FEEDING DURING GESTATION, LACTATION AND WEANING

Dog owners who have bred their bitches for the first time often ask us, "How much do we feed her during pregnancy, nursing and weaning? Will she and her puppies be healthy after whelping?"

Data obtained from more than 900 litters whelped at the Purina Dog Care Center provide us with the answers.

If the bitch has been in good condition prior to mating, no change is necessary in the quantity of food fed for the first four weeks after mating. After four weeks, she should be allowed to eat all she wants. Her daily food intake will then increase approximately 20% over the normal quantity. Most of the additional weight is deposited in embryonic bodies, reproductive fluids and membranes. On the day of parturition the bitch may not eat at all. Plenty of fresh water should be made available to her.

After whelping, feed consumption increases as milk production increases. By the third or fourth week, the bitch consumes two-and-a-

half to three times more food than normal. At about three-and-a-half to four weeks of age, puppies start eating solids. The quantity of food consumed by the bitch tends to decrease, while that consumed by nursing puppies — eating from her dish — increases. Puppies should receive all the ration they want.

We have found that restricting the bitch's food intake during weaning helps decrease milk secretion and helps maintain healthy udders. Feed is withheld from her on the day the puppies are weaned; $\frac{1}{4}$ of the normal maintenance level of food is fed the second day, $\frac{1}{2}$ on the third day, $\frac{3}{4}$ on the fourth, and the normal maintenance level is fed on the fifth day.

Puppy stamina and livability can be influenced by proper feeding of the bitch. Our cover this year features Ch. (Can. & Am.) Shipmates Hannibal, at eight years of age still our leading stud dog, with two of his get. Bred by Shipmates Kennels (Mrs. S. J. Navin), Hannibal, through both his sire (Roseneath Gay Kilt) and his dam (Shipmates Confection) goes back strongly to Ch. (Can., Eng. & Am.) Cruben Dextor. Roseneath Gay Kilt was a son of Ch. (Can. & Am.) Roseneath White Knight a Dextor grandson, and the link appears also in several other parts of the pedigree, while Shipmates Confection was by Fons of the Rouge C.D., out of Teena of the Rouge, whose dam, Can. Ch. Fanfare of the Rouge, was litter sister to Fons and part of the first litter sired by Dextor in North America. This was the foundation of our breeding stock at Kennels of the Rouge, and with occasional necessary outcrosses to leading American and English stock we have built up a stable line emphasizing good fronts and shoulders, well balanced heads, with strong hindquarters and good quality coats.

When Mrs. Navin reduced her stock we took the opportunity of obtaining Hannibal since he is a beautifully balanced dog with excellent reach of neck and shoulder placement which gives him the good reach of fore-quarter stride and the powerful hindquarter drive which are the marks of a good Westie, and which attributes he imparts to the greater proportion of his get. He is still in steady demand for service by breeders in both the U.S. and Canada.

Hannibal's daughter, Mac-a-Dac Rouge Remembrance, bred by Sharon McCarty, was a stud fee puppy out of Am. Ch. Mac-a-Dac Mistletoe, top-winning Westie bitch in the U.S. for the last two years. After raising some very satisfactory puppies, "Emmy" is now being groomed for the show ring.

The 7-months old Windemere Rouge Midshipman on the cover is another stud fee puppy sired by Hannibal, bred by Mrs. Keith Balston out of Galatea of the Rouge. This bitch was sired by our Ch. (Can. & Am.) Gallant Lad of the Rouge (who is also strongly Dextor in background) out of Can. Ch. Philomel of the Rouge, a granddaughter of our late Ch. (Can., Eng. & Am.) Shining Cliff Sprig. We feel "Chip" will be a worthy successor to his sire, whom he strongly resembles. Shown at the WHTCA Specialty in New York at the age of six months and three days, he was in the final six considered

MINIATURE SCHNAUZER TEMPERAMENT

. . . I don't want to send Mrs. Griggs scurrying for her bullet-proof shelter, but I would like to disagree with her.

She states that European breeders will not breed to an American dog. I have yet to see the European dog that I would care to use. I am basing my judgment on imports, but I imagine most European breeders are laboring under the same handicap.

Since I was married I have always had at least one German Shepherd, and I think they are a noble, loyal breed. I do not feel that this or any other breed in the working group is a cuddly, adorable lap dog as is suggested. They are bred for a purpose, many for guard duty, and are to be as much respected as admired. Has Mrs. Griggs ever challenged a good Collie or Shepherd on duty, tried to train a high-spirited Boxer, or shoved her fingers into the mouth of an unknown Doberman? I have yet to meet my first vicious Schnauzer. The standard calls for an active, alert, robust dog and I think this is what most breeders are striving for. A timid or cowed animal is hardly an asset to any breed. As far as showing in the working group is concerned, thank you, but no. My dogs could no doubt withstand the excessive gaing sometimes required of the working dog, but I doubt the old dame at the other end of the lead could.

I like the American and Canadian dogs, I like the Schnauzer temperament, and I like Group 4.

. . . During the years that I have been active in dogs, both in obedience and conformation, I have yet to meet a single sharp-tempered Miniature Schnauzer.

The opening words of the standard specify "A robust, active dog". In my opinion one of the great charms of a good Miniature Schnauzer is its willingness to sparkle. Alert and happy in the ring, it settles quietly onto the bench between ring appearances. A lifeless, spiritless dog, no matter how well-behaved it might be, is not worth showing in any group.

Judges who have followed the breed since the first imports were shown on this continent tell me that the Miniature Schnauzer has shown nothing but improvement over the years.

There is such a wide variety of trimming apparent in the ring that it might be possible to point to the occasional specimen and identify it with a Wire Fox Terrier trim. But on the whole, top dogs prepared by top conditioners look exactly like they should — darn good Miniature Schnauzers.

BELGIAN SHEEPDOGS IN U.S. SHOWS

. . . In a recent issue of Dogs I noticed an article by E. T. Morgan entitled "What is the Belgian Sheepdog? (part II)". I feel I should correct two of his statements.

The first, dealing with the Tervuren, states they ". . . compete as Belgian Tervuren in U.S. shows, but not in Group 3 as they do in Canada". In the U.S. the three varieties recognized by the A.K.C. were separated into three distinct breeds effective July 1, 1959. Since then Belgian Tervuren have always competed in the Working Group (Group 3) at our shows. The largest show in our country in 1966, at Beverly Hills, Calif., had over 2,900 dogs competing. A Belgium Tervuren placed fourth in the Group.

Belgian Malinois were shown in the Miscellaneous Class until June, 1965, when they were added to the Working Group. At present the Malinois and Tervuren have equal status with the Groenendael in the U.S.

IN DEFENCE OF LIVE STOCK RECORDS

. . . Your issue of March carried a complaint about the slowness of the Canadian National Live Stock Records' issuance of transfers and registrations.

Live Stock Records maintains a 48-hour service for the issuance of registration certificates and transfers for exports. If there is any unfinished business, financial or other, between seller and buyer, it is usual for the certificate and transfer to be mailed to the seller, who then mails it to the buyer.

CALLING "LONDON CALLING"

. . . In a recent "London Calling" column, Stanley Dangerfield seems to be disappointed that I did not put myself on record when I mentioned the method of judging German Shepherds in Argentina. True, I only gave it a casual mention, as I did the fact that though top beef sold for 49 cents a pound, European compact cars sell for over \$1,000 more than they do in Canada.

But, for the record, I agree one hundred percent with Mr. Dangerfield. Beating a dog with a stick or firing pistols proves nothing, in my opinion, particularly with old campaigners. They are trained and tested this way from puppyhood. Obviously a dog which failed these tests during training would not be brought to the show.

I think Mr. Dangerfield would agree with me (after all he thought I would agree with him) that you could tell much about temperament from the eyes, and I do that it was amusing to

watch some of the dogs' expressions during this "temperament testing". I'm prepared to swear that one dog was laughing at the antics of the so-called higher intelligentsia. Another looked frankly puzzled, head cocked sideways as though thinking "What's that idiot trying to prove?" One that had probably been through the routine ad nauseam was just plain bored. Continuous yawning showed that.

But temperament, good or bad, is a quality that basically is born in the dog. Environment, owners, many things can improve or affect adversely what the dog was born with. Training, particularly with a breed as intelligent as the German Shepherd, can create a surface confidence where inward turmoil exists.

I would suggest that temperament is much more than the ability to stand steady while pistols are fired and sticks are shaken. I find temperament in the whole dog — the way it enters a show ring, the interest it shows in what is going on, the way it moves at the end of a lead, the rapport between the dog and the handler and indeed, as Mr. Dangerfield says, in the eyes and the whole expression and impression the dog gives.

So I agree fully with Mr. Dangerfield. But I also agree with those good breeders of German Shepherds who insist that poor temperament be faulted to the extent of disqualification when warranted. They know that since German Shepherds became popular on this continent the breed has fallen into disrepute, on at least three occasions, because of poor temperament. Conscientious lovers of the breed have brought it back every time. Today, fortunately, vicious and shy representatives of this magnificent breed are rarely seen in the show ring. We who judge have a responsibility to those breeders. Giving first ribbons and championship points to dogs with temperament faults doesn't do much to support their efforts.

BLENDER REAL HELP

. . . I wonder if dog owners are aware that the electric blender is an invaluable aid to those who wish to include vegetables in the diet of their dogs. With the addition of a small quantity of water or broth any vegetable or vegetable peeling can be reduced to an edible mush in a few seconds.

I keep on hand at all times a broth made by simmering bones and poking out the marrow. The vegetable mush can be added to the broth and cooked a few minutes or mixed in raw. The resulting mixture, poured over meal or canned food, makes a tasty, nutritious dish.

Carrots, lettuce or other greens, cucumber and squash peelings, the tough parts of broccoli and asparagus, bits of cabbage, onions, anything that comes to hand can be included.

My Irish Setters like vegetables in almost any form, but I find the blender a great aid in cutting out all that chopping. The resultant mixture cannot be rejected by a fussy dog, if well stirred into the food he likes.

Quebec, Ontario and the New York area. Twenty-one different breeds were represented, among them some who were quite unique in the field of dog obedience, e.g. the tiniest — a Miniature Pinscher, a handler-kissing Boxer, a frivolous Bouvier des Flandres, a ponderous St. Bernard, happy floppy-eared Basset Hounds and a snow-white Samoyed.

The Judge, Mr. Charles M. Oliver, travelled all the way from Warwick, Rhode Island to perform a pleasant and commendable judging assignment. Highest score in trial went to Mrs. Frances Walker with her Min. Poodle O.T. Ch. "My Highland Lassie", with a brilliant score of 199.

A spacious training ring was provided by the club for the benefit of exhibitors. Rings were ample, with wide rubber matting and new jumps supplied for Open and Utility.

Individual Class Winners were: Novice A, Miss J. Lovett—Min. Poodle, 198 pts; Novice B, Mr. A. Bourgie (Handler) German Shepherd, 198½; Open A, Mr. R. Tomlinson—German Shepherd, 170; Open B, Mrs. F. Walker—Min. Poodle, 199; Utility, Mrs. M. Heller—Min. Poodle, 189.

The trophy table was beautifully decorated and laden with silver trays, spoons and pewter mugs, enabling the winners to go home contented.

NOTICE

From time to time our attention is drawn to the practice of some breeders who, when advertising or otherwise offering dogs for sale, indicate in some way that the purchaser of a dog sold as pure-bred will be required to make a higher, or additional, payment in order to be furnished with a certificate of registration. Such persons should note that the price at which a dog is sold, or the purpose for which a dog was purchased, has no bearing whatever on the obligation of the seller to supply the purchaser with a certificate of registration issued by The Canadian Kennel Club for a dog sold as pure-bred.


The Live Stock Pedigree Act, a federal statute, requires that when a person sells a dog as pure-bred, or contracts to sell a dog as pure-bred, he must furnish, or agree to furnish, a certificate of registration, together with fully-recorded transfer of ownership to the buyer.

Article XXXI, Section 3 of the By-laws of The Canadian Kennel Club reads as follows:

"A member may be suspended or expelled, or a non-member deprived of the privileges of the Club, if it is proven to the satisfaction of the Board that when selling, or otherwise disposing of a dog for a consideration (monetary or otherwise), the person disposing of the dog has asked or required the new owner to make any form of payment specifically for the purpose of being furnished with a certificate or registration."

To avoid possible prosecution under the Live Stock Pedigree Act and/or possible disciplinary action by The Canadian Kennel Club, members and others engaged in the selling of dogs as pure-bred are cautioned to refrain from the practice of quoting two selling prices for the dogs, one "with papers", the other "without papers", or to in any other way indicate that an additional payment is required for a certificate of registration.

This notice is published by an order of the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club.



TRIALS AND TRIBULATIONS

By the time this article reaches you, two months will have gone by, so I must write it now while it's still very fresh in my mind and I can relive some of the moments on paper.

Very recently, while judging in West Virginia, I was asked to conduct a run-off to establish a winner for the "Pearsall's Black Charger Memorial Trophy", (many clubs across the border are offering similar trophies in honor of Milo Pearsall's great contribution to Obedience.

On the surface you might say "So what's so special about reporting a run-off?". Ah!, but here's the catch! Just imagine a run-off with the winners of each of the regular five Classes in the ring at one time, and going through their paces simultaneously under the Judge's commands. Then imagine trying to keep track of this situation as the dogs spread further and further apart during the continuation of the exercise!

Having read about this type of run-off being conducted by some clubs in California I had a rough idea what to expect.

Enough of this chit-chat — let's get on with the run-off!

Picture, if you can, five handlers and their dogs sitting in the Heel position, lined up side by side in the ring. Each of the five handlers was given a credit of three points — the idea was to keep hacking away at their individual three points as errors occurred until only one dog was left. The remaining dog would then be declared the winner.

My instructions to the group were simple — I informed them that the exercise to be used was the Heel Off Lead, which was common to all Classes. I also advised them that when the commands were given to heel, turn, halt, etc., they were to ignore the fact that there were other dogs around them, but to treat the commands as if they were specifically meant for each individual handler. The degree of penalty deducted would depend on the infraction committed by the dog and/or handler.

Here's the lineup — Novice "A", Irish Setter — Novice "B", Dachshund — Open "A", German Shepherd — Open "B", Golden Retriever — Utility, Miniature Poodle.

The first dog to be eliminated was the cute, saucy Novice "B" Dachshund — she was so intrigued by all the dogs and people working around her that

with her little tail wagging merrily she simply forgot to sit both times the command to halt was given. The handler was penalized two points for each failure to sit, so our little friend was eliminated after the first two sits. They made a happy pair leaving the ring together — the handler laughing and the little Dachsy also laughing in her own little tail-wagging way!

Next to go was the Novice "A" Irish Setter. The Open "A" German Shepherd lasted quite a while, but he, too, finally succumbed to the inimitable precision work of the Golden and the Miniature Poodle. This was no surprise to me, as the latter-mentioned dogs are among the country's top obedience workers!

Left turn, right turn, about turn, halt, forward, fast, halt, forward, slow, halt, forward, halt. This went on and on for over five minutes, and all these two dogs had lost was about $\frac{1}{2}$ point each — as the commands were repeated over and over again, the two dogs seemed to work better and better, and were ever so attentive to their handlers. Bringing them to a fast halt right up against a wall, neither dog would deviate an inch — they sat as straight as arrows and parallel to their handlers. Suddenly, I observed that a dead silence had descended all around the Trial area — you could almost feel the tension in the air — obedience exhibitors and spectators alike were caught up in this splendid display of Obedience work by two top-working obedience teams.

Not being able to resist the temptation, after one of the halts I turned to the audience, cupped both my hands over my mouth and whispered in a very loud voice, "Exciting, isn't it?". The place literally exploded — people laughed, some got up and changed positions, shuffled their feet, stretched, yawned — just about anything to release the tension that had gripped them. One of my remaining two handlers took his coat off — he was becoming hot from all the rapid fire

commands and changes of pace — after all, they had been going steady for over five minutes!

Away we went at it again — forward, right turn, about turn, left turn, on and on it went. Occasionally, as the handlers drew further and further apart due to the different working speeds of the individual handlers, they were halted and brought together again to make it easier to observe as they went through their paces. (After all, my "peripheral vision" does have its limits!).

Finally! — it happened! After about 11 minutes of heeling the Golden had used up its last $\frac{1}{2}$ point, and the Miniature had only a half point left — what a wonderful finish for two beautiful working dogs and excellent handlers! The Miniature had won "Pearsall's Black Charger Memorial Trophy" by the margin of $\frac{1}{2}$ a point. Both exhibitors shook hands firmly and congratulated each other for their fine efforts — for winner and loser alike it was a moment to be proud of, and even Milo's "Black Charger", I'm sure, would have been proud of such a duel in his honor!

It was a very gratifying day for the owners of these two dogs — the Golden had won the Open "B" Class, the Miniature had taken second. The Miniature Poodle had won the Utility Class, the Golden had taken second. The Poodle won the "Black Charger" run-off, and the Golden won the Highest Scoring Dog of the Trial!

As luck would have it, top honors were shared very equally!

For Obedience enthusiasts it was a moment to be remembered, for the club it was a moment of proud achievement, for the actual competitors a moment of tenseness, and for me, I was in the thrilling middle of it all! □

the old timer

The Old Timer was chuckling when I dropped in to see him. He'd just laid down his copy of Dogs in Canada.

"Reminds me of the old parlour game," he said.

"What do you mean?" I asked
"Russian roulette, spin the bottle or plain old post office?"

He was obviously in good humor.

"Post office or spin the bottle would be fine," he said "but Russian roulette is out. No, I was thinking of that game where you tell a person a certain set of facts. They pass them to a second, the second passes them to a third until finally about six persons have given their version of those facts to another person. Finally you compare the last version with the original and the differences are weird and wonderful."

He reached for his pipe and began to fill it.

"So what gave rise to all this," I asked.

He chuckled again.

"Remember," he said, "last summer I was airing my opinions on certain breeds that were natural for group placings. I said that a reasonably good German Shepherd, Boxer or Doberman would have a much better chance in the group than an outstanding Rottweiler — that a reasonably good Wire, Scottie or Westie would be more likely to place than an outstanding Australian, Border or Norwich Terrier. And I suggested that the owners of rare breeds might have a better chance if they kept their breeds in front of the judges and did a little educational job on what a good specimen of their breed should be."

"I remember," I said, "so how does that relate to parlour games."

"Well," said the Old Timer, "that particular comment has now developed in some strange way into an argument of the merits of the specialty judge as compared to the all rounder. First, a Mr. Bruce wrote a letter to the editor and did make a reference to the competence of all rounders. Then my old friends, George Kynoch and Elsie Murray, of Vancouver, wrote letters in defence of the all rounders. Now I see another old friend, Gordon Garrett, of German Shepherd fame has given his opinion, strongly in favor of the specialist, indicating that in his breed, at least, eye appeal is the deter-

mining factor with all round judges. Now I want to get into the act."

"So you're in," I suggested.

"First of all," the Old Timer continued, "there are good competent all-rounders and there are bad all-rounders. Similarly there are good specialty judges and there are bad ones. I must agree with Mr. Garrett that a man who has specialized in one breed — if he has an eye for a dog, if he can apply the standard of that breed to the dog, if he isn't prejudiced on certain points — will do perhaps a better job on that breed than the all rounder. But I emphasize those three qualifications, an eye for a dog, no prejudice on certain faults, and applying the standard to the dog. If he can't do those things — for instance if he over-penalizes a little extra size, or is a bug on movement, disregarding type and balance, if stand-offishness is considered as timidity — then you'll get no better judging from that specialty judge than from a mediocre all-round.

"But I can't agree that under a good competent all rounder any exhibitor will suffer. I can't agree that under a competent all rounder Shepherds, to win, must be black and tan, flashy and alert, present a nice picture standing for a long time and have straight up, erect ears. Mind you I agree with some of this. The German Shepherd standard calls for nobility. Can a dog have nobility, if it is not alert? It emphasizes temperament. Don't ears that are laid back when the judge approaches suggest at least the possibility of timidity and don't such ears detract from nobility? And as for color, seems to me that I recall the top winning German Shepherd in Central Canada of two or three years ago was a sable — and many of its top wins were under all rounders. Indeed, it's not too many years ago that what I remember as a rather heavy coated, almost solid black dog, the very famous and very excellent Ch. Shoes of DeGrassi, achieved most of its top wins under all round judges.

"As for 'angulation front and rear, side movement, firm backs, good ribbing, good bites, good croups, full dentition' being things not necessary to get by most all rounders, this is a pretty serious condemnation. It may not be necessary for a few all rounders, but it's certainly not true for 'most'. Most all rounders attend show after show. They'll judge more dogs in a couple of shows than a lot of specialty judges will judge in a year. They've developed an eye for a dog. Without making a production of it they'll recognize type and balance instantly. They don't need to run a dog around and around to see whether it's taking too many steps to cover too short a distance of ground. And most all rounders are very conscious of the

need for proper angulation, for firm backs, for the type of croup the standard of that breed calls for. And they'll be watching gait, coming and going and from the side pretty closely, relating movement imperfections to structural faults. But I agree few all rounders would penalize the lack of a couple of pre-molars to such an extent that a top dog lacking them would be beaten by an ordinary one that had them. I've seen this happen with a specialty judge."

"I take it then you consider the all rounder superior to the specialty judge," I asked.

The Old Timer re-lighted his pipe. "I didn't say that," he said. "I said there are competent all rounders and incompetent ones. Similarly there are competent specialty judges and incompetent ones. And any placing in a dog show will be just as good as the ability of the judge who does the placing. Even Mr. Garrett admits that 'a lot of specialty show judges might go overboard on some feature of their breed'. I wonder if that admission itself doesn't suggest that the best overall evaluation of merit in any breed is likely to come from the competent all rounder. Doesn't it suggest that a lot of specialty judges (Mr. Garrett's words) may just fail to see the forest because of the trees?" □

Canine Kindergarten For Young Puppies

A course designed to teach inexperienced owners how to handle their puppies at home, on the street and in congested places such as shopping centres has proven to be a great success in the Ottawa area. The Bytown Dog Obedience Club, which accepts dogs six to eight months or older, initiated the kindergarten and invites puppies at two months. Mrs. Patricia Wilson, who instructs, directs owners in grooming and in handling the dogs under unusual circumstances such as noise, how to hold a dog on the veterinarian's table, how to look after paws, eyes and ears. The dogs are taught "controlled walking" (not actually heeling) without pulling or fighting the lead, and to obey simple commands to sit or lie down.

Material and help for Kindergarten Puppy Training has been received from dog-training experts in the United States. At their request Mrs. Wilson keeps a record of their puppies and their reaction to this early training.

that few breeds worth finding remain undiscovered.

At the beginning of every year Britain's national newspapers are aggrieved to find that there is no sensational news story about a hitherto unknown breed which has suddenly zoomed to popularity and become our favorite dog.

They are not interested in a slow change of emphasis. A shuffling of the old favorites. They want action. Like boxing and racing journalists they are bored by winners who stay at the top. They want the favorites to fall. And fall frequently!

When they ring me for a story they clearly regard me as a spoil sport in being unable to provide it. Reluctantly they accept that once again it's the mixture as before. Then they switch to the second line. "If and when the position changes, what will be the new top dog?" Once again I cannot feed them the meat they require.

And so, grudgingly, to the final question with the clear implication that if I cannot do a little better they do not propose to waste much more time on me. "What foreign breeds are there in the world", they ask, "which would have a big future in Britain?"

At once I launch myself on my big party piece. As far as I remember, nobody has stayed on the line to the end of it. Perhaps, as you do not have to pay for this particular telephone call, you will be more patient!

There are over 350 different and distinct breeds of dog in the world. In Great Britain, we officially recognize a mere 120. Some that we know are of comparatively recent introduction and this includes many established favorites.

For examples, Alsatians were virtually unknown in this country until returning service men brought them from Germany after the first war. Boxers have a similar but more recent British history because their recognition followed the second world war. The Chihuahua from Mexico was an extreme rarity here until 1950. These three are now firmly established in the top 20; the 'charts' of our most popular dogs.

Theoretically then, there are still something over 250 breeds in the world merely waiting for a forward-thinking dog fancier to achieve fame and fortune by introducing them.

Alas, my experience persuades me

While public taste, fashion, gimmickry — call it what you will — is unpredictable, in dogs it at least has a starting point. Chosen favorites are always distinctive and identifiable, even in silhouette. Top British breeds since 1920 prove this point; Wire Haired Fox Terrier, Cocker Spaniel, Poodle and Alsatian. Additionally, there are the aforementioned Boxer and Chihuahua.

Dachshunds from Germany, Boston Terriers from the States, Newfoundlanders from Canada, Chows from China, Samoyeds from the Arctic circle, Elkhounds from Norway, and scores more are here, and here to stay, for the same reason.

The overwhelming majority of the world's 'undiscovered' breeds are too indefinite; lacking in distinction and easy to confuse. Thus, although there are upwards of a score of varieties of Spaniel in Europe, few could decide into exactly which category any particular specimen fitted.

I have of course seen some breeds during my travels which might succeed in Britain. I insist however that any person hoping for positive results should have a deep purse and a long expectation of life!

From Finland, the Karalian Bearhound, an impressive animal, standing some 24" high at the shoulders and in outline resembling a giant Elkhound. Coloring is distinctive being black, tan and white, all in huge splashes. They are used on the Finland/Russian borders to track and harass bears, a task calling for extreme hardness and courage. They are frequently seen in Scandinavian countries but rarely outside.

From France the Briard of Chien Berger de Brie, a dog already known in North America and one with a long and honorable history. Essentially working dogs, many are employed in France guarding farms and herding sheep. While not unlike the Old English Sheepdog in coat, size and movement, they are more lightly built, more supple and active. During the war they were used extensively as frontier guards, trackers and even pack dogs.

From Germany, the Affenpinscher. A breed widely known on the continent and recognized in the United States but increasingly difficult to find elsewhere. Sometimes called the Monkey Dog, these small, sturdy and independent little characters undoubtedly gave much to our modern Griffons, which have since overshadowed and robbed them of devotees. Usually black, sometimes black and tan or red, they have a lot of terrier about them and many, like myself, find the bright, dark eye, the general air of raffishness and the irrepressible high spirits most appealing.

From Switzerland, the Bernese Mountain Dog, an exception which I would unhesitatingly recommend to those with a taste for importation. Their continued neglect is inexplicable. While similar in outline to a Collie, they are bigger and more robust. Perhaps in conformation more like an unusually large Golden Retriever.

Their coloring is magnificent. Jet black with rich tan markings over the eyes, on the side of the chest and on upper forelegs. Additionally they have white feet, tail tip, blaze on forehead and star on chest. A kindly disposition, coupled with a willingness to learn and work, have made them favorites in many lands.

My last tentative suggestion is the Toy Fox Terrier, small as a Pom, sturdy as an Ox, cheeky as a Monkey and designed and fashioned in the U.S.A. Veracity demands the admission that it is not recognized by the American Kennel Club. Toy Fox Terrier is in fact a rude word. While the ruling body of America turns aside, there is a 'pirate' organization which does a thriving business registering them and reportedly keeping a detailed and accurate stud book.

Like most terrier purists, I dislike the theory of a 'miniature' Fox Terrier. In practice I find them the most engaging little characters! It has been suggested that they owe much to Chihuahua blood. Respectfully I suggest that the boot is more likely to be on the other foot!

Finally, and in contrast, I mention two dogs encountered on my travels which, although fulfilling the requirements of being distinctive, even unforgettable in appearance, are unlikely to ever find a permanent home in these Isles.

From Hungary the Puli, a medium-sized dog covered from nose-tip to tail with a long, fine coat falling into cords. At its best this dog is a traffic stopper. Everybody gazes in awe. Some presumably, to find out which end is which. Sensational enough to excite the most publicity conscious. What a pity that their grooming problems are so manifest and obvious!

Finally, another guaranteed non-runner, the Chinese Fighting Dog, met in Hong Kong. A weird, almost primitive animal. A fighting machine with hard, elephant-like skin covered in bristles. A dog with curved fangs in place of the usual canine teeth. A dog with the chilling air of a prehistoric monster.

Like all dogs it wagged its tail when I patted it. It is doubtful if even this is enough to establish it as Britain's favorite lap dog! □

RETRIEVERS IN THE FIELD

This winter has seen the loss of several fine upcoming field dogs, both here and in the U.S.A. Roy Walker lost his fast young bitch, Bell's Liberty, while in whelp and not long ago he also lost her dam, F.T. Ch. Bill's Bell from Penfield. In the Toronto area, Ken Sinclair lost his bitch, Jet Lady, and near Winnipeg, Tiff Trimble lost Crozier's Castlemore Cork. Both these dogs had placed in the Open Stakes and both were killed by cars, close to their homes. A more recent loss is Pat Wolfe's young bitch, Nixa's Bonnie Doon, who was doing well in Junior in Ontario.

Happier news comes from the Sportsmen's Shows, held in March in Toronto. In the shows, the Best of Breed Winners were:

1st Show — Ch. (Can. & Am.) Wimberway's Wanda CD, owned by Sandy Briggs, Wimberway Kennels.

2nd and 3rd Shows — Ch. (Can. & Am.) Wimberway's Wateaki CD, CDX, Am. CD, also owned by Sandy Briggs.

4th Show — Ch. Waterboy of Downsview, owned by Horst Schlotzer, Forget me Not Kennels.

5th Show — Ch. (Can. & Am.) Braemar Bounce of Willowmount, owned by Kay Robinson, Willowmount Kennels.

In the indoor Retriever Trials held in the large arena, 48 Labradors and Goldens competed during the week and on March 18 the seven finalists (winners at each daily trial) competed for the Gold Whistle offered by the Ralston Purina Company. The seven finalists were: F.T. Ch. & Amat. F.T. Ch. & Ch. Stormy of Spirit Lake Gal, BLM, Jim Thomson of Toronto; (Stormy was top winning Retriever in the Open stake in Canada for 1966); Buck of Ghent, BLM, a stylish three year old who is already half way to his field title, Len Ikonen of Kitchener; Alberic of Avandale, BLM, just over two years old and the youngest competitor, Len Tait of Montreal; Seg-Mar Stubblewest Gold Teena, GRF, Barry Taylor of Montreal; Ralston Valley's Thunder, YLM, Vern Steer of London; Bigstone Wyckoff's Wendy Coot, BLF, Peter Wyckoff of Cooksville, and the winner, F.T. Ch. and Amat. F.T. Ch. Irwin's Toby, BLM, Bill Hutchison of Hamilton. This was Toby's second win and he is obviously out to equal his sire's

(F.T. Ch. Van Wagner's Kernel) record of three wins. Both Kernel and Toby are in the list of top ten Retrievers in Canada, and Toby is just a point ahead of his sire who is now retired. It was a pleasure to see these fine dogs working.

The arena was well "planted" with evergreens to simulate natural conditions, and covered with dry leaves which had been collected in the Fall and carefully stored through the winter. Cedar rail fences were strategically located both on land and in the water. Bushes and floating sticks and plants made hides for the water blinds in the channel of water which divided the arena in two across the middle. This stretch of water was just too wide for the dogs to jump and was a great source of amusement to the capacity crowds which filled the seats. Each dog that tried to walk around the water brought "aaaahs" and craning necks from the audience, and each pussyfooter into the water caused giggles and gales of laughter. The tests for the finals were: Triple mark. Diversion and blind. Triple blind and a double with bulldog and blind. The judge was Dr. M. F. (Turney) Williams.

With the severe winter conditions that have prevailed at some of the southern Ontario training trials, some clubs are beginning to wonder if they are worth it. The low temperatures seem to have no scent-holding abilities, with the result that dogs are often close to the bird but, with no scent, often hunt and hunt and either stumble on it by accident or have to have it rethrown. The bird sometimes disappears into the snow and bitter, cutting winds make even the hardest judges, handlers and trial workers cold and numb. The icy crust, caused either by sudden thaws and refreezings or by ice storms, leads to cut feet and poor work on the whole.

By the time this article appears in print the Spring Judges' Clinics will have been held in both the East and the West. Previous Clinics have proven to be most informative and interesting. Tapes of the early Clinics are available to clubs who wish to use them. These tapes, made in the East, have been borrowed by Westerners and the comments received have proved the benefits of taping the dis-

cussions. The Eastern Clinic in Toronto is April 8 and 9 and the Western Clinic will be in Calgary on April 15 and 16.

The 1967 National will be held in Montreal from October 12 - 15 and plans for this are already underway. With Expo '67 in Montreal, this could be a good time for your planned trip East with your whole family. However, accommodation being at a premium, and prices higher than normal, and even camp sites in the Parks requiring reservations, it might be a good idea to try to arrange to stay with relatives or friends, if you haven't already got reservations.

At some of the shows already held this year, several different trophies have made their appearance which could well be used for field trial trophies. Centennial year is the motif and centennial coin sets, glass sets, centennial tankards, trays with the centennial design or map of Canada on them, are all available now. To visitors from across the border as well as to local residents who win them, they are truly Canadian and mark this Centennial year well.

With the seriousness with which some field trialers are now going to training trials, one wonders if they are really enjoying themselves or whether they are just out to win. Training trials should be fun. They should be enjoyed and they should be looked on as places where dogs and handlers have the opportunity of working under trial conditions without the costs and tensions of a Licensed Trial. Handlers should not be so desperately keen to win that they cannot bring themselves to correct their dogs' faults. A fault not corrected early may be the cause of a dog losing the coveted blue ribbon later on. Don't lose your patience, or your temper. You have the opportunity at a training trial to go out and correct your dog (not necessarily with a beating!) and by the time you get into the real trials where the entry fees are higher and the wins really count, your dog will have settled down and be in far better shape than one who has completed every winter trial but is still goofing on simple things, but not badly enough to put him out.

Training trial entries are increasing to almost the size of Licensed Trials and to combat the problem of dogs not getting the corrections and the real training they need the Labrador Owners Club has been holding regular field training sessions for their members as well as running training trials which are open to all. The field training sessions are divided into stakes and tests set up. Once the test is set, any dog can run it as many times as the handler desires until he feels his dog has mastered it, then he can move on to the next test, and so on until he has completed all tests satisfactorily. It is all good practice and dogs and handlers seem to enjoy it. □

UMANELY SPEAKING

BY TOM HUGHES

I am getting pretty tired of those people who call themselves "animal or dog lovers" who write and telephone to me to complain about the fact that a dog has been picked up by an Animal Control Officer, Animal Warden, or to use the more well known title, the much criticised "Dog Catcher!" I agree that many dog catchers should not be allowed to catch flies, let alone dogs. I agree completely that many dog catchers are moonlighting by sending dogs for research. I know only too well that many dog pounds to which unfortunate dogs are taken are not fit to house anything except the dog catcher himself, and that probably the best thing that could happen to these so called "pounds" is for them to be burnt! Agreed! Agreed! Agreed! BUT the fact still remains that, in principle, the best protection for any dog in any community in Canada is a modern, humane, moderate dog control by-law enforced by humane, reasonable, knowledgeable Animal Control Officers, subject to proper supervision by a competent person. And if the dogs are taken to a clean Animal Shelter operated by a local Humane Society which is responsible in turn to an interested and informed membership, then the "ordeal" of being impounded should mean no more to the dog than a trip to a well run boarding kennel.

I thought of this recently when three stories came to my attention.

In Kingston, Ont., a dog was shot and then beaten to death by a farmer. The dog in question was in the general vicinity of three young lads and was allowed to run on farm land on which cattle are "habitually kept." And, in Ontario, this means that the farmer was acting within the law. The severe law that protects the citizen who wishes to exercise the "ultimate sanction" by killing the offending dog rather than exercise his civil rights by suing the owner of the dog, which could easily have been done in this case. And so there is no charge that can be brought against such a man. The dog was shot, twice, but not killed or even seriously wounded. The man used the butt of the rifle to beat the dog to death. The fact that the man did beat the dog to death is the very act on his part that protects him against a criminal charge. If he had not done this; if, for example, he had merely shot and wounded the dog and

allowed it to suffer, then he could, and would, have been charged with causing the animal "unnecessary suffering." But the law allows him to "kill" any dog that comes on to his property. By any method. He can, for example, poison the animal. Or trap it. So long as he kills the dog he is in the clear.

How much better if the dog had been impounded and taken to an Animal Shelter from which the owner could have recovered this dog by merely taking the trouble to go to the Shelter and by paying a small fee. And yet far too many people, both men and women, take the opportunity, when claiming their dogs, to abuse the personnel at the Animal Shelter. The language they use is often both choice and ripe.

And what about the all too common, frequent instance of dogs that die under the wheels of a motor vehicle. Is there anything more tragic and heartbreaking than the sight of a terrified dog in traffic, frantically trying to escape the terror of screeching tires, the honking horns, only to end with a sickening thud and a torn, broken body flying through the air. And how very few motorists will even stop to see if the animal can be helped. And what can the average person do if the dog is obviously too far gone for anyone to be able to help.

Not too long ago I was driving on the Macdonald-Cartier Freeway near Belleville, Ont. It was dark but the weather was clear. I was in the fast lane when my headlights picked out the body of a dog lying on the grass median. From long training and habit I immediately stopped on the grass median, and walked back to look at the dog. The dog was still alive but near to death. I backed up the Society car equipped with red emergency flashing lights to where the dog lay. I was nearly killed by a car travelling at about 80 m.p.h. which swerved on to the grass median to pass me. The dog died en route to a veterinary hospital. How long had the dog lain

there? Wouldn't that dog have been better off in a decent shelter or pound?

Every day in Canada, many animals die of strichnine poisoning. The fact that strichnine can be easily obtained, without any need to sign a drug store register, is not well known. But it is true, nevertheless. Strychnine is the base of all the most common vermicifuges. It is used to kill rats and mice. It is used in vast quantities. Every spring there is a rash of pet animal deaths caused by the wide-spread, seasonal use of rat and mouse poisons in homes and gardens throughout the land. Have you ever seen a dog die of this form of poison? It is quite horrible. There is no doubt that strichnine is one of the most cruel poisons. Many other pesticides and for that matter garden preparations contain arsenic or other poison, and they all contribute to the never ending succession of pets that die from one poison or another.

Wouldn't all these animals be better off if instead of dying in agony, they had been taken to a comfortable kennel until their concerned owner claimed them?

Let's face it. If the owners of the animals that are taken to shelters were really concerned for the safety and well being of their pets, they would be jolly glad that they were safe and would not abuse the staff at these places of refuge.

The conclusion is obvious. Many people don't care where their animals are or what happens to them or, if they do, not enough to accept the chore of looking after them properly. And when something does happen and the dog is picked up they vent their guilty conscience on the only people they can find who have to accept their nonsense; the very people who are trying to ensure that no harm comes to animals. There is something very sad in the spectacle of a hardworking "volunteer" who probably worked and

gave until it hurt to make the shelter possible in the first place being abused by some bad tempered, crude "pet owner!"

Such people simply should not have animals. They do not deserve them. The tragedy is that this type of person will always have another and another and another dog, no matter how many they lose. It's a tough world for dogs — and anyone who tries to help them. Try it some time and you'll soon see what I mean! □

insecticides and weed killers

The incidence of canine poisoning goes up considerably during the months when gardens, lawns and trees are usually sprayed for control of weeds, insects or pests of various types. Today's insecticides are the most powerful ever produced by man, and a knowledge of those most widely used should be within the interest of all dog owners.

The indiscriminate use of chemicals might be an innocent procedure, but the toxic effects of most insecticides cannot be denied. The fact that dogs lick their feet and many occasionally eat grass dictates a very careful look into the contents of whatever lawn or plant insecticides may be used and a knowledge of the potential danger of the ingredients.

The majority of these chemicals, when ingested, may lie dormant, stored within the body until the body draws on its fat reserves. The dangers are insidious and become alarming only when symptoms appear. Many poisons are stored within the fatty tissues and the liver, and the threat of chronic poisoning and degenerative changes of the liver are very real.

Residues from chlorinated hydrocarbons may be excreted through the milk, according to John P. Smith, D.V.M., in *The Southwestern Veteri-*

narian. Puppies may then receive small but regular additions to the load of toxic materials building up in their bodies, which may have begun in the womb before birth.

Since the common agents used for insect or weed control are not generally responsive to home treatment or first aid, the help of the veterinarian should be obtained if poisoning is suspected. Keeping a list of all the various house and garden sprays will be helpful in such cases.

This check list should be followed by the owner who suspects his dog has been poisoned:

1. Keep the dog warm and quiet.
2. Determine what poison has been ingested, if possible. Call the veterinarian. Observe the dog's actions carefully and tell the veterinarian all that you can. Brief but accurate reporting may save your dog's life.
3. If the veterinarian approves, administer an antidote.
4. Don't delay. Call and act promptly; get the dog to the veterinarian as soon as possible.

Following are some of the more popular compounds used in garden and tree sprays:

DDT

Dissolved in oil, DDT is definitely toxic. If swallowed, it is absorbed through the digestive tract and stored in those organs rich in fatty substances — the adrenals, testes, or thyroid. Relatively large amounts are

deposited in the liver and kidneys, and stored there. Results are cumulative.

CHLORDANE

Residues of this chemical are long and persistent. It may be absorbed through the skin or lungs, or swallowed. The results are cumulative.

DIELDRIN

Five times as toxic as DDT when swallowed and forty times as toxic when absorbed through the skin in solution. It strikes quickly and with terrible effect on the nervous system, sending the victim into convulsions. This, too, has cumulative results.

ALDRIN

Extremely toxic and can sometimes produce sterility.

ENDRIN

Fifteen times more toxic than DDT to mammals: used primarily by gardeners for spraying trees.

ORGANIC PHOSPHATES—PARATHION

This widely used insecticide produces paralysis and is extremely toxic. Destroys enzymes in the body.

MALATHION

Widely used by gardeners; in mosquito sprays, etc. Relatively harmless except when used in combination with other organic phosphates.

HERBICIDES

Belief that herbicides are toxic only to plant life and pose no threat to animal life is, unfortunately, not true. Plant killers include a large number of chemicals that act on animal tissues, as well as vegetation.

Field Trial Jargon

by JOHN SELLEN

In response to some comments, and phone calls directed to our C.K.C. representative in Manitoba I have penned the following lines.

After the Canadian National Retriever trials held in Edmonton, Alberta in October, 1966, I had occasion to do a write up of this trial for *Canadian Field Trial News* and also for *Dogs in Canada*.

Following my report in these magazines, the C.K.C. representative for Manitoba received several telephone calls from irate readers who wanted to know what kind of sadists would run a dog in the National trial after he had been badly hurt in a previous series. May I hasten to explain that these calls came from well meaning but uninformed people, as to common terms used by people who run dogs in Retriever trials.

Thus the following terms have been set out to better acquaint interested readers who would like to know a little more about the field trial game. This is not an attempt to list every term ever used in Retriever trials, but rather the more common ones that come readily to this writer's mind.

A dog that has been "Badly Hurt" in a certain series, merely means that he has done a poor job on that particular test, and has nothing whatever to do with the dog being injured.

"Blind Retrieve" — A test whereby a dog has to retrieve a bird that has been hidden so that only the judges and the handler of the dog are aware of its exact location. The dog must then be directed to this bird by means of whistle and hand signals.

"Taking a line" or "Running a line" — This term is applied to a dog being sent on as direct a line as possible to a blind retrieve. Running a good line would mean that the dog has followed the direction given to him by the handler for most of the distance to a blind retrieve.

"Lining a blind" — Simply means that the dog has been sent all the way to the bird without using any whistle or hand signals, and also that he has taken a direct line all the way out to the blind retrieve.

"Handling a dog" — Means stopping your dog by means of a loud blast on a whistle and then directing the dog with directional signals with your hand.

"Casting a dog" — Is the term used when, upon stopping your dog with a

blast on the whistle, you handle your dog to left or right or direct him to go further away from you by means of holding your hand in certain positions.

"Popping" — Is a term used when a dog is sent out for a blind retrieve and he turns and looks at the handler before he has been directed to stop by whistle signals.

"Dry shot" or "Popper shot" — A term for the firing of a gun by a gunner placed in the field by the judges, but no bird is thrown for the dog to retrieve. This dry shot is often used in conjunction with a blind retrieve to see if a dog will be inclined to go over to the gunner who has fired this shot, after he has been sent by the handler. The idea being to see how well the dog will handle away from this dry shot and over to where the blind retrieve is hidden.

"Gunner" — The man who fires the shots.

"Thrower" — The man who throws the birds for the dog to retrieve.

"Marking Test" — A test where the dog sees all the birds being thrown prior to his retrieving them.

"Steady to shot" — A dog is considered steady when he does not leave the handler's side until he is ordered to do so.

"Honor dog" — This is a test to see if a dog will sit quietly while another dog who has been sitting beside him is sent out to retrieve birds.

"Breaking" — This is when a dog leaves his handler's side to retrieve a bird before being sent by his handler.

This happens most often on an honoring test.

"Retiring Gunners and Throwers" — After the shot has been fired and the bird thrown in the field. The gunner and throwers sometimes are asked to retire, or hide from the dog's view. This is a test to see how good the memory of a dog is after the gunner and thrower have moved from their original position, and are in fact out of sight of the dog.

I would like to point out again that these are by no means all the expressions used in connection with field trials. Perhaps some reader who is much better qualified as a writer than myself could pursue the matter further and cover the subject completely and put the material down in writing in such a fashion that it will make interesting reading for everyone.

My thanks again to *Dogs in Canada* and particularly the editor Elizabeth Dunn, for the opportunity of informing its readers as to some of the field trial jargon. □

Sled Dog Racing

Laconia, N.H.

The Laconia Race has always been good news to Canadian sled dog teams but this year our dogs and drivers broke a 40-year record by placing 1st, 2nd and 3rd.

Eddie Sylvain, of Lac Beauport, Que., an intensely competitive 28 year old Canadian, placed 1st three days running, a record held by only one other man, Dr. Charles Belford of Deerfield, Mass.

Like most dogs, Eddie's team reflect his own temperament. His 12 Siberians, Shepherds and Huskies are tense, ebullient and tremendously keen to go.

Eddie and these 12 regulars have placed in the top three winning positions at all the races in the Eastern circuit this year which, for consistency, might be a record only accorded to the three 'greats', Dr. Lombard, Keith Bryar and Dr. Belford.

Second place went to Raymond Garneau of Quebec City with a team of cross-bred hounds jointly owned by Wilf Lepine, a 'great' international competitor for the past 20 years or more.

Third place went to Malcolm McDougall from Ste. Agathe, Que., owner of Malamac Siberian Husky Kennels. This team has been moving up from an average 8th position four years ago to 1st and 2nd place positions this year. 'Mac' maintains that the training his dogs got on the Alaskan circuit in '66 is the reason for this improvement.

Two American women placed 4th and 5th, 19-year-old Debbie Molburg and Jean Bryar, former 3-time winner in the North American Women's Championship Race in Alaska.

Then two more Canadian boys, Marcel Plante, 6th, and teen-age Pierre Brunet, son of the 'great' International champion Ernie Brunet, in 7th place.

Reminiscing with Ernie while waiting for the teams to cross the finish line we learned that his old lead dog, Rex, at 17 years of age is enjoying life as a house pet as only an old working dog can do. Ernie talked about the races of 15 years ago when this "small dog with a big heart" led his teams to many victories through rough trails with deep snow up to the brisket that the modern driver won't face since the introduction of the Bombardier, Snow-cat and Ski-doo.

From my point of view the most interesting teams at Laconia were the registered team of nine Walker Coon Hounds owned and driven by 53 year old Don Blodgett of Hollowell, Maine, and the 11 Irish Setters owned by John Lyman of Guilford, N.H.

The Walker Coon Hounds are registered with the United K.C. in the States and are used by Blodgett all year round to hunt coon and cat. They compete in field trials, are bench champions and run in harness during the New England racing circuit led by eight year old "Tennessee Ernie".

They placed 8th overall at Laconia, a very keen, happy, strong and handsome team of hound dogs at the hitch-up area. I didn't see this team running on the course but did see the Irish Setters at two cross points.

The Setters loped along at a good pace in perfect rhythm. For sheer beauty nothing could match the contrast between the bright sunshine on the new snow and the deep red of the shining Setter coats. This team was led by 11 year old Bridgett, a good-boned Setter bitch in beautiful condition.

John Lyman, President of the Lakes Region Sled Dog Club, is a typical dog driver. The only information he could remember off-hand regarding the stock back of his Setters was the fact that his first dog came from kennels owned by Mrs. Swartz, a past Secretary of the Irish Setter K.C. of America. (Most dog drivers have to go to their files to get kennel names, pedigree records and the like.)

His dogs were handicapped during this particular weekend by balled-up feet due to temperature and snow conditions. Corn snow in the month of March gives his dogs the least amount of trouble, although several of the Setters on this team are never bothered with this problem.

Emile Martel, a former International Champion driver, perfected a formula to counteract this problem of balling-up which Lyman uses on the

Setters' feet but, even so, the weather conditions were such that his team did lose time and he finished in 20th place.

An interesting fact here is that a team of Setters set a record back in the '30s that has never been broken. They ran 10 miles in 27 minutes.

Forty-five teams were entered at Laconia and 43 teams ran the three-day 60-mile course. Many of the 450 dogs at the hitch-up area (and that's a conservative estimate) are registered with the AKC or CKC and all of

them are in top form through conditioning and training at this time of the year.

Very little has ever been said about the men and women who drive these dogs other than to use the adjective 'great'. This word includes everything; courage and stamina, both moral and physical, and self discipline in the highest degree. If a driver is not so endowed by nature he either drops out of the sport or he develops these qualities. If he cannot control

himself he cannot control, let alone train, 13 or 14 fast, powerful dogs running ahead of him.

These dogs are as keen and competitive as the driver who runs up the mountain behind the sled and peddles mile after mile on the flat.

Another professional racing season has ended in the East. To both our dogs and their drivers — the unsung heroes of the dog world — congratulations on a job well done in this Centennial year of 1967.

Canadian Centennial

"Mark Ten" Derby

The Carnival spirit was in the air at Hudson Heights, Qué., the weekend of March 4 and 5 when, as part of the festivities presented by the Lake of Two Mountains Civitan Association, 23 Canadian and American dog teams competed in the two-day Centennial 'Mark Ten' Sled Dog Derby which was managed by the Laurentien Sled Dog Club.

Drivers were unanimous in their praise of the 14-mile circuit prepared by the Association over the fields and trails of the Lake of Two Mountains Hunt Club. The winning team, Eddie Sylvain of Lac Beauport, completed the two-heat race of 28 miles in a total time of 2:02:15., closely followed by Dick Moulton of Centre Harbour, N.H., in 2:02:18 — only the difference of a lead dog's sneeze! Mac McDougall of Ste. Agathe was third with 2:05:04, Raymond Garneau of Lac Beauport 4th (2:06:01) and Anne Wing of Millbrook, New York 5th (2:07:35).

For the first time in this area, a three-dog amateur race was run over a shortened course with Nancy Scarth of Baie d'Urfé winning over two local teams and one from New York State. (Amateur Sam and Husky drivers in Quebec and Ontario should keep this race in mind for next year; we all had a lot of fun and excitement seeing our dogs perform against competition.)

And for the first time in the history of sled dog racing a check was made for the use of stimulants and other illegal drugs. This was done under the direction of Race Marshalls Don McFaul and Keith Bryar, using a special kit prepared by the Federal Department of Agriculture and the Independent laboratories of Warnock Hersey for the testing of all race horses in eastern Canada. Before the second heat, urine samples were taken from a random number of dogs from each of the six fastest teams in the

first heat, using sterile procedures and a foolproof coding and identification system; the test is extremely sensitive and will even show up the feeding of such mild stimulants as coke, a tea bag, or chocolate. The lab immediately processes the samples and results are available in 48 hours; in this case, officials were pleased to report that results were negative.

As can be imagined, these tests are costly but it is expected that an awareness that such tests may be done will discourage misdemeanors on the part of any misguided driver.

Not only was the competition good and the atmosphere friendly and warm but the "mushers" were well fed by the Ladies' Guild of the Côte St. Charles United Church at a pot luck supper, and well entertained at a round and square dance held on the Saturday night. "Oui, ici on parle l'hospitalité!" □

The Law and Dog Owners

Conclusion of a three-part article by Mr. Martin,
Port Arthur lawyer and enthusiastic dog owner

Last month I advised my client that I thought he would be not found liable for the damage done by his dogs either under the Criminal Code or by a Civil Court. However, he couldn't seem to leave the subject alone and although I had prepared a written opinion for him he wanted to talk about it. "Say, Counselor, if I had been found liable, what would it have cost me?"

"The answer is very simple," I replied. "What it costs depends upon what or whom is injured." I pointed out that the cost to him would be an attempt by the Courts to recompense the injured person for the damage done. "In other words, the Judge would try to place the injured party in the position he would have been but for the damage done by your animals."

My client looked up from my written opinion and said "That's ridiculous. You can't take away the pain from the bite, and we can't bring back the dog that has been killed."

"No," I stated, "but money is put in place of the destroyed dog or bitten person. The Court requires that there be strict proof of the losses, and the losses must be those which have a value in law. Not all losses have value. For example, if your dogs dig holes in your neighbor's lawn, and you are found liable, the complaining neighbor would not receive any money for his annoyance in seeing your dogs dig the holes in his lawn. A judge would award him the cost of filling in the holes and perhaps reseeding the lawn. His mental anguish at seeing your dogs sitting on his tulips is not a factor taken into consideration but the actual cost of replacing the tulips is. Interestingly enough, if your neighbor fills in his own lawn himself, and does not call in a landscape gardener to do it he may have difficulty in establishing the "quantum"



of his loss, that is the amount the loss actually cost him, and he might recover nothing."

From a legal point of view, the loss or injury must be one that can be given a dollar and cents value.

"The money to be awarded depends upon the circumstances of every case, and surprisingly the awards are much lower than one might expect. For those of you who live in the City of Toronto, you might have noticed a news story from the morning newspaper published in that city Friday, March 17, 1967. The report stated that a six year old boy was bitten by a German Shepherd dog in April of 1966 and awarded damages of \$457.40 by a County Court Judge. The boy and his father sought \$8,000.00 from the dog's owner, and it would appear that the trial Judge found that the boy had been injured by the dog named Prince. Liability was found against Prince's owner. The Judge held that the general damages for pain and suffering that the boy received be in an amount of \$250.00 to be held in Court until the boy reached 21. The balance of the Judgment being \$207.40 covered the medical and out-of-pocket expenses of the boy and his father."

My client looked at the clipping

with real interest. "Although not right on point, the Judge stated the dog had displayed a mischievous tendency and that the owner of the dog was negligent in having a defective lock on the gate of his property. Good thing he wasn't talking about me," the client read on.

"The Judge found that the boy was in an alley, when the dog chased him and bit him on the buttocks, and that the boy had not been negligent."

I interrupted, "It is also interesting to note that the newspaper report states that a veterinarian testified that German Shepherds bite more frequently than other breeds of dogs." I mused, wondering what people might say if they had to testify about my Corgis, quiet little dogs that they are.

My client broke into my thoughts and said, "How on earth could they decide that the value of a bite on the buttocks of a six year old boy was worth \$250.00."

I laughed, "We lawyers have a magic scale which we use in personal injury cases and those of us who engage in Court work believe that we can place a value on any sort of wound or injury inflicted. The general damages . . . I don't really know in this case, but in all cases, if the owner of the dog is held to be liable, the injured person will get his special damages."

"What are special damages?", asked my client.

"Well," I said, in the jargon of the trade, "This refers to those damages which are specific, or which are known to relate directly to the injury. These are the medical bills, hospital bills, compensation for torn pants, dry cleaning account and all the rest."

"The only real question revolves around the general damages, which are those given for the pain and suffering of the injury." I pulled a

book from the uneven pile on my desk and started to paraphrase.

"The most interesting case involving general damages is one that was reported early this year, in the High Court of Justice of Ontario. In that case a man was bitten on the knee by a dog. The skin of the knee was not broken, but on the day after the complainant was bitten, he noticed teeth marks on his knee and went to his family physician. The physician tested the injured person in a normal and approved manner for anti-tetanus allergy and then gave him a full injection in the upper right forearm, which is said to be the normal and proper procedure for treatment of such injury. The patient suffered a toxic reaction, which resulted in a permanent partial paralysis of the right arm and shoulder. The Judge stated that from the medical evidence available, it would appear that such cases of disability are rare.

"The injured person sued the dog owner for damages for the bite on his knee and for his partial paralysis. The dog owner readily admitted that he could be liable for the bite on the knee, but in addition the Court held that the injured person was entitled to collect for the damages arising from the doctor's injection, and special and general damages in an amount of \$23,784.30 were given against the dog owner, and interestingly enough, the doctor was not held to be liable."

My client whistled, and said, "Boy, O boy! I wouldn't want to be responsible to pay \$23,000.00."

"Few dog owners would be," I replied, "but the question is, 'How many dog owners protect themselves from such contingency?'" I looked at my client squarely, "Would you drive a motor vehicle on the highway without insurance?"

"Of course not," he replied, "That's foolish, you jeopardize everything you own, if you become involved in an accident and injure an innocent person."

"Well," I said "The same thing holds true if you own a dog, and you do not cause the risks of such ownerships to be insured. Do you know that in many cases, if you have a composite policy of insurance on your home, for no additional premium, your agent may include in the liability portion of the package a rider to the effect that your insurance will cover all damage done by pets, whether the damage or injury occur on or off your own premises. If you have more than one or two dogs, and you are involved in breeding and/or having a kennel, a policy of liability insurance is a must and from what I have been able to learn the premium rates are very low in having regard to the protection afforded. I would suggest that every dog owner discuss with his own insurance agent the possibility of taking out such a policy."

"Counselor," said my client, "you're taking the fun out of everything.

Now to have dogs we've got to have insurance, we've got to obey municipal by-laws, we've got to look at provincial statutes, and all of the things you have told me about seem to add immensely to the cares of dog ownership."

I put my feet on my desk. My receptionist had left for the day, and I was anxious to get home. I had just a moment more to talk dogs with my client.

"Friend, owning a dog is getting to be like everything else. It's not like it was even ten years ago. Those good old days when you could let the dogs run in the backwoods, bounding over the open fields, are rapidly coming to an end. Today you have to license your dogs, and in built up areas, leash them. You must take care they are not running where there are cattle. You must prove to certain people the dogs have had proper vaccinations and you can't take them across international borders without veterinary certificates. As a lawyer I suggest you are foolish to own dogs not covered by liability insurance. Those simple pleasures of owning dogs, like many other things in this confusion of twentieth century urban living, are not as simple as they once were. Even so, I find that some of our most pleasurable moments are romping with the Corgis at home.

"So get out of the office . . . I want to lock up and get home, it's almost supper time and our big brave cattle dogs are most annoyed if they don't get supper in the kitchen right on schedule. Good Night."

My client left to go to his kennels and I started home to those over-insured, over-fenced and over-fed dogs of mine. □

club activities

The purpose of the club directory is to help our readers to locate a club which fits their own particular doggy interests. Listings in the directory have increased steadily and it has now overflowed to a second page. The all-breed clubs operate on a local or area basis, as do the group clubs. The breed clubs, for the most part, strive for national coverage. Only one obedience training club, the Queen City Training and Tracking Associates, is listed in the directory but several of the all-breed clubs provide training classes. No field trial club has yet taken a listing in the directory but two of the breed clubs listed provide field training and run field trials. To assist its advertisers, Dogs in Canada asked each club listed to report as to what it was doing to promote pure-bred dogs to the general public. The response was very grati-

fying and this article attempts to collate the replies received.

ALL-BREED CLUBS

The all-breed clubs, in most cases, provide championship shows in their own area and frequently provide training classes. This is especially true of the smaller communities where limitation of numbers makes separate training clubs a difficult proposition. In addition to their show-giving activities all-breed clubs tend to become very involved in their own communities. The Lethbridge & District KC commenced operations in 1961 at a time when there was a pronounced anti-dog atmosphere in the city. The club approached the city for stricter enforcement of the existing leash law and for an increased license fee for unspayed bitches. Their suggestions were adopted and the situation improved. The club then set out to improve the demand for pure-bred dogs by shows, training classes and advertisements in the local paper. Enquiries are now received from all over southern Alberta. The Ontario County KC has a similar program which is tied in with a puppy match at the Brooklin fair. Here the dogs parade before the grandstand while the announcer describes the breed and its original purpose.

The Calgary K & OC, the Edmonton KC and the Northern Alberta CA all place great emphasis on their training classes and the large numbers of dogs and handlers which pass through these classes each year. A scrutiny of the scores at some of the Alberta trials shows the success of this emphasis. The Northern Alberta CA prides itself on the Klondike theme of its spring show each year. This provides wonderful publicity material which enables the club to get both TV coverage and newspaper support.

GROUP CLUBS

The group clubs, including the Toy Dog Breeders Association of Canada, conduct shows either on their own or in conjunction with all-breed clubs. Many of these clubs also seem to place more emphasis on their educational programs than do the all-breed clubs. In a great many cases invitations are issued to other dog clubs and to the general public to attend. The British Columbia All Terrier Club reports an average attendance of 75 at its educational meetings. Is the failure of the all-breed clubs to report educational programs indicative of lack of interest or of a lack of suitable speakers? One of the most interesting educational meetings which we have had the opportunity to attend was a panel discussion staged by the Dominion Collie and Shetland Sheepdog Association. The program was taped and loaned to various other clubs in Ontario, British Columbia, Texas, Colorado and England before returning to Quebec. When the decision was made to tape the program the DC&SSA thought that other

clubs would return the compliment and offer tapes in exchange. Sad to say, none ever did.

BREED CLUBS

The breed clubs in Canada have a very real problem of communication because of the great distances between members and groups of members. In many cases they try to tie their members together by a newsletter. These can be very effective if published at regular intervals. The Canadian Samoyed Club publishes its bulletin every three months. The Belgian Sheepdog Club of Canada publishes its newsletter eight times each year. The Labrador Owners Club publishes a yearbook as well as its bulletin. This year book is a *magnum opus* complete with pictures of members and their dogs, an honor roll and a list of top-producing Labrador sires and dams.

The Basenji Club of Canada is possibly the most dedicated to achieving national coverage. In 1967, this club plans a booster show in Ottawa and has applied for CKC permission for specialty shows in the Maritimes and in British Columbia. This club has a publicity committee which supplies press releases and other information on Basenji activities. Going over the reports sent in by the various clubs responding to our request it was noticeable how few clubs had someone on the executive with no other responsibility than to arrange and provide publicity.

Possibly the smallest breed club is the Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club of Canada. In its first year of activity this club has held two booster shows and started a stud registry. Another small but enthusiastic club is the Schipperke Club of Canada. It encourages its members to work their dogs in obedience. What better advertisement for a breed is there than a fine working specimen in an obedience trial? Possibly the most versatile is the Irish Setter Club of Canada. In addition to conformation shows, the club conducts two field trials each year and offers annual awards for field, obedience and conformation. It also publishes a year book and is very publicity minded. Its major publicity effort in recent times was in connection with a moving picture whose star was an Irish Setter. Close cooperation with the producer resulted in obedience-trained dogs appearing at theatres across Canada.

The St. Bernard Club of Ontario prides itself on activities where members and others can share the great beauty and strength of the dogs. Visits to children's homes and hospitals where the dogs mingle with the children and give them wagon and sled rides are favorite outings for members of the club. All dog people can be proud to have such public-spirited enthusiasts in their midst.

COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

The Lethbridge & District KC offers a standing reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction

of any dog poisoner. With the co-operation of other groups the reward now stands at \$400. With all the concern being expressed in Ontario and Quebec about dognapping to supply animals for research institutions, there would seem to be a wonderful opportunity for some of the dog clubs in that area to band together to offer a reward for the conviction of any dog thief. Such a project might be too big for any one club but would certainly be within the scope of a group of clubs. The Dominion Collie and Shetland Sheepdog Association reports that it has on several occasions made active protest about puppies being offered as prizes in promotional schemes. This is most commendable. The innocent victims of these schemes all too often end up in homes where there is little true love for a dog and a few weeks later are dead under the wheels of an automobile or up for adoption in some humane society shelter.

One of the most ambitious schemes for promotion of pure-bred dogs and also a declaration of war on puppy mills was the full page advertisement taken in the local daily paper by the St. Catharines and District K&OC during National Dog Week. The advertisement pointed out the pitfalls of purchasing a dog from a questionable source and the regulations regarding the registration of pure-bred dogs in Canada. It also listed the various breeds recognized in Canada and told of conformation shows and obedience trials.

LOOKING AHEAD

Looking over the various things done by the clubs advertising their activities by means of the club directory, the question arises as to why more educational programs are not offered to their members. Far removed from dogs but very pertinent, the North American Lily Society, with members scattered from coast to coast, conducts round robins which are groups of ten persons whose letters are circulated through the group several times a year to discuss all phases of lily culture. This would seem to be a very productive and interesting project for a breed club. Very little use appears to be made of books. A few clubs have books which are available for circulation among their members. Much more could be done in this area. A budget of \$25 for books each year would soon build a substantial club library. One or two groups provide their local public library with a subscription to *Dogs in Canada*. This would seem to be very suitable for the smaller communities.

The basic question of publicity is one which needs full emphasis. So many things can happen which might damage the image of pure-bred dogs and dog breeders that every club should have some member or members of its executive with full responsibility for publicity. Every club should be continually alert to the necessity for presenting a favorable image at all times and make certain that the image is well presented. □

Animal experiments and legislation *where do we stand?*

The manager of an S.P.C.A. in Canada states: "In 1954 I sat in a Court of Vancouver for four hours to testify about cruelty to a hog. The hog was shackled by its back legs, dragged across a room, yanked off the ground; its leg was broken, it was hoisted through a hole in the wall, and went around a wheel and banged against a steel plate, bumped along another 50 ft. where it lay there kicking and they finally stuck a knife into it. We testified all that in Court, and the Appeal Court ruled that it was not wilful cruelty."

That was in 1954. Such testimony by eye-witnesses of conditions in Canadian abattoirs led to the passage of the Federal Humane Slaughter Act in 1960, under which cattle and hogs must be rendered insensible prior to

and during slaughter. Federal, and in some areas Provincial legislation as well, has given the Courts power to prevent these arrant cruelties.

What of the suffering inflicted on animals in Canadian laboratories? There is no legislation whatever to protect these animals at present.

■ In Canada there are 12 schools of medicine and 25 universities, the majority of which have a number of faculties (some many) using animals, such as the Departments of Physiology, Neurology, Psychology, Pharmacy, Dentistry, Nutrition and so on. In a number there are areas for cancer research and radiology, and there are also Government Research Centres, National Defence laboratories, Guelph Veterinary College and three universities with veterinary de-

partments. Added to these users of animals are the Pharmaceutical companies in Eastern Canada and the hospitals across the land where animals are used for testing or experiment.

How many animals are thus used annually? The Government requires no returns.

How are they obtained? Again, the Government requires no record.

What of husbandry? It may run from excellent to very poor; but without regular and independent inspection and legally enforceable standards this cannot be confirmed.

What of post-operative care? Common sense would suggest that the whole purpose of a survival experiment hinges on this, and one does not doubt that generally scientists give it the required attention; but documentary evidence of conditions in U.S. institutions proves the reverse is too often true there — and how many of our Canadian laboratories provide responsible oversight at nights, at weekends, and on holidays? One remembers the death of hundreds of animals in the laboratory when Dr. Hans Selye's library went up in flames one night.

Finally, and most serious, what of the experiments performed? Is there needless repetition and duplication? An American scientist stated: "It is easier to repeat an experiment than to check what has already been done — the literature is so vast!" In one volume alone of the Index Medicus, the standard record of medical experimentation, approximately 108,150 experiments are listed, the majority using animals. (1).

To cite but a few examples:- Freezing as a method of anaesthesia for human subjects is a valuable technique, but is it necessary to repeat endlessly, in endless laboratories, freezing experiments on animals? One reason given is "Defence in Arctic Survival": but the United States Government has made such detailed studies at Wainright, Alaska, on both human volunteers and a vast variety of animals that one would think the further infliction of freezing experiments repetitive. Yet Canadian medical journals continue to report them. J. S. Hart and O. Heron exposed mice at -24 d. C. and -8 d. C. for a month. (2, 3). E. A. Sellers and D. G. Baker, using 280 animals, kept half the number from 76 to 82 weeks at near zero temperature. E. Schonbaum et al. placed unanaesthetized rats in a deep freeze at -20 d. C. "for as long as 3 hours". (4).

Another very painful type of experiment is exposure to Sarin poisoning. For example, experimenters at Suffield, Alta., exposed 50 cats to P-32 tagged Sarin and rabbits were injected with D.F.P. tagged with radio-phosphorus. There is no account of the effects on the animals during survival when the time of exposure was from five minutes to nearly ten hours

(651 mins.), but the report states that of the 50 cats, three died during exposure and 11 were "exposed till death". (5). There is no word of anaesthesia.

■ How needless are some of the procedures? In one volume alone of U.S. Biological Abstracts (a monthly) there are notes on no less than 66 psychological experiments involving rats, mice, bees, monkeys, guinea-pigs, pigeons, goldfish, hamsters, chicks, puppies and turtles, and covering such painful experiments as food and water deprivation, electric shock, inhaling gases, intense noise, forced activity, etc., the usual purpose being to prove the obvious — that lessons can be learnt and unlearnt, if there is sufficient stimulus — generally distressing. (6).

Canadian researchers are also active in this field. Some of the experiments to the layman would seem merely silly, but for the expenditure of time and funds involved. For example, at the University of Alberta young cats were first confined and then released for half an hour, and their "play motions" counted. In experimental jargon, the results noted were "A negatively accelerated increase in rate of responding as deprivation increased". (7). The report also solemnly lists 23 references between 1945 and 1960. Another, from the University of Manitoba, describes the increased learning ability of rats from an "enriched environment" as compared to that of others from an "environmentally restricted" category. The lucky ones had cages "with modernistic designs in luminous paint and mirrors, swings, marbles and teeter-totters", while their poorer brothers had unadorned cages and no playthings. (8).

But psychological experiments are rarely so painless. In some cases when rats went to their feeding pans they received "a single 250 volt condenser discharge in the mouth", the dish and wire mesh floor serving as terminals. (9). In other experiments rats are trained to press a bar to receive a food pellet, and when this skill is acquired "a 2-second burst of 60-cycle sine wave was given". (10).

To test whether blinded animals would "demonstrate greater activity than sighted ones" more than one series of experiments have blinded rats to test the theory. (11). The writer cited this as an example of needlessly inflicted suffering to the Head of a research Department. "Well, in my case, I would have cut the optic nerve rather than enucleate," he replied. "But why blind them at all?" one urged, and received only a tolerant smile. (12).

■ One of the cruellest types of psychological experiment is the "drastically restricted environment" in which puppies are confined — each in a small cage in complete isolation, with no human contact allowed for the first eight months of life. When finally released, such puppies' reactions to

electric shock, pricks and burning matches, are compared with those of normal dogs. (13).

One could go on endlessly citing examples of the suffering inflicted by experimental burns, surgery, dentistry, drug tests and so on, but there are other points to consider.

■ One does not deny that animal experimentation has led to greater knowledge of mammalian physiology, to infinitely greater skills in surgery, to the discovery of useful drugs, and the rejection of harmful ones. Also one believes that many medical scientists are humane men, dedicated to their task. Can regulation of experiments and the enforcement of humane standards not be left in their hands? Is legislation necessary? The answer is that abuses do exist unchecked; that a scientist is unwilling to criticise or condemn the behaviour of a fellow; that he would hold himself unfitted to judge the procedures of a scientist in a different field. Further, dedication has its dangers and the scientist may well gradually lose his sensitivity — "familiarity breeds contempt". A question was put to a group of leading Canadian experimenters: "What is the maximum of pain and suffering beyond which you will not go in the name of medical research?" (14). Not one of them would answer this question.

That Canadian scientists do realize the need for controls is evident in the "Code" prepared in 1960 by the Canadian Federation of Biological Sciences. (15). The Code's "Guiding Principles" cover acquisition of animals, husbandry, care and treatment under experiment, and post-operative care. But — and it is an all-important point — there is no means of enforcement and no outside, impartial body of inspectors to see that the Code's recommendations are observed.

Let us check a few of the points. "Animal quarters" should "provide opportunity for exercise"; yet in many laboratories, and in hospitals where dogs are held for surgery, there is no exercise area.

"All major operations must be done under general anaesthesia". Does the term "operation" refer only to surgery? Frequently it is used to cover other procedures where anaesthetics are not given, but severe pain is inflicted.

"Post-operative care should be adequate to minimize fear and discomfort". How is it then that practically no reports of experiments cite relieving agents being given? In fact, one of the frustrating aspects of scientific reports is the omission of such important data as the type and dosage of anaesthetic used (even if a drug is mentioned), the physical reaction of the subjects, the lack of reference to analgesics, and to the final disposition of the animal.

That the "Code" is a guide and that, where funds permit, it is followed, is evident in a number of labora-

BREED

NOTES

Readers are asking: why isn't there more about their breed? What are people doing in the many breeds? We need your help! Please send in brief items pertaining to your breed, Canadian wins in the U.S.A., imports, formation of new clubs, items of interest about various breeds you may find in your reading.

The Standard of the Breed

What are we trying to do? Conscientious breeders of Wirehaired Pointing Griffons will answer that question by saying, "We are trying to breed dogs conforming as closely as possible to the 'Standard of the Breed'".

"Official" Standards of the Wirehaired Pointing Griffon are promulgated and published by such agencies as the American Kennel Club, the Field Dog Stud Book, the French Club for le Griffon d'arret a Poil Dur, and the German Griffon Club. All of these Standards are similar; the wording is almost identical in many cases. They all evolved from Korthal's early concept of an ideal hunting dog, a concept which has been refined through many generations of breeding experience and which in its present official form is widely accepted by serious breeders.

The Standard is a "blue-print", but not an unreasonably rigid one. It places greatest emphasis on those features which directly relate to the Griffon as a hunting companion, but it also recognizes esthetic features — beauty for beauty's sake. There is a commonsense reason for each and every firm requirement of the Standard. Likewise, there is a commonsense reason for the variations permitted by the Standard — absolute uniformity for the sake of absolute uniformity is neither desirable nor genetically possible.

A sturdy healthy physique is perhaps the most fundamental and inflexible requirement of the Standard of our breed. It is a "must". It depends much on heredity. It is absolutely essential to a gun dog. It is characterized by a strong bone structure, by firm powerful muscles, and by a vigorous behavior. It does not exist in a dog with hereditary faults such as hare-lip, cleft palate, butterfly nose, cast eye, malformed teeth, overshot or undershot jaw, deafness, navel hernia, absence of one or both testicles, weak spine, curved spine, or shallow hip-sockets. In short, our ideal gun dog must be a healthy normal athlete full of energy and stamina.

Nobility of character and personality is as essential to the hunting Griffon as is a sound physique — and just as difficult to measure quantitatively in a dog as in a man. Qualitatively, it is characterized by boldness and courage, by eagerness to please, and by warm friendliness. These char-

acteristics are not in the least contradictory; they really amount to the same thing. It is the timid, cringing dog that is unfriendly, even to the point of being dangerous and vicious. Only the self-confident dog, one without fear, can dare to be a staunch and loyal friend to man. Teaching a boisterous puppy good manners is easy; breaking a gun-shy dog of its fear is a near-impossible task. Character and personality are greatly influenced by environment (training), but heredity alone provides the necessary foundation.

Now let's be more specific. The height of the Wirehaired Pointing Griffon (measured at the withers) may vary between 19" and 24" according to most Standards. Basically the hunting Griffon is a "middle sized" dog and although the extremes in height are permissible they are undesirable under most hunting conditions. Conceivably a big heavy Griffon might have an advantage hunting bear or wild boar; conceivably a small spindly Griffon might have an advantage hunting rabbits. But, as a breed, the Wirehaired Pointing Griffon is bred not to be a "special game" dog, but instead an "all-round gun dog". Medium size is consistent with all-purpose.

More important than size is conformation, and on this feature the Standard is quite firm. Our hunting Griffon must be a powerfully built, compact heavily muscled dog. The slender lankiness and exaggerated "tuck-up" of the racer or the sprinter is for other breeds — not for our Griffon. Instead, that solid close-coupled chunky build that makes for endurance and stamina is the sure sign of good Wirehaired Pointing Griffon breeding. Viewed from the front or rear the legs are straight. Viewed from the side with the dog standing in a normal relaxed position the back is straight and horizontal. The tail may be either full natural length or docked at the fifth joint. The muzzle is square and the ears moderately short. Overall, the hunting Griffon gives the impression of a compact bundle of energy.

The Griffon's coat is another feature on which the Standard is quite inflexible. It must be wiry and harsh. Actually, the typical coat is made up of two types of hair; the stiff, long (2" to 3") hair which gives the coat its harshness, and the short fine hair which makes up the tight warm



undercoat. Soft coats, curly coats (like a Poodle), and short coats do not typify our hunting Griffon. Special diet and good grooming may improve any dog's coat, but a good Griffon's coat can be produced only by good breeding — good genetics. Incidentally, here's a tip on selecting a puppy: Typically pronounced and stiff moustache and eyebrows (which always can be detected by the time a puppy is eight weeks old) are genetically linked with a typically wiry coat (which may not fully emerge

until the puppy is almost a year old).

Almost any markings and color (except black) are permitted by the several Standards, and the breed is quite heterozygous in this regard. Extremes include solid dark liver or mahogany, and near solid off-white. Much preferred, however, is the Griffon with strongly contrasted marking and color, especially dark mahogany and light gray — a combination easily seen against a background of white snow or green foliage or dark underbrush. Symmetric markings about the

head and ears add a distinct note of beauty, and a white tip on the tail accents the hunting Griffon's pointing style.

Perhaps it is not too much to say that the Griffon's eyes mirror its soul. Surely they are wonderfully expressive. The Standard requires a deep dark pupil and a brown iris, the darker the better. Light yellow eyes are undesirable. The shape of the eye opening is more round or more wide-open than is common to other pointing breeds, perhaps because of the protective "eye-shade" afforded by the Griffon's canopy of eyebrows!"

Understandably, the Standard is not explicit on the hunting instincts and talents of the Wirehaired Pointing Griffon. After all, these features can be fairly judged only in the field — not in the show ring. Nevertheless, the driving urge to seek game, the sensitive nose that can find game, the instinct to point and hold game, and the pride felt in retrieving game to one's master's hand are all traits essential to and typical of the hunting Griffon. Korthals, by his rigid scheme of selective breeding has given us a breed in which these vital instincts and abilities are strongly "fixed". It's left to us to maintain them and improve on them by the same rigid scheme of selective breeding.

Jaybee's Little Princess, owned by Jack Bradley of South March, Ont. and handled by Glenda Bradley, placed 3rd in the Open All Age Stake at the Susquehanna Brittany Club Trials on March 25 in Indiantown Gap, Pa. Running on the continuous course of the Indiantown Gap grounds, Princess had an exciting race with a buck on sight, coupled with points on pheasant, quail and a woodcock. She was braced with the winner, Dual Ch. Kaymores Megs.

Sundancer's Sun Rocket, Princess' kennel mate, placed 1st in the Derby Stake at the Toronto Trials April 2.

Drever Hound (Dachsbrachen)

The Drever is an ancient breed, originating in the mountains of South Germany and Switzerland. Both its popularity and its distribution were limited until drastic changes in hunting conditions forced attention to it.

The first development came in Germany and Switzerland where many municipalities prohibited hunting deer with dogs more than 35 to 40 centimetres (13 to 15") high. This was only the culmination of a process which started when the wide open spaces in which deer could be run

shrunk to the dimensions of an estate, or a group of estates. Great hounds simply got the hunter into trouble with his neighbor and did not get him a deer, though often somebody else got the deer. What was wanted was a hound that would give a number of good chases within prescribed limits.

In Sweden there were no laws restricting size of hounds that could be run, but the troubles that brought the Drever (Dachsbrachen) into popularity in Germany developed there too. There were too many people hunting, too many resentful neighbors who would seize or even shoot a trespassing hound, to carry on the old way of hunting. Hence the dramatic rise in the popularity of the Drever, which can be used without diplomatic complications on an area of from one to two square miles, or even less if the topography is right. It is popular because it produces the deer under modern conditions.

For the same reasons for development and introduction in Germany and Sweden, the breed was introduced from Sweden into Canada in 1954 by Dr. C. H. D. Clarke, Chief of Fish and Wildlife, Department of Lands and Forests, Ontario, and Dr. Alan C. Secord of the Secord Animal Clinic, Toronto.

Progenies of the original imports have been used in congested hunting areas in Ontario with the highest degree of success. The foremost characteristic of the Drever is that it takes a track, runs up to three-quarters of an hour then breaks off and backtracks to the origin of the start or the hunter acting as dog man. The outstanding ability of this breed to backtrack generally results in the hunter always having his dog for the next chase.

Besides being a hunting dog that works to satisfaction in congested hunting areas, the Drever can also be kept in a home without the necessity of a kennel. It makes a very affectionate pet, being particularly fond of children. One trouble with deer hounds these days is that most hunters have to farm them out, or borrow, beg or

REGISTRATION, STUD BOOKS AND RELATED MATTERS

KENNEL NAMES

As most decisions on the processing of applications for registration
of kennel names are routine, the Board decided that the full reports of
decisions of the Kennel Names Committee would not be published, but
that the Secretary may publish any decisions which would be of general
interest to the membership.

On the Secretary's suggestion the Board approved the deletion of the
following in the regulations regarding kennel names:

"Where both husband and wife hold separate memberships it shall be
permissible for both to use a kennel name registered by either
provided that the member who registered the name gives his or her
consent to the arrangement;"

and the substitution of the following:

"Where husband and wife have a joint membership and the kennel
name is registered in their joint names, the kennel name may be
used by either as an individual upon the written consent of the
other."

BREED STANDARDS

The Board decided that when a specialty club submits a proposed
change in a breed standard it would be asked to submit for the consider-
ation of the Breed Standards Committee and the Board, an entire
standard in the standard format previously approved by the Board.

The Board authorized the Breed Standards Committee to publish in
"Dogs in Canada" any proposed new standard or any proposed change in a
standard and to solicit comments for the consideration of the
Committee and the Board.

The Board instructed the Secretary to inform the Vizsla Club of
Canada of the views set out by the Breed Standards Committee in its
report on a proposed new standard for the Vizsla submitted by the Vizsla
Club of Canada.

REGISTRATION OF DACHSHUNDS

Subject to the approval of the Chief Registration Officer of the
Department of Agriculture, the Board approved a set of regulations,
drafted and submitted by the Registration Committee, on the registration
in the Club's records of Dachshunds imported to Canada, and Dachshunds
owned by residents of the United States wishing to register their dogs in
the Club's records. (NOTE: The regulations, approved by the Chief
Registration Officer, are published elsewhere in this issue.)

PROPOSED NEW SYSTEM OF REGISTRATION

The Board considered the report of the Registration Committee on a
proposed new system of registration and approved the recommendation
of the Committee that steps be taken in the following sequence:

- (1) establish that the Club can legally institute the system and that as far
as can be determined by the Club's solicitor, the Club is not likely
to encounter any legal problems if the system is instituted;
- (2) take steps to ensure that there will be no problem in connection with
recognition by The American Kennel Club of any certificates issued
by the Club under the proposed system;
- (3) if the Club's solicitor is satisfied that the system can be instituted
without foreseeable legal difficulties, and The American Kennel Club
is prepared to recognize any certificates issued under the system,
discussions be instituted with the Record Committee of the Canadian
National Livestock Records as to costs of setting up and maintaining
the new system;

INTERNATIONAL MATTERS

THE AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB

The Board considered a letter received from the Executive Vice-
President of The American Kennel Club advising that the Board of
Directors of The American Kennel Club had agreed to adopt a policy that
is in line with The Canadian Kennel Club's earlier proposal which
suggested that The American Kennel Club approval of residents of Canada
to judge at A.K.C. licensed shows be on the same basis as The American
Kennel Club approves residents of the United Kingdom. The American
Kennel Club having suggested that the C.K.C. Secretary visit their
offices for the purpose of completing the details of the arrangement, the
Secretary was authorized to proceed to New York and conclude arrange-
ments satisfactory to The American Kennel Club.

- (4) determine a scale of fees which would be considered satisfactory and produce the required revenue;
 (5) address a message to the membership at large outlining the details of the proposed system and the scale of fees proposed, and solicit the comments of members for the consideration of the Board.

BULK SHIPMENTS

The question of proper identification of two or more puppies included in a shipment of dogs to Canada was considered by the Board and was referred to the Registration Committee for consideration.

The Board considered the report submitted by the Registration Committee, which recommended that the Board take steps to have the Club's By-laws amended to require that when two or more dogs are included in a shipment to Canada, such dogs, to be considered eligible for registration in the Club's records, must be tattoo-marked in accordance with the Club's tattooing regulations before the dogs are actually shipped to Canada.

The Committee also recommended that the Club arrange with the Kennel Club in the country of origin to include the tattoo markings on each export certificate, and to require that the export certificate must accompany the shipment in order that the identification may be checked when the dogs are cleared for entry into Canada.

The Board also noted that the Committee had recommended that the Club's By-laws be amended to require that evidence of Customs clearance must accompany the application for registration of a dog imported to Canada and that arrangements should be made with the Department of Agriculture to clear the dogs and check their tattoo markings (in the case of two or more dogs in a single shipment) which markings could then be recorded on the Customs clearance documents.

The Board noted that to implement the Committee's recommendations it would be necessary to amend the Club's By-laws, and directed that proposed amendments be drafted for inclusion in the next special referendum ballot.

DOGS WHELPED AT U.S. BASES IN CANADA

The Board endorsed the Secretary's arrangements with The American Kennel Club regarding the registration of dogs whelped the property of U.S. servicemen located on U.S. bases in Canada, it being understood that Canadian registration would be a requirement except in a case where the U.S. Serviceman returns to the U.S. with the entire litter and its sire and dam.

STUD BOOKS

The Board noted that the approximate cost per copy of the 1965 stud book was about \$12.00 and that a considerable financial loss (approximately \$11,000) resulted from the sale of the volume at \$1.00 per copy. It decided that, commencing with the next stud book to be published, the price would be \$5.00 per copy.

At the Secretary's suggestion it was decided that until further notice the volume would not include, in the litter section, the sires' index and the dams' index, although the breeders' index would be continued. It also decided that while the list of kennel names, alphabetically by kennel name, would be continued, the cross-index of registered kennel names, alphabetically by their registered owners, would be discontinued.

COMPLAINTS, CHARGES AND PROTESTS

SPECIFIC CASES

The Board noted the payment by clubs and individual persons of a number of monetary penalties, and on a number of other files took what it considered to be appropriate disciplinary action.

INTERNAL AND ADMINISTRATION

ANNUAL MEETINGS FOR 1968

The Board decided that the next Annual General Meeting of the Club would be held at Toronto on Saturday, February 24, 1968, and the next annual meeting of the Board would commence on Wednesday, February 21, 1968.

QUINQUENNIAL ADJUSTMENT

The Club's By-laws provide that every five years there shall be what is known as a quinquennial adjustment, and by this provision of the By-laws the number of members of the Board may be increased beyond the number now holding office; moreover, the number of Directors for any given zone, as compared with another zone, may not be in relation to the number of members in each zone.

The Board felt that steps should be taken to amend the By-laws with a view to preventing an increase in the number of Directors to be elected, and appointed a committee consisting of Mr. Frost, Mr. Duff, Mr. Laskey and Mrs. Smith, to draft, for the consideration of the Board at its semi-annual meeting, proposed amendments to Article XII of the Club's By-laws fixing the number of Directors to be elected for each electoral zone.

C.K.C. HEAD OFFICE

The Board received the report of a committee which it had appointed to look into all aspects of the housing of the Club's head office. It considered the report of the Committee, consisting of John Devlin Jr. (Vice-Chairman), Reg. P. Sparke and Sam Back, and noted the Committee's recommendation that the Board take up the option to renew the rental of the present office accommodation, the present lease on which is due to expire on March 31, 1968.

The Committee's recommendation was unanimously endorsed, and the signing Officers of the Club were authorized to negotiate renewal of the present lease.

PROMOTION, PUBLICITY AND PUBLIC RELATIONS

The report of the Committee on Promotion, Publicity and Public Relations (Gordon Ashcroft, Chairman) was received. After discussion the Board referred back to the Committee for further consideration and estimates of cost, a Committee proposal that a colourful single-fold pamphlet explaining the functions of the Club be prepared and distributed, the initial printing to be a quantity of 20,000.

The Board noted the Chairman's report that the newspaper advertisement (drawing attention to the provisions of the Live Stock Pedigree Act with regard to the supplying of certificates of registration for dogs sold as pure-bred) had been increased from a once monthly publication to twice monthly, and that the contracts with the periodicals and newspapers in which these advertisements now appear expire at the end of December.

BOARD MEETINGS

The Board decided that the next regular meeting of the Board would be held on May 3rd, and that the semi-annual meeting of the Board would be held at the Club's offices, Toronto, commencing on September 18th.

SPECIAL REFERENDUM BALLOT

At its semi-annual meeting in 1966 the Board of Directors had considered the possibility of conducting a special referendum ballot concurrent with the election of Officers and Directors for 1968-69 and had referred to a special Amendments Committee (D. H. Duff, Chairman) a number of questions to be considered by the Committee, its report to be submitted in the form of a series of proposed amendments to the Club's By-laws and various rules. It was also intended that the report would be published in "Dogs in Canada" prior to the Annual General Meeting in order that the proposed amendments as drawn by the Committee may be discussed at that meeting.

In submitting the Committee's report, Mr. Duff pointed out that the work involved and the difficulties encountered made it impossible for the Committee to submit its report in time for publication in "Dogs in Canada". After discussion, the Board decided that a special referendum ballot would not be conducted in 1967, and the proposed amendments as drafted by the Committee would be referred to the several amendments committees to be appointed at this meeting.

GIFT TO MR. T. E. GUNDERSEN

The Board noted that Mr. Ted Gunderson, for many years the Registrar for dogs at the office of the Canadian National Live Stock Records, had retired in December. It decided that a gift, not to exceed \$500 in cost, would be tendered to Mr. Gunderson as a token of the Club's appreciation for services rendered the Club and those interested in pure-bred dogs.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

In each issue of "Dogs in Canada" the official business of the Club is published in a section on buff coloured paper. In the setting up of this section it is imperative that the number of pages to be printed be in multiples of four (i.e. 4, 8, 12, 16, etc.). Seldom does the amount of material to be published in a given issue work out exactly to a multiple of four pages, and in most cases it is found necessary to hold over, for publication in a later issue, material prepared for the current issue.

It has been the practice for some time to include in each issue a list of the Officers and Directors of the Club, the names of each Council Chairman, and the names of the Field Trial and Obedience Trial Representatives. Because of space problems, as outlined above, the Board ruled that such listings would be segregated into four sections, each to be published as space permits.

The Board ruled that the daily allowance heretofore paid members of the Board attending the annual and semi-annual meetings of the Board would be extended to include all meetings of the Board, and members of the Complaints Committee, Kennel Name's Committee, and Registration Committee, would be reimbursed travelling expenses plus \$35.00 per day.

The Board ordered placed in the Book of Standing Resolutions a previous decision of the Board to the effect that the Club would not seek to require the owner of the sire of a litter to sign the application for registration of litter form until the stud fee is paid.

The Board ordered the following resolution placed in the Book of Standing Resolutions:

"THAT, when an officiating judge suspects that a male dog does not have two normal testicles normally located in the scrotum, and the official veterinarian is not available to render an immediate opinion, the judge is free to withhold awards for want of merit."

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE MANAGER

The Executive Manager reported on the engagement of Mr. Ralph Russell as an Administrative Assistant.

The Board approved a recommendation of the Executive Manager that in place of the present system of membership records a visible records system be installed.

In lieu of increases in salary to offset the increase in cost of living, the Board authorized the payment quarterly of a cost of living allowance to members of the staff, such allowance to be based on changes in the cost of living index.

MEMBERSHIP MATTERS

APPLICATIONS FOR MEMBERSHIP

Applications for membership reported on lists #1 to #10 inclusive, as distributed to members of the Board, were approved, and the applicants were admitted to membership.

A number of applications were rejected, and others were ordered held in abeyance pending further reports to the Board, the applicants being the subject of complaints or having overdue accounts with "Dogs in Canada".

MISCELLANEOUS

The Board considered letters received from three persons who had failed, before December 31st, 1966, to submit their renewal of membership fees to the Canadian National Live Stock Records, each person enquiring whether he may now pay membership fees for both 1966 and 1967. The Board agreed that having regard for the provisions of the Club's By-laws, renewal of membership cannot be accepted after the expiration of the calendar year for which such fees were payable.

DOG SHOWS

BAITING OF DOGS IN SHOW RINGS

After considering a number of letters and petitions protesting the issuance of a directive on the baiting of dogs in show rings, the Board rescinded the resolution adopted at its last semi-annual meeting. Instead the Board directed that a directive be issued to all judges pointing out that the Board is concerned about excessive baiting in show rings and drawing the attention of judges to Section 17 of Chapter 19 of the Dog Show Rules. In the directive each judge is to be informed that where an exhibitor in the ring uses food, or any device, in a manner which tends to interfere with any other dog in the ring, the judge may instruct the exhibitor to discontinue the practice; and where the exhibitor, having received such instruction, continues the practice, the exhibitor and the dog may be excused from the ring and will not be eligible to participate further in the competition at the show.

RECORDING AND LISTING FEES

The Board considered the question of whether it is permissible for a club holding a championship show or licensed trial under the Club's rules to set an overall entry fee which would include both recording and listing fees. It was decided that it is the responsibility of a club holding a

championship show or licensed trial under the Club's rules to collect the recording fee for every dog entered in competition, and to collect the listing fee for every dog for which a C.K.C. registration number is not given on the entry form.

JUDGES

The Board considered a question raised by the Secretary as to whether a person seeking to establish eligibility to judge a number of breeds or an entire group may be permitted to proceed with an oral examination on the breeds for which the applicant had passed a written examination even though the overall score on the written examination was not a passing mark. The Board ruled that a person may proceed with an oral examination on the breeds for which he had passed the written examination regardless of the total score obtained on the written examination, although the applicant may elect to forego the oral examination and rewrite the entire examination when he is eligible to do so.

The Board ruled that a resident of the United States who is a professional handler licensed by The American Kennel Club may be approved to judge at a specialty show held under C.K.C. rules, a breed for which said professional handler had been approved by The American Kennel Club to judge at a specialty show held under A.K.C. rules.

The Board ruled that when an applicant seeking to establish eligibility to judge at championship shows or licensed obedience trials held under the Club's rules has been notified, by the local Director, or Obedience Representative, or the Secretary, that arrangements have been made for him to take the written and/or oral examinations, and the applicant fails to take such examinations within thirty days after being so notified, the examination papers will be returned to the Secretary, and the file will be considered closed, although, at the discretion of the Director of Obedience Representative the time limit may be extended if, because of illness or other acceptable reason, the applicant is not able to proceed with the examination within the thirty day period.

The Board considered the appeal of an applicant, who had sought to establish eligibility to judge a number of breeds, from a decision of the Committee which had processed the application, and after discussion the Board sustained the appeal.

The Board decided that when the Secretary writes a judge seeking information with regard to errors or omissions in a judge's book and the Secretary does not receive a reply within thirty days, the Secretary will inform the judge that further judging engagements will not be approved until a satisfactory reply is received.

ENTRY FORMS

The Board considered the report of the Secretary with regard to distribution of entry forms and other material required by clubs staging shows and trials. With a view to assisting those clubs who are finding it difficult to obtain entry forms, the Secretary was instructed to obtain a number of plates of the C.K.C. standard entry form, and these plates would be loaned to a show-giving club, which will first be required to make a deposit, the deposit to be refunded upon return of the plates in good condition.

SANCTION SHOWS

The Board decided that clubs in Ontario wishing to hold sanction shows in the months of December, January and February may apply for dates up to one year in advance.

PRIORITY RIGHTS ON SHOW DATES

The Board considered the Secretary's report on applications received for renewal of priority rights on show dates, and reached decisions on those applications which would be approved by the Secretary on behalf of the Board.

DISQUALIFICATIONS

The Board ruled that if any report form is made for a disqualification, the exhibitor or handler of the disqualified dog is to be given immediately a duplicate copy of the report form. The Secretary was instructed to prepare, for the consideration of the Board at its semi-annual meeting, a suggested report form for use when a dog is disqualified.

CANADIAN NATIONAL EXHIBITION

A letter from the Canadian National Exhibition Association outlining its plans for its 1967 championship shows was read. It was agreed that the letter would be read at the Annual General Meeting when the report of the Club's representative to the Canadian National Exhibition is presented.

ORDER OF JUDGING AND JUDGING SCHEDULES

With a view to enabling show-giving clubs to exercise their discretion in the setting up of the order of judging and drafting of judging schedules, the Board decided that when the next special referendum ballot is conducted, the following proposed amendment would be included:

"IT IS PROPOSED THAT: Section 7 of Chapter 15 of the Dog Show Rules be deleted in its entirety and the following be substituted therefor:

'SECTION 7. The order of breed and group judging at a championship show shall be at the discretion of the Club holding the show, however it is anticipated that over a series of its shows the show-giving club will rotate the order of breed and group judging so as to give the same favourable consideration, from the point of view of early judging, to each group. Where the Board notes that a show-giving club is not proceeding as anticipated by this rule it shall have the power, for such time as it deems advisable, to instruct the show-giving club so in default as to the order of breed and group judging at its shows.'

SHOW CATALOGUES

For the benefit of show-giving clubs who might find it more economical to print a showcatalogue of a size different from that specified by the Board, the Board altered the present policy to permit a show-giving club to publish show catalogues with an individual page size ranging from 5 1/2" x 7 1/2" to 8 1/2" x 11", and authorized the use of either saddle stitch binding or "perfect" binding.

JUDGES' SEMINARS

The Board provided the following allowances for judges' seminars: \$300 for Ontario, \$200 for British Columbia, and \$100 for each other electoral zone. The Board further directed that such seminars, if and when held, would be set up under the jurisdiction of the Dog Show Council through the local Dog Show Representative. A claim for expenses is to be accompanied by an expense voucher for each item, and a claim for expenses cannot include travelling expenses.

SHOW DATES

The Board ordered approved the application of the Basenji Club of Canada for a specialty show to be held at Saint John, N.B. on August 28, 1967.

The Board withheld approval of applications for permission to hold championship shows under the Club's rules as submitted by the Kamloops & District Kennel Club, which had applied for the dates of July 10th and 11th, 1967, the Board deciding that it would consider applications received from the Kamloops Club after it has held one more sanction show.

WEIGHING AND MEASURING OF DOGS

The Board considered recommendations of the Dog Show Council with regard to revision of the present policies applicable to the weighing and measuring of dogs at shows. It decided that until the Dog Show Rules are reviewed in their entirety there would be no change in the present regulations, but that clubs holding shows under the Club's rules would be informed that the Board prefers that the weighing and measuring of dogs, when conducted at shows, be conducted outside the show ring.

CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINT RATINGS

The Board considered letters received from members and clubs in response to an invitation published in "Dogs in Canada" with regard to a proposed new system of point ratings. It decided that further consideration would be given the matter after the Annual General Meeting at which further comments would be solicited. During the course of this annual meeting of the Board, Dr. George Walker, President of the Ottawa Kennel Club, was invited to meet with the Board and explain in detail a proposed system submitted by the Ottawa Kennel Club.

JUNIOR KENNEL CLUBS

The Board received the report of Mrs. Dolly Wall, Chairman of the Junior Kennel Clubs Committee, on proposed new rules for Junior Kennel Clubs and proposed new rules for the judging of Junior Handling Competitions. It decided that the Committee's report would be considered at the semi-annual meeting of the Board and in the meantime a copy of the report would be forwarded to every member of the Board and to every known Junior Kennel Club seeking comments for the consideration of the Board.

OBEDIENCE TRIALS

RING STEWARDS

The Board ruled that it is permissible at licensed obedience trials for an exhibitor in one class to act as ring steward in other classes at the same trial.

JUDGES

The Board rescinded a resolution, adopted in 1965, requiring that all obedience trial judges be re-examined every five years.

Referred to the Obedience Council for consideration was a proposal that a club holding a licensed obedience trial be required to submit its list of proposed judges to the C.K.C. not less than two months in advance of the trial.

REQUIREMENTS FOR A DEGREE

The Obedience Council had been asked to consider the question of whether, in all zones, three qualifying scores under three different judges would be required, whereas at present three qualifying scores under two different judges is sufficient in some zones. The Board concurred with a recommendation of the Council that there be change in the present requirements.

AMENDMENTS TO OBEDIENCE TRIAL REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS

The Board directed the Obedience Council to prepare a proposed amendment to the Obedience Trial Regulations and Standards which would declare ineligible for entry at a licensed trial, a dog on which a "debarking" operation had been performed.

In the October (1966) issue of "Dogs in Canada" notice had been given of a number of proposed amendments to the Obedience Trial Regulations and Standards. There being no unfavourable comments with regard to these proposed amendments, all were approved by the Board and were declared effective as of July 1, 1967.

REPORTS ON JUDGES

The Board approved, with a single change, a form proposed by the Obedience Council for use when observers are asked to observe and report on the one-time approval of an applicant who is authorized to judge at one licensed obedience trial after having successfully taken written and oral examinations and has completed the apprenticeship requirements.

OBEDIENCE REPRESENTATIVES

The Board noted the report of the Council with regard to a suggestion that additional Obedience Representatives be appointed, particularly in any geographical area where the area to be covered is large. The Board agreed that, for the time being, additional Obedience Representatives would be appointed only for the Province of Ontario.

Referred to the Obedience Council for consideration was a letter received from a Representative on the subject of travelling and other expenses incurred by Obedience Representatives.

NUMBER OF TRIALS

Referred to the Obedience Council for consideration was the question of whether a limit should be set on the number of licensed trials which any club may hold during the course of a calendar year.

DATES

The Board approved applications for renewal of priority rights received from a number of clubs having been previously granted priority rights on trial dates.

TRIAL OF OFFICIALS

The Board ruled that when a licensed obedience trial is held in conjunction with a championship show and both events are held by the same club, one person must be designated as the secretary for both events.

JUDGES' SEMINARS

Funds in the amount of \$100 for each electoral zone were allocated for judges' seminars, the seminars to be under the jurisdiction of the Obedience Council through the Obedience Representatives, expense vouchers to be submitted with any claim for payment out of the allotment, but travelling expenses are excluded.

CHALLENGE TROPHIES

Referred to the Obedience Council for consideration was the question of whether the Regulations should be amended to abolish provision for challenge trophies.

FIELD TRIALS

PRIORITY RIGHTS ON TRIAL DATES

The Board approved a number of applications for renewal of priority rights.

FIELD TRIALS FOR POINTING BREEDS

The Board received the report of Donald H. Duff, Chairman of the Field Trial Council for Pointing Breeds, to which report there was attached the Council's complete revision of the Field Trial Rules for Pointing Breeds. The Board directed that the proposed rules, as submitted by the Council, be published in their entirety in "Dogs in Canada" and comments be solicited from clubs and persons having reason to be interested in these rules.

(NOTE: See proposed rules published elsewhere in this issue.)

The Board ruled on a number of questions raised with regard to a Centennial Shooting Dog Stake and Derby Stake which a combination of clubs in British Columbia propose holding on October 6-7-8-9, 1967.

FIELD TRIALS FOR RETRIEVERS

The Board received the report of Robert L. Blyth, Chairman of the Field Trial Council for Retrievers, on the question of whether the Field Trial Rules should be amended to require the disqualification of a dog on which a "debarking" operation had been performed. It was agreed that a proposed amendment to be prepared by the Obedience Council on this question would be referred to each Field Trial Council for consideration.

The Board authorized the payment of expenses amounting to \$49.90 in connection with a judges' seminar held in Alberta on January 21st.

Referred to the Council for consideration was the question of whether the current list of judges for Retriever field trials should be reviewed with a view to deleting the names of those who had not officiated as judge for a specified number of years.

FIELD TRIALS FOR BEAGLES

The Board received a report of a meeting of the Field Trial Council for Beagles held at Montreal on February 19th, and proceeded to deal seriatim with the recommendations of the Council.

No action was taken on a council recommendation that travelling expenses be supplied to out-of-town Field Trial Representatives attending Council meetings.

The Board approved a recommendation of the Council that, except as otherwise decided by the Council, the name of any person on the approved list of Beagle field trial judges who was not approved to judge at a licensed Beagle field trial held under C.K.C. rules in the previous five calendar years be deleted from the approved list, this to be a continuing policy and implemented annually.

The Board approved a recommendation of the Council that the name of any resident of the United States approved by the C.K.C. to judge at a C.K.C. licensed field trial for Beagles be automatically added to the C.K.C. list of approved judges.

The Board decided that travelling expenses would not be paid in connection with the attendance of a member of the Council at a judges' seminar.

The Board considered a number of proposed amendments to the Field Trial Rules for Beagles as submitted by the Council, and directed that notice of these proposed amendments be published in "Dogs in Canada" and comments be solicited.

FIELD TRIALS FOR SPANIELS

The Board considered information received regarding shooting dog stakes staged at three licensed field trials held in Nova Scotia, and decided that on the basis of the information received and the views of the Chairman of the Council, the awards in these stakes would be considered the equivalent of awards in Open All-Age Stakes.

Referred back to the Council for further consideration was a proposal regarding the issuance of working certificates for Spaniels.

JUDGES' SEMINARS

On the same basis as for Dog Show and Obedience Trials, the Board allocated the following funds for seminars for field trial judges:

- (a) Spaniels: \$100 for each electoral zone.
- (b) Beagles: \$100 for each of the following zones: Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia, and New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island;
- (c) Retrievers: British Columbia \$200; Ontario \$300; each other electoral zone \$100;
- (d) Pointing Breeds: \$200 to each of the following zones: Alberta, British Columbia, Ontario, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland; and \$100 to each other electoral zone.

GOOD AND WELFARE

RECOGNITION AND MEMBERSHIP OF CLUBS

The Board decided that pending the placing of proposed amendments to the By-laws before the voting members of the Club, applications for associate membership received from clubs and associations would be held in abeyance. A Committee consisting of Mr. Anderson (Chairman), with the Chairmen of the various Councils as Committee members, was appointed to draft proposed amendments for the admission of clubs to associate membership.

The Board agreed that pending the establishing of a policy whereby clubs would be admitted to associate membership, clubs would be informed of the desirability of their selecting club names which do not conflict with names of already established clubs.

The Board received the report of Mr. Anderson, Chairman of a special committee which the Board had appointed to draft standard constitutions for possible use by clubs seeking help in that direction.

CATTLE AND SHEEP DOGS

The Board received the report of the Registration Committee, to which Committee the Board had referred for study the question of proposed regulations for the registration of dogs suitable for working with sheep and cattle. It concurred with the Committee's recommendation that for the time being the Board take no steps to recognize the Border Collie but leave it to those interested in the breed to communicate or otherwise discuss with the North American Sheepdog Society that Society's recognition of C.K.C. certificates of registration for such Border Collies as may be exported from Canada to the United States and for such Border Collies as Canadian owners may wish to enter in sheepdog trials conducted in the United States if the C.K.C. undertook to recognize Border Collies.

CANADA'S CENTENARY

The Board considered a number of proposals on the question of how the Club may participate in the celebration of Canada's Centenary. A committee consisting of Mrs. Sarah Diamond (Chairman), J. C. Anderson and George N. Mehlenbacher was appointed to investigate the possibility of the Club establishing a library, the committee's report to be submitted to the semi-annual meeting of the Board.

RABIES CONTROL

The Board appointed Mr. W. J. Monaghan as Chairman of a Rabies Control Committee, such appointment being made as a result of a suggestion that the Club appoint a committee for the purpose of endeavouring to obtain joint Dominion-Provincial action on a program of rabies control.

BUSINESS ARISING OUT OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

DOG SHOWS AT ROYAL AGRICULTURAL WINTER FAIR

During the course of a discussion at the Annual General Meeting it was pointed out that an inhibiting factor to a resumption of dog shows at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair is the fact that in some quarters dogs are not considered "live stock". The Board named a committee consisting of Mr. Mehlenbacher and the Secretary to approach the Ontario Department of Agriculture and the federal Department of Agriculture regarding recognition of pure-bred dogs as live stock within the area of fairs and exhibitions.

ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION AND FELLOWSHIPS FOR RESEARCH

The Board noted that the following resolution had been adopted at the Annual General Meeting:

"THAT, the Board of Directors establish a committee of at least three, one of whom should be a member of the Board, to investigate the possibility of promotion of artificial insemination, and that they bring their findings to the membership, the committee to proceed along the lines outlined by Dr. LaHam."

During the course of its discussion of monies which the Club had heretofore made available for research on artificial insemination and hip dysplasia, the Board received the Secretary's report on information which he had obtained from the Kennel Club (England) and The American Kennel Club regarding their activities and policies in these areas.

Having regard for the resolution adopted at the Annual General Meeting the Board appointed Dr. Quentin LaHam and Dr. George Walker as co-Chairmen of a special committee, they to have the power to add to the committee.

REPORT OF DOG SHOW COUNCIL

The Board noted that at the Annual General Meeting the following resolution had been adopted:

"THAT, the report and recommendations of the Dog Show Council be published in the July issue of "Dogs in Canada"."

- (1) During a discussion which followed it was pointed out that the Board has not yet reviewed the Dog Show Rules as drafted by the Council nor had an opportunity of deciding on the changes which it may feel should be made before the proposed rules are published;
- (2) to publish the proposed rules in the July issue may well result in the submission of proposed amendments, according to the

provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of Article XXXVIII of the Club's By-laws, and such proposed amendments may be inappropriate or unnecessary after the Board has made what it considers desirable changes in the rules as drafted by the Council; the Board had already decided that there would not be a special referendum ballot in 1967, and it is unlikely that the incoming Board would order a special referendum ballot in 1968, that being a year in which an election of the Board is not required.

- (3)
- Having regard for the points raised during the course of the discussion, the Board decided that the report of the Dog Show Council and the Council's proposed revision of the Dog Show Rules would not be published until the Board has reviewed and revised the rules proposed by the Dog Show Council, and the Board further decided that at its semi-annual meeting in September the Board would review the Rules as submitted by the Council.

RECOGNITION OF CLUBS

The Board noted that in connection with representations made at the Annual General Meeting and a discussion which followed regarding an apparent dispute within a specialty club, the following resolution had been adopted:

"THAT, this Board sees fit to set up an examining committee to consist entirely of C.K.C. Directors and convene as quickly as possible with the two factions, together with their solicitors, and get this matter settled once and for all."

During a discussion which followed the question was raised as to whether the Board should seek to interfere in the internal affairs of another club, and what would be the position of the Board in the event that it carried out the resolution adopted at the Annual General Meeting only to find that it did not succeed in resolving the differences between the parties concerned.

After discussion the Board agreed that it would take no action on the resolution adopted at the Annual General Meeting.

CANADIAN NATIONAL LIVE STOCK RECORDS

The Board considered the remarks made at the Annual General Meeting with regard to conditions at the Canadian National Live Stock Records office, and a suggestion that the Club, along with other affiliated associations, unite in representations to the Department of Agriculture with regard to better facilities in which to house the Live Stock Records office.

- During a discussion which followed:
- (1) reference was made to the vulnerability of records to fire in their present location;
 - (2) it was suggested that the use of microfilm be considered with a view to providing a duplicate set of records in the event that the existing records are destroyed by fire;
 - (3) it was suggested that other matters that should be looked into would be the service provided breeders by the Live Stock Records office in terms of time required to process applications, and data processing of registrations of dogs.

The discussion concluded with the Board appointing the President as Chairman of a special committee to discuss these matters with the Department of Agriculture. The President named J. C. Anderson, George W. Frost, Mrs. Sarah Diamond and Donald H. Duff as members of the committee.

The President appointed Mrs. Sarah Diamond to act in his stead as one of the Club's Representatives on the Canadian National Live Stock Records Board.

NOTICE

SUBJECT: Registration of Dachshunds.

Breeders of Dachshunds are asked to note the following special regulations prescribed by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club and approved by the Chief Registration Officer of the Department of Agriculture.

REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO THE REGISTRATION IN THE CLUB'S RECORDS OF A DACHSHUND IMPORTED TO CANADA

1. An imported dog will be registered as to coat according to its actual coat; i.e. Wire-haired, or Smooth, or Long-haired.
2. If the importer wishes the imported Dachshund to be registered as a "Miniature" then the following will also apply:
 - (a) When officially weighed, as hereinafter provided, the dog must be nine pounds or under at a year of age or over.
 - (b) The application for registration must be accompanied by a properly completed "Report of Official Weighting" which report must be completed by a person appointed by the Registration Committee to weigh the dog, or by the person (or persons) officially responsible for the weighing of dog at a championship show held under C.K.C. Dog Show Rules.
3. Unless the dog is eligible for registration as a "Miniature" it will be registered as a "Standard" Dachshund.
4. The requirements for registration of an imported dog, as set out in Section 2 (2) or Section 2 (4) of Article XXX of the Club's By-laws, depending on whether the dog was imported from the United States or another country shall also apply.

SUBJECT: Proposed new Field Trial Rules and Regulations for Pointing Breeds.

At its recent annual meeting, the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club considered the report of the Field Trial Council for Pointing Breeds. With its report the Council had submitted a proposed set of Field Trial Rules and Regulations for Pointing Breeds intended to replace those now in effect.

Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 21 (AMENDMENTS) of the Field Trial Rules and Regulations, the Board directed that these proposed new Field Trial Rules and Regulations for Pointing Breeds be published in "Dogs in Canada" with an invitation to those interested to submit their comments for the consideration of the Council and the Board.

The Rules and Regulations submitted by the Council appear on the following six pages.

All persons and clubs having reason to be interested are invited to submit their written comments to the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club, 1173 Bay St., Toronto 5, Ont. so as to be received not later than July 15th, 1967. When writing please refer to File #13 FT 27.

NOTICE

SUBJECT: PRIVATE BREEDING RECORDS

Article XXII, Section 1, of the By-laws of The Canadian Kennel Club reads as follows:

"There shall be kept by each breeder a private record which shall contain full particulars of his breeding operations and identification of all dogs in his possession by reason of ownership, lease or agreement. These records shall be kept in the form as set forth in 'Canadian Kennel Club Private Breeding Record' or in some other suitable form that will contain the same information."

Any breeder who does not now have a private breeding record book may obtain one by forwarding an order with covering payment (50¢) to The Canadian Kennel Club, 1173 Bay Street, Toronto 5, Ontario.

REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO THE REGISTRATION IN THE CLUB'S RECORDS OF A DACHSHUND (NOT BORN IN CANADA) OWNED IN THE UNITED STATES

1. A Dachshund owned by a resident of the United States, when registered in the Club's records, will be registered as to coat according to its actual coat; i.e. Wire-haired, or Smooth, or Long-haired.
2. Unless the dog is eligible for registration as a "Miniature" it will be registered as a "Standard" Dachshund.
3. If the owner wishes the Dachshund to be registered as a "Miniature" then the following will also apply:
 - (a) When officially weighed, as hereinafter provided, the dog must be nine pounds or under at a year of age or over.
 - (b) The application for registration must be accompanied by:
 - (i) a properly completed "Report of Official Weighing" by the person (or persons) officially responsible for the weighing of a dog at a championship show held under C.K.C. Dog Show Rules; or
 - (ii) a statement as to weight issued at a licensed show held under A.K.C. Rules, the statement to be signed by the official who weighed the dog at the show and by the Show Superintendent of the show (or by the Show Superintendent alone if officially weighed by the Show Superintendent).
4. The requirements of Section 2 (3) of Article XXX of the Club's By-laws shall also apply.

REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO THE REGISTRATION IN THE CLUB'S RECORDS OF A LITTER OF DACHSHUNDS WHelped IN CANADA AND SIRED BY A DACHSHUND (NOT REGISTERED INDIVIDUALLY IN C.K.C. RECORDS) OWNED BY A RESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

1. Both sire and dam of the litter must be of the same coat classification.
2. If the sire of the litter is a Standard Dachshund the customary requirements for the registration of the litter will apply but the dam of the litter must be C.K.C. registered as a "Standard" Dachshund. If the dam of the litter is registered in the Club's records as a Miniature Dachshund, then the application for registration of litter must be accompanied by:
 - (a) a statement as to weight of the sire issued at a licensed show held under A.K.C. Rules, the statement to be signed by the official who weighed the dog at the show and by the Show Superintendent of the show (or by the Show Superintendent alone if officially weighed by the Show Superintendent); or
 - (b) a properly completed "Report of Official Weighing" signed by the person (or persons) officially responsible for the weighing of a dog at a championship show held under C.K.C. Dog Show Rules; or
 - (c) a statutory declaration of the owner of the sire that the sire of the litter, when in full flesh, does not exceed nine pounds at one year of age or over.
4. The customary requirements for registration of a litter sired by an American-owned stud dog will also apply.

REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO THE REGISTRATION IN THE CLUB'S RECORDS OF A LITTER OF DACHSHUNDS WHelped IN CANADA AND SIRED BY A DACHSHUND (REGISTERED INDIVIDUALLY IN C.K.C. RECORDS) OWNED BY A RESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES

1. Both sire and dam of the litter must be of the same coat and size classification according to C.K.C. registration records.
2. The customary requirements for registration of a litter sired by an American-owned stud dog will apply.

PROPOSED FIELD TRIAL RULES & REGULATIONS FOR POINTING BREEDS

(See NOTICE on preceding page)

(NOTE: The word "dog" wherever used in these Field Trial Rules and Regulations includes both sexes.)

CHAPTER 1

FIELD TRIALS DEFINED AND CLASSIFIED

A LICENSED FIELD TRIAL is a field trial at which championship points may be awarded, given by a club or association which has been specially licensed by The Canadian Kennel Club to give the specific field trial designated in the license.

A SANCTIONED FIELD TRIAL is an informal field trial at which dogs may compete but not for championship points, held by a club or association, obtaining the sanction of The Canadian Kennel Club.

CHAPTER 2

WHO MAY HOLD A FIELD TRIAL AND WHEN AND WHERE AND HOW TO START ABOUT IT

SECTION 1. A club or association must apply to The Canadian Kennel Club for leave to hold a field trial, stating in the application the day or days upon which and the place where it desires to hold such field trial. The application to hold a licensed field trial must be on forms made available by The Canadian Kennel Club, must be accompanied by a date fee of \$10.00, and must reach The Canadian Kennel Club at least three months prior to the date of the proposed trial. This application will be referred to the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club which will consider the same and notify the club or association of its approval or disapproval of the dates and place selected. Only a club or association whose president or secretary or field trial secretary is a member in good standing of The Canadian Kennel Club may make application for trial date or dates.

If the Board of Directors shall approve and the field trial shall be given at the time and place applied for or on any postponed date or dates within thirty (30) day thereafter, or if the Board of Directors shall disapprove, the deposit will be returned to the club or association. If the club or association shall fail to hold its field trial at the time and place which have been approved, or on any postponed date or dates within thirty (30) days thereafter, the deposit may, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, become the property of The Canadian Kennel Club.

When, because of circumstances beyond its control, a club or association finds it necessary or advisable to change the date of its trials, it may, subject to the approval of The Canadian Kennel Club, change the date of its trial, and there shall be no forfeiture of date fee if the request for change of the date is received by The Canadian Kennel Club at least one month in advance of the original date granted for the trial.

SECTION 2. The use of a club's name for field trial purposes cannot be transferred.

SECTION 3. Sanctioned Field Trials shall be governed by such simple rules and regulations as from time to time shall be determined by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4. The Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club will not approve applications for field trials where dates conflict unless it be shown that the granting of such application will not work to the detriment of either field trial club which has applied.

A club holding field trials must not advertise or publish the date of any field trial which it purposed to hold until that date has been approved by The Canadian Kennel Club.

CHAPTER 3

RIBBONS, MONEY PRIZES, AND SPECIAL PRIZES WHICH MAY BE OFFERED

SECTION 1. All clubs or associations holding field trials under the rules of The Canadian Kennel Club, except sanctioned field trials, shall use the following colors for their prize ribbons or rosettes:

First prize—Blue. Third prize—Yellow.
Second prize—Red. Fourth prize—White.

Special prizes—Dark Green.

SECTION 2. Each ribbon or rosette, except those used at sanctioned field trials, shall be at least 2 inches wide, and approximately 8 inches long; and bear on its face a facsimile of the crest of The Canadian Kennel Club, the name of the prize, and the name of the field trial-giving club with numerals of the year and date of trial.

SECTION 3. If ribbons are given at sanction field

trials, they shall be of the following colors, but may be of any design or size:

First prize—Rose. Third prize—Light Green.

Second prize—Brown. Fourth prize—Gray.

Special prize—A combination of these colors.

SECTION 4. If money prizes are offered, a fixed amount for each prize shall be stated.

SECTION 5. All special prizes not money which may be offered shall be accurately described or the value stated. Stud services shall not be accepted as special prizes.

CHAPTER 4

JUDGES

SECTION 1. Persons judging field trials are not required to obtain licenses and a field trial club may submit the name of any reputable person who is in good standing with The Canadian Kennel Club for approval to judge at a licensed field trial.

SECTION 2. After a club has been granted permission by The Canadian Kennel Club to hold a trial, it must send to The Canadian Kennel Club at least two months before the trial for the approval of the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club or such sub-committee as may be appointed by the Board of Directors for the purpose of passing on selected judges, a list of the names and addresses of the persons which it has selected to judge its trial, giving in each instance the particular stake or stakes which it is desired that each one shall pass upon. If said Board of Directors or sub-committee approve, the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club will inform the trial-giving club that the list of judges has been approved.

SECTION 3. If the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club is not prepared to approve of a person selected as judge, or is not prepared to approve of the entire assignment for which a person has been selected as judge, the club or association must, within two weeks thereafter, select and submit to The Canadian Kennel Club the name or names of alternative persons to judge the stake or stakes for assignments not previously approved by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4. Substitute or additional judges may be appointed by a field trial club at its field trial, if occasion demands it, provided however that said substitute or additional judges are persons in good standing with The Canadian Kennel Club. When additional judges are used, they shall always act in conjunction with one or more of the regularly approved judges if present. The Canadian Kennel Club shall be promptly notified of additional or substitute judges officiating.

SECTION 5. Officers of clubs or associations giving field trials may run dogs in their club's or association's trials and may also judge any stakes of said trials in which they do not run dogs.

SECTION 6. No judge may judge the same stake held by a club on consecutive days in championship events.

CHAPTER 5

SELECTION OF CHAIRMAN OF FIELD TRIAL COMMITTEE

SECTION 1. After a club or association has been granted permission to hold a licensed field trial, it must submit the name and address of its proposed superintendent, if it intends to employ a superintendent, and also the name and address of the secretary of the field trial for approval by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club before the premium list or entry form of the field trial can be printed.

SECTION 2. Any reputable person who is in good standing with The Canadian Kennel Club may act as Secretary of a field trial.

CHAPTER 6

PREMIUM LISTS AND ENTRY FORMS

SECTION 1. After a club or association has been granted permission by The Canadian Kennel Club to hold a licensed field trial and before its premium list or entry form shall be printed, it must send to The Canadian Kennel Club for approval two copies setting forth in detail the stakes to be run and their conditions, a complete list of the money, ribbon prizes and special prizes which it wishes to give, a list of the names and addresses of the judges, and the stakes they are to judge, the names and addresses of the officers of the club and of all the officials of the field trial, including the Field Trial Secretary and/or the Superintendent if one is employed and the exact location of the field trial must also be specified. The hour and exact place at which the draw is to take place must be stated in the premium list.

SECTION 2. Two copies of the premium list or entry form when printed must be sent to the Secretary of The Canadian Kennel Club at time of distribution to prospective entrants. A club or association holding a licensed event shall forward premium lists and entry forms to each of the Clubs holding trials under these Rules.

SECTION 3. A field trial-giving club shall assume the responsibility of collecting all listing fees for The Canadian Kennel Club, which fact shall be stated in the premium list or entry form.

SECTION 4. Such extracts from the rules as shall be designated by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club shall be furnished with every premium list or entry form.

SECTION 5. Field Trial Committees may make such regulations or additional rules for the government of their field trials as shall be considered necessary, provided such regulations or additional rules do not conflict with any rule of The Canadian Kennel Club. Such regulations or additional rules shall be printed in the premium list or entry form and violations thereof shall be considered the same as violations of the rules and regulations of The Canadian Kennel Club.

SECTION 6. Every premium list or entry form shall specify the date on which the entries for the field trials shall close, but if so stated in the premium list or entry form, post entries may be accepted up to the time of the drawing.

CHAPTER 7

ENTRIES AND ENTRY FEES

SECTION 1. Every dog entered in a licensed trial held under these rules must be registered or eligible for registration in the Stud Book of the Canadian Kennel Club. The following must appear on the entry form: Name of breed, name of dog, Canadian Kennel Club registration number if registered in the Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, name of breeder, place and date of birth, name of sire, name of dam, stake or stakes in which dog is entered, name and complete address of owner of the dog, name of handler if the dog is not to be handled by the owner or member of his immediate family. If the dog is being held under lease the name of the lessee shall be given instead of the name of the registered owner. Every entry form must be signed by the owner (or lessee) or his authorized agent, and, in the case of telegraph entries the entry forms must be signed by the owner (or lessee) of their authorized agents not less than one hour after judging commences.

Under no consideration can telephone entries be accepted. Every dog entered in a licensed field trial shall be the property (or leased by) the person making its entry, and the right to run a dog cannot be transferred. The entry of a dog shall be accompanied by a recording fee of fifty cents (50c), and all recording fees shall be remitted to The Canadian Kennel Club within ten days after the trial, by the club or association holding the trial.

The Board shall have the power to advise a person entering a dog at a field trial held under the Club's rules that he may no longer include in the name of a dog any name which, in the opinion of the Board, infringes on the rights of any person, partnership, or company whose kennel name has been registered by the Club, or where, in the opinion of the Board, such name is considered to be similar to a kennel name registered with any other national kennel club with whom the Club has working arrangements with regard to mutual protection of registered kennel names.

If, where a person has been advised that he may no longer include a particular name in the name of a dog and said person continues to enter a dog at field trials held under the Club's rules with such name included, then the Board shall have the power to cancel all awards, prizes and championship points earned by said dog at field trials held after the original advice was communicated to the owner of said dog.

SECTION 2. If a dog is not registered individually in The Canadian Kennel Club Stud Book, it may be entered at a field trial, held under these Rules, as a "listed" dog, provided:

- If born in Canada, that the litter of which it is a part or the whole has actually been registered in accordance with the provisions of Article XXIX of the Club's By-laws;
- If not born in Canada, that it is eligible for individual registration in accordance with the provisions of Article XXVIII of the Club's By-laws.

The entry of a "listed" dog at a field trial held under

these rules (sanctioned field trials excluded) must be accompanied by a listing fee of \$1.00, and all listing fees must be remitted, by the club or association holding the trial, to The Canadian Kennel Club within ten days after the trial.

The Canadian Kennel Club shall have the right at any time, to require the owner of a "listed" dog to submit proof of the dog's eligibility for registration in the Club's Stud Book, and if the Board of Directors is satisfied that the dog is not eligible for registration in the Club's Stud Book, it shall have the right to order the cancellation of all wins, championship points, and prizes earned by the dog at trials held under these Rules. By failing to comply with the Board's order to return ribbons and/or prizes to the clubs or associations concerned the owner of the dog automatically renders himself ineligible to enter any dog in any competition approved by the Club.

SECTION 3. No entry shall be received from any person who is not in good standing with The Canadian Kennel Club on the day of the closing of the entries. Before accepting any entries, a list of persons not in good standing must be obtained by the field trial superintendent or field trial secretary from The Canadian Kennel Club.

SECTION 4. No entry shall be made under a kennel name unless that name has been registered with The Canadian Kennel Club. All entries made under a kennel name must be signed with the kennel name followed by the word "registered". An "entrant" is the individual, or, if a partnership, all the members of the partnership entering in a field trial. In the case of such entry by a partnership every member of the partnership shall be in good standing with The Canadian Kennel Club before the entry will be accepted; and in the case of an infraction of these rules, all the partners shall be held equally responsible.

SECTION 5. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms, whoever may make such errors.

SECTION 6. No dog which

- has distemper or other communicable disease shall be entered at any field trial.
- has had distemper or other communicable disease shall be entered at any field trial unless it has been fully recovered for thirty days.
- is known to have been in contact with distemper or other communicable disease shall be entered in any field trial until thirty days after such contact and provided said dog has itself been free from any symptom of said disease during said thirty days.
- has been kennelled on premises on which there existed distemper or other communicable disease shall be entered in any field trial until thirty days after such exposure and provided said dog has itself been free from any symptom of said disease during said thirty days.
- has been inoculated with distemper virus shall be entered at any field trial unless it has been fully recovered from any reaction to said inoculation for at least thirty days.
- has been inoculated with distemper virus and has shown no reaction thereto shall be entered in any field trial until thirty days after said inoculation.
- is known to have been in contact with an animal which has been inoculated within thirty days with distemper virus shall be entered in any field trial until thirty days after such contact, and provided said dog has itself been free from any symptom of distemper during said thirty days.

SECTION 7. A dog is not eligible to be entered in any field trial in any stake in which championship points are given, if the judge of that stake or any member of his family has owned, sold, held under lease, boarded, trained or handled the dog (except in an amateur stake) within six months prior to the date of the field trial.

SECTION 8. Any field trial-giving club which accepts an entry fee other than that published in its premium list or entry form, or in any way discriminates between entrants shall be disciplined. No club or member of any club shall give or offer to give any owner or handler any special inducements, such as reduced entry fees, allowances for board or transportation or other incentive of value for a certain number of entries or shall give or offer to give in consideration of entering a certain number of dogs, any prizes or prize money, except the officially advertised prizes or prize money shall be for a stated sum or a portion of the entry fees. Any club found guilty of violating this

rule shall be barred from holding licensed or sanctioned trials, and if a member of The Canadian Kennel Club, may be expelled from membership therein. All persons found guilty of paying or receiving any monies, special inducements or allowances in violation of the foregoing shall be disciplined, even to the extent of being deprived of all privileges of The Canadian Kennel Club for a stated time or indefinitely.

SECTION 9. A field trial committee may decline any entries or may remove any dog from its trial for cause, but in each such instance shall file good and sufficient reasons for so doing with The Canadian Kennel Club.

CHAPTER 8

CANCELLATIONS AND PROTESTS

SECTION 1. If a dog shall have been entered in any stake for which it is ineligible, all prizes won by said dog in that stake shall be cancelled by The Canadian Kennel Club when the awards of the field trial are checked by The Canadian Kennel Club from the judge's book.

SECTION 2. If the win of a dog shall be cancelled, the dog next in order of merit shall be moved up, and the win of the dog moved up shall be counted the same as if it had been the original award.

SECTION 3. If the win of a dog shall be cancelled by The Canadian Kennel Club, the entrant of the dog shall return all prizes for such win to the Secretary of the field trial-giving club within ten (10) days of receipt of notice from The Canadian Kennel Club of said cancellation.

SECTION 4. A protest against a dog may be made by any entrant or any member of The Canadian Kennel Club. It shall be in writing and be lodged with the Secretary of the field trial-giving club within seven (7) days of the last day of the field trial unless the same be made by The Canadian Kennel Club, provided, however, that a protest calling for a decision as to the physical condition of a dog which can be determined only by a veterinarian or at the time of running shall be made before the closing of the field trial. No protest will be entertained unless accompanied by a deposit of five (\$5.00) dollars, which will be returned if the protest is sustained. This does not apply to protests by The Canadian Kennel Club.

SECTION 5. An appeal to The Canadian Kennel Club from a decision of a field trial committee where a dog has been protested may be taken, and shall be forwarded to The Canadian Kennel Club within seven (7) days of the date on which the decision was rendered together with a deposit of ten (\$10.00) dollars. If the decision be sustained the deposit shall be forfeited, but if reversed, the deposit shall be returned. If a protest is sustained by The Canadian Kennel Club, then the original fee of \$5.00 deposited by the protester shall be returned to the protester.

SECTION 6. If a protest shall be made during the holding of a field trial, the field trial committee shall hold a meeting as soon as possible and give all parties concerned an opportunity to be heard and shall at once render its decision. If a protest shall be made subsequent to the field trial, it shall be decided by the field trial-giving club within thirty (30) days of its receipt. Five days' notice of the date and place of hearing shall be given to all parties concerned. Written copies of all decisions on protests shall be forwarded immediately to The Canadian Kennel Club.

CHAPTER 9

SPECIAL RULES AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS APPLYING TO BRITTANY SPANIELS, POINTERS, POINTERS (GERMAN SHORTHAIRED), SETTERS, WIREHAIR POINTING GRIFFONS, VIZSLAS, AND WEIMARANERS

SECTION 1. Field trial clubs or specialty clubs formed for the improvement of Brittany Spaniels, Pointers, Pointers (German Shorthaired), English, Irish or Gordon Setters, Wirehaired Pointing Griffons, Vizslas, or Weimaraners may give field trial stakes in which one of the above breeds only may compete, or in which more than one of the above may compete together.

SECTION 2. Brittany Spaniels, Pointers, Pointers (German Shorthaired), English, Irish or Gordon Setters, Wirehaired Pointing Griffons, Vizslas, and/or Weimaraners shall become Field Trial Champions of Record after having won ten points at field trials licensed by The Canadian Kennel Club; Of the required ten points, at least three points shall have been won in an all-age stake, and not more than two points in puppy stakes. Championship points shall

count whether the stakes are open or members' stakes.

SECTION 3. Championship point ratings: Puppy Stake (5 or more starters)—Winner—1 point; Derby Stake (8 or more starters)—Winner—2 points;

SECTION 4. Definition of Stakes:

PUPPY STAKE—From January 1st to July 1st in each year for dogs whelped on or after January 1st of the year preceding and from July 1st to December 31st of each year for dogs whelped on or after June 1st of the year preceding.

DERBY STAKE—From July 1st to December 31st in each year for dogs whelped on or after January 1st of the year preceding, and from January 1st to July 1st in each year for dogs whelped on or after January 1st of two years preceding.

AMATEUR ALL AGE STAKE—Dogs of all ages (over six months) owned, trained and handled by amateurs.

SHOOTING DOG STAKE—Dogs of all ages (over six months), handled on foot.

OPEN ALL AGE—Dogs of all ages (over six months).

At any field trial there shall not be more than one of the following stakes; open all age, amateur all age, shooting dog, derby, puppy. And no club shall hold more than two of any of these stakes in one calendar year unless justified by exceptional circumstances and approved by The Canadian Kennel Club.

The running of the open all age, amateur all age and shooting dog stakes must at all times take preference over the junior stakes derby and puppy.

SECTION 5. Running Rules—In accord with the provisions of Chapter 9 of the Rules Applying to Pointing Breed Trials which reads: "The requirements for a dog of one of the pointing breeds competing in field trials under these rules to be recorded a Field Champion shall be established by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club." The Board of Directors has adopted the following requirements for a Pointing Breed Field Championship: At present a dog will be recorded a Field Champion after having won 10 points under the point rating schedule below in regular stakes provided 5 points is won in one all age stake, that no more than 2 points each have been won in Open Puppy and Open Derby Stakes, and that no more than four points have been won in Amateur Stakes.

Championship points shall be credited only to dogs placed in regular stakes. The number of points shall be based on the actual number of starters in each stake according to the following schedules:

Puppy Stake (5 or more starters)—Winner—1 point;
Derby Stake (8 or more starters)—Winner—2 points;
Each of the All Age Stakes (8 or more starters);

Pointing Breed Field Trials

The Board of Directors has adopted the following Standard of Procedure Breed Trials to be effective (date to be set).

PROCEDURE 1

Standard of Performance

1 a. Puppy Stakes. Puppies must show desire to hunt, boldness, and initiative in covering ground and in searching likely cover. They are not expected to point but should flash point or otherwise indicate the presence of game if the opportunity is presented. Puppies should show reasonable obedience to their handler's commands. They are to be judged on their future promise as high class Derby Dogs. Game will not be killed in a Puppy Stake. Blanks will not be fired in a Puppy Stake unless so specified in the premium list, in which case every dog that makes game contact shall be fired over if the handler is within reasonable gun range. At least 15 minutes and not more than 30 minutes shall be allowed for each hunt.

1 b. Derby Stakes. Derbies must show a keen desire to hunt, be bold and independent, have a fast, yet attractive style of running, and demonstrate not only intelligence in seeking objectives but also the ability to find game. Derbies must point, but steadiness to wing and shot are not required. Should birds be flushed after a point by handler or dog within reasonable gun range from the handler a shot must be fired. Lack of opportunity for firing over a Derby dog on point shall not constitute reason for non-placement when it has had game contact in acceptable Derby manner. However, Judges must arrange to have all placed dogs fired over if a natural opportunity does not occur. Derbies are to be judged on their promise as either future Shooting Dogs or future All Age Shooting Dogs. At least 30 minutes and not more shall be allowed for each heat.

1 c. Shooting Dog Stakes. A Shooting Dog must show a keen desire to hunt, have a bold and attractive style of running, and demonstrate not only intelligence in quartering and in seeking objectives but also the ability to find game.

The dog must hunt for its handler at all times at a range suitable for a handler on foot, and should show or check in front of its handler frequently. It must cover adequate ground but never range out of sight for a length of time that would detract from its usefulness as a practical gun dog. The dog must locate game, must point staunchly. When the brace mate has established point it should back, preferably on sight, but if not then on command. Intelligent use of the wind and terraine in locating game, accurate nose, style and intensity on point, are highly desirable.

The dog should automatically relocate game that moves out, but may be encouraged to relocate by its handler. The dog should give a finished performance and should be under its handler's control at all times. A Shooting Dog should handle well with a minimum of nose or hacking by the handler. At least 30 minutes shall be allowed for each heat.

1 d. All Age and Limited All Age Stakes. An All Age dog shall demonstrate all of the same qualities as a Gun Dog as defined in the foregoing, except that it must hunt with greater speed and at a much greater range if the terrain permits, with a greater degree of independence, and covering the course in a forward moving pattern so as to locate any game on the course. It should respond to handling but should show an indication of using its own judgment, in negotiating the course to find birds, and should not wait for the handler to direct it as to where to go. Style and intensity on point are essential and must be steady to wing shot. At least 30 minutes shall be allowed for each heat.

1 e. In a Gun Dog All Age or Limited All Age Stake held by a German Shorthaired Pointer, German Wire-haired Pointer, Vizsla or Weimaraner Club, the dog placed first must have demonstrated backing in addition to the basic requirements for hunting and pointing as described above. A dog should not be placed on the basis of his backing performance alone, but failure of a dog to back or honor when its brace mate has established point must be heavily penalized. Backing should be done naturally but may be done on command, but greater credits shall be given for a natural back. Judges should try to have each dog that is being considered for placement back in a natural situation. However, if the opportunity to back does not occur naturally in these stakes the Judges may set up a brace for this purpose. The backing dog may not be touched before the blank is fired, nor before the retrieve if game is shot, unless directed by a Judge in case of an unproductive find.

1 f. No Gun All Age, or Limited All Age Stake shall be run in heats of more than 30 minutes at a licensed or member trial unless the running time is given in the premium list.

1 g. In any stake in which birds are not shot, except Puppy or Derby Stakes as specified in sections 1a. and 1b. a blank cartridge must be fired by the handler over any dog on point, after the game has been flushed. The handler must shoot within the time that would be required to kill a bird at natural shot gun range. Any deliberate delay in shooting must be severely penalized.

1 h. A reasonable move of a dog to mark a bird flushed after a point is acceptable, but this shall not excuse a partial break or a delayed chase.

1 i. Any club that anticipates an entry in a licensed or member field trial that might exceed the number of dogs that could be judged on the available running

grounds during the available judging hours should specify in its premium list that entries in any or all stakes will be limited and that entries will close when the limit or limits have been reached if this occurs before the specified closing time for entries.

PROCEDURE 2 JUDGES

2 a. Each stake must be judged by two Judges.
2 b. The decisions of the Judges shall be final with respect to the running and placement of the dogs, and in all questions concerning the merits of the dogs. They shall have full power to turn out of any stake any dog that does not reasonably obey its handler or that interferes with the work of its brace mate, and any handler who, in their opinion, wilfully interferes with another handler or his dog.

2 c. Any person who, during the running of a stake, strikes, or otherwise abuses or mistreats a dog, or conducts himself in a manner prejudicial to the best interests of the sport, must be expelled from that stake by the Judges who shall also report the matter to the Field Trial Committee for possible action under Chapter 19. A report of the incident and the action taken shall be sent promptly to the C.K.C. by the Field Trial Secretary.

2 d. Any additional running of the dogs after the first series of heats has been completed shall be entirely at the discretion of the Judges unless further series are specified in the premium list, and the Judges shall determine the length and scope of any subsequent series and the bracing of the dogs.

2 e. If the two handlers with their dogs become separated while both are on course and under judgment, one Judge shall accompany each handler, except that a Judge should not follow a dog that cuts the specified course in order to reach the bird field.

2 f. The Judges may appoint an official observer at the bird field to report to them whether or not a dog had game before a Judge could reach the bird field.

PROCEDURE 3 Field Trial Marshals

3 a. The Field Trial Committee shall appoint one or more field trial Marshals. It shall be the duty of one Marshal to assist the Judges and to carry out instructions, including regulating and controlling the gallery, and seeing to it that the gallery is kept separate from and behind the Judges, and that no one in the gallery talks to the Judges while the dogs are down. Other Marshals shall see to it that braces are ready when called and assist the Field Trial Committee in all other matters necessary for smooth and expeditious running of the trial.

PROCEDURE 4 Drawing and Bracing

4 a. The dogs shall generally be run in braces, and each dog in a brace must have a separate handler.

4 b. If every dog entered in a stake at a licensed or member field trial has a different handler, the bracing of the dogs in that stake shall be established by a straight drawing and the braces shall then be run in the order drawn.

4 c. If two dogs with the same handler are entered in a stake at a licensed or member field trial, such entries shall be segregated for the drawing for bracing so that no two dogs handled by the same person can be drawn for the same brace. The running order for all complete braces shall then be determined by a separated drawing after the bracing has been established; if during the drawing for running order, any handler is drawn to handle in more than two consecutive braces in the same stake, and if there is a later brace to be drawn in which that handler has no dog may be moved up to run following the second consecutive brace, so that the handler would not be required to run in more than two consecutive braces. However this shall not apply if an alternate handler has been named.

4 d. The bracing and running order established by either method shall not be changed under any circumstances: except that

(1). in case of a scratch or absentee the brace mate of the absent dog shall be run with the dog from the next incomplete brace or, if there is no other incomplete brace, with the bye dog; and except further that

(2). if the foregoing procedure would result in the bracing together of two dogs handled by the same person the two odd dogs shall be re-braced consecutively with the two dogs in the

last brace in the stake in which that handler has no dog.

4 e. Any new brace or braces so created must be run in the running order drawn for one of the two dogs in the brace, as the Field Trial Committee may decide. If there is no bye dog and no other incomplete brace, the brace mate of a scratched or absent dog shall run last as the bye dog.

4 f. If a bye dog remains after all the braces have been run, its brace mate shall be selected by the Judges at their sole discretion from among the dogs that have run in that stake; or the Judges may, if the Field Trial Committee agrees, run such a bye dog without a brace mate. The Judges alone shall decide whether or not any brace mate they select for such a bye dog shall be under judgment, and if under judgment for what portion or portions of the heat, and their decision shall be publicly announced before the brace is started.

PROCEDURE 5 COURSES AND BIRDS

5 a. Stakes at licensed or member field trials may be run on any of the following types of courses, all of which must include sufficient acreage, adequate cover for birds, and suitable objectives:

(1). Single Course with Bird Field consisting of a back course and a bird field which has sufficient cover to hold birds and which is of adequate size to permit a dog to hunt naturally without excessive backing. A bird field must not be less than 5 acres and 10 acres is recommended. At a licensed or member trial no less than two birds must be released for each brace in first series in all stakes except Puppy Stake. Additional birds may be released either in the bird field or on the back course.

(2). Single Courses Without The Bird Field, consisting entirely of a course without any specific bird field, on which birds are released in suitable places around the course. At a licensed or member trial no less than two birds must be released for each brace at a suitable place on the course in all stakes except the Puppy Stake.

(3). Multiple Courses consisting of series of courses on which each brace starts where the last brace was picked up. On such a course it is assumed that there is adequate natural or released game.

5 b. The same requirements for released birds that apply to other stakes at a licensed or member trial shall also apply to Puppy Stakes unless the premium list specifies that no birds will be released in the Puppy Stake.

5 c. No released bird shall be picked up on the course or in the bird field unless dead or crippled.

5 d. Regular stakes at a licensed or member trial shall be run only on recognized game birds, and the birds should be strong, healthy, full-feathered and clean except that in Puppy Stakes non-game birds may be used if specified in the premium list.

5 e. Birds should, if possible, be released in natural cover rather than in artificially created cover. They should not be placed in holes nor in such cover as will impede their ability to fly or run. Birds may be rocked or dizzied but not to such an extent as to affect their ability to fly. Gamestewards should wear gloves. Successive birds should not be released in or near the same spot.

5 f. The premium list for a licensed or member trial shall specify the type of course and species of game to be released in each stake.

PROCEDURE 6 RUNNING AND HANDLING

6 a. Running and Handling.

The duty of having a dog ready in place when required for judging rests solely with its handler or owner. All dogs should be ready on the grounds well in advance of the scheduled times for braces so that the Judges will not be held up in case of an absent brace. If a dog is not present at the place where it is to start within 5 minutes after it is called for by the Judges to run in any series it must be disqualified. The Judges are responsible for keeping the time.

6 b. No more than one brace shall be run on a course or any part of a course at the same time, irrespective of whether the dogs are in the same stake or in different stakes.

6 c. In a stake on a single course with bird field the

time of each heat shall include no more than 8 minutes in the bird field, except that in Puppy Stake the time in the bird field shall not exceed 6 minutes. The time shall start when the first dog may be disqualified if it has cut the specified course in order to reach the bird field, in which case time starts when the second dog enters. Otherwise the Judges, or the Marshal if instructed by the Judges, shall see to it that both dogs in each brace are directed to the bird field at as nearly the same time as possible. If one dog has strayed or is otherwise held up on the course the brace mate and its handler may ordinarily proceed on the course and enter the bird field unless otherwise directed by a Judge.

6 d. Time shall not be called when a dog is on point in the bird field unless so specified in the premium list.

6 e. In a Derby Stake, if the second dog is not on point or backing, its handler may, without penalty, hold or otherwise control the dog if there is any likelihood that it will interfere with the dog on point.

6 f. A dog that is on point roading or obviously on game, when time is up, shall be allowed a reasonable time to complete its work.

6 g. Judges must discourage continuous or excessive noise or loud vocalizing by handlers in any stake, and particularly in Gun Dog Stakes. Failure to heed the Judges instructions may result in disqualification.

6 h. Intimidation, blocking, or the use of any training aid or other means to restrain the dog from breaking wing or shot shall be severely penalized.

6 i. A dog remains steady to wing and shot with minimum of handling or commands must be given credit in a Gun Dog, All Age or Limited Age — Age Stake.

6 j. A dog that is out of judgment for a continuous period of more than 5 minutes or for more than 1/6 of the time specified for the heat if over 30 minutes, shall not be placed unless, seen on point by a Judge or unless, in the opinion of Judges, the dog's absence was due to unusual conditions.

6 k. No person shall in any manner assist a handler in controlling his dog or in finding a dog that is lost, unless specific permission is first obtained from a Judge. A dog may be disqualified if it receives directions of any kind from anyone except its handler.

6 l. No dog shall be picked up during a heat except on directions or permission from a Judge.

6 m. All dogs started in a stake must remain on the grounds until the stake is completed unless excused by the Judges or by the Field Trial Committee.

6 n. No one shall be permitted in the bird field at any time during the running of a stake; except for the Judges, the official guns, the Marshal, and the handlers of the competing dogs while the dogs are in the bird field; and except for the game stewards to the extent necessary to release birds.

6 o. No person shall serve as an official gun in a stake in which he handles a dog or which a dog is owned by him is entered.

6 p. Promiscuous firing of guns or blank pistols on the field trial ground is prohibited, the handler of a dog shall fire one blank and no more for each flush of one or more birds.

6 q. There shall be no training of dogs anywhere on the course during the trial.

6 r. The Field Trial Committee shall not permit severe training, correcting, or disciplining of dogs on any part of the field trial grounds. The Committee shall investigate any reports of such conduct prejudicial to the best interests of pure-bred dogs, field trials, or the C.K.C. Any person who conducts himself in a manner prejudicial to the best interests of the sport shall be dealt with promptly, during the trial if possible, after the offender has been notified of the specific charges against him, and has been given an opportunity to be heard in his own defense.

6 s. The premium list for any licensed or member field trial must specify whether or not handling from horseback will be permitted in any stake or all stakes. If handling from horseback is permitted in any stake the club must have suitable horses available. Mounted and foot handlers are not to be segregated in the draw. The Judges shall see to it that any mounted handler uses his horse only as a means of conveyance on the course and never as an active aid in handling. The handlers shall remain on specific course with the Judges. If one handler is mounted and the other is on foot, the Judges shall set a reasonable pace to accommodate the foot handler. Mounted handlers must keep their horses at a walk at all times unless other-

wise authorized by the Judge. A handler must always dismount before handling his dog on game and before firing. No handler's horse may be brought into the bird field.

PROCEDURE 7 SHOOT-TO-KILL STAKES

7 a. The premium list must identify any Shoot-To-Kill Stakes and must specify, for each stake in which birds are to be shot whether the shooting will be done by official guns or whether handlers will be required to shoot or whether handlers will be required to shoot their own birds, and the shooting for all braces in the stake shall be done in the manner specified.

7 b. The Judges shall have complete authority over all shooting. They may require a change of official guns at any time, and may bar from further shooting in that trial any official gun or gunning handler who does not abide strictly by safe gunning rules.

7 c. If the shooting is done by official guns, two qualified guns are required for each brace, one to accompany each handler. Provision must also be made for alternate or stand-by guns in case they should be required.

7 d. One official gun must join each handler as he enters the bird field, or if a bird field is not used at a designated place on the course. The official gun must always keep himself in the correct position for safety of dogs and persons.

7 e. Game should be shot cleanly, in a sportsmanlike manner, in full flight, and at a distance that will give the dog a reasonable retrieve. An official gun represents the handler up to the time that game is shot, but must not interfere in any manner with his work nor direct the work of the dog.

7 f. Game flushed by a free running dog or birds that flush wild shall not be shot except on instructions from a Judge. If a bird does not fly after an attempt to flush by handler, it shall not be shot on the ground.

7 g. Retrieving is required in all Shoot-To-Kill Stakes, except Derby Stakes as specified below, and counts as an important part of a dog's performance. After the shot the dog shall not be sent to retrieve by the handler until the dog's steadiness to wing and shot has been positively demonstrated. The handler commands and/or signals the dog to retrieve but may not touch the dog. The dog must retrieve promptly and tenderly to hand. In Shoot-To-Kill Derby Stakes retrieving will also be required unless otherwise specified in the premium list, but the dog is not required to be steady to wing and shot.

(NOTE: Chapters 10 to 15 have not been allocated).

CHAPTER 16 JUDGES' BOOKS, REPORTS AND DECISIONS

SECTION 1. At the conclusion of the judging field trial clubs shall provide the judge or judges with a book containing full names of all the dogs entered and the names and addresses of the owners. The awards and absentees in said judges' books shall be marked by the judge or judges and certified to by the secretary of the field trial club, its Superintendent or field trial secretary, who shall file said judges' book, together with all original entry forms and a full report of said trial, and pay all listing fees to The Canadian Kennel Club within seven (7) days after the closing of the trial.

Penalty for non-compliance \$1.00 per day and such other penalties as may be imposed by the Board of Directors. The report shall contain a list of all officers, members of field trial committees, names and complete address of judges and the name and address of the Superintendent or secretary of the field trials.

SECTION 2. A Judges decision shall be final in all cases affecting the merits of the dogs. Full discretionary power is given to the Judge to withhold championship points; where a Judge considers that the work of the dogs does not merit the awarding of championship points the ribbons for such placement must also be withheld. Such action to be recorded in the Judges' Books.

CHAPTER 17 MISCELLANEOUS

Field Trial Chairmen of field trials shall be held responsible for the enforcement of all rules and regulations relating to field trials, and must provide themselves with a copy of The Canadian Kennel Club rules and regulations for reference.

CHAPTER 18 NO LIABILITY

SECTION 1. The Canadian Kennel Club shall not be responsible to any member, person, partnership, club or corporation for any loss or damage arising at or by reason of any field trial held under any rules adopted by The Canadian Kennel Club.

CHAPTER 19 DISCIPLINE

SECTION 1. The Board of Directors may take disciplinary action against any club, person, company or partnership or member of The Canadian Kennel Club for any act of omission or commission which violates any section or subsections of the Field Trial Rules and Regulations, such action to be taken as provided for in the By-Laws of The Canadian Kennel Club.

SECTION 2. Any member, person, partnership, company or organization availing themselves of the privilege of participating in any capacity, manner, shape or form at a field trial shall, by such participation, be deemed to have agreed to the authority of The Canadian Kennel Club and its Board of Directors as conferred on the Club by its By-laws and all other rules and regulations adopted by The Canadian Kennel Club.

SECTION 3. For any act of omission or commission which violates any of the Field Trial Rules and Regulations, the Board of Directors may impose such penalty or penalties as it deems fit.

SECTION 4. The administration, in any form, of a drug or any substance whose action alters the nervous system by stimulation, sedation or tranquilization to a dog competing at a field trial shall be considered as misleading the judge and will be considered misconduct in the opinion of The Board of Directors. The person or persons responsible will be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with the Rules of The Canadian Kennel Club and the dog shall be debarred from the trial.

CHAPTER 20 AMENDMENTS

1. These Field Trial Rules and Regulations are subject to amendment, as hereinafter provided, by the Board of Directors of The Canadian Kennel Club (hereinafter referred to as "the Board").

2. (1) Amendments may be proposed by the appropriate association, council, committee, executive, or representative group or body operating in connection with the phase of field trial activity it was organized to promote;

(2) An amendment to these Field Trial Rules and Regulations shall only be considered as having been approved by the Board when not less than 10 members of the Board vote in favour of such amendment.

(3) The effective date of any approved amendment shall be as set by the Board.

(4) With a view to ensuring a systematic method of receiving and processing proposed amendments, the Board shall have the power to prescribe regulations with regard to the submission and processing of proposed amendments, to the submission of briefs, the hearing of delegations, representatives, and with regard to such other matters and things as may be calculated to enhance competition, conservation of game, and breed improvement.

(5) The Board shall not reach a final decision on any proposed amendment to these Field Trial Rules and Regulations without prior publication of it in the official organ, and then only after consulting the appropriate Field Trial Council.

(6) A final decision of the Board on any proposed amendment shall only be given at the Board's annual meeting or at its semi-annual meeting.

(7) When a final decision has been reached, the appropriate Field Trial Council and the principal proposer shall be notified; and the approved amendment shall be published in the official organ.


3. This chapter of The Field Trial Rules and Regulations is not subject to amendment by the Board. It may be amended only as provided in the Club's By-laws.

in a sweepstakes class of nineteen 6-9 months puppies, and placed in the regular class for this age, while at the WHWTC of Indiana Specialty in March he won the 6-9 months sweepstakes class.

Another Hannibal son of whom we are proud is the Pedans' Ch. (Can. & Am.) Danny Boy of the Rouge (out of Am. Ch. Klintilloch Moment) who won the Canadian Westie Specialty in 1966 over a record bench of 36, including ten specials present, and who is a Group winner in the U.S. and has had Group placements in Canada. He has been producing some very promising puppies and is in considerable demand at stud.

Our Can. Ch. Cooper's Annie Laurie (a daughter of Am. Ch. Wigtown Talent Scout), featured on last year's cover, has almost completed her U.S. title, having gained a point and 2nd in Group at Batavia last summer, then taking time out for her third litter (we feel 17 puppies in three litters is a pretty good production record!) and then taking major wins at Battle

Creek and Detroit, and a 5 point win over 17 bitches at the Indiana Specialty in March of this year. She will be bred this summer to Am. Ch. Rannoch-Dune Down Beat, top-winning Westie in the U.S. for 1965 and 1966.

A daughter of Hannibal and Annie, Can. Ch. Hoosier Lass of the Rouge, owned by Mrs. David Cook of St. John's, Newfoundland, completed her title last year with Group placings as well, and is now in whelp to Ch. (Can. & Am.) Danny Boy of the Rouge. Mrs. Cook's Can. Ch. Joshua of the Rouge (by Am. Ch. Rachelwood Rivet ex Can. Ch. Vigil of the Rouge, another Talent scout daughter) also finished his title with three major wins and Group placings, and another young Rouge bitch will shortly be going to Mrs. Cook's Avalon Kennels. An Annie daughter by Ch. Danny Boy has gone down to Mrs. Kozel in Florida for breeding and show, and an Annie Daughter by Ch. (Can. & Am.) Mercury of the Rouge, owned by Len Hunter of Windsor, has points towards her U.S. title and is currently in whelp to Hannibal.

tories visited, where the husbandry is careful, and where both personnel and animals show confidence. Perhaps, therefore, it is in the major aspects of acquisition of animals, and actual experiment, that legislation is most needed.

■ On August 24 this year, President Johnson signed a bill which makes obligatory (1) the registration and licensing of dealers who supply dogs and cats for research; (2) registration of institutions using dogs and cats for research; (3) compulsory humane care of all mammals by all research facilities; (4) inspection by the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture of (a) research facilities and (b) dealers'

premises; (5) requirement that research institutions purchase animals from licensed dealers only; (6) provision that law-enforcement agencies (which include S.P.C.A.) may inspect animals and records when searching for lost animals.

This Bill also contains strict penalties for violations. Here the United States has at last recognized the duty of government and the public to extend the Protection of Animals Act to the millions of helpless sentient creatures that suffer and die in laboratories.

Britain has had legislation on these lines since the Act of 1876, and the Parliamentary-appointed "Littlewood" Commission, after an exhaustive two-year study in 1965 made wide and strong recommendations to amend and increase the powers of that legislation.

What we now ask of our Federal Government is a law which will make legally effective the Code which Canadian biologists already regard as a necessary measure. And added to the Code, provisions which will advance the humane ethics of refinement of procedures, reduction of numbers of experiments and numbers of animals, and replacement wherever possible of living creatures by work on elementary forms of life, tissues, embryos and cultures.



The Quarrybrae Kennels Story

The passing of long-time Collie and Sheltie breeder George Getty (see "Dogs and People" this issue) fortunately does not mean the termination of the well-known Quarrybrae Kennels. Mrs. Getty (Laura) who has taken a heavy responsibility in the kennel operation as well as caring for her husband in the past number of years, will continue Quarrybrae.

How does a renowned kennel get its start? As in the case of most kennels, in a very limited way. George Getty lived in a restricted area in Toronto in the early 1900's. His first Collie, Riverdale Violet, was purchased from the late Mr. Arthur Parish of Riverdale Kennels. Her beautiful tri-color markings won Mr. Getty's heart, but not many ribbons. It was his custom to visit the kennels of the late J. D. Strachan (then Canadian Kennel Club Secretary) every Sunday. Mr. Strachan advised George he'd get nowhere with that female and suggested he purchase a good bitch. A young female pup, who was being groomed for a show, toppled off a box and broke her shoulder. He offered her to George for \$200 — a fortune to a man who at that time was earning 18c an hour. That was the beginning of Quarrybrae, in 1914.

By the time George paid for Quarrybrae Mary he didn't have the money for the services of a good stud. Mr. Strachan took care of the fee for service by Ch. Wisher Rival, a top stud of Dr. Bennett's kennels in Illinois, with the understanding George would pay later with funds from the litter. Of eight lovely puppies one remained unsalable. She was a runt, who later grew to glory — Ch. Quarrybrae Colleen, "a champion three times over without a defeat". George later purchased some of the Elmhill Collies of the late Dr. Cooper, one of which was Ch. Elmhill Buddy Boy, a handsome lad who did a great deal to improve Collies in Canada. He also purchased dogs from the Sterling Kennels of Judge Edwin L. Pickhardt of New Milford, Conn. and from Mr. Stephen J. Field's Parader Kennels in Omaha, Neb. One was Ch. Graham Farm Parader who won several best in Show awards and Specialties. Known as Big Red, this handsome dog, whose portrait was

painted by artist June Renaud for the Calvert series, appeared on the July, 1955 cover of *Dogs in Canada*. The Gettys' last import from the United States is Ch. Royalan Mr. Chips, top winning Collie in Canada in 1964. Jock at Quarrybrae, an extremely promising young son of Mr. Chips, will likely carry on the Quarrybrae honors.

The Doberman Standard and Its Interpretations

The following is my translation of the German Dobe Standard and its interpretation done by Herr Erns Wilking, a Doberman judge and breeder (v. Forell) in Germany. I had the pleasure of meeting him and his wife in Germany three years ago.

The German Standard is very similar to ours, however much emphasis is put on substance, bone, teeth, temperament, color and markings. I noticed this when I had the opportunity of viewing the Dobes in Germany and Holland. The dogs are never set up or strung up at shows, but must walk into a stance naturally.

The Doberman is of German breeding. Through the Fédération Cynologique Internationale (F.C.I.), Brussels is recognized to be the origin


Although there is a standard, it so happens that the standard is interpreted in various ways. Some breeders in Germany and other countries are trying to interpret some parts of the Doberman standard so that possibly it will be better fitted to the products of their kennel. However, if our goal is to breed a dog, which will be as close to the desirable standard as possible, such self-deceiving measure is the biggest hindrance. As the breeders also carry a big responsibility for the standard of a breed, they should, in the first place, have a uniform interpretation of it. I would like to try to explain the standard so it would be clear to anyone.

GENERAL APPEARANCE

The Doberman should be middle sized, powerful and muscular in build. In spite of all substance, which is absolutely desirable, the body line should be elegant and noble. The proud, upright carriage, his spirited character and the expression of resoluteness should contribute to the ideal picture of the dog. His body appears almost square. This demand should be taken more into consideration in a male than a female.

HEAD

Seen in profile and from the top the head of the Doberman should resemble a blunt wedge. The skin should lie so tight that the flat muscles,

country of the breed. The DV (Doberman Verein) keeps the breeding records, which at the same time are the original breeding records for all Dobermanns in the whole world.

sinews and veins are visible as a fine mould. Such a head is called "dry". The skull is flat, seen from the front and side. The top head-profile is formed by two parallel lying planes; the

bridge of the nose and the forehead. These two lines are interrupted in front of the eyes by a small stop. The bridge of the nose and the forehead — line is rising until the occiput. There the skull-line drops off to the neck in a slight roundness.

The muzzle is deep and full with tight, close-lying lips. The bite should be complete, consisting of 42 white teeth and should meet in a scissor bite. The line across the crown of the head when seen from the front is horizontal. This line should not drop off towards the ears. The eyes are middle-sized and oval. The eye color is dark. The color of the nose is black. A lighter shading is permissible in brown and blue dogs; however, correspondingly eyes and nose should have a darker effect. The high set ear is carried erect and its length is cut in proportion to the head. A roman nose is faulty. If the skull is round instead of being flat it's also a fault; if there is no visible stop it's just as faulty as when there is too much stop. In the latter case the stop is not small as desired, but distinctly steep. A short, thick head is a major fault, also a cheeky head; if the muzzle has not sufficient depth and width it's a major fault. We then speak of a snipey head or of lacking muzzle-depth; besides head faults include droopy lips and too high or low-set ears. The eye should not be a round, cherry eye nor a slit eye. Bulging or too deep-set eyes are just as faulty as light ones.

In Germany, bite-faults are disqualifications in placing at shows and receiving breeding permission. It is absolutely a fault if a dog has less than 42 teeth. The teeth of course must be according to the well-known tooth pattern. The front teeth should close in a scissor-bite, i.e. the lower incisors standing behind the upper incisors. The top part of the lower teeth touches slightly the inside of the upper teeth. The ideal spacing here is so that a person could still push a postcard between the teeth. If the lower incisors are standing in front of the upper it's called undershot-bite. As far as the lower incisors standing behind the upper incisors with too large a space between, it is called an overshot bite. If the upper and lower incisors meet exactly even it is a level bite.

Now for our monthly flashback into the past: Ever have problems with a bitch who has just whelped and won't touch anything for several days — try Campbell's Beef with Vegetable


Soup mixed with milk — so help me, it never fails, even with the most finicky eaters.

Our breed is the Wire-Haired Fox Terrier; a coated critter which requires much effort to keep presentable, entirely apart from show presentation. It is also a breed which generally does not take too well to kennel life. The Fox Terrier will tolerate one other member of his breed if he has to; but much prefers to be a participating member of the human race. In case anyone reading this is about to tell me he has five or six Wires who are all kenneled together and live in perfect peace and harmony, I say "Sir, you may have five or six lovely dogs but they sure aren't Terriers!"

I never worried over the males I sold. If they had possibilities, buyers simply signed a statement to the effect that "all Stud Rights are reserved by Mrs. Jarvis". Most of the females I've sold have been pet quality and I've had purchasers sign a simple statement not to breed, laterally using the CKC form which I don't send in.

One couple I sold a bitch to last year didn't want show quality — "just wanted one litter". I sold them a bitch who was not show quality but had things I liked about her to the extent I would have kept her and bred her myself. They paid \$75.00 cash and I reserved choice of stud and pick of litter. They further agreed that if the bitch did not produce anything worthwhile they would then have her spayed. These people have turned into real enthusiasts and unfortunately have a bitch who is exactly as I represented her to them. I wish she was better!

On the other hand, another bitch I sold last Spring was one I didn't want to sell but they spotted her while I was showing one I wanted to sell and fell for her. I tried to dissuade them but on finding they had a large ranch in the interior was swayed by the thought of what a lovely existence this would be for a dog, and especially this one which was a special favorite of mine. They paid their \$100.00 down. Three months later they wrote what a "Swell little dog" she was; later, on the Okanagan circuit, they visited me and I agreed to postpone fall breeding until the third season which would occur during better travelling weather. All was quiet until this January when they wrote informing me they'd decided to give her up because she didn't bark and was too friendly with strangers, a pack of coyotes was trying to lure her away, and would I obtain a just-weaned female Airedale pup which they would be willing to trade!

I reminded them that the dog was in both our names and as per agreement would not be registered in theirs until full purchase price had been paid. However, if they really felt she was that unsuitable they could have her put to sleep and return Registration and Veterinary slip and I would consider the matter closed.

I may have a peculiar way of look-

ing at things but it seems to me that to have a dog put to sleep is kinder than to bring one who has run free and been a house pet into a caged kennel existence just for the purpose of manufacturing a few pups.

They replied that they would not hear of having her destroyed as she was "so friendly and affectionate". So they would come down "at proper time" and return the next day (!?) and if she had a minimum of four pups that would be fine but if not they would have to breed her again!

I asked them why they wanted to breed more of her if they found her unsuitable and again reminded them that they had agreed to have her spayed after the first litter, provided she produced more than one pup.

After one more letter from them, suggesting I give them \$100.00 in exchange for the bitch, I sent them a transfer slip which they both signed. At this moment I have written them telling them when they deliver the bitch to us they will receive cheque.

I do not believe for one moment that legally or morally I am compelled to do this. But in this life we are expected to pay for our mistakes one way or another and this is one mistake I will never make again. I fully realize I could just have written the whole thing off and either told them to go whistle or probably even have been able to pick up the bitch for non-payment. If this was a business we were running I would probably have done this, but those methods have no place in a "hobby".

Unless I know the person well, I will never again sell a dog on terms of any sort. This does not present a problem to the person who can be objective about his dogs. That sort of person would not concede that there is a problem. But there must be lots of people like ourselves in the "dog game" who feel a very real responsibility for each and every pup we bring into the world; and it is to these people I say "BREEDING CONTRACTS — NEVER".



What is a Staffordshire Bull Terrier?

In 1835 the Humane Act was passed in Great Britain. This act was aimed at abolishing all fighting between animals and did (after being enforced by the police and dragoons) successfully abolish the baiting of bulls in public although the last recorded bull baiting took place in Derby, England over 20 years later.

An unforeseen result of the Humane Act was the development of

the Staffordshire Bull Terrier. Being denied the excitement of public bull-baiting the section of the community interested in such sports concentrated their attention on dog fighting which could be carried on much less conspicuously. In the "Black Country" in South Staffordshire dog fighting became commonplace.

The Bull Dog of the early 1800's was considerably more agile than the type which is seen today. While it was ideal for baiting bulls it was considered too slow a dog when matched against another dog. In order to improve its speed and fighting ability breeders had crossed the light weight Bull Dog with the old English Terrier sometime before the passage of the Humane Act. This cross breed soon became known as the Bull and Terrier and later the Bull Terrier. This dog, it should be noted, was the direct ancestor of the Staffordshire Bull Terrier. The 'white' Bull Terrier was originated in the early 1850's by James Hinks of Birmingham who crossed the Bull Terrier with other breeds which were predominantly white and produced the fashionable show dog. The original Bull Terrier still existed but was found only in the dog fighting pits, not the show ring.

Eventually of course dog fighting did die out. In the early 1930's a group of fanciers in Staffordshire, recognizing that this sterling breed would also die out, formed the Staff-

fordshire Bull Terrier Club and sought official recognition. In 1935 the Kennel Club in England recognized the breed. Since the name Bull Terrier was already in use and since the breed had been fostered in Staffordshire it was logical to call it the Staffordshire Bull Terrier.

In the 1860's some of the original stock was taken to the United States and again used principally for pit fighting. Indeed, the United Kennel Club of the United States was organized "to place the Pit Contest upon a recognized plane of excellence and promote more and better contests". The dog is known as the Pit Bull Terrier by the United Kennel Club. In 1936 The American Kennel Club recognized the breed as the Staffordshire Terrier.

The two breeds have a common heritage. True, by virtue of their separation for many years they have grown somewhat apart. The American dog is larger than its English counterpart. In subsequent articles in this place the two breeds will be compared and contrasted.

Are We Getting Our Pekingese Too Short in Body?

That lovely, easy, rolling gait seems to be fast disappearing from the breed and in its place we have a 'choppy' gait that is not desirable to the Peke. A body too short does not allow enough space for the front feet to get out of the way of the back feet when in motion. So, in order to move without stepping on their own feet they must either hop or use a crab-like movement which is not pretty.

Some years ago our problem was a body far too long, resulting in a rangy and lumbering movement. Now the pendulum is swinging too far in the other direction. A poor gait certainly ruins an otherwise beautiful animal.

We see these glamorous creatures standing still and think that here is a winner until he starts to walk, then the glamor is gone.



We should try for the happy medium. A body just long enough to allow easy gait, nice bowed legs, the neck long enough to balance, a nice wide, flat skull, big, soulful eyes, a well groomed and healthy coat. Then we are pretty close to the standard of perfection.

Let's Save Those "Stillborns"

Many people, upon having a litter say, "it was a beautiful litter, the only sad thing is that one was stillborn". In the past, my husband and I have brought a number of these so-called "stillborn" puppies back to life. You must not just assume they are born dead. You must work with them and try to give them life. In many cases these puppies just need the extra "life-saving" effort on your part to turn them into lively, healthy puppies.

A puppy in this condition when born must be rubbed very briskly with a terry cloth towel, drying out the mouth and nose for excess fluid. Mouth to mouth resuscitation will expand the lungs and allow the puppy to breathe. Breathe into the mouth of the puppy, being very careful to hold the tongue over the lower jaw and thus out of the way. Give short blows of breath, not too hard but hard enough to expand the puppy's lungs. Blowing into the lungs is a very delicate procedure as blowing too hard could cause damage to the lungs. However, you must blow hard enough to expand the lungs. You know you are breathing hard enough when the rib cage is making a normal motion of breathing quietly. If the rib cage

motion appears as if the puppy were sighing or taking a deep breath, then you are blowing too hard. About one breath every two seconds. Sometimes it takes several blows of breath for a puppy to give any indication of life and then he may only give a gasp every minute or half minute. As long as he's showing signs of life, don't give up. Keep up a steady rhythm of breathing into the puppy until he is gasping every two or three seconds. Then put one (only one) drop of whiskey (any liquor you have will do) on the puppy's tongue. This will give him added strength. This effort may take two or three hours but as long as he's gasping you must keep working with him until his lungs are strong enough for him to be on his own.

Another method is to use a small home oxygen unit that may be obtained at a nominal cost from your pharmacy. (The one we use is called Life-O-Gen). The entire mask can be placed over the puppy's body and oxygen given for 10 seconds at a time.

Newborn puppies have no source of body heat and therefore must be kept warm. A heating pad or hot water bottle must be used. If the puppy is very cold to the touch, place him in warm water up to the ears but do not get water in ears, nose or mouth. Then rub briskly in a terry cloth towel. This may be repeated several times until the puppy starts to breathe.

When the puppy is breathing regularly, give him to his mother to nurse. If he is too weak to nurse then he probably will also be too weak to bottle feed. Dropper feeding can be very dangerous as the weak puppy may not be able to swallow properly and the milk could go into his lungs instead of his stomach. We use the premature infant feeding tube method and have had great success.

The reward for all the work and effort on your part is often a strong,

About Toy Manchester

As a young girl I loved my friend's Toy Terrier. By the time I achieved my ambition to purchase my own purebred the breed was called Toy Manchester Terrier.

The Manchester Terrier, I am told, is one of the oldest and most distinctive of the many breeds of dogs that originated in England. He has had influence in the formation of many of today's popular purebred breeds but has himself remained not generally popular but a true fancier's dog.

It is not easy to breed a good one — one which conforms to the standard. Of all the breed standards — CKC and AKC — that of the Manchester is the most definite in its wording as to markings. They must be in certain spots or areas and must be of certain sizes and rich mahogany tan. Disqualification is any spot of white the diameter of a dime.

Most people do not know this "gentleman's terrier". He is small, 12 lbs. and under, neat, and clean with his short hair and erect ears — just the dog for a modern apartment. He is sturdy, intelligent, alert, courageous and a dependable watchdog. The smaller they are the more spirit they seem to have. Our neighbors laughed to see our four lb. Wee Gee chase a German Shepherd from our yard one day, after climbing our 4' frost fence to get after him. We hurried out to make sure the G.S. didn't turn around when he reached the street.

The Toy Manchester is wary of strangers at first but after introductions usually accepts his master's friends with good grace. But he does not bestow friendship indiscriminately.

He is affectionate and becomes so devoted to his own family that he is sometimes too possessive.

The Toy Manchester is classed in the Toy Group because of his small size but could qualify in any of the other Groups:

A Sporting dog — he is a retriever. Watch him retrieve a ball every time!

A Hound — he is bred as a squirrel dog in the Southern United States.

A Working dog — a faithful guard and courageous watchdog.

A Terrier — the original top rat dog.

A Toy — he loves to cuddle in your lap.

A Non-Sporting dog — with his shining black coat set off by trimmings of rich mahogany brown he is most attractive and with his proud, aristocratic bearing and gentlemanly conduct he can certainly place here.

As a companion he is a dog par excellence. Of course, I am just a little prejudiced as a breeder of Toy Manchesters.

I'm as guilty as anyone when it comes to loving a little Boston Terrier, and I know some very nice ones, right here in Canada. And yes, I know Ch. Taffy's Kid Benjamin and we have just as good Boston Terriers, and just as small right in St. John, N.B.

I would like to explain something of what I mean about a good-sized dog. Good bone structure is very important in the Boston Terrier, more so than the perfect markings, and there is no place for the roach-backed, straight-stifled, apple-headed, narrow breasted little Bostons in our breeding scheme.

So far, some little ones I have seen at some of our dog shows are of very poor quality. Not like the standard calls for — skull-square, flat on top, cheeks flat, brow abrupt, eyes wide apart, large and dark in color, expression alert, but kind and intelligent, the eyes should set square in the skull, muzzle short, square.

It seems a Boston Terrier should be a square built dog, and I would like to think that what the great men had in mind when writing the standard, regarding what a correct Boston Terrier should look like was that it not be a low stationed dog in any respect, but a proud standing dog, one that is ready for fight and at the same time is a real gentleman, kind, loving and an all around good sport.

Our male Boston is around 17 lbs., but if we wanted to starve him down he would only be about 15 lbs. We don't believe in starving our dogs.

On March 25 the Chow Chow Fanciers of Canada completed a most successful showing year. Thirty-one members gathered at the home of Mrs. Yan Paul for a delicious buffet and the presentation of the annual awards for 1966.

Club President Douglas Stephen

spoke of the great strides the Chow fancy has made in recent years, and pointed to the 1966 Specialty Show as an example. On that occasion 26 dogs were benched, set off by bench decorations in the club colors. Many of the Chow ladies wore Chinese dresses which added a welcome touch of oriental color. BB honors went to Kin Chi's Miss-Te-Fu, owned by Doug Schwoob, with BOS going to Ch. Foo Hsing's Fu Tu, owned by Mr. and Mrs. A. Garwood. BCBP went to Lidice's Ko Ko owned by Fred Peddie. Special appearances, which made a tremendous impression on spectators, were by Ch. Minhow Miss Sadie Wu and five of her progeny, and by Foo Hsing's Fu-Ting and six of his get. Well done, "Gem" and "Peanuts"! Another unusual attraction was provided by the presence of three fine entries in what was a new venture for the Chow Chow fancy, the Brace Class. Winners were Kin Chi's Ceecce paired with Ch. Foo Hsing's Fu Winko, owned by Mr. and Mrs. N. V. McEachern.

Neil McEachern, past-president of the Chow Chow Fanciers of Canada, observed in his summary of the year's activities that in five fewer shows than in 1965 there had been an increase to 328 Chow entries from 166 a year earlier. Thank you, to all who worked so diligently to make our Specialty the success it was. We look forward now to 1968!



The death of Leonhard Seppala, one of Alaska's legendary dog mushers, has been reported previously in *Dogs in Canada*. Mrs. Nona Navin sends a clipping from the *Alaska Highway News* recalling the event:



distance out of Shaktoolik on January 29, 1925.

He had come 169 miles from Nome with his two Siberian dog teams. Trouble was experienced as the package of anti-toxin was transferred. The scent of reindeer was strong on the trail and the dog teams began to fight.

In the confusion, Togo, one of Seppala's famous lead dogs, ran away.

Though he had already raced 42 miles that day, part of it across the treacherous ice of Norton Bay, the famous dog musher turned around, retracing the same distance in a blinding blizzard.

He stopped for the night at Isaacs Point to rest his dogs whose feet were cut and bleeding.

The next morning he trudged onward through the blizzard through

Moses, Elim and Walla Walla, finally turning over the anti-toxin to Charlie Olson, a mine owner, at Golovin, 78 miles from Nome.

Olson with his dogs struggled forth 25 miles in five hours and then turned the serum over to Gunnar Kaasen, a Nome miner, at Bluff. Kaasen took the serum the rest of the way.

The All-Alaska Sweepstakes race, of which Seppala was king, was begun in 1908, and consisted of a 408 mile trail from Nome to Candle and back.

Born in Skjaervoy, Norway, the five-foot four-inch driver estimated before his retirement in 1940 that he had mushed nearly a quarter million miles.

Through crossbreeding with the Alaska husky, he originated and developed the Siberian strain of race dogs.

CANINE AND FELINE NUTRITIONAL REQUIREMENTS: PROCEEDINGS OF A SYMPOSIUM ORGANIZED BY THE BRITISH SMALL ANIMALS VETERINARY ASSOCIATION.

The papers presented at this Second Annual Symposium were written by scientific workers for other researchers and small animal veterinarians. The book is not written in layman's language, nor is it intended to be of use to the layman. Quite the contrary, the language is often technical and the material only incidentally of interest and use to the average cat or dog breeder. Few, if any, breeders are equipped to make the analyses of the food they are using in order to compare it with the experimental diets dealt with in this book, and the food companies certainly don't provide us with such detailed information. Furthermore, the results of experiments to date are generally too inconclusive to be of practical use to anyone other than a fully qualified veterinarian.

On the other hand, many interesting tidbits of information may be gleaned from the various papers: that protein requirements can't be evaluated in terms of quantity, even when quality is good, since "the degree to which food proteins may be useful in meeting the needs of an animal depends upon the amino-acid composition, the proportion of dietary energy contributed by protein and lastly, upon the caloric intake"; that animal protein is utilized much more efficiently than vegetable protein; that a deficiency in the vitamin B-complex (a normal accompaniment to protein) produces impaired learning ability; that a low-protein diet can cause a condition similar to adult-onset human diabetes; that a diet of even marginally inadequate protein permits severe infestation of *Toxocara canis*, while a diet of adequate protein protects against infestation; that since the calcium-phosphorus ratio is critical, either too much or too little calcium may produce true rickets, but that bone meal may be added safely since it provides Ca and P in the correct ratio; that to maintain healthy skin and coat, a canine diet should "contain some 15% by weight fat (dry matter basis)"; and that overdoses of certain vitamins (notably A and D) can be as bad as deficiencies.

The food companies claim to provide complete diets and maintain that cat and dog owners who feed supplements only destroy the balance which the companies have worked so hard to achieve. It was thus most interesting to discover that vitamin and mineral

supplements are given routinely "as a wise safeguard" to animals at laboratories represented by speakers at this Symposium.

Many breeders would disagree with some of the conclusions reached by the authors. For example, one experimenter studied the effects of a tinned food diet upon four generations of dogs. Defining an adequate diet as one which "supports normal sexual maturation, reproduction and lactation," he reported that this tinned food diet satisfied these criteria, since 75% of the pups born "grew apparently normally to adulthood" in good health with the exception of mouths!

On the whole, the book is a valuable contribution to the study of canine and feline nutrition, but is stiff going for the average breeder or owner.

GENETICS OF THE DOG (The Basis of Successful Breeding)

— by Marca Burns and Margaret N. Fraser, pub. Oliver and Boyd. 186 pp plus appendices and bibliography — \$9.45.

This is the second edition of a book originally published in 1952 and out of print for many years. The 1966 edition has been completely rewritten and brought up to date. The references cited indicate that revision continued until very late in 1965 or even into early 1966. The authors have prepared the book under the sponsorship of the Commonwealth Bureau of Animal Breeding and Genetics. In this forward, J. P. Maule suggests that this work is probably the most complete and authoritative review available on dog genetics and the inheritance of behaviour. Two careful readings indicate that this is an understatement. If Dr. Maule were writing from Texas rather than Edinburgh he would have been quite justified in saying that this is an outstanding book, remarkable in its completeness yet free from any attempt to baffle the reader with science. It is not a simple book yet any dog breeder with a sincere desire to improve his knowledge and thus breed better dogs can profit by careful study of this particular book.

Dr. Burns is both a working geneticist and a breeder of Cocker Spaniels. Her interests have guided her into study of an immense mass of work done in various countries on the apparent dominant or recessive inheritance of many show points for various breeds. These are wonderfully set out in chapter III entitled "Show-points, skull shapes and conformation". This is followed by a very complete chapter on color breeding. The next four chapters deal very completely with physiological peculiarities and abnormalities. In all cases references are cited and on many points of particular interest there is reference to private communication between Dr. Burns and authorities throughout the world.

The two chapters on the inheritance of behaviour characteristics are the particular interest of Miss Fraser. These are as complete and well written as the chapters on physical characteristics. The work of Pfaffenberger and others at the Jackson Laboratory is fully dealt with, particularly the critical periods in development. Various characteristics dealt with include herding, gunshyness, barking, hunting and tracking. The work done in studying the trainability of various breeds as guide dogs for the blind is discussed with reference to work done in USA and UK.

The final chapter outlines successful breeding systems which have been developed by various individuals working on particular problems. One

of the most striking items in this chapter shows a picture of Cocker Spaniels in 1879 and an English Cocker in 1961. On the next page are pictures of a Scottish Deerhound in the early 1900s and a 1945 Deerhound. In the first case the difference is enormous. In the second case the type is identical.

To me the greatest strength of this work is the 24 page bibliography. Three pages are restricted to hereditary diseases and then over 21 pages of general references. The sources quoted come from at least ten countries in at least seven languages. This is an excellent measure of the work which has gone into this book. It is definitely recommended for the studious breeder. — H. Malcolm Stephens

He is an ardent advocate of closer liaison between the physician and veterinarian. His experience includes the original replant surgery of dogs' legs and other organ transplants of the dog. He has also developed a dog snake antiserum and at present is working on a human antiserum.

Hobby: Mrs. Calvin McCulligh of Fergus, Ont., mother of six, who makes clothing for herself and her children and conducts two sewing classes a week, makes custom clothing for neighborhood dogs and cats. She was flown to Edmonton and there her husband chartered a plane to Medicine Hat, where Dr. Clementi is now Medical Officer of Health. Mrs. Clementi's lively interests helped stave off loneliness in Milk River. Among them, an exceptional collection of jade and purebred Burmese cats . . . **George Getty**, one of Canada's longtime breeders of Collies and Shelties, April 14. Mr. Getty established his Quarrybrae Kennels in 1914. Both he and

Mrs. Getty have been long respected for their breeding and exhibiting in both Canada and the United States. For details of the Quarrybrae career see Breed Notes in this issue. Mr. Getty had been in ill health for the past number of years, undergoing serious surgery in 1958, and later amputation of both legs. A heart condition terminated his life . . . **Flt. Lt. Robert M. Grant**, 25, eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Grant, Glanrobin Beagles, Martintown, Ont., died in a plane crash March 27. Mr. Grant and **FO. Douglas R. Clark** of Vancouver lost their lives when a twin-engined jet fighter crashed while approaching for a landing at the RCAF base at Bagotville, Que. after a routine training flight from Chatham, N.B. The Grants formerly lived in Ste. Anne de Bellevue, Que.
