referendum ballot:

"IT IS PROPOSED THAT:

Article XVII, ORDER AND CONDUCT OF BUSINESS, of the Club's By-laws, be amended by the deletion of Section 2 in its entirety, and the following be substituted therefor:

12. Rules of Order, as found in "Bourinot's Rules of Order" revised by J. Gordon Dubroy and published by McClelland and Stewart Limited, 1963, shall govern meetings of the Club and Board, so far as they are applicable and not inconsistent with the provisions of these By-laws."

C. K. C. ARCHIVES

Mrs. Sheila Anderson was appointed Chairman of the C. K. C. Archives Committee, with power to add to the Committee.

SPECIAL REFERENDUM BALLOT - 1965

The Board authorized the conducting of a special referendum ballot concurrent with the next regular referendum ballot, the ballot to include such proposed amendments to the Club's By-laws and rules as the Board may authorize pursuant to the provisions of Section 17 of Article XXXVIII of the Club's By-laws.

The Board authorized the inclusion of the following proposed amendments in the special referendum ballot:

(1) A proposed amendment to Chapter 17 (DISQUALIFICATIONS) Section 2 (a) of the Dog Show Rules, deleting Toy Manchester Terriers and substituting Miniature Pinschers. Also a proposed amendment to the same section adding Cavalier King Charles Spaniels after Toy Spaniels.

(2) A proposed amendment to Chapter 4, Section 3, of the Dog Show Rules, deleting the provision for the entry of dogs for "Specials Only".

(3) A proposed amendment to Chapter 1, Section 20 (AMENDMENTS) of

Only⁶.

A proposed amendment to Chapter 1, Section 20 (AMENDMENTS) of the Obedience Trial Regulations and Standards, giving the Board the power to deal with proposed amendments to the Regulations and Standards, subject to the requirements to be set out in the proposed amendment. The special referendum ballot will also include as a complementary amendment to the foregoing, a proposed amendment to Article XXXIX. (4)

complementary amendment to the foregoing, a proposed amendment to Article XXXIX.

A proposed amendment to Article XII (ELECTIONS) of the By-laws to prescribe the action to be taken if a candidate should die in the period between the printing of the ballots and the close of balloting. A proposed amendment to Article X, Section 5, of the By-laws to give the Chairman of a meeting of the Board the right to vote on motions (and amendments thereto) at a meeting of the Board.

Because Section 17 of Chapter XXXVIII of the Club's By-laws requires that not less than eleven members of the Board must be in favour of the inclusion in a special referendum bailot of a proposed amendment being put forward by the Board, the President ruled that the following resolutions adopted at this meeting of the Board had no force or effect:

(1) A resolution (which carried by a vote of 10 in favour, 2 opposed)

authorizing the inclusion in the special referendum ballot of a proposed amendment to Section I (1) of Article XXXVIII of the By-laws to provide that the By-laws, Dog Show Rules, and the Obedience Trial Regulations may be amended by a majority affirmative vote on a referendum ballot to be voted upon in the years ending with an odd digit (i. e. 1967, 1969, 1971, etc.). (NOTE: The primary intent of this proposed amendment being that the regular referendum ballot would be conducted concurrent with the biennial election of Officers and Directors). A resolution (which carried by a vote of 10 in favour, 2 opposed) authorizing the inclusion in the special referendum ballot of a proposed amendment to Section 1 (1) of Article XXXVIII of the By-laws to provide that the By-laws and the Dog Show Rules may be amended by a majority affirmative vote on a referendum ballot to be voted upon in the years ending with an odd digit.

QUINQUENNIAL ADJUSTMENT

The Club's By-laws provide that every five years calculations will be made to determine the number of Directors to be elected in each electoral zone for the succeeding five years and such a calculation is to be made in 1965 for the purpose of determining the number of Directors to be elected for the years 1966 to 1970 inclusive.

The Board received the report of the Secretary-Treasurer which indicated that, except for the Province of Quebec (where two Directors are now to be elected), there was no change in the number of Directors to be elected for any of the other electoral zones.

The Club's solicitor and the Secretary-Treasurer were appointed a committee to review the present provisions of the By-laws with regard to the determination of the number of Directors.

BERMUDA KENNEL CLUB

The Executive Manager was authorized to go to Bermuda as a guest of the Bermuda Kennel Club for the purpose of discussing arrange ments leading to the eventual termination of the Club's registration of dogs not born in Canada owned in Bermuda, and of the Bermuda Kennel Club's holding their championship shows and licensed obedience trials

APPOINTMENTS FOR 1965

Pursuant to authorization given by the Board at its annual meeting Mr. Ashcroft had named Mrs. Monica Torrance as Obedience Represen-tative for Manitoba and Mr. Fred Ward as the Manitoba Field Trial Representative for Retrievers

No action was taken by the Board with regard to the appointment of Dog Show Representatives permissible by virtue of Article XIII, Section 12 of the Club's By-laws.

Mr. John McNicol and Mr. A. H. Lake were appointed to the Amendments Committee (Dog Show Rules).

On the recommendation of Mr. Duff, the following appointments on the recommendation of Mr. Dull, the lollowing appointments were made for Nova Soctia and Newfoundland:
Advisory Provincial Committee: M. G. Andrews, Harvey Gratton, E. C. St. John Green, H. Johnson, John J. LeMoine.
Field Trial Representative for Beagles (Brace): Robert McGlashing.
Field Trial Representative for Spaniels: Craig McDonald. Obedience Representative: Lloyd Hill.

MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

APPLICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP

In the course of considering a number of applications for membership referred to it for special consideration, the Board: (a) rejected the application of a partnership for associate membership on the grounds that one of the partners had failed to provide the purchaser with a certificate of registration for a dog sold as pure-bred; (b) rejected an application for ordinary membership on the grounds that the applicant is not maintaining private breeding records in proper form; (c) rejected an application for associate membership on the grounds that the applicant, while having supplied certificates to a number of complainants, had a past record of having taken an unreasonably long time to supply certificates of registration.

MISCELLANEOUS MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

The Board decided that on receipt of a complaint that a member of the Club is engaged in the breeding, buying or selling of cross-bred dogs, the Board will take appropriate action. However, the Board ruled that a member, employed strictly on a salary basis by a pound or human society, selling dogs on behalf of the pound or society, is not by such act acting contrary to the provisions of the Club's By-laws which provide that a person cannot become or remain a member of the Club if engaged in the breeding, buying or selling of dogs which are not pure-bred. Here it should be noted that "pure-bred" insofar as it concerns dogs, means a dog registered individually in the records of The Canadian Kennel Club or eligible for registration in the Club's records.

DOG SHOWS

JUDGES

On the grounds that a show-giving club is free to require that a judge it is about to engage must agree that, as a term of his engagement, he would not judge at any other show within a stated time and distance of their show, the Board decided that it would not reinstate a previous policy prohibiting the approval of a person to judge the same breed in the same zone within a period of three months less two weeks.

In connection with the selection by a show-giving club of a resident of the United Kingdom to judge at a championship show to be held under C. K. C. rules, the Board ruled that judging engagements at Open Shows in the United Kingdom would not count in the determination of the breeds for which the person selected may be approved. Having regard for the provisions of Section 1 (a) of Chapter 7 (ELIGIBILITY FOR APPROVAL TO JUDGE), the Secretary was instructed to communicate with the Kennel Club (England) and enquire whether or not the Kennel Club would be

prepared, when a resident of the United Kingdom is invited to judge at a championship show in Canada, to state whether or not it approves of the proposed engagement in part or whole.

The Secretary was instructed to inform Mr. Manuel Barra of Mexico, that if invited to judge at a championship show held under C.K.C. rules, he may be approved to judge the following breeds: Airedale Terriers, Bedlington Terriers, Fox Terriers, Irish Terriers, Kerry Blue Terriers, Lakeland Terriers, and Welsh Terriers.

RING STEWARDS

Reference was made to Chapter 13 (RING STEWARDS) of the Dog Show Rules, and a ruling was sought in the following hypothetical situation: Mrs. Green is ring steward for Judge "A" in Ring #1. Judge "B" is officiating in Ring #2 as judge of breeds in Group #6 at the breed level, and under Judge "B" Mr. Green exhibits Mrs. Green's Standard Poodle which is awarded Best of Breed, Judge "A" is scheduled to judge Group #6 at the Group level. Is Mrs. Green's Poodle eligible, or required to compete, at the Group level under Judge "A"?

The Board ruled that the dog is not eligible to compete under Judge "A" for whom its owner ring stewarded at the show, and its owner would be violating Section 3 (o) of Chapter 4 of the Dog Show Rules if she does not place her dog in group competition at the show. In short, Mrs. Gree should realize the possibility, before agreeing to ring steward for Judge "A", that her dog may receive an award which calls for her to place the dog in competition under Judge "A" and should therefore decline the ring stewarding assignment, or be prepared to accept the consequences.

MEASURING AND WEIGHING

The ruling of the Board was sought on whether or not the owner (or handler) of a dog competing at the Group or General Specials level may call for the measurement of a dog, in a breed having a height limitation, competing in a group or for a General Special, if the dog in said breed had not been measured at the show. The Board ruled that a competitor at the group level or General Specials level may challenge a dog on the grounds of height or weight (where a disqualification applies) if the dog was not officially weighed or measured previously at the show, and if weighed or measured out at the show all awards and points earned at the show shall be cancelled.

AMENDMENTS TO DOG SHOW RULES

Referred to the Dog Show Council for the preparation of appropriate proposed amendments was a proposal that the Dog Show Rules be amended to provide that while a dog is required to compete for all awards for which it is eligible up to the breed level, it shall be at the option of the owner (or handler) whether the dog competes for any higher award for which it may be eligible.

Referred to the Dog Show Council for consideration and, if deemed advisable, the preparation of appropriate proposed amendments were the following questions:

the elimination from the Dog Show Rules of provision for the award-ing of challenge trophies; a rule to prohibit, at championship show or other event, a lottery

ORDER OF JUDGING AND JUDGING SCHEDULE

Reference was made to the provisions of Section 16 of Chapter 16 of the Dog Show Rules, and the Board instructed the Secretary to advise show-giving clubs that a schedule, in the form approved by the Board, must be sent out to exhibitors, after entries close, along with acknowledgment of entries and identification cards, the schedule to be drawn on the basis of 20 dogs per hour on breed judging.

The Board ruled that the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 19 of the Dog Show Rules, regarding the issuance of a "judging programme" applied to all championship shows and not only to unbenched championship shows.

SANCTION SHOWS

Clubs holding sanction shows are free to use the same style of judges books as are employed at championship shows,

No action was taken on a proposal that the colour of ribbon for Best Canadian-bred Puppy at a sanction show be changed from pink to lavender on the grounds that the latter colour could be confused with the colour of the ribbon prescribed for the award of Reserve Winners at championship

Following the annual meeting of the Board show-giving clubs were sked to submit their views on the following questions:

a) a proposal that a specialty club would be permitted to hold a specialty show only for the breed or breeds indicated by its club name;
b) a proposal that permission to hold an all-breed show would be granted only to exhibitions, fairs, and clubs and associations recognized as all-breed clubs;

3) the granting of the symptom that the standard thad the standard that the standard that the standard that the stan

the question of the spacing (datewise) between shows in a zone,

The Board reviewed the replies received from show-giving clubs and decided that it would give consideration to providing for amendment to the Dog Show Rules to the effect that clubs or associations may only be allowed to hold such championship shows as are designated in the name of a club, association or organization.

The Secretary was instructed to prepare and submit to the next annual meeting of the Board proposed regulations regarding the registration of clubs by The Canadian Kennel Club for the purpose of controlling the formation of clubs and the allocation of show and trial dates.

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINT RATINGS

The Secretary was instructed to publish in "Dogs in Canada" a pro-posal submitted by Mr. George Frost and other members with regard to the championship requirements for German Shepherd Dogs, and to invite

the comments of interested clubs and individuals for the consideration of the Board at its next annual meeting.

Effective January 1, 1966 the schedule of championship point ratings for all zones will be altered to require two dogs for one point (rather than one dog for one point) in Chow Chows. This action was taken on the recommendation of the Chow Chow Club of Canada.

Proposals submitted at the last annual general meeting by Mrs. Ena Stewart regarding proposed amendments to Chapter 21 (Champions and Championship Points) of the Dog Show Rules were ordered referred to the next annual meeting of the Board for consideration.

The ruling of the Board was sought on whether or not, in the following situation, a dog is considered to have defeated "at least one dog in its own breed" (Chapter 21, Section 8 of the Dog Show Rules):

One male and one female entered in the breed. The male is awarded ist in the Open Class, Winners and Best of Breed. The female, due to lack of merit in the judge's opinion, is placed 2nd in the Open Class and is awarded Best of Opposite Sex but is not awarded Winners Female.

The Board ruled that in this situation there must not be a Best of Winners award, and the male awarded Best of Breed had not defeated, at that particular show, "at least one dog in its own breed".

SHOW OFFICIALS

Ordered held over for further consideration at a future meeting of the Board was a proposal that steps be taken to require each show-giving club to arrange for the instruction of those who would, in due course, take over positions as show officials, more particularly the position of show secretary.

VETERINARY INSPECTION

It was decided that approval would not be given the inclusion in a pre-mium list of a championship show of a statement to the effect that while veterinary inspection would be available during specified hours at a cham-pionship show, veterinary inspection for later arrivals would be the res-ponsibility of the owner or handler.

JUNIOR KENNEL CLUBS

The Secretary read a letter (received on March 17th) from Mrs. Freda Clementi, Milk River, Alta., asking that he convey to the Board Mrs. Clementi's "appreciation of the tremendous work Mrs. Murray and her Junior Kennel Club put into the Sanction Show last Sunday".

SHOW SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT FORM

The Board decided that, effective January 1, 1966, each dog show superintendent would be required to submit a report in a form suggested by the Dog Show Council, all such reports to be submitted to the Chairman of the Dog Show Council.

DOG SHOW RULES IN FRENCH

Consideration was given to having the Dog Show Rules translated and published in French; however, in view of the formation of a committee to review these rules, this question was ordered referred to the next annual

OBEDIENCE TRIALS

AMENDMENTS TO OBEDIENCE TRIAL REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS

Mr. George Mehlenbacher, Chairman of the Obedience Council, reported that after considering the views of Obedience Representatives and members of the Council, it was the recommendation of the Council that changes in the Obedience Regulations adopted by The American Kennel Club (declared effective July 1, 1964) be published in "Dogs in Canada", such changes to be considered by the Board at its next annual meeting along with the views received from clubs and individuals in response to the invitation to be published with the changes enumerated by Mr. Mehlensacher. The Board concurred with the recommendation of the Council.

TRAINING CLASSES

After considering the Council's report as submitted by Mr. Mehlen-bacher, the Board decided that "no action be taken at this time on the con-trol of training classes".

JUDGES

After considering a report from the Obedience Council the Board decided that, effective January 1, 1966, all obedience judges must be re-examined each and every five years, the examination to be the written examination only except that if the judge fails the written examination he must successfully pass an oral examination; that all judges who have not previously passed written and oral examinations must requalify by December 31, 1966, and all who had previously passed written and oral examinations must requalify within five years from the date on which each established eligibility to judge, but in all cases every judge shall have not less than one year from January 1, 1966 to requalify.

Mr. Mehlenbacher reported on the results of written and oral examinations taken by four applicants seeking to establish eligibility to judge one or more obedience classes. Approval was granted the addition of the names of the following to the list of persons eligible for approval to judge the Novice, Open and Utility Classes: Richard S. Ross, Philadelphia, Pa., and Edward R. Anderson, Wayne, Pa.

The Secretary was instructed to inform one applicant that further experience was required before examinations may be taken, although the applicant may reapply after the expiration of six months.

JUDGES' SEMINARS

On the recommendation of Mr. Mehlenbacher the Board authorized the setting up of obedience judges' seminars under the jurisdiction of the Obedience Council through the Obedience Representatives, and authorized the payment of out-of-pocket expenses (not to exceed \$500 during the next 12 months) for which proper expense vouchers are submitted.

The Board upheld the ruling of the Secretary that the provisions of Subsection 3, Section 7, Chapter 1 of the Obedience Regulations apply also in the case where an obedience club is holding a licensed obedience trial in conjunction with a championship show held by another club. It directed however, that the question of whether this rule should be amended be referred to the Obedience Council for a recommendation and report to the

FIELD TRIALS

FIELD TRIALS FOR FOXHOUNDS

Mr. W. J. Monaghan, Chairman of the Field Trial Council for Fox-

- is: reported that the annual meeting of the All-Canadian Fox Hunters! Association had been held at Napanee on May 29th, and that he had attended the meeting; reported that the next meeting of the Association would likely take place on April 30, 1966; reported that seven Foxhound clubs are affiliated with the Associa-

- tion; reported that a dearth of foxes was still a problem but there was an improvement in the Lindsay, Ontario and Quyon, Quebec areas; stated that a final decision had not yet been made as to whether the "National" would be held this year, but if so, it would be held on November 25th, 26th and 27th; pointed out that proposed new running rules for Foxhound trials had been reviewed and submitted to The Canadian Kennel Club in 1964 and had been referred to the Field Trial Council; proposed that the running rules as drafted and submitted be published in "Dogs in Canada" and comments invited in order that the Board may reach a final decision at its next annual meeting.

FIELD TRIALS FOR POINTING BREEDS

On the recommendation of Mr. Robert Little, Chairman of the Field Trial Council for Pointing Breeds, the Board adopted the Gaines "Standards of Judicial Practice and Field Trial Procedure" as a guide for pointing breeds field trials and instructed the Secretary to obtain a supply of these Standards for distribution to clubs and individuals who wish to pur-

Mr. Little further reported that The American Kennel Club is now giving consideration to amendments to its field trial rules for pointing breeds and in due course the Council would review any changes adopted by the A. K. C.

He also reported that consideration would be given to a "National" Stake (or Stakes) for pointing breeds.

On Mr. Little's recommendation, the Secretary was instructed to prepare and distribute to pointing breeds clubs a list of all such clubs (the names and addresses of their respective secretaries) in order that such clubs may communicate with one another on matters of mutual inter-

Ordered referred to the Council for consideration was the question of whether a club may run a stake restricted to a particular breed or

FIELD TRIALS FOR BEAGLES

As requested by Mrs. Edna Joel, Chairman of the Field Trial Council for Beagles, the Board ruled that when a Beagle has been officially measured by the C.K.C. on the application of its owner and has been found to exceed 15" in height, its owner is to be informed that the dog is not eligible for entry at future licensed Beagle trials held under C, K, C, rules, and if entered in spite of such warning, the awards and championship points which it may earn will be cancelled.

On the recommendation of Mr. Warren Anderson, Beagle Field Trial Representative for Nova Scotia and Newfoundland, Mr. Frank Mayne and Mr. Robert McGlashing were appointed Official Measurers of Beagles.

Mrs. Joel reported that the name of Mr. Hubert Froats, Long Sault, Ontario, had been added to the list of persons approved to judge Beagle (Pack) field trials.

FIELD TRIALS FOR RETRIEVERS

On the report of Mr. "Vic" Williams, Chairman of the Field Trial Council for Retrievers, that an overwhelming majority of the members of the Field Trial Council was in favour of the establishment of such a policy, the Board ruled that the same judge may not be approved to judge the Open All-Age Stakes on consecutive dates even though the trial-giving club may wish to pair him with a different judge each day.

- Mr. Williams reported that, as asked by the Board at its annual meeting, he had consulted the Council on the following questions:

 (1) a proposal that the total points required for a field trial champion—ship in Retrievers should be increased from 10 to 15, and points be allocated in the Junior and Qualifying Stakes;

 (2) the question of whether the Field Trial Rules should be amended to exclude "altered dogs";

 and reported that in both cases an overwhelming majority of members of the Council opposed any change in the Field Trial Rules. In view of the Chairman's report, the Board took no action on these questions.

Mr. Williams reported that, as authorized by the Board, he had consulted the Council on the question of The Canadian Kennel Club promoting judges' seminars and reported that it was the unanimous reaction of the members of the Council that such activity is very worth while and should be instituted. Mr. Williams suggested that for the purpose of organizing judges' seminars and allocating funds, the country be segregated into the following zones: British Columbia (2), Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario (2), Quebec, New Brunswick & Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia & Newfoundland.

The Board authorized the setting up of judges' seminars for Retriever field trial judges, the mechanics to be left to the Field Trial Council, subject to the Board's approval, and for the purpose of financing

judges' seminars allotted funds as follows: B, C, \$200; Ontario \$300; and \$100 to each of the other zones set out above.

FIELD TRIALS FOR SPANIELS

On the recommendation of Mr. W. J. Monaghan, Chairman of the Field Trial Council for Spaniels, the Board directed that the following be published in "Dogs in Canada" with an invitation to those interested to submit their comments for the consideration of the Council and for the consideration of the Board at its next annual meeting:

(1) the draft of a proposed addition to the Field Trial Rules and Regulations:

the draft of instructions for the handling of birds at field trials; the draft of a proposed amendment to Section 13 of Chapter 11 with regard to the Puppy Stake; the draft of a proposed Working Test,

ADJOURNMENT

The semi-annual meeting of the Board adjourned on June 21st.

A special meeting of the Board was held on April 28th specifically for the purpose of dealing with complaints, charges and protests.

In the course of dealing with these files referred to it by the Complaints Committee, the Board: (a) decided that a certificate of registration would be returned to the owner of a dog only after the dog had been properly re-identified; (b) cancelled the registration of two dogs; (c) severely reprimanded an exhibitor at a field trial following an investigation of the alleged conduct of the exhibitor at the trial; (d) gave a member one month to arrange for the registration and transfer of two imported dogs or elect a formal hearing of two complaints; (e) gave another member fifteen days in which to submit an application for registration and transfer or elect a formal hearing of a complaint received from the purchaser; (f) appointed advisory committees to investigate two complaints; (g) cancelled awards to a number of dogs exhibited at two championship shows and at one licensed field trial when applications for registration of lease clearly indicated that the dogs had been leased for competitive purposes (Section 1 of Chapter 7 of the Field Trial Rules provides that "the right to run a dog cannot be transferred" and Section 6 of Chapter 16 of the Dog Show Rules provides that "the right to exhibit a dog cannot be transferred"). transferred").

April 6. It consisted of seven males and 11 females. Of the total, ten puppies survived the rather complicated birth and of these one puppy died at three days. Of the then surviving nine pups we raised two males and seven females with long days and nights of countless supplementary feedings and constant surveillance, necessitated by the extreme variation in birth weights (from seven to 18 ounces) and the apparent fading in three puppies.

"We were recently thrilled to have a visit from Moryci's Marco Polo birth weight seven ounces, weight at 31/2 months, 51 pounds! The rest of the litter has, to the best of our knowledge, achieved approximately the same weight, with the females being slightly smaller, as is the normal pattern.

"The measure of our success is due in no small part to the dedication of Dr. A. L. Kassirer, who made numerous house calls at all hours through the critical periods. Through this experience we were nobly assisted by other Ottawa KC members and friends, and our thanks is herewith expressed."

TV Show Bears Out Samoyed History

On a recent Sunday afternoon I stumbled on a short half-hour program a sort of humorous travelogue on Japan showing a white tourist on his rounds on the Island of Hokkaido.

It informed us that this island's tribe were known as the "hairy Ainus". They were divided into two groups, one group deriving their income from making and selling curios to the tourists while the other group remained on the sea coast and earned their livelihood by fishing.

Much to my astonishment and delight, in one brief flash of this fishing group, I discerned what just had to be a Samoyed running happily around on the beach. This interested me very much and I immediately got out an old copy of the Book of Knowledge which had been gathering dust for several years and decided to find out what I could about these people, the Ainus. The pronunciation is "I-noos" with accent on the "I".

Much to my delight I soon came across just the information I was seeking.

"It is generally thought that the first people, after the cave dwellers, to settle in Japan were the Ainus, who probably crossed over from Siberia; and a delightful change they must have found it in the Southern islands, with their pleasant, fertile country. The climate on the east coast of Japan is tempered by a warm stream from the south, just as the northwest coast of Britain is washed by the warm Gulf stream from across the Atlantic. The Ainus, however, were ever pushed back from the

more desirable parts of the land by newcomers of higher civilization . . but the Ainus have never been driven right out of the country. There are still some thousands of them in north Japan, living apart from the other people. They are remarkable for their general hairiness"

Those of us who have delved into the history of the Samoyede tribe of Siberia have read where they originally lived way to the South but that advancing civilization gradually pushed them farther and farther north to find food for their reindeer and eventually settling in Siberia. These two stories are so similar I feel these could be of the same trible of people.

In a singular burst of competition, Samoyeds had the largest entry of the entire show at the Kingston and District KC held June 20. This may be a Canadian record for the breed.

The splendid representation was the result of the efforts of the members of the newly formed Samoyed Association of Canada in supporting their first booster show.

The Association, F. T. Freeman informs Dogs, is for the express purpose of improving the breed and enquiries for membership are welcome. They should be addressed to the Secretary, Miss Joan Aitchison, 1157 Montreal St., Kingston, Ont.

Of particular interest to fanciers of the breed is that one of the membership requirements is that applicants must agree to X-ray all breeding stock and to breed only those dogs thus shown to be free of hip dysplasia.

"While it is known that this will reduce the number of applicants for membership, it is also felt that this is a major step forward in combating this condition. To date we have been highly complimented by several leading authorities on hip dysplasia in both Canada and the United States for taking such action."

The Story Behind the Amazing Corgi

PART ONE

It is generally accepted that the native dog of any country resembles the fox, wolf or jackal, and there is a good deal of evidence that the early dogs in Britain were similar in appearance to the Cardigan Welsh Corgi.

There is little doubt that the longtailed Cardigans were the ancestors of the short-tailed Pembrokes and the two breeds were not separately recognized by The Kennel Club until 1934.

Originally all dogs must have been of a "general utility" type, and by degrees those showing particular ap-

titude for any work such as hunting, tracking, or herding were selected and trained for such specialized occupations.

During the course of centuries many different peoples and tribes visited Britain, some peaceably, some aggressively, and by degrees the early Britons, with their animals were driven into Wales. On the long journey dogs were essential for helping their masters to keep the stock together, and drive off marauding bands, and beasts of prey.

In the ninth and tenth centuries the Vikings made many visitations to South Wales and it is probable that they brought with them the pastoral Vallhunds, which would have interbred with the native dogs. The Vallhund is still present in Sweden and is very similar in appearance to the Pembroke Corgi.

The versatility of Corgis, their intelligence, desire to please and quickness to learn, makes them adaptable to most circumstances and occupations and although classed as "non-sporting", "general utility" would seem a better term.

It must be remembered that the Corgi is the "Homestead" dog, and for centuries has combined herding with guarding his people and their house and land. The latent urge to herd remains very strong, even with those Corgis who have been kennel-bred for several generations, and the majority of them take quickly to work on a farm.

They are affectionate, watchful companions, but any sporting activity does not come amiss. They are expert ratters and mousers and amazingly nimble at catching the odd rabbit. Indeed they have been known to kill foxes and hares. They will help land a fish, scare off birds of prey and many make good rough shooting dogs as they will go into gorse, brambles or water, to flush or retrieve their game. Nevertheless, they can be trusted to look after young stock and poultry and most of them extend their protective instinct to babies and children.

The present day Corgis do not often have the opportunity to employ their instincts and abilities, but they are essentially dogs who like occupation and will think up a variety of jobs for themselves. These can include the usual repetoire of tricks, guarding the baby in the pram, the larder, the tortoise, or any special household god, and many excel at obedience test work. Corgis are excellent housedogs, easy to train and fastidiously clean.

So much for the characteristics of Corgis as I have known them for some 50 years. As regards appearance, there is still some variance amongst breeders and judges as to the correct type and the standard seems to suffer a variety of interpretation, which makes for a deal of confusion amongst novice owners.

For guidance, turning to photographs of champions can be misleading, for some may be bad likenesses, while other photographs may portray lucky dogs who have largely gained their titles through good showmanship, which can tone down a multitude of faults. Nor can price be taken as a measuring stick of excellence, as a good many dogs have been sold for more than their true value.

Individuals suggestive of Pomeranian, Schipperke, Keeshond, Collie and even Staffordshire Bull Terrier still occasionally occur and seem to find favor with some people. These breeds may have been accidentally or indeed intentionally introduced, to "improve" certain points. The odd thing is that Corgis suggesting these breeds also seem to carry many of their characteristics in an exaggerated degree. While I have nothing against the Pom proper, the "Pom Corgi" combines undesirable traits both physical and temperamental. They are usually light of bone and build, with small heads and ears and short backs. They have shrill voices which they exercise to excess and are apt to be snappy and generally tiresome.

To my mind, the "Schipperke" build is also unattractive in a Corgi, even though the temperament does not seem to suffer so much.

The "Bull Terrier" head, with a rather small eye, usually accompanies very straight strong forelegs and they are short and strong over their loins. While they have plenty of intelligence and courage, they are not above a fight, if one comes their way.

The "Collie" brand is too long in the fore-face, rather narrow in skull and carries too much coat, and they are not amongst the most intelligent.

The type which suggests a small barge dog, or "Keeshond" is often sable with a dense coat and tail set rather high. One can imagine that had the tail been there it would have been carried with a curl over the loins! Oddly enough, these are nearly always intrigued by water and love nothing better than fishing from a boat, when they will help land fish, giving a skilful nip through the head before throwing them on the bottom of the boat. They will keep a look-out for seals and bark and draw attention to their presence. They show great excitement when a hose-pipe or bucket of water is being used, when they will dash about and seize mouthfuls of spray, not minding how wet they get. Their coats dry very quickly, they dislike mud and always seem to return from a walk clean and tidy.

passed away before he had a chance to really get started.

One morning my phone rang. "The Trust Co. speaking, Mr. Kynoch. Are you interested in purchasing two Wire Fox Terriers, Ulida Battle male, and Wendy St. George, both registered, the property of the late Mr. Griffin.' What's the price? "Twenty dollars." O.K. Send them up, and I will take them. In an hour or so along came the delivery truck, dogs, all papers and a \$20.00 Backest Crate. driver handed me a bill. Two dogs, \$20.00. \$10.00 each. Asked driver if there was any mistake, no, that's the price. On looking them over, I found that the male had half of his left ear torn off, but he was a good dog.

Two days after Mr. Foster, from Oshkosh, Wisc., called at the kennel and wanted a Wire stud dog and bought him for \$75.00, minus half his ear. Just wanted a stud dog.

I then looked over the ball of wool and found Wendy was in whelp and in three weeks gave me a beautiful litter of seven puppies, five males and two females. She was a beautiful mother and raised all the puppies.

When they were eight weeks old, I sold them all, from \$75.00 to \$100.00, which was a good price those days. Now comes the heartbreaker! Wendy had jumped out of the loft window and I never saw her for four months. One Sunday morning my good friend Mr. Charlie Cowell, a good dog man, spotted her on Pembina Hwy. with some children and called her by name and sure enough it was Wendy. I was lucky, as she was coming in season, I eventually bred her to a dog I bought in the New York show from Billie Livesley and had six puppies, four males and two females. I sold three to Alex Stewart of Chicago.

Then came the fun. Stripped her coat and what a dog. Started to show and was never beaten with her. The big test came when George Steadman Thomas came to judge the Winnipeg show. Mr. Thomas said to me, "George, where did this one come from, and who is she." I said, this is the \$10.00 Champion. "Ten dollars," he said. "I will give you \$300.00 for her." I said, I know what I have got, and I want \$1,500.00 for her.

After the show, he came to my ken-nel and I sold him five English Setters, \$1,800.00. They were good stuff. He said, "you ought to throw in the Wire bitch in the deal." I said, yes, for \$1,500.00. In two weeks I shipped him the Setters. Phoned me to say they had arrived and in good shape. He then said, "what about the Wire bitch. I have a man that is willing to pay \$1,200.00 for her." So after a while I said, I will take \$1,300.00 for her. "It's a deal," he said. So I shipped her to him in her \$20.00 crate.

In the following February I was at the New York show, showing Springers, and we decided to go to the Terrier Specialty Show and to my delight the \$10.00 bitch champion,

Wendy St. George, went Best of Breed. Then owned by Mr. Homer Gage, I must say it was quite a thrill to me to see her do it.

To finish this story, my advice is, you never now what you are selling and the experts cannot be sure what they are keeping or selling, so God bless Wendy, she did me a good turn. -George Kynoch

Just What is A Kerry Blue? PART TWO

To the extent that the breeding of animals links the past and the present with the future, accurate knowledge of the past becomes one of the first requisites of successful breeding, and it is here where throughout dogdom, an impenetrable jungle confronts the researcher. Trying to trace a dog's virtues or faults back to its source of origin, the breeder finds himself stopped cold just a few generations back for lack of records. The detailed characteristics of a dog, dead perhaps only five or six years, are shrouded in mystery. There may be a few people around who still remember him, but their memory is so hazy and unreliable that a specific question of the dog's anatomy or behavior when asked of three different breeders may well elicit three completely different answers. Even this, at best questionable, fount of information peters out with ancestors still further back often having lived and died abroad.

It was this situation which confronted a group of Canadians who three years ago began to ask themselves these and other questions, and set out to find the answers, using the Kerry Blue Terrier as a basis.

The most natural move, initially, was to find out what the breeders of other types of livestock were doing, and if any research had been done on dogs, which meant writing and visiting the Dominion Experimental farms, checking with Veterinary Colleges, both in Canada and the U.S. Geneticists at Universities were questioned. Feed companies were written; we sought out every avenue in which information might be available.

It was discovered that Holstein breeders had for years kept records of milk production and butter fat content (Records of Production), and had measured their animals physically to the most minute detail, and are still doing so with recent generations. With fieldmen who visit the herds and appraise them, they continue these records, which have apparently been processed for several years. Conferences were held, the result of which produced a panel of highly knowledgeable men who worked with a sculptor for weeks, while he produced their concept of a "Model of Perfection" of both a cow and bull; animals of such bone structure that should be able to produce the maximum amount of milk with the highest butterfat content. This "model" was to serve as a goal for all Holstein breeders, so that herds could be appraised on a

In other areas of livestock breeding, we found similar efforts. Sheep and swine breeders have also maintained records, the results of which are found in the higher quality and amount of meat per animal which is in evidence today.

The mink breeders apparently have a most complete arrangement, as they are dealing with a luxury trade, and must produce new colors that will appeal to the public; colors that will not fade, and can be bred consistently. They have secured the permanent services of geneticists, many of whom hold doctorate degrees, to work for their benefit. Their records concerning color and breeding data are in the form of almost unbelievable detail.

It is true, these breeders are trying to produce a commodity as uniformly and as economically as is possible. Not at all in contrast to these breeders are the many thousands of us who are trying to breed a commodity not unlike those mentioned. Just because breeding purebred dogs is a costly enterprise at best, don't underestimate its potentials. The breeders of purebred dogs support a tremendous and most enterprising industry, the dog food and products business, in addition thousands of small animal veterinarians, and many other fields whose financial basis is directly related to the breeding of dogs.

Yes, we have a commodity . . . in dogs. It is a family pet that takes most of this business, therefore temperament is our prime objective along with disease resistance. Other factors such as size, coat, color and quality, are equally important to the pet market as well as those breederexhibitors, as we must, like any other industry, produce a saleable product.

The admirers: Jacqueline Kennedy and son Jon-Jon.

Scottish Terrier Trends: The Fashion Hint Line

In January of 1937 British Ch. Heather Necessity died and with his death closed an era in which, thanks to the prestige of this famous dog and his sons, the breed had enjoyed a period of high public favor. The Necessity bloodlines were much in demand as well as those of his contemporary at stud, British Ch. Albourne Barty. Emphasis was almost entirely

on imported sons and grandsons of these two, which America seemed to possess in abundance and were some of England's best. They were to be the foundation of America and the beginning of a new era in Scottiedom.

Both Necessity and Fashion Hint were fortunate in the quality of and number of their sons, the former sired 18 and the latter 21 champions. About 1940 the American line from Fashion Hint started a downward trend, while in the same period his half-brother, Ch. Heather Ambition, topped all others.

In England during this period or decade the war curtailed breeding programs and halted show activities. The last pre-war champion appeared in 1939.

In 1953 the descendants of Heather Asset and Ch. Ortley Ambassador were in the lead and, passed on down through Fashion Hint, produced 23 of the 59 champions while Ambition descendants produced 19. As this line faded into the background the Barty descendants moved into second place behind Fashion Hint, a position they held for six years.

During the first five years of the decade Fashion Hint champions were derived almost entirely from the Ch. Walsing Warrant's grandsons, until this day Ch. Deephaven Dividend and Deephaven Red Seal, Ch. Glenbrae Navigator, Ch. (Can. & Am.) Cedaroot Gayde's Gold, are continuing the line through their sons and grand-

Then the Walsing Warrant and Walsing Wizard descendants began and 34 champions were raised. Two important sons were Walsing Watch Tower and Wespark Masterpiece. One son of Masterpiece, Ch. Trevone Tartar of Bothkennar, has in turn sired ten champions, among them Ch. Fran Jean's Bokor. Bokor is noted for having sired the litter brothers, Ch. Cantie Confident and Ch. Cantie Captivator, and the female, Champion Sadoone's Missy Lou.

Another outstanding Wizard descendant is the 1956 Ch. Westpark Derriford Baffie. His show career in England was second only to his illustrious ancestor, Ch. Heather Realization and when brought to America by the Carnation Farms was shown 18 times, going 12 times Best in Show, winning 17 Terrier Groups and topping one specialty.

The Wyreburys and the Glendunes have also been making their way across to America and are closely bred to Wizard through Rosehall Enchanter. Br. Ch. Walsing Warrant, the litter brother of Heather Benefactor, imported at the beginning of World War II, is responsible for the greatest expansion of the Fashion Hint line in this country. His grandsons, Deephaven Red Seal and Deephaven Dividend, have sired many champions.

The combination of English and American bloodlines stemming from their common source, Ch. Heather

Realization, has accounted for 158 American champions, the majority of them since 1950. In 1953, for the first time in a little over ten years, the entire male line from Fashion Hint produced more champions than any

Used wisely, the line from Br. Ch. Heather Necessity through his greatest son should prosper in America and in Canada and give us Scottish Terriers of which we can be proud.

West Highland White Terrier Contrasts

How does the Westie differ from some of the other Terrier family? Its body, for one thing, appears more or less flat-sided, with less rounded spring of ribs as is the case of some of the other Terrier breeds. This is a requirement of the Standard.

The hind feet are carried rather close together during action and while standing. The Standard differs again from the usual wider-spread hind legs required of most Terriers.

Nor do Westies in general have the prominent angulation of the longerlegged Terriers. This contributes to that fetching bounce. Sufficient angulation to have drive is essential, of course, to cover ground, rather than "standing in their tracks".

The Westie does not have the lowslung appearance of its cousin, the Scottish Terrier, but should stand off the ground rather than being squat and very short-legged.

Pug Colors

For some time now, the controversy with respect to Pug size has been waxing in the United States and rightly so. However, equally as important in the opinion of this writer, and substantiated by the Pug standard, is the reference to color.

This latter heading in the Standard states clearly: silver or apricot-fawn. Each should be decided, to make the contrast complete between the color and the trace and the mask.

Unfortunately one sees too many Pugs in the show ring today with a "washed-out", "faded", or "sooty" coat coloring. Where have gone the beautiful apricot shades of yesteryear? Not the light fawn or sooty silver that is so prevalent today. Even the black Pug coloring has taken on a rust tint and not the true black color that is required.

Not to be overlooked are the following references to color:-

Feet - Nails black.

Eyes - Dark, very lustrous.

Ears - Thin, small, soft, like black velvet.

Markings - Clearly defined. The muzzle or mask, ears, moles on cheeks, thumb mark or diamond on forehead, back-trace should be as black as pos-

Mask — The mask should be black. The more intense and well-defined it is the better.

Trace - A black line extending from the occiput to the tail.

Here again one sees too many lightcolored toe nails, markings not clearly defined or as black as they might be and of course in many cases complete absence of trace.

The Pug as a breed is a proud, gay, hardy fellow and quite capable of holding his own in the show ring. So, Pug breeders! Let us all strive to improve and keep the "cobby one" at the top of the Toy breeds and always have the breed standard in mind with respect to our breeding program.

you have ever worked on a Poodle puppy of this age that has never heard, much less felt, the sound of electric clippers next to his ear, you would realize why they should be started at about four weeks of age. The puppy should first hear the sound of the clippers running near his body, all the while petting him and calling him by name in a quiet, confident tone. Clipping and grooming is an essential part of his life, so the first several times special care and patience and understanding on

the part of the clipper is essential. The feet, face and tail should be clipped frequently when they are young - about every four or five weeks - being careful not to run the clippers on the underside of the tail, as this is a very sensitive area and instead requires careful scissoring. Careful tipping of the body coat is essential to encourage and stimulate the adult coat growth. This is generally started at three months of age and should continue at intervals until you can observe the stronger, curly adult coat developing. This occurs at six to seven months of age.

I have seen some coats that are able to take a Town and Country clip at four and a half to five months and others which had to be left in



a modified puppy pattern up to a year. There is no definite age for setting a pattern. It is contingent on coat quality.

A most important part of proper Poodle care is the bath. An uninformed pet owner can ruin his Poodle's coat by repeated bathing done incorrectly. A thorough brushing and combing before the bath is essential. Poodles can be bathed once a month or every six weeks, providing the owners will brush their dog in between. White Poodles may need to be bathed more frequently because, even if they are not really dirty, they may give the appearance of being so.

What woman washes her hair without combing it first? If she did not, she would never get the tangles out. This holds true for the Poodle coat. We recommend a Hines slicker brush — a flat oblong brush with short fine steel needles. The nylon or bristle brushes, in our experience, don't get right into the coat as thoroughly.

Gentle bathing with a good shampoo and a very thorough rinsing, followed by a light towelling, is the prelude to the next important step—comb and brush before completely dry.

These few simple actions will keep the coat in lovely soft curly condition until his next clipping and will eliminate all those terrible mats and tangles that are so frustrating to the owner and so painful to the dog.

This procedure, properly done, will save money and resentment for the owner when he is faced with extra charges at the clipping salon for removing those hard mats. Bathing without brushing and combing produces hard and solid mats close to the skin, which are difficult to remove. This can be a painful and delicate manoeuvre, amounting almost to a form of surgery, in which neither scissors nor clippers alone can do the job, but must be alternated inch by inch. Working, in this fashion, on a skin already sore from the matted condition, is almost more than a dog can bear. Some nearly go wild and become almost impossible for the operator to handle.

One little patient, a Maltese, was so badly matted it was walking in a crippled state. Working several hours at a time it required four days to clear up. Other dogs have come in with feet so matted the toes were twisted and the nails curled under, the hair so matted it's almost impossible to get the point of the scissors through.

Professional pet clipping is as much of an art as the beautifully intricate and difficult patterns which are de rigeur in the showing. Styles must

be adapted to suit the individual dog whose coat quality has a great bearing on the contemplated pattern. These important decisions should be left to those trained, experienced and equipped to handle them.

There is much the individual can do for his pet to make the trip to the salon a happy and enjoyable experience. These few steps, if followed, will eliminate the discomfort caused by ignorance and the time between trips to the salon can be lengthened to the satisfaction of all concerned.

I would not advise the pet owner to attempt removing hair from inside the ears. However, a piece of absorbent cotton (not a tipped stick) wrapped around the forefinger can be used to gently remove any moisture after bathing. This will suffice until the clipper can remove the hair as part of the regular routine.

If excessive ear scratching occurs, check the ears for an accumulation of wax and clean out gently, being careful not to push the wax in further. Ear-X is one very good preparation which we use for cleaning and is a preventive of ear trouble in all breeds, as well as being a cure for most of the stubborn ear parasites. Most good pet shops and department stores have it in stock.

If this article has helped in a small way even one neophyte in the breed, I shall be happy, because I am assuming everyone interested in this gay, lovable, intelligent breed wants to keep it that way.

parents and three litters, will produce, with only slight variation, approximately the same temperament.

Environment: This is the factor that creates poor temperament - not necessarily inbreeding, so you have a consistent temperament.

FOURTH (OUTCROSSED) LITTER

Now comes the time to look for an outcross, which must have inbred qualities, as we stated in the beginning, when you were selecting your key dog. You have to make sure that these qualities are desirable ones which your family does not contain. You have to make a great study of the family of the outcross dog. He must have in him, inbred in his genetical makeup, the qualities that your male's or female's family simply does not contain. Otherwise there is no point in outcrossing.

But, in reviewing all of the foregoing, we presuppose that each litter contains a good female. If not, a second mating must take place because no appraisal is complete without two litters from which to judge.

Does all this sound discouraging? It's not. In the meantime you have been showing your puppies and adults in the family program from time to time and doubtlessly coming home with ribbons, group wins and handsome trophies. You have the thrill of seeing, with each litter, another step toward your goal.

Advice on Dog Skin and Coat Care Given in New Booklet

A new booklet, Skin and Coat Care of Dogs, offering tips on grooming and suggestions on how to control skin diseases, has been published by the Gaines Dog Research Center, New York.

The role of proper diet together with hygiene, is pointed out.

What is a Spay?

Spay is a slang term used to refer to the ovariohysterectomy (complete removal of uterus and ovaries) in the dog or cat. This operation, done as it should be done, using modern-day sterile techniques, is not just a simple procedure. However, the mortality rate is very low and the surgery is often recommended in female animals unless they are to be used for breeding purposes.

One reason for recommending this surgery is, to avoid the "season" or "heat" periods in which the female animal attracts males and may become pregnant if exposed to them and, in the case of the dog, the female also discharges small spots of blood about the house. More important are the changes that can take place in later life in a female animal that has not been operated on. One of these is called pyometritis, a condition in which the uterus fills with pus and causes the animal to become toxic, thus endangering its life. This can result in an older animal, perhaps ten to twelve years of age, suddenly requiring an emergency ovariohysterectomy.

Another possible result is the formation of breast tumors, which often are malignant and these often occur from the age of eight years and on. Such tumors are extremely rare in dogs which have been operated on.

The operation itself is an intraabdominal operation and so requires careful sterile surgical techniques. The animal is anesthetized, shaved, the skin is scrubbed and prepped with disinfectants plus the area is draped with sterile drapes. Now the veterinarian must do a surgical scrub and don his operating gown and sterile gloves. Then the actual surgery takes place. When the incision is closed, there is aftercare in the hospital and the instruments must be cleaned, repacked, and sterilized for the next day's surgery. Usually several "spay packs" are kept sterile and ready at all times. This also applies to all drapes and gowns used in the operation.

So you see that the popular misconception that a "spay" is a simple procedure is just that - a misconception.

Two-Way Sportsmanship

Trials should be planned right down to the last detail, keeping ever foremost the best interests of the dogs as well as the exhibitors, i.e. propersized rings, indoors and out, suitable equipment and a warm friendly attitude, for there are enough other "occupational hazards" at Trials.

As for the exhibitors . . . they are only human, wishing (quite naturally) to win. When they do . . . they are . when they don't, well -! happy . . Most of them, anyway, realize who is at fault. If a dog isn't passing his Class Exercises at home with ease he shouldn't be counted upon to pass them at a Trial. Be sporting with your dog, give him his just due!


An entry fee reserves your right to question any ring set-up (jumps, etc.) if not properly lined up for your dog or anything else seemingly not just right. Question it by all means but be nice about it!

Judges are the rulers in the ring and their ruling of the facts are nearly always incontrovertible, usually upheld by Kennel Club authorities. So unless you really have a reasonable, legitimate complaint, backed by the required \$5.00 deposit to affirm your written beef, at the time, your only recourse is not to appear under that judge again.

Splitting the present Utility Class into the customary A and B divisions would lessen the tension on those who are bringing up their first dogs. In Trials, the more newly trained dog is completely outclassed by the older ones. And why not introduce an Official or Unofficial Beginners Test-(ON LEAD), to draw new exhibitors, at a reduced entry fee? Novice entries are in need of a Booster, one way or another.

How can the Judges be good sports? By arriving in good time for the Trials, being considerate as possible and fair to all, including the wellknown top workers. Judges should mark and penalize according to the rules, not their interpretation of them, without bearing down on any one penalty. Revising the Penalty Guide of 1955 for Judges might help. A lot of changes have come into being during our past 10 years of Obedience activity. Judges should acknowledge any mistakes made even if it does cause embarrassment, for they are only human. To err is human and none of us is infallible.

And why couldn't the Judges themselves promote Obedience by accepting a percentage of the Trial Entry Fee (per dog) taken by the club, i.e. if a Judge only drew 27 entries at one given Trial, his judging fee wouldn't exceed the sum of \$27.00, no matter what his inconvenience? The operating club would indeed be appre-

PARASITISM

Perhaps no other disease entity receives more attention and consequently more abuse, than parasitism in dogs. There are several areas to be discussed in this problem and the bare essentials follow.

DIAGNOSIS

In Ontario and most of Canada four main species of worms are diagnosed, i.e.:

> Roundworms Hookworms Whipworms Tapeworms

We shall not consider Coccidiosis, but it too is an intestinal parasite.

Diagnosis Can Be Made By

(1) Actual presence of the adult worm in the stool. Roundworms are 3-6" in length, colored white, round in diameter and tapering to a point at either end. Hookworms are ½-¾" in length, white and threadlike. Whipworms are threadlike, white, barely visible to the naked eye. Tapewarms are flat, maggot-like, white in stool about ½" long or may be seen as a dry, brownish looking grain about ¼" long, resembling a grain of rice stuck to the hair around the dog's perinial region.

(2) Isolation and demonstration of the worm eggs or larvae in the stool by the use of a microscopic examination of the fecal material. Refined laboratory techniques are available to examine the stools of suspect dogs. This is by far the more likely method of detecting the worms since adult worms are rarely seen in the stool with the possible exception of tapeworms.

"Origin and History"

of the Poodle

Excerpted from the first chapter of the new book, The New Complete Poodle by Lydia Hopkins who was one of the first to start breeding Miniature Poodles in America and has also owned Standards and Toys. She has made many champions in other breeds as well. This handsomely bound book is lavishly illustrated and contains 76 chapters, 352 pages. A book no Poodle breeder or enthusiast can afford to be without. Available through Dogs in Canada, \$12.50.

There can be no doubt that the Poodle, one of the most intelligent and devoted of all breeds of dogs, is also one of the oldest. Perhaps the most ancient of its varieties is the small white Toy, always a separate branch of the family, called for many hundreds of years the "Petit Barbet."

The first illustrations of Poodles were carved on Roman tombs and other monuments of about A.D. 40, but the first known printed mention of them was made by Conrad Gessner in 1555. Clipped Poodles appear in French, Dutch and Italian paintings as early as 1454, and even earlier in illuminated manuscripts, notably those of the Burgundian House, preserved in the British Museum. . .

The larger Poodles were called by various names, in France and elsewhere, Canis aviarius aquaricus, Grand Barbet, Caniche, Mouton and Moufflon; while the name in the German language is very nearly the same as in English - "Pudel," and there is little doubt that the early English "Water Dog" (not to be con-fused with the Water Spaniel) was also another branch of the family. Early writers treated the woolly coated Poodles as separate from the corded varieties . . .

While many persons credit Russia with the origin of the corded Poodle, Dr. Friz Inger, a German authority. in his Hunde und Sein Racen, states his belief that the Poodle originated

in Africa, either in Morocco or in Algiers, and that the corded varieties had a Spanish, Portuguese or Greek origin. In the light of knowledge concerning other African breeds, such as the Saluki and Afghan Hound, which have been bred and preserved practi-cally unchanged in Africa for centuries, it seems unlikely that the Poodle originated in Africa, since no trace of such an indigenous breed exists there

All authorities agree, however, that there were three Continental varieties: the German, the Russian and the French, and that all three were to be found in small (but not Toy), medium, and large sizes. With one accord the authorities concur that white, parti-colored or brown were common colors for ordinary, unpedigreed dogs, but that the aristocrats were black. That the blacks must have been crossed with other colors is evidenced by earlier difficulty in breeding blacks without white on chest or feet. Earlier writers classify the Poodle among the Spaniels.

(It appears from early authorities) that it is quite probable that Poodles were imported into England as working and hunting dogs long before they were recognized as a distinct breed and assigned a name. The Irish Water Spaniel, which even today shows a strong resemblance to the Poodle, was undoubtedly descended from it. No official mention of the importation of Poodles, as such, into England is recognized until the Napoleonic Wars in the early part of the 19th century.

The difference between the Poodles from the three countries, France, Germany and Russia, is mentioned in many of the earlier books.

In France, where the larger Poodles, or Moutons, were used for draught dogs, as well as for retrievers, truffle hunters and circus actors, the earlier dogs were sturdy, thick-set animals, with wide skulls, light, round eyes rather short necks, fairly high set ears and thick, woolly coats.

as important on road as at home

WHILE more and more hotels and motels are willing to accept guests traveling with dogs, good manners on the part of both pets and their owners while staying at such places are as essential as elsewhere. The observance of good behavior practices will not only serve to retain the interest of those hotels and motels currently accepting dogs, but can also serve to convince others to do likewise and, thus, make it even easier for the traveling pet owner to find a place to stay, says the Gaines Dog Research Center.

Whether a motorist traveling with his dog may be staying for an extended period or making only an overnight stop, consideration for hotel and motel equipment and other guests should be such that the management would be glad to see him again, as well as other dog owners.

Accordingly, the Center offers these suggestions as guidelines for motorists traveling with their pets to follow:

First, always make it a point to find out in advance whether a hotel or motel permits dogs; never try to "sneak in" your pet. Second, when going through hall-

ways and passages keep your dog on a leash. Doing this keeps other guests from being annoyed, as well they can be, if the animal is permitted to race up and down the halls.

Next, except for Guide Dogs, don't bring your dog into the dining areas. Again, consideration for other guests and the management makes this a good practice to follow.

Responsibility for the exercise of your dog is yours. When you exercise your dog, take him to the edges of the property; don't let him soil the walks or planted areas.

Avoid damage to furniture, draperies, bedding, etc., by keeping untrained dogs confined to a crate or sleeping box while in a motor court or hotel room. Never leave your dog alone and unattended for long periods of time. This can serve to make him bored and unhappy and be destructive or bark.

You can help your dog be a better guest if you take pains to do some prior planning to make him feel "at home" while away, states the Center. A small kit or suitcase with the dog's belongings will not only prove convenient, but its familiar contents will be welcomed by the dog. The kit

should contain pans for food and water, as well as a leash and toys or other objects to which the dog is accustomed.

Sudden changes in diet, which usually cause digestive upsets, can be avoided by taking along several packages of new soft-moist dog foods now available. They do not require any special preparation or mixing and can be served any time right from the package. Not requiring refrigeration, no special storage problems are encountered. In addition, any uneaten food can be replaced in its wrapper or package and kept until the next feeding time, thus avoiding wastage.

And, finally, the Center advises taking along the dog's bed or a cushion or blanket for him. Hotel and motel managers will be much more kindly disposed toward continuing, or adopting, a policy of accepting dogs as guests if their good blankets or pillows are not used for dog beds.

What is an Emergency?

Many times veterinarians are called out in the middle of the night to look after sick animals. The owners of these animals call, saying it is an "Emergency" and the animal needs attention immediately. True emergencies are fairly common, but the extra load put on the veterinarian treating so-called emergencies can be taxing.

Some of the true emergencies are: 1) An animal involved in a motor

accident.

2) A badly bitten animal.

3) An animal which has become suddenly and acutely ill.

4) A suspected poisoning.

- 5) A case of eclampsia or "milk fever".
- 6) An animal taking seizures or convulsions.

7) A badly burned animal.

8) A whelping case (problems during the birth of kittens or puppies).

Many times, however, these out of hours calls are not really emergencies at all. Often the animal has been sick for several days and should have been attended to long ago. Most often the veterinarian will still offer his services to such cases but mostly because he feels sorry for the animal because of neglect of its owner.

Don't fall into this latter category. If your animal becomes sick, have it attended to right away. Observe your pet closely for signs of diarrhea, blood in the stool, blood in the urine, vomiting, lack of appetite, unusual swellings or discharges. These symptoms are clues that your pet is sick. When any of these are noticed, or if you feel that there are other problems, have the condition diagnosed and treated in good time. Your pet will live a longer, happier life and it will cost you less in the long run.

A great admirer of the little Dachshund, he spent many hours in the study of genetics and color breeding and devoted the last few years of his life trying to produce the chocolate and tan strain. Born in Scotland, Bob came to Canada with two Border Collies, thorough workers. Writes Robert B. Laskey: "This well-bred working pair were the first examples we had of obedience dogs owned in New Brunswick. Knowing the worth of such dogs, he, as Director, recommended that the breed be recognized for registration. He was a keen live stock official with the position of Chief Herdsman with the Agricultural Research Station, Fredericton, where Holstein Friesians are the ROP breed there. It was upon this experience that he made his recommendations that the use of artificial insemination as practised by stock breeders be made useful for dog breeding. Obedience clubs will sadly miss him. He was the first appointee for obedience and trained owners as well as for obedience and trials. He will be missed equally in conformation. His first efforts in the world of dog shows were with the Fredericton KC. With the late Wm. W. Laskey, first CKC Maritime Director, he reorganized the original Fredericton KC in 1922 as a club in 1947. He served as President from 1947-49 and remained keenly interested. More recently he had been valuable in bird field trials and leaves vacant his office as Chief Field Trial Counsel for pointing breeds. He leaves his wife Ruby, son Bruce of Port Arthur, Ont. and daughter, Mrs. Helen Little-Stresser of Toronto." Sympathy is extended to the bereaved family.
